

The reports have said that New Delhi has conveyed to Canada that if the diplomats are not withdrawn by the deadline, they will lose their diplomatic immunity.

There are more than 60 Canadian diplomats posted in India.

Last month, after Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau had alleged in Parliament that Indian intelligence agents may have been involved in the murder of Sikh pro-Khalistan hardliner Hardeep Singh Nijjar, the diplomatic relations have hit an all time low between the two nations.

Following Trudeau's allegations, both the countries had expelled a diplomat each.

India had also termed Canada's allegations as "politically driven".

On September 21, while replying to questions related to a possible reduction of Canadian diplomats stationed in India, External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Arindam Bagchi had said: "Yes, we've informed the government of Canada that there should be parity in strength in our mutual diplomatic presence. Their number is very much higher than ours in Canada... I assume there will be a reduction from the Canadian side."

Nijjar was shot dead outside a gurdwara in Surrey, British Columbia, on June 18 by masked gunmen. *IANS*

Its important that diplomats remain on ground: Canadian Foreign Minister amid row with India

OTTAWA: Amid the continuing diplomatic fallout of Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's claim of the involvement of Indian agents in the killing of Sikh separatist leader Hardeep Singh Nijjar, Canada's Foreign Minister Melanie Joly called it is important that diplomats remain on the ground.

She said Canada believes in the im-

portance of having a "strong diplomatic footprint" in India, Canada-based CPAC reported.

Speaking to reporters, Joly said, "So in moments of tensions, because indeed there are tensions between both of the governments more than ever, it's important that diplomats be on the ground. And that's why we believe in the importance of

having a strong diplomatic footprint in India. That being said, we are in go ongoing conversations with the Indian government, and we will continue...," CPAC reported.

She made the remarks in response to the question regarding reports claiming that India has asked Canada to remove 41 of its 62 diplomats in the country.

Nijjar, a designated terrorist in India, was killed outside a gurdwara in Canada's Surrey on June 18. India has also expelled a senior Canadian diplomat in a reciprocal move to Canada expelling a senior Indian diplomat.

Meanwhile, Prime Minister Trudeau has said his country was not "looking to escalate the situation with India," adding that Ottawa wants to remain on the ground in New Delhi to help Canadians, Reuters reported.

"Canada is not looking to escalate the situation with India, will continue to engage responsibly and constructively with New Delhi. We want to be on the ground in India to help the Canadian families there," Reuters quoted PM Trudeau as saying.

During a debate in the Canadian Parliament in September, Trudeau claimed Canada's national security officials had reasons to believe that "agents of the Indian government" carried out the killing of Nijjar. India outrightly rejected the claims calling them "absurd and motivated".

Last week, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said the ongoing problem with Canada has been there for some years because of the "permissiveness" by the government regarding terrorism, extremism and violence in the country.

Jaishankar said the current situation can't be termed a "deadlock", adding that the Indian government is open to looking at any specific and relevant thing shared by the Canadian side in connection with the issue.

Addressing a press conference in

Washington DC last week Jaishankar said, "Well, I don't know if I would use the term deadlock...The issue is as follows: The Canadians have made some allegations. We have pointed out to them that this is not the Government of India's policy and if they are prepared to share with us specifics and anything relevant, we are also open to looking at it. So in that sense, that's where the matter stands". ANI



2 Indian-origin men plead guilty to multimillion-dollar Covid fraud in US

NEW YORK: Two Indian-origin men have pleaded guilty to their role in a scheme to fraudulently obtain and launder millions of dollars in forgivable Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loans that the Small Business Administration guaranteed under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act.

Nishant Patel, 41, Harjeet Singh, 49, and three others

engaged in a conspiracy to defraud the SBA and certain SBA-approved PPP lenders by submitting false and fraudulent PPP loan applications, a Department of Justice statement said on 2nd October.

All five defendants also assisted in laundering the fraudulently obtained PPP loan funds

by supplying the co-conspirators with blank, endorsed checks, which were made payable to people posing as employees of the companies that received the PPP loan, but who were in fact not employees.

These fake paychecks were then cashed at the check cashing stores that other members of the conspiracy controlled, according to court documents.

As part of the scheme, Patel obtained a false and fraudulent PPP loan in the amount of nearly \$474,993 and Singh obtained two false and fraudulent PPP loans for a total of nearly \$937,379.

The total amount obtained by the other three amounted to more than \$1.4 million in total.

> All five of them pleaded guilty to one count of conspiracy to commit wire fraud, and are scheduled to be sentenced on January 4, 2024.

> They face a total maximum penalty of five years

> A federal district court judge will determine any sentence after consider-

ing the US Sentencing Guidelines and other statutory fac-

In addition to these five defendants, one other individual was convicted at trial for his involvement in the scheme, and 15 other individuals have pleaded guilty to their involvement in the loan fraud scheme. IANS

Canada wants "private talks" with India to resolve diplomatic dispute: Foreign Minister Melanie Joly

OTTAWA: Canadian Foreign Minister Melanie Joly has said the country wants "private talks with India to resolve a diplomatic dispute" over the killing of Khalistan terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijiar, Reuters reported

"We are in contact with the government of India. We take Canadian diplomats' safety very seriously and we will continue to engage privately because we think diplomatic conversations are best when they remain private," Reuters quoted Joly as saying to reporters.

The statement by Joly comes after a report said India had asked Canada to withdraw 41 diplomats.

India has told Canada that it must repatriate the diplomats by October 10. Neither Joly nor Prime Minister Justin Trudeau responded when asked if the report was accurate, as per Reuters.

There is a strain in India-Canada relations following Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's allegations regarding the Indian government's 'potential role' in the fatal shooting of Khalistan terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijjar.

Notably, Canada has yet to provide any public evidence to support the claim about the killing of Hardeep Singh Nijjar. The country has said it wants to "work constructively with India" regarding the allegations. ANI



Indian-American CEO agrees to pay \$20 mn to settle kickback allegations

NEW YORK: BioTek reMEDvs, a Delaware-based pharma company and its Indian-origin CEO Chaitanya Gadde, have agreed to pay \$20 million to resolve allegations of violating the False Claims Act of paying kickbacks to patients and physicians to protect its revenue

The government alleged that, from at least August 2015 through May 2020, the specialty pharmacy that offers drugs and infusion services, routinely waived the copayments of Medicare and TRICARE patients to induce those patients to purchase its drugs and services.

Many of the specialty drugs offered by BioTek were expensive and required patients to pay large copays, a Department of Justice release stated on 2nd October.

The government said that the company sought to avoid deterring patients from purchasing its drugs and services by engaging in a scheme, orchestrated and

It was also alleged that BioTek provided remuneration in the form of gifts, dinners and free administrative and clinical support services to physicians to induce them to refer patients to BioTek.

The government named Dr David Tabby -- who operated a neurology practice in Pennsylvania -- and claimed that he knowingly solicited and accepted the remuneration in exchange for referring numerous patients to

The Department's release stated that Tabby has separately paid \$480,000 to settle these allegations, based on his ability to pay.

"BioTek allegedly provided improper physician inducements and covered up kickbacks for patient referrals by waiving co-pays," said US Attorney Jacqueline C. Romero for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania.

"BioTek's alleged scheme, orchestrated and imple-

mented by Gadde, Dr Tabby, and others, to routinely waive these copays -- without regard for whether the patients were experiencing financial hardship -- ensured a steady rev-

enue stream for BioTek and undermined patient care to citizens of this District," Romero said.

The federal Anti-Kickback Statute prohibits the offering, paying, soliciting or accepting, directly or indirectly, of any remuneration -- which includes money or any other thing of value -- to refer or arrange for the referral of items or services payable by any federal healthcare program.

This prohibition extends to companies that routinely waive the copays of Medicare patients without determination of financial need. IANS

implemented by Gadde to routinely waive these large copays, without regard for whether the patients were experiencing financial hardship.

When a Medicare beneficiary obtains a prescription drug covered by Medicare, the beneficiary may be required to make a partial payment, which may take the form of a copayment, coinsurance or a deductible (collectively copays). Congress included copay requirements in the Medicare program in part to serve as a check on health care costs.

Largest Ambedkar statue outside India to be unveiled in US on Oct 14

NEW YORK: A 19-foot statue of B.R. Ambedkar, named 'Statue of Equality' and also the largest outside

India, is set to be unveiled in the US state of Maryland on October 14 to celebrate the life and legacy of the leader and architect of the Indian Constitution.

Built on 13 acres of land in Accokeek city, just 21 miles away from White House, it is a replica of the world's largest 125-feet Ambedkar statue unveiled in Hyderabad recently, according to the organizers.

According to the Ambedkar International Center (AIC), it is the "largest statue of Ambedkar outside India", and part of the organization's first Ambedkar Memorial project in the US.

"Be a part of this inspiring occasion as we honor Dr Ambedkar's contributions to equality, human rights, and empowerment," AIC said in a statement.

> "Witness the grand unveiling of the magnificent statue, a symbol of his enduring influence, and pay homage to the great leader who dedicated his life to fighting injustice."

> The event, which will begin at 10 a.m., will be followed by cultural perfor-

> The statue is crafted by renowned artist and sculptor Ram Sutar, a Padma Shri award recipient, who also built the biggest Sardar Patel statue in Ahmedabad.

> Sutar has made more than 90 monumental sculptures in the last sixty years, which have been placed in India, the US, France, Argentina, Italy, Russia and Malaysia. IANS

US: Vivek Ramaswamy says chaos 'not a bad thing' after House Speaker McCarthy's ouster

WASHINGTON, DC: Following the ouster of US House Speaker Kevin McCarthy on Tuesday, Indian-American entrepreneur and Republican presidential candidate Vivek Ramaswamy has said that the resultant

chaos is a positive thing, according to The Hill.

"The point of removing the House Speaker was to sow chaos. That's what the critics of Matt Gaetz and everybody else is saying," Ramaswamy said on Tuesday in a video message.

"And my advice to the people who voted to remove him should own it," he added

The mutiny, led by Rep. Matt Gaetz (R-Fla.), came days after McCarthy averted a government shutdown by putting a stopgap mea-

sure on the floor that garnered Democratic support - a move that infuriated hardline Republicans.

"But the real question to ask, to get to the bottom of it, is whether chaos is really such a bad thing? Admit it. There was no better plan of action for who's going to fill that Speaker role. So was the point to sow chaos? Yes, it was. But the real question to ask, to get to the bottom of it, is whether chaos is really such a bad thing?" Ramaswamy said further.

In the final 216-210 vote, seven Republicans joined Gaetz to unseat McCarthy. The following Republicans voted to oust McCarthy- Andy Biggs, Ken Buck, Tim Burchett, Eli Crane, Matt Gaetz, Bob Good, Nancy Mace

and Matt Rosendale, The Hill reported.

Every Democrat in the chamber also voted to boot McCarthy, refusing to help protect him from his unruly conference. McCarthy said he would give Democrats nothing if they were to vote to help him.

Republicans, according to Ramaswamy, a political outsider who ran his campaign on challenging the established order, have more pressing concerns than who will be the next Speaker.

He asserted that the House GOP

should concentrate on subjects Gaetz and his friends claimed McCarthy was weak on, including border security, the national debt, and security against China.

Republicans who opposed McCarthy claimed that the former speaker caved to Democratic pressure throughout the appropriations process, notably when he passed a bipartisan budget continuing resolution over the weekend that prevented a government shutdown, The Hill reported. *ANI*

Over 200,000 migrants apprehended at US-Mexico border in Sept., highest in 2023

WASHINGTON: US Border Patrol apprehended more than 200,000 migrants crossing the country's border with Mexico unlawfully in September, marking the highest so far this year, according to an official

from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS).

The latest figure marked an increase from August, when Border Patrol arrested around 181,000 migrants crossing between ports of entry, reports CNN.

September's tally is the highest since December 2022, when

more than 222,000 migrants were apprehended.



'31 mn Indian users expected to upgrade to 5G phones this year'

NEW DELHI: About 31 million Indian users are expected to upgrade to 5G phones in 2023, representing a vast opportunity for further 5G adoption in the country, a new report has said.

According to Ericsson Consumer Lab Report, 5G in India has elevated overall network satisfaction by an impressive 30 percent compared to 4G.

World Bank pegs India's GDP growth at 6.3% as global headwinds emerge

NEW DELHI: The World Bank has forecast India's GDP growth for 2023-24 to be at 6.3 percent as global headwinds are emerging as a drag.

The expected moderation (from 7.2 percent in 2022-23) is mainly due to challenging external conditions and waning pentup demand," the World Bank said in its India Development Update (IDU) report released on Tuesday.

However, service sector activity is expected to remain strong with growth of 7.4 percent and investment growth is also projected to remain robust at 8.9 percent, the report adds.

India continues to show resilience against the backdrop of a challenging global environment, according to the World Bank.

The IDU, the Bank's flagship half yearly report on the Indian economy, observes that despite significant global challenges, India was one of the fastest-growing major economies in FY22/23 at 7.2 percent.

India's growth rate was the second highest among G20 countries and almost twice the average for emerging market FY23/24 compared with 13.3 percent in the first quarter of FY22/23, the report explains.

The IDU expects that global headwinds will continue to persist and intensify due to high glo-

"An adverse global environment will continue to pose challenges in the short-term,"?said Auguste Tano Kouame, the World Bank's Country Director in India.

"Tapping public spending that crowds in more private investments will create more favorable conditions for India to seize global opportunities in the future and thus achieve higher growth."

Adverse weather conditions contributed to a spike in inflation in recent months.

Headline inflation rose to 7.8 percent in July due to a surge in prices of food items like wheat and rice. Inflation is expected to decrease gradually as food prices normalize and government measures increase the supply of key commodities.

"While the spike in headline inflation may temporarily constrain consumption, we project a moderation. Overall conditions will remain conducive for private investment," said Dhruv Sharma, Senior Economist, World Bank, and lead author of the report.

"The volume of foreign direct investment is also likely to grow in India as rebalancing of the global value chain continues."

The World Bank expects fiscal consolidation to continue in FY23/24 with the central government fiscal deficit projected to continue to decline from 6.4 percent to 5.9 percent of the GDP.

Public debt is expected to stabilize at 83 percent of GDP.

On the external front, the current account deficit is expected to narrow to 1.4 percent of the GDP, and it will be adequately financed by foreign investment flows and supported by large foreign reserves. *IANS*

This resilience was underpinned by robust domestic demand, strong public infrastructure investment and a strengthening financial sector. Bank credit growth increased to 15.8 percent in the first quarter of bal interest rates, geopolitical tensions, and sluggish global demand.

As a result, global economic growth is also set to slow down over the medium term against a background of these combined factors.

India now 2nd-biggest manufacturing hub for mobile phones globally

NEW DELHI: India is now the second-biggest manufacturing hub for mobile phones due to heavy investment from original equipment manufacturers, original design manufacturers and companies dealing in components and parts, a new report shows. India is expected to export about 22 percent of its total assembled mobile phones in 2023, according to Counterpoint Research.

However, China's manufacturing and supply chain will still maintain its essential role in the longer run," said senior research analyst Ivan Lam.

In a fillip to the 'Make in India' initiative, India saw mobile phones exports worth \$5.5 bil-

lion (over Rs 45,000 crore) in the April-August period in the ongoing fiscal year (FY24), government and industry data showed recently.

As per the estimates by the Department of Commerce and the India Cellular and Electronics

Association (ICEA), the April-August period saw mobile phone exports worth \$5.5 billion, against

\$3 billion (about Rs 25,000 crore) in the same period in FY22-23.

India is set to cross Rs 1,20,000 crore in mobile phone



exports in the current fiscal year, with Apple leading the market with more than 50 percent in FY24.

Meanwhile, according to the report, smartphone shipments from original design manufacturers (ODMs) and Independent Design Houses (ODMs/IDHs) declined six percent (year-on-year) in the first half this year, according to the report.

"The YoY decline in ODM/IDH companies' H1 2023 shipments was driven by Samsung, Xiaomi and Lenovo Group's weak performance. However, Vivo, HONOR and Transsion Group's rise offset part of the decline," said senior research analyst Shenghao Bai. IANS

ChatGPT shows promise for effective psychotherapy

NEW YORK: Open AI's ChatGPT-4 can accurately generate individualised personal narratives based on stream-of-consciousness thoughts and demographic details, two studies have suggested.

Previous research has shown that personal narratives -- the stories we tell ourselves about our lives -- can play a critical role in identity and help us make sense of the past and present. It is also known that by helping people reinterpret narratives, therapists can guide patients toward healthier thoughts and behaviors

To explore, researchers from the Positive Psychology Center at the University of Pennsylvania tested the ability of ChatGPT-4 to generate individualised personal narratives.

The study findings, published in the Journal of Positive Psychology, showed that 25 of the 26 participants rated the AI-generated responses as completely or mostly accurate, 19 rated the narratives as very or somewhat surprising, and 19 indicated they learned something new about themselves.

"This is a rare moment in the history of scientific psychology: Artificial intelligence now promises much more effective psychotherapy and coaching," said Martin Seligman, Professor of Psychology, and director of the Positive Psychology Center.

For each participant, the researchers fed ChatGPT-4 recorded stream-of-consciousness thoughts, which was likened to diary entries with thoughts as simple as "I'm hungry" or "I'm tired."

In a separate study published concurrently in The Journal of Positive Psychology, the team fed five narratives rated "completely accurate" into ChatGPT-4, asked for specific interventions, and found that the chatbot generated highly plausible coaching strategies and interventions.

"Since coaching and therapy typically involve a great deal of initial time spent fleshing out such an identity, deriving this automatically from 50 thoughts represents a major savings," the researchers said. IANS

Just 50 steps climbing stairs a day can cut heart disease risk by 20%

NEW DELHI: Forget walking 10,000 or 7,000 steps a day. Taking at least 50 steps climbing stairs daily could significantly slash your risk of heart disease, according to a new study.

The study from Tulane University in Louisiana in the US, published in the journal Atherosclerosis, found that climbing more than five flights of stairs daily could reduce risk of cardiovascular disease by 20 percent.

Atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease (ASCVD) along with coronary artery disease and stroke are the leading causes of morbidity and mortality worldwide.

"Short bursts of high-intensity stair climbing are a time-efficient way to improve cardiorespiratory fitness and lipid profile, especially among those unable to achieve the current physical activity recommendations," said

Health and Tropical Medicine.
Using UK Biobank data col-



Dr Lu Qi, professor at the Tulane University's School of Public lected from 450,000 adults, the study calculated participants'

susceptibility to cardiovascular disease based on family history, established risk factors and genetic risk factors and surveyed participants about their lifestyle habits and frequency of stair climbing

It found that climbing more stairs daily especially reduced risk of cardiovascular disease in those who were less susceptible.

However, Qi said the increased risk of heart disease in more susceptible people could be "effectively offset" by daily stair climbing.

"This study provides novel evidence for the protective effects of stair climbing on the risk of ASCVD, particularly for individuals with multiple ASCVD risk factors," Qi said. *IANS*

Daylight exposure can improve blood sugar control in diabetics: Study

LONDON: Improving blood sugar control may be as easy as increasing daytime exposure to natural light, according to a new research that can help millions of people with Type 2 diabetes (T2D).

The study showed that natural daylight can boost metabolism and help treat and prevent diabetes. It can also help curb other metabolic conditions, such as obesity.

"The misalignment of our internal circadian clock with the demands of a 24/7 society is associated with an increased incidence of metabolic diseases, including type 2 diabetes," said Ivo Habets, of

Maastricht University, in the Netherlands.

"Natural daylight is the strongest zeitgeber, or environmental cue, of the circadian clock but type of light you are exposed to matters for your metabolism. If you work in an office with almost no exposure to natural light, it will have an impact on your metabo-



most people are indoors during the day and so under constant artificial lighting.

"Our research shows that the

lism and your risk or control of Type 2 diabetes, so try to get as much daylight as possible, and ideally, get outdoors when you can," Habets said.

The findings were presented at the ongoing annual meeting of the European Association for the Study of Diabetes (EASD) in Hamburg, Germany from October 2-6.

The team carried out a range of metabolic tests on 13 people with T2D when they were exposed to natural light and when they were exposed to artificial light and compared the results.

They were exposed to two lighting conditions during office hours (8am to 5pm) in a randomized crossover fashion: natural daylight from windows and artificial LED lighting. IANS

Neck lumps can be dangerous if avoided: Doctors

NEW DELHI: Ignoring neck lumps, which can be both of infectious and non-infectious origin, can prove to be dangerous, experts said, stressing the need for early di-

The lymphatic system is a network of vessels and nodes that helps fight infection and disease. Lymph nodes are small, bean-shaped lumps of tissue found throughout the body.

When the body is fighting an infection, like in the case of fever, lymph nodes can swell. However, if the lymph nodes are swollen and painless, it could also be a sign of cancer.

"If one is having a swollen lymph node which is gradually getting bigger with or without pain, fever, it mandates im-

mediate medical attention and expert advice," Neha Rastogi Panda, Senior Infectious Diseases Specialist at Fortis Memorial Research Institute, Gurgaon, told IANS.

Panda said that in Indian settings, one of most common causes of lymph node enlargement/ swelling is tuberculosis (TB). Other infections -- viral, fungal should also be sought on a case-to-case basis. Furthermore, nodes can also be a sign of an inflammatory process and also cancerous origin called lymphoma.

"There is overlap and always a dilemma owing to huge similarity between symptoms of lymphoma and infections particularly tuberculosis which leads to delay in appropriate treatment. We have seen one has been

> started on anti-tubercular therapy without diagnosis and it doesn't improve leading to further delay and complications," the doctor

"Lymphoma can be misdiagnosed as TB, so it becomes important to diagnose it correctly, the only way these two can be separated is by biopsy and

blood works," Rahul Bhargava, a lymphoma expert and Principal director of hematology and bone marrow transplant, at Fortis Memorial Research Institute, Gurugram, told IANS

Lymphoma is cancer that begins in infection-fighting cells of the immune system, called lymphocytes. These cells are in the lymph nodes. IANS

New 'inverse vax' offers hope for arthritis, Type-1 diabetes

NEW YORK: A new type of vaccine that does not shut down the immune system has shown promise in the lab to completely reverse autoimmune diseases like arthritis, multiple sclerosis, Type-1 diabetes, and Crohn's disease.

A typical vaccine teaches the human immune system to recognize a virus or bacteria as an enemy that should be attacked. Currently autoimmune diseases are generally treated with drugs that broadly shut down the immune system

The new "inverse vaccine", developed by researchers at the University of Chicago, does just the opposite: it removes the immune system's memory of one molecule.

While such immune memory erasure would be unwanted for infectious diseases, it can stop autoimmune reactions like those seen in multiple sclerosis, Type I diabetes, rheumatoid arthritis or Crohn's disease, in which the immune system attacks a person's healthy tissues.

The inverse vaccine, described in the journal Nature Biomedical Engineering, takes advantage of how the liver naturally marks molecules from broken-down cells with "do not attack" flags to prevent autoimmune reactions to cells that die by natural processes. IANS

Australia to crack down on student visa exploitation

CANBERRA: The Australian government on October 2, announced a crackdown on international student visa scams

Education Minister Jason Clare, Skills Minister Brendan O'Connor and Home Affairs Minister Clare O'Neil flagged immediate action to boost the integrity of Australia's lucrative international education industry, reports Xinhua news agency.

Following a government-commissioned rapid review into the exploitation of Australia's visa system, the government will strengthen regulations to prevent the widespread rorting of the system, they said in a recent joint statement.

"The party is over, the rorts and loopholes that have plagued this system will be shut down," O'Neil said.

Under the crackdown, private colleges will be banned from paying commissions to education agents for poaching international students from rival institutions to prevent agents from luring students away from high-quality universities to low-fee courses.

The government will also start monitoring international student attendance in a bid to stop migrants from using student visas purely for the purpose of working in Australia

According to daily newspaper the Australian Financial Review, the number of student visa holders in Australia hit an all-time high of 660,765 at the end of June, an increase of 203,000 from the start of 2023. *IANS*

RBI to maintain rates real estate sector to be disappointed

CHENNAI: Only an unforeseen and sustained increase in inflation may compel the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) to revise upwards the repo rate, said the Chief Economist at Anand Rathi Shares and Stock Brokers.

He also added that not in the near future the MPC will reduce the reporate from the current 6.5 percent. Repo rate is the rate at which the RBI lends to the commercial banks. This rate is used by the RBI as a financial instrument to control inflation.

The MPC will meet early next month

"Unless there is an unforeseen and sustained increase in inflation, it appears that the RBI has completed its monetary policy tightening for the present cycle. Nevertheless, it should be noted that the initiation of the rate reduction phase is not anticipated to occur in the near future," Sujan Hajra, Chief Economist & Executive Director at Anand Rathi, told IANS.

"Although it is improbable to occur during the present policy meeting, there is a possibility that the RBI might alter its policy stance regarding liquidity from a tightening approach to a neutral one, once retail inflation falls below 6 percent," Haira added. IANS

Teaching Asian American, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander History Act (H.R. 3434 and S. 1702) - The keynote issue, aims to promote the inclusion of AANHPI history in American education.

Korematsu-Takai Civil Liberties Protection Act of 2023 (S. 129) - A pivotal bill focused on safeguarding civil liberties within AANHPI communities.

Afghan Adjustment Act (H.R. 4627 and S. 2327) - Addressing critical issues concerning Afghan refugees.





xtreme heat and its effects on populations, particularly those who are vulnerable and poor, has been moving to the forefront in cities and counties around the United States. Heat already kills more Americans than any other weather-related incident and the climate crisis has made those events increasingly deadly. of Heat Response and Mitigation in Phoenix temperatures exceeded 110 degrees for the 12th straight day. The record for extreme heat was set in 1974 with 18 straight days of temperature above 110 degrees. Phoenix has set up 200 cooling or hydration centers, and David Hondula, the local "heat czar," recommends taking small breaks in the heat of the day.

Marta Segura, Chief Heat Officer of the City of Los Angeles said public awareness is critical to that and that's why public awareness, organizing, engagement and having conversations with people about extreme heat is an opportunity to catalyze that change and connect with climate solutions. One of the most innovative solutions discussed during the conversation was the idea of "cool pavement," or a pavement reflecting sunlight and absorbing less heat.

The experts said each city must find its own unique handcrafted solutions based on its climate, geography, and demographics. However, common themes emerged, creating a basic recipe, which can be applied to any city. Genesis and Fall of Civilization





To feel that we are something is to


from the ocean, but not for the drop in the ocean, which knows no rest.

he steady rise of India on the global platform expectantly helped by an extraordinarily successful G20 under India's Presidency, the efficacy of India's strategy of countering the mischief of Sino-Pak axis against this country and the acknowledgement worldwide of the credibility of India's policy of building a deep friendship with the US without letting this come in the way of India's strategic bonds with Russia - particularly in the backdrop of the 'war in Ukraine' - have all created a sense of desperation among those who had been building the narrative of 'authoritarianism', 'majoritarianism' and inadequate 'safety of minorities' over a long period against the government of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

It is not therefore difficult to see that anti-Modi forces and the lobbies hostile to India have stepped up their activities as the next general election is drawing close.

Meanwhile, a sudden dip in India-Canada relations following the extraordinary statement made by Prime Minister Justin Trudeau in Canadian Parliament on September 18 to the effect that there were the known 'terrorists' who were instigating violence and secessionist calls against India in the name of Khalistan, from inside Canada and who were having links with Pak ISI.

And the last is the unavoidable conclusion - to be drawn from the plea of 'freedom of speech' invoked by Trudeau to cover up for a definite failure on his part to heed the serious complaints made by India - that the Canadian Prime Minister was unabashedly indulging in 'vote bank' politics to face an impending election.

Apart from Nijjar's direct role in instigating anti-India violence, the attention of Canada was drawn also to several other separatist terror groups operating out of that country whose leaders were wanted for heinous crimes committed in India. They included World Sikh Organization (WSO), Khalistan Tiger Force (KTF), Sikhs for Justice (SFJ) and Babbar Khalsa International (BKI). IANS

Continued ethnic strife in Manipur making region vulnerable to external exploitation

illings in Manipur are continuing with the ethnic strife spreading beyond the Meitei and Kuki Zo. Three Kuki-Zo youths were shot dead on September 12, followed by a tribal police inspector on duty on September 13. On September 16, an Indian Army soldier on leave, Sertho Thangthang Kom, was abducted at gunpoint from his home in Tarung, in Imphal West district. The next day his bullet-ridden body was found, apparently the handiwork of Meitei terrorists. This was the first killing of a Kom tribal. The Kom have been living peacefully with the Nagas in Manipur.

Political skullduggery is continuing in Manipur. Myanmarbased KYKL terrorists in all probability have joined forces with their Meitei brethren in the Imphal Valley. The latter are armed with old Tatra trucks and painted them in the same color with the same insignia of the Assam Rifles.

The rise of private militia

With sightings of such vehicles in the Kakching area of Manipur, Assam Rifles has demanded swift action to avoid any adverse action. However, none of these vehicles have been seized yet although the Manipur Police and Central Armed Police Forces deployed in Manipur have access to drones. This could be by design under political directions.

With Army/Assam Rifles lookalike vehicles, terrorists may be planning to ease through the buffer zones or get close to Army/Assam Rifles posts for surprise attacks. One thing that appears certain is that Manipur is the vanguard for establishing private militia in India. The next step could

thousands of so-called looted weapons from armories, which according to ground sources were "distributed", not looted. Without the Armed Forces Special Powers Act (AFSPA), the Army/Assam Rifles are powerless in Imphal Valley, leaving the Manipur Police free to carry out ethnic cleansing of Kuk-Zo and now the Kom as well.

Terrorists in police uniform have been sneaking into the hill areas of Manipur, through buffer zones manned by the Assam Rifles, to kill Kuki-Zo tribals. Most likely these are police commandos operating directly under the state leadership. If this was not enough, the Assam Rifles have written to Manipur Police that some of the Meitei had acquired

be arming them with heavy weapons.

Over 175 persons have been killed in the violence in Manipur so far and over 50,000 displaced. The Kuki-Zo were told earlier to bury their dead "elsewhere". Now the Supreme Court has ruled that unclaimed bodies of the tribals should be disposed of if no kin come to claim them. But how can the families of the dead Kuki-Zo come to collect the bodies when the moment they step into Imphal Valley they will all be shot dead?

There have been massive protests by thousands in the Imphal Valley when the four Meitei accused responsible for parading Kuki-Zo women naked and assaulting them were re-

manded to police custody in Imphal. Fresh protests broke out with photos of the two missing Meitei students on social media after the internet ban was lifted on September 23. The photos taken on July 8, two days after the students went missing, show the de-capacitated bodies of the boy and the girl students. The internet has been banned again and all schools have been closed. The circle of violence is unlikely to end.

The China, Pakistan nexus

China has been supporting, training and arming northeast terrorists for the past several decades. In 2015, Chinese intelligence formed the United Liberation Front of Western South East Asia (UNLFW) bringing together separatist groups in India, like the United Liberation Front of Assam (ULFA), the National Socialist Council of Nagaland (NSCN) and the National Democratic Front of Boroland (NDFB). The UNLFW had claimed responsibility for the deadliest ambush in Manipur in 2015, in which 18 army soldiers were killed. The KYKL is an offshoot of the UNLFW. The ongoing political experiment of ethnic cleansing and polarization in Manipur would naturally be exploited by China.

Pakistan, a strong supporter of Sikh separatism, allowed Sikhs For Justice (SFJ) to establish an office in Karachi and aligned the SFJ with Chinese intelligence. China is now aligning Khalistanis with Kuki extremists, while Ataullah abu Ammar Junun, chief of the Arakan Rohingya Salvation Army (ARSA) in Myanmar, is a Pakistani national linked to Pakistan's ISI and the Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT).

Caste politics has never been so dominant in India,until now with Bihar government's Bihar caste-based survey 2022 report, released on 2 October 2023, which shows that extremely backward classes (EBCs) account for 36.01 percent of the 13.07 crore population of the state. OBCs and EBCs, together account for 63% of total population of Bihar. The survey report revealed that Hindus comprise 81.9986% of the population while the Muslim share is at 17.7088% in Bihar. There are about 190 castes whose population is less than even one percent.

In the past decade, the support for the BJP among OBCs has seen a sharp rise. To hold onto that is key to any hopes it may have, of coming back to power in May 2024. Already nervous about the Opposition pivoting to turning into a wide network of OBCs, that too 'non-dominant' OBCs as chief ministers and in the state leadership (Siddaramaiah, M.K. Stalin, Pinarayi Vijayan, Bhupesh Baghel and Ashok Gehlot, to name just the chief ministers), and with numbers now revealing the disparity between who has real power and who does not, keeping the 44% of the OBCs who voted for the BJP in 2019 onside could prove to be a challenge.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, in his recent statement on the caste census as a "new conspiracy" by the Congress and other members of (INDIA party), to create division and rivalry among people. PM Modi stressed that empowering the poor, regardless of their caste, is of paramount importance for the country's progress. He asserted that the first right to resources should belong to the poor, which include all castes. PM Modi's statement resonated with his track record of implementing welfare benefits for impoverished individuals of all castes, transcending traditional caste-based politics.

While suchsituations of caste-based politics were common amongst Indian politicssince decades, a landmark law banning caste-based discrimination came into effect in the US City of Seattle and earlier in California, making it the first country outside India to enforce such legislation. It will ban discrimination based on caste in places of public accommodation and several other places including hiring of jobs.

To better understand what's going on here, it's worth taking a step back to look at how caste is recognized in the modern era and why it's become a flashpoint beyond the Indian subcontinent. Caste is a hierarchical system of group stratification with roots tracing back to Vedic period in India. It initially was practiced based on person's profession but later through centuries many rulers took advantage and discriminated the lower caste population.

The British Empire took advantage of the caste system and further used the divide-and-rule policy, with their Indian subjects. As Indians agitated for freedom from the Brits in the early 20th century, a dynamic anti-casteism movement led by Dalit scholar B.R. Ambedkar ensured that India's post-independence constitution forbid caste-based discrimination while enshrining affirmative action programs for disenfranchised lower-caste Indians.

As the caste system seemed to slowly diminish, a new wave just entered the political scene with recent Bihar census. It may surely play as a spoiler for the coming election 2024.

Madhya Pradesh. Considered as the crown in the wildlife heritage of Madhya Pradesh, Bandhavgarh is known for the Royal Bengal Tigers, cheetals, leopard, gaur, sambhar, and many more faunal species.

Bandhavgarh National Park is nestled in the Vindhya mountain range of Central India full of hills and ravines. Though, very small in comparison to Kanha or other parks of Madhya Pradesh, it hosts almost the same number of tigers or any other wildlife animal. Apart from tigers and leopards, Bandhavgarh is also extremely productive for medium-sized bison herds.

Bandhavgarh came into existence as a national park in 1968 with a core area of 105 sq. km, which was later extended to include two adjoining Sal forests in 1986. Before becoming a national park, it was the game reserve of the Maharajas of Rewa. But due to loss of royal patronage, it remained neglected for a long time until the government declared it a national park to control rampant poaching in the area.

TOURIST ATTRACTIONS

At Bandhavgarh you can find moist deciduous forest, as at Kanha National Park. At higher altitudes, the flora tends to move towards mixed forests. With the highest density of tigers, Bandhavgarh is one of the most important wildlife sanctuaries in India for the wildlife preservers and enthusiasts.

There are more than 22 species of mammals and 250 species of birds. Common Langurs and Rhesus Macaque represent the primate group. Carnivores in-

clude the Asiatic Jackal, Bengal Fox, Sloth Bear, Ratel, Gray Mongoose, Striped Hyena, Jungle Cat, Leopard and Tiger. The artiodactyls frequently sighted are Wild Pigs, Spotted Deer, Sambar, Chausingha, Nilgai, Chinkara and Gaur. Mammals such as Dhole, the small Indian Civet, Palm Squirrel and Lesser Bandicoot Rat are seen occasionally. Among the herbivores, Gaur is the only coarse feeder.

There are two main ways of getting about in the park in a motor vehicle or on elephant back. Many of the animals are now accustomed to both; even so, it is best to talk quietly and not make rapid movements. Jeep safaris are best undertaken from dawn until about 10am and from about 4pm until dusk, as the animals are most active during these periods.

A Forest Department guide must always accompany you. This guide will be able to direct you and point out wildlife. Elephants are used every morning by the Forest Department for tiger-tracking. If a tiger is found, then the

park is also home of the white (albino) tiger.

There are interesting cave shrines scattered around the park, with Brahmi inscriptions dating from the first century B.C.

Bandhavgarh Fort: Built by the Maharajas of Rewa, Bandhavgarh Fort is located well within the Bandhavgarh National Park. It is believed to be 2,000 years old. The fort is situated at an altitude of 800 m and gives a panoramic view of the wildlife preserve as well as surrounding countryside. There is a small stream call Charganga that flows besides the fort. In the way to the fort you can also see a number of statues and temples, the most famous of all is a rock-cut statue of Lord Vishnu.

Places around: There are very few places around Bandhavgarh that offer much in the way of excursion. Katni and Umaria are two important urban habitations around Bandhavgarh National Park. Major tourist attractions in the region include world-famous temples of Khajuraho, Jabalpur - a major business center of Madhya Pradesh and Bheraghat on the river Narmada.

Best time to visit Bandhavgarh National Park

The park opens its gate for the visitors from Octobermid to June end and the best time to visit Bandhavgarh National Park is from November to February. The peak season also lasts from November to February as the climatic conditions are excellent.


