HINDU PLURALISM

An untold story of Global Hindu Pluralism and universal harmony

NEW DELHI: Some may dismiss religion for being divisive. I, however, have experienced the Hindu tradition as a unifier. On the morning of 22 January 2024, I chanted Siya-Rama and Swaminarayan intermittently while watching Prime Minister Narendra Modi perform the inauguration of the Rama Janmabhoomi Temple in Ayodhya.

I observed around me not only the diversity of the flock, but its solidarity. Shaivas, Shaktas, Vaishnavas, Swaminarayans, Jains, Sikhs, Christians and Muslims all experienced themselves as Bharatiya. This focus on similarities is the way of Bharat -a land of diverse religions, sects, manifestations of the Divine (deities), languages, foods, and people.

As Hindus around the world prepared to celebrate Ramanavami and Swaminarayan Jayanti on Chaitra Shukla Navami, I found that morning in Ayodhya at the forefront of my consciousness even as I sat here in Abu Dhabi.

It heartens me to briefly reflect on the plurality of deities in India through the lives of Shri Rama and Shri Swaminarayan.

The plurality of lineages or sampradays, have been an asset to the Hindu Sanatan tradition for nearly two millennia. These sampradays typically worship different manifestations of the divine and believe in distinct theological principles or dar?ans. Despite these differences and diversities, Hinduism has flourished as one identity.



HINDU PLURALISM

An untold story of Global Hindu Pluralism and universal harmony

NEW DELHI: Some may dismiss religion for being divisive. I, however, have experienced the Hindu tradition as a unifier. Despite these differences and diversities, Hinduism has flourished as one identity.

This variability reiterated the universal lessons of Hinduism for different regional communities in disparate languages and eras. Shri Rama is celebrated for his discipline, dignity (maryada), and respect for individuals irrespective of their social class and gender.

These stories are well known and well told. I first encountered them before my initiation as a youth while reading the Amar Chitra Katha series. I later retold them several times in sermons across India, Europe, and the Middle East.

Not too far from Ayodhya, just across the Saryu River, is Chhapaiya, a small village in the Gonda District of Uttar Pradesh, which is celebrated as Shri Swaminarayan's birthplace.

Millions flock annually to this small town to honor the teachings of Shri Swaminarayan. Swaminarayan left home at the age of eleven, travelled across the Indian subcontinent from the Himalayas to Kanyakumari, and later settled in Gujarat.

Swaminarayan's sabha in Gujarat became a place for open conversation among devotees, theologians, and politi-

teachings is why the Hindu concept of manifestation (avtara) is important -- not to alienate and separate Hindu believers through reverence for different manifesta-

cal emissaries, but also the performance of music and literature representing various cultural streams from across India.

These conversations were compiled in a text of 273 teachings called the Vachanamrut. The proliferation of these lessons amplified the earlier teachings of Maryada Purushottam Shri Rama and Lila Purushottam Shri Krishna, both of whom Shri Swaminarayan revered.

The relevance of Swaminarayan's

tions of Divinity, but rather to unite them by sharing these same lessons in various tones and registers for diverse communities after a few thousand years.

Shri Swaminarayan's social reform work embodies these same Hindu values and promotes spiritual excellence. His emphasis on empowering women's status in the home as well as in society has been appreciated by notable scholars and historians such as Kanaiyalal M. Munshi.



His subtle yet impressive reform of class-oppressive practices and superstitious ritualistic behavior has been lauded by his contemporaries and subsequent Hindu leaders. It can be argued that his teachings paved the way for an articulation of Hinduism that spoke to a changing Colonial India and later a grand global Hindu identity.

Most importantly, Shri Swaminarayan's community resonated the Vedic Hindu Sanatan teachings outside of India in an impactful manner.

BAPS Swaminarayan Akshardham in New Jersey, USA, BAPS Hindu Mandir in Abu Dhabi, and the most recently inaugurated BAPS Shri Swaminarayan Mandir and Cultural Complex in Johannesburg, South Africa make accessible the universal teachings of Hinduism to tens of millions outside of India.

Again, I reflect on Shri Swaminarayan's work and teachings as a celebration of the collectiveness and commonality found in all of Hinduism -- as a continuation or reverberation and not an amendment or restructuring of the work of those who preceded him.

I write this final thought while sitting under the central dome of the BAPS Hindu Mandir in Abu Dhabi, UAE.

In such mandirs and cultural complexes, Shri Rama and Shri Swaminarayan, along with several other deities, grace all. Here, the benedictions are not limited to those who identify as Swaminarayan, or even more broadly Hindu

There are no conversations of superiority or hierarchy-only blessings for all those who come with curiosity, spiritual thirst, or a quest for personal betterment or cultural belonging. These are the lessons of love, peace and harmony, which are the need of the hour for all countries, communities, cultures and religions.

No wonder, the universal ideal of 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam' - the whole world is one family - which is one of the core values of the Hindu Sanatan Dharma is felt here, on the Day of Ram Navmi.

WASHINGTON DC: Billionaire entrepreneur Elon Musk, who heads the US Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE), had appealed to American President Donald Trump to reconsider the retaliatory import tariffs, the Washington Post reported, citing sources.

According to the US daily, Musk's attempted intervention was unsuccessful and the CEO of X and Tesla also

disagreed with other high-ranking Washington officials on issues such as migrant visas and DOGE's approach to government spending, The Washington Post pointed out citing two people familiar with the matter.

The newspaper recalled that on April 5, Musk criticized White House trade adviser Peter Navarro, who played a key role in preparing a plan to introduce tariffs. "A PhD in Econ from Harvard is a bad thing, not a good thing," Musk wrote on his X page, referring to Navarro. This exchange marks the

highest-profile disagreement between the President and Musk, the report said

The Washington Post also said that Musk had over the weekend said that he would like to see a "free trade zone" between Europe and the United States."

"At the end of the day, I hope it's agreed that both Eu-

rope and the United States should move ideally, in my view, to a zero-tariff situation," the newspaper quoted the entrepreneur as saying.

According to Musk, he would like people to be able to move freely between European countries and the US "if they wish." "That has certainly been my advice to the president," he added.

> Musk's brother and fellow Tesla board member Kimbal Musk also lobbed sharp criticism at the President over the tariff policies.

Trump had announced a sweeping 10 percent baseline tariff on all imports to the United States, alongside steeper duties targeting specific countries, including India.

Meanwhile, Tesla sales plunged 13 percent in the first three months of this year, the largest drop in deliveries in its history, as backlash against CEO Elon Musk and growing competition took a

large bite out of demand for its EVs, as per a report in the CNN earlier this month.

Amid the turmoil in the global markets following the tariff announcements, US President Donald Trump has ruled out the possibility of a "pause" on the tariffs on countries during negotiations. ANI

Pakistan can say goodbye to IMF by tapping mineral wealth: PM Shehbaz Sharif

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said Pakistan could free itself from reliance on global financial institutions like the International Monetary Fund (IMF) if it successfully harnessed its mineral reserves, which are estimated to be worth "trillions of dollars." He made the remarks while addressing the Pakistan Minerals Investment Forum 2025 (PMIF25), held at the Jinnah Convention Centre in Islamabad, Dawn reported.

The two-day forum brings together around 300 foreign delegates and aims to showcase investment opportunities in Pakistan's emerging mineral sector. The government plans to unveil a unified national framework to promote mining ventures across all four provinces, as well as Azad Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan.

"The deposits are valued in trillions of dollars. If we are able to harvest these great assets... Pakistan would say goodbye to institutions like the IMF... It will be able to get rid of the mountain of loans and borrowed sums of money costing us a fortune," PM Shehbaz said. He also emphasized that any future investor engagement would be conditional on downstream processing within Pakistan.

"We will not allow raw materials to be shipped out of Pakistan," he stated. "There has to be an integrated policy where you [investors] mine raw material, have downstream industry, convert them into finished goods and then export it out." ANI

The call appeared to be the first publicly known contact between cabinet officials of the two countries after Trump's announcement last

Vietnam was the first, offering to scale down its tariffs to zero. Trump also spoke with Japan's Shigeru Ishiba.

The US President said in a post on Truth Social, his social media platform, "Countries from all over the world are talking to us. Tough but fair parameters are being set. Spoke to the Japanese Prime Minister this morning. He is sending a top team to negotiate! They have treated the US very poorly on Trade. They don't take our cars, but we take millions of theirs. Likewise agriculture, and many other things. It all has to change, but especially with China!!!"

Israel's Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu is meeting Trump later in what is being called the first in-person meeting between a world leader and the American President on tariffs. Trump has slapped a tariff of 17 percent on Israel, a key military ally. IANS

BEIJING: Hundreds of Tibetans have flocked to social media to urge the Chinese government to reinstate Tibetan language education in schools, following Beijing's release of a white paper asserting that Tibetan language rights are guaranteed in the region, according to a report

by Radio Free Asia (RFA).

In the report from March 28 discussing human rights in Tibet, China declared that Tibetan is frequently used in government documents, public announcements, media, and educational institutions, claiming that both Mandarin and Tibetan are taught in primary and secondary schools, according to RFA.

However, Tibetans argue that this statement is inaccurate and that China has deliberately sought to diminish the usage of their language, which they view as part of a broader effort to erase Tibetan cultural identity, as noted by RFA.

In 2020. Mandarin became the main language of instruction in all primary and secondary schools in Tibet, labeled as "bilingual" education; however, in practice, Mandarin was predominantly used, as highlighted by RFA.

In 2023, China introduced a Mandarin-

only policy for students taking the annual college entrance examination, placing many ethnic minorities, including Tibetan children who had previously been able to take the test in their native language, at a disadvantage, as cited by an RFA report.

Moreover, the title of the white paper, "Human Rights in Xizang in the New Era," utilized the

Beijing-endorsed term "Xizang" to refer to Tibet, further indicating efforts to assimilate Tibetans into Han Chinese culture. According to RFA, access to Tibet for outsiders has been severely limited by China, making it extremely challenging to accurately depict the conditions on the ground. ANI

US tariffs: Gold, crude oil prices tumble amid global uncertainty

NEW DELHI: The effect of the newly announced reciprocal tariffs by US President Donald Trump is now being felt in the global commodity markets, with sharp declines seen in the prices of key commodities like gold and crude oil.

According to the Indian Bullion Jewellers Association (IBJA), the price of 24-carat gold on 7 April fell sharply by Rs 2,613 to Rs 88,401 per 10 grams, down from Rs 91,014 on Friday 4 April.

Similarly, the price of 22-carat gold dropped to Rs 86,280 per 10 grams, while 18-carat gold is now priced at Rs 78,680 per 10 grams.

Silver prices also took a hit. A kilogram of silver declined by Rs 4,535 to Rs 88,375, compared to its previous price of Rs 92,910 per kg.

The fall in gold prices is largely due to a global decline in rates. The price of gold internationally has come down from its record high of \$3,201 per ounce to \$3,060 per ounce.

A similar trend is seen in silver, which dropped from \$35 per ounce to around \$30.40 per ounce. Crude oil prices have also slumped amid concerns over a slowdown in global economic activity following the announcement of the trade tariffs.

On 7 April, Brent crude was trading 2.12 percent lower at \$64.24 per barrel, while West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude dropped 2.24 percent to \$60.61 per barrel. *IANS*

Malls, main streets drive 55 pc surge in India's retail leasing during Jan-March

NEW DELHI: Leasing activity in India's retail sector recorded a robust 55 percent jump to cross 2.4 million square feet (MSF) in the January-March quarter this year across top eight cities, with both malls and main streets contributing to the growth, according to recently released report. Both malls and main streets contributed to this growth owing to the commencement of new supply in emerging locations, said the report by Cushman & Wakefield.

The report highlighted that Hyderabad was the frontrunner in terms of leasing volume, contributing 34 percent (0.8 MSF) of the total leasing activity, with a staggering 106 percent year-on-year growth. *IANS*

NEW DELHI: With China facing a 34 percent US tariff and Vietnam 46 percent, India's relatively lower tariff of 27 percent may shift supply chain dynamics, helping the domestic tech hardware sector grow further, according to a new report.

India's electronics manufacturing, especially smartphones, are set to gain a competitive edge as the US imposes tariffs on electronics imports from key countries, says a CLSA report.

The shift in the global supply chain could favor India, particularly in the smartphone-manufacturing segment, it added.

Smartphones account for \$51 billion worth of imports for the US, with China, Vietnam and India being key sources, according to the global brokerage.

Apple and Samsung already have robust manufacturing operations in India.

India's lower tariff combined with its large domestic market and increasing backward integration supported by the production-linked incentive (PLI) scheme, enhances its cost

competitiveness.



NEW DELHI: The swift shift in global sentiment, high market volatility and fear of recession amid the US tariff shock indicate a 25bps cut by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on April 9, with possible change in stance to "accommodative" to give directional easing bias, a recent report showed.

The Central Bank began its three-day Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting this week.

"The extent to which this global trade war could stretch is unclear. Monetary policy may have to do the heavy lifting in India by being more countercyclical than fiscal this year. Implications for India could stem from both, global financial market disruptions and real sector hit," said Emkay Global Financial Services in the note.

While there is scope for negotiation and de-escalation, "we think this could be a pivotal turning point for emerging markets (EMs) assets in coming months".

However, the RBI may not want to use all the ammunition too soon, given fluid global markets, and may thus not frontload cuts in April.

"Options like non-conventional easing in the form of easier regulatory (lending) norms, lower daily CRR requirement for banks to sub 90 percent, sterilized INR management, etc may be used, if needed," the report noted.

Near-term, however, there may be some overhaul of

the liquidity framework in favor of daily variable rate repo (VRRs) instead of 14-day VRR, as the primary tool for easier asset liability management (ALM) and liquidity management for banks.

According to the report, the fluid global dynamics will require the RBI to be nimble in managing any risk of tighter financial conditions, "especially as the shock to sentiment/capital flows is likely to require higher risk premia from

While the extent of trade war pain is unclear, monetary policy may have to do the heavy lifting in India, it added.

According to Ankita Pathak, Macro Strategist and Global Equities Fund Advisor at Ionic Asset by Angel One, the RBI is likely to cut rates by 25bps tomorrow, with an expectation of a change in stance to accommodative from the current neutral. *IANS*

India ranks 3rd highest-funded fintech startup ecosystem globally in Q1 2025

BENGALURU: India secured the third position globally in terms of funding raised for the fintech sector in Q1 2025, following the US and the UK, a recent report showed.

A majority of the funding in this space has been seen in the late-stage rounds. Late-stage funding witnessed a 47 percent increase to \$227 million in January-March period, compared to \$154 million raised in Q4 2024, said the report by Tracxn, a leading market intelligence platform.

The first quarter of this year witnessed a total funding of \$366 million. March was the most funded month of the quarter, with \$187 million raised, accounting for 51 percent of the total funds.

The Indian economy faced bearish stock trends, US-imposed tariffs, global trade tensions, and rising inflation discouraging venture capital inflows.

Despite these challenges, India's GDP growth for FY 2025 is projected to remain resilient at approximately 6.5 per-

Furthermore, the rising acceptance of UPI beyond Indian borders in countries like Singapore, Nepal, and Sri Lanka presents a significant opportunity for Indian fintech players to expand operations overseas and attract more

capital into the sector, according to the report.

The sector witnessed significant growth in specific segments, with banking tech, Internet-first insurance platforms, and investment tech emerging as top performers in Q1 2025.

Banking tech, the highest-funded sector, received a funding of \$108 million, a 9 percent increase compared to the \$99 million observed in Q1 2024 and a substantial increase of 1,700 percent compared to \$6 million raised in Q4 2024, accounting for 29.59 percent of the total funds raised in Q1 2025 in this ecosystem, said the report.

Neha Singh, Co-Founder Tracxn, said, "The Indian fintech sector continues to evolve despite market fluctuations. While funding levels have declined, the industry's long-term growth potential remains strong".

"With increasing regulatory clarity, digital payment expansion, and a rising global footprint, we anticipate exciting opportunities for fintech startups in the coming years," she mentioned.

The quarter witnessed 10 acquisitions, reflecting a 67 percent and 100 percent increase compared to that of 6 and 5 acquisitions in Q1 2024 and Q4 2024, respectively. *IANS*

New research could help improve future whooping cough vaccines

TEXAS: Whooping cough, also known as pertussis, was formerly a leading cause of death in children in the United States and around the world before vaccines were introduced in the 1940s.

In the decades since, the bacterial disease has been practically eradicated in the United States, with annual fatalities falling into the double digits.

Now, new research from The University of Texas at Austin could aid in improving whooping cough vaccines to once again push this disease toward eradication by targeting two key weaknesses in the infection.

But the disease has made a troubling comeback in recent years as vaccine coverage declined after the Covid-19 pandemic. In 2024, several outbreaks left public health officials and hospitals scrambling to accommodate a sudden influx of patients, primarily infants, who are often too young to be vaccinated and suffer the most severe symptoms.

Against this backdrop, a team of researchers, including members of UT's McKetta Department of Chemical Engineering and Department of Molecular Biosciences, has made significant strides in understanding and enhancing pertussis immunity. ANI

World Health Day: PM Modi urges nation to fight obesity, calls fitness key to Viksit Bharat

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi, on the occasion of World Health Day on 7 April, urged Indians to adopt a healthier lifestyle and work towards a life free from obesity.

He emphasized that maintaining personal fitness would be a significant contribution to India's goal of becoming a developed nation -- Viksit Bharat.

Taking to X, PM Modi posted, "On World Health Day, let us reaffirm our commitment to building a healthier world. Our Government will keep focusing on healthcare and invest in different aspects of people's well-being. Good health is the foundation of every thriving society!"

In a video message shared on the platform, the Prime Minister stressed the age-old adage that "health is the ultimate fortune and the ultimate wealth" while sounding an alarm over India's growing obesity crisis.

"You all know that today, our

lifestyle is becoming a big threat to our health. Recently, a report has come on the problem of obeusage, is not just a personal decision but a social responsibility.

This will be a big step towards reducing obesity."

He further encouraged people

to incorporate regular physical activity into their daily routines.

"Apart from this, we have to make exercise a part of our life. If we keep ourselves fit, then it will be a big contribution to the journey of a Viksit Bharat," he added.

The Prime Minister has been consistent in his advocacy against obesity and lifestyle-related ailments.



Every 2 min a woman died from pregnancy and childbirth in 2023 globally: UN

NEW DELHI: A woman died almost every two minutes, or more than 700 women died daily from preventable causes related to pregnancy and childbirth in 2023, according to data from the UN and World Health Organization on World Health Day, 7 April.

World Health Day is celebrated on April 7 every year. The theme this year Healthy beginnings, hopeful futures, urges governments and the health community to ramp up efforts to end preventable maternal and newborn deaths

and to prioritize women's longer-term health and well-being.

The report titled Trends in maternal mortality shows a 40 percent global decline in maternal mortality ratio (MMR, number of maternal deaths per 100 000 live births) between 2000 and 2023.

It showed that since 2016, the pace of im-

provement slowed down significantly, and that an estimated 260,000 women died in 2023 due to complications from pregnancy or childbirth.

More than 90 percent of all maternal deaths occurred in low and lower-middle-income countries in 2023, said the report.

"While this report shows glimmers of hope, the data

also highlights how dangerous pregnancy still is in much of the world today despite the fact that solutions exist to prevent and treat the complications that cause the vast majority of maternal deaths," said Dr. Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, Director-General of the WHO.

"In addition to ensuring access to quality maternity care, it will be critical to strengthen the underlying health and reproductive rights of women and girls - factors that underpin their prospects of healthy outcomes during preg-

nancy and beyond."

Further, the report also provides the first global account of the Covid-19 pandemic's impact on maternal survival.

In 2021, an estimated 40,000 more women died due to pregnancy or child-birth -- increasing to 322,000 from 282,000 in 2020.

Besides the direct complications caused by

Covid infection, the deaths were also due to widespread interruptions to maternity services, the report said.

"This highlights the importance of ensuring such care during pandemics and other emergencies, noting that pregnant women need reliable access to routine services and checks as well as round-the-clock urgent care," said the report. *IANS*



Bird flu: Centre makes registration of poultry farms mandatory, calls for amping up surveillance

NEW DELHI: Amid rising bird flu cases in the country, the Union Government has made registration of poultry farms mandatory and urged the need for increasing surveillance to curb avian influenza.

A high-level meeting in New Delhi, chaired by Alka

Upadhyaya, Secretary at the Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying (DAHD) under the Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying set up a three-pronged strategy with stricter biosecurity, surveillance and mandatory registration of poultry farms.

The strategy "encompasses stricter biosecurity measures wherein poultry farms must enhance hygiene practices, control farm access and follow stringent biosecurity protocols to minimize the risk of infection, strengthened surveillance and mandatory reg-

istration of poultry farms to enhance disease tracking and control", stated the ministry.

"All poultry farms must register with state animal husbandry departments within a month. The government has urged poultry industry stakeholders to ensure 100 percent

compliance with this directive," it added.

"Protecting our poultry sector is critical for food security and rural livelihoods. Strict biosecurity, scientific surveillance, and responsible industry practices are essential in our fight against bird flu," Upadhyaya said.

In addition, she stated the need for developing a predictive modeling system for early warning and environmental surveillance which would enable proactive disease detection and response, minimizing the risk of outbreaks and protecting the poultry industry.

Avian Influenza is a highly infectious viral disease affecting birds, with occasional transmission to mammals. Since its first detection in India in 2006, outbreaks have been reported annually across multiple states.

Notably, Highly Pathogenic

Avian Influenza (HPAI) has since January affected eight states -- Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, Bihar.

Currently, six active outbreak zones remain in Jharkhand, Telangana, and Chhattisgarh in the country. *IANS*

Healthcare hiring in India grows 62 pc, creates over 7.5 mn jobs: Report

BENGALURU: India's healthcare sector is emerging as a major employer -- with hiring in the industry growing 62 percent year on year, and creating more than 7.5 million jobs, according to a report on Monday 7 April.

The report by jobs platform foundit (formerly Monster APAC & ME), showed that the healthcare sector has also seen a 7 percent increase in hiring over the past three months, underscoring its rapid expansion and evolving workforce dynamics.



It showed that the sector is witnessing remarkable growth and transformation fuelled by technological advancements and rising demand for medical services. Further, the demand for Al/ML engineers, data analysts, and product managers is surging, reflecting the sector's digital transformation.

"India's healthcare sector is entering a new era -where technology and talent are driving transformative change," said V Suresh, CEO, foundit.

"Our latest data highlights a sharp rise in demand for roles across AI, digital health, and informatics, reflecting a sector-wide pivot toward innovation and patient-centric care. In addition to metro cities, Pune, Kochi, and Kolkata are also showing strong growth in healthcare hiring, with Pune leading the charge with a 10 percent month-on month (MoM) growth rate.

Notably, the healthcare sector boasts high female representation (38 percent of the workforce), yet leadership roles remain disproportionately male-dominated, with women holding only 4 percent of these positions.

To address this disparity, healthcare organizations should implement targeted leadership development programs and diversity hiring policies with benchmarks to increase female representation at senior levels. These initiatives can help break down barriers and promote gender equity in leadership and specialized medical fields, the report said. *IANS*

Coast Guard nabbed 1,683 intruders at sea in 10 years

NEW DELHI: While guarding seashores, the Indian Coast Guard (ICG) has seized 179 boats and arrested 1,683 people over the last 10 years for illegally entering Indian waters, the Parliament was informed recently.

A toll-free number 1554 has also been promulgated for reporting of any eventuality at sea, said Minister of State for Defense Sanjay Seth in a written reply in Lok Sabha.

Replying to a question by Krishna Prasad Tenneti, the MoS said the 179 boats seized by ICG in the past decade were engaged in illegal activities like poaching, narcotics smuggling and illegal immigration.

He said surveillance of coastal areas is also undertaken through the Coastal Surveillance Network (CSN) and investigation by Remote Operating Station (ROS) and Remote Operating Centres (ROCs).

Elaborating on initiatives to strengthen coastal security, MoS Seth said the ICG deploys 18-20 ships, 30-35 crafts and 10-12 aircraft for daily surveillance.

The ICG used Rs 12,201 crore towards acquisition of ships and aircraft and utilized Rs 1,583.8 crore for CSN (Pan India), said the MoS.

"The ICG assets ensure maritime law enforcement to strengthen coastal security and maintain rule-based order at sea. Surveillance efforts also focus on the Offshore Development Area (ODA) and seas adjoining the Island groups (Andaman & Nicobar and Lakshadweep)," he said. IANS

The security agencies had identified 100,000 Afghans living in over 150 'Afghan Colonies' across Punjab only, an official told the country's leading daily, Dawn.

Many Afghans at Pakistan's Hassan Abdal expressed dissatisfaction with the "sudden implementation" of the deportation orders. They said that they sold all their belongings at throwaway prices and packed up their businesses in haste, which left them with huge losses.

The Union Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) last year announced that the FMR, which allows people residing along the India-Myanmar border to travel 16 km into each other's territory without a visa, would be scrapped soon.

Instead, the MHA decided to replace the FMR to adopt a new scheme to issue a pass to the border residents of both India and Myanmar living within 10 km on either side of the frontier to regulate cross-border movements.

The Nagaland Assembly on March 7 unanimously decided that an all-party delegation would meet the Union Home Minister to explain to him the "sentiment and resentment of the Naga people" against the MHA's decision to cancel the FMR between India and Myanmar.

Participating in the discussion on the issue, the Chief Minister had told the house that the border movement restriction would affect the long-standing historical, ethnic, social, cultural, traditional and economic ties of Nagas living on both sides of the India-Myanmar border.

The delegation would apprise the Home Minister about the concerns and unanimity of the house, which adopted unanimous resolutions passed on March 1, 2024, and the state cabinet decisions of February 8, 2024, and January 6.2025.

The Nagaland and Mizoram governments and a large number of political parties and civil societies in the two northeastern states have been opposing both border fencing and the FMR.

Four northeastern states -- Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Nagaland, and Mizoram -- share a 1,643-km un-

fenced border

The MHA had earlier decided to erect fencing on the entire porous border, known for the smuggling of arms, ammunition, narcotics and various other contrabands, at a cost of Rs 31,000 crore.

Meanwhile, officials of the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) and the top leaders of the National Socialist Council of Nagaland-Isak-Muivah (NSCN-IM) held a meeting in Dimapur on February 21 and decided to hold fresh formal talks between the government and the dominant Naga group soon.

According to a Nagaland government official, the MHA's advisor, North East, A.K. Mishra, during his visit to Nagaland in February, held a meeting with NSCN-IM's General Secretary and chief negotiator Thuingaleng Muivah and discussed various aspects of the Naga political issue.

"Both sides decided to hold formal talks at the earliest to take forward the long-pending Naga political issue," the official had said on condition of anonymity. IANS

Pakistan continues to forcibly deport thousands of Afghan refugees

Meanwhile, forcibly deported individuals stated that they were arrested by Pakistani police while at work and deported to Afghanistan, leaving behind their businesses and family members.

"I ran a small hotel business at the fruit market. The police raided me, detained me in Haji Camp in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa for four nights, and now deported me via Torkham." reports Afghan media outlet TOLO News quoting a deportee, Gul Mohammad.

Some other deportees say that although Pakistan demands visas, it does not provide a proper system for extending them. Instead, visas are sold at high prices on the black market, making them unaffordable.

"They arrested us while we were working. Whatever money we had, they took it. They brought us to the police station and treated us harshly. They don't see us as good neighbors," another deportee, Agakhan, stated.

Pakistan's deportation policy has come under scrutiny, with several international organizations condemning the act. They have raised concern over the grave risks faced by the refugees upon their return amid uncertainties in Afghanistan.

The Pakistani government had dismissed concerns raised by the UN High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) and other agencies regarding the mass repatriation of Afghan refugees. IANS

US mistakenly asks Ukrainian refugees to leave

WASHINGTON: In an administrative error, the US government mistakenly issued an email to several Ukrainian refugees, notifying them that their provisional legal status would be terminated in 7 days and ordering them to leave the country.

The notice received by the Ukrainians who sought refuge in the US following the war with Russia caused panic among the immigrants this week.

The US Department of Homeland Security (DHS) acknowledged the error last Friday.

"A message was sent in error to some Ukrainians who entered the United States under the Uniting for Ukraine program," said DHS spokeswoman Tricia McLaughlin in a statement.

The email, sent on April 3, read, "DHS is now exercising its discretion to terminate your parole," referring to the temporary legal status that the Biden administration granted to hundreds of thousands of

"Unless it expires sooner, your parole will terminate 7 days from the date of this notice," it stated.

The agency also took the step of withdrawing the email, sending a follow-up message to the recipients, American broadcaster CBS reported.

"You may have received an email notification titled 'Notice of Termination of Parole.' The DHS sent this email to you in error. No action will be taken with respect to your parole," it read.

Last month, addressing reporters in the Oval Office, US President Donald Trump said the White House has not come to a decision yet regarding the legal status of 240,000 Ukrainian refugees currently living in the country.

Trump said that he had not made a decision on the matter yet, but planned to do so "pretty soon". He also claimed that his administration did not want to hurt refugees from Ukraine.

"We're not looking to hurt anybody, and we're certainly not looking to hurt them," Trump added.

"And I'm looking at that, and there were some people that think that's appropriate, and some people don't, and I'll be making a decision pretty soon," Trump added that Ukrainians had "gone through a

White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt pushed back on the report at the time, saying no de-

The Biden administration announced in January before leaving office that it was extending temporary protected status for Ukrainians until October 2026 "due to armed conflict and extraordinary and temporary conditions in Ukraine that prevent individuals from safely returning."

The revocation of Temporary Protected Status (TPS) for Ukrainians would be in line with the Trump administration's broader approach to cracking down on legal pathways to enter the US amid a widespread crackdown on immigration. IANS





thnic Minority Media (EMS) invited three education experts on April ■ 4th to discuss optimizing the current classroom settings. For over a century the basic structure of the school day and week has been organized around 6 or 7 periods a day, five days a week, with each period lasting 40-60 minutes. But a growing number of educators are rethinking how to restructure the school day to make schools more rewarding for students whose learning styles don't always match the division of learning into hourly bites. The need to rethink the basic structure of the school day is receiving bipartisan support.

Shalonda Gregory, Principal of MidWest High in Oakland, CA., which is implementing a model to create innovative learning environments developed by Big Picture Learning said that students will go out on campus for internships two days a week, that is, every Tuesday and Thursday. Internships help them acquire the skills they need in the workplace to be successful in their future careers. Some high school students even get job offers during

their internships. She believes that schools should be places where students feel happy. In daily teaching, understand epidemic, physical classes were not possible, which made many children want to resume classes as soon as possible.

Louis Freedberg introduced the concept of Carnegie Unit, also known as effective credit unit (credit unit), which refers to the length of time students actually study a course in school. Generally speaking, students need 120 hours of class time per year. Louis Freedberg said that current education needs to improve efficiency. In addition to book knowledge, children should be given key skills for future work, including critical thinking, teamwork, and the ability to study alone.

"The way our (Indian) government has extended a helping hand to Myanmar, the people here keep praising our government



Dr Ram Niwas, a social worker and professor of Sanskrit and Pali language, pointed to the deep


historical ties underpinning this support.

place additional burdens on both American and Indian businesses.

"I strongly urge President Trump to reverse his harmful new tariffs, including those on Indian imports, and instead prioritize the well-being of American families, the strength of the US-India partnership, and our collective economic and national security in the face of authoritarian threats," he said.

Last week President Trump rolled out a reciprocal tariff system that seeks to levy higher tariffs on trading partner countries that levy high duties on imports from the US or have huge trade surpluses over the US.

There is a baseline rate of 10 percent that has been levied on all imports into the US. A large group of countries have been brought under individualized rates. Imports for India will be tariffed at 26 percent. Imports from China will be levied at 34 percent, 20 percent for imports from the EU and so on and so forth. *IANS*

India plays a crucial role in the Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectorial Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC), acting as a key driver of regional integration. BIMSTEC is a regional grouping of seven member states -- five from South Asia (Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Nepal, and Sri Lanka) and two from Southeast Asia (Myanmar and Thailand). It serves as an essential link between the two regions, with India being its largest and most influential member, actively shaping the group's agenda and fostering collaboration.

promising development has emerged in the ongoing efforts to repatriate the Rohingyas. In the first phase, authorities have identified 180,000 Rohingyas-out of the nearly 800,000 who have sought refuge in Bangladesh-as eligible to return to Myanmar. Myanmar has assured Bangladesh of its cooperation, and final verification of an additional 70,000 individuals is currently underway. Bangladesh submitted these lists to Myanmar in six phases between 2018 and 2020. Most recently, during the sixth BIMSTEC Summit in Bangkok on April 4, Myanmar's Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister conveyed the update to Dr. Khalilur Rahman, High Representative of the Chief Adviser to Bangladesh.

Although bilateral and multilateral negotiations have been attempted several times over the years, meaningful progress has been elusive-until now. This is the first instance of Myanmar officially acknowledging returnees from a verified list, sparking renewed hope for tangible progress.

So also, if our mind is fired with an intense love for the Name, this love will automatically enable us to remember the Name constantly. When this love is luke-



Institutional investments in Indian real estate up 31 pc at \$1.3 billion in Q1

NEW DELHI: Institutional investments in India's real estate sector saw a strong start to 2025, with total inflows reaching \$1.3 billion in the first quarter, as per recent report.

This marks a 31 percent increase compared to the same period last year, driven largely by domestic investors, according to the report by Colliers India.

Domestic investments played a significant role in this growth, contributing \$0.8 billion, which is a 75 percent rise on a year-on-year (YoY) basis. *IANS*

Foreign capital makes strong comeback in Indian real estate sector in FY25



MUMBAI: Foreign capital made a strong comeback in the Indian real estate sector in FY25, with cumulative investments at 3.1 billion, compared to \$2.6 billion in FY24, a recent report showed.

The surge in foreign investments has led to an increased share of foreign investors in Indian real estate -- accounting for 84 percent of total investment in FY25, up from 68 percent in FY24. This revival highlights a renewed global investor interest in India's real estate story despite persistent macro volatility, according to a report by Anarock Capital.

Logistics and warehousing sector emerged as the clear frontrunner in India last fiscal, attracting 48 percent of private equity (PE) funding, the highest in five years.

This marks a sharp pivot from

the 8-21 percent range seen by the sector from FY21 to FY24, according to a report by Anarock Capital.

The Indian real estate sector continues to navigate a rapidly evolving investment landscape, with overall private equity (PE) investments continuing to soften in FY25

Average deal size surged to 94 million in FY25, from \$75 million in FY24. Last fiscal saw ap-

proximately \$3.7 billion in PE funding.

The concentration of capital in fewer, larger transactions has increased significantly.

In FY25, the top 10 deals accounted for 81 percent of total PE investment value, up from 69 percent in FY24.

Aashiesh Agarwaal, senior vice president and investment advisor, Anarock Capital, said the spike in average deal size - from \$75 million to \$94 million -- highlights a more focused and strategic deployment of capital.

In FY25, pan-India/multi-city transactions accounted for 52 percent of all deal value - up from 47 percent in FY24 and just 25 percent in FY23.

"Barring the Covid year, pan-India and multi-city transactions have been rising steadily - increasing from 14 percent in FY19 to 52 percent in FY25. This underscores our view of a greater sector formalization and a shift toward large, diversified portfolios," Agarwaal added.

With capital consolidating around quality assets, and global investors re-engaging, Indian real estate is poised for a new chapter of strategic growth. *IANS*

'Now no one can rob lands in name of Waqf Board'

LUCKNOW: Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, while lauding the passing of the Waqf Amendment Bill said now "no one can rob lands in the name of Waqf Board," with public property being used to build schools, colleges, hospitals, or housing for the poor.

"Now, no one can rob lands in the name of the Waqf Board... Public property and revenue lands will now be used to build schools, colleges, hospitals, or housing for the poor," Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister said.

CM Adityanath thanked Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah for ensuring the passage of the bill, saying how in Uttar Pradesh Waqf board had become a means to "illegaly occupy land."

"I thank Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah for this because, in Uttar Pradesh, too, lakhs of acres of land had been illegally occupied in the name of the Waqf Board. It had become a means of loot for some people. Now, this looting will be curbed."

Following the passing of the Bill by the Lok Sabha (288 in favor)

and the Rajya Sabha (128 in favor), multiple Opposition parties have launched their protests and objections to it, with Congress and AlMIM challenging it in the Supreme Court.

Office retrofitting a Rs 45,000 cr investment opportunity for better rentals in India

MUMBAI: The office market across top seven cities in India offers an estimated Rs 45,000 crore (approximately \$5.3 billion) opportunity in retrofitting (improving the existing building design and engineering, integrating new technology, enhancing user experience, and incorporating climate-adaptive features and capabilities) and upgrading existing buildings, according to a recent report.

Approximately 62 percent of India's Grade A office stock across top seven cities, equivalent to 530.8 million



square feet (sq ft), requires upgrades - spanning from light to moderate to deep interventions.

The Silicon Valley of India leads in office retrofitting opportunities offering the largest potential among major Indian cities, with 155.9 million sq ft of Grade A stock, requiring an estimated Rs 14,410 crore in upgrade spends.

This presents both a challenge and an unprecedented opportunity for stakeholders across the industry, said the JLL report.

The focus of this transformation opportunity is primarily headlined by four key markets - Bengaluru, Delhi NCR, Mumbai, and Hyderabad - which account for about 81 percent of the total capex spend.

These four markets also represent about 75 percent of occupier activity in the country and, thus, need critical

developer and investor interventions to keep office assets 'relevant'.

"Around 32 percent of India's office stock was built earlier than or in the first decade of the new millennium. Even assets built later but prior to 2020 need to look at upgradation considering what tenants need today, given the changing dynamics around the need for offices to become 'experiential', fulfilling the twin objective of being modern (agile, tech-driven, amenity-rich) and sustainable/low-carbon," explained Dr Samantak Das, Chief Economist and Head of Research and REIS, India, JLL.

Post-retrofit rental premiums offer tangible returns, while improved occu-

pancy rates and longer lease terms further enhance the per-square-foot value of assets.

"By investing in these retrofits, property owners can expect rental premiums of 15-30 percent, with some prime locations seeing increases of up to 50 percent," said Das. *IANS*

The Third eye: Trump's quick fix for administrative reforms

D.C. PATHAK

S President Donald Trump has in his sec ond term, made reforms in federal governance a key component of his MAGA drive. He has established a new department- the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE)- under his closest confidant Elon Musk and given him a free hand in downsizing the various wings of the federal government.

The President is validating decisions of Musk by issuing Executive Orders on a running basis. DOGE has evidently discovered systemic corruption on a large scale and found legitimate grounds for enforcing cost-effectiveness.

Efficiency, by definition, is a measure of output per unit of resource- money and manpower

the quick-fix style of working of the new department under Elon Musk, that has created a stir leading to many orders being challenged in the District Courts. The Trump Administration was not deterred by any of this- it seemed to be confident about pushing the judicial process through the Court of Appeals and even the Supreme Court.

Education and Health are the two basic concerns of the national government in a democratic dispensation for they laid the foundation for producing the right kind of electorate - apart from meeting the obligation of 'welfarism' that had to be discharged by a democratic state.

These two wings of the government are interestingly, the first among the segments tar-

in this case- and it is enhanced if the number of employees doing a job is reduced to the optimal minimum and likewise, if procedures are pruned to ensure that a task was completed in the minimal number of operational steps.

India has had a history of Administrative Reforms Commissions (ARCs) producing voluminous reports that only added to the size of bureaucracy and left behind no lasting impressions. It is interesting to note that Prime Minister Modi's call for 'minimum government maximum governance' for India is what seemingly was being implemented by DOGE in America.

However, it is the large-scale lay-offs ordered at one go and

Trump signed an executive order dismantling the Department of Education on March 20 but even before that on March 12 nearly 50 percent of the department's workforce had been laid off

Trump said he wanted to 'return education back to the states', derided the department as 'wasteful and polluted by liberal ideology' and in a strong comment declared that 'the experiment of controlling American education through federal programs and dollars has failed our children, our teachers and our families'.

Federal actions have already been initiated against Ivy

League schools, Columbia and Harvard, over alleged harassment of Jewish students. The Trump Administration has suspended several dozen federally funded research grants to Princeton University as part of its investigation into campus anti-Semitic activity.

Unsurprisingly, Civil Rights groups saw all of this as a policy going against principles of equality and equability and warned of the return of civil rights violations in schools. Established in 1979 the Department of Education oversees funding for public schools, monitors student loans and runs programs that help low-income group students.

Trump has accused the department of 'indoctrinating young people with racial and political material'. He thought it was not the business of Education to handle loans and assigned this function to the Treasury. Trump has also curtailed USAID funding because of his basic aversion to civil society groups promoting left-liberalism in the name of human rights.

Robert F Kennedy Jr, Secretary Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced major changes at HHS bringing down the divisions from 28 to 15 through internal mergers, indicating that mass layoffs were in the offing to reduce the full-time HHS workforce of 82,000 by about 25 percent -saving 1.8 billion a year -and contended that the department 'will do more with less'. Kennedy went on record to say that in one instance 'defiant bureaucrats' impeded his office's effort to access the closely guarded database that might reveal the 'dangers of cer-

FIGHTING WAR WITH TARIFFS

Trump's war on fighting global tariffs regime started this April, targeting several fronts including his peace initiatives with Russia and Hamas. Despite ongoing concerns about potential shifts in US allies toward China, Trump expressed confidence in his strategy, pointing to recent examples like the European Union's reduction of car tariffs to 2.5%. Trump, who has previously called India "tariff king" and "tariff abuser," is looking to make a significant shift in trade relations. Both countries have begun negotiations toward finalizing an early trade deal to resolve the ongoing tariff standoff.

White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt also highlighted several unfair trade practices in India's tariff system, including the 100% tariff India imposes on US agricultural products. She pointed to similar tariffs imposed by other nations such as the European Union (50% on American dairy), Japan (700% on American rice), and Canada (300% on American butter and cheese), all of which hinder US exports and contribute to significant trade imbalances.

Ahead of the tariff deadline, the US criticized India's trade policies, including restrictions on dairy imports, agricultural surcharges, and the "Make in India" program. The 2025 National Trade Estimate (NTE) report also raised concerns over India's patent rules, digital trade barriers, and unpredictable import restrictions.

President Trump also threatened Iran with "possible bombing" as well as, the imposition of secondary tariffs on the Islamic Republic if they do not comply with the nuclear deal proposed by the US. Trump warned that Iran could face bombing and secondary tariffs if it does not come to an agreement over nuclear negotiations in the coming days, as per news agency Reuters. Iran's officials are talking but did not elaborate on the details. This is his first reaction since Iran rejected Washington's proposal for direct negotiations. He added, "If they don't make a deal, there will be bombing. It will be bombing the likes of which they have never seen before," Trump was quoted as saying.

In regards to Russia-Ukraine war, Trump told reporters he was disappointed with Putin on the peace deal, but added: "I think we are making progress, step by step."Trump said he could impose the new trade measures within a month. "That would be, that if you buy oil from Russia, you can't do business in the United States," Trump said. "There will be a 25% tariff on all oil, a 25 to 50-point tariff on all oil." There was no immediate reaction from Moscow.

Russia has called numerous Western sanctions and restrictions "illegal" and designed for the West to take economic advantage in its rivalry with Russia. He had already sanctioned tariffs on countries buying Venezuelan oil.

Where does India stand in this entire game of tariffs? In the past India was able to buy Russian crude at much lower prices and process them in India, when US sanctioned Russia on oil exports. Now the tariffs seem to cover much larger scope. In the past sanctions and tariffs did not seem to have much effect. Rather, countries were able to negotiate and form new alliances.

In a complex and interdependent global trade, Trump may find it difficult to implement such actions.

ainital, a picturesque hill station in the Kumaon region of Uttarakhand, is known for its serene lakes, lush green hills, and pleasant climate. 


