

Amid the escalation of the conflict, Dujarric said, the peacekeepers are in their

"The Department of Peace Operations (DPO) and UNIFIL are closely engaged with troop-contributing countries to update them on developments and contingency

planning", he said.

If the situation worsens, Dujarric said, the peacekeeping operation has contingency plans.

"UNIFIL has been there for quite a long time. They've thought through different scenarios", he said.

Guterres condemned the escalation of the Middle East conflict, without naming Israel which began an invasion of Lebanon after aerial bombings, the Hezbollah that has attacked Israel, and Iran which launched a barrage of missiles against Israel.

"I condemn the broadening of the Middle East conflict, with escalation after escalation", he said. "This must stop. We absolutely need a ceasefire".

The Indian peacekeepers include 873 troops, 19 staff officers and 6 women.

The UNIFIL deputy force commander is Major General Chok Bahadur Dhakal of Nepal, which has deployed 858 troops. *IANS*

"Totally unacceptable," US State Secy condemns Iran's attack on Israel

WASHINGTON DC: US Secretary of State Antony Blinken, in a meeting with External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, condemned the Iranian attack on Israel, calling it "totally unacceptable."

Blinken stated that Iran had launched a direct attack on Israel, including 200 ballistic missiles.

"Before I speak to this meeting, let me say this: a few hours ago, Iran, for the second time in five months, launched a direct attack on Israel, involving some 200 ballistic missiles. This is totally unacceptable, and the entire world should condemn it," he said.

Blinken reaffirmed US support for Israel, stating that they would continue close communication with Israel moving forward.

"Initial reports suggest that Israel, with the active support of the United States and other partners, successfully repelled the attack. We have once again demonstrated our commitment to Israel's defense. We will remain in close contact with Israel and other regional partners in

the coming hours and days," he said.

Referring to Secretary Blinken's remarks, Jaishankar said that the two leaders "address global issues."

"On the (India-US) bilateral front, we have achieved a lot since our last meeting, but there are also global issues to address, including some of the events you've mentioned today. I look forward to a productive conversation," he said.

"It's a pleasure to have my friend and colleague, External Affairs Minister Jaishankar, here with us today. In recent weeks, we've seen the incredible vibrancy and strength of the partnership between the United States and India. We had Prime

Minister Modi here in Wilmington, Delaware, for the Quad meeting, as well as a bilateral meeting with President Biden." he said.

He noted that the warmth and ambition in the India-US relationship were at an unprecedented level.

"The warmth of that meeting and the ambition in the relationship are at an all-time high. This reflects the value that both countries place on this partner-ship--a partnership in many sectors, including strategic technology, space, semiconductors, and clean energy. Our countries are increasingly working together to create new opportunities, not just for people in India and the United States but also globally," Blinken said.

The Secretary of State emphasized India's critical role on the global stage in promoting peace.

"India plays a critical role on the global stage, working for peace and security. We are doing more together than ever before." ANI

Tibetans hold protest outside Chinese embassy in Delhi, call for holding China accountable for atrocities in Tibet

NEW DELHI: As China celebrates its national day today, Tibetans held a protest outside the Chinese Embassy in Delhi, demanding China be held accountable for committing atrocities in Tibet.

The protesters shouted slogans like "Make China accountable for committing atrocities in Tibet," "Free Tibet", "Stop genocide in Tibet," "China go away", "Free Tibet, stop genocide, Tibet is not part of China," and "Stop atrocities in Tibet."

The police detained protesters in front of the Chinese embassy as they were shouting slogans against China.

Recently, Tibetan Youth Congress organized a cycle rally to raise awareness about the cultural genocide in Tibet and demand that the Chinese government put an end to it. Notably, the Tibetan Youth Congress organized a cycle rally from Dehradun via Chandigarh. The 50 cyclists covered more than 400 kilometers and reached Delhi.

Speaking with ANI, Tibetan Youth Congress President Gonpo Dhundup said,

urge the international community to speak in support of Tibet... The third objective of this campaign is to seek the support of the Indian government for the Tibetan people's call for Tibet's independence... We got tremendous support from the local Indian community. It was a successful campaign."

Earlier on September 27, the representative of the European Union during the 57th general session of the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) in a statement, reiterated its concerns about the continuous dire human rights situation in Tibet, highlighting the obligatory boarding schooling, mass DNA sampling and closure of Tibetan schools, The Central Tibetan Administration reported. *ANI*

Our relationship with neighbors much stronger since independence: EAM Jaishankar

WASHINGTON DC: Referring to the evolving situation in the neighborhood, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said that India's relationship with its neighbors today is much stronger since indepen-

Regarding the concerns of neighboring countries, the Foreign Minister affirmed confidence that India will be able to maintain its position in the region with patience and hard work.

Addressing the event, Jaishankar said. "Structurally. our relationship with our neighbors would be much stronger than it has been since independence. And the reason was very simple. If you look today at how much more regionalized we have become. If you look at the

power grids, the fuel flows, the rail lines, the airways, the ferries, and the waterways, there's actually a tremendous change."

"If I were to look at it...15 years before, you can see an enormous shift in terms of how much more closely we deal with each other. And even in terms of the movement of people...we mentioned Bangladesh, I think, every year we issue about 1.5-1.6 million visas everywhere in Bangladesh. So we actually have much more trade, much more economic activity," he added.

This comes amid changing leadership in the Indian neighborhood. Bangladesh recently underwent an upsurge where student protests turned into an anti-govern-

ment movement forcing Sheikh Hasina -a key India ally -- to flee.

Mohamed Muizzu's storming to power in Maldives also brought challenges in New Delhi-Male ties. However, the situa-

tion has eased out lately, with more engagements between the two nations.

Similarly, power changes have also taken place in Nepal and Sri Lanka, two key neighbors of India.

He further emphasized that the neighboring countries also have their domestic politics and there will be ups and downs, adding that the best way to deal with the situation is to allow the stability factors to

"Now we have to recognize; the world has to recognize that they also have their politics, there will be ups and downs there. As a bigger neighbor, sometimes we end up being part of the political debate. It's not unusual. So we have to factor it in. And my own sense is the best way of dealing with it is rather than getting overexcited by immediate events, you allow the stability factors to play out. You respond with a degree of sobriety and re-

> sponsibility to anything that happens," he said.

> Referring to China and the competition New Delhi faces from Beijing in the region, the Foreign Minister said that politics is competitive and one has to work hard to maintain and improve its position.

"Where China is concerned... with some countries, China is also a neighbor. In a few cases, China is a neighbor or near-neighbor. So politics is competitive... I tell my colleagues in the foreign ministry, to prepare to compete. I mean, this world is not going to give

you anything on a platter. So, if you want to maintain your position, improve your position, do the hard work, and do the investment. And that's what we'll do and I'll tell ANI

Putin signs decree on autumn military draft

MOSCOW: Russian President Vladimir Putin signed a decree, calling up 133,000 citizens for military service in autumn, according to a document posted on the country's legal information portal.

According to the decree, a total of 133,000 people aged 18 to 30, will be drafted from October 1 to December 31, 2024, Xinhua news agency reported.

Conscripts will not be involved in tasks related to the special military operation in the new regions, and will serve at permanent deployment points of military units and formations on the territory of Russia, Deputy Head of the Russian General Staff's Main Organizational and Mobilization Department Vladimir Tsimlyansky said during a briefing.

In July 2023, Russia's lower house of parliament voted to raise the maximum age at which men can be conscripted to 30 from 27. The new legislation came into effect on January 1, 2024.


Russia conducts conscription twice a year, in spring and autumn respectively. The autumn 2023 draft saw the enlistment of 130,000 people. All men in Russia are required to do a year-long military service, or equivalent training during higher education, from the age of 18. IANS

"Ongoing projects, approved agreements definitely go on": Bangladesh Foreign Affairs advisor

DHAKA: As Bangladesh emerges from a period of political instability it looks to continue ongoing commercial activities and other projects with India. Bangladesh's Foreign Affairs Advisor Mohammed Touhid Hossain says that these projects will remain unaffected.

Speaking to ANI, Touhid said, "Trade has been going on. After a short gap. Immediately after the fall of the government, trade again picked up...going on."

"The projects that are ongoing and approved agreements definitely go on," he underlined.

Amid the current slowdown in trade between both nations, the first consignment of renowned 'Padma Hilsa' fish from Bangladesh arrived in West Bengal on September 27, weighing around 45-50 tons ahead of Durga Puja.

Further, Touhid clarified that everything will go as usual despite the fact that the process of issuance of visas has not achieved normalcy.

"About the people-to-people contact, the Indian visa offices are not opened as yet fully. It is up to them when they will do it. This is the decision of the Indian government when that happened, people have the visas to go to India. Our offices in India are issuing visas to those who are coming for Bangladesh visas. I think even though there is some pause some times, it is pick up," Touhid

Touhid Hossain also added that the bilateral relations between Bangladesh and India "will continue normally." ANI

16 companies pick candidates for over 1,000 jobs at Delhi job fair: IT Ministry

NEW DELHI: Sixteen companies shortlisted candidates against more than 1,000 job openings in their respective companies at a job fair organized by the National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT) here, the IT Ministry informed on Sunday.

He emphasized India's growing leadership in the space and geospatial sectors, underscoring the opportunities for both local and international stakeholders to contribute to this vital growth.

"India, currently the world's 5th largest economy, is set to become the 3rd largest by overtaking Japan and Germany in the next two and a half years," Kant stated.

"To achieve our goal of a \$30 trillion economy by 2047, significant breakthroughs in sectors like space and geospatial technology will be key drivers of growth," he added.

While acknowledging the challenges in opening up these sectors, Kant lauded Prime Minister Narendra Modi's initiative in

overcoming bureaucratic resistance.

"India's share in the global space economy must grow from 2 percent to 10 percent. The private sector, especially startups, will play a pivotal role in driving this shift, with groundbreaking firms like Skyroot and Agnikul leading the way," said

the former NITI Aayog CEO.

The seminar explored how India's space and geospatial sectors are poised for tremendous growth, focusing on the 'Make in India' initiative. The event also highlighted the immense potential for foreign direct investment (FDI) in manufac-

turing software and hardware products.

Kant encouraged startups to utilize vast data resources for economic disruption and satellite communications, highlighting real-time data as a key factor in improving governance and addressing rural-urban disparities.

The seminar also featured discussions on urbanization and how geospatial technology can address future infrastructure needs. By 2050, 50 percent of India will require urban development, and Kant emphasized the need for digital twins and advanced forecasting tools for sustainable growth.

Sanjay Kumar, CEO of GWCC and Geospatial World highlighted that the global geospatial industry, including the two crucial pillars of space infrastructure -- earth observation and the global navigation satellite system -- now represents a \$500 billion industry.

"Its socio-economic impact and relevance to the digital economy are not only fundamental but a prerequisite for the future." Kumar said. *IANS*





Norway tightens rules on collective protection for Ukrainian refugees

OSLO: Norway will grant collective protection to fewer Ukrainians arriving from six areas deemed safe by the Norwegian Directorate of Immigration, the government said.

If no individual need for protection exists, applications from new asylum seekers from these areas will be rejected, it said.

For the past two and a half years, most Ukrainians fleeing to Norway have been given temporary protection without individual assessment, but now applications from safe regions of Ukraine will be evaluated under regular asylum regulations, Xinhua news agency reported.

"In the future, asylum seekers from Ukraine will therefore be treated on a more equal footing to other asylum seekers. The collective protection scheme will now be directed more precisely at those in need of protection," said Emilie Enger Mehl, minister of justice and public security.

Norway, which has taken in 85,000 Ukrainians in the past two and a half years, the most in Nordic countries, has seen a reduction in arrivals following earlier cuts to benefits and accommodation. However, recent months have witnessed an uptick in new arrivals

"Norwegian municipalities are starting to reach capacity. Housing is in short supply and there is pressure on welfare services. We must maintain control over immigration to Norway," said Tonje Brenna, minister of labor and social inclusion. *IANS*

US opens additional 250,000 visa appointments for Indian travellers

NEW DELHI: The US Embassy in India on Monday (30 Sept.) announced it has opened an additional 250,000 visa appointments for Indian travellers, including tourists, skilled workers, and students.

"The recently released new slots will help hundreds of thousands of Indian applicants take timely interviews, facilitating the travel which is the backbone of the people-to-people ties that underpin the US-India relationship," stated the US Mission to India.

It also detailed that the Indian Mission has already surpassed one million nonimmigrant visa applications for the second consecutive year.

"During our student visa season this summer, we continued to process record numbers, and all first-time student applicants were able to obtain an appointment at one of our five consular sections around India. We are now focused on bringing families together, connecting businesses, and facilitating tourism," the statement added.

According to the US Mission, at least six million Indians already have a nonimmigrant visa to visit the United States, and each day, it issues thousands more.

The Embassy highlighted, the United States' "partnership with India is stronger, closer, and more dynamic than any time in history" with the US Senate designating September 30 as a 'US-India Partnership Day', recognizing the contribution of the two countries to one another and a relationship that continues to define the 21st century.

"Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Joe Biden set an ambitious goal to improve and expedite the visa process and I'm proud to say that we have delivered on that promise. Our consular teams at the embassy and four consulates work tirelessly to ensure that we meet the surging demand," US Ambassador to India Eric Garcetti said recently.

Last week, during his visit to the United States, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had announced that the Indian government will open two new consulates in Boston and Los Angeles.

"Last year, I announced the opening of a new Indian consulate in Seattle. I sought your suggestions for two additional Con-

sulates. India has now decided to open two new consulates in Boston and Los Angeles," remarked PM Modi while interacting with the Indian diaspora in New York's Nassau Coliseum. *IANS*

'Four in ten illegal foreigners entered South Korea without visas'

SEOUL: Four in 10 foreigners who illegally stayed in South Korea last year entered the country without visas and stayed beyond the visa-free period, data from the justice ministry showed.

The number of "illegal aliens" in South Korea came to 423,675 as of the end of last year, accounting for 16.9 percent of the total foreigners staying in the nation, according to the data cited by Rep. Song Seong-jun of the ruling People Power Party.

Of the illegal foreigners, the number of those who arrived in South Korea without visas reached 190,000, or 44.9 percent. Foreigners are allowed to enter South Korea without visas in cases of visa exemption (B-1) and tourists in transit (B-2), Yonhap news agency reported.

The number of illegal aliens who entered South Korea with a visa waiver came to 169,000, the largest proportion for a single category at 40 percent, followed by those with a short-term stay visa at 87,000. Those with B-2 status reached 21,000, the data showed.

Such foreigners are believed to be illegally staying in South Korea to engage in economic activities without proper employment visas. *IANS*

Kamala Harris pledges to revive bipartisan border security bill blocked by Trump



WASHINGTON, DC: US Vice President Kamala Harris has reaffirmed her commitment to border security, emphasizing the need for stronger measures to combat illegal immigration and the fentanyl crisis. Harris criticized former President Donald Trump for blocking a comprehensive border security bill that had bipartisan support in Congress.

"Last December, I helped raise the rate of overtime pay for border agents," Harris stated. "I strongly supported the comprehensive border security bill, written last year by a bipartisan group of senators, including one of the most conservative members of the United States Congress."

The bill, which Harris described as "the strongest se-

curity bill we have seen in decades," aimed to address several critical issues at the US southern border. It would have hired 1,500 more border agents and officers, installed 100 inspection machines to detect fentanyl, and expanded

the number of immigration judges and asylum officers. Harris explained, "It would have allowed us to more quickly and effectively remove those who come here illegally."

Despite being endorsed by the Border Patrol Union, the bill was ultimately derailed by Trump. "Donald Trump tanked it. He picked up the phone and called some friends in Congress and said stop the bill, because he prefers to run on a problem instead of fixing a problem," Harris charged.

As a result of Trump's interference, Harris contended that the border remains less secure today. "The American people deserve a President who cares more about border security than playing political games and their personal, political future."

Harris pledged that, if elected President, she would revive the bill and sign it into law. "Even though Donald Trump tried to sabotage the border security bill, it is my pledge to you, that as President of the United States, I will bring it back up and proudly sign it into law."

This comes amidst renewed debate on border security, as Trump's administration previously secured a victory when the US Supreme Court allowed the use of \$2.5

billion from the Department of Defense to construct parts of a border wall. Despite Congress refusing to provide the requested funds, the Supreme Court's 5-4 ruling allowed Trump to move forward with the controversial wall, a decision that has continued to fuel division on how best to secure the border.

Many lawmakers opposed the move, warning that diverting funds from the Pentagon would harm national security priorities. *ANI*

Mumbai property sales registration crosses

MUMBAI: Registration of property sales in Mumbai city surged past 100,000 landmark in September 2024, which is recorded to be the fastest in a decade, as per a report by Knight Frank India, a real estate consultancy firm.

In 2023, this mark was achieved in October.

As per the real estate consultancy firm, Mumbai city (area under BMC jurisdiction), recorded about 105,664 property registrations in the first nine months of 2024, contributing more than Rs 8,892 crore to the state exchequer. *ANI*

Maha Cabinet nod to seeking transfer of Centre's salt pan lands for Mumbai housing schemes



MUMBAI: In the run up to the Assembly elections the Maharashtra Cabinet chaired by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde, took a record 38 decisions including seeking the transfer of the Centre's salt pan lands in Mumbai to the state government to accelerate housing schemes for the poor.

The state government has written to the Centre urging it to transfer 255.9 acres of salt pan lands through a lease agreement to Maharashtra to push housing schemes for the poor in Mumbai.

The state housing department will enter into a lease agreement with the Centre for this purpose.

Of the 255.9 acres of salt pan lands, 120.5 acre will be from Kanjur, 76.9 acres from Kanjur and Bhandup and 58.5 acre from Mulund.

The state government will collect the land amount from the Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) company and give it to the Centre for acquisition.

The SPV will bear the cost of rehabilitation of the workers on the salt pan lands.

The salt pan lands will be used for rental housing, slum re-

habilitation projects, affordable housing and housing for Economically Weaker Sections and the government has fixed the responsibility on the developer of the Dharavi rehabilitation project.

Further, the Cabinet also cleared a discount on payment of land premium by the Mumbai Metropolitan Region Development Authority (MMRDA) to expedite the slum rehabilitation scheme of Ramabai Ambedkar Nagar and Kamrajnagar in north

of its payment at the beginning.

The Cabinet also gave approval for a subsidy scheme for rearing of indigenous cows citing that Goshalas have very low income and they could not afford to bear the expenses.

The government will provide a per day subsidy of Rs 50 per indigenous cow. This scheme will be implemented online by the Maharashtra Goseva Commission.

Moreover, the Cabinet also cleared the development of the Multipurpose Port Project at Murbe in Palghar District by JSW Infrastructure Developers.

A detailed project report will be prepared on technical issues and also on rehabilitation of fishermen by roping in expert organizations such as the Central Water and Power Research Centre and Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute.

The proposed port will be all season and it will mainly handle captive and dry bulk cargo. The project entails an investment of Rs 4,259 crore and it will create 1,500 jobs. *IANS*



'Prescribe painkillers when necessary to kids'

NEW DELHI: Pediatricians must prescribe opioids for pain to children when necessary, with recommended precautions to increase safety, according to a new clinical practice guideline released recently by the American Academy of Pediatrics.

The first clinical practice guideline for opioid prescriptions in kids also includes explicit instructions on how and when to prescribe these medications for pain while reducing the long-term risk of addiction.

The guideline, published in the journal Pediatrics online, called on pediatricians to always start non-opioid medications and treatment, for a patient with mild to moderate pain. It also marked a shift in clinical practice by recommending a routine prescription for naloxone -- a medication used to reverse overdoses -- alongside every opioid prescription

"There's been a big pendulum swing in the practice of medicine over the last two decades -- first with opioid-overprescribing, then with a huge cutback in opioid prescribing, likely leaving some children's pain undertreated," said Scott Hadland, lead author of the guideline. *IANS*

Indian pharma companies to expand revenues by 9-11 pc in FY25

NEW DELHI: The Indian pharma companies are estimated to expand their revenues by a healthy 9-11 percent in the current fiscal (FY25), a recent report showed.

This will be driven by 9-11 percent revenue growth from the US market, 7-9 percent each from the European and domestic markets, and 11-13 percent from the emerging markets, according to credit rating ICRA.

The revenue growth from the domestic market is likely to improve by 7-9 percent in FY25 against 6.4 percent in FY24.

Why gynecological cancers are rising among young Indian women

NEW DELHI: Obesity, diabetes, and Polycystic Ovarian Syndrome (PCOS) are the key reasons why India is seeing a rise in gynecological cancers like endometrial, ovarian, and uterus, said experts.

The rise is particularly of concern among younger women, and calls for greater awareness and early screening.

There have been more incidences of endometrial cancer - cancer that develops in the lining of the uterus -- among young women in their early 30s, a condition traditionally seen in post-menopausal women.

"As obesity rates climb and more women delay childbearing or remain childless, they face prolonged exposure to estrogen, a known risk factor for endometrial cancer. Conversely, progesterone, produced during

pregnancy, provides a protective effect against this cancer," Dr. Vandana Jain, Sr. Consultant and Chief of Gynae Oncology Services, Rajiv Gandhi Cancer Institute and Research Centre (RGCIRC), told IANS.

"Women with conditions like Polycystic Ovarian

Disease (PCOD), who often do not ovulate regularly, also find

themselves at heightened risk," Jain added.

According to statistics 1 in 100 women are either diagnosed with



cancer of the uterus or cancer of the ovary. However, a steady rise

in the numbers of these two cancers has been observed of late.

"Obesity, diabetes, and PCOS have all been scientifically

proven to be the reasons for the rise in the incidence of cancer of the uterus and ovary, albeit indirectly," Dr. Sai Lakshmi Daayana, Senior Consultant - Surgical Oncology, Apollo Cancer Centre, Hyderabad, told IANS.

Ovarian cancer is the third most common type of cancer among

women in India. According to the Indian Council of Medical Re-

search (ICMR), the age-adjusted incidence rate of ovarian cancer in India is estimated to be around 6.8 per 1,00,000 women.

Daayana said in the majority of cancers of the ovary, no particular cause is identifiable. The majority of these patients are above 50 years of age.

"However, it has been established that women who seek fertility treatment are at an increased risk of developing cancers of the ovary many years down the line. Previously infertility was seen in about 1:10 couples. This number has now risen to 1:3 capsules. PCOS also contributes to a majority of female infertility," the expert said. *IANS*

South Korea, Japan, China aim to complete global plastic reduction pact

SEOUL: South Korea, China and Japan have agreed to work more closely to complete negotiations for an international legally binding instrument on plastic pollution, Seoul's environment ministry said.

The commitment was made last week after the ministers of the three nations held a two-day ministerial meeting on South Korea's southern resort island of Jeju to discuss ways of enhancing trilateral cooperation on various environmental challenges, including plastic pollution, climate change and yellow dust, according to the ministry.

"The three nations agreed to actively take part in the upcoming negotiations on plastic pollution reduction set to take place in November in Busan to make tangible progress," Minister Kim Wan-sup told a press briefing, reports Yonhap news agency.

The fifth and final round of meetings of the United Nations' Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee (INC) on plastic pollution is scheduled to be held in the southern port city of Busan in November, which aims to develop an international legally binding instrument on plastic pollution.

The three nations also agreed to boost cooperation to mitigate yellow dust levels, particularly in partnership with Mongolia. IANS





This includes evaluating hiring practices to reach more women as well as examining relevant policies and department culture to actively foster the career success of wellqualified women in law enforcement.

Since the 30x30 pledge was signed by Fremont Police Chief Sean Washington in November 2021, the number of women police officers employed by the City of Fremont has increased by three total officers (19 women Police Officers in 2021 vs. 22 as of August 11, 2024). Currently, women make up only 12% of sworn Officers and 3% of police leadership in the U.S. Today, women make up 14% of filled sworn officer positions at Fremont PD and 9% of sergeant positions and above.

Chief Sean Washington has been invited to participate in a panel discussion on the topic of women in law enforcement. The Women's Law Enforcement Symposium & Career Fair is scheduled to take place on September 18, 2024, in Oakland.

Benjamin Neuman, Professor at Texas A&M University, pointed out that from a scientific perspective, the vaccine is usually effective for about 4 to 6 months, and then the virus will begin to mutate. If we only consider it from a scientific perspective without considering practical factors such as cost, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) should update vaccines twice a year instead of once a year. Although the effectiveness of the vaccine may not be ideal from a scientific perspective, this is a problem due to the rapid mutation of the virus; considering many practical limitations, annual vaccination is still the best prevention strategy.

The updated version of the vaccine and the Novavax vaccine are more related to the new strain and are more protective. For many people, the last vaccination may have been a year or more ago, and because it is uncertain how long the immune response from white blood cells or T cells lasts, some people may need to get a new vaccine to gain new immunity.

The CDC currently recommends that everyone aged 6 months and up get the updated COVID-19 vaccine to protect against serious illness and complications from the virus. Wearing a mask (like a KN95 or N95) in crowded indoor situations and when traveling can help to lower your risk of getting infected.

Significance of Navaratri and Nava Durga Puja

avratri (or nine nights) is a Sanatana holiday that honors Shakti or the Divine Feminine/ Mother and devotees worship her for spiritual cleansing, guidance, and enlightenment. Navaratri festival lasts for nine nights and ten days. It is a time of deep rest and rejuvenation and engage in prayer, fasting, and meditation to purify one's mind and body. Each day is dedicated to one of the nine forms of the Mother Divine. The final day that is the 10th day is called Vijayadashami, the day popularly celebrated as the day of the victory of 'Good over Evil on the universal level' and the victory of sattva Guna winning over the other Gunas on an individual level.

We all possess three Gunas namely Sattva, Rajas and Tamas. The first three days of the Navaratri are dedicated to win over Tamo Guna or inertia, the second three days to conquest Rajo Guna or restlessness and activity, and the last three days to instill Sattva Guna or purity and high Prana into our lives. It is believed that observing these practices with sincerity can lead us to attain spiritual enlightenment and divine blessings. The final day of Navaratri named Vijayadashami/Victory Day is observed as a victory day over all the Gunas/evils and celebrated human life with harmony and peace. Shardiya Navratri is a sacred period that commemorates the intense nine-day battle between Goddess Durga and the demon Mahishasura. The festival is concluded with Mahishasura's defeat on the tenth day, symbolizing the triumph of good over evil.

The ancient people knew the cordial connection between the macrocosm and the microcosm, and the parts of our body. The cosmos, the planets, the cosmic rays, and the vibration are all connected and Navaratri is the time to explore this deep connection. This entire cosmos is made up of that one energy called Devi and the whole universe comprises of vibrating and scintillating consciousness, and encourages us to take an inward and upward spiritual journey and do not get distracted from our goals in life.

Significance of Nava Durga (Nine Forms of Durga)

For Sanatanis, the mother Goddess Durga is a very special deity, and appears in nine different forms, each of which is endowed with unique powers and traits. Together, these nine manifestations are called Nava Durga. Each night of Navaratri honors one of the mother god-

dess' manifestations. Sanatanis believe that worshiping Durga with much religious fervor will lift the divine spirit and fill them with renewed happiness.

Day 1 - Shailaputri: means "daughter of the mountains." She is the daughter of Hemavana, the king of the Himalayas. She is considered as the purest embodiment of Durga and the Mother Nature. In iconography, she is depicted riding a bull and holding a trident and a lotus blossom. The lotus represents purity and devotion,

hands, and has 3 eyes. She is seeing all, ever vigilant, and ready to battle evil from whatever direction.

Day 4- Kushmanda: means "a ball of energy/Prana or a creator of the universe," who brought light to the dark cosmos. The glitter n her hand represents the sparkling light that she brings to the world. Kushmanda rides a lion, symbolizing strength and courage in the face of adversity.

Day 5 - Skandamata: is the mother of



while the prongs on the trident represent the past, present, and future.

Day 2 - Brahmacharini: means "one who practices sincere austerity." In this form, she shows us the magnificent embodiment of Durga with great powers and divine grace. Brahmacharini holds a rosary in her right hand, representing the special Vedic prayers recited in her honor, and a water utensil in her left hand, symbolizing marital bliss. She bestows happiness, peace, prosperity, and grace upon all the devotees who worship her. She is the way to emancipation, called Moksha.

Another meaning is the virgin aspect of Mother Divine. Her energy is like the sunrays, fresh and new. The newness is depicted in the second form of Durga.

Day 3 - Chandraghanta: this third manifestation of Durga represents peace, tranquility, and prosperity in life. She wears Chandra (half-moon) in her forehead in the shape of a ghanta (bell), which is charming, has a golden bright complexion, and rides a lion. Like Durga, and holds different weapons in her 10

Skanda or Lord Kartikeya, who was chosen by gods as their commander-in-chief in the war against the demons. She is worshipped on the fifth day, emphasizing her pure and divine nature. Skanda Mata is seated on a lotus. She has four arms and three eyes. She holds the infant Skanda in her right upper arm and a lotus in her right hand, which is slightly raised upward. With her left arm, she grants blessings to the devotees and she holds a second lotus in her left hand.

Day 6 - Katyayani: is worshipped on the sixth day. She has a fearsome sight, with wild hair and 18 arms, each clutching a weapon. Born with a divine rage and anger. She emits a radiant light from her body to take away the darkness and evil forces. Despite her angry appearance, she can bestow a sense of calmness and inner peace upon all those who worship her.

Day 7 - Kalaratri: Kalaratri/ Shubhamkari means "One Who Does Good." She has dark complexion, disheveled hair, four arms, and three eyes. The lightning coming out of her necklace and the flames shooting from her mouth, like Kali, the goddess destroys evil forces. Kaal Ratri has black skin. She provides protection from darkness and allaying all fears

Day 8 - Maha Gauri: She is worshipped on the eighth day of Navaratri and her name means "extremely white," and luminous beauty radiates from her body. Sanatanis believe that by paying homage to Maha Gauri, all the past, present, and future sins will go away imparting a deep sense of inner peace. She wears white clothes, has four arms, and rides on a bull, one of the most sacred animals in Sanatana Dharma. Her right hand is in the pose of allaying fear, and her right lower hand holds a trident. The left upper hand holds a Damaru (a small tambourine or drum) while the lower one is thought to grant blessings to her devotees. Maha Gauri is so beautiful and she gives momentum, ultimate freedom in life that leads to liberation.

Day 9 - Siddhidhaatri: is the final form of Durga, celebrated on the final night of Navaratri. Her name means "giver of supernatural power" to achieve perfection in life and acquire siddhis. What we think is impossible; she makes it possible. She grants wisdom and insight to those who appeal to her, and she can do the same for deities who worship her as well. She rides a lion, has four limbs and carries a trident, a spinning disc called a Sudarshana Chakra, a conch shell, and a lotus. The conch, called a Shankha that represents longevity, while the spinning disc symbolizes the soul or timelessness.

VIJAYA DASAMI - Significance of Shamee Vriksha

The Shamee Vriksha/Banni Mara/tree (Prosopis ciner aria) is found in dry and arid regions at low altitudes. This tree is widely grown in North West and Central Bharat including Afghanistan, Iran, Oman, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates, and Yemen. It is also the United Arab Emirates' national tree. This tree is a medium-sized (12 mts) ever green tree which can grow in harsh climatic conditions, and in any type of soil. In Tamil, it is called Vanni, in Telugu Jammi, in Sanskrit Shamee, Saikanta in Bengali, Gonharea in Oriya, Loong

Shamee Vriksha, which is revered as a sacred and divine plant and its leaves and flowers are used for worshiping Lord Shiva and Lord Ganesh in the 21 Patra Puja. It is also a tree of Lord Shani Mahadeva and lowers the Shani Dosha if worshipped daily. As per Bhavishyottara Purana Lord Venkateswara (Srinivasa) had worshiped Shamee tree as His Kula Devata before proceeding to marry Goddess Padmavathi Devi. The twigs of the Shamee tree are used for the sacrificial fire/Homam as an effective remedy for Saturn's malefic effect. Another legend in

shipped it, seeking power and victory in the ensuing battle with the Kauravas. In the battle, Pandavas emerged victorious. In the Ramayana, when Lord Rama was going to Lanka, the Shami tree told him that He would be victorious. Thus it is believed that Shamee tree also represents goddess Durga and those who worship the Shamee tree are blessed with victory and prosperity. Banni Mara/Shamee Vriksha is considered a symbol of courage, peace, and prosperity.

Pandavas took the weapons from the tree and wor-

Mahabharata mentions that the god of fire- Agni hid in the heart of the Shamee tree to escape from the wrath of Brighu Maharishi.

This Shamee tree

becomes a significant part of our Dasara festival as Sanatani warriors before going for a war used to offer prayers to Banni tree since they believe that they will certainly emerge victorious in the war. The legend behind this tradition is found in the great epic Mahabharata, when the Pandavas had to spend one-year incognito, as part of their 14 years of exile, they hid their weapons in the Shamee tree. After one year, when they came back to the tree, they found their weapons intact. The

Tree in Rajasthan, Jand in Punjabi and in Hindi Khejri. It belongs to the pea family, Fabaceae, which is considered as the Kalpa Taru of the Thar Desert. Its leaves are small and delicate and are arranged next to one another (bipinnate) with 7-14 leaflets on each of the pinnate. The decomposed leaves add nutrients (nitrogen) to the soil, thereby enhancing the growth and productivity of the crop.


Some westerners call the method of machinery enlightened and that of the

hand ignorant. It has still to be proved that displacement of the hand by the machine is a blessing in every case.

I hold that the machinery method is harmful when the same thing can be done easily by millions of hands not otherwise occupied.

It is any day better and safer for the millions spread in the seven hundred thousand villages of India scattered over an area nineteen hundred miles long and fifteen hundred broad that they manufacture their clothing in their own villages even as they prepare their own food.

These villages cannot retain the freedom they have enjoyed from time immemorial, if they do not control the production of prime necessaries of life. Western observers hastily argue from Western conditions that what may be true of them must be true of India where conditions are different in so many material respects.


Lastly, I do not subscribe to the belief that everything old is bad. Truth is old and difficult.

Knowledge diplomacy: India's missing soft power tool

ational Security and International Relations in India are no longer understood in narrow military terms. They have many more stakeholders now than ever before. Areas such as human rights, climate, water and environment security, education, medical and healthcare, pharmaceutical industry, cybersecurity, maritime security, low intensity conflicts, diaspora and soft power have moved to the centre stage and assumed importance in matters of national security governance. Education is a critical aspect of this national security related conversation. The need for knowledge diplomacy in enhancing India's national security and foreign policy goals and provoking a public discussion in this regard is the need of the hour.

Historically, education, especially higher education, has served nation-states as a potent tool of soft power. The USC Center

on Public Diplomacy produces a Soft Power Index ranking countries on various criteria, in which education is an important one. Most countries on its top 30 list (India not included) have some form of strategies to internationalise their higher education. For instance, the US has within its State Department, a Bureau of Cultural and Educational Affairs, which builds and sustains strategies to improve US public diplomacy through educational exchanges and partnerships with academic institutions.

Even countries that do not have worldclass higher education facilities have sought to positively employ education diplomacy to supplement weaknesses in other aspects of national power. Case in point is the Kosovo International Summer Academy (KSA) that runs a summer program aimed specifically at spreading a positive image of the country amongst foreigners. A study conducted for the Journal of Humanities and Social Sciences Communication argued that KSA has "the potential to influence the perceptions, attitudes, and country image of international visitors towards Kosovo, including those from countries that have not yet recognised Kosovo, or categorically refuse to do so."

With such evidence before us about the importance of education diplomacy for national security and international relations, India's superpower ambitions require a comprehensive strategy to use the Indian education sector, both private and government, towards advancing India's strategic aims and objectives. A starting point to experiment such knowledge/education diplomacy lies in its neighbourhood. In the ancient days, India was one of the key destinations for knowledge accumulation, even when many of today's high ranking European nations were experiencing the dark ages. Today, as India aspires to reclaim its civilisational

glory, it is time and opportune for the government and the private sector to empower Indian universities to strengthen India's strategic footprints in its neighbourhood and its immediate concentric.

Higher education institutions such as IITs, IIMs, Business Schools and Institutions of National Importance such as the Rastriya Raksha University (RRU) must take the lead in this direction. The practice of operating in silos has to be avoided and collaborative platforms should be created for this purpose. The initiative should emanate from the private sector whilst the government has to play a meaningful role through the involvement of the Ministry of External Affairs, Ministry of Defence, Ministry of Home Affairs, Commerce Ministry and the Ministry of Education. The role of state governments and Union Territories must also be another consideration.

Can Pakistan and Bangladesh overcome historical grievances to redefine relations?

heikh Hasina's exit from Bangladesh's political scene, following 15 years of tense ties with Pakistan, is a watershed moment for South Asia. For more than a decade and a half, Pakistan-Bangladesh relations were strained by distrust, historical grievances, and India's rising influence in Dhaka during Hasina's Awami League administration. With a new interim government in place, led by Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus, Islamabad sees a chance to restore relations with Dhaka. However, as this new chapter progresses, the complexity of the past, regional geopolitics, Bangladesh's internal political dynamics will all influence the future of this partnership.

A Tumultuous History: The Shadow of 1971

To appreciate the tense ties Pakistan between Bangladesh during Sheikh Hasina's reign, one needs to review the 1971 events. The conthat resulted Bangladesh's independence remains a source of deep historical pain. Sheikh Hasina, the daughter of Bangladesh's founding father, Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, incorporated the scars of the violent battle into her political agenda. Her term in power, from 1996 to 2001 and again from 2009 to 2024, was distinguished by an unwavering attitude against Pakistan, which she considered accountable for the 1971 crimes.

From Pakistan's perspective, the events of 1971 are a terrible part of its history that it recognises but does not believe should define future ties. Islamabad has frequently emphasised the need to move beyond the animosity of the war, emphasising that both countries suffered during the fight. Nonetheless, Hasina's government's political murders of Pakistani elites throughout the conflict further widened the split. Under her

leadership, Dhaka remained strongly allied with New Delhi, stifling any substantial development in bilateral relations with Pakistan.

Hasina's Departure: A Window for Reconciliation?

The political turmoil that resulted in Sheikh Hasina's fall in August 2024, following huge student-led demonstrations, provides Pakistan with an opportunity to reset its ties with Bangladesh. With Muhammad Yunus at the helm of the interim administration, Pakistani Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif lost no time in reaching out for collaboration. In a phone conversation with Yunus, Sharif stressed Pakistan's intention to increase commerce, cultural exchanges, and people-to-people interaction between the two countries.

For Pakistan, this change in leadership might signal the start of a thaw in long-frozen ties. The absence of Hasina, widely seen tion. India had an important part in Bangladesh's independence and continues to have a considerable impact on Dhaka's domestic and foreign affairs.

In the post-Hasina period, anti-India sentiment has grown in Bangladesh, as seen by the student demonstrations that helped overthrow her administration. Many Bangladeshis, notably followers of the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) and Jamaat-e-Islami have long criticised Hasina for being too close to New Delhi and allowing India undue influence over the country's politics and economy. While its primary goal is to restore order and resolve internal concerns, the new temporary administration must tread gingerly.

For Pakistan, prevailing anti-India sentiment provides a potential chance to re-establish relations with Bangladesh. However, Islamabad must exercise caution in not focusing


in Pakistan as a staunch supporter of India, provides an opportunity for Islamabad to engage Dhaka without the historical baggage that has weighed down previous diplomatic efforts. While the change in leadership may provide a chance for reconciliation, the path to normalising relations will be riddled with difficulties.

The India Factor: A Delicate Balancing Act

India's influence is one of the major hurdles to improving Pakistan-Bangladesh ties. Under Sheikh Hasina, Bangladesh's foreign policy was closely linked with that of New Delhi, reflecting a shared history and strategic cooperaits diplomatic efforts primarily on its competition with India. While shared cultural, religious, and historical links between Pakistan and Bangladesh provide a solid framework for better relations, any overt anti-India stance might backfire, especially given India's strategic importance to Bangladesh.

INDIA INITIATES PEACE FOR MYANMAR

ust over a week ago, India's federal home minister Amit Shah announced a plan to fence the open border with neighboring Myanmar. He said, India would secure the rugged 1,643km (1,020-mile) boundary the same way as "we have fenced the country's border with Bangladesh", which is more than twice as long.

Mr. Shah said the government would also consider scrapping a six-year-old free movement agreement that allows border residents from India and Myanmar to travel 16km into each other's territory, without a visa. He gave few details of how the fence would be built, or over what timeframe. Lately, India has witnessed major issues at the northeastern borders with ethnic groups crossing the border.

The Myanmar junta has been in war with the ethnic minorities as well as the democratic forces since 2021. Since India is greatly affected by these developments at its border, India has invited political and military opponents of Myanmar's ruling junta to attend a seminar in New Delhi, according to sources as told to Reuters. This is surely a significant move by the South Asian power that has maintained ties with the top generals shunned by Western nations in the past few years.

A civil war in Myanmar, since its military unseated an elected civilian government in a February 2021 coup, now risks destabilizing India's 1,650-km border with Myanmar, and some of its key infrastructure projects there. A leader of an armed group and two sources with direct knowledge of the issue said the parallel National Unity Government and ethnic minority rebels from the states of Chin, Rakhine and Kachin, bordering India are invited to a seminar in mid-November. The event would be hosted by the government-funded Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA), whose council includes External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar, said two other sources, who spoke on condition of anonymity as the matter was confidential.

However, there were no confirmed reports from either the Junta or the organizers. Although the junta has been condemned by western powers, with most having imposed sanctions, India has kept up engagement with the generals through visits to the capital, Naypyitaw, by its government and defense officials. India has been reluctant to openly criticize the junta, which could push the generals closer to rival China. New Delhi has had no formal engagement with the junta's opponents.

In June, Foreign Minister Jaishankar voiced concern about border instability and the security risks to India's projects in Myanmar. India was "open to engaging all stakeholders in addressing this situation," he told his Myanmar counterpart. India is involved in developing the \$400-million Kaladan port and highway project in Myanmar's west, as well as providing about \$250 million for another road project to link its landlocked northeastern states with Thailand, via Myanmar.

The seminar plan comes amidst a peace effort by the ASEAN grouping of Southeast Asian nations that has made scant progress since it's unveiling in April 2021, as some ASEAN nations have been vexed by the junta's refusal of talks. The November meeting would represent New Delhi's effort to reconcile the junta with the ethnic population.
