

The 20th session of the Committee is being held at the iconic Mughal-era monument from December 8 to 13. This is also the first time India is hosting a session of the UNESCO panel.

India currently has 15 elements inscribed on UNESCO's Intangible Cultural Heritage list, including the Kumbh Mela, Kolkata's Durga Puja, Gujarat's Garba, Yoga, Vedic chanting, Ramlila, Ramman, and Kutiyattam. With Deepavali's inclusion, India's cultural prestige on the global stage gains a significant boost. *IANS*



The India Al Summit's agenda is organized around seven thematic pillars, known as the 'seven Chakras': Human Capital, Inclusion, Safe & Trusted AI, Resilience, Innovation and Efficiency, Democratizing Al Resources, and Al for Economic Development and Social Good.

"Not conducive to regional peace": US critiques China's use of radar on Japanese jets

WASHINGTON DC: The US has for the first time criticized the Chinese military's use of radar on Japanese fighter jets last week, as Tokyo refuted Beijing's claims it had given sufficient advance notice of military drills near Japan, The Japan Times reported.

"China's actions are not conducive to regional peace and stability," a State Department spokesperson told The Japan Times via email recently. "The US-Japan Alliance is stronger and more united than ever. Our commitment to our ally Japan is unwavering, and we are in close contact on this and other issues."

The criticism was the first comment by US President Donald Trump's administration following the Saturday's incident that saw Chinese fighters dispatched from the Liaoning aircraft carrier twice illuminate Air Self-Defense Force jets with radar, maneuvers that Tokyo has lambasted as "dangerous," as per The Japan Times.

ber 7 remarks that the Self-Defense Forces could be deployed under certain "worst-case" scenarios, such as a Chinese naval blockade of Taiwan, which she said would constitute a "survival-threat-

The radar incident comes as Tokyo and Beijing remain embroiled in an increasingly acrimonious dispute following Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi's Novemening situation" for Japan.

Trump himself has yet to publicly weigh in on either the radar incident or Takaichi's comments, frustrating Japanese officials, who have reportedly urged Him to offer Tokyo greater public support amid tensions with Beijing.

But with Trump eager to seal a trade deal with Chinese leader Xi Jinping during a planned state visit to Beijing in April, his administration has largely shied away from moves that could alienate China.

Japan's top government spokesman welcomed the State Department's comments, saying they "demonstrate the strength of the US-Japan alliance," as per The Japan Times.

But Chief Cabinet Secretary Minoru Kihara also explicitly noted that "gaining other countries' understanding" in Japan's dispute with China remains "extremely important." ANI

Sindhi leader appeals to PM Modi over Pakistan's extremist-controlled nuclear arsenal

BERLIN: Shafi Burfat, Chairman of the Jeay Sindh Muttahida Mahaz (JSMM), urged Prime Minister Narendra Modi to raise the issue of what he described as Pakistan's "extremist-controlled nuclear arsenal" at international forums and draw global attention to Islamabad's state-sponsored terrorism and radicalization.

In a detailed appeal Burfat said, "With deep respect and an unshakable commitment to peace, dignity, and regional stability, I submit this comprehensive appeal on behalf of the people of Sindh, an ancient civilization, a distinct nation, and a people who today stand at the frontline of suffering under Pakistan's militarized, extremistdriven, and structurally artificial state sys-

"This appeal is not merely a political statement. It is a warning. It is an alarm for humanity. It is the voice of a nation struggling to survive under an oppressive, radicalized, and dangerously unstable state," he added.

Burfat argued that Pakistan's Sindh province faces a grave existential threat under the country's "extremist, militarized, and fundamentally corrupt state structure". With Pakistan's "radicalized, jihadist-influenced military elite" controlling nuclear weapons through opaque and irresponsible command systems, he warned that the country represents not only a danger to Sindh but a destabilizing force for the wider region and the world.

Expressing concern, Burfat stated that the escalating nuclear danger under Pakistan's "radicalized" army is no longer about whether extremist groups might seize nuclear weapons. IANS

India's exports at all-time high despite global uncertainties

NEW DELHI: India's total exports of goods and services surged to a record high of \$418.91 billion during April-September 2025 of the current financial year to register a 5.86 percent annual increase as the strong momentum of the previous financial year, that ended on March 31, continued into the new fiscal year, according to a yearend review recently released by the Commerce Ministry.

"Remarkably, India's trade performance in the first half (H1) of FY 2025-26 is the highest ever export achievement in spite of persisting global uncertainties," the review states.



The robust performance follows the country's landmark achievement of total exports of merchandise and services scaling an all-time high of \$825.25 billion in 2024-25, reflecting a robust 6.05 percent growth over the previous financial year.

India's services sector continued to drive India's overall export momentum, achieving a record \$387.54 billion in 2024-25, a strong 13.63 percent growth. This upward trajectory remained firmly intact in the current fiscal year, with services exports rising to \$199.03 billion during April-September 2025, registering a 9.34 percent increase over the same period last year.

India's merchandise exports remained steady in 2024-25 at \$437.70 billion, while non-petroleum exports surged to a historic \$374.32 billion, recording a 6.07 percent growth. The positive trend continued in the current fiscal year, with merchandise exports rising to \$219.88 billion during April-September 2025, an increase of 2.90 percent over the same period last year, the review further states. *IANS*

Amazon, Microsoft, Google bet big on India with huge \$67.5 billion total investments

NEW DELHI: India is rapidly emerging as one of the world's most attractive destinations for artificial intelligence (AI) investments, with three global technology giants Amazon, Microsoft and Google have announced \$67.5 billion commitments to build the country's digital future.

A young population, affordable data and a fast-growing digital ecosystem are helping transform India into a major

hub for AI-led innovation, drawing unprecedented interest from companies like Amazon, Microsoft and Google.

US e-commerce leader Amazon has unveiled plans to invest more than \$35 billion in India by 2030, strengthening what it calls its three strategic pillars -- Al-driven digitization, export growth and job creation.

The company said its investments will expand AI capabilities, improve logistics infrastructure and support lakhs of small businesses across the country.

Microsoft has announced an equally ambitious move, committing \$17.5 billion over four years (2026-2029) to scale up cloud and Al infrastructure, expand skilling programs, and strengthen sovereign-ready digital capabili-

ties across India.

The announcement followed CEO Satya Nadella's meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who said India's youth will harness this opportunity to "innovate and leverage the power of AI for a better planet".

He also said that the country is on track to become the world's largest developer community by 2030.

Highlighting the country's growing talent and its emerg-

ing leadership in nextgeneration Al innovation, Nadella said, "India is projected to have 57.5 million developers by 2030, making it the largest developer base globally."

Google has also made a major commitment, announcing a \$15 billion investment to build a worldclass AI hub in Visakhapatnam (Vizag).

In partnership with AdaniConneX and Airtel, Google will develop India's largest AI data center campus, powered by clean energy and supported by a subsea cable network.

Experts say the investment marks a shift in India's tech map beyond Bengaluru and Hyderabad, potentially giving the country a new global-scale innovation center on its east coast. *IANS*

'Airline turmoil hits national economy': Delhi HC pulls up Centre over IndiGo crisis

NEW DELHI: The Delhi High Court pulled up the Union government over the widespread cancellations and delays of Indigo flights, asking why the situation was allowed to precipitate into a nationwide turmoil that stranded lakhs of passengers and inflicted losses on the national economy.

A bench of Chief Justice Devendra Kumar Upadhyaya and Justice Tushar Rao Gedela, while hearing a public interest litigation (PIL) seeking an independent judicial probe into the episode, remarked that the crisis is not confined to causing inconvenience to passengers but also affects the economy of the country.

"We appreciate the steps taken by the Union Ministry of Civil Aviation and DGCA (Directorate General of Civil Aviation). However, what bothers us is how such a situation was allowed to precipitate, leaving lakhs of passengers unattended at airports. Such a situation is not confined to causing inconvenience to the passengers but also affects the economy of the country, as in the present day, fast movement of passengers is an important aspect to keep the economy functioning," the CJ Upadhyaya-led Bench observed in its order.

During the hearing, the Delhi High Court asked the Centre to explain the legal provisions available to act against errant airlines.

Referring to powers vested in the DGCA and the Centre under the Bharatiya Vayuyan Adhiniyam, the bench asked: "In case an airline fails to adhere to directions, what

is the provision available to you? Are you helpless? We want to know under which provision or policy decision you would take action against them?"

In response, Additional Solicitor General Chetan Sharma, who appeared for the Centre government, submitted that a high-level committee had been constituted and that the DGCA had issued a show-cause notice to Indigo, which had "apologized profusely".

The law officer added that fare caps were imposed within two days of the crisis. *IANS*

Delhi HC directs government to consider Belgian citizen's application for Exit visa

NEW DELHI: The Delhi High Court has directed the Central Government to consider the application of a Belgian citizen and academician, Wim Evert K. Lauwaert, who is seeking an exit visa.

An FIR was lodged against him in 2023 for allegedly participating in a hunger strike in Ladakh. His visa has already expired.

Justice Sachin Datta directed the Central Government to consider the application for an Exit visa.

The court noted that, as per the status report filed by the respondents, he has already been granted bail.

The court further noted that



there is nothing against him except that he stood in a hunger strike in 2023. Though, as per the police, the investigation is not completed

Meanwhile, the court agreed that the petitioner shall join the investigation virtually and there will be an interaction between him and the investigation officer. The court said, to finish the investigation within one week.

The court said that thereafter, the government shall take action to grant him an exit permit or to extend his visa.

While issuing the notice to the Central Government on December 1, the high court had directed the respondents to decide the petitioner's Exit Permit application of October 3 under intimation to the petitioner.

"Till the same is done, no coercive steps shall be taken against the petitioner," the high court had directed.

The petitioner, a Belgian citizen and an academician, filed a petition asserting that he has been stranded in India for over a period of two months post expiration of his E-visa, despite no fault of his own.

It was submitted that the petitioner has made every possible bonafide effort to secure an Exit Permit from FRRO, however, to no avail.

It was also submitted that the petitioner works in Bhutan on a valid work permit to conduct academic programs, develop and support outreach initiatives that promote international understanding between the citizens of Belgium and other nationalities.

It was further submitted that the petitioner travels to India frequently as a middle point between his travel to and from Belgium to Bhutan, as there are no direct flights from Bhutan to Europe. For the same purpose, he entered India on November 19 to use the Indira Gandhi International Airport, Delhi, for the purpose of his return journey to Belgium.

The counsel for the petitioner further submitted that the petitioner was prevented from undertaking the aforesaid travel and was not allowed to board the flight that was due to depart from Delhi, on the pretext that his visa was due to expire that very night. Due to this, the petitioner was stranded in India. *ANI*

US Senator flags H-1B abuse, raising questions for Indian tech talent

WASHINGTON: A senior US lawmaker urged the Trump Administration to intensify federal scrutiny of corporate use of H-1B visas, warning that major American technology firms are laying off domestic workers even as they continue recruiting thousands of foreign professionals - a trend with direct implications for Indian engineers who make up the single largest group of H-1B beneficiaries.

In a letter to Labor Secretary Lori Chavez-DeRemer, US Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) Director Joseph Edlow, and Attorney General Pam Bondi, Senator Ruben Gallego said high-skilled immigration must

place US employees, especially as the American dream continues to grow further out of reach for young people."

Citing internal data and federal research, Gallego said, "large technology corporations have laid off hundreds of thousands of workers." At the same time, "in fiscal year 2025, these same companies were approved to hire over 30,000 foreign H-1B workers." He noted that unemployment among young American tech workers remains elevated, even as employers continue filing visa petitions for foreign recruits - a contradiction, he said, that deserves urgent review by labor, immigration, and enforcement agencies.

"High-skilled immigration programs, when designed, implemented, and enforced appropriately, spur economic growth that creates good-paying jobs for American workers," Gallego wrote

advance economic growth without becoming a channel to "undercut or replace US employees." He argued that the pattern of mass layoffs followed by continued H-1B hiring has raised "important questions" about how large corporations are deploying the program.

"High-skilled immigration programs, when designed, implemented, and enforced appropriately, spur economic growth that creates good-paying jobs for American workers," Gallego wrote. "At the same time, we must ensure such programs are not used to undercut or re-

sharp decline in the representation of the youngest employees at major U.S. technology firms.

The senator pointed to a

workforce in January 2023. By July 2025, that number had dropped to 6.7 percent." He said the figures show "there are young American workers eager to be trained for and to fill these roles."

Gallego added that the pressure facing Gen Z extended well beyond the workplace. According to the analysis he cited, "over 13 percent of unemployed Americans in July were new entrants into the workforce or jobseekers with no prior work experience, who tend to be Gen Z." *IANS*

India officially resumed issuing tourist visas to Chinese nationals worldwide in November 2025, expanding on a limited reopening that began in July 2025. Business visas were already being issued prior to this recent announcement, and that process remains in place.

The resumption of visas is part of a series of "people-centric" confidence-building measures agreed upon by both sides in 2025, which also included the resumption of direct commercial flights in October 2025 and the revival of the Kailash Manasarovar Yatra pilgrimage.

This decision is expected to boost tourism and trade and enhance people-to-people exchanges between the two most populous countries in the world. *ANI*

Expect China to assure that Indian travellers will not be selectively targeted, detained or harassed: MEA

NEW DELHI: India has said it expects the authorities in China to provide assurances that Indian citizens transiting through Chinese airports will not be selectively targeted, arbitrarily detained or harassed.

The strong statement came after an Indian national from Arunachal Pradesh was arbitrarily detained by Chinese authorities at the Shanghai International Airport last month, an incident which was termed by New Delhi as a clear violation of international norms and bilateral understanding.

"We expect the Chinese authorities to provide assurances that Indian citizens transiting through Chinese airports will not be selectively targeted, arbitrarily detained or harassed and that regulations governing international air travel would be respected by the Chinese side," Randhir Jaiswal, the spokesperson for the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) stated during a weekly media briefing in New Delhi recently.

"The MEA would advise Indian nationals to exercise due discretion while travelling to China or while transiting through the country," he added.

Prema Wangjom Thongdok, an Indian citizen hailing from Arunachal Pradesh, had alleged that she was detained for 18 hours by the Chinese immigration officials during what was supposed to be a brief three-hour layover while travelling from London to Japan on November 21.

She said that the officials refused to accept her Indian passport, claiming her birthplace, Arunachal Pradesh, was "part of China".

Following the shocking incident, India had strongly taken up the matter with the Chinese side.

"Chinese authorities have still not been able to explain their actions, which are in violation of several conventions governing international air travel. The actions by the Chinese authorities also violate their own regulations that allow visa free transit up to 24 hours for nationals of all countries," the MEA stated on November 25. *IANS*

India's rising incomes making homes more affordable: Report

NEW DELHI: India's fast-rising incomes have made buying a home far more affordable over the past decade and a half, with the country's price-to-income ratio dropping sharply from 88.5 in 2010 to 45.3 in 2025, as per new report. As average income levels have grown more than fourfold -- rising at around 10 percent annually -- housing prices have increased at a much slower pace of 5-7 percent a year, data compiled by Colliers India showed. *IANS*

Smart City Mission: 7,741 projects worth Rs 1,55,386 crore completed, 323 projects ongoing



NEW DELHI: The Smart City Mission (SCM) has seen 7,741 projects (96 percent of total projects) amounting to Rs 1,55,386 crore being completed, and the remaining 323 projects amounting to Rs 9,425 crore are currently ongoing (as on December 1, 2025), the Parliament was informed.

The mission had undertaken 8,064 projects amounting to Rs 1,64,811 crore in 100 cities.

"Under the SCM, the Central government had a total outlay of Rs 48,000 crore for the 100 cities. As reported by states/UTs, as on 01.12.2025, the cities have been able to claim Central Financial Assistance of Rs 47,458 crore (99 percent of the total Central share allocation)," Union Minister of State for Housing and Urban Affairs Tokhan Sahu told

the Rajya Sabha in a reply to a question.

The states/UTs are reported to have utilized Rs 46,093 crore (97 percent of the total Central share claimed), the minister added.

Meanwhile, post the financial closure of SCM on March 31, 2025, there is no budgetary outlay under the Mission, the minister said.

The ministry issued an advisory in June 2025 to all states/ UTs, outlining the envisioned future role of SPVs and a roadmap for the continued functioning of Integrated Command and Control Centres (ICCCs).

As per the advisory, all Special Purpose Vehicles (SPVs) are requested to ensure the timely completion of all ongoing SCM projects and prepare operation and maintenance plans for the assets created. Further, the advisory underscores the repurposing of SPVs to meet emerging urban challenges. *IANS*

Rate cut to boost housing demand as home loans to get cheaper

MUMBAI: The Reserve Bank of India's decision to cut the repo rate by 25 basis points to 5.25 per cent is expected to give a strong push to housing demand, especially in the affordable and mid-income segments, as home loan EMIs are likely to come down in the coming weeks.

Announcing the monetary policy decision on Friday, RBI Governor Sanjay Malhotra said the MPC voted unanimously for the rate cut to support growth in the economy.

He said the sharp fall in inflation to 1.7 per cent and the strong 8.2 per cent GDP growth in the

second quarter had created a "Goldilocks period" that gave the central bank room to ease rates.

Real estate developers and consultants welcomed the move, saying it would improve affordability and encourage fence-sitters to finally buy homes.

Anshuman Magazine, Chair-

man & CEO - India, South-East Asia, Middle East & Africa at CBRE, said the rate cut reflects the RBI's focus on boosting consumption in a low-inflation environment.

He said lower rates are likely to push banks to transmit earlier cuts more aggressively and support demand across real estate segments.

"For real estate, this is expected to boost the demand and strengthen investment sentiment across segments. For home loan borrowers, this might bring a tangible relief as floating-rate EMIs will ease," he added. *IANS*

Indian households expect ease in inflation pressures to continue: RBI survey

NEW DELHI: Indian households are anticipating a notable softening in inflation expectations for the next three months and one year ahead, the Reserve Bank of India's latest Households' Inflation Expectations Survey showed.

The RBI released the results of November 2025 round of its bi-monthly inflation expectations survey of households on Friday evening. The survey was conducted during November 1-10, 2025, in 19 major cities, with 6,061 responses.

Households' perception of the current median inflation declined significantly by 80 basis points (bps) to 6.6 per cent in comparison to the previous round.

Households reported easing of price and inflationary pressures in most of the product groups including food products, non-food products, and cost of services for both the time horizons. The RBI survey found that fewer households now anticipate price increases across key segments such as food, non-food items, housing, household durables, and services.

For instance, the share of respondents expecting food prices to rise in the next three months fell to 74.9 per cent in November, down from 79 per cent in September, while those anticipating price increases in non-food products declined to 67.8 per cent, compared to 73.4 per cent in

The RBI survey found that fewer households now anticipate price increases across key segments such as food, non-food items, housing, household durables, and services



Alongside, their inflation expectations for the next three months and one year ahead also experienced notable softening by 50 bps and 70 bps to 7.6 per cent and 8.0 per cent respectively, RBI said.

"For both short term and one year ahead periods, the shares of respondents anticipating rise in both general prices and inflation maintained its declining trend," the central bank survey found.

Longer-term expectations show a similar pattern.

One-year-ahead expectations of price increases also dropped across categories, with general inflation expectations falling to 83.6 per cent in November, from 86.8 per cent in September.

Raipur-Vizag corridor poised to propel growth across 3 states

NEW DELHI: The upcoming 6-lane greenfield Raipur-Visakhapatnam Economic Corridor is poised to cut travel time between the two cities from 12 hours to 5 hours and boost economic development on the route between them as the project heads for completion in December 2026.

The corridor, being developed by the Ministry of Road Transport & Highways, stretches across the forests of

Chhattisgarh, the mineral-rich landscapes of Odisha, and the hills of Andhra Pradesh. Being built at a total cost of Rs 16,482 crore, it is set to cut down the distance from 597 km with the existing NH-26 to 465 km, saving 132 km in distance and nearly seven hours of travel time, which will generate major fuel savings and reduced

transportation costs for public and freight operators.

What once took 12 hours will soon just take 5 hours and will open the gates to faster logistics and seamless connectivity under the PM Gati Shakti vision. Industries in Chhattisgarh and Odisha, too, will get a major boost as they will directly be linked to the Visakhapatnam Port and the Chennai-Kolkata National Highway. This would mean

improved connectivity to ports and industrial hubs, quicker exports, smoother supply chains and a powerful push for trade, leading to a huge boost for logistics efficiency. The corridor will also promote tourism and stimulate economic growth through job creation and real estate development, according to a statement issued by the ministry.

For truckers who spend nights away from home, farm-

ers who anxiously wait for their produce to reach markets, and families seeking avenues of new opportunities, this corridor feels like a path towards a more hopeful fufure

Vishal, a lorry owner who regularly transports goods from Raipur to Visakhapatnam, says the new

corridor will drastically change the way transporters operate. "Earlier, the journey took one and a half days. Now, I can start during the day and reach the destination by night," he says. The reduction in distance, he says, will directly translate into lower diesel consumption and less wear and tear on trucks, bringing tangible financial relief to operators like him. *IANS*

Mumbai's Worli accounts for 40 pc of ultra luxury residential transactions

NEW DELHI: Worli in the Mumbai Metropolitan Region has become the epicenter of India's wealth concentration, accounting for 40 percent of the country's ultra-high-net-worth residential transactions, commanding prices that rival global peers, a report said.

The growth is supported by an over Rs 69,000 crore infrastructure ecosystem, and fed by an incoming pipeline of projects worth over Rs 36,000 crore, the report from ANAROCK and 360 One Wealth said.

The area saw more than 30 homes priced above Rs 40 crore each sold in just 24 months, totaling over Rs 5,500 crore, with a transaction velocity that redefines India's residential real estate pecking order.

"Forty percent of India's entire ultra?luxury apartment market is now Worli. Across the entire country from Bangalore's sprawling tech corridors to Delhi's power pockets - Worli accounts for nearly half of all transactions exceeding Rs 40 crore," ANAROCK Group Chairman Anuj Puri said.

"The momentum is only accelerating. The area witnessed one of India's costliest apartment transactions - 2 duplexes sold for over Rs 700 crore in 2025. Over the past three years, Worli closed over 20 residential deals individually priced above Rs 100 crore," he said.

Premium tower apartments in Worli now trade at Rs 65,000 to Rs 1 lakh plus per sq. ft., equivalent to New York's Lower Manhattan.

The price-to-size breakdown showed that apartments under 1,000 square feet cost below Rs 8 crore. Ultra?premium residences above 4,000 square feet cost over Rs 32 crore, the report said.

"Two decades of relentless development have transformed a largely nondescript industrial zone into a curated lifestyle ecosystem. There are nearly 4-5 million sq. ft. of premium residential and retail space currently under construction, just at the visible layer of a deeper structural shift," the report noted. *IANS*

Indian-American Sunny Reddy, elected Michigan GOP Co-Chair

WASHINGTON: Indian American entrepreneur and community leader Sunny Reddy was unanimously elected Co-Chair of the Michigan Republican Party, marking a breakthrough moment for the Indian diaspora in one of America's most competitive political battlegrounds.

There were 600 people, all their families, coming up to take a picture of him. So he's like the biggest celebrity in the entire Indian community," he said. Describing Reddy as "the nicest guy I have ever known," he added that he regularly hears of Reddy quietly paying for community needs without seeking attention.

The motion to close nominations and approve Reddy "by unanimous consent" was swiftly accepted, with the room responding in a unified "Aye." The chair declared the result unanimous.

Taking the stage moments later, Reddy spoke emotionally about the moment and what it meant for Indian Americans in Michigan. "Can you believe it? I am the first person to elect for any position as a Republican in Michigan, as an Indian-American, first person," he said to applause. *IANS*

hile federal health programs face cutbacks, California is expanding maternal health protections under MediCal. The state now offers one of the most comprehensive maternal health benefit packages in the country. Pregnant Californians, regardless of immigration status, are eligible for fullscope MediCal during pregnancy and for 12 months postpartum, ensuring continuous care during one of the most critical times in their lives. Yet many families remain unaware that this comprehensive support is available to them, including the many new services and benefits available through the California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal (CalAIM) program. At AcoM briefing held on December 4, officials and medical experts from the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) provided detailed information on relevant policies.

Erica Holmes said California has continuously strengthened maternal and child health care over the past few years, adding numerous benefits to improve healthcare accessibility, reduce racial disparities, and ensure safe healthcare for

port. Officials point out that this extended postpartum coverage policy effectively reduces maternal mortality and helps in the early detection of postpartum depression and changes in physical and mental well-being.

Family PACT program provides contraception, reproductive health testing, sexually transmitted infection testing, cervical cancer screening, and fertility education, and is open to all eligible California residents regardless of immigration status. Family PACT fills the gaps in insurance coverage for many families and is very important for those trying to conceive, those not yet planning to conceive, or those unsure about their family planning.

California has expanded the scope of midwife involvement in childbirth care, allowing licensed nurse midwives and licensed midwives to practice independently, assisting low-risk pregnant women with natural childbirth and providing personalized care. Experts said the midwife model offers more flexible, family-oriented options, allowing pregnant women to avoid relying entirely on traditional hospital delivery.

Last year, an appeal sought USD 85 million in additional funding for new arrivals but fell short. The 2025 Joint Response Plan-launched by the UN and Bangladesh government-requested USD 935 million for 1.48 million refugees and host communities. Yet implementation remains stalled.

Amid this bleak outlook, many Rohingyas attempt to blend into local communities, generating social tensions and security concerns.

ante-thought, or ante-word. The mind, before it is stirred by a thought, is called hua t'ou. Between two thoughts there is a gap, that gap is called hua t'ou.

Watch. One thought passes on the screen of your mind - on the radar screen of your mind one thought passes like a cloud. First it is vague - it is coming, it is coming - then it is there suddenly on the screen. Then it is moving, then it has gone out of the screen, again it becomes vague and disappears . . . another thought comes. Between these two thoughts there is a gap - for a single moment or a split second the screen is without any thought.

That state of pure no-thought is called hua t'ou - ante-words, antethought, before the mind is stirred. Because we are not alert inside, that's why we go on missing it - otherwise meditation is happening each moment. You have just to see it happening, you have just to become aware what treasure you are carrying always within you.

It is not that meditation has to be

afraid of one thing - of not being aware of them, of being delayed in awareness.

When a thought arises, if with the thought your awareness is also there if you can see it arising, if you can see it coming, if you can see it there, if you can see it going - then there is no problem at all. This very seeing, by and by, becomes your citadel. This very awareness brings you many fruits.

Op Sagar Bandhu: Over 2000 patients receive treatment in India's field hospital

COLOMBO: Amid India's relentless relief and rescue efforts under the ongoing Operation Sagar Bandhu, the field hospital set up by it in Sri Lanka's Mahiyanganaya near Kandy has provided medical care to over 2200 patients affected by Cyclone Ditwah.

The Indian medical team has successfully conducted 67 minor procedures and three operations in the field hospital since December 5, according to the statement released by the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA).

"Operation Sagar Bandhu. Providing medial (sic) care and support. The field hospital set up by India in Mahiyanganaya near Kandy, since 5 December has already: Provided much needed medical care to more than 2200 patients affected by Cyclone Ditwah. Successfully conducted 67 minor procedures and 3 operations. Indian medical teams remain committed to delivering timely care to Sri Lankan people," MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal posted on X.

India launched 'Operation Sagar Bandhu' on November 28 to provide urgent search and rescue and Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) support to Sri Lanka. *IANS*

Al-based diagnostic tools boosting TB, diabetes care: Govt

NEW DELHI: The government is leveraging artificial intelligence (AI) to drive transformative change in public health services, especially to tackle the burden of tuberculosis and diabetes across the country, said the Union Minister of State for Health and Family Welfare, Prataprao Jadhav.

In a written reply in the Lok Sabha, Jadhav said that the Ministry of Health has designated AIIMS Delhi, PGIMER Chandigarh, and AIIMS Rishikesh as 'Centre of Excellence (CoE) for Artificial Intelligence' to promote the development and use of AI-based solutions in Health.

"The Ministry has developed Al solutions, including the Clinical Decision Support System (CDSS) in e-Sanjeevani, a Diabetic Retinopathy (DR identification solution), and the Abnormal Chest X-ray Classifier Model,



among others," he added.

MadhuNetrAI (DR identification solution) is an AI solution developed to enable non-specialist health workers to conduct screenings for Diabetic Retinopathy. It automates DR detection by analyzing retinal fundus images using artificial intelligence, ensuring standardized,

accessible, and efficient triage.

It classifies DR across standard grades, enabling optimized resource allocation by prioritizing urgent cases for specialist refer-

"The solution has been implemented across 38 facilities in 11 states and provided AI assistance during screening of

more than 14,000 retinal images, benefiting 7,100 patients," Jadhav said.

Under the Tuberculosis elimination program, 'Cough against TB' (CATB) Al solution is used for screening for pulmonary TB in the community settings. In the deployed geographies, the solution has shown an additional yield of 12-16 percent in TB reported, over patient screenings using conventional methods.

"Between March 2023 and November 30, 2025, the CATB solution has been utilized to screen more than 1.62 lakh individuals," the Minister said.

The 'Clinical Decision Support System' (CDSS) Al solution has been integrated into the national telemedicine platform, eSanjeevani, to enhance consultation quality by streamlining patient complaints entry and providing Al-based differential diagnosis recommendations.

"Since CDSS integration in April 2023 till November 2025, 282 million eSanjeevani consultations have benefited from standardized data capture, ensuring consistency across health and wellness centers," Jadhav said.

Strict adherence to applicable standards and government policies, including AI Governance Guidelines by MeitY, Ethical Guidelines for Application of AI in Biomedical Research and Healthcare by ICMR, Information Technology Act 2000, Digital Personal Data Protection Act 2023, and Rules framed thereunder, and Information Security Policy for Healthcare by the Department of Health and Family Welfare, are ensuring high operational reliability, the MoS said. *IANS*

India needs more skilled surgeons for revision knee, hip replacement surgeries, say experts

NEW DELHI: With a rise in the ageing population in India and failing artificial joints, the demand for skilled surgeons for revision knee and hip surgeries is rising in the country, said experts.

Revision knee or hip replacement surgery, called Revision Arthroplasty, is done when any hip or knee replacement loosens, wears out, or fails.

The artificial knee and hip joints are increasingly being subject to wear and tear, with their lifespan reduced to 20 to 25 years.

"In India, a lot of elderly patients have undergone joint re-



placement, primarily due to a rise in degenerative arthritis, in the last 15-20 years. So, the burden of revision surgeries is going to increase, as the implants can wear off or any infection might occur, or some complication occurs," Prof Vijay Kumar, Department of Orthopedics, from AIIMS, told IANS.

"With the number of ageing implants rising rapidly in India,

the lack of specialized training can lead to premature failures, repeated operations, higher healthcare expenses, and long-term functional challenges for patients," added Dr Samarth Mittal, Additional Professor, Orthopedics, JPNA Trauma Centre, AIIMS, Delhi.

The health experts, speaking on the sidelines of the three-day Revision Arthroplasty Conference (RAC) 2025, noted that revision surgeries are far more complex and a surgically demanding procedure than the primary implant surgery and require additional surgical skills. *IANS*

India now a global success story, with milestones in science, healthcare, space: Jitendra Singh

NEW DELHI: India is now a global success story with milestones in all sectors such as science, innovation, healthcare, and space, said Jitendra Singh, Union Minister of Science and Technology.

Speaking at the recent India International Science Festival (IISF) 2025 in Panchkula, Haryana, Singh shared how the outlook towards India has changed globally in the last decade.

"The world has now acknowledged that India's esteem has risen; there is now huge recognition of Indian talent. There is also a remarkable change in how the world views India and the country's youth," Singh said.

"India is now a global success story with persistent milestones," he added, citing the feats achieved in the fields of science, innovation, healthcare, and space.

The Minister stated that the country has "started living up to the global parameters and is being recognized on global benchmarks".

"We were in the Fragile 5 economy in 2014, but are now among the top four globally. From just 350-400 startups, we

have scaled up 1.75 lakh across the country. We are now ranked third globally in terms of startups. In the

Global Innovation Index (GII), we were ranked 80, but within a decade, we are in the 38th spot," the Minister said.

He also mentioned that more than 55 percent of patent applications in India are now filed by resident Indian innovators, a significant increase from previous years.

has also emerged as a global leader in preventive healthcare, with the first gene therapy in the world for hemophilia, and the first indigenous antibiotic, he noted.

The Minister credited these to policy changes in the last 10 years and increasing collaboration with the private sector.

2,501 new confirmed mpox cases, 12 deaths reported from 44 countries in October: WHO

NEW DELHI: A total of 2,501 new confirmed cases, including 12 deaths due to mpox, were reported from 44 countries in October, said the World Health Organization (WHO).

The latest situation report for the multi-country outbreak of mpox showed that all clades of the monkeypox virus (MPXV) continue to circulate.

When mpox outbreaks are not rapidly contained, and human-to-human transmission is not interrupted, there is a risk of sustained community transmission.

"In October 2025, 44 countries, across all WHO regions, reported a total of 2,501 new confirmed mpox cases, including 12 deaths (case fatality ratio [CFR] 0.5 percent)," the WHO report said.

Twenty-one countries in Africa reported active transmission of mpox in the last six weeks (from October 12 to November 23), with 1,734 confirmed cases, including 10 deaths. *IANS*

Lessons from an Indian epic: Mahabharata holds a mirror to today's world

COL KL VISWANATHAN (RETD.)

he Mahabharata is not merely a book, it is a tra dition. To call it scripture shrinks its spirit; to call it literature underestimates its sweep. It is a living reservoir of India's civilizational experience, enriched by centuries of oral memory, cultural dialogue, and philosophical reflection. Unlike many doctrinal texts that demand unquestioning belief, the Mahabharata demands something far more difficult-reflection. It probes, questions, unsettles, and exposes the contradictions and moral ambiguities that define political power and human behavior. Its genius lies in its refusal


leadership. Had we taught the epic as the civilizational chronicle it truly is, we might have raised citizens far better equipped to understand power, ethics, conflict, and the consequences of human weakness.

An Enduring Epic

To expect the Mahabharata to offer a fixed ideology is to misunderstand the epic itself. It is too vast, too layered, too comfortable with contradiction to fit into the neat compartments that political ideologies demand. What it offers instead is a pragmatic middle path, an honest recognition that power is inherently un-

low blindly, convinced that loyalty is a substitute for judgment. On the other stand those who oppose reflexively, rejecting even sensible actions simply because they come from the "other side."

The Mahabharata warns us about both kinds. Blind loyalty ruined the Kauravas; it turned intelligent men into silent spectators. At the same time, rigid opposition wounded the Pandavas themselves, for even their vows, taken without thought for consequences, sometimes became shackles. A nation that embraces either extreme endangers itself, because in both cases the mind stops working long before the mouth stops talking.



What fuels these dangerous tendencies? Often, the oldest poison of all, envy. "Why not me?" is a question as old as humanity. It tormented Duryodhana, surfaces repeatedly in our historical chronicles, and shakes the foundations of modern politics. Envy breeds resentment, resentment hardens into hatred, and hatred eventually turns into malice; the slow, corrosive kind that accumulates like venom in a serpent's tooth. The tragedy is that the venom harms not only the intended target but ultimately the hand that holds it.

A Neglected Civilizational Chronicle

Yet, in post-Independence India, we grew strangely hesitant to teach this epic to our own children. In our eagerness to maintain a secular national identity, we packed the epics into the "religion" box, conveniently forgetting that for millennia they served as mirrors to society, not manuals of worship. This artificial distance created an ironic outcome: the Mahabharata appears "religious" today not because it is sectarian, but because it has been rendered unfamiliar.

Generations grew up studying political theory through Western thinkers, Hobbes, Locke, Rousseau, while remaining distant from India's most sophisticated text on power, duty, and

stable, that righteousness is always contested, and that the pursuit of absolute correctness often leads straight into conflict.

Seen this way, the dilemmas of Yudhishthira and the impulses of Duryodhana feel surprisingly modern. We see their echoes not only in parliaments and ministries, but in corporate boardrooms, family gatherings, and even in the tone of our online conversations. The epic endures because the human mind of today is not all that different from the human mind of 2,000 years ago. Only the scenery has changed.

Two Extremes Of Modern Poli-

Today's political stage is not dominated by thoughtful citizens who read widely and ponder deeply. Instead, it is crowded by two equally dangerous extremes. On one side stand those who fol-

Global Echoes: Churchill and de Gaulle

World history offers its own Mahabharata-like warnings. Winston Churchill led Britain through its darkest hour, steadied a weary nation, and defeated a monstrous tyranny. Yet as soon as victory arrived, he was voted out. Charles de Gaulle faced a similar fate in 1946, even after leading France out of humiliation and occupation.

resident Putin, facing diplomatic isolation since the Ukraine war began in 2022, was recently given a red carpet welcome by Delhi, which would have sent a strong message to Trump and the West. India is under pressure from Trump to stop buying oil from Russia. Frustrated by India's continued Russian oil imports and its BRICS participation, the Trump administration first imposed a 25% tariff on Indian goods, later doubling it to 50%.

It will be interesting to see how Modi manages to achieve the impossible, that is, to continue buying oil from Russia and get a mutually beneficial trade deal with Trump at the same time.

Russia is reeling under Western sanctions and India faces 50% tariffs from Washington. Both need alternate markets to boost their economies. Both countries see each other as big markets and there also seems to be an understanding that their economic partnership has underperformed for decades. Their current trade volume of \$68.72bn, up from \$8.1bn in 2020, has hugely relied on India's purchase of discounted Russian oil. Russia would like this to continue but when Putin said that Moscow was ready to continue "uninterrupted shipments" of fuel, it was a gentle nudge to Modi and India to not give into the White House's demands.

Agreements like the Russia-India economic cooperation program - is an agreement involves critical minerals and supply chains, including pharmaceuticals. A Russian-Indian pharmaceutical factory will be built in Russia's Kaluga region. India has been buying large volumes of Russian oil. As these purchases have been a major support for Russia's sanctioned economy. Much to the annoyance of America, Putin emphasized that Moscow is ready to ensure uninterrupted oil supplies to India.

Amid heightened trade tensions, analysts noted that Modi has adopted a firm stance in response to punitive tariffs imposed by Trump, maintaining India's strategic autonomy and protecting key economic interests. Despite the imposition of a 50% tariff on select Indian exports including jewelry, shrimp, and textiles, Modi refrained from making concessions, instead, signaling India's intent to diversify partnerships by engaging with leaders such as Putin and Xi by pursuing closer trade ties and with the European Union. The dispute initially strained bilateral relations, but the resumption of negotiations in September 2025 indicated that India's consistent approach might have influenced the course of talks, positioning it as a more assertive actor in global trade dynamics.

Trump's policy to make America strong and great, is no doubt a noble thought but his handling of world affairs especially under new tariffs, and immigration policies, seems to backfire. By imposing higher tariffs on India he has not only distanced India but made India drift closer towards Russia and China. Trump's immigration policies on Indian techies would eventually starve America's leadership role in information technology. It is not that America does not have talent but to create hi-tech talent pool requires time and efficiency in the constantly innovative tech space.

No single nation can progress without the support and cooperation of other nations. It is better to accept this sooner than later that some countries have market and others have products the market needs. It will be interesting to see the new power shifts and the play.




