AHMEDABAD: Senior BJP leader and former Gujarat Chief Minister Vijay Rupani died in the Air India flight crash in Ahmedabad on Thursday, authorities said. He was 68.

Rupani was onboard Air India flight Al171, which was headed to London's Gatwick Airport when it crashed shortly after takeoff from Ahmedabad. He was reportedly seated in business class seat 2D.

A seasoned politician, Rupani served as the 16th Chief Minister of Gujarat from August 2016 to September 2021. Known for his composed demeanor and firm administrative style, Rupani steered Gujarat through a critical phase of industrial growth and post-Covid recovery.

His governance emphasized investment, infrastructure, and social welfare schemes.

Born on August 2, 1956, in Rangoon (now Yangon) in then Burma, Rupani and his family migrated to Gujarat's Rajkot during the political turmoil in the Southeast Asian country. He completed his B.A. and L.L.B. from Saurashtra University, later becoming actively involved in the RSS and student politics through its student wing, the ABVP. Rupani began his political journey as a municipal corporator in Rajkot in 1987.







World leaders express grief over Ahmedabad plane crash

MOSCOW/NEW DELHI: Condolences from leaders across the world continue to pour in for the people affected after an Air India flight bound for London, carrying over 240 passengers, crashed shortly after taking off from the Ahmedabad airport on Thursday afternoon. The incident occurred near the Meghaninagar area of the city, triggering a massive emergency response.

At least 169 Indians and 53 British nationals were travelling in Air India's flight AI171 from Ahmedabad to London's Gatwick airport.

Russian President Vladimir Putin sent a message of condolences to President Droupadi Murmu and Prime Minister Narendra Modi over the passenger plane crash in Ahmedabad.

"Please accept the deepest condolences over the tragic consequences of a passenger plane crash in Ahmedabad. Kindly convey the words of sincere sympathy and support to the families and near ones of the victims, as well as wishes for a speedy recovery to all those injured in this catastrophe," said Putin. *IANS* student politics through its student wing, the ABVP. BRUSSELS: Nearly three weeks after the end of a brief but intense conflict between India and Pakistan, External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar has issued a stern warning against future terrorist provocations, reiterating that India will not hesitate to strike back regardless of location.

"If they are deep in Pakistan, we will go deep into Pakistan," Jaishankar said in an interview with POLITICO during his official visit to Brussels for high-level trade talks with the European Union. The remarks reflect one of the Indian government's strongest stances on cross-border terrorism in recent months. stan for sponsoring the attack, a charge Islamabad has denied. The clash saw days of missile exchanges and aerial strikes between the two nuclear-armed neighbors, culminating in a ceasefire declared on May 10.

While both countries claimed victory, their versions of events varied. India initially rejected Pakistan's claims of downing several Indian fighter jets. However, a senior Indian military official later acknowledged aircraft losses without providing specific details. Images circulating online suggested that at least one Mirage and one Rafale -- both French-made -- had been downed. According to

the jets.

When asked whether the conditions that triggered last month's hostilities still existed, he said, "If you call the commitment to terrorism a source of tension, absolutely, it is."

The conflict erupted in early May following a deadly terrorist attack in an Indian-administered region that claimed the lives of 26 civilians, mainly Hindus. India blamed PakiJaishankar emphasized that Indian air strikes had severely degraded Pakistan's military infrastructure. "As far

Zardari blames US exit for terror surge, highlights Pakistan's struggles with leftover Afghan arms

WASHINGTON: Pakistan People's Party (PPP) chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari, currently visiting Washington, has reignited diplomatic tensions with pointed remarks on Afghanistan and terrorism, indirectly holding the United States and regional dynamics responsible for Pakistan's internal security challenges.

Zardari claimed that Pakistan has suffered due to the manner in which the US withdrew from Afghanistan and left behind military equipment that, he alleged, has now fallen into the hands of terrorist groups.

"We talk about terror, we talk about Afghanistan, we talk about other things. That's what we've spent the last couple of decades of this relationship discussing about," he said, underlining that these themes continue to dominate Pakistan's engagement with the United States.

The PPP chairman further pressed for greater regional

and international cooperation to counter terrorism--without acknowledging Pakistan's own widely alleged role in fostering extremist elements in its neighborhood over the years.

"We need more cooperation, regional, international, on what are we going to do now that post-Kabul to deal with the remnants, with the terrorism that's left over. As far as the weapons are concerned, you'd be astonished to hear, sometimes when we're fighting these terrorist groups within Pakistani territory, the weapons that they have procured for the black market that were left behind in Afghanistan are more advanced than the policemen that they're fighting against," he said.

While the Islamic Emirate is yet to respond to Zardari's remarks, it has in the past cautioned Islamabad against making inflammatory accusations that could destabilize already fragile bilateral ties. *ANI*

IAF asks Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla to 'touch the sky with glory'

NEW DELHI: Ahead of the Axiom Space Mission 4, the Indian Air Force (IAF) has wished Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla, to 'touch the sky with glory'.

With the success of the flight, Shukla will become the first Indian to set foot on the International Space Station (ISS). He will also be the second to go to space after Rakesh Sharma flew to space station Salyut 7 in 1984.

The US-based Axiom Space is scheduled to carry Shukla along with three others, to the ISS from the Kennedy Space Centre in Florida aboard a SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket on June 11 at 8 a.m. ET (5.30 p.m. IST). The mission was initially scheduled for launch on May 29, but was later deferred to June 8 and then June 10.

"As Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla prepares to embark on the Axiom-4 space mission tomorrow, the Chief of the Air Staff and all Air Warriors of IAF wish him and the entire crew of Axiom-4 all the best for a safe and successful trip to the International Space Station," the Indian Air Force - Media Co-ordination Centre, shared in a post on social media platform X.

"This will add a new chapter to the Indian Space Odyssey. Touch the sky with glory!" the post added.

Shukla will pilot the mission alongside Commander Peggy Whitson from the US. Other crew members include mission specialists Slawosz Uznanski-Wisniewski (Poland), and Tibor Kapu (Hungary).

Air Vice Marshal Sanjay Bhatnagar VM VSM (Retd) called Shukla an inspiration.

Ahead of his much-awaited lift-off, his family called it a moment of "immense pride" for the nation as well as for his loved ones.

"We are definitely feeling proud; our son has done something that brings pride in itself...", Shukla's mother told IANS from Lucknow.

Shukla's hometown is also celebrating with posters and car stickers. Cutouts are also being displayed proudly at his residence.

"From the land of Lord Shri Ram to space! Heartiest congratulations to Uttar Pradesh's son, Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla is now going to create history - he will set out on a journey to space carrying the dreams of India. This is a proud moment for every Indian and every family of Uttar Pradesh," Yogi Adityanath, UP Chief Minister said earlier on X.

After reaching the ISS, the Group Captain is expected to conduct exclusive food and nutrition-related experiments.

The experiments -- developed under a collaboration between the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) and the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), with support from NASA -- aim to pioneer space nutrition and self-sustaining life support systems vital for future long-duration space travel. *IANS*



California sues Trump over 'unlawful' National Guard order

SACRAMENTO: The US state of California sued the Trump administration for deploying the state's National Guard in Los Angeles amid protests against federal immigration raids, calling the move "an unmistakable step toward authoritarianism."

California Governor Gavin Newsom and Attorney General Rob Bonta announced Monday (9 June) they filed a lawsuit against the Trump administration to end the "illegal and unnecessary takeover" of takeover occurred without the consent or input of the governor, as federal law requires, but also because it was unwarranted, according to a news release from the governor's office on 9 June, Xinhua news agency reported.


In response, Trump ordered the deployment of 2,000 National Guard members on Saturday. The protests intensified further next day, with growing crowds and heightened confrontations between demonstrators and law enforcement officers.

"President Trump's order calling federalized National Guard troops into Los Angeles - over the objections of the Governor and local law enforcement - is unnecessary and counterproductive," said Bonta in a statement on 9 June.

"The President is trying to manufacture chaos and crisis on the ground for his own political ends. Federalizing the California National Guard is an abuse of the

President's authority under the law - and not one we take lightly. We're asking a court to put a stop to the unlawful, unprecedented order," Bonta said.

Newsom said the deployment of National Guard is "a manufactured crisis," accusing Trump of "intentionally causing chaos, terrorizing communities, and endangering the principles of our great democracy." "It is an unmistakable step toward authoritarianism. We will not let this

stand," said the governor.

Following the announcement of the lawsuit, Trump posted on social media that his administration would "hit" back if protesters "spit" at National Guard members.

En route to Canada for G7, PM Modi's stopover in Cyprus being planned: Sources

NICOSIA/NEW DELHI: In yet another sign of India's growing outreach to the countries in the Mediterranean region, especially those in the neighborhood of Turkey, Prime Minister Narendra Modi could make a brief stopover in Cyprus en route to Canada for participation in the G7 Summit, sources indicated.

The Summit of the Group of Seven (G7) countries is scheduled in Alberta from

June 15-17 and Cyprus is being strongly considered as a refueling stopover, cited top officials. PM Modi could also hold bilateral discussions with the top leadership of the country during his short stay, they revealed.

The region remains engulfed in conflict as Greece and Cyprus have repeatedly called out Ankara's "provocative actions" and accused Turkey's President Recep Tayyip Erdogan of making expansionist moves which have incensed many more countries in the continent and beyond. Turkey has been slammed for expanding its oil and gas exploration plans in Greece's territorial waters and carrying out drilling activities in Cyprus's maritime economic zones.

India-Cyprus relations have strengthened over the past 10 years under Prime Minister Narendra Modi who has stated that both countries share rich legacies of ancient civilizations which have influenced each other through millennia. India has also maintained its principled position on the Cyprus Issue, reiterating several times its commitment for a bi-communal, bizonal federation based on UN Resolutions in Cyprus. Three force commanders from India served in this capacity, and it is heartening for me to know that all of them are fondly remembered in Cyprus," PM Modi said during the State Visit of the President of Cyprus to India in April 2017.

Nicosia, which shares with New Deli the common objective of bringing about an early reform of the United Nations, has been backing India's claim for a permanent seat in an expanded UN Security Council.

In December 2022, during his visit to Nicosia, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said that the Mediterranean will see more of India in the future and the

UN hopes India could influence parties in Myanmar conflict to negotiate: Senior official

UNITED NATIONS: The world organization hopes that India could use its influence to get the Myanmar military regime, the National Unity Government and the ethnic groups to negotiate a peaceful solution to the conflict there, according to a senior UN official.

"India is a nation of influence" in Myanmar, the official said recently, adding that the situation in the country is "diabolical" with the earthquake adding to the already dire political and insurgency crises.

"The challenge with this conflict is that it's multifaceted, it's not one side and an opposition: There is the Myanmar military and numerous ethnic armed organizations, people's defense forces, and, also a more organized opposition through the former NLD" [the National Liberal Democracy Party, whose civilian government was overthrown by the military junta].

The official said only negotiations among the various parties to the conflict can bring peace to Myanmar, but every side believes in a military solution.

The sides in the conflicts have a "zero-sum mentality" expecting a total military solution to the problem and it favors them, the official said.

Failing that, they expect that the more territory they capture, the more influence they will have in the negotiations, the official added.

"I'm hoping that India can be part of the cohort of neighbors that bring some sense to this senseless conflict", the official said.

According to the official, the UN was disappointed by the hardline stance India has taken with regard to the Rohingya who are leaving Myanmar and seeking refugee status elsewhere.

However, the official added, the UN was hoping "to continue to engage closely with India to see if there are some constructive things we can do with India in relation to humanitarian support and treatment of Rohingya". *IANS*

India's population reaches 1.46 billion, sees decline in fertility rate: UN

NEW DELHI: While India continues to be the most populous country, with an estimated 1.46 billion people in 2025, the country's total fertility rate has fallen to 1.9, below the replacement level of 2.1, according to the latest report by the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) released 10 June.

The 2025 State of World Population (SOWP) report underscores that the real crisis lies not in population size, but in the widespread challenges to support individuals' right to decide freely and responsibly if, when, and how many children to have.

The UN report estimates "India's population at present at 1,463.9 million".

"India is now the world's most populous nation, with nearly 1.5 billion people -- a number expected to grow to about 1.7 billion before it begins falling," the report said.

The Total Fertility Rate (TFR) in India is currently 2.0 children per woman. This means that on average, a woman in India would be expected to have 2 children during her childbearing years (typically ages 15-49). This rate has remained constant since 2020, according to the Sample Registration System (SRS) report for 2021.

However, the new report showed it has declined to 1.9 births per woman, which means that, on average, Indian women are having fewer children than needed to maintain the population size from one generation to the next, without migration.

Despite the slowing birth rate, India's youth population remains significant, with 24 percent in the age bracket of 0-14, 17 percent in 10-19, and 26 percent in 10-24.

While 68 percent of the population accounts for the 15-64 age bracket, the elderly population (65 and older) stands at seven percent.

As of 2025, life expectancy at birth is projected to be 71 years for men and 74 years for women.

The UN report also placed India in a group of middle-income countries undergoing rapid demographic change, with the population doubling time now estimated at 79 years. *IANS*

India big winner in 2025 as global smartphone manufacturing output declines: Report

NEW DELHI: As global smartphone manufacturing output declines, India is set to be the big winner in 2025, with output growing in double-digit percentages to reach a record 20 percent share of worldwide output, fuelled by export demand from Apple and Samsung, a recent report showed.

Global smartphone manufacturing output is expected to slip 1 percent (on-year) in

2025 due to tariff impacts and a broader industry slowdown, following a 4 percent rise in 2024, according to Counterpoint Research's latest global smartphone manufacallocation turing tracker.

China, India, and Vietnam were responsible for more than 90 percent of the global manufacturing output in 2024, with India leading in terms of growth.

However, in 2025, manufacturing outputs from different countries are expected to show mixed performances. China will feel the impact of

tariffs in

2025, which will result in declining output coupled with forecast domestic underperformance.

The global smartphone manufacturing shift has been accelerating after the Covid-19 pandemic, but the tariffs have hurt industry players at every level - from upstream component suppliers to downstream importers and distributors, brands to manufacturers "Consequently, brand owners

have no choice but to move out of China and allocate more production capacity and output in other countries," said Counterpoint Research Senior Analyst, Ivan I am

The main winners are India, which has significant growth potential, and Vietnam, which is relatively closer to China and has a mature contract manufacturing and export sector for consumer electronics, Lam noted. IANS

India's hospitality sector expected to clock 8 pc growth in FY26: Report

NEW DELHI: India's hospitality sector is expected to post a revenue growth of 6-8 percent in FY2026 on the high base recorded after three years of double-digit revenue expansion seen by the industry over FY2023 to FY2025, according to an ICRA report released on Monday (9 June).

ICRA estimates pan-India premium hotel occupancy to hold at 72-74 percent in FY2026, slightly higher than the 70-72 percent levels witnessed in FY2024 and FY2025. The average room rates (ARRs) for premium hotels are projected to rise to Rs 8,200-8,500 in FY2026, after a healthy Rs 8,000-8,200 in FY2025 amid lagging supply additions and several hotels undergoing renovation, refurbishment, and upgradation.

Jitin Makkar, Senior Vice President ICRA Limited, said: "After three years of strong demand, driven by favorable domestic leisure travel, demand from meetings, incentives, conferences and exhibitions (MICE), including weddings, and business travel, the growth in the Indian hospitality sector is forecast to normalize at 6-8 percent year-on-year in FY2026."

"While the terror attacks in April 2025 and consequent heightened uncertainties in North and West India in May 2025 had led to a surge in cancellation of travel/ MICE, the impact has been largely temporary and localized. In recent weeks, there gradual recovery thereafter. However, domestic tourism has been the prime demand driver so far and is likely to remain so in the near term, the report states.

India working with EV makers towards steady flow of rare earth magnets: Crisil

NEW DELHI: As diversification of supply sources is being actively explored, aligned with policy efforts, the situation continues to evolve for the Indian automotive players in their quest to have a steady

flow of rare earth magnets amid China's export restrictions, a Crisil report recently showed.

Rare earth magnets, low in cost but critical in function, could emerge as a key supply-side risk for the India's automotive sector if China's export restrictions and delays in shipment clearances persist.

A disruption lasting beyond a month can impact electric vehicle (EV) launches, affect production and weigh on the sector's growth momentum, said the Crisil Ratings report.

Recognizing the risk, the government and automakers are taking action on two fronts.

In the short term, the focus is on build-

ing strategic inventories, tapping alternative suppliers and accelerating domestic assembly under Production Linked Incentive schemes.

For the long term, reducing import de-



pendency will hinge on fast-tracking rare earth exploration, building local production capacity and investing in recycling infrastructure.

"Despite contributing less than 5 per-

cent of a vehicle's cost, these magnets are indispensable for EV motors and electric steering systems. Automakers are actively engaging with alternative suppliers in countries such as Vietnam, Indonesia, Ja-

> pan, Australia, and the US, while also optimizing existing inventories," said Poonam Upadhyay, Director, Crisil Ratings.

In a constrained supply scenario, magnets may also get diverted to ICE models, which require fewer units, potentially impacting EV growth, she added.

Rare earth magnets are integral to permanent magnet synchronous motors (PMSMs) used in EVs for their high torque, energy efficiency and compact size. Hybrids also depend on them for

efficient propulsion. In internal combustion engine (ICE) vehicles, the use of rare earth magnets is largely limited to electric power steering and other motorized systems. *IANS* to the report.

ICRA's sample set, comprising 13 large hotel companies, is likely to report range-bound operating margins of 34-36 percent for FY2026, despite a lower revenue growth. The margins will remain supported by factors like cost rationalization measures and asset-light expansions in recent periods.

However, within the sample, it is likely to be a mixed bag, depending on renovations and an increase in employee expenses amidst growing demand. De-leveraging of balance sheets has led to lower interest costs and is likely to support net margins, as well as improvement in credit metrics, the report observes.

"The demand uptick over recent years led to an increase in supply announcements and resumption of deferred projects in the past 24-30 months. However, supply growth is expected to lag demand over the next 12-18 months." *IANS*



Govt imposes anti-dumping duties on vitamin A, rubber chemical imports from China, Japan, EU

NEW DELHI: The Union government has imposed anti-dumping duties on imports of Vitamin-A Palmitate and insoluble sulphur -- a crucial rubber additive -- on China, Japan, Switzerland, and the European Union (EU).

The Ministry of Finance, in a notification on June 6, issued the anti-dumping duties for a period of five years unless it is cancelled or revised.

It aims to protect domestic manufacturers from low-priced imports that affect the local industry.

The move follows an investigation by the Directorate General of Trade Remedies (DGTR) which revealed that the price of Vitamin-A Palmitate imported by these countries was lower than the normal value.

The DGTR also noted "material injury" to domestic producers of Vitamin-A Palmitate due to large-scale dumping from China,

the EU, and Switzerland.

The compound, commonly used in small quantities, remains heavily import-dependent in India.

While Vitamin-A Palmitate is used in pharmaceuticals, food, and cosmetics, insoluble sulphur plays

According to the notification. the duties for Vitamin-A Palmitate range from \$0.87 to \$20.87 per kg; the highest duty has been imposed on Chinese exporters other than Shangyu NHU BioChem, which will face a lower rate of \$14.95/kg. Swiss producer DSM Nutritional Products will attract a duty of \$0.87/kg, while other Swiss exporters will face \$8.2/kg. A flat rate of \$11.09/ kg will apply to imports from the EU, the notification stated.

Further, depending on the exporter, the duties on insoluble sulphur will range from \$259 to \$358 per metric ton.

Chinese imports will face a flat duty of \$307/MT. Among Japanese companies, Shikoku Chemicals will be charged \$259/ MT, while all other Japanese exporters will face the maximum rate of \$358/MT. the notification said, IANS

Depression, bipolar disorder after 40 may signal dementia risk: Study

NEW DELHI: Mood disorders like depression, bipolar disorder, or mania after the age of 40 may not be just mental health conditions but can precede motor or cognitive symptoms in various neurodegenerative diseases, according to a study.

Growing evidence suggests these latelife mood disorders (LLMDs) could be early warning signs of neurodegenerative diseases like dementia, even when they appear years before memory loss or other cognitive symptoms become apparent, said researchers from the National Institutes for Quantum Science and Technology (QST), Japan.

The study, published in Alzheimer's & amp; Dementia: The Journal of the Alzheimer's Association explored the presence of abnormal tau protein -- a hallmark of several neurodegenerative diseases -- in the brains of 52 participants with LLMDs and 47 healthy controls.

The researchers used advanced brain imaging techniques to examine 52 participants with LLMDs and 47 healthy controls.

They employed a positron emission to-

mography (PET) scan using two different tracers, which can detect various forms of tau protein and amyloid beta accumulation

and analyzed brain tissue samples from 208 autopsy cases to examine the relationship between late-life mood symptoms

and the subsequent development of neurodegenerative diseases.

They found that about 50 per cent of participants with LLMDs showed tau accumulation in their brains, compared to only about 15 percent of healthy controls.

Similarly, nearly 29 perent of participants with LLMDs had detectable amyloid deposits versus just 2 per cent of controls. The autopsy findings further supported these results, showing a significantly higher prevalence of diverse tau proteinrelated pathologies in individuals who had experienced late-life mania or depression.

"Because most of the participants with LLMDs in our study had no or mild cognitive decline, these results support the evidence that neurodegenerative diseases, including Alzheimer's and non-Alzheimer's tau-related pathologies, can initially manifest as psychiatric symptoms," said Dr. Shin Kurose from QST.

Further, many participants also had tau accumulation in the frontal regions of the brain -- crucial for emotional regulation and cognitive function. *IANS*

Antibiotics during pregnancy may reduce preterm births in women with HIV: Study

NEW DELHI: A daily dose of a commonly used, safe, and inexpensive antibiotic may help reduce preterm births (born at 37 weeks' gestation or before), in women with HIV, according to a study of almost 1,000 pregnant women in Zimbabwe.

An international group of researchers, from the UK and Zimbabwe, found that women living with HIV who took the antibiotic trimethoprim-sulfamethoxazole during their pregnancy had larger babies who were less likely to be preterm.

Trimethoprim-sulfamethoxazole is a broad-spectrum antimicrobial agent with anti-inflammatory properties that are widely used in sub-Saharan Africa.

The study showed that for babies born to a small group of 131 women with HIV, the reduction in premature births was especially marked, with only 2 percent of births in the t r i m e t h o p r i m sulfamethoxazole group preterm, as compared with 14 percent in the placebo group.

"Our findings suggest that a low-cost, daily antibiotic, in a setting where infections like HIV are common, might reduce the risk of preterm births. We desperately need new strategies to prevent preterm births, which are the leading cause of under-5 child mortality," said Andrew Prendergast, Professor of Pediatric Infection and Immunology at Queen Mary University of London.

"If we can confirm in other trials that trimethoprim-

sulfamethoxazole reduces the risk of babies being born too soon, it would be a promising new approach to help newborns survive and thrive," he added.

One in four live-born infants worldwide is preterm, is small for gestational age, or has a low birth weight.

The mortality rate for these small and vulnerable newborns is high, with prematurity now the leading cause of death among children younger than 5 years of age. Maternal infections and inflammation during pregnancy are linked to adverse birth outcomes, particularly for babies born to mothers living with HIV, who have a greater risk of being born too small or too soon.

> The randomized controlled trial included 993 pregnant women from three antenatal clinics in central Zimbabwe, and gave them either 960 mg of the drug or a placebo daily.

The study, published in the New England Journal of Medicine, found that although birth weight did not differ significantly between the two groups, the trimethoprimsulfamethoxazole group

showed a 40 percent reduction in the proportion of preterm births, compared to the placebo group.

Overall, 6.9 percent of mothers receiving the drug had babies born preterm, compared to 11.5 percent of mothers receiving the placebo, and no women receiving antibiotics had babies born before 28 weeks. *IANS*

Healthy lifestyle can boost metabolic health even without weight loss: Study

HEALTHY LIFESTY

JERUSALEM: People can improve their health through dietary and lifestyle changes even if they do not lose weight, according to an international study.

The research, conducted by the universities of Ben-

Gurion (Israel), Harvard (US), and Leipzig (Germany), focused on individuals described as "weight loss resistant" -- those who adopt healthy habits but struggle to shed pounds, Xinhua news agency reported.

"We have been conditioned to equate weight loss with health, and weight loss-resistant individuals are often labeled as failures," said lead author Anat Yaskolka Meir, postdoctoral research fellow in the Department of Epidemiology at Harvard Chan School.

"Our findings reframe how we define clinical success. People who do not lose weight can improve their metabolism and reduce their long-term risk for disease. That's a message of hope, not failure," Meir added. Published in the European Journal of Preventive Cardiology, the study challenges the long-standing belief that weight loss is the primary sign of a successful diet. Researchers found that even participants who did not lose

weight showed measurable improvements in key health indicators.

The study tracked 761 adults between 18 to 24 months. All participants followed lifestyle changes without taking supplements or medications and were assigned to healthy diets.

Participants also received free gym access and exercise guidance.

By the end of the trial, approximately onethird of the participants had not lost weight, despite closely following the program.

However, they showed improvements in metabolic health, including higher levels of "good" HDL cholesterol, lower levels of leptin (a hormone primarily produced by fat cells), and reductions in abdominal fat, confirmed through MRI scans.*IANS*

Scientists find gene mutation that links iron deficiency with Crohn's disease

NEW YORK: Biomedical scientists have discovered that a genetic mutation associated with Crohn's disease can worsen iron deficiency and anemia - one of the most common complications experienced by patients with inflammatory bowel disease, or IBD.

The study led by scientists at the University of California, Riverside School of Medicine in the US - performed on serum samples from IBD patients - reported that patients carrying a loss-of-function mutation in the gene PTPN2 (protein tyrosine phosphatase non-receptor type 2) exhibit significant disruption in blood proteins that regulate iron levels.

This mutation is found in 14-16 percent of the general population and 19-20 percent of the IBD population. A loss-of-function mutation is a genetic change that reduces or eliminates the normal function of a gene or its product, a protein.

While IBD primarily affects the intestines, it can have effects beyond the gut. Iron deficient anemia is the most prevalent of these effects, contributing to

chronic fatigue and reduced quality of life, particularly during disease flare-ups, said the study published in the International Journal of Molecular Sciences.

"This discovery sheds light on a critical mechanism that links a patient's genetics to their ability to absorb and regulate iron, which is essential for maintaining healthy blood and energy levels"

nism that links a patient's genetics to their ability to absorb and regulate iron, which is essential for maintaining healthy blood and energy levels," said Declan McCole, a professor of biomedical sciences at UCR who led the study. "Our findings offer an explanation for why some IBD patients remain iron-deficient despite oral supplementation."

When the researchers deleted the PTPN2 gene in mice, the animals developed anemia and were unable to absorb iron effectively.

The team found this was due to reduced levels of a key iron-absorbing protein located in the intestinal epithelial cells - the cells responsible for taking up dietary nutrients.

"The only way the body can obtain iron is through intestinal absorption from food, making this discovery particularly significant," said first author Hillmin Lei, a doctoral student in McCole's lab.

Disruption of this pathway by genetic variants like those in PTPN2 could help explain why some IBD patients fail to respond to oral iron therapy, a commonly prescribed treatment for anemia, Lei added.

The study is a vital step toward understanding how genetic risk factors for IBD can compound patient symptoms by interfering with nutrient absorption. *IANS*

Taxing remittances

ucked into the thousand plus pages of President Trump's "big, beautiful" spending package which passed the House last month is a proposal to impose a 3.5% tax on remittances. In 2024, US residents sent more than \$220 billion to families and friends in other countries: more than half went to Latin America. Mexico is the largest recipient of US remittances, while India is the top recipient of remittances from around the world. Experts at the EMS briefing warned the tax would harm economies abroad, especially in lower income countries where remittances account for up to 30% of GDP. Immigrant advocates argue the proposal represents a form of double taxation as senders including millions of undocumented immigrants already pay income tax on their earnings.

Helen Dempster, Policy Fellow and Assistant Director for the Migration, Dis-

placement, and Humanitarian Policy Program at the Center for Global Development pointed out that if the tax increases the cost of remittances by 3.5%, global remittance flows may decrease by 5.6%. In terms of absolute losses. She emphasized: "For many countries, remittances have long sur-

Dr. Manuel Orozco of the Harvard University Development Center further pointed out that there are major challenges in the implementation of the tax.

Ariel Ruiz Soto, Senior Policy Analyst, Migration Policy Institute pointed out that this tax will lead to a surge in remittances in the short term and may slow down in the long term, but it may eventually force some families to choose to immigrate because they lose their economic pillars. He warned: "This will offset the Trump administration's policy goal of trying to curb illegal immigration." He added that immigrants may turn to informal or illegal channels to send remittances, increasing personal risks and money laundering risks.

Ana Valdez, President and CEO of the Latino Donors Association, criticized the bill from an internal U.S. perspective, saying it "punishes immigrants for their American dream." She said, "This money has been taxed once or even twice, and now it has to be taxed again, which is really unfair." She also revealed that banks have recently observed a large number of immigrants withdrawing their deposits, and they are expected to evade taxes by carrying cash or sending money on their behalf, which will undermine the stability of the financial system.



Trump signs proclamation banning travel from 12 nations

WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump has signed a proclamation imposing a travel ban on 12 countries and restricting the entry of seven others to the US, citing national security concerns.

According to the proclamation, the 12 countries that were banned include Afghanistan, Burma, Chad, Congo, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Haiti, Iran, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, and Yemen.

Additionally, the order partially restricts and limits the entry of nationals of the following seven countries -- Burundi, Cuba, Laos, Sierra Leone, Togo, Turkmenistan, and Venezuela.

The announcement of the ban followed a recent violent terror attack in Boulder, Colorado, on participants of a peaceful rally calling for the safe return of Israeli hostages from Hamas captivity.

"The recent terror attack in Boulder, Colorado, has underscored the extreme dangers posed to our country by the entry of foreign nationals who are not properly vetted, as well as those who come here as temporary visitors and overstay their visas. We don't want them," Trump said in a video statement released by the White House last week.

Meanwhile, US Homeland Security officials said that the terror attack perpetrator in Colorado, Mohammed Sabry Solima, was allowed entry into the country under the former Biden Administration and overstayed his visa. *IANS*

Delhi Police deported 71 illegally staying foreign nationals, including 47 Bangladeshi, in May

NEW DELHI: The Dwarka District Police has deported 71 illegally staying foreign nationals, including 47 Bangladeshis, 17 Rohingyas from Myanmar, and 7 Nigerians, in May.

According to DCP Dwarka Ankit Singh, "The foreign nationals were found overstaying in India without valid visas. They were apprehended by various teams of the Dwarka District Police, including Special Staff, PS Uttam Nagar, Anti-Narcotics Cell, PS Chhawla, and AATS. The apprehended foreign nationals have been sent to a detention center after being produced before the Foreigners Regional Registration Office (FRRO), which ordered their deportation.

Earlier on June 2, the North-West district police of Delhi apprehended 18 Bangladeshi nationals found illegally residing in the city. The arrests were made during a special operation conducted on last week in the Bharat Nagar police station area by the Foreigner Cell unit.

The operation was launched based on specific intelligence inputs indicating that three families who had migrated from Haryana were now hiding in the Wazirpur JJ Colony, frequently changing locations to avoid detection.

LOS ANGELES: President Donald Trump ordered the deployment of 2,000 National Guard troops to Los Angeles to control immigration protests, overriding California Governor Gavin Newsom's objections in a rare move. According to CNN, this invocation of presidential power without the governor's consent is "extremely rare" and marks a significant escalation.

The deployment follows protests triggered by federal immigration raids arresting at least 44 people. Law enforcement used tear gas and flashbang grenades to disperse protesters over the weekend. Trump accused local officials of failing to control unrest, pledging federal inter-

Trump signed a presidential memorandum deploying the National Guard under Title 10 of the United States Code to protect ICE and federal personnel and property. This allows the National Guard to report directly to the president, bypassing the governor.

This is the first federalization of National Guard troops by a US president since 1992 during the Los Angeles riots. Unlike then, Trump's deployment was made without Governor Newsom's consent, who called the move "pur-



Protesters blocked Los Angeles freeways and streets, disrupting traffic. The LAPD declared the gathering unlawful and made arrests as authorities worked to reopen the freeway.

According to CNN, experts say presidential deployment without a governor's request is without modern precedent, last seen in 1965 under President Lyndon B. Johnson to protect civil rights demonstrators.

CNN quoted Juliette Kayyem, senior national security analyst, who called Trump's response an "extreme overreaction" and "not rational given the threat." ANI

LOS ANGELES: California Governor Gavin Newsom denounced the deployment of National Guard troops to Los Angeles as "purposefully inflammatory," saying Presi-

dent Donald Trump's order undermined state authority. "These are the acts of a dictator, not a President," he posted on X.

California National Guard troops were deployed in Los Angeles to help contain escalating protests over President Donald Trump's immigration crackdown, Reuters reported.

The third day of demonstrations saw federal agents clashing with protesters across the city, as tensions flared over ICE raids and detentions.

According to Reuters, the deploy-

ment--ordered by the White House--has triggered sharp backlash from California officials, who have called it unlawful and politically motivated.

Federal security agents confronted demonstrators in areas including Paramount, Compton, and downtown Los Angeles. Protesters, many waving Mexican flags, chanted slogans such as "ICE out of L.A.!"

Meanwhile, Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth said Marines at Camp Pendleton were on "high alert" and warned that active-duty troops could be mobilized if violence escalated.

Though the Trump administration cited Title 10 of the

U.S. Code to justify the deployment, legal scholars and state officials questioned whether the federal government could bypass the governor's authority. The administration has not yet invoked the Insurrection Act, but said the Guard's role was limited to protecting federal buildings and personnel.

Los Angeles police declared several protests "unlawful assemblies," reporting that some demonstrators threw bottles and concrete at officers. The FBI offered a \$50,000 reward after a federal officer was injured in Para-

mount. Mayor Karen Bass accused the Trump administration of deliberately inciting tensions, while also condemning violence from a small group of protesters.

The Department of Homeland Security reported around 1,000 "rioters" last Friday, though Reuters could not independently verify that figure. Immigration advocates said the enforcement operation also swept up legal residents and green card holders. Angelica Salas of CHIRLA said lawyers were denied access to those detained. ANI

"Radicalism, illegal immigration biggest threat to world": all party delegation member Samik Bhattacharya in Belgium

BRUSSELS: Bharatiya Janata Party MP, Samik Bhattacharya, who is part of the all-party delegation led by BJP MP Ravi Shankar Prasad said that the biggest threat facing the world are radicalization and illegal immigration, which is happening in India from Bangladesh and could happen in Europe too.

The delegation is currently in Germany after departing from Belgium as part of the diplomatic outreach to meet with various officials and put forward India's stance against terrorism. During their visit to Brussels, they held meetings with members of the European Parliament.

'The threat facing the whole world is radicalism, illegal immigration, which is happening in India because of Bangladesh...What is happening in India today can happen in Europe tomorrow. If the European Union is looking at itself as a multicultural society and acting, they should also understand that India also has а

multicultural society, and what is Bangladesh doing?" Bhattacharya told ANI.

Hitting out at Pakistan, he said that terrorism is their "state doctrine," making terrorism and Paki-<u>stan synony-</u> mous with each other.

"You cannot separate Pakistan from terrorism. Terrorism and Pakistan are synonymous; the world should be free from this, and Europe should be free from this. It is the EU's responsibility to stand with India and at least raise their voice against fundamentalism, terrorism,"

Criticizing the Pakistani army further, the delegation member claimed that the Pakistani Army's chief, General Asim Munir, believes that Hindus and Muslims cannot coexist.

'The line of General Munir is that Hindus and Muslims cannot coexist together, our aspirations are different, our goals are different, and we want to achieve something different. Looking at this, the whole European Union should stand united against terror," he said.

Earlier, AIADMK leader M Thambidurai highlighted that it is accepted in the United Nations that Pakistan has at least 52 terror camps, which not only terrorize India but the whole world.

"UN also has accepted that 52 terrorist camps are there (in Pakistan), which are used not only to terrorize India but also to kill innocent people, it is also happening in other parts of the world." ANI



Is Bangladesh slipping toward a praetorian state?

B angladesh's ongoing crisissparked by student protests and deepened by military interventionmarks one of the country's most significant democratic regressions toward a praetorian state since the 1980s. The student protests of July 2024, triggered by a 30% job quota for descendants of 1971 freedom fighters-seen by many as favoritism towards Awami League loyalists-ignited widespread unrest. tory became clearer with Sheikh Hasina's resignation and exile on August 5, 2024.

Parliament Speaker Shirin Sharmin Chaudhury reportedly advised Prime Minister Hasina to step down due to rising threats to her safety amid protests. However, Hasina and her party leaders resisted. According to India Today and The Economic Times, army officials confronted her, demanding resignation, to which she defiantly responded, "Shoot me and bury me in Bangabhaban (President's House)."

The interim government that followed was engineered by the military under General Waker-uz-Zaman, with Muhammad Yunus appointed as its advisor through negotiations involving military officers, student leaders, and the president-an arrangement that underlined the military's central role.

Bangladesh's political history is replete with similar episodes of military intervention. It began with the 1975 coup that as-

the military, are pressuring the Yunus regime. Key demands include a time-bound election by December 2025. The military, in particular, has opposed initiatives like the Bangladesh-Myanmar Humanitarian Corridor and has issued firm warnings against any interference in military affairs or institutional restructuring.

This convergence of demands amid the political crisis has exposed deep fault lines in Bangladesh's democracy, reinforcing concerns over the military's expanding role in governance. Such developments indicate a classic praetorian environmentwherein the military dominates political discourse and weakens civilian authority.

The Praetorian Slide

The current crisis is not an isolated episode but part of an ongoing pattern, suggesting that Bangladesh may be veering toward militarized governance. This trajectaker government in 2007 was formed in response to political gridlock and unrest between the Awami League (AL) and the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP), leading to credible elections in 2008.

Even in 2012, a foiled coup attemptrooted in opposition to the government's secular and India-friendly stance-highlighted lingering military ambitions. The Guardian reported that this plan was thwarted before execution and lacked widespread support within the army. In short, military interventions have been a recurring theme whenever civilian governance falters.

That, President Donald Trump is willing to put all his energy into revolutionizing rection if the move ran into a dead end. Some of this was evident after he advanced the claim that he had brought about a ceasefire between India and Pakistan when the two countries were in the midst of a military confrontation following the terrorist attack at Pahalgam.

In his innate desire to take credit for finding geopolitical solutions he even talked of mediating between India and Pakistan on the issue of Kashmir but quickly realized that the suggestion was going to create a huge problem for India-US relations. He therefore lost no time in stating that the two countries should talk to each other directly.

Trump Administration can-

not be faulted for taking interest in the matter of India-Pak military confrontation after a desperate Pakistan had approached it in the wake of damage inflicted by India on several Pak air bases during the escalating situation.

India's acceptance of a plea for ceasefire, made by Pak at DGMO level, can also not be interpreted as a sign of weakness of any sort. Operation Sindoor was meant to make punitive strikes at as many as nine terrorist bases beyond LoC and inside Pakistan identified by our Intelligence. A failed attempt of the Pak army subsequently, to make a drone attack on India invited a deadlier missile strike on the leading air bases of Pakistan, pushing the Pakistan army into a situation where it was driven to call for a halt on the military operations.

The response from India can be said to have added to our credentials as a responsible peace-loving nation. Modi government's claim that Operation Sindoor was a success stands to reason- the political slugfest resulting from it at home can be seen, to an extent, as a manifestation of our domestic politics.

Trump's approach to foreign policy seems to be flawed for the reason that it did not get all its components right. 'Making America Great Again' (MAGA) depended as much on the military and technological might of the US together with its economic power gained largely through trade, as on the 'patterns of interdependence' that strengthened America. Trump has apparently given total attention to the first two at the cost of the last prerequisite of US strength being sustained by its links with the democracies of Europe and Asia.

INDER POST FRANCE AND A DRONES

recent attack on Russia by Ukraine's "Spider Web" opera-tion is believed to have struck forty-one planes with the help of drones, which is a third of the bombers Russia uses as strategic cruise-missile carriers. Experts believe this could negatively affect Russia's ability to continue its launch of cruise missiles against Ukrainian targets. The Russian Defense Ministry has acknowledged the attack and damage to several of its aircraft, but it disputed the extent of the assault.

However, Operation Spider Web has left a ripple effect that is still being felt in the attack's aftermath. Here is why these drone strikes were so remarkable, and how they could affect the future of conflict. The operation used commercial transportation, such as trucks, to smuggle large numbers of one-way attack drones, for launch close to airfields across Russia, from the country's western border with Ukraine all the way to Siberia. It is believed the drones were smuggled into Russia inside wooden cabins mounted on the back of Lorries and concealed below remotely operated detachable roofs.

The attack came as a surprise. Russia apparently had no idea it was coming, and the strikes once again demonstrated Ukraine's ability to be at the cutting edge of technology and tactics. Ukraine has consistently and successfully leveraged and integrated everything from old military technology and, off-the-shelf commercial systems to artificial intelligence (AI) for its military operations. This has made a difference in the war, since its early days, giving Ukraine new and unexpected vectors to attack Russia. Ukraine's devastating attack demonstrates that the world has entered an era of remote precision in war. The combination of AI and autonomous weapons, precision guidance and, commercial manufacturing mean that low-cost precision strikes are now also accessible to almost any state or militant group.

Whereas in India, on 22 April, Pakistan based terrorist group "The Resistance Front" (TRF) perpetrated a devastating attack in Kashmir, India. In this attack 26 innocent tourists were killed in cold blood after segregating them based on their religion. TRF is an offshoot of the well known Pakistan backed terrorist organization Lashkar-e-Taiba. Post attack, TRF claimed the responsibility for this attack not once but twice within a few hours. Pakistan's subsequent refusal to acknowledge or curb these terrorist networks compelled India to take a responsible but resolute action. In response, on the night of 7-8 May 2025, India executed "Operation Sindoor," The response was non escalatory, precise and targeted terrorist training camps at nine different locations within Pakistan and Pakistan Occupied Kashmir. No military targets were engaged.

However, in the early hours of 8 May, Pakistan, in an escalated response launched coordinated drone and missile strikes targeting over a dozen Indian military installations across the Northern and Western theatres, including Srinagar, Jammu, Pathankot, Amritsar, Ludhiana, Bathinda and Bhuj. India's robust Integrated Counterdrone Grid and layered Air Defense systems intercepted these attacks; the recovering debris conclusively traced to Pakistani origin.

What do both these scenarios mean for the future of global warfare? It clearly supports what defense experts have been saying for the past few years, that all future wars will witness use of more and more AI, drones and robots.
