

The celebrations coincided with the ongoing Hindu Heritage Month in Canada, which is held annually in November to acknowledge the significant contributions made by the community.

"I was pleased to host Diwali on parliament hill. We also used this opportunity to raise the flag of Hindu sacred symbol Aum on parliament hill. My sincere thanks to all those who attended, volunteers and artists of excellent cultural performances at the event," Arya wrote in a message posted on X.

The event was supported by 67 Hindu and Indo-Canadian organizations and saw participants from across the country, including Ottawa, Greater Toronto Area and Montreal. Arya, a ruling Liberal Party MP, also hosted Himachal Pradesh's famed Kullu Dussehra for the first time in the country's Parliament Hill last month.

The celebrations come in spite of the tense diplomatic standoff between India and Canada in the wake of



Khalistan leader Hardeep Singh Nijjar's killing this year in British Columbia province.

Arya has been a vocal critic of hate crime incidents targeting Hindus, and has strongly criticized and demanded action against the recent attacks on temples and Indian installations by Khalistan supporters.

Hinduism is the third-largest religion in Canada, which is followed by approximately 2.3 per cent of the nation's total population.

As of 2021, there are over 830,000 Canadians of the Hindu faith.

"Hindu Canadians are the most peaceful, highly educated and hardworking community and hence a successful community. We have significantly contributed and continue to do so for the socio-economic development of Canada. We have immensely enriched Canada's multicultural fabric," Arya said, marking the second Hindu Heritage month in the country this year.

The Karnataka-born MP had initiated a private members motion in May last year to mark November as the Hindu Heritage Month, which was later unanimously passed in the House of Commons on September 29, 2002. IANS

# No ceasefire till hostages are freed: Netanyahu

JERUSALEM: Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Tuesday (7 Nov.) reaffirmed his commitment not to yield to global pressures for a ceasefire, including from its trusted ally US, as the IDF is nearing its goal shortly of capturing Gaza and assuming responsibility for its administration.

The IDF encircled Gaza and split the territory into two, cutting off the north from the south in a strategic military maneuver.

Netanyahu said that Israel will have to oversee "security responsibility" in Gaza "for an indefinite period" to make sure Hamas cannot carry out large-scale terrorism acts again.

"There would be no ceasefire in Gaza without the release of our hostages," he told ABC News' 'World

On a humanitarian pause if hostages are released, Netanyahu said, "There'll be a ceasefire for that purpose. We're waiting for that to happen. It hasn't happened so far."

On future governance of Gaza if and when the war is over, Netanyahu said, "Those who don't want to continue the way of Hamas?"

Hamas militants currently hold about 240 hostages after their attack on October 7.

The Israel Defense Forces (IDF) took control of a Hamas military stronghold in the northern Gaza Strip, the military said in a daily Telegram update covering the events of the previous day.

Anti-tank missiles and launchers, weapons and intelligence materials were located on the site of the compound, the IDF said.

Meanwhile, more than 100 foreign nationals left Gaza and entered Egypt via the Rafah border crossing on 7th November, according to an Egyptian border official cited by CNN.



The total number of foreign passport holders who have left war-torn Gaza so far is 114, the official said, with an additional four wounded Palestinians allowed into Egypt for medical treatment. At least 30 more injured Palestinians are set to enter the country soon, the official added.

Meanwhile, the United Arab Emirates has said that it will set up a field hospital with a 150-bed capacity in the Gaza Strip to deliver essential medical treatment to Palestinian people, the country's state-run news agency said.

Five aircraft carrying supplies and equipment for the medical facility have departed from Abu Dhabi and will unload their cargo at the al-Arish airport in Egypt, for where it will be transported to the Gaza Strip -- likely by truck, through the Rafah

# Harris outperforms Biden in 3 swing states ahead of 2024 presidential race

NEW YORK: US Vice President Kamala Harris has fared better than her boss, President Joe Biden, in three key swing states when pitched against former president Donald Trump, the GOP's front-runner, ahead of the 2024 presidential election, according to various polls.

It is a tight race between Trump and Biden but most voters feel Biden (81) and Trump (77) are too old to run for presidency.

Biden will likely become the Democratic nominee as the incumbent, he is currently up against Marianne Williamson, best known for her work as a spiritual leader of the Church of Today, host of The Young Turks Cenk Uygur, and Representative Dean Phillips of Minnesota, media reports said.

### 'She deserves to be hanged': Son of British Sikh woman who murdered husband

LONDON: The son of a 38-year-old British Sikh woman, sentenced to death in India for poisoning and slitting her husband's throat in 2016, has said that his mother "deserves to be hanged" for doing an "evil thing".

Ramandeep Kaur Mann from Derby was found guilty of murdering her husband Sukhjit Singh, 34, by a court in Uttar Pradesh last month after their teenage son Arjun who witnessed the murder when he was nine - testified against his mother.

Kaur reportedly connived with her lover Gurpreet Singh to kill Sukhjit for his 2 million pound life insurance and property in the UK and India.

Arjun Singh, 17, told the Daily Mail that Ramandeep stopped being a mother to him and his younger brother the moment she murdered their father.

"There are not many children who watch their mother kill their father and then give evidence about it. How do you try and get on with your life after something like this? I've had to be very brave and I'm proud of what I've done because I've got justice for my father," Arjun told the British daily. IANS

Although Harris had made it clear that she is only up for a 2nd term as Biden's running mate in 2024, she was included hypothetically for president as some Democrats say they do not want Biden to run for a second term. According to a CNN poll conducted from August 25 to August 31, two-thirds of Democrat-leaning voters said the party should not nominate Biden in 2024.

In a New York Times/Siena College poll that was conducted from October 22 to November 3, voters were asked to choose for president between Harris and Trump, 47 percent in Michigan said Trump and 45 percent said Harris. Meanwhile, in a matchup between Biden and Trump, 48 percent of voters in Michigan chose the former president and 43 percent chose Biden.

In Georgia, Trump received 45 percent of the vote while the vice president nabbed 44 percent.

However, when Trump is up against Biden, he received 49 percent of the vote compared to Biden's 43

Harris secured more support in Nevada than Biden when either of them were pitched against

Approximately 48 percent of voters in Nevada picked Trump over Harris, while Harris received 42 percent of voter support. However, when Biden is on the

ballot with Trump, the former president has an 11-point lead, 52 to 41 percent.

Biden is better than Harris on the ballot with Trump in Wisconsin and Arizona. In Wisconsin, the former president grabbed 47 percent of the vote while Harris received 46 percent.

Biden had the lead over Trump in Wisconsin, 47 to 45

In Arizona, the former president beats Harris, 48 to 43 percent. And while Trump still wins over Biden in Arizona, 49 to 44 percent, the President still fared better than Harris in the state.

Biden and Harris got the same verdict in Pennsylvania. Trump received 47 percent of the vote when up against the vice president who received 44 percent. Biden also nabbed 44 percent against Trump, who received 48 percent.

Donald Trump gets great news in 5 key swing states -- the poll's sample size was 3,662 registered voters and the margin of error for all swing states combined was plus or minus 1.8 percentage points for all registered voters and plus or minus 2 percentage points for the likely electorate.

Kevin Wagner, a pollster and professor at Florida Atlantic University, previously told Newsweek via email that "it is important to remember that this is one poll, and it is over a year before the general election". IANS

### **CEO of Chinese** live-streaming service DouYu goes missing

BEIJING: The CEO of a Chinese live-streaming service backed by Tencent has become the latest executive to go missing in the country, CNN re-

Tencent Holdings Ltd. is a Chinese multinational technology and entertainment conglomerate.

As per a report from Cover News, a state-owned media outlet, DouYu (DOYU) CEO Chen Shaojie has been unreachable in recent days. It also cited unconfirmed reports that Chen was being investigated and had been missing for nearly three weeks.

It was not reported which authorities were behind the investigation and DouYu did not respond to CNN's request for comment.

The 39-year-old CEO made his last public appearance in August when he spoke on the company's quarterly earnings conference call with financial analysts, the report said.

The Chinese live streaming service listed on the Nasdaq in 2019, where it raised about USD 775 million in one of the largest share offerings by a Chinese company on Wall Street that year.

DouYu, which translates "fighting fish" in Chinese, is often compared

Amazon's Twitch service. It hosts interactive live streams of video games on its desktop and mobile apps while letting users chat in real time and inviting them to watch other content created for its platform, as per CNN.

The CEO's unexplained absence comes as China continues an anti-corruption crackdown that has trapped top executives, particularly in the finance and tech sectors.

China's top anti-corruption watchdog, in a brief statement, said it was investigating Zhang Hongli, a former senior executive at the Industrial and Commercial Bank of China (ICBC), one of China's "Big

Zhang was "suspected of seriously violating rules and laws," a phrase that is commonly used to refer to corruption, the Central Commission for Discipline Inspection said, without giving any further details.

Bao Fan, a star investment banker and tech dealmaker, was also caught up in the sweep. In May, Chinese state media reported that Bao had been in the custody of the anti-graft agency since his disappearance in February, as per CNN. ANI

# Taliban accuses Pakistan of humiliating Kabul through expulsion of immigrants

KABUL: Afghanistan's Taliban-appointed Acting Minister of Foreign Affairs Amir Khan Muttagi has accused Pakistan of humiliating Kabul through the expulsion of immigrants, Khaama Press reported.

The Khaama Press is an online news service for Afghanistan.

Muttaqi said that despite their concerns being communicated to Pakistani military and foreign affairs officials, no action has been taken to halt the deportation.

He asserted that Pakistan's deportation of immigrants is an attempt to exert pressure on Kabul but emphasized that Afghanistan will not

yield to such pressure.

Muttaqi expressed his concern about Pakistan's unilateral decision to deport Afghan refugees and migrants. He said the despite sharing their concerns with both civilian and military authorities in Pakistan, the decision to expel these vulnerable populations remains in effect, further straining the already complex relationship between the two neighboring countries, as per Khaama Press.

eign Affairs Minister of Afghanistan, Sher Mohammad Abbas Stanikzai warned Islamabad to treat Afghan immigrants appropriately, TOLO News reported.

Stanikzai said this during the meeting on the "Future Economic Development of Afghanistan", adding that the reaction of Afghans has been recorded in history and now Afghanistan has a strong defense force and plenty of weapons.

He further criticized Pakistan's move to deport Afghan immigrants and considered it a unilateral decision by the Pakistan interim government, TOLO News reported.



Meanwhile, the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR) has raised alarms about the severe problems and dangers faced by a significant number of Afghans forced to leave Pakistan.

Recent statistics indicate a significant flow of people returning to Afghanistan. Approximately 174,000 people have returned through the Torkham, Gholam Khan, and Angoor Ada crossings, while another 45,000 have returned via the Chaman-Spinboldak crossings.

As per Khaama Press, the ongoing deportation issue underscores the complex relationship between Afghanistan and Pakistan and the challenges faced by Afghan migrants. It also sheds light on the efforts of international organizations like UNHCR to address the humanitarian concerns arising from these migrations.

Recently, the Taliban-appointed acting Deputy For-

According to the information of the Refugees and Repatriation Department of Kandahar province, 4,533 families, which reached 31,547 people, have returned from Pakistan in the last five days.

Pakistan's caretaker government announced October 31 as the deadline for Afghan refugees to leave the country. Nearly 2 million Afghan refugees have to leave Pakistan or face forced deportation.

Pakistan, although it stressed that its decision was only targeted at sending back those without legal documents, continues to accuse Islamabad of harassing the refugees, according to The Express Tribune.

More than 6,500 Afghanistan nationals left Pakistan through the Torkham border on 5th November, taking the number of repatriated Afghans to more than 174,350, Pakistan-based Dawn reported. ANI

# SFJ declares US phase of Khalistan referendum beginning Jan 28

NEW DELHI: After Canada banned terrorist group Sikhs for Justice (SFJ) announced the American phase of Khalistan referendum, beginning January 28, 2024.

The SFJ made the announcement on Sunday at the 44th annual Sikh parade in California's Yuba City.

It made the "America Votes" declaration with a float celebrating former Indian Army Chief General A.S. Vaidya's killing by Sikh separatists Sukhdeo Singh and Harjinder Singh in 1986.

"The ongoing global Khalistan referendum is a remarkable journey of Sikh sovereignists from avenging operation Blue Star by killing of Indira Gandhi and General Vaidya to liberation of Punjab from Indian occupation through ballots," SFJ's legal counsel, Gurpatwant Singh Pannun, said in a statement shared with IANS.

The announcement comes just a day after Pannun, a designated-terrorist in India, gave a call to the global Sikh community to "stop flying Air India" from November

"We are asking the Sikh people not to fly via Air India on November 19. There will be a global blockade. On November 19, don't travel by Air India or your life will be in danger," Pannun said in the video that went viral on social media.

He further called on the Sikh community to "shutdown" the Indira Gandhi International Airport in the national capital on November 19.

"While Khalistan Referendum is to challenge India's claim to territorial integrity, the call for Boycott Air India is to break India's economic hegemony," Pannun said in his statement.

SFJ's second phase of Khalistan referendum concluded on October 29 in Surrey city of Canada with the group announcing a \$100,000 reward for High Commissioner Sanjay Kumar Verma's arrest and release of a new map with Delhi as part of Khalistan.

An estimated 300,000 people came to celebrate the Sikh Nagar Kirtan at Yuba City, according to KCRA News, where the SFJ announcement was made.

The annual Sikh Parade festival was introduced in Yuba City in the 1980s by well-known Punjabi-American peach farmer Didar Singh Bains, also known as "Peach

The event is held on the first Sunday of November and attracts nearly 100,000 South Asians each year from across the US, Canada, England, and India. IANS

LONDON: Stating that Sikhs' rights and religious freedoms need to be respected, British Sikh MP Preet Kaur Gill wrote to the UK Justice Secretary after a man from the community was barred from taking part in jury service for carrying a kirpan (religious dagger).

In a letter addressed to Alex Chalk, Gill said Jatinder Singh was made to "feel like a criminal" after he was prevented from taking part in jury service at the Birmingham Crown Court last month.

"I believe this incident highlights a pressing issue that requires attention to ensure that individuals, regardless of their religious background, can engage in civic duties without facing discrimination," Gill said in her letter published in BirminghamLive.

Baptized Sikhs are required to carry the five Ks with them at all times, as a symbol of their faith, which include Kesh (uncut hair), Kara (bangle), Kanga (comb); Kaccha (undercloth) and Kirpan (dagger).

"Mr Singh, who possesses a Kirpan as permitted

by the Criminal Justice Act 1988, found himself being refused entry to the court during his jury service. This incident is deeply concerning, as it not only raises issues of religious freedom but also affects the credibility and inclusivity of our legal system," the MP from Edgbaston stated in the letter last week.

"It is vital that we ensure that individuals like Mr Singh, who are summoned to perform their civic duties, are able to do so without any compromise to their religious beliefs," she added. IANS

# India most targeted country with 13.7% cyberattacks: Report

NEW DELHI: India is the most targeted country, with 13.7 percent of all cyberattacks, followed by the US with 9.6 percent, Indonesia and China with 9.3 percent and 4.5 percent, respectively, a new report revealed.

According to the cybersecurity firm Cyfirma, India was the most targeted country in 2022, as attacks on government agencies more than doubled.

In the second half of 2022, there were 95 percent more cyberattacks on government agencies than in the same period in 2021.

The number of state-sponsored cyber attacks in India increased by more than 100 percent in 2022 compared to 2021.

Healthcare is the most targeted sector by hackers, followed by education, research, government and military sectors, according to the report.

"India's growing prominence at the world stage and push from Western economies to favor India over other large countries, a young and tech-savvy population with low cybersec maturity has played a key role in hackers. *IANS*

# Fitch raises India's GDP growth forecast, cuts China's

NEW DELHI: Global credit rating agency Fitch on 6 November raised its forecast for India's gross domestic product (GDP) mid-term growth by 0.7 percent to 6.2 percent from 5.5 percent earlier, while cutting its estimate for China's growth by 0.7 percent.

The rating agency reduced its estimate for 10 emerging economies to 4 percent from 4.3 percent earlier.

"The reduction is mainly due to a large reduction of 0.7 percentage points to the estimate of China's supply-side growth potential," Fitch said in its report "Emerging-Market Potential Growth Weakens as China Slows". China's mid-term growth forecast has been cut to 4.6 per-



cent from 5.3 percent earlier.

"However, we have made large upgrades to India and Mexico, with the latter benefiting from a much better outlook for the capital-to-labor ratio. India's estimate is higher at 6.2 percent from

5.5 percent and Mexico's at 2 percent from 1.4 percent," it added.

The forecast for Russia has been cut to 0.8 percent from 1.6 percent, for Korea to 2.1 percent from 2.3 percent, and for South Africa to 1 percent from 1.2 percent.

The agency also said the latest estimates remain below its pre-pandemic potential growth projections for all the top 10 emerging markets (EM10), except Brazil and Poland.

"This reflects deteriorating demographic trends and the legacy of disruptions from the pandemic. The latter is partly reflected through revisions to projections for capital stock and productivity growth," it said.

"But some 'scarring' effects are hard to capture and we have now made additional downward 'level shock' adjustments to historical estimates of potential GDP in 2020 and 2021 for Mexico, Indonesia, India, and South Africa," the report added. *IANS* 

# China's uncomfortable role as the world's largest official debt collector SANJEEV SHARMA

NEW DELHI: China is navigating an unfamiliar and uncomfortable role -- as the world's largest official debt collector, AidData said in a report.

Fifty-five percent of its loans to low- and middle-income countries have already entered their principal repayment periods and this figure will increase to 75 percent by 2030.

Total outstanding debt -- including principal but excluding interest -- from borrowers in the developing world to China is at least \$1.1 trillion and potentially even as high as \$1.5 trillion (in nominal USD).


China is finding its footing as an international debt collector at a time when many of its biggest borrowers are illiquid or insolvent.

AidData estimates that 80

percent of China's overseas lending portfolio in the developing world is currently supporting countries in financial distress.

Overdue repayments to China are also soaring -- in ab-

Beijing's public approval rating in the developing world plunged from 56 percent in 2019 to 40 percent in 2021.

Washington, on the other hand, has seen its public approval-rating rise and opened up a 14-percentage point advantage over Beijing.

Across the developing world, China has also struggled to maintain a razorthin lead over the US in media coverage favorability. Yet it has proven very capable of winning and retaining the foreign policy support of governing elites

. Across all UN General Assembly votes cast between 2000 and 2021, the governments of low- and middle-income countries aligned their foreign policy positions with China 75 percent of the time, as compared to 23 percent with the US. *IANS*

# TikTok to shut down \$1 bn creator fund from Dec 16

SAN FRANCISCO: Chinese short-video making app TikTok has shut down its \$1 billion creator fund from December 16.

Creators in the US, UK, Germany and France will no longer be able to monetize their work through the original fund, a TikTok spokesperson told The Verge.

The TikTok creators' communities in Italy and Spain aren't affected by the development.

The TikTok's original fund was launched in 2023 with a three-year commitment. Creators who are part of the fund will be able to roll over to the Creativity Program, the report mentioned.

However, influencers and other content creators cribbed about low payouts, "making it impossible to earn a living through the creator fund alone".

In May, the Chinese short-form video platform opened its revamped creator fund, called the "Cre-

ativity Program Beta", to all eligible creators in the US.

Creators required at least 10,000 followers and 1,00,000 views in the last 30 days to join the program.

The company initially began testing the new program


with select creators in February.

According to the company, the new program was designed to generate higher revenue and unlock more real-world opportunities for creators.

### Scientists discover new antibody to combat breast cancer

NEW YORK: Professor Nicholas Tonks' laboratory identified an antibody that can suppress an enzyme that may aid in the spread of some breast tumors. With more research, the antibody may be able to provide a feasible therapeutic treatment for the same breast cancers.

The novel antibody targets PTPRD, an enzyme that is overexpressed in some breast tumors. PTPRD is a member of the protein tyrosine phosphatase (PTP) family of molecules, which aid in the regulation of numerous cellular functions.

They accomplish this by collaborating with enzymes known as kinases to regulate the behavior of other proteins within cells. Kinases are enzymes that add tiny chemical regulators known as phosphates to proteins. PTPs remove them.

Disruptions in the addition or removal of phosphates can contribute to inflammation, diabetes, and cancer. Some disruptions can be corrected with kinase-blocking drugs.

"People have targeted kinases for 25, 30 years," Tonks explains. "It's a multibillion-dollar industry. But many challenges remain. In cancer, patients will respond to these sorts of kinase inhibitors and then, after a period of time, resistance develops." *ANI*

# Al to bring high-quality and affordable healthcare to people: Google

NEW DELHI: The next generation of AI and large language models (LLMs) represents a dramatic shift in capability and promises to bring high-quality, affordable care and health to people around the world, with equity and inclusion, Google has stressed.

Dr Karen DeSalvo, Chief Health Officer at Google, said that AI has the potential to transform the health of people on a planetary scale akin to the discovery of penicillin.

All while partnering with the health ecosystem and the people it is serving," said the Google executive. IANS

# Delhi air pollution ups 'risk of death due to heart attacks': Bengaluru cardiologist

NEW DELHI: Dr Deepak Krishnamurthy, a senior interventional cardiologist at Sakra World Hospital in Bengaluru, has warned that exposure to highly polluted air increases the risk of death due to heart attacks.

In a post on X, the cardiologist wrote that air pollution is an important and under-recognized risk factor for cardiovascular events (heart attacks).

"Higher levels of fine particulate matter (PM2.5) lead to endothelial dysfunction and

slow flow in coronaries and systemic inflammation, leading to accelerated atherosclerosis and thrombus (clot formation)," he posted.

What is important to note is that even "acute exposure to increased PM2.5 levels like we are seeing with #Delhi AirPollution increases risk of death due to heart attacks".


The cardiologist said that it is high time the government takes concrete measures to curb this menace.

The doctor shared

infographics, highlighting that 25 percent of deaths caused by heart diseases were a result of exposure to deadly air pollution.

# Do you know improving deep sleep can prevent dementia? Study finds

WASHINGTON DC: According to one study, 1 percent reduction in deep sleep per year for people over the age of 60 results in a 27 percent increased risk of dementia. The study also implies that improving or sustaining deep sleep, commonly known as slow-wave sleep, in later life may aid in the prevention of dementia.

Associate Professor Matthew Pase of the Monash School of Psychological Sciences and the Turner Institute for Brain and Mental Health in Melbourne, Australia, conducted the study, which was published in JAMA Neurology.

"Slow-wave sleep, or deep sleep, supports the ageing brain in many ways, and we know that sleep augments the clearance of metabolic waste from the brain"

The study looked at 346 participants, over 60 years of age, enrolled in the Framingham Heart Study who completed two overnight sleep studies in the time periods 1995 to 1998 and 2001 to 2003, with an average of five years between the two studies.

These participants were then carefully followed for dementia from the time of the second sleep study through

to 2018. The researchers found, on average, that the amount of deep sleep declined between the two studies, indicating slow wave sleep loss with ageing. Over the next 17 years of follow-up, there were 52 cases of dementia. Even adjusting for age, sex, cohort, genetic factors, smoking status, sleeping medication use, antidepressant use, and anxiolytic use, each percentage decrease in deep sleep each year was associated with a 27 percent increase in the risk of dementia.

"Slow-wave sleep, or deep sleep, supports the ageing brain in many ways, and we know that sleep augments the clearance of metabolic waste from the brain, including facilitating the clearance of proteins that aggregate in Alzheimer's disease," Associate Professor Pase said.

"However, to date we have been unsure of the role of slow-wave sleep in the development of dementia. Our findings suggest that slow wave sleep loss may be a modifiable dementia risk factor."

Associate Professor Pase said that the Framingham Heart Study is a unique community-based cohort with repeated overnight polysomnographic (PSG) sleep studies and uninterrupted surveillance for incident dementia.

"We used these to examine how slow-wave sleep changed with ageing and whether changes in slow-wave sleep percentage were associated with the risk of later-life dementia up to 17 years later," he said. *ANI* 

### Herbal formulations can help control blood sugar levels: Study

NEW DELHI: With the surge in diabetes cases, a study has suggested a healthy lifestyle and diet coupled with anti-diabetic properties of herbal formulations can help control blood sugar levels.

The study, conducted by researchers from Patnabased Government Ayurvedic College and Hospital on a patient suffering from high levels of blood sugar, has been published in the International Ayurvedic Medical Journal (IAMJ).

As per the study, the team, led by Assistant Professor Prabhas Chandra Pathak, prescribed the patient a combination of research-based traditional medicines, including herbal formulation like BGR-34, Arogyavardhani Vati, Chandraprabhavati, cholesterol reducing drugs, lifestyle adjustments and a specific diet for two weeks.

After 14 days, the treatment was slightly altered. The patient showed significant improvement, for instance, the sugar level that was 254 mg/dl at the time of admission, came down to 124 mg/dl.

The study says it was found that Daruharidra, Giloe, Vijaysar, Gudmar, Methi and Majishtha in the BGR-34 showed anti-diabetic properties, which helped cut down the sugar level in the blood. This medicine is prepared by the country's research institute, CSIR, after research. *IANS*

### Biden fast losing support of Michigan Muslim voters over Israel stand

WASHINGTON: US President Joe Biden is fast losing the support of Michigan Muslim voters over his stand on Israel-Hamas conflict.

Thousands of American Muslims have voted for Biden to beat Trump during 2020 in Michigan.

A Palestinian American immigration lawyer, Hammoud, said that she is unclear whether to vote for Biden again in 2024 or not due to his stand on the Palestinian issue. She's watched the Biden administration offer unwavering support to Israel with no red lines for the Jewish country and no calls for a ceasefire, even as thousands of civilians in Gaza have been killed.

"He's (Biden) has put us in a very difficult situation," Hammoud told CNN. "It has become almost impossible for me, morally, to vote for someone that's taken the stances that he's taken in the past few weeks."

Arab and Muslim Americans may constitute a small percentage of the voters but they have outsize influence in battleground states like Michigan where the Muslims rejection of Biden can cost him reelection as they feel hurt and betrayed by his administration.

Michigan has more than 200,000 Muslim American voters -- 146,000 of whom turned out to vote in 2020 -- according to an analysis by Emgage Action, an organization that seeks to up the Muslim political power. Biden won Michigan -- a state that narrowly went to Donald Trump in 2016 -- by 155,000 votes. IANS

# Immigration agent denies issuing fake admission letters to Indian students in Canada

TORONTO: An immigration agent, accused of cheating several Indian students of tens of thousands of dollars by issuing fake college admission letters to procure study permits to Canada, has denied charges against him.

Brijesh Mishra, who has been under arrest in a British Columbia jail since June, said he has been scapegoated by dozens of international students from India, the Toronto Star reported.

"They are blaming me to cover their mistakes," Mishra said, making his first public appearance before an immigration tribunal in Toronto via video link last week.

The Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) has charged Mishra with offering immigration advice without a license, and with counseling a person to directly or indirectly misrepresent or withhold information from authorities

In March this year, CBSA issued deportation notices to hundreds of Indian students, mostly from Punjab, whose admission offer letters to educational institutions were found to be fake.

A majority of these students

facing deportation had filed visa applications from 2018 onwards till 2022 through Jalandhar-based Education Migration Services, which was headed by Mishra.

In June, following investigations into fraudulent admissions letters, an IRCC (Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship of Canada) taskforce was formed to work with the CBSA to review the cases of affected students and graduates.

# Google ends \$15 bn deal with lead developer for US campuses projects

SAN FRANCISCO: Google has ended its \$15 billion deal agreement with Lendlease, the developer the company had been working with on major campus projects in the Silicon Valley.

Lendlease said in a statement that both companies agreed to end the deal after determining that "the existing agreements are no longer mutually beneficial given current market conditions."

The four master-planned districts are in San Jose (Downtown West), Sunnyvale (Moffett Park), and Mountain View (Middlefield Park and North Bayshore) in the San Francisco Bay area in California, collectively referred to as the San Francisco Bay

Project.

The development could have totaled over 15 million square feet of "office, residential, retail and other space."

However, the pandemic significantly changed business real estate needs after coming at "a variety of options" to meet its housing commitment.

# Fall in net financial savings of Indian households could be due to higher inflation

NEW DELHI: The net financial savings of Indian households have fallen to a multi-decade low of just 5.1%, while their net financial liabilities have risen to 5.8% of GDP in FY 2023, up from 3.8% in FY 2022, Kotak Alternate Asset Managers said in a research report.

"This could be attributed to higher inflation eroding savings, as well as the financially weaker section of society borrowing more to make ends meet, in our view," the report said.

This could lead to sluggish overall consumption demand in the medium term unless the government steps up spending to revive consumption before the elections.

"On the other hand, a surge in government spending ahead of

# Gains in movement to end most pervasive violence in the world - domestic violence

ccording to statistics, one in three women is a victim of domestic violence; one in six men is a victim. "Domestic violence is the oldest and most pervasive form of violence in the world," says author, essayist and feminist Angela Davis. It's long been accepted as an inevitable part of the complex fabric of family relationships across all cultures, including mainstream American culture. Today a growing movement to break that mindset is emerging even as data reveals that one out of three women and one in six men in the U.S. have experienced it at some point in their lifetimes. Speakers at the EMS briefing on November 3rd discussed three recent efforts to find solutions through legislation, through reforms in the courts and through grassroots mobilization by survivors of abuse using social media.

Senator Susan Rubio pointed out that she had been a victim of domestic violence, so when she joined the California Senate in 2018, she set a goal to promote legislation for victims of domestic violence. However, the legislative process is slow and takes time. Thanks to her efforts, SB914 was passed. This bill helps victims of domestic violence who become homeless by providing them with social resources. Relevant statistics show that 57% of female homeless people said that domestic violence was the di-

### MAHA receives Grant Award to Implement "Bridge" Program

CHICAGO:MAHA announced the award of 1.5 million funding support for 3 years from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to implement the "bridge" project.

The project is designed to close the gap in insurance coverage among Asian and Latino children, parents, and pregnant individuals. Through this project, MAHA will collaborate with local schools, day care centers, community-based organizations, and health providers to enroll limited English-speaking Asian and Latino immigrant children and families to health insurance and improve their access to healthcare.

"We are so excited about this award from the federal government. This grant will enhance our capacity to better serve the needs of the low-income immigrant families in our communities and to improve their access to health care", said Dr. Hong Liu, Executive Director of MAHA. All children in Illinois, age 0-19, are covered by the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), and FamilyCare covers qualifying parents based on their household size and income. Pregnant women are also encouraged to sign up for perinatal care through the Moms and Babies Program. Additionally, MAHA is currently hiring a project coordinator experienced in community outreach, serving children and families, and is fluent in English and Mandarin/Cantonese. rect cause of their homelessness. Rubio said that before the law, victims of domestic violence did not receive special care after becoming homeless. The law ensures that local governments receive dedicated funding to help people who have become homeless as a result of domestic violence. In addition, the SB273 bill (also known as the Phoenix Bill) drafted by Rubio in 2019 extended the statute of limitations for domestic violence victims to prove their perpetrators from the previous three years to five years.

Tina Swithin, Founder of One Mom's Battle described how she divorced her violent husband and how she protected her two children during the separation.

She founded "One Mom's Battle" to provide support

to mothers who are victims of domestic violence.

Viji Sundaram, Reporter for the San Francisco Public Press and Co-Founder of Narika, a nonprofit advocacy group working with South Asian American women, told the story of a woman in the Bay Area who suffered domestic violence. Narika was founded in 1992, by immigrant women who identified the need for culturally responsive and linguistically diverse domestic violence services in the Bay Area. Narika's confidential, toll-free Helpline 1-800-215-7308 enables any individual who has been a victim of domestic violence to call in and speak to any one of our sensitive and knowledgeable advocates.

# New threats to home ownership target communities of color

he California Mortgage Relief program, launched Dec. 2021 and expanded in early 2023, has pro vided millions of dollars in aid to thousands of financially struggling homeowners, many of who are of color. When the funds run out, however, more homeowners will be at risk of foreclosure than ever as they struggle with keeping the family home after a parent or grandparent passes away, zombie mortgage, and predatory clean energy PACE financing. In the EMS Briefing on November 2nd, housing rights attorneys and mortgage experts explained these threats and what homeowners can do to hang on, while homeowners facing these threats shared their stories of how they're struggling to keep their family homes.

Joe Jaramillo, Senior Attorney, Housing & Economic Rights Advocates

(HERA) said that as the epidemic ends, many families in California are indeed facing the dilemma of hav-

ing their homes repossessed due to loan repayments. He said the main threats facing vulnerable homeowners are "keeping the family home when a parent or grand-parent passes away; financing Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) programs which risk the borrower's home if unpaid; and "zombie" second mortgages "that haunt borrowers with unexpected bills and threats of fore-closure." "It sounds good in theory," said Jaramillo, "but many salespeople and contractors target low-income households and misrepresent costs or install non-functioning improvements like solar panels."

Rebecca Franklin, President, California Housing Finance Agency (CalHFA) said that the California mortgage relief program, funded by the federal government, was launched in March 2021 and expanded in early 2023. This reduction and exemption plan is tailor-made for those who have difficulty repaying their housing. It provides each household with a maximum of \$80,000 in mortgage relief. Over the past two years, it has spent \$650 million to provide mortgage relief for more than

20,000 households with difficulty in repaying their loans, or allowing them to keep up with their mortgage payments. Franklin said that communities of color have been particularly hard hit during the epidemic, so the government has adopted various methods to help. People in need can contact the California Housing Finance Agency.

Franklin said that applications for the California Mortgage Relief Program have certain review thresholds. The applied house must be the home where the borrower mainly lives, and the borrower's family must be low-to-moderate-income. She said even if you don't meet the requirements, they will refer you to housing legal assistance and support, which is currently available in six languages and is free of charge.

t's a simple dessert made with Atta (whole-wheat flour), sugar and ghee. You only need these 3 basic ingredients to make Atte ka Halwa

### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 1/2-cup Atta (whole wheat flour)
- 1/2-cup ghee
- 1/2-cup sugar
- 1.5-cup water
- 3-4 green cardamom.

### Method:

- 1) In a heavy bottom pan melt ghee. Then add Atta to it.
- 2) Roast until flour is golden brown in color and leaves a nice aroma.
  - 3) Meanwhile, heat 1-cup

water in a pan on another stove. The water to be boiling hot when you add it to the Ghee-Atta mix. So keep it ready to go.

- 4) Now, add hot water and sugar to the Ghee-Atta mix.
- 5) Continue to stir the Atta Halwa and cook until it turns brown in color and gives a nice aroma, take around 6 to 7 minutes on medium heat or cook till ghee oozes out and Atta leaves sides of pan. Be careful to not burn the Atta-Halwa here.
- 6) Add grounded green cardamom
- 7) Garnish with chopped almonds/pistachio (optional)

# Significance of Kartika Maas

he month of Kartika/Damodara Month/festival of Deepam, considered sacred for worshiping Lord Vishnu, began on Sun, Oct 29, 2023 and ends on Mon, Nov 27, 2023 in the eighth Lunar month of Hindu calendar. It is the best, the purest, and the most glorious of all months because there is no other month equal to Kartikaand is very dear to Vaishnavas, Shaivas, Jains, Sikhs and many others. Lord Shiva, Lord Vishnu, Kartikeya, Tulsi, Lakshmi, Guru Nanak and Lord Adinath are honored with much devotion. They celebratewith great devotion several religious rituals, traditions and spiritual activities, such as vratas, getting up in the Brahma Muhurat, offering prayers, meditation, fasting, activating chakras, performing Sadhana and visiting temple and listening to Kartika Maas Katha etc. It is believed that any vrata, even the smallest, will yield huge results that last for one hundred lifetimes.

During Kartika Masam, the time is starting to move into what is called Kaivalya Pada"solitude" or "detachment" in Sanskrit. In terms of Sadhana, Dakshinayana is for purification, and liberation from rebirth and freedom from suffering, Uttarayana is for enlightenment. The Sadhana Pada was the time of plowing, seeding and cultivating and reaching a state of union with the divine or higher Self.

### Why Kartika Maas is known as Damodara Maas?

This month is also known as Damodara Maas ("Dama" means - "rope" and "udara " means - "belly") as little Krishna performed his sweetest pastime 'Damodara Leela' in Kartika month on the day of Diwali with Ma Yashoda who tied him up to grinding mortar. Later, by his persistent pulling of grinding mortar, the arjuna tree was uprooted, and two of Kuvera's sonsnamed Nalapuvera and Manigriva were rescued and promoted to their life of demigods and they became great devotees of the Lord. Thus, Krishna through Damodara Leela, showed us how one can bind him with the ropes of love, affection and devotion.

### What are the Legends of Kartika Maas?

According to the Skanda Purana, this sacred month is associated to Lord Vishnu's divine incarnation as Matsya, the first Avatar and Lord Shiva's slaying of Tripurasura. In Kartika, Lord Vishnu resides in water in the form of Matsya, so, dipping in the river or pond before sunrise are believed to lead one to Vaikuntha. It is said that even the Gods descend to the Earth during this auspicious month to participate in the sacred bathing ritual in the Ganga.

### What are the Glories of Kartika Month?

Per Padma Purana, Uttara Khanda, for Lord Krishna, "Of all plants, the sacred Tulasi is most dear to him, of all months, Kartika is most dear, of all places of pilgrimage, HIS beloved Dwarka is most dear, and of all days, Ekadashi is most dear." Kartika month is the most rewarding month of the year as every little devotional service or charity performed, pleases lord Krishna and gets magnified a thousand times during this month.

### What to do during Kartika Maas?

During Kartika Maas, everyone should do vratas very strictly. Following dos are important than don'ts. One can make a list of resolutions with firm decisions and push oneself to do so, such as 1) Abstaining from social me-

dia and read some Katha. 2) Observing celibacy (physical and mental purity) is a prerequisite in any vrata and spiritual Sadhana. 3) Spending time with spiritual Gurus, Sadhus and Sants for inspiration/escape velocity to get out of this world's ignorance gravitational pull. 4) Bowing



to Gods and the devotees as a vrata (11 times or 21 times etc.) suppresses our ego and that way, you get both physical and spiritual pushups. 5) Taking a bath early in the morning before the Sunrise obtains the results of bathing at all the holy places and brings goodness and charm into the lives of worshippers. If a person takes bath only once in the water of Yamuna in Mathura resides in Vaikuntha for a long period.6) People must offer arghya (water) to Lord Surya in the morning and perform Pooja, Havan and Yagnya

7) Offering Ghee lamp with meditation to the Lord by looking at His face removes one's all sins, and never see



the face of ruthless Yama and attain the eternal spiritual world where there is no suffering. Also daily offering of Ghee lamp and Parikram (circumbulation) to Tulsi Devi offers one eternal residence in Vrindavan and eternal service of the lotus feet of Krishna. Eating basil leaves on an empty stomach provides protection from illnesses.

8) Offering of a garland of fresh and fragrant flowers and/ or Tulasi to Krishna every day helps one to maximize one's spiritual commitments to go Vaikuntha. 9) Cleaning the temples of Lord and the houses early in the morning brings indescribable happiness.10) Hearing eagerly the sacred scriptures, Hara and Hari Kathas, Bhagvadgeeta, Chanting, and listening to Kirtans in the presence of Lord purifies mind and body, destroy sins and bestow Moksha. A person, who, with his controlled senses, reds even one verse of Geeta gets the result of reading the eighteen Puranas. 11) Eating only just one meal in the entire day and consume radish, tubers, carrots, garadu, and sweet potatoes for good health and essential nutrition. Avoid eating onion, garlic, spicy food, non-veg, drinks and Urad Daal and sleep on the floor. 12) Charity holds great importance, one can donate grains, sesame seeds, Amla, money, clothes, blankets, shoes, umbrellas and also Deepam to Brahmins and seek their blessings.

### What is the importance of Kartika Somavar vratam?

Kartik Masam commences after Diwali and harbingers the winter season. Karva Chauth, Tulsi Vivah, Diwali, Kartik Purnima and many other important festivals are celebrated. Worshipping Lord Shiva during Kartik Masa especially on Mondays is considered to be very holy in Maharashtra, Gujarat, Karnataka, and Andhra Pradesh and is referred to as the "Somavar Vratam". Devotees observe fasting, visit temples, to have Darshan, offer specialPoojas, chant Hymns and Beej Mantras, perform Abhishekam, to Lord Shiva to escape from the curse of Daksha, and get the blessings and Moksha. Somavar (Monday) gets its name from one of thousand names of Lord Shiva - Someshvara, who keeps the "Soma" the Moon curved on HIS knotted hair. Devotees also offer Naga/Snake Pooja and offer milk and eggs to Nagulamma, who removes Naga Dosham and relieves from bad karma effects. Devotees donate offerings to poor, disabled, old, poor and animals as they see Lord Shiva in every living being.

### What is the importance of Kartik month?

The importance of Kartik month has been explained in detail in Shrimad Bhagvat and leaves its imprints on both humans and nature, by highlighting the strengths and harmony of their relationship, for the welfare to the world. Annakut known as Govardhan Puja shows love and respect of humans towards nature from which we get everything and the color of life. Diwali that is celebrated on the Amavasya of Kartik month depicts how we can remove the darkness in life with light and teaches us how to live with hope when we are surrounded by despair. In the same way, the festival of Bhaiya Dooj brings purity and strength to relationship by depicting the importance of natural love and companionship between brothers and sisters. Karva Chauth fasting observed by married ladies shows the way of leading an ideal married life and rejuvenates the happiness and vows between the life partners. This festival marks the bond of faith and trust in marriage, and it is believed that observing this fast ensures long life of life partners.

icharchika (Eczema) is a type of Kshudrakustha of ten characterized with symptoms, namely, Kandu (itching), Srava (discharge), Pidaka (vesicles), and Shyava Varna (discoloration). Vicharchika is correlated to eczema based on the clinical presentations. Eczema originates from a Greek word "ekzein" which means to 'boil over' or 'break out' and is used for a group of inflammatory skin conditions that cause itchiness, dry skin, rashes, scaly patches, blisters and skin infections. Modern sciences call it as Dermatitis (Derma - skin, otitis inflammation). Eczema damages your skin barrier function, weakening your skin's ability to retain moisture and protect itself from external factors and generates heat.

skin. For darker skin tones, eczema can present as brown, purple, gray or ashen. Eczema can begin at any age and it can range from mild to severe. Newborn babies can experience eczema within the first weeks/months after birth. Young children with eczema can experience dry itchy skin patches that can lead to blisters and skin infections due to ex-

cessive scratching. Adults can also experience eczema in their 20s or over the age of 50. It is very common in the United States, and over 31 million people deal with some form of eczema.

Eczema is an atopic dermatitis and related to your gut health and results from an overactive immune system that causes the skin barrier to become dry and itchy. Ec-

zema is not contagious and cannot "catch it" from someone else. While the exact cause of eczema is unknown, researchers do know that people develop eczema because of an interaction between genes and environmental triggers. However proper, and consistent gut health care is essential in the prevention and management of eczema than us-

ing creams and lotions for temporary relief and the problem is going to bounce back. Therefore, treat it from inside then you will see the results outside.

### What Are the Symptoms of Eczema?

Eczema symptoms will look different for everyone and the severity of eczema also varies. Eczema usually includes itchy skin "pruritus." People with eczema often experience bumpy rashes, blisters, dry skin, itchiness, inflamed/discolored skin, rough, leathery skin appearing as scaly patches, oozing or crusting in the areas of swelling. They are frequently noticed on parts of the body such as your hands, neck, face, feet, knees, and elbows, but it can appear elsewhere as well. However, too much scratching results in infections that may become painful or prone to infection.

### What are the types of eczema?

There are seven different types of eczema: atopic dermatitis, contact dermatitis, dyshidrotic eczema, nummular eczema, seborrheic dermatitis and stasis dermatitis

#### What is the root cause of eczema in Ayurveda?

According to Ayurveda, Eczema /Vicharchika is caused due to a faulty diet and lifestyle, which leads to impairment of digestion and aggravation of Pitta Dosha (Fire). Pitta is usually a factor in eczema as it governs from its root. Those who have severe eczema, you can soak 8 grams of each herb and use the overnight soaked water to treat the affected area.

Note: You should avoid using meat, alcohol, sour stuff (Achar/pickles except lemon and C vitamin fruits),



the liver, blood and digestion - all of which affect the texture and health of the skin. Pitta manifests in the skin and causes accumulation of heating toxins known as ama. Eczema can also be caused by core genetic and immune factors or by external triggers such as microbiome, cold weather, excessively hot showers, fragranced beauty products and detergents, and stress. Emotional stress can also trigger an eczema flare-up, but it is not exactly known why. Some people's eczema symptoms and flare-ups get worse when they are feeling "stressed.

adi Patta/Curry Leaves (Murraya Koenigil) are well known for add ing exotic aromatic flavor and distinctive taste to Indian cuisine along with their countless nutritional and medicinal benefits. According to Ayurveda, our meals should contain pungent, bitter and astringent ingredients. Kadi Patta, therefore is a perfect ingredient that goes well with dals, Sabjis, curries, vegetable salads, rice dishes, buttermilk, curd, soups, stews, chutneys, seasoning blends, like curry powder, and more. It can be eaten raw, fried and cooked. It is called Kadi Patta or Meetha Neem in Hindi. Surabhinimba in Sanskrit, Narasingha in Asamiya, Barsanga in Bengali, Gorenimb in Gujrati, Kadhilimb in Marathi, Karibevu in Kannada, Karepaku in Telugu, Bhursanga in Oriya, Kariveppilai in Tamil, or Karivempu in Malayalam as this tree is indigenous to India, Srilanka, Bangladesh, and many Southeast Asian countries. Curry leaves trees usually grow in the tropical and subtropical climates.

These curry leaves add slightly citrusy and bitter flavor to various dishes. They are often used in the tempering process, where they are fried in oil along with other spices to release their flavors before being added to a dish. Since curry leaves, roots, fruits and barks are rich in disease-fighting constituents have been used as Ayurvedic remedies for curing many diseases and ailments for centuries.

### What are the qualities of curry leaves?






People think the Hindus mean by the



# In era of 'proxy wars', political will to counter 'covert' offensives is important

orld War II ended with the firstever use of a nuclear bomb by the US on Hiroshima and Nagasaki in Japan on August 6 and 9, 1945 respectively, resulting in the killing of nearly two hundred thousand civilians and the surrender of Japan a week thereafter.

What set in later was appropriately called the period of 'Cold War', in which nuclear deterrence rooted in the theory of 'Mutually Assured Destruction' (MAD) kept the two superpowers from initiating a fullscale war. These were also the years of a tense ideological divide of the world between International Communism with state control of the economy and the Capitalist model of the Free Market.

The Vietnam War in the meanwhile revealed that military armament could work West as their first enemy.

The contradiction surfaced soon enough for the US to work for the ouster of the Emirate - which laid the turf for 9/11 and realize the seriousness of the threat posed by Islamic radicals to its own security and the security of its allies.

The 'war on terror' launched by the USled coalition first in Afghanistan and then in Iraq, saw radicalization spreading in the Muslim world at the expense of the fundamentalist but pro-US regimes like Saudi Arabia, UAE and Bahrain.

The radical outfits used faith-based motivation as the instrument of terrorism. Pakistan has been riding two horses trying to be in the good books of the US and collaborating at the same time with the radical forces of Taliban, Al Qaeda

and ISIS.

The 'asymmetry' of the Vietnam battle was an indicator of the era of 'proxy wars' that would follow once the Cold War ended with the withdrawal of the Soviet army from Afghanistan and the consequent dismemberment of the Soviet Union and the demise of International Communism in 1991

Further, Pakistan's strategic alliance with China multiplied the security threats to India specifically but the US-led West did not always see it from the Indian perspective, which added to the challenge for

Indian diplomacy and the country's security set-up.

In the era of proxy wars, there is increasing reliance on the power of technology for combat. The strategy of countering 'covert' offensives of the adversary required political will and in the Narendra Modi regime, this has been coming forth in adequate measure.

Incidentally, there is a learning for Israeli security from the Hamas terror attack of October 7 - that technology should not be allowed to override the importance of human Intelligence.

It is interesting that the Russian military intervention in southern Ukraine in February 2022 was termed as a crossborder 'operation' and not a 'war' by President Vladimir Putin who spoke up for safeguarding the legitimate interests of the Russian-speaking population of the region. The US responded in a 'proxy' mode - supplying Ukraine with armament, putting economic sanctions on Russia and denouncing Russia's action in the UN. IANS

Post-Cold War, open warfare evidently gave way to 'covert' offensives by way of instigation of cross-border terror attacks. support to insurgencies and promotion of separatist movements.

The end of the Cold War coincided with the rise of faith-based terrorism because the anti-Soviet armed campaign was run on the war cry of Jehad and conducted in an asymmetric mode.

The US gave all credit to Pakistan for the success of the 'Afghan war' clearly in ignorance of the fact that Pak ISI had also patronized Islamic radicals of Taliban and Al Qaeda and managed to install the Taliban Emirate in Kabul in 1996 knowing well that these outfits considered US-led

ri Lanka is the designated chairperson for the Indian Ocean Rim Association (IORA) from 2023 to 2025. CSO and the Council of Ministers meetings were held in Colombo from October 9 to 11. Emerging from a severe economic crisis, Sri Lanka presents a symbol of resilience in successfully overcoming the negatives it underwent. Today Sri Lanka is able to host all of the IORA members to participate in the conference, symbolizing the goodwill and confidence she enjoys in the Ocean Rim and beyond.

### Anatomy of an island

A land known by many a name to the world systems located to the east and west of this island, its history is essentially a story of trans-oceanic connectivity. It is a story of how this island came to evolve its unique personality due to the convergence of multiple streams of people, cultures, languages, religions, ethnicities and technologies. It also represents a vibrant dynamic of authentic multiple histories of the Sri Lankan mosaic. The historical saga of Sri Lanka, an island situated in a pivotal position in the Indian Ocean Rim, could not be inscribed otherwise in the annals of history and most certainly not without the story of the sea - a story of nurtured reciprocity as one of the most valued "ports of call" in antiquity.



Situated between the Persian Gulf and Red Sea to the west and the Straits of Malacca and Sunda to the east, Sri Lanka is arguably


