WASHINGTON DC: NASA astronaut Sunita Williams, who has been in space for nearly five months, extended her warmest wishes for Diwali to those celebrating the festival in the United States and around the globe.

In a video message shared from the International Space Station (ISS), the Indianorigin astronaut said that this year she had the unique opportunity to observe Diwali from 260 miles above Earth and reminisced about her father's efforts to keep their cultural roots alive by teaching her and her family about Diwali and other Indian festivals.

"Greetings from the ISS," Williams said. "I want to extend my warmest wishes for a Happy Diwali to everyone celebrating today at the White House and around the world." "This year I have the unique opportunity to celebrate Diwali from 260 miles above the earth on the ISS...My father kept and shared his cultural roots by teaching us about Diwali and other Indian festivals," US President Joe Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris for their participation in the Diwali festivities and for recognizing the contributions of the community.

she further said.

She emphasized the festival's message of hope and renewal, saying that Diwali is a time of joy as goodness in the world prevails.

Williams also expressed gratitude to

the world prevails...Thank you to the President and the Vice President for celebrating Diwali with our community today and for recognizing the many contributions of our community," she said.

The message was particularly poignant

as it came during a special Diwali celebration held at the White House. Notably, Sunita Williams along with her

fellow astronaut Butch Willmore have been at the ISS since June. The pair had launched aboard Boeing's Starliner spacecraft on June 5 for its first crewed flight, arriving at the space station on June 6.

A decision was made to return Starliner to Earth without its crew, and the spacecraft successfully returned on September 6 after NASA in August said that it was "too risky" to bring Wilmore and Williams back to Earth.

Wilmore and Williams continued their work formally as part of the expedition and will return in February next year. This means what would have been a week-long test flight, extended to around 8 months. *ANI*

"Selected Kamala to be my running mate for many reasons..." President Biden lauds VP Harris ahead of polls

WASHINGTON DC: US President Joe Biden lauded his deputy and Democratic presidential candidate, Kamala Harris, emphasizing that he had many reasons for selecting her as his running mate.

While addressing the White House Diwali celebrations on Monday (28 Oct), Biden called Vice President Harris a "smart, tough and trusted" leader.

He also took a jibe at Harris' rival Republican candidate Donald Trump, saying, Harris has more experience than the "other guy she's running against" and, most importantly, "she has character."

"My wife Jill Biden wanted to be here but she is travelling to Wisconsin, and Kamala (Harris) is travelling as well. You know, I selected Kamala to be my running mate for many reasons. She's smart, she's tough, she's trusted... There's more experience that she has than the whole of that other guy she's running against. But most importantly, she has character, " he said.

Biden highlighted a personal connection with Harris, mentioning how both share a bond over the influence of their mothers in their lives. *ANI*

Addressing the White House Diwali Celebrations on 28 October, the US President said, "The South Asian American community has enriched every part of American life."

"Yours is the fastestgrowing and most engaged community in the world...Now, Diwali is celebrated openly and proudly in the White House," he added.

The President also spoke to the moment's significance, noting that the country is facing an "inflection point" and reminding attendees not to take the 'Idea of America' for granted.

Reflecting on the challenges of American democracy, he acknowledged the ongoing debates and dissent inherent in a diverse society but stressed the importance of unity and historical awareness.

"This is not my house; this is your house...Today we face an inflection point...Every once in a few generations we



are reminded to not take the Idea of America for granted... American Democracy has never been easy. In a country as diverse as ours, we debate, we dissent... but the key is, we never lose sight of how we got here and why," Biden said.

The US President further recalled the time when he and First Lady Jill Biden hosted

the first Diwali celebration at the Vice President's residence in 2016. He touted the diversity of his administration, including current Vice President Kamala Harris as well as US Surgeon General Vivek Murthy.

"Only in America is everything possible," Biden said at the end.

> Over the years, the Bidens' Diwali celebration has added a unique touch to this luminous tradition. The celebration, characterized by lights, color, music, and dancing, also features traditional performances and dancers.

> Diwali events at the White House began with President George W Bush in 2003 and have included President Barack Obama lighting a diya in the Oval Office, as well as then-Vice President Biden hosting a reception in 2016.

President Donald Trump continued the Diwali tradition in 2017 by lighting a diya alongside his daughter Ivanka and Indian American members of his administration. However, in 2018, the crucial midterm elections disrupted the 15-year-long tradition of formal Diwali celebrations at the White House. *ANI*



"Talks will make relationship more dynamic," says PM Modi at bilateral with President Sanchez at Laxmi Vilas Palace

VADODARA: Prime Minister Narendra Modi met Spanish President Pedro Sanchez on 28 October in the Durbar Hall of the famous Laxmi Vilas Palace in Vadodara, following the inauguration of the Tata-Airbus C-295 aircraft assembly facility.

The two leaders enjoyed lunch at the palace, which was built in the late 19th century by Maharaja Sayajirao Gaekwad III, the ruler of the former state of Baroda.

During the bilateral meeting with Pedro Sanchez, Prime Minister Narendra Modi welcomed him.

PM Modi said, "This is your first visit to India. We all missed you at the G20 Summit in New Delhi last year. I am very happy that I am getting the opportunity to welcome you in India during the festival of Deepawali and I am welcoming you in the same Vadodara which made me a Member of Parliament for the first time and later I became the Prime Minister.

"Gujarat is considered the land of festivals and celebrations. Diwali is a symbol of light, enthusiasm, joy, energy and new beginnings. Similarly, your visit has infused new energy and enthusiasm in our relations", he added.

PM Modi also highlighted the opening of a new consulate in Barcelona and said the partnership was dynamic and multifaceted.

"Our partnership is centuries old. Shared belief in values like democracy and rule of law binds us together. We have strong cooperation in many areas like economy, defense, pharma, IT, science and technology and we both emphasize on global peace, prosperity and cooperation. People-to-people contact provides a strong foundation for our relations. Indian young talent is contributing to Spain's green and digital transition goals. In view of the growing people-to-people relations, this year India opened a new Consulate in Barcelona, Spain. We welcome your decision to open a new Consulate of Spain in Bengaluru. I am confident that our talks today will contribute to making our partnership even more dynamic and multifaceted."

Earlier in the day, during the inauguration of the Tata-Airbus aircraft assembly facility in Vadodara, President of the Government of Spain, Pedro Sanchez, highlighted the cultural and industrial ties between India and Spain while reminiscing about the collaboration between renowned Spanish guitarist Paco de Lucia and Indian musician Ravi Shankar in the late 1960s.

Sanchez said, "In the late 1960s, the talented Paco de Lucia and the great In-

dian musician Ravi Shankar brought our two countries closer through music. Together they managed to fuse flamenco and Indian classical music, Spanish guitar with the spirituality of the sitar. This plant will be a symbol of industrial excellence, an engine of growth, and a testament to the close and growing friendship."

Sanchez also underlined the significance of the facility as a collaboration between Tata and Airbus.

PM Modi, President Sanchez renew commitment to India-EU partnership with focus on IMEEC corridor

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Pedro Sanchez reaffirmed their commitment to strengthening the India-EU Strategic Partnership.

A key area of focus for boosting the partnership is the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor Project (IMEEC).

Notably, Sanchez paid an official visit to India on October 28-29. This was President Sanchez's first visit to India and the first visit by a President of the Government of Spain to India after 18 years.

He was accompanied by the Minister of Transport and Sustainable Mobility, the Minister of Industry and Tourism, and a high-level official and business delegation, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said in a press release.

The MEA further said that PM Modi and President Sanchez reaffirmed their commitment to strengthening the India-EU Strategic Partnership and to advancing the EU-India triple negotiations of a comprehensive Free Trade Agreement, Investment Protection Agreement and Geographical Indications Agreement.

They agreed to enhance their collaboration to fully realize the objectives of the EU-India Connectivity Partnership and recognized the potential of the IMEEC to boost connectivity between India and Europe.

The leaders also explored avenues for cooperation among regional countries in areas such as trade, investment, technology, energy, logistics, ports, and infrastructure development, the release added.

Notably, India, the US, UAE, Saudi Arabia, France, Germany, Italy and the European Union signed the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to establish the India-Middle East-Europe *ANI* rating a cutting-edge industrial facility. Today we're also witnessing how an extraordinary project between two emblematic companies becomes a reality. Prime Minister Modi, this is another triumph of your vision. Your vision is to turn India into an industrial powerhouse and a magnet for investment and business. This partnership between Airbus and Tata will contribute to the progress of the Indian aerospace industry and will open new doors for the arrival of other European companies. This project brings together the best of two worlds. Tata is probably the best exponent of Indian industrial strength. Its products and services are present in virtually every country on the planet. Tata is a giant among giants", he added.

Sanchez then hailed Aircraft manufacturing giant Airbus as a leader in technological innovation. The Spanish PM said "As for Airbus, it embodies the very essence of a united Europe, committed to technological innovation and the creation of jobs and prosperity. For my country, for Spain, being an integral part of the Airbus consortium means defending the values it represents--values on which the very idea of Europe is based on cooperation, modernity, and progress."

He expressed confidence in the growth potential for Indian companies, stating, "So if Indian companies want to grow, believe me, they can trust Spain. In 2026, the first C295 manufactured in India will be produced by this plant in Vadodara. This aircraft is a symbol of the Spanish and European aeronautical industry. *ANI*

PM Modi was felicitated by Union Ministers JP Nadda and Mansukh Mandaviya at All India Institute of Ayurveda (AIIA) in the national capital.

The Prime Minister also handed over Ayushman Vaya Vandana Card to the beneficiaries.

Addressing the inauguration of various health projects, BJP national president JP Nadda said that the Prime Minister has dedicated the day to health services and infrastructure for health.

"Necessary for India to settle its relationship with Russia": Ambassador Denis Alipov on India-Russia ties

NEW DELHI: Russian Ambassador Denis Alipov recently discussed key aspects of India-Russia cooperation, including efforts to establish a direct trade payment system in rubles and rupees. While addressing challenges to this mechanism, he noted that both countries are working towards making bilateral payments more feasible despite financial hurdles.

"Both [India and Russia] are thinking about a ruble-rupee trade mechanism," Alipov said. "I'm not a big specialist in finances, but there is no direct exchange of rupee and ruble currently. The problem is not the exchange rate; the biggest challenge is the over-cautiousness of Indian banks regarding transactions with Russia." He attributed this hesitation to pressure from the United States, noting, "The US has been meticulous in tracking transactions between India and Russia, even threatening sanctions."

Alipov further questioned why India should be restricted to working only with the US-aligned countries, and said, "Today it is necessary for India to settle its relationship with Russia; tomorrow the US might ask India to curb its relationship with Bangladesh, for example. There might be an endless list of countries the US decides upon." ANI Pradesh, Bhopal in Madhya Pradesh, Guwahati in Assam and in New Delhi, which will also include a Jan Aushadhi Kendra.

These projects will bring healthcare benefits to around 55 lakh ESI beneficiaries.

PM Modi has been a strong proponent of expanding the usage of technology to enhance service delivery across sectors.

In an innovative usage of drone technology to enhance service delivery to make healthcare more accessible, he also launched drone services at 11 Tertiary Healthcare Institutions.

Over 50K student affiliates of Sheikh Hasina's party, who once ruled campuses, now find themselves in hiding

DHAKA: Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL), the student wing of former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's Awami League (AL) party ruled over Bangladesh for over 15 years before she was ousted and forced to flee following a student-led movement in August, today find themselves in hiding and at the receiving end of interim government's action

At least 50,000 affiliates of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL), the student wing of former Bangladeshi Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's Awami League are now struggling to continue their tertiary education, a report by Al Jazeera stated.

On October 23, the leader of the Bangladeshi interim government led by Muhammad Yunus banned BCL terming it a "terrorist organization". Though Bangladesh's top court scrapped the quota, the protests soon morphed into a wider call for the removal of Hasina's "autocratic" regime, marked by allegations of human rights violations.

The student told AI Jazeera that he did not participate in the government's crackdown against the protests. "My sisters were part of the protests," he said. "I also believed in the cause but was trapped by party obligations."

Talking about his involvement in the now-banned party, the student said, "I was a good student who cared little for politics, but at Dhaka University, hall politics was unavoidable. You either joined, or you suffered." He admitted that being a BCL leader would improve his prospects of landing a government job.

On August 5, protestors stormed prominent government buildings, including Sheikh Hasina's residence and the parliament, and the 77-year-old prime minister fled the country. *ANI*

Job postings up 20 pc in India festive season

NEW DELHI: More than 2.16 lakh job postings were reported in this festive season in the country -- a 20 percent increase compared to 1.8 lakh job postings last year, according to a recent report.

Sustained undersupply in 2024 will fuel NAND prices up 60 percent in 2024, but they are poised to decline by 3 percent in 2025.

With lower supply and a softer pricing landscape in 2025, NAND flash revenue is forecast to total \$75.5 billion in 2025, up 12 percent from 2024, the report noted. *IANS*

NEW DELHI: The inauguration of the TATA Aircraft Complex in Gujarat's Vadodara to manufacture C-295 military transport aircraft marks a key milestone in India's journey toward Atmanirbharta in defense, as the country reached Rs 1.27 lakh crore in domestic defense production in FY24, the government said.

According to data from all defense public sector undertakings (DPSUs), other public sector units manufacturing defense items, and private companies, the value of defense production has surged to a record high of Rs 1,27,265 crore, representing an impressive increase of approximately 174 percent from Rs 46,429 crore in FY 2014-15, according to a Ministry of Defense statement.

The defense exports have reached an all-time high, surging from Rs 686 crore in FY 2013-14 to Rs 21,083 crore in FY 2023-24, reflecting a remarkable increase of over 30 times in export value over the past decade.

Notably, defense exports also experienced a substantial growth of 32.5 percent over the previous fiscal year, rising from Rs 15,920 crore.

India exports to over 100 nations, with

Under the program, 56 C-295 aircraft will be delivered, with the initial 16 arriving from Airbus in Spain and the remaining 40 produced domestically. *IANS*

'Illnesses linked to McDonald's E. coli outbreak rise to 75'

LOS ANGELES: With more cases being reported, the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has confirmed that at least 75 people in the country have been sickened by the E. coli outbreak linked to McDonald's Quarter Pounder hamburgers.

The latest tally, up from 49, including one death, earlier this week, has been reported in 13 states, Xinhua news agency reported. The most recent illness started on October 10, according to the CDC.

Of 61 people with information available, 22 have been hospitalized, and two people developed hemolytic uremic syndrome, a serious condition that can cause kidney failure.

Can standing for long periods raise risk of stroke?

NEW DELHI: People whose occupations require them to stand for long hours, like retail workers, hairdressers, or factory employees, are more susceptible to suffering strokes, according to experts, ahead of World Stroke Day.

World Stroke Day is celebrated annually on October 29 to raise awareness about the condition to prevent and treat it fast.

The number of people worldwide having a new stroke rose to 11.9 million in 2021 -up by 70 per cent since 1990. Stroke-related deaths rose to 7.3 million -- up by 44 per cent since 1990.

While stroke is now the third leading cause of death worldwide (after ischemic heart disease and Covid-19), the condition is highly preventable and

treatable.

Ramdasi noted that over time, poor circulation can also contribute to hypertension -- another



blood flow may lead to the formation of clots, raising the risk of stroke, particularly if these clots travel to the brain," Dr Raghvendra Ramdasi, Consultstroke risk factor.

A recent study from Australia involving over 83,000 participants found that prolonged sitting or standing was linked to a higher

risk of problems such as varicose veins and feeling dizzy or lightheaded.

The study called for regular movements.

It noted that standing for extended periods can cause blood to pool in the legs, which slows circulation and raises the possibility of blood clots.

"An ischemic stroke could result from these clots dislodging and moving to the brain if there is a hole in the heart, where they would stop blood flow," Dr. Vikram Huded, HOD and Director and Clinical Lead - Interventional Neurology at Narayana Group told IANS.

The experts recommended people with existing heart disease, hypertension, or a family history of stroke be particularly careful and take frequent breaks to move around. IANS

New weight loss drugs can cause decline in skeletal muscle mass: Study

NEW DELHI: Amid the growing use of weight loss medications, a new study has raised concerns about declining skeletal muscle health caused by the popular drugs.

In a recent commentary published in The Lancet journal, researchers from the US and Canada highlighted the critical importance of skeletal muscle mass in the context of medically induced weight loss, particularly with the widespread use of GLP-1 re-

ceptor agonists.

While the drugs have shown extreme potential in treating obesity -- a precursor for many diseases like diabetes, hypertension, and cancer -- they can also lead to substantial muscle loss as part of the weight loss process, argued researchers from Pennington Biomedical Research Center in

the US, Universities of Alberta and McMaster in Canada.

They noted that muscle loss -- measured by decreases in fat-free mass -- can account for 25 to 39 percent of total weight lost through the 36 to 72 weeks. The role of skeletal muscle is not only for maintaining physical strength and function but it is also crucial for metabolic health and regulation of the body's immune system. The team found that GLP-1 receptor agonists lead to significantly larger muscle decline than with a non-pharmacological caloric restriction diet or normal ageing. This, the researchers said, "could lead to unintended negative health consequences".

People with poor muscle mass have decreased immunity, and are at increased risk of infections, poor glucose regulation, and other health risks.

> Further, the researchers noted that muscle loss caused by weight reduction can also worsen sarcopenic obesity -prevalent among individuals with obesity, and contributes to cardiovascular disease and higher mortality rates.

Dr. Steven Heymsfield, professor of metabolism and body composition at

Pennington, called on people going for weight loss drugs to be "mindful of the side effects". He added that, while on the medications people are "eating less and not getting the appropriate amount of dietary vitamins and minerals".

An adequate amount of protein along with an optimum amount of exercise should be explored along with the medications, suggested the researchers. *IANS*

Abnormal BMI in childhood can affect future lung function: Study

NEW DELHI: An abnormal body mass index (BMI) in children -- whether high or low -- can be associated with impaired lung function, according to recent research.

About 10 percent people suffer from poor lung function in childhood. They also cannot achieve maximal lung capacity in adulthood, increasing the risk of serious health problems such as cardiovascular disease, lung disease and diabetes.

However, the study led by researchers from Karolinska Institutet in Sweden showed that if their BMI is normalized before they reach adulthood, the impairment can be offset.

The team followed 3,200 children from birth to the age of 24. BMI -- the most common body measurement -- which takes account of weight, but not muscle and fat composition was measured about 4 times.

The results published in The European Respiratory Journal showed that abnormal weight and height were the major risk factors associated with impaired lung function.

Children with a persistently high BMI or an accelerated increasing BMI had impaired lung function as adults. It was primarily the result of restricted airflow in the lungs, a condition known as obstruction.*IANS*

He believes the US is more vulnerable to global election interference than it was in 2020. "Our adversaries, China, Russia, Iran in particular, have realized it is effective and cheap to spread misinformation and disinformation at a greater level than before," said Warner, a Democrat who represents Virginia in the Senate. Social media and technology platforms in general are devoting fewer resources in terms of monitoring their content, generating a flow of false information that can change the way a candidate is perceived without being real. He said even with more traditional platforms like Facebook, Instagram, YouTube and others, content moderation efforts have been cut back dramatically.

The reason U.S. elections are secure is due to its decentralized system, Warner said. Counting takes place at individual polling locations, then it's reported to a county and the state, leaving no way for a foreign adversary to hack into a national system and disrupt the national vote. Warner is concerned that some states have changed their laws to require hand counting.

Historically, many countries have had a history of government interference in disinformation for their own purposes, however, the United States has worked to have better monitoring and tools to protect the information handled on various platforms with the aim of ensuring that real and truthful information is greater and gains more ground in the digital area.



Immigration sustains Finland's population growth

HELSINKI: Current immigration levels will keep Finland's population growing until 2070, according to the latest population forecast by Statistics Finland.

However, the number of children and working-age individuals will decline after mid-century, contributing to an ageing population, Xinhua news agency reported.

Finland's population is expected to reach 6.5 million by 2070, but the number of children under 15 will drop from 832,000 to 700,000. The working-age population, currently around 3.46 million, will peak at 3.84 million in the 2050s before declining.

Markus Rapo, senior statistician at Statistics Finland, noted that high immigration is key to this growth, but it will not stop the rising demographic support ratio. This measures the ratio of non-working individuals to workers and currently stands at 62. However, the ratio is set to increase to 72 by 2070 as the elderly population grows.

While immigration will delay these effects, low birth rates remain a challenge. 2024 marks the seventh consecutive year in which fewer than 50,000 children were born in Finland.

Rapo added that if the birth rate remains low for an extended period, its effects will be felt far into the future. Initially, this will impact the number of children born, he said, while in the long term, it will impact the number of women of childbearing age. *IANS*

Trudeau shared a post on X and wrote, "We're going to significantly reduce the number of immigrants coming to Canada for the next two years. This is temporary to pause our population growth and let our economy catch up. We have to get the system working right for all Canadians."

This plan was announced during a news conference on Parliament Hill, where Trudeau was joined by Immigration Minister Marc Miller, and Miller's parliamentary secretary Paul Chiang.

"The new plan will reduce the number of permanent residents arriving in Canada from 500,000 to 395,000 in 2025 and 500,000 to 380,000 in 2026. The government has set a target of 365,000 permanent residents for 2027," according to the Canada-based

media channel, Cable Public Affairs Channel (CPAC).

Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship, Marc Miller, also shared a post on X about the growth in the short term to achieve well-managed, sustainable growth."

In another post, he wrote, "Big drop in immigration targets will

immigration cuts and wrote, "Today, we announced the 2025-2027 Immigration Levels plan. Immigration is essential to our country's economic success and growth. In response to the evolving needs of our country, this plan will pause population cut population and reduce the need to build more homes."

Notably, Trudeau is facing mounting pressure from within his own party, with dissident Liberal MPs giving him an ultimatum to decide his future by October 28. In response, Trudeau said he will lead his Liberal Party into the next election even after two dozen of his Members of Parliament called on him to step aside, Canada-based Global News reported.

Liberal MP Sean Casey, who was one of three members of the caucus who confirmed that they signed the document calling for the prime minister to resign and termed Trudeau's announcement that he will stay on as leader just hours after MPs expressed their discontent, "disappointing."

During the caucus meeting last week, a document was presented outlining the case for Trudeau's resignation, but it didn't specify any consequences if he fails to meet the deadline.

Justin Pierre James Trudeau is a Canadian politician who has been serving as the 23rd prime minister of Canada since 2015 and the leader of the Liberal Party since 2013. ANI

US-India migration cooperation reason behind latest deportation of illegal Indian migrants from US

WASHINGTON, DC: The United States has deported a batch of Indian nationals who did not have proper legal papers and documentation to live in the country.

The US Department of Homeland Security (DHS) in a statement last week said it has used a chartered flight to send Indian nationals back to India on October 22.

According to sources, as part of India-US cooperation on migration and mobility, both sides are engaged in a process to deter illegal migration.

"This is being done to create

more avenues for legal migration from India to the US. The latest deportation of Indian nationals by a chartered flight is a result of this cooperation. Such deportations have been happening for several years," the sources said.

According to a statement by the DHS, "On October 22, the US Department of Homeland Security (DHS), through U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), conducted a large-frame charter removal flight to the Republic of India of Indian nationals who did not establish legal basis to remain in the United States,".

"This week's flight demon-

strates the Department's continued commitment to pursuing sustained cooperation with the Indian government and other international partners to reduce and deter irregular migration and jointly work to counter human smuggling," it further said.

DHS said that it continues to enforce US immigration laws and deliver tough consequences for those who enter unlawfully. "This includes swiftly returning those without a legal basis to remain in the United States, while encouraging the use of lawful pathways," it said. ANI

Speaking out against what he asserted was the weakening of respect for the US under President Joe Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris, he said, "A report that they issued that if we end up in a war with China, we cannot win. We're not strong enough".

"We have the greatest military in the world," he declared.

"You don't put out reports like that - and it's not true. We would kick their ass," he said.

Even "assuming that's true, how stupid are you to put out a report like that," he said. He did not say which report he was referring to, but it was likely a report from the Commission on the National Defense Strategy to the Senate Armed Services earlier this year.

It said, "The Commission finds that the US military lacks both the capabilities and the capacity required to be confident it can deter and prevail in combat" and that "in many ways, China is outpacing the United States and has largely negated the US military advantage in the Western Pacific".

Trump's strong statement tinged by a colloquial vulgarity was in keeping with his theme of asserting that he would reclaim America's greatness which he said had been devalued by Biden and Harris.

"If we win, our enemies won't be laughing anymore," Trump said

The Madison Square Garden was packed to its capacity of about 19,000 about 90 minutes before his campaign rally was to begin, and thousands were left stranded outside after waiting for hours to get in and watched him on giant screens.

Inside, whipped to bouts of frenzy, the crowd punctuated his speech with screams of, "USA, USA", and "Four more years".

Although most of his nearly 90-minute speech focused on immigration and inflation,

he presented himself as the keeper of world order.

His 2016 Democratic Party rival Hillary Clinton, he said, had warned that he would start World War III, but he was the first president in 82 years not to have launched a foreign military intervention.

He said that if he were the president, Russia would not have invaded Ukraine or Hamas attacked Israel.

He said he got along with Russia's President Vladimir Putin and other adversaries.

"Ukraine was the apple of his (Putin's) eye, but I said, Vladimir, don't go in," Trump said.

On foreign trade, he reiterated his threat to enact what

he called the Trump Reciprocal Tax Act that would impose tariffs of the same amount that countries levied on imports from the US.

He said he would make the US companies bring home their manufacturing, creating jobs in the US.

Trump promised a "golden age" of prosperity for the US.

Attacking Harris as dishonest, he repeated his claim

that she had not worked at McDonald's fast-food restaurant as she had said.

He said that his campaign event of working at a Pennsylvania restaurant was longer than any she might have.

He asserted that Google CEO Sundar Pichai - "a very smart guy" - had called him about it.

Mangling his first name by pronouncing the U as in sun, Trump said, "I got a call from Sundar ... and he said, we've had more hits for McDonald's (story). I think he said (more than) anything we've ever had".

(Harris and many sources maintain that she had worked part-time at McDonald's while she was a student at Howard University in Washington.)

Trump praised his vice presidential candidate J.D. Vance's wife, Usha, as a highly intelligent person who had topped Yale Law School and said their children would be

very smart. Trump trotted out his well-worn accusations that Harris was a radical Leftist who was trying to hide her past radical statements on immigration and being soft on crime but would bring them back if elected.

The media was again his target, calling it "fakers" and "enemy of the people".

Passport, visa details compromised in cyber attack affecting Australia's Department of Home Affairs

CANBERRA: Personal data, including passport and visa information, has been compromised in a cyber attack on a data firm contracted by Australia's Department of Home Affairs.

News Corp Australia newspapers reported recently that data from the Department of Home Affairs, which oversees Australia's law enforcement, national security, emergency management, immigration and cyber security, was exposed in a January cyber attack on Australian firm ZicroDATA, Xinhua news agency reported.

Australian visa holders who used the department's Free Translating Service (FTS), which is run by a subsidiary of ZicroDATA, were advised by a recent departmental alert that their visa application, full names, phone numbers, dates of birth, driver's licenses, and passports were compromised in the breach.

The data was first listed on the dark web in Febru-

ary but the Department of Home Affairs said it was only notified in July that the dataset included documents obtained by the government from people who accessed FTS between 2017 and 2022.

The departmental Cyber Security Incident alert issued to FTS clients instructed them not A spokesperson for the department told News Corp Australia newspapers that they were working with ZicroDATA to notify impacted clients and advise them on steps they can take to protect their information

to attempt to search the dark web for the data, warning that doing so could lead to further potential harm.

A spokesperson for the department told News Corp Australia newspapers that they were working with ZicroDATA to notify impacted clients and advise them on steps they can take to protect their information.

"The department has prioritized accuracy to ensure all relevant details are communicated clearly to those impacted and to put in place the necessary remedial support services, in agreement with ZicroDATA," they said.

Public healthcare provider Monash Health in May revealed it was affected by the ZicroDATA breach, with archived data relating to family violence and sexual assault support units dating from 1970 to 1993 compromised.

The national cyber security coordinator, Michelle McGuinness, said in a statement on May 3 that she was coordinating a response from federal, state and territory governments to the ZicroDATA incident. *IANS*

ne great advantage of the path of personal discipleship is that it requires no intellectual capacity, no special gifts of any kind, to get its profits and make progress along its course. The advantage of having a living master is immense. Man is so sense-bound that it is easier for him to follow an embodied ideal than a disembodied one, easier to understand truth in action than truth in the abstract.

Should anyone have the good fortune to be taken under the wing of a sage, his progress will go forward at a far quicker rate than would otherwise be possible. It is not a little thing that he has someone to turn him in the right direction or that his movement in this direction is guided by an experienced pioneer.


tionship in depth or beauty or value.

The zeal of the Master will by slow degrees permeate the heart of the disciple. Under the sunshine of this encouragement, inspiration, and stimulation, the inner life expands.

Amid chaos in Bangladesh, speculation resurfaces over US role LT GEN PRAKASH KATOCH (RETD)

Mohammad Shahabuddin said in an interview with Dhaka Tribune that he did not have any documentary evidence of Sheikh Hasina's resignation, he did not realize the consequences of this statement on his presidency and that it could even be life threatening. Violent mobs have besieged the presidential house of President Shahabuddin for speaking the truth that Sheikh Hasina did not resign before the military packed her out of the country. They are demanding the resignation of Shahabuddin and removal of the army chief, threatening that otherwise riots will spread throughout Bangladesh and that the country's borders will also witness violence. President Shahabuddin has been given a 24 hour ultimatum to resign (https://youtu.be/

> It remains to be seen whether the residence of President Shahabuddin will be "allowed" to be rampaged by the mobs if he does not resign, and will

he be physically attacked like some of the members of judiciary as part of the regime change? The Army Chief is unlikely to change, considering the recent overhaul in the senior ranks.

Ominous portents

The apparent aim of the mobsters, which include Islamist students backed by sections of the military, is to overturn the constitution and impose Sharia, the Islamic canonical law, in Bangladesh. Release of terrorist leaders from prison like Muhammad Jasimuddin Rahmani, chief of Ansarullah Bangla, an Al-Qaeda affiliate, his confabulations with Lashkare-Toiba's Mufti Haron Izhar, who planned attacks against Indian interests in Bangladesh, and both addressing mass rallies, all point towards this. Removal of the president will usher in military rule.

Business and bonhomie in Kazan: The significance of the BRICS Summit 2024

s the BRICS held its 16th Summit in Kazan, Russia, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi remarked that India is fully committed to increasing cooperation under the BRICS. He reaffirmed the belief in diversity and multipolarity as the strength of the grouping and mentioned that the shared belief in humanity will help give a meaningful shape to the prosperous and strong future of the future generation.

The BRICS Summit, a gathering of the world's leading emerging economies - Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa - has been a significant event on the global stage, and the 2024 edition in Kazan, Russia was no exception. BRICS nations, which collectively account for 30% of the Earth's land mass, 45% of the world's population, and 28% of the global economy have the potential to play a pivotal role in shaping the future of the global economy. For the alliance, which now includes ten member countries, the Summit between October 22-24, 2024, is proving to be a pivotal moment.

Turning point in India-China ties

A major diplomatic development took place on 23 October as Prime Minister Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping held their first bilateral meeting in five years. They emphasized that a stable bilateral relationship between Beijing and New Delhi will contribute to world peace and prosperity. India-China ties, which have been tense due to border concerns in recent years, may improve with the long-awaited meeting between the leaders of the two Asian powers. Significant progress was made in efforts to end the military impasse along the Line of Actual Control. The meeting also helped India and China address their security concerns, with both parties agreeing to return patrolling rights to each other in the Depsang Plains and Demchok region in Ladakh. For many, this represents a turning point in the tense relationship between the two neighbors.

In the meantime, India has taken the position that it is open to providing any support for peace in Ukraine and has been in communication with all parties on the resolution of the Russia-Ukraine conflict through dialogue. PM Modi said that "India is always ready to help bring peace" at his bilateral meeting with Russian President Vladimir Putin.

Additionally, PM Modi held meetings with the presidents of Uzbekistan, UAE, and Iran where they discussed ways to deepen economic cooperation and people-to-people exchanges. Strengthening its relations with Iran in particular has proven to be significant. To gain access to trade routes and exdemonstrate the group's increasing global clout. In announcing its future objectives, the BRICS group has emphasized the need to fortify cooperation and solidarity founded on common interests. It embodied the organization's common vision and goals and described the future course it expects to take. The declaration states, "It reaffirmed the significance of further strengthening BRICS solidarity and cooperation based on our mutual interests."

According to a Goldman Sachs analysis, the BRICS group has long been seen as a growing power in the global economy and in the ensuing decades their economic and demographic sway-especially that of China and India-is expected to increase further. At this Summit, India had the chance to make a time-bound proposal for reforms

pand their influence in the Middle East, India is collaborating with Iran to create the strategically important Chabahar port. Hence, the Summit provided India the opportunity to strengthen its ties with Russia, balance relations with the United States, and strategically align itself with important players such as Iran and the UAE.

BRICS' growing influence in global politics

For India, its adoption of The Kazan Declaration represents yet another significant turning point. The Kazan Declaration is anticipated to support the BRICS countries' joint endeavors to tackle global concerns, ranging from security to economic development, and to at the Summit to international organizations like the WTO, UN Security Council, and multilateral development banks.

The Summit advocated a reform of multilateralism and underlined the importance of people-centric approaches to addressing global issues. With Modi lauding the expanding collaboration and development of BRICS, the enlarged grouping emphasized the significance of communication and diplomacy for world peace and stability. The impact of the U.S. presidential election not only affects the policies and leadership of America but the entire world. As Americans go to the polls next week, partners around the world are watching closely for change with the next U.S. president, not in the sense of decoupling from the United States, but certainly by developing greater self-reliance in security affairs and greater regional integration, more broadly with their own neighbors in anticipation of a less predominant and preeminent United States.

While allies would surely want to see the continuity with the policies but any change in leadership can jeopardize the support US provides. Either of Harris or Trump wins the presidency; there are differences in the intensity and gravity of the change. With Trump's commitments to consolidating critical supply chains, allies and partners are preparing for confrontation with Trump's punitive tariffs. They are also aware that Biden did not remove many of the tariffs, and there is a chance that Kamala Harris is unlikely to embrace lowering tariff barriers.

Whosoever becomes president, Trump or Harris; there are concerns about a decrease in the U.S. security presence at a time when the wars today have demonstrated that neither European nor Asian allies are prepared to defend themselves against conflict in their region without the United States involvement and support. This was made obvious by the war in Ukraine and Israel. During the entire campaign, Trump had been promising to American citizens that he would stop supporting and provide critical supply to Ukraine once elected. With Harris, the commitment to alliances will be undeniably strong, but the subtext of greater selfreliance and, burden sharing will not be irrelevant given limited time and resources.

On climate change commitments, Trump's hostility toward the Paris Agreement is very well known while Harris may be more adjusting towards global commitments and US share the burden equally. While the U.S. election is an important variable for change, the domestic context for every country and region is equally important and will help to determine outcomes.
