DHARAMSALA: US Secretary of State Marco Rubio rest speculation over whether the 600-year-old institution

has extended best wishes to the Dalai Lama, who turned 90 on 6 July.

"The US remains firmly committed to promoting respect for the human rights and fundamental freedoms of Tibetans. We support efforts to preserve Tibetans' distinct linguistic, cultural, and religious heritage, including their ability to freely choose and venerate religious leaders without interference," the US Department of State said in a statement.

The 14th Dalai Lama, the 'Voice for the Voiceless', aims to live for more decades.

Ahead of his 90th birthday, the Nobel Peace Laureate also confirmed that he will have a successor, putting to


will end when he dies.

Meanwhile, in celebration of the extraordinary occasion of the Dalai Lama turning 90, the democratically-elected Central Tibetan Administration (CTA), the representative of Tibetan people both in and outside Tibet that is based in this north Indian hill station, has declared that July 2025 to July 2026 will be observed "The Year of Compassion".

The initiative celebrates the Dalai Lama not only as a spiritual leader, but

also as a global advocate for peace, compassion, secular ethics, interfaith harmony, among others.







# ICE raids are hurting South Asians in California

any within the South Asian community believe that immigration enforcement is not "our" issue. Our community operates under the assumption that because we arrived on student, work, or family visas; we are protected from raids and deportations. But this belief is quickly shattering, especially here in Southern California.

In recent months, ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement) activity has escalated in regions with large minority populations, including the neighborhood of Little India in Artesia, California. These raids have striked fear not just within undocumented folks, but has also gone to paralyze the community as a whole.

South Asians all over Southern California are choosing to stay home and out of the streets. Temples, mosques, and gurdwaras once filled with chatter now hold a deafening silence. South Asians, especially undocumented or out-of-status individuals, have stopped showing up to community events. Community members are missing medical appointments. Grocery stores and restaurants sit quieter than usual. Fear has now become part of the daily routine.

The South Asian Network (SAN), with offices in Little India and Little Bangladesh, has been on the frontlines of this crisis. Since 1990, SAN has worked to advance the health, civil rights, and social justice of South Asians across Southern California. Today, we are responding to the rising fear in our community. SAN is getting calls not just from undocumented individuals, but from folks with green cards, work permits, and even U.S. citizenship.

We have heard stories from commu-



nity members who were stopped and questioned by ICE officers. These people are not hooligans or participating in nefarious activities, they were stopped while doing mundane tasks such as: shopping for groceries or walking home from work.

Last week, SAN hosted a Know Your Rights Town Hall, with the majority of attendees being documented. I had the op-

portunity to facilitate the session, and what struck me most came during the question session. These were not the usual hypotheticals SAN has heard before; instead individuals asked "What if ICE knocks on my door?" "What if my visa expires?" These questions were urgent, immediate, and deeply personal. People wanted to know how to keep themselves safe, whether they should attend their upcoming court dates, and what would happen if ICE came to their home. By the end of the evening, one thing became heart-breakingly clear: legal status no longer guarantees a sense of safety.

What is happening in Little India and throughout Southern California is not about law and order. People who are following the rules- attending their court dates, complying with government orders, staying within legal boundaries- are still being targeted. This is not justice.

South Asians are not exempt from this system. We are part of it and increasingly, victims of it. Immigration is a South Asian issue. It touches our parents, our coworkers, our friends, and our neighbors. The fear is here, and it is real.

Organizations like SAN are doing everything they can by offering legal referrals, know-your-rights trainings, trauma support, and advocacy. But we cannot carry this burden alone. We need greater visibility, stronger solidarity, and a louder collective voice saying: this affects us, too. As South Asians we are taught to care for our community and right now our community is hurting.



"I develop determination and courage in my daily life through the teachings of the Buddha and Indian masters such as Shantideva, whose following aspiration I strive to uphold."

The Dalai Lama, who fled Tibet in March 1959 after a failed uprising against Chinese rule, believes in a 'middle-way' approach, meaning greater autonomy for Tibet rather than outright independence.

The Tibetan monk lives in exile in McLeodganj, a small and quaint hill station on the suburbs of Dharamsala in the northern Indian Himalayas. *IANS* 

# US close to making deal with India, says Trump amid new tariffs announced against 14 nations

WASHINGTON, DC: President Donald Trump said that the US is close to reaching a trade deal with India, even as he announced tariffs on 14 nations.

While speaking to reporters as he hosted Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu at the White House this week, Trump stated that the US had made a deal with the UK and China. He stated that he had sent a letter to the nations that he believed would not make a deal with the US.

When asked about tariffs, Trump responded, "We've spoken to everybody. ...it's all done. I told you we'll make some

We have more than 90... have much more than 90. But most of those are going to be sent to letter. This is exactly what I said. Now we've made a deal with United Kingdom. We've made a deal with China. We're close to making a deal with India. Others we met with and we don't think we're going to be able to make a deal. So we just send them a letter.

"If you want to play ball, ...this is what you have to pay... As far as I'm concerned, we're done. We're sending out letters to various countries telling them how much tariffs they have to pay. Some will maybe

deals, but for the most part, we're going to send a letter. We're going to say, welcome to the United States if you'd like to participate in the greatest, most successful country ever. I mean we are doing better than ever... We've never had numbers like this. We've never had investment like this. adjust a little bit, depending if they have a, cause. We're not going to be unfair about it and actually, it's a small fraction compared to what we should be getting. We should be, we could be asking for much more. But for the sake of relationships that we've had with a lot of really good countries,

we're doing the way I do it. We could be getting a lot more. We could ask for a lot more than what we're asking for," he added.

His remarks came after he announced new tariffs for 14 nations, including Thailand, Myanmar, Bangladesh, South Korea, and Japan, that will take effect on August 1

Earlier, Trump shared letters sent by his administration to 14 countries on his social media platform Truth Social, informing them of the reciprocal tariffs that will take effect from August 1.

Trump first shared the letters sent to Japan's Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba and South Korea's President Lee Jae-myung.

Around two hours later, he announced similar letters were sent to Malaysia, Kazakhstan, South Africa, Myanmar and Laos.

Later, he shared tariff letters sent to leaders of other countries, including Thailand, Bangladesh, Indonesia, Tunisia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Serbia and Cambodia.

Cambodia each will face a tariff of 36 percent while and Bangladesh and Serbia will each be hit with a tariff of 35 percent. In the letters, Trump mentioned that Malaysia and Kazakhstan will each face 25 percent tariffs.

According to the letters, Thailand and

Myanmar and Laos will face a 40 percent tariff on their goods exported to the US. Indonesia will face a tariff rate of 32 percent. Imports from South Africa and Bosnia and Herzegovina will be subject to 30 percent tariffs on August 1. According to the letters, Tunisia will face a tariff of 25 percent. *ANI* 

# BRICS seeking to undermine US interests, will ensure America fairly treated on world stage: White House

WASHINGTON, DC: President Donald Trump believes BRICS is seeking to "undermine" the interests of the United States, and he intends to ensure that America is fairly treated on the world stage, the White House stated.

While addressing a press briefing recently, Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt stated that Trump will take any necessary action to prevent nations from taking "advantage of the US" and its people.

"The president feels, generally speaking, that BRICS is seeking to undermine the interests of the United States. It's the president's utmost responsibility to put the interests of the United States first. That's how he views his job as president. So, he's going to ensure that America is fairly treated on the world stage, and he'll take any action necessary to prevent countries from taking advantage of the United States and our people."

She stated that Trump is "closely monitoring" the BRICS Summit, and he perceives these nations as trying to undermine the US interests. The 17th BRICS Summit, hosted by Brazil in Rio de Janeiro on July 6-7, brought together leaders from

Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa, and new members Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, the UAE, and Indonesia for the meeting.

"He's closely monitoring it (BRICS Summit), which is why he put out a statement himself. He does not perceive these countries as growing stronger. He just perceives them as trying to undermine the United States' interests. And that's not cent tariff on goods.

"Any Country aligning themselves with the Anti-American policies of BRICS, will be charged an ADDITIONAL 10% Tariff. There will be no exceptions to this policy. Thank you for your attention to this matter," Trump posted on Truth Social.

Trump's statement signals a hard stance from the US administration against

okay with him. No matter how strong or weak a country may be."

Her remarks come after Trump issued a strong warning to countries supporting what he termed the anti-American policies of BRICS. In a post shared on Truth Social, Trump stated that any country aligning itself with the "Anti-American policies of BRICS" will face an additional 10 perwhat it sees as growing opposition from BRICS nations. # Baloch Human rights activist becomes victim of forcible detention by Pakistani forces

QUETTA: Several human rights organizations have condemned the detention of Baloch activist Gulzar Dost by Pakistan's Counter Terrorism Department (CTD) amid an ongoing wave of atrocities against people in Balochistan.

Activist of the human rights organization Baloch Yakjehti Committee (BYC), Sammi Deen Baloch, raised alarm over the "forced detention" of Gulzar Dost, who was taken from his home in Turbat, Kech district of Balochistan, in the early hours of Monday (7 July) by the "notorious CTD."

She asserted that this "brazen act is part of a deliberate campaign to suppress Baloch voices and intimidate those who dare to dissent peacefully."

"Cracking down on nonviolent activists like Gulzar Dost sends a clear message to Baloch youth: peaceful resistance will be met with the same violence as militancy. This erases any incentive for dialogue and pushes more young people toward despair or radicalization. Gulzar Dost is known for his commitment to justice through nonviolence. His immediate release and safety must be guaranteed," the BYC leader posted on X.

"If the state truly wants peace in Balochistan, it must stop punishing those who seek change without violence. When every form of resistance is punished

equally, democratic avenues are closed. The state cannot claim to fight militancy while creating the very conditions that sustain it," the post added.

Sammi Baloch called on the Pakistani authorities to immediately produce Gulzar Dost and guarantee his safety.

"The political aspirations of the Baloch people cannot be silenced through force. If Pakistan is serious about peace in Balochistan, it must protect -- not persecute -- those who believe in change through nonviolence," she stated.

# Xi Jinping ditches yet more PLA commanders in ongoing purge

HONG KONG: Last week, a powerful task group comprising the Chinese aircraft carrier Shandong and three escorting warships arrived in Hong Kong to fly the flag as the territory celebrated its handover anniversary. While this naval flotilla certainly reflected the massive investment that Chairman Xi Jinping has poured into the People's Liberation Army (PLA), the Chinese leader continues to winnow commanders and senior officers from among the PLA's ranks.

The PLA, as the armed wing of the Chinese Communist Party (CCP), has proved particularly stubborn in yielding to Xi's uncompromising will and abandoning the chance for personal gain.

In fact, the latest military figure to be culled was Vice Admiral Li Hanjun, Chief of Staff of the PLA Navy (PLAN). Li's dismissal from China's 14th National People's Congress was announced on 27 June 2025. Examining this sacking, Andrew Erikson, Professor of Strategy at the China Maritime Studies Institute, part of the US Naval War College, offered this comment, "Vice Admiral Li Hanjun was a

fast-rising star, terminated before he could make his full contribution and career achievements."

He had only been in the post since April last year. Li had previously served at the Dalian Naval Academy and was commandant of the Naval Command College, suggesting "he was well known and respected across the fleet," Erickson assessed.

# Awami League slams Yunus administration for rising rape incidents in Bangladesh

DHAKA: In a span of nine days, 24 women, including an infant, were raped in Muhammad Yunus-led Bangladesh, according to the Awami League, which added that over 281,000 complaints have piled up and are still "unresolved."

"In just 9 days, 24 women were raped. Among them, a child was raped by a 60-year-old man. These numbers are horrifying, but each number hides a lifetime of pain and trauma," said the Awami League.

According to the former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's party, "Rapists aren't strangers -- they're police officers, teachers, politicians, and many roam free, protected by silence and a broken system."

"Under Yunus's illegal rule, Bangladesh is no longer a safe place for women. Every day, women are raped while the state stays silent. When survivors seek justice, they're humiliated again -- by police questions, invasive medical exams, courtroom cruelty, and society's blaming gaze. In court, survivors are shamed for their clothes and character. Cases drag on for years. Social media adds more wounds, as victims' images spread while rapists remain anonymous," the Awami League stated.

"Laws alone won't save us. We need a social revolution. Women must rise, confront, and demand justice. Men must stand with them. Silence is complicity. As long as leaders like Muhammad Yunus remain in power, nothing will change," it added.

Calling a Bangladeshi woman's body "a battlefield," the party said, "Until the state takes responsibility, this bleeding won't stop. We must challenge the state -- or women will never be safe."

Recently, the Awami League revealed the statistics mentioned that only in June, 63 incidents of rapes were reported, including 17 gang rapes, seven survivors were women/ girls with disabilities, while 19 children and 23 teenage girls were raped.

Additionally, 39 cases of sexual harassment and 51 physical assaults on women were reported.

"These aren't just statistics. They are devastating proof that women and girls in Bangladesh live in constant fear," said the party. IANS





# Trump issues letters, set to impose 25 pc tariffs on Japan, South Korea from Aug 1

WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump started sending out tariff letters to countries, saying he would impose a 25 percent tariff on goods from Japan and South Korea from August 1.

The US President announced the decision on his social media platform, Truth Social, where he posted copies of the letters.

The letters warned Japan and South Korea not to retaliate by increasing their own import taxes, or else the US administration would increase import taxes.

"If for any reason you decide to raise your tariffs, then, whatever the number you choose to raise them by, will be added onto the 25 percent that we charge," Trump said in the letters to Japanese Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba and South Korean President Lee Jae-myung.

"Please understand that the 25 percent number is far less than what is needed to eliminate the Trade Deficit disparity we have with your country," Trump said in both letters, encouraging them to manufacture goods in the United States to avoid tariffs. IANS

### Real estate companies raise 3x more funds in FY25

MUMBAI: The Indian real estate sector has witnessed a remarkable surge in fundraising activity, with the amount of capital raised by companies tripling from Rs 1,09,554 million in FY24 to Rs 3,28,526 million in FY25, a report of 3rd July said.

This sharp increase reflects growing investor confidence and renewed momentum in the sector. Most of the funds were raised in the largecap real estate segment, which attracted Rs 3,93,898 million, according to data compiled by Equirus Capital

Real Estate Investment Trusts (REITs) followed with Rs 3,12,012 million, while smallcap and midcap segments raised Rs 66,938 million and Rs 52,626 million, respectively.

The number of deals also jumped from just five in FY24 to 17 in FY25 -- reflecting strong investor interest in the sector.

The report also highlighted strong performance by REITs in the past year. For the 12-month period ending June 23, REITs delivered a return of 17.9 percent, which is nearly three times higher than the Sensex's return of 6.1 percent.

In comparison, listed companies in the largecap, midcap, and smallcap real estate segments recorded negative returns over the same period. *IANS*

# India's office real estate sector clocks robust growth in H1 2025, GCCs key driver

NEW DELHI: India's office real estate market continues to demonstrate robust growth with gross leasing volume in the top eight cities, reaching 21.4 million square feet (MSF) in the April-June quarter (Q2), reflecting a 5 percent quarter-on-quarter growth, according to a report released 7 July.

With H1 2025 gross leasing now at around 42 msf, the sector is firmly on track to surpass 90 million square feet of annual leasing activity - a new benchmark and a reaffirmation of sustained occupier confidence, the report by Cushman & Wakefield stated.

This momentum follows 2024's historic performance of about 89 million square feet, with H1 2024 figures comparable to this year's. If trends hold, 2025 will mark the second consecutive year of 85+ million square feet of gross leasing, reinforcing a new baseline of market performance, the report added.

Global Capability Centers continued to be a major demand driver, contributing 24 percent of the overall leasing activity in the quarter at 5.1 MSF. Bengaluru (1.6 MSF) and Pune (1.6 MSF) accounted for 63 percent of this leasing. *IANS* 

# US, Japan, Hong Kong drive 89 pc of Q2 foreign inflows in Indian real estate

NEW DELHI: Indian real estate sector received institutional investments of \$1.80 billion in April-June period (Q2 2025), with investors from the US, Japan and Hong Kong contributing around 89 percent to the foreign investments, according to a recent report.

Investments more than doubled in Q2, recording a sharp 122 percent growth over the previous quarter, said the Vestian report.

Foreign investments dominated investment activities in Q2. Interestingly, majority of the investments from the US, Japan and Hong Kong, around 69 percent, were concentrated in commercial assets. Residential properties received only 11 percent of the total investments, whereas the rest were diverted towards diversified properties.

The share of co-investments almost doubled to 15 percent from 8 percent, registering a marginal hike of 2 percent in terms of value.

The shift from direct investments to co-investments by foreign investors' underscores their cautious approach, driven by a desire to mitigate risks amidst uncertain demand due to geopolitical conflicts and macroeconomic instability, said the report.

"Institutional investments saw a strong recovery in Q2 2025, primarily fuelled by a sharp resurgence in commercial real estate activity compared to the previous quarter. While overall inflows remained lower on an annual basis, the substantial quarterly growth reflects renewed investor confidence supported by

robust macroeconomic fundamentals and strong inherent demand," said Shrinivas Rao, FRICS, CEO, Vestian.

This growth momentum is expected to continue as several rating agencies predict economic growth of more than 6 percent during FY 2026.

# Institutional Investment in India's real state up 122% in Q2 2025 (QoQ): Vestian Report

NEW DELHI: The Indian real estate sector received institutional investments of USD 1.80 billion in Q2 2025, an increase of 122 percent from the previous quarter, from global giants like the U.S., Japan and Hong Kong according to a report by real estate consulting firm Vestian.

The report, however, adds that despite investments more than doubling over the previous quarter, a yearly decline of 42 percent is registered from the highest-ever investments recorded in any quarter.

Amid global headwinds, investors from the U.S., Japan, and Hong Kong contributed around 89 percent to the foreign investments recorded in Q2 2025. The majority of the investments from these countries were concentrated in

commercial properties. Residential properties received only 11 percent of the total investments, whereas the rest were diverted towards diversified properties.

However, the share of these countries remained largely stable compared to the same period of the previous year.

The report noted that, while foreign investments dominated investment activities in Q2 2025, its share declined from 71 percent in Q2 2024 to 66 percent in Q2 2025.

In value terms, foreign investments dropped by 46 percent to USD 1.19 billion from USD 2.21 billion. However, the share of co-investments almost doubled to 15 percent from 8 percent in the previous quarter, registering a hike of 2 percent in value terms.

The reports added that the shift of investment pattern from direct investments to co-investments by foreign investors underscores their cautious approach, driven by a desire to mitigate risks amidst geopolitical conflicts and macroeconomic instability.

Shrinivas Rao, FRICS, CEO, Vestian, said, "While overall inflows remained lower on an annual basis, the substantial quarterly growth reflects renewed investor confidence supported by robust macroeconomic fundamentals and strong inherent demand. This growth momentum is expected to continue as several rating agencies predict economic growth of more than 6% during FY 2026. Moreover, the recent reduction in the repo rate is ex-

pected to bolster positive sentiment by reducing borrowing costs and improving credit access for the sector."

Investment by domestic investors accounted for nearly 19 percent of the total investments in Q2 2025, down from 21 percent in the same period last year.

In value terms, domestic investments stood at USD 336 million, about a 47 percent annual decline and a 28 percent decline compared to the previous quarter.

The report says a decline in investments by domestic investors reflects cautious sentiment amid market uncertainty due to geopolitical conflicts and trade uncertainty. ANI

### Brighter night-time light exposure may not be good for your heart

NEW DELHI: Are you in the habit of sleeping with lights on during the night? Beware, a study led by an international team of researchers found that brighter night-time light exposure may increase the risks of five major cardiovascular diseases.

Light at night causes circadian disruption, which is a known risk factor for adverse cardiovascular outcomes. However, it is not well understood whether personal light exposure patterns predict an individual's risk of cardiovascular diseases.

In a study of 88,905 people, yet to be peer-reviewed, researchers from the Flinders Health and Medical Research Institute, along with colleagues in the UK and the US, showed that avoiding exposure to night light may lower the risk of cardiovascular diseases.

The study posted on the preprint site medRxiv, that night light exposure to women more, with stronger associations for heart failure and coronary artery disease. Younger participants were also found at an increased risk for heart failure and atrial fibrillation.

Night light exposure was a significant risk factor for developing cardiovascular diseases. In addition, to current preventative measures, avoiding light at night. IANS

# Covid hospitalization, family history, lifestyle behaviors behind unexplained sudden death: ICMR study

NEW DELHI: Hospitalizations due to severe Covid-19 infection, a family history of sudden deaths, as well as lifestyle behaviors are some of the reasons behind the unexplained sudden death, according to a study led by the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR).

The peer-reviewed study published in the Indian Journal of Medical Research explored factors associated with unexplained sudden deaths among adults aged 18-45 years in India.

It showed that Covid vaccination was not responsible for sudden and unexplained deaths seen among young and healthy individuals.

The study was conducted in 2023, following anecdotal reports of sudden, unexplained deaths in India's apparently healthy young adults, which were linked to Covid-19 infection or vaccination.

"Covid-19 vaccination did not

increase the risk of unexplained sudden death among young adults in India. Past Covid-19 hospitalization, family history of sudden death, and certain lifestyle behaviors increased the likelihood of unexplained sudden death," the researchers said.

Using a multicentric matched case-control model, the researchers included 729 cases and 2,916 controls from 47 tertiary care hospitals across India.

The cases were apparently

healthy individuals aged 18-45 years without any known co-morbidity, who suddenly (were seen apparently healthy 24 hours before death) died of unexplained causes between October 2021 and March 2023.

Four controls were included per case matched for age, gender, and neighborhood.

The team interviewed/perused records to collect data on Covid vaccination or infection and post-Covid conditions, family history of sudden death, smoking, recreational drug use, alcohol frequency and binge drinking, and vigorous-intensity physical activity two days before death/interviews.

"The results showed that receiving at least one dose of Covid-19 vaccine lowered the odds for unexplained sudden death," the researchers said. Two doses, further, lowered the odds of unexplained sudden death. IANS

# Adults who have survived childhood cancer are at high risk of severe COVID 19

STOCKHOLM COUNTY: People who have survived cancer as children are at higher risk of developing severe COVID 19, even decades after their diagnosis.

This is shown by a new study from Karolinska Institutet.

With medical science development in terms of research and technology, more and more children are surviving cancer. However, even long after treatment has ended, health risks may remain. In a new registry study, researchers investigated how adult childhood cancer survivors in Sweden and Denmark were

affected by the COVID 19 pandemic.

The study included over 13,000 people who had been diagnosed with cancer before the

began. They were compared with both siblings and randomly selected individuals from the population of the same gender and year of birth.



age of 20 and who were at least 20 years old when the pandemic

The results show that child-hood cancer survivors had a

lower risk of contracting COVID 19, but were 58 percent more likely to develop severe disease if they did become infected. Severe COVID 19 was defined as the patient receiving hospital care, intensive care or death related to the infection.

"It is important to understand that even though these individuals were not infected more often, the consequences were more serious when they did become ill," says Javier Louro, postdoctoral researcher at the Institute of Environmental Medicine at Karolinska Institutet and first author of the study.

The differences in risk were particularly clear during periods

of high transmission, such as when new virus variants such as Alpha and Omicron spread rapidly. In Sweden, where pandemic management was based more on recommendations than restrictions, the increase in risk was greater than in Denmark, which introduced early and strict measures.

"Our results suggest that childhood cancer survivors should be considered a risk group in future pandemics or other health crises. This could involve prioritizing them for vaccination or offering special protection during periods of high transmission," said Javier Louro. ANI

# US researchers develop AI model improving sudden cardiac death prediction

NEW YORK: US researchers have developed a new artificial intelligence (AI) model that significantly outperforms current clinical guidelines in identifying patients at high risk of sudden cardiac death.

The AI system, known as Multimodal AI for Ventricular

Arrhythmia Risk Stratification (MAARS), integrates cardiac MRI images with a wide range of patient health records to detect hidden warning signs, offering a new level of precision in cardiovascular risk prediction, Xinhua News Agency reported.

The study, published in the journal Nature Cardiovascular Research, focused on hypertrophic cardiomyopathy -- one of the most common inherited heart conditions and a leading cause of sudden cardiac death in young people.

"Currently we have patients dying in the prime of their life because they aren't protected and others who are putting up with defibrillators for the rest of their lives with no

benefit," said senior author Natalia Trayanova, a researcher focused on using AI in cardiology, at Johns Hopkins University.

"We have the ability to predict with very high accuracy whether a patient is at very high risk for sudden cardiac

death or not," Trayanova added.

Clinical guidelines used in the US and Europe currently have an estimated accuracy of only 50 percent in identifying at-risk patients.

In contrast, the MAARS model demonstrated an overall accuracy of 89 percent, and 93 percent for patients aged 40 to 60 -- the group at the greatest risk.

The Al model analyses contrast-enhanced MRI scans for patterns of heart scarring -- something that physicians have traditionally found difficult to inter-

pret. By applying deep learning to this previously underused data, the model identifies key predictors of sudden cardiac death. *IANS*

# Poor heart health may signal gestational diabetes risk in pregnancy: Study

NEW DELHI: Women with poor cardiovascular health may be at a higher risk of developing gestational diabetes and coronary artery calcium (CAC) in midlife, according to a study.

CAC refers to the buildup of calcium deposits in the walls of the coronary arteries, which supply blood to the heart. It is a significant indicator of heart disease risk.

The findings, published in JAMA Cardiology, suggest that gestational diabetes is a marker of pre-pregnancy cardiovascular health. It also underscores the importance of healthcare providers in helping patients improve their cardiovascular health both prior and after pregnancy.

"We need to optimize cardiovascular health early in the life course," said lead author Natalie Cameron, instructor in the Department of Medicine's Division of General Internal Medicine at Northwestern University, US.

In the study, the investigators analyzed patient data originally collected from 1985 to 2010. Of the more than 1,000 participants included in the cohort, the average age was 28.6 years.

All participants had at least one singleton birth and did not have pre-pregnancy

Overall, the investigators found that participants with poor pre-pregnancy cardiovascular health compared to those with better pre-pregnancy cardiovascular health were more likely to have a pregnancy complicated by gestational diabetes and were more likely to develop CAC.

"Patients with gestational diabetes and other adverse pregnancy outcomes should follow up with a primary care provider so we can optimize heart health after pregnancy," Cameron said.

"We need to take a good pregnancy history, ask about lifestyle behaviors such as diet and physical activity, and screen for cardiovascular disease risk factors. Then we can work with patients to help them optimize their heart health throughout their life course," she added.

The researchers also urged revamping postpartum primary care for women with adverse pregnancy outcomes to seamlessly help patients get from obstetrics to a primary care provider. IANS



urekha Murti-Fehr was just 2 when she was diagnosed with acute lymphoblastic leukemia. Her earliest memories are of her treatment at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, losing her hair and watching television with her father, Gopal Murti, Ph.D., the retired director of Scientific Imaging at St. Jude.

She was in treatment for five years.

Since her treatment for cancer, she finished school, got married and had children. And she never forgot the gift of life she was given at St. Jude.

She had thought about becoming a doctor and wanted to work at St. Jude, which leads the way the world understands, treats and defeats childhood cancer and other life-threatening diseases. But life had other plans. She met her husband while an undergraduate in East Tennessee. They married after she earned a doctorate in physical therapy and settled down there.

"I really like physical therapy because of the one-on-one you have with the patients," said Surekha.

She went to work at a private practice helping orthopedic patients with a broad range of musculoskeletal conditions.

But, during the pandemic the certified lymphedema therapists left the practice where she works.

A certified lymphedema therapist works with patients experiencing swelling of the

lymph system, which helps the body fight infections. Her boss asked her if she'd train for that work and promised that if she

They sent her cancer patients.

"Basically, it turned into my whole pro-



didn't like it, she could return to orthope-

It was fine, Surekha said, but she wasn't really "digging it."

Then a local medical provider asked if she could recommend a lymphedema therapist for their patients. She said she'd fession. So, now my practice is only treating breast cancer patients every single day. It's really cool," Surekha said. "Something I didn't think I was going to like at all turned into this and now my dream of helping cancer patients has finally come full

Gopal and his wife, Aruna Murti, are proud parents, but they will never forget how worried they were.

"When she got leukemia, it just killed me. I did not think she was going to survive," Gopal said.

Today, ALL patients treated at St. Jude have a 94% survival rate. That number was significantly lower when Surekha was diagnosed in the early 1980s.

As a child of Lebanese immigrant parents, Danny Thomas founded St. Jude in 1962 to care for some of the world's sickest children regardless of their race, ethnicity, beliefs or ability to pay. Families never receive a bill from St. Jude for treatment, travel, housing or food - so they can focus on helping their child live.

After her treatment, her parents were told to watch for side effects from the treatment that could impact her physical development and delay her intellectual development. They warned her teachers, too, Gonal said.

Instead, Surekha flourished.

"I still worry about her even now," Gopal said. "But I keep it all secret. What she has done is remarkable. Surekha has done exceptionally well at everything."

Surekha no longer lives in Memphis, but said if she were home, she'd want to work

"St. Jude saved my life," she said.

PORT OF SPAIN: Prime Minister Narendra Modi during his visit to Trinidad and Tobago announced the decision to issue Overseas Citizenship of India (OCI) cards up to the sixth generation of the Indian diaspora of Trinidad and Tobago, as noted in the joint statement issued by the Ministry of External Affairs.

The joint statement on PM Modi's official visit to Trinidad and Tobago underlined how May 30, 2025 marks the 180th arrival anniversary of the first Indian immigrants to Trinidad and Tobago.

Both PM Modi and PM Kamla Persad-Bissessar recognized the importance of Nelson Island as a location for Cultural Tourism and the need for Digitization of Indian Arrival and other Records at the National Archives.

"Prime Minister Modi also announced a decision of the Government of India to issue Overseas Citizenship of India (OCI) cards up to the sixth generation of the Indian diaspora of Trinidad and Tobago.", MEA noted.

Significantly, PM Modi also welcomed Trinidad and Tobago's decision to join the Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure (CDRI) and the Global Biofuel Alliance, reflecting their shared commitment to climate action, resilience building, and sustainable development.

As per the MEA, the leaders agreed to explore further collaboration in early warning systems developed by India for disaster risk reduction. # US-based Indian family of 4 killed in car crash

DALLAS: A vacation turned into a devastating tragedy for a family of four from Hyderabad, who died in a horrific car accident in the United States after a mini truck, allegedly speeding in the wrong lane, crashed into their vehicle, causing it to catch fire.

The deceased were identified as Venkat Bejugam, his wife Tejaswini Cholleti, and their two children, Siddarth and Mrida Bejugam.

Originally from the Suchitra area in Secunderabad, the family was residing in Sutton Fields, a community located in Aubrey, near Dallas. Their mortal remains will be brought back home to India for the last rites.

They had been visiting relatives in Atlanta and were returning to Dallas when the tragic accident occurred.

According to reports, the accident occurred when a mini truck collided with their car from the wrong direction, resulting in a head-on collision. The impact caused the vehicle to burst into flames.

All four members of the family suc-

cumbed to burn injuries and died on the

Due to the severity of the burns, US authorities have launched forensic examinations, including verification of dental records and DNA testing, to conclusively establish the identities of the victims before handing over the bodies to the family

Non-profit organization TEAM Aid, which supports expatriates in distress and assists in the repatriation of mortal remains, is currently coordinating with the family and friends of the deceased to provide logistical support.

"The bodies of the deceased will be brought back to Hyderabad for the last rites. DNA tests are being conducted to confirm the identities, and once that process is completed, the remains will be handed over to their relatives," said a member of TEAM Aid.

Further details are awaited as authorities continue the repatriation process and complete formalities related to identification and transportation. *IANS*





"I had the opportunity yesterday to visit Camp Mystic to see firsthand what happened there," said Governor Abbott. "It was nothing short of horrific. We're here in Austin today because there have been lives lost in this greater region. We are broadening the area that we're focused on, but we are not reducing our focus in the Kerrville area. There are dangers over the next 24-48 hours that could pose public safety threats. If there's any water on the road, the most important thing you can do is to protect your lives. Remember: Turn Around, Don't Drown. Texas continues our 24/7 operations to search for anybody who was affected by these deadly storms."

The Governor was joined by Texas Division of Emergency Management Chief Nim Kidd, Texas Department of Public Safety Colonel Freeman Martin, Adjutant General of Texas Major General Thomas Suelzer, Lower Colorado River Authority General Manager Phil Wilson, and other state officials.

During the press conference, Governor

Abbott thanked President Donald Trump for swiftly approving a Major Disaster Declaration. He also commended U.S. Department of Homeland Secretary Kristi Noem for visiting Kerr County yesterday to get critical updates from local officials and first responders so the federal government can keep providing all necessary resources to assist in response and recovery efforts.

## 29 foreign nationals deported from Delhi for illegal stay

NEW DELHI: In a coordinated crackdown on illegal immigration, the Delhi Police on Monday announced the apprehension and deportation of 29 foreign nationals from the capital, who were found residing without valid vi-

Among those deported were 18 Bangladeshi nationals, alongside others from African countries including Nigeria, Liberia, Ivory Coast, Benin, and Tanzania.

The operation carried out in the month of June, was led by the special staff and various police stations under the Dwarka District.

According to officials, of the 29 individuals, 11 were apprehended by the Special Staff, seven by Dabri Police Station, six by the Anti-Narcotics Cell, three by Mohan Garden Police Station. and one each by Uttam Nagar, Dwarka, and AATS units.

In a statement, Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Ankit Singh said the illegal presence of foreign nationals was placing a strain on local resources and public infrastructure.

"Illegally staying foreigners eating upon the resources of the land are reeling under pressure in Dwarka district," he said.

Police said their teams from operational units and local stations had been actively gathering intelligence about foreign nationals residing illegally in the area.

After verifying their documents and establishing that these individuals had either overstayed or entered India without valid visas, action was taken. IANS

# Hundreds of Chinese spouses in Taiwan refuse to give up China citizenship, threatening Taiwan's laws

TAIPEI: About 2,000 Chinese spouses in Taiwan have yet to provide proof of renouncing their household registration in China, immigration officials said, with hundreds reportedly wanting to retain their Chinese citizenship and willing to give up their Taiwanese IDs, Taipei Times reported.

The Mainland Affairs Council (MAC) issued a directive in April requiring Chinese spouses to submit proof of deregistration from China or an affidavit declaring they had done so, with the deadline ending last week. Of the estimated 140,000 Chinese spouses residing in Taiwan, about 10,000 had not completed the process before the deadline, according to an official from the National Immigration Agency

"The NIA sent official letters to 12,146 Chinese spouses under the directive. By the deadline, the MAC had processed over 8,000 submitted documents," the official said in an interview with Taipei Times.

The MAC has outlined six alternative methods for submitting the affidavit or proof and three exemption or deferral conditions. Around 2,000 Chinese spouses

have either submitted alternative documents or applied for exemption or deferral. However, about 2,000 remain uncontacted, many of whom live in China or other countries.

Taipei Times quoted the official saying, "Hundreds of Chinese spouses have expressed unwillingness to renounce their Chinese household registration and citizenship. Some travel frequently between Taiwan and China for work or family reasons. Others cited concerns such as inheritance rights under China's former one-child policy and mortgages on parental homes requiring full payment deregistration."

Some applicants requested extensions to pay off mortgages before completing deregistration but were rejected by the NIA. "The rejection is because it is unfair for some to hold residency in both places to enjoy benefits on both sides," the official added.

Taiwan's law, the Act Governing Relations Between the People of the Taiwan Area and the Mainland Area, prohibits dual household registration, the official said. Those retaining Chinese residency have effectively given up their Taiwanese IDs by not submitting proof of deregistration.

The MAC is coordinating with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and representative offices abroad to contact those living overseas. For those in Taiwan, the NIA is working with social affairs departments and social workers to locate individuals, some of whom may live in remote areas or lack phone access. ANI

# NIA arrests two more 'US donkey route' human traffickers following raids in Himachal, Delhi

NEW DELHI: The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has arrested two 'US donkey route' human traffickers after searches at two locations in Himachal Pradesh and Delhi, the agency said on Saturday.

The accused, identified as Sunny alias Sunny Donker of Dharamshala in Himachal Pradesh's Kangra district and, Shubham Sandhal alias Deep Hundi of Ropar in Punjab, and currently residing in Delhi's Peeragarhi, were associates of Gagandeep Singh alias Goldy, arrested earlier in March. They were arrested on Friday.

NIA said Gagandeep was arrested on a complaint of a victim who was illegally trafficked to the US using the infamous 'Dunki' route and was deported back to India in February this year.

NIA had chargesheeted Gagandeep, a resident of Tilak Nagar in New Delhi, in the case on June 27.

As per NIA investigations, Gagandeep Singh used to take around Rs 45 lakh from each victim on the pretext of sending them to the US on a valid legal visa. "He would then illegally send them on an arduous journey via multiple countries, including Spain, El Salvador, Guatemala and Mexico," said the NIA.

He had sent more than 100 victims illegally to the US in this manner before being arrested.

Sunny was the main associate of Gagandeep Singh and played a key role in facilitating the journey of the victims on the donkey route.

"The victims were physically and mentally harassed on the way by the donkers and agents seeking to make more money". ANI

# Bangladesh seeks details from Malaysia on 36 nationals arrested for IS links

DHAKA: Bangladesh has sought the identities and case details of 36 Bangladeshi nationals recently arrested in Malaysia for their involvement in a radical movement and bringing extremist beliefs based on the Islamic State (IS) ideology into the Southeast Asian country.

"The government of Bangladesh is closely monitoring the developments, and the Bangladesh High Commission in Kuala Lumpur is in close communication with the relevant Malaysian authorities," Bangladesh's Foreign Ministry said in a recent statement.

"The Bangladesh High Commission will extend necessary support to the expatriate Bangladeshis wherever needed. Of the arrested/detained individuals, formal charges have been filed against five in Malaysian courts. The rest are in the process of either further investigation

or deportation," the statement added.

Addressing reporters, the Malaysian Inspector General of Police Datuk Seri Mohd Khalid Ismail stated that the Bangladeshi nationals apprehended on June 27 had raised funds to support Islamic State (IS) cells in Syria and Bangladesh.

"We are still investigating the total funds collected by the group. We believe they collected funds through membership fees and donations from members. We believe they have between 100 to 150 members in their WhatsApp group. Initial investigations revealed each member is required to pay a Malaysian Ringgit RM500 yearly membership fee. However, the amount of donations given is up to the members," leading Malaysian daily 'The Star' quoted the senior police official as saying. *IANS*

# India's Trade Hesitancy Can Undermine Global And Regional Standing

ndia's global trade posture is facing its most complex test in years. #### The China Constraint

Even as India talks up self-reli-

ance and diversification, it remains deeply dependent on China for key inputs. In FY2024-25, bilateral trade exceeded \$110 billion, with China remaining India's top supplier of electronics, industrial machinery, and active pharmaceutical ingredients.

A sharp 60% drop in Chinese rare earth exports this April disrupted Indian electric vehicle manufacturing-highlighting just how brittle alternative supply routes still are. Despite diplomatic friction, India lacks the industrial depth to delink quickly from China, and substituting imports from Vietnam or Africa will require years of policy commitment and logistical overhaul.



# **BRICS** and the Shifting Sands of Global Power:

# Can it Evolve into a Credible Counterweight to Western Dominance?

M A HOSSAIN

n geopolitics, symbolism and substance often march hand in hand. The recent BRICS summit in Brazil is a case in point. While Western media largely reduced the event to a footnote, dismissing it as just another gathering of emerging economies, the joint declaration issued by the BRICS bloc signals something far more profound: the slow but undeniable erosion of Western hegemony and the ascent of a multipolar world order.

The BRICS declaration underscores what is increasingly selfevident: multipolarity is no longer an aspiration; it is a geopolitical fact. For decades, the world has operated under a system shaped by the neoliberal values of the so-called "Washington Consensus," a system that has too often unhindered delivery of humanitarian aid. It is a position that flies in the face of Western double stan-

The contrast is instructive. When Russia invaded Ukraine. the West was quick to mobilize outrage, sanctions, and military aid. Yet when Israel's bombardment of Gaza results in mass civilian casualties, the Western response is often muted, mealymouthed, or altogether absent. BRICS has rightly pointed out this hypocrisy, calling for adherence to international law and the dignity of all people, regardless of political alliances.

This is not merely rhetoric. The call for Palestinian self-determination harks back to the spirit of the Bandung Conference of 1955 where post-colonial na-

served as a thin veil for neocolonial exploitation. Today, that consensus is fracturing, and BRICScomprising Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa, and now expanding to include new members like Indonesia-is emerging as one of the architects of this change

#### Palestine: A Stand Long Overdue

One of the most striking features of the BRICS declaration was its unequivocal support for Palestinian statehood based on the 1967 borders, with East Jerusalem as the capital. The bloc called for an immediate and unconditional ceasefire in Gaza, the withdrawal of Israeli forces, the release of hostages, and the

tions gathered to assert their right to chart their own course free from imperial domination. In this regard, BRICS is not creating a new path but reviving an old one-one the world sorely needs to revisit.

#### Standing Against Economic Coercion:

Equally significant was the BRICS condemnation of U.S. protectionism and unilateral economic measures that bypass the United Nations and undermine global stability. By denouncing tariffs, non-tariff barriers, and socalled "green protectionism," the bloc has shone a spotlight on the selective application of rules that have long skewed global trade in favor of advanced economies.

Historically, the West has preached free trade while practicing protectionism when convenient. The United States, once the greatest advocate of open markets, has in recent years weaponized tariffs as part of its broader geopolitical strategy, from the Trump administration's trade war with China to the Biden administration's continuation of restrictive policies under the guise of national security and environmental protection.

BRICS's call for reforming the World Trade Organization (WTO)-including restoring its dispute settlement mechanismunderscores a collective frustration among developing nations that the current system serves the powerful at the expense of the vulnerable. This is not mere economic discontent; it is a clarion call for fairness.


#### The Ghosts of Interventionism

The bloc's demand for Israel to withdraw from occupied Syrian territory and its condemnation of terrorist activities in the region highlights another crucial theme: the defense of state sovereignty. Western interventions-from Iraq to Libya-have left behind a trail of shattered states and human misery, often under the pretense of democratization or humanitarian intervention. BRICS is positioning itself as an alternative voice, one that prioritizes sovereignty, nonintervention, and dialogue over military adventurism.

The recent lifting of unilateral sanctions on Syria-welcomed by BRICS-points to a recognition that punitive measures often do more harm to civilian populations than to the regimes they target. It is a nuanced position that echoes the failures of past Western interventions and the urgent need for more balanced approaches.

# RICH NATION POOR **HEALTHCARE**

he fight is over: Republicans' sweeping bill to cut taxes and slash benefit programs like Medicaid was passed by Congress and is already signed by the President. Democrats were unified in opposition to the bill in the House and Senate, calling it an assault on healthcare and nutritional assistance. The bill would make deep cuts to Medicaid, leaving nearly 12-million Americans uninsured and, knock 2 million people off the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance food program.

"People will die. Tens of thousands, year after year after year, as a result of the Republican assault on the healthcare of the American people," said Jeffries who spoke for more than eight-and-a-half hours.

The bill is projected to eliminate insurance coverage for between 12-million and 20-million people over the next decade, according to two estimates. Republicans or Democrats alike, for last many decades they were not able to build or provide basic universal healthcare for its citizens besides being one of the richest and most developed country in the world.

In contrast, India's healthcare landscape is a mix of public and private initiatives with the government playing a significant role in providing affordable healthcare to those eligible. The government's flagship program Ayushman Bharat, aims to achieve Universal Health Coverage (UHC) by providing financial protection and healthcare access to vulnerable populations. The program will offer comprehensive primary healthcare services, including preventive, promotive, and curative care, with a focus on maternal and child health, non-communicable diseases. and palliative care. The health insurance scheme provides coverage of up to 5-lakh INR per family, per year, for secondary and tertiary care hospitalization, targeting around 500 million beneficiaries. The National Health Scheme focuses on strengthening primary and secondary healthcare infrastructure, particularly in rural areas.

India is also leveraging digital technologies to enhance healthcare accessibility and efficiency through initiatives like the Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission (ABDM) and telemedicine platforms. While India has made significant strides in healthcare, challenges remain, including ensuring high-quality care, addressing affordability concerns, and building capacity within the healthcare workforce.

European healthcare models can generally be categorized into two main types: The Beveridge model and the Bismarck model. The Beveridge model relies on public funding through taxation to provide healthcare, with services often free at the point of use. The Bismarck model, on the other hand, utilizes a system of social insurance, often funded by employers and employees, with insurance funds managing healthcare provision.

The Beveridge Model (National Health Service) funds primarily through general taxation, and services are largely provided by the government via public institutions and government-employed healthcare professionals. Generally, healthcare is free at the point of use for all residents. Mainly in United Kingdom, Spain, Scandinavia. The Bismarck Model relies on social insurance contributions from employers and employees and Insurance funds, often non-profit, manage healthcare provisions, typically, residents are insured through these funds and may have access to both public and private providers. Example: Germany, France and Belgium.

Why do many Americans including India's Diaspora, travel all the way to India, Singapore or even Thailand, to get their Eye, Dental or other elective surgeries done, in spite of living in the most developed country. Is something wrong with our healthcare system?





It is surrounded by the protected areas of Mudumalai in Tamil Nadu as well as Nagarhole and Bandipur in Karnataka. Founded in the year 1973, the wildlife sanctuary is an integral part of the Nilgiri Biosphere Reserve which was the first biosphere out of the 14 present in India.

Meenmutty Falls: Located 29 km away from Kalpetta in Wayanad district, Meenmutty waterfalls is considered as one of the largest waterfalls in the

> Kalpetta region and the second largest Kerala. It is also one of the most thrilling and beautiful natural attractions in Wayanad. Nestled away in the lap of a jungle trek, the cascading waterfall Meenmutty

makes up for a dazzling view.

Soochipara Falls: Also known as Sentinel Rock Waterfalls. Soochipara Falls is a three-tiered waterfall situated in Vellarimala, Wayanad. Surrounded by deciduous, evergreen and montane forests, this waterfall is regarded as one of the best waterfalls.


