

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN: Prime Minister Narendra Modi has announced that the ties between India and Brunei have been elevated to level of Enhanced Partnership.

In his address at the banquet hosted by Brunei Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah on 4 September, PM Modi thanked the royal family for their warm welcome and their hospitality. He noted that the two nations share deep historical and cultural ties and will mark 40th anniversary of political relations this year.

PM Modi said, "India and Brunei share deep historical and cultural ties. This year, we are celebrating the 40th anniversary of our political relations. On this occasion, we have decided to give our relations the status of Enhanced Partnership."

"We had extensive discussions on all aspects to give strategic direction to our partnership. We are committed to strengthening our cooperation in the economic, scientific and strategic areas," he added.

PM Modi said that he and the Sultan of Brunei discussed possibilities of long-term cooperation in LNG. The two leaders also agreed to strengthen cooperation between two nations in space sector. He also announced that direct flights between two nations will start soon.

"We have decided to focus on mutual cooperation in agriculture, industry, pharma and health as well as technology and cyber security. In the energy sector,

we discussed the possibilities of long-term cooperation in LNG. To enhance cooperation in the defense sector, we took positive views on the possibilities of defense industry training and capacity building," PM Modi stated.

"To strengthen our cooperation in the field of space, we have agreed on satellite development, remote sensing and training. Direct flights will be started soon for connectivity between the two countries. Our people to people relationships are the foundation of our partnership," the PM added.

Highlighting Indian community's contribution in Brunei, PM Modi stated, "I am glad that the Indian community is making

a positive contribution to the economy and society of Brunei. With the inauguration of the Indian High Commission yesterday, the Indian community has got a permanent address. We are grateful to the Sultan of

"This year, Brunei will celebrate its 40th Independence Day. Your majesty, Brunei, under your leadership has progressed with an important confluence of tradition and continuity. Your vision of Wawasan 2035 for Brunei is commendable. On behalf of 140 crore Indians, I extend my best

wishes to you and the people of Brunei," he said.

Expressing gratitude to Brunei's royal family for the warm welcome, the PM said, "I thank the royal family for the warm welcome and their hospitality. Even though this was the first bilateral meeting of an Indian Prime Minister with Brunei, the warmth that I received here reminded me of our shared history."

Calling Brunei an 'important partner' in India's Act East Policy, PM Modi said, "Brunei is an important partner in India's Act East policy and Indo-Pacific vision. India prioritizes ASEAN centrality and will continue to do so. We will support freedom of navigation and overflight under international laws like UNCLOS. We agree that a code of conduct should be followed in this sector. We support the policy of development and not expansion."

Earlier, PM Modi held a meeting with Brunei Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah and during the "wide ranging" talks the two leaders discussed ways to further cement

bilateral ties.

In a post on X, PM Modi stated, "Delighted to meet His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah, Our talks were wide ranging and included ways to further cement bilateral ties between our nations. We are

going to further expand trade ties, commercial linkages and people-to-people exchanges."

Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) official spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal termed Brunei an "important partner" in India's 'Act East' Policy and its vision of the Indo-Pacific.

In a post on X, Jaiswal stated, "Building stronger India-Brunei relations. PM @narendramodi was warmly welcomed at the Istana Nurul Iman by His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah of Brunei and his close family members. Biden says Harris has 'ramrod' backbone, moral compass of 'saint'

WASHINGTON: US President Joe Biden pitched Vice President Kamala Harris to American workers and unions at their first joint rally on Labor Day on 2nd September, as someone with a "ramrod" backbone and the moral compass of a "saint".

Vice President Harris, in turn, was effusive in her praise of Biden calling him "one of most transformative presidents in the United States".

Biden had not appeared together with Harris at an election rally after dropping out of the White House race in July and endorsing her to replace him on the Democratic ticket. He delivered the kevnote address on the first day of the Democratic convention in August in Chicago. He had not appeared in a rally either by himself or jointly since in Pittsburg, a strong union city in Pennsylvania -- a key battleground state on the road to the White House.

"She has a backbone like a ramrod, she has a moral compass of a saint," President Biden said to loud cheers from the audience. "This woman knows what she's doing. Folks, I promise you, if you elect Kamala Harris as President, (it) will be the best visit you will have ever made. Kamala thinks, as I do, unions are the spine of this economy. She'll be a historic pro-union president."

Biden remains popular with labor unions. But there are questions about the clout of the once powerful unions. Only one in 10 members of the American workforce is now represented by a union, half the percentage of the representation in the 1980s, according to The New York

Biden, who has spoken frequently about his unstinting support for belief in unions, remains popular with union members and he appealed to them to back Harris. "Folks, we've made a lot of progress, and Kamala and I are going to build on that progress, and she's going to build on it,"

set his amazing standards by winning eight times in 2006 including six wins in a row and two majors, all while dealing with the death of his father. Scheffler's eight wins included the Masters, THE PLAYERS Championship, an Olympic gold medal, and the TOUR Championship that enabled him to finally claim the FedExCup. Scheffler's seven PGA TOUR titles are the most since Woods in 2007. IANS

"India's ties with Gulf nations deepened under PM Modi": EAM Jaishankar

SINGAPORE: Ahead of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Singapore, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar highlighted the significant progress made in India's relationship with Gulf nations over the past decade.

Jaishankar also said that, unlike previous governments, the policies under PM Modi's administration have extended to include investments, technology, security and connectivity in Gulf countries.

In an interview with Singapore-based 'The Strait Times,' Jaishankar on a question that there is a perception that India's principal focus in its extended neighborhood is now the Gulf, not ASEAN, he said, "I would not take an either/or approach. Certainly, in the last decade, India's ties with Gulf nations have really taken off.

Earlier governments used to view them more narrowly from the perspective of trade, energy and diaspora. In contrast, the Modi government's policies have extended to investments, technology, security and connectivity."

Jaishankar also noted that India feels that the contributions of the Indian community are more acknowledged in the Gulf. "We definitely feel that the contributions of our community are more strongly recognized (in the Gulf). Both the economic and demographic complementarities are today coming into much greater play. But because of this, I would not draw any conclusions in regard to ASEAN. Our ties have deepened as well in this very period."

The External Affairs Minister further

said that India being the fifth largest economy will necessarily have multi-directional engagements. He said, "The fact is that India - as the most populous country and currently the fifth-largest economy - will necessarily have multi-directional engagements. The world is not a zero-sum game for us."

Jaishankar also expressed his views on the Act East policy and emphasized that Singapore has a central role to play. He said, "Singapore, which was at the core of our Look East policy, has an equally central role in the Act East policy as well. If you look at the new domains that reflect this evolution, Singapore's partnership in security, connectivity, technology and sustainability is evident."

"The Act East policy is certainly very active for a variety of reasons. Southeast Asia itself has much untapped potential. Its demographics and growth prospects make it a long-term partner," Jaishankar said.

Outlining an example, Jaishankar added, "Imagine, for example, what a change the Trilateral Highway (plan to connect India with Myanmar and Thailand) can make when completed. It is also a relationship that is indispensable for India's Indo-Pacific engagement. I would confidently predict a bright future." ANI

reers in combat sports a clear path.



PM Modi-led Cabinet approves Rs 3,300 crore semiconductor unit

NEW DELHI: The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, approved the proposal of Kaynes Semicon Pvt Ltd to setup a semiconductor unit in Sanand, Gujarat, with an investment of Rs 3,300 crore.

The proposed unit, under the India Semiconductor Mission (ISM), will produce nearly 60 lakh chips per day. The chips produced in this unit will cater to a wide variety of applications which include segments such as industrial, automotive, electric vehicles, consumer electronics, telecom and mobile phones, etc.

According to PM Modi, the country has the potential to fulfil the dream of developing a 'Made in India' chip for every piece of equipment. The first indigenously-developed chip is set to arrive in the country by the end of this year.

In March, PM Modi laid the foundation stone of three semiconductor projects worth Rs 1.25 lakh crore.

Tata Electronics is setting up a semiconductor fab in Dholera, Gujarat and one semiconductor unit in Morigaon, Assam. CG Power is setting up one semiconductor unit in Sanand. These units will produce lakhs of direct and indirect jobs. *IANS*



47 Indians rescued from cyber-scam centers in Laos

LAOS: The Indian Embassy in Laos announced last week, it has successfully rescued 47 Indian nationals who were trapped in cyber-scam centers located in the Golden Triangle Special Economic Zone (SEZ) in Bokeo province.

The Embassy reported that 29 individuals were handed over by Laos authorities following a crackdown on illegal activities in the SEZ. The remaining 18 approached the Embassy directly, seeking assistance.

In a post on X, the Embassy explained that its officials travelled from the capital, Vientiane, to Bokeo, where they coordinated with local authorities to facilitate the rescue. The rescued individuals were then transported back to Vientiane, where they were provided with accommodation

The Embassy has completed all necessary procedural requirements with the Laos authorities



for the repatriation of these individuals. So far, 30 individuals have either returned to India or are on their way back home,

To date, 635 Indians have been rescued from similar situations in Laos and have safely returned to India. The Embassy has issued multiple warnings advising Indians considering job offers in Laos to exercise extreme caution and conduct thorough due diligence to avoid falling vic-

ters in Laos. In May, 13 Indians, including seven workers from Odisha, were also rescued and

repatriated.

The Embassy has highlighted that many of these fake job offers involve positions such as "Digital Sales and Marketing Executives" or "Customer Support Service" roles, which are fronts for callcenter scams cryptocurrency frauds. These offers are often facilitated by agents based in Dubai, Bangkok, Singapore, and India, who recruit Indian nationals with promises of high salaries, hotel bookings, return air tickets, and visa facilitation. IANS

Czech police finds 30 migrants in truck, one dead

PRAGUE: Czech Police found a truck carrying about 30 migrants on a highway, and one of them was dead.

The police said on social media platform X on 2nd September they stopped the truck on the D8 motorway near Veltrusy, north of Prague, after 8:00 p.m. and detained the migrants aboard, reports Xinhua news agency.

"Everything points to the fact that these are transit migrants,

and unfortunately, the initial information from the scene shows one person is dead," the police said without revealing more details.

After finding the migrants in a semi-trailer, the police closed the highway and used a helicopter to search for those who might have tried to escape.

Local media said the health condition of the migrants was bad. Their nationalities are not yet known. *IANS*

We have nothing further to add on that matter. Also to answer your question, you know, I think what you want to ask, what you are asking lies in the realm of hypothetical issues. So that is where we are on the issue that you raised."

Zaman, a resident of Attock, had a plan to travel from Malaysia to the United Kingdom (UK) with the assistance of an agent, ARY News reported citing Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) sources.

He had already paid Pakistani Rupees (PKR) 4,00,000 to the agent, with a total of PKR 2.8 million agreed upon for the illegal immigration attempt with payments made through both cash and microfinance accounts.

Last month, the FIA arrested two passengers at Sialkot Airport for their alleged involvement in human smug-

As per details, the arrested individuals, identified as Usman Irshad and Qasim Ali, were reportedly trying to smuggle people to Greece.

According to the FIA, Usman Arshad had arrived from Dubai and was found to be involved in human smuggling during investigations. He was allegedly working with an agent named Umair, a resident of Gujranwala. ANI



MUDA case: RTI activist who highlighted K'taka CM's role gets life threat from land mafia

BENGALURU: A Mysuru-based RTI activist, who highlighted the alleged irregularities in the Mysuru Urban Development Authority (MUDA) and Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah's role, claimed he was getting life threats from land sharks and the real estate mafia.

In response to threats from the real estate mafia, the Karnataka Police has started patrolling his residence and the surrounding areas in Mysuru city.

RTI activist N Gangaraju, who had exposed Chief Minister Siddaramaiah's family's involvement in the MUDA case, has written a letter to the Chief Minister' Office (CMO) requesting security and the deputation of a gunman.

The authorities while rejecting his request for a gunman have arranged for police patrolling around his residence. Additionally, a 'Smart e-beat' system has been set up at his home.

Speaking to IANS, Gangaraju explained that two to three crucial documents in the MUDA case against Chief Minister Siddaramaiah are yet to come out.

"On Sunday (Sept. 1), when I was returning from Pandavapura town to Mysuru with my family, strange persons waylaid the vehicle and threatened me and my family and I got their photos. The threats have continued," he stated.

"I was the one who had registered a criminal case against Chief Minister Siddaramaiah during his first tenure as the CM, regarding his direct involvement in a land case.

"Now, the matter is before the Supreme Court. At present the High Court is asking petitioners to establish direct involvement of CM Siddaramaiah in the case and I can establish his role but I am being threatened," Gangaraju stated.

"I was the first to bring out the MUDA case," Gangaraju stated.


The Inspector of Kuvempunagar Police Station in Mysuru in a written statement to Gangaraju on August 28 stated, "The PSI, ASI, Cheetah bike patrol, mobile squad, plainclothes officers, crime division police, and sleuths from the Intelligence wing will patrol the residence and surrounding areas to keep viril

"The police department has also placed a point book at your residence where the beat police are required to sign in, during both day and night shifts. Officers are also tasked with gathering information regarding the movement of suspicious persons."

The police have asked Gangaraju to inform them immediately if he faces any threats to his life or the lives of his family members.

"He can either call the emergency number or file a complaint with the police. If Gangaraju wants protection from a gunman, he can avail of the facility by paying the stipulated fee." *IANS*



Devotional Singing and its effect on mind and actions

CHICAGO: Devotional singing of Bhajans is the method of singing that originates in the heart and comes out of our tongue.

It is the expression of our joyous thrill while singing the Glory of God. It is the spontaneous manifestation of inner happiness. It does not seek the admiration or the appreciation of the listeners. It is just a group singing of the names of the Lord. Devotional singing of Bhajan is one of the processes by which you can train the mind to realize eternal values. It teaches your mind to comprehend the glory and majesty of God and stay away from petty horizons of pleasure.

Devotional singing induces in you a desire for experiencing the truth, the glimpses of beauty that is God, and the taste of the bliss that is total godliness. It encourages man to dive into himself and be genuinely his real self and not influenced by the external forces. Devotional singing of Bhajan is a spiritual practice/Sadhana. Every song sung in praise of the Lord/God/Goddess is a sword that cuts the six enemies of the mind, which are Kama (desire/lust), Krodha (anger), Lobha (greed), Mada (ego), Moha (attachment), and Matsarya (jealousy) additionally Alasya (laziness).

It is a great social service to remind all of their duty to the Almighty, who watches over them. People realize that there is nothing superior to Bhajans for they are filled with bliss. They demonstrate oneness when groups of people join in voic-

ing the names of God. The vibrations emanating from singing Bhajans make the heart vibrant. If you sing alone in the shrine, the vibrations return to you as a reaction but in community singing, you do not have a reaction but a wave of vibrations. They enter into the atmosphere and purify the polluted air as today's atmosphere around us is polluted by bad thoughts and feelings.

When you sing the Glory of God, the bad thoughts will be destroyed and thereby the bad actions will be vanished. When all the participants in a Bhajans

sung in any language as long as all can follow them but all in chorus can sing familiar Bhajans and bring added Ananda/bliss. When you sing Bhajans, try to understand the meaning of the song and the message of each name and form of God. Bhajan must provide a thrilling experience to the participants and leave them with full of pure energy and elevated enthusiasm. The purpose of singing Bhajan is to spread good will, love, and happiness. It must cleanse the polluted atmosphere; it must invite all to share the joy and peace.

Devotional singing induces in you a desire for experiencing the truth, the glimpses of beauty that is God, and the taste of the bliss that is total godliness. It encourages man to dive into himself and be genuinely his real self and not influenced by the external forces. Devotional singing of Bhajan is a spiritual practice/Sadhana

singing are in unison, sacred vibrations are produced and divine energies are released. When the cosmos is filled with these vibrations, they inspire divine power to destroy bad forces and establishes equilibrium in the world.

Those who sing Bhajans derive joy and distribute joy. It is recommended to have Bhajans on as many days as possible or at least once a week. Have them in a central hall where all the devotees can sit comfortably and sing. Bhajans can be

The Ngarsankirtan/ congregational singing of Bhajans must be radiating devotion and love. The singer should fill every moment of singing with energy, enthusiasm, and effort to derive the Ananda/bliss to the participants. Everyone must sing the names aloud as far as the voice can reach so that the divine will respond in full measure and shower His grace. Together with melody and rhythm, you have to impart feeling to your singing to make the Bhajan a sacred of

fering to the Divine. A tune without feeling is ineffective. You must sing the Bhajans in a spirit of humility and devotion.

Bhajan must make the listener to experience the presence of the Lord and your singing should please the Lord as well. Devotional fervor is more important than musical skills in singing Bhajans. Pay just attention to the tune, the raga (rhythm), the tala (beat), the pronunciation, the meaning, and other fine points of the Bhajans. While singing, let your heart pant for God, then the raga (rhythm) and tala (beat) will automatically be pleasant and correct. Do not sing one song for more than six minutes, repeating the same line often. Repeat each line twice and no more. Have only two speeds, slow and fast. In this way, you can have in one hour of Bhajans, more songs, more forms, more tunes, and more variety, giving more people a chance. Those with a good voice and musical talent must lead the Keertan/ singing the name of God. It must be pleasant to the ear. If your voice is not pleasant or sweet, keep quiet or sing in your mind that is the best service you can do.

Participants should carry the elevated, uplifted and sublime mood created by the atmosphere at the Bhajans. Therefore, after the Bhajans, people should disperse quietly; maintaining silence so that the joy and peace derived from the Bhajans will linger and abide in the heart.

Why water should replace sugar filled beverages

NEW DELHI: The increased consumption of sugar-filled beverages is surging health problems such as Type 2 diabetes, obesity, heart disease, and tooth decay worldwide. Switching sugary drinks with water can be a way to prevent these problems, suggests a study.

Researchers from Virginia Tech, US, examined the comprehensiveness and comprehensibility of healthy beverage guidelines for nations that implemented tax laws on sugar-filled beverages between 2000 and 2023. They examined the textual and visual suggestions found in national dietary guidelines from different nations to determine how they promote the substitution of water for sugary drinks like soda.

By choosing healthy drinks like water over sugary ones, one can lower their risk of obesity and other health issues. Governments can use this information that the researchers gleaned meticulously to rate recommendations for good hydration and discourage the consumption of sugary drinks by improving the message's rationale, action-ability, specificity, and visual content.

About 58 of the 93 nations that aimed to impose tariffs on sugar-filled beverages in 2023 have dietary standards based on food. *IANS*

10 new Ayush institutes to be opened in next 5 years: Minister

NEW DELHI: The government has announced 10 new Ayush institutes will be opened in the next five years to expand the traditional medical system, allowing every citizen in the country to benefit from it.

The announcement came as Union Minister of State for Ayush (Independent Charge) and Health Minister, Prataprao Jadhav, visited the All-India Institute of Ayurveda (AIIA), where he reviewed the facilities and the treatments being provided to the patients.

The minister emphasized that the government is committed to fulfilling the Prime Minister Narendra Modi's effort to bring Ayurveda to every household.

"Ayurveda and our traditional medical system suffered significant damage during the colonial period and foreign invasions but today, there has been a global shift in perception towards Yoga and Ayurveda, and their accep-

tance is rapidly increasing," said .ladhay

Professor Tanuja Nesari, AIIA Director, said Minister Jadhav has played a significant role in promoting Ayurveda, and "his the masses and establishing it on the global stage."

Minister Jadhav also announced an international conference, titled 'AAROHA-2024,' scheduled from October 17-19.

Wellness Centres (AHWCs), renamed as Ayushman Arogya Mandirs (Ayush), under Ayushman Bharat are functional in the country.

With 2,019 functional Ayushman Arogya Mandirs, Rajasthan leads in the states, followed by Uttar Pradesh (1,034), Madhya Pradesh (800), Himachal Pradesh (740) and Kerala (700).

The Ministry of Ayush also plans to roll out the NABH (National Accreditation Board for Hospitals and Healthcare Providers) entry-level certification to 1,000 Ayushman Arogya Mandir by next month. Of this, 750 have been certified so far.

Further, 541 Ayurveda, 58 Unani, 17 Siddha, and 277 Homeopathy colleges or educational institutes have been established in the academic year 2023-24 in the country -- a significant rise since 2014. *IANS*

How robots are revolutionizing healthcare, especially orthopedics

NEW DELHI: Robots have long been demonized in science fiction and the public imagination, by the very public that created them.

Nevertheless, doctors themselves now say that robots are capable of giving a healing touch, especially in the orthopaedic sector, where they can perform joint replacement.

Out of the several stages the surgeon performs, the robot completes two crucial ones in robotic-assisted joint replacement, the precise cutting of the bone, as well as the implant's size and positioning.

The lifespan of the knee re-

placement is determined by these two steps. These procedures are nearly always exact when performed by a skilled of this mistake. Although this requires further study.

Robotic technology has brought precision and better results to joint replacement surgery, revolutionizing the procedure. A 3D model of the patient's joint is produced using sophisticated imaging and computer algorithms, enabling customized surgical planning.

This accuracy lowers the possibility of human error, enhances joint function, and lessens pain following surgery.

Because robotic technologies enable real-time alterations, every surgery may be tailored to meet the specific demands of the patient.

Robotic systems will continue to improve joint replacement care as long as breakthroughs in technology are made. *IANS*

Patients with existing lung problems are more susceptible to lung cancer, warns study

NEW DELHI: People with lung problems like chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) and asthma, may experience delays in receiving a lung cancer diagnosis, according to a recent study.

The study, led by researchers at Brighton and Sussex Medical School (BSMS), examined hospital and general practitioner data from 11,870 patients in England who were diagnosed with lung cancer between 1990 and 2019.

A study by Dr Imogen Roger from the BSMS found that patients with "alternative explanations" for lung cancer symptoms experienced significant delays in diagnosis. Patients with one condition, like COPD or asthma, were diagnosed 31 days later, while those with two or more conditions experienced an even longer delay, 74 days on average in that case.

The study also discovered that once age, sex, and smoking history were taken into account, diseases like diabetes or arthritis that put "competing demands" on a general practitioner's time did not significantly affect the time to lung cancer diagnosis.

The factor that was found to cause the largest delay in the identification of lung cancer was COPD; patients with

the condition were diagnosed 59 days later than those without it.

Updated clinical recommendations are especially important for people with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), the study emphasizes. According to the research, COPD may conceal early signs of lung cancer, delaying identification and treatment. The study team notes how critical it is to increase healthcare workers'

awareness in order to shorten diagnostic turnaround times and enhance patient outcomes.

This research underscores the need for heightened vigilance in patients with chronic respiratory conditions. It is important to understand that lung cancer symptoms can be mislabeled as COPD in order to expedite detection and treatment.

The research aims to enhance early identification and treatment of lung cancer in individuals with COPD by revising clinical standards and raising awareness, which will ultimately result in better health outcomes. The conclusions highlight the importance of quick thinking and attentive monitoring, with significant ramifications for both patients and healthcare providers. IANS

Study shows kidney drug can boost treatment outcomes for heart attack patients

NEW DELHI: An international team of researchers, led by one of Indian origin, has demonstrated that a drug used to treat kidney diseases can be safely administered to patients who are hospitalized for acute myocardial infarction -- heart attack.

The team led by Mount Sinai Fuster Heart Hospital demonstrated that the drug empagliflozin can reliably lower heart failure episodes in individuals who have had a heart attack, regardless of the patient's pre-existing renal function. Acute heart attack patients are particularly vulnerable to acute renal injury because of prolonged exposure to kidney stressors, such as diuretics or contrast agents used during cardiac catheterization.

Because of this danger, doctors are hesitant to start empagliflozin soon after a heart attack because there is little data regarding this class of drug's safety in this particular clinical setting. The drug can block the so-dium-glucose cotransporter-2-protein that aids in the kidneys' ability to reabsorb glucose from the blood.

Deepak L. Bhatt, Director of the Hospital said the finding will contribute to closing a significant knowledge gap on the clinical application of Empagliflozin in heart attack survivors.

The trial randomized 6,522 patients with acute heart attack and increased heart failure risk to empagliflozin or placebo. Empagliflozin reduced hospitalization and adverse events of heart failure, with consistent risk reductions across baseline kidney function. *IANS*



The Third Eye: Conflict-ridden Middle East is putting global peace at risk

he steady spread of radicalization in the Muslim world, the deepen ing Sunni-Shia conflict in the Middle East and the growing impact of the historical religious divides on the current geopolitics, are the ongoing trends that should cause concern to the democratic world.

The attack on July 16 at Muscat, the capital of the Sultanate of Oman -- a moderate Islamic country with friendly ties with the US, by a 'suicide' team of ISIS which along with Al Qaeda represents the leading forces of Islamic radicals, confirms that radicalization was pushing ahead in this region.

The attackers targeted a Shia congregation worshipping on Ashura eve at Imam Ali Mosque -- the event marked the first terrorist offensive in the Gulf in recent times -- thereby demonstrating also the extreme hostility harbored by Sunni extremists

The fundamentalist Shiism is anti-US because of its ideological opposition to a capitalist economy and it is no surprise that Iran under the Ayatollah's rule is getting politically aligned with Russia and China, in the Cold War kind of divide that was evidently reappearing between the US on the one hand, and the axis of these two countries on the other.

What is being witnessed here is the fact that the divisions of 'faith' involving a fundamentalist Iran, a Salafi Saudi Arabia, a Zionist Israel and the Wahhabi forces of ISIS and Al Qaeda were influencing the political agenda of international relations.

The 'war on terror' launched by the US in the wake of 9/11 -- first in Afghanistan and then in Iraq -- led to a consolidation of Islamic radical forces in these two theatres. While the Taliban-Al Qaeda axis managed to dig in heels in the Afghanistan-Pak belt, the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) arose in 2004 as an affiliate of Al Qaeda in the Iraq-Syria region.

Osama bin Laden founder leader of Al

Qaeda was killed at Abbottabad in Pakistan in May 2011 in a midnight operation of US Navy SEALS and subsequently, Abu Omar Al-Baghdadi who had formed ISIS, was also killed in a raid by American troops in North Western Syria in October 2019.

The US policy of demolishing the leadership of Islamic radical outfits has not prevented the latter from advancing their indoctrination drive for Jehad and striking roots in new territories.

The historical memory of the 19th century Wahhabi revolt against the Western colonizers has kept the radical forces going after the US-led West -- regarding the latter as their first enemy -- and also targeting a country like Saudi Arabia considered to be the closest ally of the US in the Arab world.

The Saudis run a puritanical Salafi state but the Wahhabis while endorsing the 'revivalist' call of return to the golden

period of Islam of the first four Caliphs, stand in total opposition to the US politically.

In Pakistan, the Tehrike Taliban Pakistan (TTP) attacks the establishment because of its leanings towards the US

whereas in the Iraq-Syria region, ISIS directly confronts the American presence. Both TTP and ISIS have also targeted Shiites because the more extremist a Sunni outfit was, the greater its hostility towards Shiism for historical reasons. That radical Sunni-Shia antagonism is going to be a prime source of violent friction in the Muslim world in the coming times is indicated by the reports that Iran had decided to erect a 300-km boundary wall separating the country from Afghanistan-IRGC being made responsible for it showed that the project was of military importance.

What is impacting the current geopolitical scene is the series of attacks carried out by ISIS in Syria, Iran and Russia in recent times. In a lethal offensive ISIS-K, a branch of ISIS- attacked a Moscow concert hall on March 22, 2024, killing 130 people and injuring hundreds more.



Balochistan's enforced disappearances: When will Pakistan own up to its flawed policies?

he International Day of the Disappeared, ob served on 30 August annually, holds particular relevance to Pakistan's Khyber PakhtunKhwa and Balochistan provinces, plagued by enforced disappearances and target killings. Activists here have long been agitating against these abuses, alleging state and military complicity.

A 2024 report by the Commission of Inquiry on Enforced Disappearances has documented 10,088 enforced disappearances since 2011. Of these, 4,413 were resolved, while security agencies enforced only 7% of the 744 'Production Orders - a legal mechanism to produce detainees in court.

In Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa, 3,485 have gone "missing" since 2011, of which 1,336 cases were still pending by yearend. Balochistan had the second-highest number of such cases, 2,752, with 1,990 resolved and 468 pending by the end of 2023.

The activist organization Voice of Baloch Missing Persons says that the government figures are grossly under-reported, and that there are about 8,000 cases of enforced disappearances in Balochistan.

Analysts hold that systematic state repression and denial of rights fuels insurgencies as well as giving cover to armed militant groups formed in the name of religion. The recent murder of several migrant workers in the Musa Khel area of Balochistan, is a case in point.

Women-led protests

With so many men being disappeared or threatened, Baloch women have stepped up to take an active role in this campaign, also addressing land occupation and resource deprivation. Their women-led Baloch Yakjehti, or Solidarity, Committee is known as the BYC.

Co-convener of the BYC, Sammi Deen Baloch, 26, began her activism after her father was taken away from their Khuzdar home in 2009. He has been 'missing' since. She told Sapan News that she feared that this grassroots movement led by unaffiliated Baloch women would fade into oblivion. However, it gained momentum with support from political workers, human rights advocates, activists, and students.

However, this is the first time that women and young girls from Balochistan have come out like this, Farhatullah Babar told Sapan News. The sit-in ended under hostile conditions, with no government negotiations, mainstream parties silent, and growing pressure from various quarters.

"We have lost faith in elections because every government has used our issue as a political bargaining chip," lamented Sammi Baloch, speaking to Sapan News earlier this year from Quetta. "Once in power, they get caught up in safeguarding their so-called seats and po-

The BYC alleged that the Frontier Corps, a paramilitary force responsible for security in the region, was behind the deaths. The provincial government denies any involvement.

The Sindh administration cracked down on a rally in Karachi in support of the Gwadar demonstration, with several protesters including prominent academic Dr. Nida Kirmani being detained. Police charged 35 male protestors with terrorism, citing a violation of Section 144. This is a legal provision which bans public gathering. However, a demonstration by religious groups nearby was allowed to continue freely, exposing the stark disparity in state treatment.

"This is clear discrimination and goes against all principles of democracy. We cannot say this is a democratic state when an entire population is being suppressed and prevented from exercising their constitutional rights," Dr.

sitions and forget about us."

At the end of July this year, the BYC convened a one-day demonstration at the port city of Gwadar, for which convoys of protestors converged from all over the province.

Though the women-led movement is up against Balochistan's traditionally conservative norms, "we were welcomed with flowers and cheers at every stop," she added.

However, the state responded with teargas and police action. At least three persons were killed, and several injured ahead of the Gwadar sit-in. This led to the protest extending to ten days.

Kirmani told Sapan News.

Such demonstrations are not new. The extended 'long march' ten years ago, in 2013, went on for at least a year. The activist Sabeen Mahmud will forever be associated with this, as she was killed in 2015 after hosting a discussion on the issue at The Second Floor cafe-gallery in Karachi that she had founded.

MAIN CHALLENGE FOR INDIA

ndia is at a turning point, both in terms of economic growth and in the human development of its 1.4 billion citizens. The country is the fifth largest economy in the world, overtaking UK this year. India's GDP is now at \$3.9 trillion according to IMF. It is continue to grow and hoping to become \$5 trillion economy within next few years. It does this while being the world's largest democracy and the world's second most populous nation, with nearly 1.35 billion people spread across hundreds of thousands of large urban centers, small towns and rural clusters.

First, the education system focuses on gaining conceptual knowledge, rather than tangible skills, which ensure employability. Second, there are more jobs in the informal economy than in the formal economy. Third, there are state-level and regional disparities within India in terms of employment opportunities.

Looking further ahead to 2030, India will remain a relatively young nation with a median age of 31 years (compared to 42 in China and 40 in the United States) and will have added more working age citizens to the world than any other country. India will gain nearly 10-12 million working age people every year over the next decade, leading to a "working age majority". Therefore, to ensure the country's envisioned income growth, and hence consumption growth, massive efforts will be required to provide the right skills and gainful employment, with leadership needed from all stakeholders, including corporates, academia, not-for-profit organizations and government leaders.

With sustained, efficient execution, such innovative programs in digital and financial areas, along with the proposed improvement of physical infrastructure (road connectivity to nearby urban centers and reliable power supply to all rural households), will be key drivers to ensure inclusive growth in India, truly bridging urban-rural divides across multiple levels.

Two key challenges must be solved to improve the quality of health and urban livability for India's citizens at the macro level. First, while improving overall access to and affordability of healthcare services, it will be crucial to address the advent of noncommunicable diseases, which currently account for 63% of all deaths in India. NCDs are on the rise, owing to unhealthy food and lifestyle choices, across both urban and rural areas, and across income segments.

Second, the impending crises in air and water pollution, waste management and urban congestion must be urgently solved. As an illustration of the magnitude of just one dimension of the airwater-waste-congestion challenge, nine of the world's 10 most air-polluted cities are in India, including its capital New Delhi.

As the country enters a new era of envisioned growth, now is the time for all Indians to come together as one and address the most pressing societal challenges facing the country today: skilling and job creation, the socioeconomic inclusion of rural India, and the building of a healthy and sustainable future for every citizen.

Collaborative efforts, especially public-private partnerships to address these challenges, can unlock the full potential of a young, progressive and dynamic nation, and establish India as a model for the world's fast-growing consumer markets.


debut with 'Kahan Shuru Kahan Khatam', has shared that shooting for the film in the town of Chanderi made her feel homesick.
