Hindu vote becomes a factor in US elections

WASHINGTON: Niraj Antani, a Republican running for US Congress, is aggressively projecting his Hindu faith. Bhavini Patel, a Democrat running for Congress, is battling allegations of courting Hindu nationalist donors. And Indian-descent donors are pressing the Biden-Harris campaign for a "Hindu page" in its 2024 campaign manifesto.

The "Hindu Vote" appears to have become a factor in US politics.

There is no rock solid count of Hindus in the US be-

cause the US Census does not record religious affiliation in its surveys. But there are several estimates.

Pew Research Center said 0.7 percent of Americans were Hindu in 2015 and that their number is projected to grow to 4.8 million by 2050. Harvard Divinity School estimated their number to be 2.5 million in 2018. And some Hindu Americans put the number generously at 5 million, which, they concede, includes Sikhs and Jains.

As crucial as their number is US politics, so is their ability to write big donation checks. Details on page 5



As crucial as their number is US politics, so is their ability to write big donation checks.

Niraj Antani, an Ohio state lawmaker who is running in the Republican primary for a congressional seat, has frequently described himself as Hindu and posted this message on X, to mark the inauguration of the Ram temple in Ayodhya: "As the 1st Hindu American State Senator in Ohio history, today it was my privilege to do Darshan to Lord Ram at @BAPS Cincinnati Mandir to mark the opening of his Mandir in Ayodhya. As we celebrate this occasion, let us stand for religious freedom around the world. Jai Shri Ram!"

His pinned post on X is an endorsement from the Hindu American PAC.

Bhavini Patel, a Democrat who is

seeking to unseat the incumbent Democrat in a congressional race in Pennsylvania, is being attacked by her opponent for courting Hindu nationalist donors, as also for her unstinting support for Israel.

A fundraising call she hosted with Mihi Meghani, a co-founder of the Hindu American Foundation was being cited as proof of her courting Hindu groups. Meghani is also the chair of the Hindu American PACs whose endorsement is a pinned post on Antani's X feed.

The Patel campaign has denied these allegations.

The back and forth only demonstrates the growing presence of a Hindu vote in US politics.

"There was always a Hindu vote, which was not recognized publicly," said Ramesh Kapur, a longtime Democratic donor and strategist.

"But it is being recognized now, and has come to the fore in the context of the 2024 elections."

A bunch of donors are also pressing the Biden-Harris re-election campaign to include a "Hindu Page" in its manifesto, whenever it is announced.

The same group had tried but failed to convince the Biden campaign to feature the same page in its manifesto that ran on the campaign's website as "Joe's Vision". It had sections dedicated to Mus-

lims, Jews, African American, and so on. The campaign did issue Biden's agenda for Indian Americans but this group of Hindu donors were insistent on a "Hindu Page" in "Joe's Vision" specially because of the observances in the section for Muslims.

"Joe Biden has been disappointed by the measures that the government of India has taken with the implementation votes to offset the possible boycott of Arab and Muslim votes over the administration's support of Israel offensive against the Hamas in Gaza, specially in the key swing states that tend to determine most presidential races.

A phrase being used frequently in this context is "plug the gap".

Wisconsin, one of the swing states, will be critical. Biden won this state by 20,000

Both laws remain un-enforced.

These donors are pressing for the page with an offer to provide President Biden the cushion of Hindu American

in 2020. It has an estimated 38,400 Hindu Americans and they may be able cushion the blow from the boycott by the state's 68,000 Muslims to an extent. These numbers come from a document prepared by these donors to make their case.

Hindu Americans are more confident of their ability to help Biden better in Georgia, a state he won by roughly 12,000. The state is home to 172,000 Hindu Americans, who can more than compensate for its 123,000 Muslims. *IANS*

Family of slain British Indian teen slams UK cops for 'mismanagement'

LONDON: Slamming the police for 'mismanagement', families of the victims of Nottingham murders, which included an Indian-origin student, said they will continue to raise 'serious concerns' about the case and 'will not be silenced'.

British-Indian Grace O'Malley-Kumar, fellow student Barnaby Webber, both aged 19, and 65-year-old school caretaker Ian Coates were stabbed to death by Valdo Calocane near the University of Nottingham on June 13, 2023.

In a joint statement, the families also accused the Nottinghamshire Police of 'gagging' the media in an attempt to stop details of case failings being made public, the Shropshire Star newspaper reported.

Calocane, 32, was sentenced to an indefinite hospital order last month after prosecutors accepted his plea of guilty to manslaughter based on diminished responsibil-

The victims' families -- who had hoped for a murder trial -- reacted with shock and anger to the verdict, which said that Calocane would not face a murder trial due to 'mental illness'

ity with psychiatrists saying that he suffered from paranoid schizophrenia.

The victims' families -- who had hoped for a murder trial -- reacted with shock and anger to the verdict, which said that Calocane would not face a murder trial due to 'mental illness'.

Further, they criticized the police after it emerged during a misconduct hearing that they shared details about the murder victims on a WhatsApp group.

"We will not be silenced. This behavior must be addressed and urgent changes made as this must not happen again to other innocent families," the families said in the statement released. *IANS*

India-born economist Geeta Batra named as first woman Director of World Bank's GEF

MUMBAI: Geeta Batra, an Indian economist, has been named as the new Director at the Independent Evaluation Office of the World Bank's Global Environment Facility (GEF), making her the first-ever woman from a developing country to hold the coveted post.

Batra, 57, is currently the Chief Evaluator & Deputy Director for Evaluation at the GEF's Independent Evaluation Office (IEO), affiliated to the World Bank.

Her name was unanimously recommended for the coveted position at the 66th GEF Council Meeting held

She will also build partnerships with multilateral and bilateral agencies, foundations and networks, and share knowledge of what works, where and why.

Born in New Delhi, Batra studied at the Villa Theresa High School (1984) in Mumbai, then completed her Economics from the Stella Maris College, Chennai (1984-1987), followed by an MBA in Finance from the NMIMS, Vile Parle (1990) in Mumbai.

After her MBA, she was inspired by one of her professors, Harkant Mankad, to go to the US (August 1990) to pursue a PhD in Economics.

Armed with a doctorate, she worked for a couple of years as Senior Manager, Risk, at American Express, before joining the World Bank's Private Sector Development Depart-

ment in 1998.

Serving there for seven years till 2005, she implemented competitiveness projects in East Asia and Latin

Subsequently, she took over as the Head & Chief Evaluator at the International Finance Corporation, for its advisory services portfolio, before moving to the World Bank's IEG as Chief Evaluator and Manager for country and corporate thematic evaluations.

In 2015, Batra joined the GEF's IEO (established in July 2003) - which assesses the progress and impact of GEF interventions - where she manages a team of evaluation professionals, providing oversight on the design, implementation and quality of evaluations.

Since the Rio Earth Summit (1992), the GEF has been one of the largest players in the environmental sector, providing around \$24 billion in grants, plus marshaling an additional \$138 billion in co-financing over 5,700 projects in 170 countries till 2020.

Through the GEF's Small Grants Program (SGP) more than 20,000 grants were given to civil society and community-based organizations totaling over \$1 billion.

The GEF is a partnership for international cooperation with 183 countries working together with international institutions, private sector and civil society to address global environmental concerns.

For the past over 23 years, developed and developing countries have provided funds to support activities pertaining to biodiversity, climate change, international waters, land degradation, chemicals and waste in the context of development projects and programs.

Batra has co-authored books and articles, plus managed over 100 evaluations, and is "interested in development issues with a particular focus on promoting the use of feasible and practical approaches in monitoring and evaluation, to help achieve better outcomes". IANS

Indian-American Congressman Raja Krishnamoorthi for 2026 Senate run?

NEW YORK: Indian-American Congressman Raja Krishnamoorthi is planning to run for the US Senate in 2026, according to a top US magazine that has placed the representative in the list of 50 most powerful in Chicago, a city in Illinois state.

Born in New Delhi to parents from Tamil Nadu and raised in Illinois, the Democrat was ranked number 24 in Chicago Magazine's "heavy hitters" list, which was

topped by Illinois Governor J B Pritzker

Elected to Congress in 2016, the 50-year-old is now in his fourth term representing Illinois' 8th District, which includes Chicago's west and northwest suburbs as well as the 41st ward of the city.

"Krishnamoorthi... who used his former perch as chairman of a House Oversight subcommittee to investigate everything from the Washington Commanders to the baby formula shortage, has \$14.4 million in his campaign coffers," the magazine said.

The amount, according to the magazine, is more than three times as much as any other congressional representative from Illinois, and the third-highest total in the entire Congress.

In 2022, he donated \$460,000 to Democratic candidates and the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee.

As of now, he is "stockpiling his campaign cash to run for the Senate in 2026" if Dick Durbin retires, according to the magazine.

Durbin, 79, is in his fifth Senate term and has served as the Senate Democratic whip since 2005.

Apart from Krishnamoorthi, several other politicians have their eyes on Durbin's Senate seat, which includes Lauren Underwood, US representative from Naperville,

Illinois comptroller Susana Mendoza, and Robin Kelly, the US congresswoman from the south suburbs.

While political consultant Tom Bowen thinks Krishnamoorthi has been "raising money like a banshee" to prepare for a Senate run, the Congressman has denied it.

Speaking to Tribune, he said: "First of all, I hope Senator Durbin continues... I haven't heard any indication he's not.... I'm not looking at it right now, [but] I'm not ruling anything out."

However, according to

Chicago Magazine, "donations from pharmaceutical companies and corporate political action committees could hurt him with progressive primary voters".

The US Congress has 535 voting members -- 100 senators and 435 representatives. While senators represent their entire states, members of the House represent individual districts. *IANS*

NEW YORK: A top Hindu advocacy group in the US has said that it is "shocking" and "disheartening" to see that the investigation into the killing of Indian student Jaahnavi Kandula is dismissed with no charges against those who struck her.

Kandula, a student of the Northeastern University in South Lake Union, died after she was hit by a Seattle Police vehicle driven by officer Kevin Dave at a pedestrian crossing on the night of January 23 last year.

Authorities in the U.S. ruled that Dave will not face any criminal charges due to the lack of "sufficient" evidence.

Hindu advocacy group, Coalition of

Hindus of North America (CoHNA) said it is "doubly shocking that such serious violations of civil rights of Hindus of different backgrounds and ages do not even merit any restorative justice."

"It is shocking and disheartening to see the investigation into the killing of #JaahnaviKandula be dismissed

with no charges against those who struck her. Where is #justice for the family of this young international student, run over in a #Seattle sidewalk by a police car?" CoHNA said in a post on X.

The group said that they are reminded of the "infamous" 2015 case of Sureshbhai Patel, who faced police brutality that left him paralyzed.

Patel, then 57, was out for a walk in a neighborhood in Alabama when a 27-year-old police officer, Eric Parker, searched him for weapons.

He then took the Indian national to the ground, which resulted in serious spinal cord injury and paralysis.

CoHNA said that charges against Parker were similarly dismissed due to 'lack of sufficient evidence'.

The King County Prosecutor's Office said in a statement last week that they will not be moving ahead with the trial against Seattle Police Officer Dave, and no criminal charges will be pressed against him. *IANS*

94 pc of Indian firms plan to boost workers' skills, abilities this year: Report

NEW DELHI: About 94 percent of Indian companies plan to enhance their employees' skills and abilities, and 53 percent are looking to provide online training and development programs in 2024, a new report stated.

According to the professional networking platform LinkedIn, upskilling employees, aligning learning programs to business goals, and creating a culture of learning are the top three focus areas for India's learning & development (L&D) professionals in 2024.

"With skills for jobs globally expected to change 68 percent by 2030, we are seeing a greater emphasis on learning both technical and soft skills with a majority of employers surveyed agreeing that this balance will be critical for organizations to succeed in the age of AI," said Ruchee Anand, Senior Director - Talent, Learning and Engagement Solutions, LinkedIn India.

The report surveyed 4,323 hiring managers in the UK, Ireland, France, Germany, Italy, Spain, the US, India, Aus-

tralia, Singapore, Japan, Indonesia, China, the Netherlands, Sweden, MENA, and Brazil.

Amid rapidly changing skill requirements due to AI and automation, the report mentioned 98 percent of employers in India noted significant shifts in the skills they prioritize for job candidates.

Companies now value candidates with not just AI expertise, but also soft skills and a capacity for learning.

The report revealed that 91 percent of L&D professionals in India view human skills as increasingly competitive in the economy.

Moreover, the report highlighted that 48 percent of India's hiring managers are providing career progression opportunities to their existing employees.

They also believe "helping employees build the skills needed for the future of work" (38 percent) and "providing competitive salaries and benefits" (31 percent) are key to retaining top talent. *IANS*

TCS likely to lead its peers in revenue growth: UBS

NEW DELHI: TCS is likely to lead its peers in revenue growth by 100-150 bp along with improvement in margins in FY25, foreign brokerage UBS said in a report.

"We believe the market is not pricing this in, given a divided consensus and the stock remaining at the lower

end of its long-term trading premium vs peers," UBS said as it upgraded TCS.

"We see enough drivers to believe TCS can deliver industryleading growth and margins among peers in FY25," UBS said.

These include ramp-up of large deals, revival in the BFSI segment, revival in cloud migration

projects; and continued managed services demand strength at industry level.

"On the margin front, we expect a sharp fall in attrition

to aid in gross margins with some lag, a potential 200 bp additional improvement in utilization, and scope for subcontracting cost reductions. Our two-factor regression model suggests gross margin can expand by more than 100 bp in the next four to six quarters," UBS said.

UBS has lifted FY25/26 EPS estimates 3 percent/9 percent and upgrade TCS valuing the company at 28x PE (earlier 26x) on FY26E EPS, which is close to the current multiple.

TCS' current multiple premium over peers is below the historical average, and any outperformance makes the case

for a re-rating, providing comfort in using the current multiple, the brokerage said. TCS shares gained 2.5 percent on 27 February, on BSE to close at Rs 4,102. *IANS*

Instagram, Threads, to start limiting the recommendation of political content

NEW DELHI: Instagram users will no longer be bombarded with unwanted political content on their feed.

As per Variety, Instagram, in a blog post, said it will not "proactively recommend" political content from accounts that users do not already follow.

The same policy is also applied to Threads, the Twitter-like app launched last summer under the Instagram brand.

"We want Instagram and Threads to be a great experience for everyone. If you decide to follow accounts that post political content, we don't want to get between you and their posts, but we also don't want to proactively recommend political content from accounts you don't follow," the Meta-owned company said.

Both apps will add a setting to let users who still want to see political content recommendations opt to do so -- and, according the post, the same con-

on Facebook at a later date. Instagram defines "political content" as "potentially related to things like laws, elections or social topics."



"Our goal is to preserve the

ability for people to choose to interact with political content, while respecting each person's appetite for it," Instagram head Adam Mosseri wrote in a post on Threads.

The updated policy to discontinue recommending political content applies to areas of Instagram including Explore, Reels, In-Feed Recommendations and Suggested Users.

Meta has already been deprioritizing political content across its social apps, including on Facebook. "People have told us they want to see less political content, so we have spent the last few years refining our approach on Facebook to reduce the amount of political content - including from politicians' accounts - you see in Feed, Reels, Watch, Groups You Should Join, and Pages You May Like," the company explained in a post on its Transparency Center site, Variety reported.

The Instagram blog post noted that professional accounts on the app can check the Account Status setting to see if their posts are eligible to be recommended -- based on whether they recently posted "political content." If Instagram has blocked an account's posts from recommendations, pro users may edit or remove recent posts to regain eligibility or request a review if they disagree with Instagram's designation. *ANI*

90% of young Indian women suffer from iron deficiency: Doctors

NEW DELHI: Iron deficiency is a widespread issue among young women, affecting around 90 percentin India, said doctors, calling the need for timely detection of the condition.

Many women experience low iron levels without realizing it, often attributing symptoms like fatigue and weakness to other causes.

Iron deficiency is a common nutritional shortfall that occurs when the body doesn't have enough iron to support its functions.

This essential mineral plays a crucial role in transporting oxygen throughout the body, maintaining healthy red blood cells, and supporting overall energy levels.



Without adequate iron, individuals may experience fatigue, weakness, shortness of breath, and impaired cognitive function.

"Iron deficiency among young women is a growing concern that is often overlooked. Despite efforts to promote healthy eating and supplementation, 90 percent of young women still struggle with insufficient iron levels," Dr Rajesh Bendre, National Technical Head and Chief Pathologist Apollo Diagnostics, told IANS.

He said factors such menstrual blood loss, restrictive diets, and heavy reliance on processed foods are behind the rise in iron deficiency among women.

Further the doctor noted that the lack of education about ironrich food sources and dietary requirements exacerbates the problem.

"It is crucial to raise awareness about the importance of maintaining adequate iron levels and provide accessible resources for proper nutrition education," he said. *IANS*

Yoga gives distinct cognitive advantages to older women at risk of Alzheimer's disease: Study

CALIFORNIA: A new UCLA Health study discovered that Kundalini yoga improved cognition and memory in older women at risk of developing Alzheimer's disease by restoring neural pathways, preventing brain matter decline, and reversing ageing and inflammation-associated biomarkers--improvements not seen in a group that received standard memory training exercises.

The findings, published in the journal Translational Psychiatry, are the most recent in a series of studies conducted by UCLA Health researchers over the last 15 years to compare the effects of yoga and traditional memory enhancement training on slowing cognitive decline and addressing other dementia risk factors.

Led by UCLA Health psychiatrist Dr Helen Lavretsky of the Jane and Terry Semel Institute for Neuroscience and Human Behavior, this latest study sought to determine whether Kundalini yoga could be used early on to prevent cognitive decline and trajectories of Alzheimer's disease among postmenopausal women.

Women have about twice the risk of developing Alzheimer's disease compared to men due to several factors including longer life expectancy, changes in estrogen levels during menopause and genetics.

In the new study, a group of more than 60 women ages 50 and older who had self-reported memory issues and cerebrovascular risk factors were recruited from a UCLA cardiology clinic. The women were divided evenly into two groups. The first group participated in weekly Kundalini yoga sessions for 12 weeks while the other one group under-

went weekly memory enhancement training during the same time period. Participants were also provided daily homework assignments.

Kundalini yoga is a method that focuses on meditation and breath work more so than physi-

and for molecules associated with inflammation, which are contributing factors to Alzheimer's disease. A handful of patients were also assessed with MRIs to study changes in brain matter.

Researchers found the Kundalini yoga group participants saw several improvements not experienced by the memory enhancement-training group. These included significant improvement in subjective memory complaints, prevention in brain matter declines, increased connectivity in the hippocampus which manages stress-related memories, and improvement in the peripheral cytokines and gene expression of anti-inflammatory and anti-aging molecules. IIT Madras develops 1st India-specific Al model to determine fetus age

CHENNAI: In a first, researchers at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Madras have developed an Artificial Intelligence (AI) model that is specific to Indian population and can accurately determine the age of a fetus in a pregnant woman, in her second and third trimesters.

Accurate age of a fetus -- gestational age -- helps in providing proper care of pregnant women and also to determine precise delivery dates.

Currently, physicians in India determine the gestational age using a formula developed for Western population, increasing chances of error.

The new model called 'Garbhini-GA2' accurately estimates the age of a fetus for the Indian population, reducing error by almost three times, said the team of researchers, including from the Transla-

and validated using Indian population data", they noted in the study, published in the peer-reviewed journal Lancet Regional Health Southeast Asia.

The new model can also improve the care delivered by obstetricians and neo-



natologists, thus reducing maternal and infant mortality rates in India.

The research is also part of 'Interdisciplinary Group for Advanced Research on Birth Outcomes -- DBT India Initiative' (GARBH-Ini) program.

"GARBH-Ini is a flagship program of DBT, and the development of these population-specific models for estimating gestational age is a commendable outcome. These models are being validated across the country," said Dr. Rajesh Gokhale,

Secretary, Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Government of India

"IIT Madras has been contributing towards solving healthcare problems at the grassroots and local level with the aim of enhancing public health in India. To this end, we are utilizing advanced data science and AI/ML techniques to build tools to predict unfavorable birth outcomes. The first step towards this is to develop accurate GA models that perform significantly better than currently

used models designed using Western populations," added Dr Himanshu Sinha, a Coordinator at the Center for Integrative Biology and Systems Medicine, IIT Madras, and who led the data science work for this research. *IANS*


Delhi doctors report rise in stomach flu cases

Mexican Foreign Minister urges US to regularize migrants' legal status

MEXICO CITY: Highlighting the importance of Mexican migrant workers to the US economy, Mexican Foreign Minister Alicia Barcena has again urged Washington to regularize their legal status.

Addressing a press conference, Alicia Barcena said Mexicans working in the US contribute over \$324 billion annually to the nation's economy in such essential sectors as agriculture, services and construction, Xinhua news agency reported.

"The regularization of Mexicans is not unprecedented. In 1986, 3 million Mexicans were regularized," she said.

Mexico is requesting the US to make "a similar and fair gesture" to regularize undocumented Mexicans who have worked there for more than five years, including half a million young people protected by the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals Act.

The influx of migrants at the US-Mexico border rose to unprecedented levels at the end of 2023. In December 2023, US **Customs and Border Protection** recorded nearly 250,000 encounters with migrants crossing the US-Mexico border, the highest monthly total on record.

To curb mass emigration, the US needs to approve a budget of 20 billion dollars annually to promote development in Latin America and the Caribbean, Barcena said, calling on Washington to lift its sanctions on Venezuela and trade embargo against Cuba. IANS

7-year ban on Indian restaurant owner for hiring illegal workers in UK

LONDON: The owner of an Indian restaurant and takeaway in the UK has been banned as a company director until 2031 for hiring three illegal workers from Bangladesh without conducting right-to-work checks.

Ikbal Hussain, 51, hired the workers, all in their forties, at the Taste of Raj on High Street, Hertfordshire, before the restaurant was raided by immigration enforcement officials in March

A resident of Enfield, Hussain was the sole director of the restaurant, trading under the company name of Tender Love Ltd, since June 2014.

The workers told investigators they had worked at the restaurant for between four days and up to two months.

Hussain not only employed them without conducting right-towork checks but also failed to keep the required documentation proving they were eligible to work in the UK, a Home Office statement said.

"Ikbal Hussain's failure to ensure the required checks were carried out resulted in the em-



ployment of three illegal workers, in contravention of the Immigration, Asylum and Nationality Act 2006," Kevin Read, Chief Investigator at the Insolvency Service, said.

Calling this a serious breach of legislation, Read added that Hussain cannot be involved in the promotion, formation or management of a company in the UK as a result of the ban,

which came into effect on February 16.

Suran Padiachie from Home Office Immigration Enforcement said illegal working cheats honest workers out of employment, puts vulnerable people at risk, and defrauds the public purse.

"We're clamping down on illegal working by ramping up enforcement activity and tripling fines for rogue employers. We will continue to work with partners, including the Insolvency Service to tackle illegal migration in all its forms," Padiachie added.

The Secretary of State for Business and Trade accepted a disqualification undertaking from Hussain. IANS

Chinese Visa: Court reserves order on cognizance in Karti Chidambaram's money laundering case for March 16

NEW DELHI: A Delhi court has reserved its order on whether to take cognizance of the Enforcement Directorate's (ED) charge sheet filed against Congress MP Karti Chidambaram and others in a money laundering case linked to the Chinese Visa is-

Special Judge MK Nagpal of Rouse Avenue Court recorded submissions from the financial probe agency's counsel. Now the matter will come up for pronouncement of order on March 16.

Chidambaram had earlier moved an anticipatory bail application in the Delhi High Court, wherein, Assistant Solicitor General, SV Raju, representing the ED, had

assured the court orally that no coercive action would be taken until the matter is pending.

Senior Advocate Kapil Sibal, representing Chidambaram, had argued against the allegations, stressing the absence of material evidence implicating the accused.

Sibal had contended that no money laundering case could be established without evidence of monetary transactions involving Chidambaram.

He had further mentioned the temporal gap between the

> alleged transaction in 2011 and the case registration in 2022.

In response, SV Raju had countered Sibal's arguments, saying that the bail application was premature given the absence of substantial evi-

BJP tears into K'taka govt over deportation of 'controversial' UK writer from B'luru airport

BENGALURU: The Karnataka BJP unit has leveled serious allegations against the Congress government in connection with the reported deportation of British academic and writer Nitasha Kaul from the city, accusing it of channelizing taxpayers' funds to 'terrorist-sympathizers', 'urban naxals', 'anti-nationals', and 'riots-accused' to destabilize the country ahead of the upcoming Lok Sabha elections.

Last weekend, Nitasha Kaul was detained by the security agencies on her arrival at the KempeGowda International Airport in Bengaluru before she was deported back to London. Kaul later claimed that she was denied entry despite having an invitation to speak at a conference organized by the Karnataka government.

Kaul, a controversial writer, was invited by the government of Karnataka to participate in a conference titled 'The Constitution and Unity of India' in Bengaluru.

Lashing out at the Congress government for inviting Kaul, the BJP posted on social media without taking her name, "The Congress has disgraced the Indian Constitution by inviting a Pakistani

sympathizer who wants India to break up.

"Don't you have any shame, Chief Minister Siddaramaiah? Are you trying to challenge the Constitution and threaten the unity and integrity of India?"

It is now apparent that the Congress is now using Karnataka as its laboratory to prepare ground for its divisive agendas, potentially undermining national unity and integrity, the BJP alleged.

"Thanks to our security agencies, one such anti-India element was caught suspiciously entering India and was detained at the airport. No money to spend on drought relief or developmental needs of Karnataka, but, Siddaramaiah is happy to finance the 'Break India Brigade'," it said.

Kaul, an OCI cardholder and writer based in London, stated on X, "Denied entry to India for speaking on democratic and constitutional values. I was invited to a conference as an esteemed delegate by the government of Karnataka (Congress-ruled state) but Centre refused my entry. All my documents were valid and current (UK Passport and OCD)." *IANS*

RERA warns defaulter promoters of tough action

GURUGRAM: The Real Estate Regulatory Authority (RERA) of Gurugram has asked the defaulter promoters to file Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) and Annual Audit Report (AAR) without further delay to avoid "drastic" action.

Earlier this week, the Authority initiated a drive and called the promoters and asked them to comply with the regulations.

"In case it (the persuasion) fails to work, RERA Gurugram shall be compelled to take drastic action against such promoters. This may entail levying of penalties, freezing of their RERA accounts, attachment of their properties etc," said RERA in a statement.

The Authority has appealed to all its promoters to abide by stipulations and discharge their legal obligations.

The filing of QPR and AAR by real estate promoters is a mandatory requirement under RERA Act 2016 to ensure efficient and transparent progress of constructions of projects and utilization of funds for better regulations of the real estate sector.

However, in practice, most RERAs in the country are struggling to ensure that it is filed by all concerned on time. IANS

She said that "money" is important to everyone, and voting is to decide how funds are allocated, such as whether to build schools, build roads, and whether it can make the community better.

Anneshia Hardy, Executive Director of Alabama Values described the strategies the organization used to mobilize voters to turn out, including conveying the concept that voting is not just about electing leaders, but about the future of the community. She encouraged social media, local news outlets to promote voting rights through storytelling. She urged everyone to vote in the March primary election, which will determine the candidates' names to appear on the November ballot.





That is why, this festival goes on nightlong to ensure that people stay awake by keeping their spine vertical.

What is the deeper meaning of Lord Shiva?

Destroyer of darkness is calledShiva. He is also known as the destroyer, transformerand auspicious, gracious, kind, benevolent. The deeper meaning is that the one who worships Him, he can overcome his/her inner darkness/demonic nature through self-awareness, self-awakening and self-control. By seeking his blessings, we can transform the darkness into light both within and around us.

After your deep and concentrated meditation, when you open your eyes and look around, you will see many

of His beautiful creations, if you are partially enlightened; you will see His existence in the vast emptiness/infinity, if you are really and fully enlightened. Even according to modern science also everything comes from nothing and goes back to nothing. For that reason, the vast emptiness/nothingness is referred to as Mahadeva, the great lord.

What is the Meaning of Maha Shivaratri?

Maha Shivaratri, the great night of Shiva has three words namely, Maha means great, Shiva means auspicious, and Ratri means night, which gives rest and comfort. This is the night of transcendental divine consciousness, which destroys adhyatmik, adibhoutik and adidaivik hurdles, as this great energetic night awakens every particle of our body towards truth, love,

Spiritual seekers love to meditate to understand the higher truths of life. According to Shiva Purana, also a

person who fasts on this divine day can reap the benefits of a whole year's rigorous prayers.

What are the Maha Shivaratri rituals?

On the Maha Shivaratri, after completing the morning routines, devotees should make a Sankalp to

observe a full day fasting and should break it only after the final Aarati in the mid-night or on the next day after taking bath and doing Shiva puja and prayers. On this day, devotees should take a second bath in the evening before visiting a temple of Lord Shiva. Shivaratri Puja can be performed onetime or four times during the night by offering water, milk, curd, honey, flowers, Belvapatra, and Diya to Shiva Lingam. Devotees stay awake all night at the Shiva temple or at home and listen to stories of Lord Shiva, sing Bhajans, chant Mantras to praise Lord Shiva and receive His graceful blessings.

The Ayurvedic Treatments for Long COVID

Although most people with COVID-19 return to their normal state of health after acute infection in 2-4 weeks, but a significant proportion report persistent lifealtering health problems. It is difficult to predict who will experience long COVID however, the continuous symptoms as well as remitting and relapsing patterns do also occur morein women and be linearly related to age. Long COVID can occur irrespective of the initial severity of infection, and often affects multiple organ systems such as heart, lungs, kidneys, liver, pancreas, or spleen. Many individuals have more than one organ affected and it is

unknown so far how and when these chronic symptoms will resolve. Studying long COVID syndrome is especially difficult because there is such a wide range of health issues involved -- from shortness of breath to "brain fog" to fatigue to insomnia to cardiovascular problems to polyneuropathies to depression, and even rare cases of psychosis andthere is no consensus on how to define, diagnose or measure this syndrome using modern medical technology. COVID-19 can result in prolonged illness due to following sequelae.

1) Neurologic sequelae: Coronavirus is primarily a respiratory virus causing symptoms range from mild, such as headache, nausea, anosmia (loss of smell), ageusia (loss of taste), altered consciousness, "brain fog" to more severe such as hemorrhage, syncope, seizure, stroke, meningoencephalitis, Guillain-Barre syndrome, and demyelinating disease. The exact pathologic basis for these neurologic symptoms is currently unknown despite the understanding of the "spike protein", that builds many copies during the infection, can readily cross the blood brain barrier and lodge in the gray matter of the brain and this toxic spike protein subunits also enter the spleen, liver and kidneys.

2) Cardiac sequelae: According to previous studies, although cardiac abnormalities and myocardial inflammation were not associated with initial COVID-19 severity. At the same time, evidence of cardiac injury in long COVID is not only rising but also observing cardiac symptoms such as chest pain, heart palpitations, and tachycardia that commonly persist among COVID-19 survivors for 6-12 months or longer, suggesting substantial cardiac sequelae. Individuals with orthostatic hypotension along with tachycardia condition are at risk for vasovagal syncope.

3)Gastrointestinal, renal, and musculoskeletal sequelae: Long COVID may also affect the gastrointestinal system and patients may experience abdominal pain, gastrointestinal bleeding, nausea and vomiting, diarrhea, hepatitis, and pancreatitis. People who experienced kidney dysfunction during many other acute illness periods are more likely to have continued kidney dysfunction as time passes but researchers are uncertain how this will affect COVID-19 long-haulers. The musculoskeletal symptoms of myalgias and arthralgias are also very common complaints among long-haulers and often misdiagnosed as fibromyalgia.

4) Skin sequelae: Dermatologic symptom associated with COVID-19 infection include skin lesions such as morbilliform rash ("measles-like") and chilblain-like acral lesions, "COVID toes (pink, red or purplish bumps)." may develop up to 2 weeks after acute COVID-19 infection and normally resolve within 4 to 8 weeks, but can persist.

5) Immunity sequelae: Some people who have recovered from COVID-19 have decreased immune systemactivity and it can also have the opposite effect, causing parts of the immune system to become overactive and trigger harmful uncontrolled inflammation throughout the body. At this time, it is unclear how long it

takes the immune system to regain balance and normalcy. A recent study has revealed that increased risks of new respiratory, diabetes, and cardiovascular diseases occurring within the subsequent six months among COVID-19 patients.



ome to the largest population of the one-horned rhino on earth, Kaziranga National Park is one of India's national treasures in terms of flora and fauna. Located in the state of Assam in North-Eastern India, its total area is shared by the districts of Nagaon, Golaghat and Karbi Anglong placing it roughly at the center of the state. Approximately around five hours by road from Guwahati, Kaziranga National Park stands tall as the epitome of successful wildlife conservation in India. In 1985, it was awarded the status of a World Heritage Site by UNESCO.

Lying on the floodplains of the mighty river Brahmaputra, rich vegetation covers almost the entirety of Kaziranga National Park. Receiving massive amounts of rainfall each year, at times even crossing dangerous levels, this national park is characterized by tall elephant grass, marshlands and tall tropical broadleaf forests. Here, a wide variety of fauna thrives including the one-

horned rhino, Asiatic elephants, wild water buffalo, leopards and Royal Bengal Tigers. Kaziranga National Park is also listed officially as a Tiger reserve and is home to one of the world's largest population of tigers.

Different types of birds can also be spotted here at the park. A popular migratory location for birds who fly down from the north, one can spot various birds such as the black-nested stork, the lesser white-fronted goose, ferruginous duck and Baer's pochard duck to name a few. Other notable bird families that can be seen here include the great Indian hornbill and wreathed hornbill among many others.

Safaris can be undertaken both during the day and night during the open tourist season. Elephant rides are also very popular among tourists and wildlife journalists and enthusiasts. Hiking is one such activity that is prohibited here to avoid casualties. Great care is taken at this national park such that tourism and natural sustainability go hand in hand.


Best time to visit Kaziranga National Park

The best time to visit Kaziranga is anywhere from November to April. Since the whole of Assam receives a major rainfall in the monsoon and the pre-monsoon time of the year, the Kaziranga National Park floods in the months of June, July and August. No wonder

the rhinos love bathing and staying in water during these months. The water starts receding in September and October and the place is open to tourism from November again.

How to reach Kaziranga National Park

There are a total 5 airports near Kaziranga. The nearest is the Jorhat Airport, 97 km away. Others include the Tezpur Airport at Solanbari, which is the same distance as the Jorhat Airport. The nearest International Airport is the Lokpriya Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport in Guwahati. www.holidify.com

t was meditation in emptiness, a void that had no border. Thought could not follow; it had been left where time begins, nor was there feeling to distort love. This was emptiness without space.

The brain was in no way participating in this meditation; it was completely still and in that stillness going within itself and out of itself but in no way sharing with this vast emptiness. The totality of the mind was receiving or perceiving or being aware of what was taking place and yet it was not outside of itself, something extraneous, something foreign.

Thought is an impediment to meditation but only through meditation can this impediment be dissolved. For thought dissipates energy and the essence of energy is freedom from thought and feeling.

Meditation is the emptying the mind of all thought, for thought and feeling dissipate energy; they are repetitive, producing mechanical activities which are a

The totality of the mind, in which is the brain with its thoughts and feelings, was empty; and because it was empty, there was energy, a deepening and widening energy without measure. All comparison, measurement belong to thought and so to time. The otherness was the mind without time: it was the breath of innocence and immensity. Words are not reality; they are only means of communication but they are not the innocence and the immeasurable. Habit and meditation can never abide together; meditation can never become a habit; meditation can never follow the pattern laid down by thought which forms habit. Meditation is the destruction of thought and not thought caught in its own intricacies, visions and its own vain pursuits.

Thought shattering itself against its own nothingness is the explosion of meditation. This meditation has its own movement, directionless and so is causeless. And in that room, in that peculiar silence when the clouds are low, almost touching

necessary part of existence. But they are only part, and thought and feeling cannot possibly enter into the immensity of life.

Quite a different approach is necessary, not the path of habit, association and the known; there must be freedom from these. Meditation is the emptying of the mind of the known. It cannot be done by thought or by the hidden prompting of thought, nor by desire in the form of prayer, nor through the self-effacing hypnotism of words, images, hopes and vanities. All these have to come to an end, easily, without effort and choice, in the flame of awareness.

Walking on that road, there was complete emptiness of the brain, and the mind was free of all experience, the knowing of yesterday, though a thousand yesterdays have been. Time, the thing of thought, had stopped; literally there was no movement before and after; there was no going or arriving or standing still.


Space as distance was not; there were the hills and bushes but not as high and low. There was no relationship with anything but there was an awareness of the bridge and the passer-by.

the treetops, meditation was a movement in which the brain emptied itself and remained still. It was a movement of the totality of the mind in emptiness and there was timelessness. Thought is matter held within the bonds of time; thought is never free, never new; every experience only strengthens the bondage and so there is sorrow. Experience can never free thought; it makes it more cunning, and refinement is not the ending of sorrow.

India should be prepared for a long war with China

ndia and China held the 21st round of Corps Commander-level talks at the Chushl-Moldo meeting point on the Line of Actual Control (LAC) on February 19, 2024. According to the Ministry of External Affairs, India sought "complete disengagement" in eastern Ladakh. China's Ministry of Defense said commanders agreed to look for a mutually acceptable solution at the earliest and described the talks as positive, in-depth and constructive. India said the talks were in a friendly and cordial atmosphere. Both sides agreed to keep communicating through the relevant military and diplomatic mechanisms and were committed to maintaining peace on the ground in the

which means sweet nothing. A senior Indian security official reportedly told the media, "There was no forward movement during the fresh round of talks as the Chinese army refused to budge from disengaging from the Depsang Plains and Demchok, which are strategically crucial for India."

The PLA has conveyed many times in the past they will not pull back anymore from newly occupied positions. By asking for more talks, the Indian government wants to show territory lost to China in 2020 is not permanent. Indian officials perhaps feel that the ongoing display of Indo-US camaraderie would make China relent. But China is too perceptive to see through geopolitical relationships.

Defense Minister Rajnath Singh and Defense Secretary Girdhar Aramane are effusive about how the US can help India become a developed country by 2047, how India-US cooperation will act as a force multiplier for a "rules-based world order", and how the US is geared towards India fending off China.

At the INDUS-X (India-US Defense Acceleration Ecosystem) summit on February 21, Aramane said, "We are standing against a bully (China) in a very determined fashion. And we expect that our friend, the US, will be there with us in case we need their support. It is a must for (India), we have to stand up to China whether we can or we can't (sic)...We have to have the strong resolve that we will support each other in the face of a common threat, this is going to be of critical importance to us".

Can US be relied upon?

The defense secretary is the highestranking non-military official charged with the defense of India and the defense minister is a political appendage but

can they explain what technology America has exactly given to India? Why didn't they seek answers at INDUS-X, why a US carrier group threatened India in 1971, why was the GPS switched off during the Kargil

conflict, and what actions concerning India were discussed with Pakistan's army chief and DG ISI in Washington recently?

Why does our national hierarchy fail to perceive that having Europe tied down in Ukraine, Israel in Gaza and forcing conflict in the Red Sea by not supporting the Gaza ceasefire, the next most lucrative market for the US is to get India involved in a conflict with China on land and sea, using India as a proxy in Indo-Pacific? Why not make public all the help India sought from the US in 1962 and what America gave to establish the measure of American friendship? Don't declassified US documents read the American dictum: "Give them (India) some weapons but make sure India and China never get

Pakistan elections: A rebuke to the military establishment's policies?

he recent general elec tions in Pakistan, the re sults of which are yet to be finalized, gave birth to distinct themes echoing with clarity and significance. Among these a resounding message becomes apparent: the Pakistani populace, especially its dynamic youth, opposes the coercive methods of the state apparatus and refuses to adhere to predetermined narratives dictating the country's trajectory by the military leadership.

The defeat of the establishment-backed Pakistan Muslim League (N) (PML-N) at the hands of mostly relatively obscure and youthful candidates like the top tier of former Prime Minister Imran Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) lays a promising foundation for a more democratic trajectory forward.

A coalition between the PML-N and Pakistan Peoples Party is taking shape, consolidating power in Islamabad and three provinces: Punjab, Sindh, and Balochistan. The PTI has a clear victory in the fourth province, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

However, the coalition government being formed with the support of the country's powerful 'militablishment', a term referring to the army's high command and powerful intelligence agency ISI, may lack public support and moral legitimacy. This would make it unlikely to survive for long.

Disdain for entrenched elite

Multiple court cases instituted against Khan and his family reek of political vendetta and the preservation of the military's dominant position in the political realm.

In sharp contrast to the last elections in 2018, when Khan was the establishment favorite, the country's electronic media channels notably sidelined Khan and his PTI in their coverage this time, with even the mention of his name restricted in broadcast reports and newspapers. Two days before the elections, major

newspapers featured paid frontpage content referring to Nawaz Sharif as the prime minister. In response, PTI upped its already strong social media campaign.

Despite the increase in the absolute number of voters, with a record addition of 22.6 million registered between the two elections, the voter turnout rate dropped from 52.1 percent in 2018 to 47.6 percent in 2024. And while as many as 66 percent of 18-25-year-olds are registered voters, their turnout is lower than the average.

Still, the younger generation exhibits a fearless disdain for Pakistan's entrenched elite, including the military, judiciary, and political allies, with PTI's fan dress the people's grievances.

The Pakistan Army's policies lack consistency and depth, often pivoting abruptly in response to changing circumstances, including shifts in military leadership. Moreover, with the impending retirement of the current military leadership within two years, new dynamics will unfold, with emerging figures forging their own paths. Over time, the army may realize that the support for Khan, or any politician for that matter, cannot be extinguished through coercive measures.

The tenuous alliance between the Pakistan Muslim League and the army is likely to teeter on the brink of disruption as has happened before with 'selected' can-

base in particular using social media to express themselves. Countering PTI's efforts to engage in online fundraising campaigns and virtual meetings, the authorities persistently disrupted internet services.

Power struggle looms

The recent electoral success odds against all has emboldened the PTI leadership and workers. Many see it as an indication of the electorate's opposition to the army's extra-constitutional powers and interference in political affairs. This realization will likely spur further aggressive political action by PTI voters, sympathizers, and leadership in the days ahead, knowing that the upcoming coalition government in Pakistan is unlikely to be able to bring about an economic turnaround or addidates. Khan himself came into power with significant help from the military in 2018, but a few years later, their alliance fell apart.

A power struggle thus looms, given the military's historical interference in Pakistan's politics. The establishment remains steadfast in its quest to maintain supremacy over the nation's decision-making processes. The chief of army staff is even one of the two persons listed on the leadership panel of a body set up in June 2023 under the caretaker administration to facilitate investments to Pakistan, the Special Investment Facilitation

AMEEN SAYANI NO MORE

or many Indians, living in India or overseas, who grew up listening to the fabulous voice of Ameen Sayani, news of his recent passing brings sadness and nostalgia. He achieved fame and popularity across the Indian subcontinent through the Binaca Geetmala program of movie songs over the airwaves of Radio Ceylon. He was perhaps one of the most popular and fondlyimitated announcers. His style of addressing the audience with "Behno aur Bhaiyo" ("sisters and brothers"), as against the conventional "Bhaiyo aur Behno" is still close to the heart of many amongst us. He produced, compered, or provided, voice-overs for over 54,000 radio programs.

Born 21st December 1932, to Kulsoom (mother) and Jan Mohammad Sayani, he was from a Gujarati Muslim Khoja Ismaili family in Mumbai. His mother was a freedom fighter and close to Mahatma Gandhi, which is why Sayani called himself a Gandhian. He was the grandson to Rahimtulla M. Sayani who had served as President of the Indian National Congress. He was introduced to All India Radio, Bombay, by his brother Hamid Sayani. Ameen participated in English programs at AIR for ten years. Later, he helped popularize All India Radio in India.

Sayani had also assisted his mother, Kulsoom, withthe editing, publishing and printing of a fortnightly journal for neo-literates, under the instructions of Mahatma Gandhi. It was this early grounding in simple communication skills that helped him in his long career of commercial broadcasting and, culminated with his being awarded the "Hindi Ratna Puraskaar" by the prestigious Hindi Bhavan of New Delhi in 2007.

Sayani was part of various movies like Bhoot Bungla, Teen Devian, Boxer and Qatl. He appeared in all of these movies in the role of an announcer in some event. The lesser-known fact about him is he worked in the marketing Department of Tata Oil Mills Ltd, from 1960-62, as Brand Executive looking after their toilet soaps, Hamam and Jai.

Some better-known radio shows he produced were CIBACA, mainly over Radio Ceylon, Film Mulakaa, Vividh Bharati, Saridon Ki Sathi, Bournvita Quiz Contest, Shalimar Superlac, Maratha Darbar and Sangeet Kay Sitaron Ki Mehfil.Sayani also produced a 13-episode radio series in the form of plays, based on actual HIV/AIDS cases that included interviews with eminent doctors and social workers. The series - Swanaash wascommissioned by All India Radio and its audiocassettes were acquired by many NGOs for their fieldwork.

Having produced several audio features on cassettes, LPs and CDs, Sayani was producing (for Saregama India Ltd), an unusual retrospective of his flagship radio show, Geetmala, on CDs. The seriescalled "GEETMALA KI CHHAON MEIN", of which 40 volumes (in packs of five CDs each), have already been produced and released. The volumes have been well appreciated. Sayani also pioneered the export of Indian radio shows and commercials, 1976 onwards. He exported content to USA, Canada, England, the UAE, Eswatini, Mauritius, South Africa, Fiji and New Zealand. In addition, he compered several shows directly for radio stations overseas.

While growing up in Burma (Myanmar), many of us from Indian families, were more than familiar with his melodious voice andeven picked-up simple spoken Hindi listening to his shows.

We will miss you Ameen.
