"No yielding to nuclear blackmail, no impunity to terrorists...": Jaishankar reiterates India's stance on terrorism

WASHINGTON, DC: External Affairs Minister S to Newsweek in Manhattan. Jaishankar has said that India is not going to yield to nuclear blackmail, stating that New Delhi will no longer accept that terrorists are proxies and spare the government that supports and finances them. He said terrorists will be treated with "no impunity" and India will do what needs to be done to defend its people.

"We are not going to yield to nuclear blackmail that you know there could be escalation, and therefore we should not do anything," Jaishankar said in an interview

The External Affairs minister's remarks come nearly two months after the April 22 terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam in which 26 people were killed.

Jaishankar called it an "act of warfare" aimed at destroying tourism in Kashmir, which he said was the mainstay of the economy. He stated that India, after the Pahalgam attack, decided that it could not allow terrorists to function with impunity.

Asked about India's message to global powers and international institutions on cross-border terrorism emanating from Pakistan, he said, "This morning, I was at an exhibition on terrorism at the United Nations, and this was something which our embassy, our mission to the UN, had organized and the reason we did that, we had a number of ambassadors from other countries who were there as well is because we believe that terrorism is actually a threat to everybody, that no country should use it as an instrument to further its policies because at the end of the day it comes back to bite everyone."

"If we take the view that one terrorist act or one terrorist organization or one sponsor of terrorism is justified here or you give them a free pass or you underplay it, it can easily happen, in fact, it does happen in other situations. The message to the world has to be that there should be zero tolerance for terrorism, that there should be no

He said, "We have had a string of these attacks and we've now reached a point, and I think in many ways the Pahalgam terrorist attack on April 22nd, this sentiment in India that look enough is enough that we are because you know the Pahalgam was meant, I mean it was an act of economic warfare. It was meant to destroy tourism in Kashmir which was the mainstay of the economy. It was also meant to provoke religious violence because people were asked to identify their faith before they were killed. We decided that we cannot let terrorists function with impunity, the idea that they're on that side of the border and that therefore sort of prevents retribution, I think is a proposition that needs to be challenged and that is what we did."

"So, now bear in mind these are not people you know who operate in secret, I mean these are terrorist organizations who have the equivalent of the corporate headquarters in the populated towns of Pakistan everybody knows what is the headquarters of organization A and organization B and those are actually the buildings, the headquarters that we destroyed," he told Newsweek.

Emphasizing India's stance on dealing with terrorism, Jaishankar said, "We are very clear, there will be no impunity for terrorists that we will not deal with them any longer as proxies and spare the government which supports and finances and in many ways motivates them."

Jaishankar emphasized that India will not be deterred by the threat of nuclear weapons when it comes to responding to cross-border attacks.

"We will not allow nuclear blackmail to prevent us from responding because we've also heard this for too long that you know you are both nuclear countries therefore the other guy will come and do horrible things but you mustn't do anything because it gets the world worried. ANI

# Quad ministers demand bringing Pahalgam terrorists to justice, renew commitment to counterterrorism

WASHINGTON: Renewing their commitment to work together to fight terrorism, the Quad foreign ministers have demanded that all those responsible for the "reprehensible" Pahalgam attack be immediately brought to justice and countries concerned cooperate with the authorities.

In a joint statement after their meeting recently, they said, "We call for the perpetrators, organizers, and financiers of this reprehensible act to be brought to justice without any delay and urge all UN Member States, in accordance with their obligations under international law and relevant UNSCRs (Security Council Resolutions), to cooperate actively with all relevant authorities in this regard."

"The Quad unequivocally condemns all acts of terrorism and violent extremism in all its forms and manifestations, including cross-border terrorism, and renews our commitment to counterterrorism cooperation," the statement said.

External Affairs Minister (EAM) S. Jaishankar, US Secretary of State Marco Rubio, Foreign Ministers Penny Wong of Australia and Takeshi Iwaya of Japan representing the major democracies of the Indo-Pacific region met for their second ministerial meeting of the year.

They said, "We condemn in the strongest terms the terrorist attack in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir, on April 22, 2025, which claimed the lives of 25 In-

dian nationals and one Nepali citizen, while injuring several others."

The statement did not name any country while calling for bringing the perpetrators of the massacre to justice, but the nation was obvious because The Resistance Front, which carried out the attack, is an arm of the Lashkar-e-Taiba, which is

The ministers said that they "plan to launch the Quad Ports of the Future Partnership in Mumbai this year."

pact," the ministers announced, "a new, ambitious, and strong agenda focused on four key areas" that will "sharpen the Quad's ability to leverage our resources to address the region's most pressing challenges."

The four areas are maritime and transnational security, economic prosperity and security, critical and emerging technology, and humanitarian assistance and emergency response.

While their joint statement repeatedly spoke of threats to countries in the region from the use of force and coercion by China, they did not name it.

"We remain seriously concerned about the situation in the East China Sea and South China Sea," the statement said listing the various actions, including "unilateral actions that seek to change the status quo by force or coercion ... dangerous and provocative actions, including interference with offshore resource development, the repeated obstruction of the freedoms of navigation and overflight, and the dangerous maneuvers by military aircraft and coast guard and maritime militia vessels, especially the unsafe use of water cannons and ramming or blocking actions in the South China Sea."

While China was not mentioned, it had carried out all those actions against the Philippines, Vietnam, and South Korea, and it has been involved in disputes with Malaysia over offshore oil drilling.

"These actions threaten peace and stability in the region", they said. "We are seriously concerned by the militarization of disputed features."

The ministers expressed concern over the disruptions to the supply chain, particularly of critical minerals and said it was important to diversify supplies. *IANS*

# India and France wrap up SHAKTI 2025, strengthening military interoperability and strategic defense partnership

PARIS: The 13th French Foreign Legion Demi-Brigade (13th DBLE) hosted the eighth edition of the Indo-French Army exercise SHAKTI from 18 June to 1 July 2025 in France, according to a release by the Embassy of France in India.

The exercise involved more than 500 legionnaires and military personnel from various units of the French Army, the Foreign Legion, as well as the French Air and Space Force, and the French Navy.

The Indian contingent of 90 personnel primarily comprised a battalion of the Jammu and Kashmir Rifles, besides personnel from other arms and services. About 50 armored and tactical vehicles and fighter jets have been deployed in this exercise.

The joint drills were held in two phases. The first, which took place from 18 to 21 June in Aveyron, Monclar district, focused on ramping up joint training on shooting,

WASHINGTON, DC: External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has refuted US President Donald Trump's claims that he used trade to force India and Pakistan to accept a ceasefire after tensions escalated between the two nations following India's Operation Sindoor. Jaishankar said he was present when Prime Minister Narendra Modi and US Vice President JD Vance held a telephonic conversation on the night of May 9.

During the fireside chat with Newsweek, Jaishankar stated that Vance had told PM Modi that Pakistan would launch a massive assault on India if they did not accept certain things. According to him, PM Modi during the call indicated that there would be a response from India.

Jaishankar confirmed that Pakistan launched a massive attack on that night, to which India responded quickly. He stated that he received a call from US Secretary of State Marco Rubio called him the next day and expressed Pakistan's willingness to hold talks.

When asked about whether Trump's claims of using trade as a means of resolving the India-Pakistan conflict have affected trade negotiations, Jaishankar said, "No, I don't think so. I think the trade people are doing what the trade people should be doing, which is negotiating with numbers and lines and products and making their tradeoffs. I think they're very professional and very focused about it." *ANI*

### Human rights body condemns rape of Hindu woman in Bangladesh

DHAKA: In yet another disturbing incident of violence on minorities and the atrocities against women in Bangladesh, a Hindu woman was brutally gang raped in her own home in the Cumilla district, while her attackers filmed the assault and circulated the footage, a human rights body said recently.

So far, five accused have been arrested, including the main accused, Fajar Ali, who is a politician of the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP).

The Human Rights Congress for Bangladesh Minorities (HRCBM) said that the culprits circulated the video of the brutal assault "like a war trophy."

"On the night of June 26, 2025, a Hindu woman in Muradnagar, Cumilla District, endured one of the most brutal forms of violence imaginable: her home was forcibly invaded, her dignity shattered, and her trauma recorded and circulated like a war trophy. She was gang raped by multiple assailants, her cries echoing through the silence of a country that has, for decades, looked away from the suffering of its most vulnerable," read a statement issued by the HRCBM.

The human rights organization also mentioned that the law enforcement officials failed to arrange a mandatory medical examination, delayed filing her First Information Report (FIR) until June 29, and later deflected blame by claiming it was "up to her" to pursue medical treatment. *IANS*

### Asian Americans Advancing Justice condemns Supreme Court order

CHICAGO: Asian Americans Advancing Justice - urged to stop the Massachusetts District Court's order that was safeguarding immigrants from deportation to third-party countries without due process.





### Study finds how pig kidney transplants work in humans

NEW DELHI: With xenotransplantation -- animal-to-human transplantation -- poised to address the global organ shortage crisis, a pioneering study has outlined how human immune cells interact with pig kidney tissue in transplanted organs, revealing critical early markers of rejection and potential intervention strategies.

Led by French and US researchers, the study deployed cutting-edge spatial molecular imaging to find key molecular mechanisms that could help overcome the biggest challenge in xenotransplantation: rejection by the human immune system.

The team led by Dr. Valentin Goutaudier from the Paris Institute for Transplantation and Organ Regeneration & NYU Langone Transplant Institute) found that human immune cells were found in every part of the pig kidney's filtering system after the transplant.

Researchers observed early molecular signs of antibody-mediated rejection as soon as Day 10 and peaking at Day 33, reinforcing previous findings that rejection begins rapidly but progresses over time.

By tracking these immune responses for up to 61 days, the team identified a crucial window for targeted therapeutic intervention.

"Our study provides the most detailed molecular map to date of how the human immune system engages with a transplanted pig kidney," explained Goutaudier, while presenting the study at the ESOT Congress 2025 in London, UK. IANS

# Your morning cup of coffee key to slow down ageing, boost longevity: Study

NEW DELHI: Love your morning cup of coffee? A new study has shown that it may not only energize you but also help slow down ageing and boost longevity.

Caffeine has long been linked to potential health benefits, including reduced risk of age-related diseases.

However, the study led by researchers from Queen Mary University of London in the UK revealed how caffeine works inside human cells, and what exactly its connections are with nutrient and stress-responsive gene and protein networks.

The researchers found that caffeine affects ageing by tapping into an ancient cellular energy system.

They showed that caffeine works by activating an important system called AMPK -- a cellular fuel gauge that is evolutionarily conserved in yeast and humans.

"When your cells are low on energy, AMPK kicks in to help them cope," said Dr Charalampos (Babis) Rallis, Reader in Genetics, Genomics, and Fundamental Cell Biology at Queen Mary's University of London's Centre for Molecular Cell Biology.

"And our results show that caffeine helps flip that switch," Rallis added, in the paper published in the journal Microbial Cell.

Interestingly, AMPK is also the target of metformin -- a common diabetes drug that's being studied for its potential to extend the human lifespan together with rapamycin.

Using a yeast model, the researchers showed that caffeine's effect on AMPK influences how cells grow, repair their DNA, and respond to stress -- all of which are tied to ageing and disease.

"These findings help explain why caffeine might be

beneficial for health and longevity," said Dr John-Patrick Alao, the postdoctoral research scientist leading this study.

"And they open up exciting possibilities for future research into how we might trigger these effects more directly -- with diet, lifestyle, or new medicines," Alao added. *IANS* 



### Indian researchers develop diagnostic device to detect early-stage bone cancer

NEW DELHI: In a major scientific breakthrough, researchers from IIT (BHU) in Uttar Pradesh have developed a miniaturized, self-reporting diagnostic device that can detect early-stage bone cancer with high precision.

The first-of-its-kind sensor detects osteopontin (OPN) -- a key biomarker for bone cancer.

The device is reagent-free, portable, and cost-effective and is ideal for rural healthcare.

said the research team led by Dr. Pranjal Chandra from the School of Biochemical Engineering.

The device works much like a glucose meter and enables quick, accurate, and on-the-spot detection, even in resource-limited settings.

The device uses a custom sensor surface composed of gold and redox-active nanomaterial, allowing it to function similarly to a glucose meter.

"This technology simplifies cancer detection and empowers primary health centers," said Prof. Chandra. The findings are published in the prestigious journal Nanoscale (Royal Society of Chemistry, UK).

OPN is a crucial biomarker associated with osteosarcoma - a highly aggressive form of bone cancer that primarily affects children and adolescents.

While current methods to detect OPN are costly and timeconsuming, the new device offers rapid and accurate results with minimal equipment. It is designed as a reagentless immunosensor, which enables on-the-spot and affordable testing. It is especially beneficial in rural and resource-constrained areas where early cancer detection is often delayed.

Cancer is a major public health concern in India, with rising incidence rates and significant mortality.

Lauding the innovation, Director Prof. Amit Patra called it "a prime example of technology with

a human face". He said it contributes to precision medicine and national health priorities. He added that the innovation aligns with the government's Make in India and Start-up India initiatives.

A patent application has been filed, and efforts are underway to convert the prototype into a smartphone-compatible diagnostic kit for remote healthcare access, the researchers said. IANS

# This new AI tool can detect 9 types of dementia from single brain scan

NEW DELHI: In a significant achievement for identifying neurodegenerative diseases early, a team of US researchers has developed a new artificial intelligence (AI) tool that helps clinicians detect brain activity patterns linked to nine types of dementia using a single and widely available scan.

The tool, StateViewer, not only helped in early detection but also provided accurate diagnosis -- it identified the dementia type in 88 percent of cases, including Alzheimer's disease.

It also enabled clinicians to interpret brain scans nearly twice as fast and with up to three times greater accuracy than standard workflows, according to the research, published online in the journal Neurology.

Researchers from the Mayo Clinic trained and tested the AI on more than 3,600 scans, including images from patients with dementia and people without

cognitive impairment.

Currently, diagnosing dementia requires cognitive tests, blood draws, imaging, and clinical interviews, and yet, distinguishing conditions such as Alzheimer's, Lewy body dementia and frontotemporal dementia remains a challenge.

"Every patient who walks into my clinic carries a unique story shaped by the brain's complexity," said David Jones, a Mayo Clinic neurologist.

"StateViewer reflects that commitment -- a step toward earlier understanding, more precise treatment, and, one day, changing the course of these diseases," added Jones, director of the Mayo Clinic Neurology Artificial Intelligence Program.

The tool analyses a fluorodeoxyglucose positron emission tomography (FDG-PET) scan, which shows how the brain uses glucose for energy. It then compares the scan to a large database of scans from people

with confirmed dementia diagnoses and identifies patterns that match specific types, or combinations, of dementia.

While Alzheimer's affects memory and processing regions, Lewy body dementia involves areas tied to attention and movement. Frontotemporal dementia alters regions responsible for language and behavior.

StateViewer displays these patterns through color-coded brain maps that highlight key areas of brain activity, giving all clinicians, even those without neurology training, a visual explanation of what the AI sees and how it supports the diagnosis.

Dementia affects more than 55 million people worldwide, with nearly 10 million new cases each year.

Alzheimer's disease, the most common form, is now the fifth-leading cause of death globally. *IANS* 

# A bowl of spinach, kale and broccoli may boost heart health in elderly women

NEW DELHI: Eating a bowl of leafy green and cruciferous vegetables like spinach, kale, and broccoli may be good to ward off the risk of heart attack and stroke, particularly in elderly women.

A team of researchers from the Edith Cowan University (ECU), the University of Western Australia, and the Danish Cancer Institute found that leafy green vegetables - rich in Vitamin K1 -- may help prevent atherosclerotic vascular diseases (ASVDs).

ASVD is a subgroup of cardiovascular diseases -- the leading cause of death worldwide, primarily due to heart attacks and strokes. It causes plaque to build up inside the arteries, potentially leading to cardiovascular problems.

The research conducted in 1,436 elderly women showed that a higher dietary intake of Vitamin K1 could reduce the risk of ASVD.

In addition, Vitamin K may also be beneficial for musculoskeletal health, through its impact on bone strength.

Notably, a higher Vitamin K1 intake also leads to less thickening of blood vessels



in the neck -- a marker of atherosclerosis.

"Leafy green and cruciferous vegetables, like spinach, kale, and broccoli, contain Vitamin K1 which may assist in preventing vascular calcification processes that characterize cardiovascular disease. The great news is that these vegetables can be easily incorporated into your daily meals" said Montana Dupuy from ECU. ECU Senior Research Fellow Dr Marc Sim noted that a cup and a half of such vegetables is an easy way to increase our daily vitamin K intake and may lower our risk for cardiovascular disease".

"This research found women who consumed approximately 30 percent higher intakes of Vitamin K1 had lower long-term risk of ASVD," he said.

As the research provided key evidence to support future studies, the team is now creating new foods that pack more leafy greens that are rich in Vitamin K1, to be used in communities with special nutritional and dietary requirements, such as aged care residents. *IANS*

### Remittances by Indians working abroad scale record high of \$135 billion

MUMBAI: The remittances sent back home by Indians working abroad have registered a 14 percent rise in the financial year 2024-25 to a record \$135.46 billion, according to data compiled by the RBI.

The RBI said the inflows, classified under "private transfers", accounted for more than 10 percent of India's gross current account flows of \$1 trillion in FY25.

Personal transfer receipts. mainly representing remittances by Indians employed overseas, rose to \$33.9 billion in the January-March quarter of 2024-25 from \$31.3 billion in the same quarter of the previous year, RBI data shows.



Indians working abroad sent home a record \$129.4 billion in 2024, with the highest ever inflows of \$36 billion in the October-December quarter.

India tops the list of recipient countries for remittances in 2024 and is way ahead of second-placed Mexico with \$68 billion. China (\$48 billion) is in the third spot, followed by the Philippines (\$40 billion) and Pakistan (\$33 billion), according to figures compiled by World Bank economists.

The growth rate of remittances in the 2024 calendar year is estimated to be 5.8 percent, compared to 1.2 percent registered in 2023, according to the World Bank data.

The number of Indians working overseas has tripled from 6.6 million in 1990 to 18.5 million in 2024, with its share in global migrants rising from 4.3 percent to over 6 percent during the same period. Indian migrants in the Gulf countries account for around half of the total Indian migrants in the world. IANS

NEW DELHI: US President Donald Trump has issued a deportation warning for Tesla and Space CEO Elon Musk who also served as his former advisor, saying the tech billionaire may need to "close up shop" and move back to South Africa in absence of electric vehicle (EV) subsidies.

Trump's warning on his Truth Social platform this week came amid the feud between him and Musk over the 'One Big Beautiful Bill'.

"Elon Musk knew, long before he so strongly Endorsed me for President, that I was strongly against the EV Mandate. It is ridiculous, and was always a major part of my campaign. Electric cars are fine, but not everyone should be forced to own one. Elon may get more subsidy than any human being in history, by far, and without subsidies, Elon would probably have to close up shop and head back home to South Africa," Trump wrote on Truth Social.

### 9 sectors have potential to generate up to \$738 billion revenue in India by 2030: Report

NEW DELHI: Driven by sound fundamentals and a resilient economy, Indian firms in nine sectors could collectively generate between \$588 billion and \$738 billion in revenues by 2030, according to a new report.

McKinsey & Company said in its report that this represents a three-and-a-half fold surge from \$164-206 billion pegged in 2023.

The nine sector are: e-commerce, semiconductor, Cloud services, cybersecurity, electric vehicle and battery, artificial intelligence (AI) software and services, space, nuclear fission, and robotics.

According to the report, the sectors were chosen based on either patent activity being twice


the median or research and development (R&D) investment outpacing the national average by a factor of two.

In e-commerce, revenue estimates project a four-fold increase, from \$60-70 billion in 2023 to \$240-300 billion by 2030.

In the electric vehicle (EV) sector, revenues are expected increase six-fold to eight-fold to touch \$40-60 billion by the end of the decade.

In the space sector, revenues are expected to rise fourfold to fivefold by 2030, according to the report.

Semiconductor revenues are expected to treble from \$40-45 billion in 2023 to \$100-120 billion by 2030, it added. IANS

### US tightens visa rules for Pakistani applicants

KARACHI: The US consulates in Karachi and Lahore have mandated that all F, M, and J nonimmigrant visa applicants make their social media accounts public as part of enhanced vetting measures, ARY News reported.

This directive aligns with a similar policy recently enacted by the US Embassy in Delhi.

An internal US State Department cable, dated June 18, instructs consular officers to screen visa applicants more thoroughly to detect any individuals with hostile views toward the United States or its institutions.

The move is part of President Donald Trump's broader strategy to tighten immigration screening, according to official statements.

ARY News further reported that the consulates announced on Instagram that applicants must adjust their social media privacy settings to allow officials to verify identity and eligibility.

The consulates warned that failure to comply could result in visa denial or future ineligibility.

Since 2019, visa applicants have been required to list their

social media handles on application forms. However, the updated

rule extends transparency by requiring public access to profiles

for F (academic), M (vocational), and J (exchange visitor) visa categories.

ARY News noted that these updated screening procedures, aimed at bolstering national security, require consular officers to conduct comprehensive background checks, including detailed reviews of applicants' social media activity.

The State Department stated, "Every visa adjudication is a national security decision... We must ensure that those applying for admission do not intend to harm Americans or our institutions."

Building on this approach, the US government has now made it mandatory for all F, M, and J non-immigrant visa applicants to set their social media profiles to 'public' so that officials can properly verify their identity and admissibility under US law. ANI

# Mexican govt reiterates protection for nationals amid US immigration raids

MEXICO CITY: Mexican President Claudia Sheinbaum has said that her government will protect the country's migrants in the United States, where a series of immigration raids have resulted in the arrest of 252 Mexican nationals.

"Our solidarity, our support, and everything within our reach -- we will do everything to protect our migrant brothers and sisters," said the president during her daily press conference last week.

Sheinbaum also noted that Mexican consulates in the United States have been instructed to visit, at least once a day, the detention centers of Immigration and Customs Enforcement and Customs and Border Protection, as part of a strategy to strengthen the protection of Mexican mi-

grants, reports Xinhua news agency.

She added that the consuls are required to hold a public hearing once a week "to listen and understand what is happening so they can take action."

The president emphasized that her government will spare no effort or resources to protect migrants from threats or rights violations, and pledged that complaints and concerns raised by Mexicans abroad will be addressed without exception.

Sheinbaum also condemned Florida Governor Ron DeSantis' proposal to build a new detention facility dubbed "Alligator Alcatraz" in the wetlands in the south of the state.

"Immigrants are not criminals," she said. IANS

# Trump hails Supreme Court ruling limiting injunctions as landmark win for executive power

WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump celebrated a major victory after the Supreme Court limited the ability of federal judges to impose nationwide injunctions, a decision that could expand his executive power, CNN reported.

Trump, who has often criticized unelected judges for blocking his policies, saw the ruling as a form of vindication. "Thanks to this decision, we can now promptly file to proceed with these numerous policies and those that have been wrongly enjoined on a nationwide basis," Trump said during an hourlong press conference at the White House. The case in question stemmed from a challenge related to birthright citizenship, though the broader impact of the ruling centers on presidential authority, CNN noted.

The decision marked a high point in what Trump described as one of the most consequential weeks of his second administration. According to a senior

Israeli military official, Trump also launched military strikes on Iran during the same period. Trump took the podium wearing a confident smile, thanking the court and singling out Justice Amy Coney Barrett--whom he had previ-

ously criticized--for writing the majority opinion. "I want to thank Justice Barrett, who wrote the opinion brilliantly, as well as Chief Justice Roberts and Justices Alito, Gorsuch, Kavanaugh and Thomas. Great people," Trump said.

In the ruling, Barrett wrote, "When a court concludes the executive branch has acted unlawfully, the answer is not for the court to exceed its power too." Trump, according to CNN, cited the opinion as support for his long-standing position against nation-wide judicial overreach. White House officials indicated that the ruling would allow Trump to advance policies that were previously blocked, including defunding sanctuary cities, freezing refugee resettlement, and suspending taxpayer-funded transgender medical care.

Trump's Attorney General Pam Bondi, speaking alongside him, said, "These injunctions have allowed district court judges to be emperors. They vetoed all of President Trump's power, and they cannot do that. This has been a bipartisan problem that has lasted five presidential terms. Five different presidents and it has ended today." *ANI*

### 'Strong capital flow and consolidation continue to drive real estate growth'

NEW DELHI: Aided by strong collections and delivery lined up for next 2-3 years, the real estate companies in India are estimated to clock 22 percent CAGR in revenue over FY25-FY27 to Rs 861 billion, a report of 26 June showed.

EBITDA is expected to post a 26 percent CAGR to Rs 252 billion and blended operating margin is estimated to improve by 168bp to 29 percent over FY25-27E, according to the sector update report by Motilal Oswal Financial Services Ltd.

"With the timely execution of strong project pipeline, companies will achieve robust collections. Collections are expected to clock a 36 percent CAGR to Rs 1.5 trillion over FY25-27E," the report mentioned.

Strong collections should result in healthy operating cash flow (OCF) generation of Rs 600 billion by FY27E, while cumulative OCF is expected to be Rs 1.4 trillion over FY25-27E.

"With strong cash flow generation, developers are shifting their focus to business development to sustain the strong growth trajectory. Additionally, strong OCF generation allows developers to keep net D/E in check and at the comfortable level of below 0.5x," the report noted. *IANS*

## India's commercial, residential real estate market shows strong fundamentals in H1 2025



MUMBAI: Private equity (PE) investment in India's office real estate sector in the first half this year reflected measured optimism, driven by asset quality, prime locations and long-term tenancy visibility, according to a report of 26 June.

PE investments into Indian real estate sector stood at \$1.7 billion, spread across 12 deals in the April-June period.

While overall capital deployment across real estate declined due to global macroeconomic pressures, the office segment stood out with \$706 million invested across three transactions in H1 2025, marking a 22 percent increase from \$579 million in H1 2024, according to the report by Knight Frank India.

Rather than broad-based investment, this growth was fuelled by strategic allocations into high-quality, Grade-A assets in core markets.

Investors showed a preference for larger, stabilized or near-stabilized office spaces

with strong cash flow potential, often through joint ventures or REIT-aligned platforms.

A notable trend in H1 2025 was the near-equal split between investments in ready and underconstruction assets - about 50 percent each, said the report.

"India's commercial real estate market continues to show strong fundamentals, driven by the return to office, rising absorption levels, and strengthening rental values," said Shishir Baijal, Chairman and Managing Directate to show the strength of the str

tor, Knight Frank India.

Similarly, the residential sector has seen year-on-year growth, and retail consumption remains steady, supported by overall economic momentum.

"These factors have encouraged investors to adopt a long-term outlook on the Indian market. As macroeconomic conditions in the West begin to ease, we expect global capital flows to return to Indian real estate, further supported by the country's sustained growth and improving regulatory clarity," he mentioned.

After witnessing a slowdown post 2017 due to regulatory shifts like RERA and GST, residential real estate has seen a transformation in investment strategy. While volumes in H1 2025 remained below the peak achieved in 2015-16, the nature of capital deployment has matured, with a sharper focus on structured and risk-mitigated approaches.

According to the report, a key trend in H1 2025 was the return to credit instruments - 60 percent of the \$500 million invested came through debt structures, compared to 40 percent the previous year. Institutional investors preferred collateral-backed investments. *IANS* 

# ED attaches Rs 557 cr assets in Mahira Group scam; ex-MLA among accused

NEW DELHI: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has provisionally attached assets worth approximately Rs 557.43 crore in a major crackdown on a real estate scam involving Mahira Group companies.

The action, taken under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), includes 35 acres of residential and commercial land across key sectors

in Gurugram and fixed deposits of around Rs 97 lakh.

The case pertains to Mahira Infratech Pvt Ltd (formerly Sai Aaina Farms Pvt Ltd), Mahira Buildtech Pvt Ltd, and Czar Buildwell Pvt Ltd. The ED began its probe based on multiple FIRs lodged by the Gurugram Police for cheating and forgery. These companies allegedly submitted forged documents, including fake

bank guarantees, to obtain licenses for affordable housing projects in Sectors 68, 103, and 104 of Gurugram.

More than Rs 616 crore was collected from 3,700 homebuyers for these projects, which the company failed to deliver. Instead, funds were misappropriated, with money siphoned off using inflated construction costs and bogus invoices from

associated entities.

position as India's top office market. Hyderabad, Mumbai and Chennai also witnessed strong occupier traction, each recording over 2.5 million square feet of leasing in the quarter, the findings showed

This momentum signals growing occupier confidence, particularly from flex space operators and firms across sectors such as technology, BFSI and engineering and manufacturing, etc.

"The fact that five of the seven major cities recorded over 2.0 million square feet of leasing each in a single quarter highlights the depth and vibrancy







### Israel and the 'Clash of Civilizations': The Case for a Muslim Nuclear Security Framework

ong before Samuel Huntington gave it academic legitimacy, Israel began promoting the notion of a "clash of civilizations" as a strategic tool in the post-Cold War era. The purpose was clear: to position Israel as the vanguard of "Judeo-Christian civilization" under siege, thereby justifying its continued exploitation of U.S. power and resources. This ideological framing, packaged later by Huntington as a cultural theory, was in fact a geopolitical instrument aimed at sustaining American military and diplomatic support for Israel's regional ambitions.

This framework is no longer theoretical. Israel has actively applied the "clash of civilizations" logic in its wars against Hamas in Gaza and, more recently, in its attacks on Iran. These conflicts have been deliberately cast as religious battles-between "the children of light and the children of darkness", a binary drawn from biblical scripture and deployed to resonate with American religious and political narratives. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's references to the Old Testament, Reinhold Niebuhr's

senal, combined with its repeated threats and recent attacks, has forced Iran to reassess its strategic posture. In this context, Iran's appreciation of Pakistan's nuclear deterrent has grown. Despite complex regional dynamics, Tehran increasingly views Islamabad's nuclear stance as a stabilizing force that signals to Israel and its backers that unchecked aggression carries real risks.

#### Time for collective narrative

In the face of a collapsing international order, paralyzed by UN Security Council gridlock and Western double standards, it is time for Muslim-majority nations to consider a collective alternative. For many small and medium-sized states in the Islamic world, conventional deterrence is insufficient. Drawing from realist theory, particularly Kenneth Waltz's structural realism, a nuclear deterrence framework led by Pakistan emerges as not only a rational option but a necessary one.

A Pakistan-led Muslim nuclear security initiative would not be aimed at prolifera-



This civilizational narrative has been aggressively promoted across American policymaking circles, social media ecosystems, and religious institutions. In doing so, Israel has effectively turned American support into a religious and cultural allegiance rather than a strategic alliance, hollowing out the international legal system in the process.

tion or escalation. Rather, it could serve as a stabilizing force, supporting the existing international order through multilateral cooperation. With Pakistan's technical capacity and strategic positioning, this framework could

provide a nuclear umbrella for countries under direct threat, such as Iran, Turkey, Egypt, Jordan, Gulf States, and Southeast Asian nations like Malaysia and Indonesia.

Such an initiative, guided by neoliberal institutionalism, would include shared protocols, joint inspections, and cooperation with international bodies like the IAEA. Drawing from constructivist theory, it could also foster a shared sense of purpose and identity among Muslim nations, one rooted not in confrontation, but in mutual assurance, stability, and a commitment to regional peace.

# The Third Eye: New shades of 'proxy war'

ars were always fought outside of the 'battlefield' as well- through the classic operations of Espionage, Sabotage and Subversion conducted "covertly".

'Open warfare' was always supplemented by Intelligence efforts to assess the strength and war plans of the enemy.

Post-Cold War, the world has seemingly passed into the era of "proxy wars", in which militants and terrorists could be secretly infiltrated with weapons into the enemy territory where they would covertly plan to carry out attacks on strategic and military assets of the adversary, causing them substantial damage. This was also termed as an "asymmetric war".

edge economy".

IT Revolution set the pace for 'Information Wars' of which 'Influence' operations are a part. Influence warfare is a strategic instrument that uses information and communication technologies to manipulate perceptions, shape public responses and achieve political and defense objectives, often without a direct military confrontation.

It involves influencing public opinion to undermine the adversary's legitimacy. This is done through "narrative building", disinformation and cyber operations.

In India's experience, social media is used by opponents at home and the adversaries abroad-particularly by the Sino-Pak axis, to run down the govern-

The anti-Soviet armed campaign in Afghanistan, run on the war cry of Jehad, was the best illustration of such a war and it was successful in driving the Soviet troops out of that country.

A proxy war damages the opponent economically, as was found to be the case with the Soviet Union, which collapsed primarily because of the economic burden of the Afghan war. It so happened that the year of Soviet dismemberment, 1991, was also the year that marked the success of the Information Technology Revolution, characterized by instant communication across geographical frontiers and the advent of the Information Age.

This created a new level of globalized competitiveness and opened the gates of the "knowl-

ment and sully the country's image internationally.

China, unsurprisingly, has attracted notice for going beyond "influence warfare" to indulge in clandestine operations to interfere with elections in the US, its prime enemy, to alter the results to the Chinese advantage.

Kash Patel, appointed by US President Donald Trump as FBI Director, announced the declassification of intelligence reports that outlined an unconfirmed claim to the effect that the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) had mass-produced counterfeit American driving licenses as part of a larger scheme to interfere with the 2020 Presidential election.

The alleged objective was to facilitate fraudulent mail-in ballots

to favor Joe Biden.

In August 2020, based on intelligence, the US Customs had reportedly seized nearly 20,000 fake driving licenses.

Kash Patel has submitted the reports to Senate Judiciary Committee Chairman Chuck Grassley for further examination. This development follows another significant disclosure by FBI Director Christopher Wray in November 2022 that the FBI was monitoring reports about the Chinese Government having established unauthorized Police Stations in the US in outrageous violation of US sovereignty and all norms of law and order cooperation protocols.

Several US nationals of Chinese origin were said to have been arrested in April 2023 for running a "Police OutPost" in Manhattan and taking orders from China's Ministry of Public Security for intimidating on social media any Chinese dissidents abroad and for projecting China's image.

These are strikingly bold examples of how "influence warfare" was pursued.

In the recent India-Pakistan military conflict that followed the Pakistan-directed terror attack in Pahalgam, Chinese state media published unverified claims about Pakistan.

Pakistan's propaganda that it had destroyed a BrahMos missile storage facility in India was spread by it, even though India had rubbished it as misinforma-

Leading Chinese papers, blogs, and social media promoted narratives backing Pakistan's actions on the battle-field and insinuating that India's moves could adversely affect regional stability.

To mark the 50th anniversary of the imposition of Emergency, a period remembered as one of the darkest chapters in India's democratic history, an event was organized by the present government as 'Samvidhan Hatya Diwas' in the national capital in India. The occasion served as a powerful reminder of the importance of safeguarding the values enshrined in the Constitution and reaffirming the nation's commitment to democracy. 'Samvidhan Hatya Diwas', a decision formalized through a notification by the Ministry of Home Affairs. The day serves to educate younger generations about the perils of authoritarianism and the need to uphold the spirit of the Constitution. "It is crucial to remember this day so that no one in the future can impose autocracy in this country. During the Emergency, a dangerous ideology took root.

During the event, Chief Minister of Delhi further added that, "We must remember it so that those who walk around with the Constitution in their pockets and preach about saving democracy are reminded that if ever there was a true betrayal of democracy, it happened on June 25, 1975, the day the entire nation was turned into a prison. Today, as we recall that day, we must take a pledge that in the future, Bharat's Constitution shall never again be threatened, and democracy shall never again be plunged into darkness." that the party is bigger than the nation, the family is bigger than the party, the individual is bigger than the family, and power is above national interest."

The media, often called the fourth pillar of democracy, was silenced across the nation. The Press Council of India was dissolved so that there would be no criticism of the government. The atmosphere during the Emergency was deeply suffocating. Yet, in those trying times, some media houses and journalists stood their ground with courage and strongly opposed the dictatorial mindset.

fficially called Alappuzha, Alleppey is known for its network of canals and lagoons with beautiful backwaters and the house boats offering overnight stays. Located in the southern part of Kerala, the coastline of Alleppey offers some of the best beaches with water sports during the dry season. Coupled with other beautiful places in Kerala like Munnar and Thekkady, Alleppey is often considered for a honeymoon or for a great family vacation.

Alleppey's palm-fringed inter-connect network of canal backwaters attracts a lot of tourists from all over the world. Kuttanad, also called the 'Rice Bowl of Kerala' covers a large part of Allapuzha and is home to lush green paddy fields, lakes and backwaters.

There are plenty of houseboats, homestays, and rejuvenating Ayurvedic resorts that make staying in Alleppey brilliant. The houseboats pass through the serene backwaters, where you can catch glimpses of green paddy fields, choir-making activities, and witness the life of locals in Kerala. Alleppey is also dotted with famous temples like Chettikulangara Devi Temple and Mullakkal Temple.

Be sure to catch a traditional snake boat race on the Punnamada Lake in the months of August and September and try out some toddy (palm wine) at a local toddy shop for adding a touch of authenticity to your travel experience in Allepey.

#### **PLACES TO VISIT IN ALLEPPEY**

Alappuzha Beach: The Alappuzha beach, also known as the Alleppey Beach, is famous for local getaways, its intrinsic beauty and a 150 years old pier which stretches into the sea. Relaxing under the palm groves and picnicking beside the beach are fantastic options available to those visiting the beach. Alleppey Beach is a host to many festivals like Sand Art festival and Alappuzha Beach Festival.

Ambalapuzha Sree Krishna Temple: Ambalapuzha Sree Krishna Temple is a Hindu temple dedicated to Lord Krishna situated in Alappuzha

district. Built-in the traditional Kerala style architectural pattern, the temple is famous for its delicious rice pudding prepared in sweet milk, popularly known as Pal Payasam.

Alappuzha Lighthouse: Known for its breathtaking 360-degree views, the Alappuzha Lighthouse(Alleppey lighthouse) is an old-world charm. It is 4 km away from the main town lying on the sea bridge facing the Arabian sea coast. The 1862 lighthouse has a museum that preserves old equipment like oil lamps and items that testify to its 150-year-old journey.

Revi Karunakaran Museum: Revi Karunakaran Museum is a memorial museum built by Betty Karunakaran in the memory of her namesake husband and one of the leading coir industrialist and businessman of Kerala- Revi Karunakaran. Builtin 2003, the renowned, privately-owned museum is a one of the largest of its kind, holding large Swarovski crystals in jade, ivory, porcelain; sculptures, Belgian glassworks, Murano glassworks and Tanjore paintings etc.

Mannarasala Sree Nagaraja Temple: Nestled in a forest glade near Haripad, Mannarasala Sree Nagaraja temple is dedicated to the snake god- Nagaraja. Nagaraja is considered to be a form of Lord Shiva and Lord Vishnu. Flocked by pilgrims and devotees who believe in serpent worshipping, the temple is marked with over thirty thousand paintings and drawings of snakes along the path and over the trees in the surrounding grove.

Marari Beach: One of the great delights of the Malabar Coast, the Marari Beach is an idyllic serene beach. About 11 km from the city of Alleppey, this beach is a hotspot for fishing activity, deriving its name from the local fishing village Mararikulam. Visiting in August gives tourists the exclusive opportunity to view Snake Boat races across the waters. The serenity and quietude on the beach are beyond description, so much so that Marari Beach has been enlisted among the top five hammock beaches of the world by National Geographic Survey.

**Backwaters in Alleppey:** The Alleppey backwaters was earlier used as a mode of transportation, fishing and agriculture and have evolved over

time as a tourism hotspot. The main attraction of the Alleppey backwaters is the overnight journey in the famous Kerala houseboats. www.holidify.com
