World leaders express solidarity with India, offer condolences over Delhi blast

TOKYO/KATHMANDU: Several world leaders have expressed solidarity with India and offered condolences following the deadly car blast near Delhi's Red Fort that has claimed several lives and injured many.

Japanese Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi offered condolences to the families of the victims of the Delhi car blast and prayed for the speedy recovery of injured people.

"I am in deep sorrow to learn that many precious lives were lost in the explosion that occurred in Delhi, India. On behalf of the Government and people of Japan, I would like to express my heartfelt condolences to the victims and their bereaved families. I also offer my sincere prayers for the swift recovery of the injured," Takaichi posted on X.

The blast occurred on Monday (10 Nov.) evening when a Haryana-registered car, a Hyundai i20, exploded near the Red Fort Metro Station.

Nepal Prime Minister Sushila Karki also expressed sadness over the tragic Delhi blast, emphasizing that Kathmandu

stands in solidarity with India.

In a statement shared on X, Karki stated, "I am shocked and saddened by the tragic Delhi explosion last evening. Deepest condolences to the bereaved families and prayers for the speedy recovery of the injured. Nepal stands in solidar-

ity with India in this hour of grief."

Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim expressed sadness over the explosion that occurred in Delhi.

In a post on X, Ibrahim wrote, "I am deeply saddened by the explosion near the Red Fort in Delhi on Monday evening,

which has claimed several lives and injured many others. My heartfelt condolences go to the victims' families and to the people of India as they mourn this senseless tragedy."

"If confirmed to be an act of terror, it deserves the strongest condemnation. There can be no justification for violence that targets innocent lives and sows fear among ordinary people. I also pay tribute to the first responders and to the authorities working to determine the cause of the blast and to bring those responsible to justice. Our thoughts and prayers are with all who are affected," he added.

Sri Lankan President Anura Kumara Dissanayake expressed solidarity with the people of India. He wrote on X, "Saddened by news of the explosion in Delhi last evening. Sri Lanka stands in solidarity with the people of India. Our thoughts are with all those affected."

Israel Foreign Minister Gideon Sa'ar offered condolences to the people of India, including the families of the victims killed in the blast in Delhi. He expressed Israel's support to India in its fight against terror. *IANS*

India's quota for Haj 2026 to be 1,75,025: Kiren Rijiju

NEW DELHI: India's quota for Haj 2026 will be 1,75,025, Union Minister of Minority Affairs Kiren Rijiju on informed after a bilateral meeting with Saudi Arabia's Hajj and Umrah Minister Dr Tawfiq bin Fawzan Al Rabiah to review preparations and confirm the number of pilgrims.

Grand Chhath Puja observed in Los Angeles

t was an evening to perfuse in divine observance at the Newport Dunes Wa terfront resort, as hundreds of members of Indian diaspora gathered to honor the Sun God and Chhathi Maiya.

The event was the annual Chhath Puja Mahaparv organized by enthusiastic members of Bihar Jharkhand Bandhu Association, a Non profit Organization working to pull off a historic gala. Hundreds of devotees offering arghya to the Sun God at the same time (Sunset on 10/27, and Sunrise on 10/28) chanting the same mantras was a sight to behold, and an inspiration for the entire community.

Chhath Puja is an ancient Hindu festival dedicated to the worship of Surya Dev (the Sun God) and Chhathi Maiya, who is believed to be the goddess of energy, fertility, and wellbeing. Celebrated mainly in Bihar, Jharkhand, Eastern Uttar Pradesh. and Nepal, the tradition has gained immense significance among devotees across the globe, symbolizing gratitude, purity, and devotion. It is considered one of the most eco-friendly observances, as all rituals are performed with natural offerings and deep reverence for the environment.

The ceremony spans four days of spiritual discipline and self-control, each carrying deep symbolic meaning.

The first day, Nahay Khay, marks the beginning of purification when devotees take a holy dip, clean their homes, and consume only satvik (pure) food.

The second day, Kharna, involves a day-long fast, which is broken in the evening after preparing prasad - typically kheer and chapati - offered to the deities and shared with family.

The third day, Sandhya Arghya, is the



onstrate unwavering devotion. The festivity beautifully blends faith, discipline, nature worship, and family unity, embodying the essence of harmony between humankind and nature.

"The lovely banana tree stumps lining the entrance corridor and the red carpet felt so welcoming and set the beautiful tone for the events planned", says Vratee Parul Priya who has been a patron and has soon as the members of the organization walked her through the traditional significance of this festival. "Part of advancing long-term health and

well-being is ensuring that patients are able to continue to grow academically while undergoing treatment at St. Jude. We know that education is a cornerstone of a healthy future and we want all of our students to be able to fulfill their dreams." said Alli Leslie, School Program Head at Imagine Academy at St. Jude.



Accredited by the nonprofit Cognia as a Special Purpose School, Imagine Academy does not grant academic credits or diplomas. Instead, students remain enrolled in their community schools while receiving instruction and advocacy support tailored to their needs. Every new patient

at St. Jude is offered a consultation to assess their educational situation and determine the best level of support.

The 23 full-time employees of the Academy see up to 150 patients per day. Imagine Academy also has a lot of additional support from volunteers. There are 16 community-based volunteers who support



students in Imagine Academy on a weekly basis. In addition, over 90 St. Jude employees from other departments serve as lab helpers in the STEM lab throughout the school year. Instruction is offered three times a week for K-12 students and twice a week for preschoolers. Beyond the classroom, the school coordinator team helps families navigate their children's educational needs, working directly with schools when necessary to ensure appropriate accommodations.

"The ultimate goal with our school coordination work is to empower students to tell their story and advocate for their classroom needs, so when they get back to school and ultimately transition to college, work or other postsecondary environments, they feel better prepared to ask for those accommodations," said Leslie.

For many students, the relationships built at Imagine Academy last well beyond their time at St. Jude. Teachers often hear from former students who return to visit, grateful for the support they received.

"The school program is amazing," said St. Jude cancer survivor Archie. "They give you one-on-one time. When I went back to school, I was still up-to-date, and actually ahead in some ways. I thank St. Jude for that because I got to graduate on time."

INDIA AI Impact Summit 2026: Pre-Event briefing session for US Congressmen and Tech CEOs hosted in Seattle







SEATTLE: In the run up to India-AI Impact Summit 2026 to be held in New Delhi next year, Consulate General of India in Seattle hosted today a Pre- Event Curtain Raiser focusing on the three pillars of India's AI Impact Summit: People, Planet and Progress.

The Roundtable featured expert presentations by leading Tech CEOs from Greater Seattle area and covered themes like the usage of Al in Agri-Tech and the potential of Data Centers and Digital Infrastructure in India.

Participants also briefed US Congressman Adam Smith, Ranking Member of the House Armed Services Committee, and Congressman Michael Baumgartner, Member of the House Judiciary and Foreign Affairs Committees about India's progress in AI and highlighted the Seven Chakras, or Themes for Global Cooperation centered around (i) Safe and Trusted AI (ii) Human Capital (iii) Science (iv) Resilience, Innovation and

Efficiency (v) Inclusion and Social Empowerment (vi) Democratizing AI Resources and (vii) Economic Growth and Social Good.

Today's briefing at the new Chancery premises of the Indian Consulate in Seattle, was the first such curtain raiser, in a series of such sessions that are being planned in the run up to the Al India Impact Summit. Subsequent, workshops and briefing sessions are being planned in leading US Universities in the US Pacific

Northwest, as well with leading Tech and Al industry stakeholders in January 2026.

The India-AI Impact Summit 2026 will be held from 19-20 February 2026 at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi, as the first global-scale AI summit hosted in the Global South. It will bring together governments, industry, academia, and startups from global capitals with an aim to translate AI's potential into tangible outcomes for People, Planet, and Progress and reaffirm India's vision of "AI for AII."







Court orders release of Masuma Khan, reuniting her with family and Altadena community

Ruling allows 64-year-old resident to return home and access critical medical care while her immigration case continues

LOS ANGELES: Masuma Khan, who has been in the United States for nearly three decades, was released from ICE detention on Wednesday, after enduring a month in which she was repeatedly denied necessary medical care. A U.S. District Court judge granted a preliminary injunction ordering her immediate release, preventing her re-detention without due process, and barring her immediate deportation to any country where she fears for her safety-all of which ensures that the 64-year-old can remain at home while her immigration case proceeds.

A team of legal counsel and advocates, including Public Counsel, South Asian Network, and Hoq Law APC, came together to push for the release of Khan, who is a pillar of her community. Masuma is known for supporting family, friends, and neighbors when they are ill

or otherwise in need.

Khan, an Altadena resident who survived the fires earlier this year, was detained for nearly a month at the California City Detention Facility, which has developed a reputation for inhumane living conditions. During her detainment, Khan was denied critical medications and basic medical care for her chronic asthma, high blood pressure, glaucoma, and other serious conditions.

"I'm so happy to reunite with my mom and know that she can now breath fresh air and get the medical care she needs to survive. We are thankful to the judge who understood the gravity of our case, applied the law, and allowed my mom to be released with dignity." said Riya Khan, daughter of Masuma.

In court, a federal judge ruled there was no reason for Masuma to remain in cus-

tody without the government explaining why her detention is necessary, given they had released her five years ago and allowed her to remain with her family while her immigration case proceeds.

The following statement can be attributed to the legal team:

"We are grateful that the court upheld the rule of law and ordered Masuma Khan's release, recognizing her right to return home and access life-saving medical care. This outcome was only possible thanks to the incredible collaboration between Masuma's family, community advocates, and our legal team - all working together to ensure justice prevailed. Masuma is a pillar of her family and her community, and we are honored to stand alongside her in this ongoing fight."

Khan and her family plan to continue pursuing her pending application for immi-

gration relief.

Covered California's open enrollment 2026:

Here to help connect Californians to care despite uncertainty around federal tax credits

SACRAMENTO, Calif.: Covered California is kicking off its open-enrollment period for 2026 coverage on Nov. 1 amid uncertainty surrounding the enhanced premium tax credits that have delivered greater affordability and record enrollment across the nation.

This marks the 13th open-enrollment period under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, which since its inception has helped tens of millions of Americans access health insurance, including a record nearly 2 million Californians heading into 2026. Today, more than 24 million Americans are insured through a market-place plan.


Open enrollment, which runs through Jan. 31, 2026, is when Californians can sign up for, renew or shop for a new health insurance plan. This year's campaign, "Connectors to Coverage," emphasizes the broad network of experts, enrollers and other guidance Covered California offers to help consumers navigate the path to affordable, high-quality health insurance.

"Since 2014, Covered California has helped more than 6 million Californians connect to quality health insurance at an affordable price," said Covered California Executive Director Jessica Altman. "Despite uncertainty in Washington, our mission remains the same. We are here to help Californians get comprehensive health insurance, including free preventive care, to keep themselves and their families healthy in 2026."

Since 2021, the federal government has helped millions of Americans afford health insurance through enhanced premium tax credits that reduce the cost of monthly premiums. The federal government made premium tax credits for lower-income enrollees more generous and provided tax credits to middle income consumers for the first time, putting money directly back in the pockets of consumers. Those enhanced tax credits are set to expire at the end of this year without Congressional action and have been the key point of debate in the ongoing federal government shutdown.

Without an extension of the enhanced premium tax credits, monthly premiums are projected to rise by 97 percent on average for more than 1.7 million Californians enrolled and receiving financial assistance through Covered California. This includes more than 160,000 middle-income consumers who currently receive the federal enhanced premium tax credits but would lose eligibility in 2026. Faced with the full premium cost of coverage without financial help, they would be at risk

of dropping health insurance.

"While President Trump and Republicans work to strip away health coverage for millions of Americans, California continues to lead the nation in expanding access to affordable health care," said Gov. Gavin Newsom. "Our health insurance marketplace, Covered California, is open and here to help every Californian get connected to the quality health insurance they

deserve for themselves and their families. We will continue to fight to make sure health insurance is affordable and attainable for every single family in California."

Despite market uncertainties surrounding federal tax subsidies, Covered California maintains a strong marketplace and engages in active negotiations with health insurance companies to ensure consumers are receiving the best value possible.

Through Covered California, Californians have access to brand-name health plans offered by 11 health insurance companies. Every plan provides access to leading doctors, hospitals and specialists across California and includes essential health benefits - from preventive care and maternity care to mental health services and emergency coverage.

Connecting With the Remaining 1.2 Million Uninsured Californians

As open enrollment for 2026 begins, Californians continue to enroll in health insur-

ance at a historic rate. Statewide enrollment has increased nearly 24 percent over the past four years, following the introduction of enhanced premium tax credits.

Despite this record enrollment, there remains federal uncertainty around enhanced premium tax credits. Covered

California is committed to our mission of supporting our current enrollees in understanding their options and staying covered, while connecting the remaining uninsured to health insurance.

New data from the California Simulation of Insurance Markets (CalSIM) model, developed by the University of California, Los Angeles's Center for Health Policy Research, estimates that nearly 1.2 million Californians who either qualify for subsidies through Covered California (508,000) or low-cost or no-cost Medi-Cal (682,000) remain uninsured and eligible for coverage in 2026.

Further, this data from CalSIM shows that certain groups are disproportionately represented among the uninsured. Among the 508,000 uninsured Californians eligible for Covered California coverage, 57 percent are Latino and 50 percent are between 45-64 years old and they reside all over the state.

For example, in Southern California, there are 604,000 uninsured Californians who are eligible for Covered California subsidies (246,000) or no-cost Medi-Cal coverage (358,000).


"Whether you work full-time, part-time, are a gig worker, or are temporarily unemployed, we believe every Californian deserves quality coverage at a price they can afford," said Altman. "Even in this unpredictable federal environment, we are doing everything possible to ensure Californians can get connected to high-quality health insurance at the lowest price possible. That starts with Congress extending the enhanced premium tax credits."

California Is Taking Steps to Protect the Most Vulnerable From Increasing Costs

In 2025, Gov. Newsom and the California Legislature increased state funding available for the enhanced cost-sharing reduction program, appropriating \$165 million to expand eligibility. This allowed Californians with incomes above 200 percent of the federal poverty level to enroll in an Enhanced Silver 73 plan with no deductibles and reduced out-of-pocket costs.

This year - if the enhanced premium tax credits sunset - California is continuing to take proactive steps to protect its lowest-income enrollees from the steepest rate increases and reduce costs for consumers should the enhanced tax credits expire. For 2026, the state has allocated \$190 million to provide state-funded tax credits for individuals earning up to 150 percent of the federal poverty level.



This support will help keep monthly premiums consistent with 2025 levels for those with an annual income of up to \$23,475 for an individual or \$48,225 for a family of four. It will extend partial additional assistance to those earning up to \$25,823 for an individual or \$53,048 for a family of four.

While this funding offers a meaningful lifeline for the lowest-income Covered California enrollees, it cannot replace the nearly \$2.5 billion in enhanced premium tax credits that Californians receive from the federal government annually. However, if Congress takes action to extend the federal enhanced premium tax credits, Covered California will be able to maintain the current state enhanced benefit program, which would allow most Covered California enrollees to purchase health plans with lower out-of-pocket costs.

Nearly 92 percent of Covered California's enrollees receive financial help. Nearly half qualify for health insurance costing \$10 or less per month in 2026, and nearly a quarter could get a Silver plan for that same price. In addition, Covered California research shows that about 17 percent of current consumers will pay \$0 in premiums in 2026 if they keep their current plan.

Trump's big turnaround on H-1B visas, says US needs foreign talent

WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump defended the H-1B visa program, saying the country needs foreign talent for certain industries.

In an interview with Fox News' Laura Ingraham on 11 November, Trump was asked if his administration planned to deprioritize H-1B visas. He replied, "You do have to bring in talent."

When Ingraham countered, "We have plenty of talent," Trump responded, "No, you don't."

"You don't have certain talents....And people have to learn, you can't take people off an unemployment line and say, I'm going to put you into a factory. We're going to make missiles," he added.

Trump's statement comes even as he launched a crackdown on H-1B visas in September through a proclamation, imposing a hefty application fee of \$100,000.

Last week, the US Department of Labor (DOL) launched at least 175 investi-

gations into potential abuses within the H-1B visa program, as part of a broader effort by the Trump administration to crack down on the foreign worker visa system.

The initiative, dubbed 'Project Firewall', was launched in September to target companies allegedly exploiting the visa system, which allows US firms to hire foreign workers in specialty occupations such as information technology, engineering, and healthcare.

"The Department of Labor is using every resource at our disposal to put a stop to H-1B abuse and protect American jobs," the DOL Secretary Lori Chavez-DeRemer said in a post on X.

In October, Florida Governor Ron DeSantis announced that he was directing the state's Board of Governors to end the use of H-1B visas across state universities, saying that positions currently held by visa holders should be filled by Florida residents.

"Why are we bringing people in to assess our accreditation on an H-1B visa? We can't do that with our own people?" DeSantis said, adding that the practice amounts to "cheap labor" and calling on university leaders to reassess hiring practices.

Days later, the White House reiterated that President Donald Trump's priority in reforming the H?1B visa program is to put "American workers first" and vowed to fight lawsuits filed against the administration's crackdown.

The administration's H-1B visa policy has faced broad opposition from lawmakers and legal challenges with two major lawsuits filed in courts, including the one by the US Chamber of Commerce, the country's biggest business organization.. *IANS*

Trump says US 'pretty close' to signing trade deal with India

WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump said he is very close to signing a trade agreement with India.

"We are making a deal with India, much different deal than we had in the past...We're getting a fair deal, just a fair trade deal. We're getting close...I think we're pretty close to doing a deal that's good for everybody," Trump added.

Trump made the remarks during the

swearing-in ceremony of Sergio Gor, the next US ambassador to India.

Trump also said that he has a "fantastic relationship with Prime Minister Modi" and termed India one of America's most "important international relationships."

"I'm trusting Sergio to help strengthen one of our country's most important international relationships, and that's the strategic partnership with the Republic of India. It's a big deal. India is home to one of the world's oldest civilizations, the largest country in the world...We have a fantastic relationship with Prime Minister Modi, and Sergio has only enhanced that, because he's become already friendly with the Prime Minister," Trump said.

Sergio Gor was sworn in by Vice President JD Vance, and senior members of the Trump administration, such as Secretary of State Marco Rubio and Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent, attended the ceremony in the Oval Office of the White House. *IANS*

In an exclusive response to IANS, a State Department spokesperson said, "We are aware of the explosion near Red Fort in Delhi. We are closely monitoring the situation and stand ready to provide consular assistance."

In a separate post on X, the State Department Bureau of South and Central Asian Affairs said, "Our hearts are with those affected by the terrible explosion in New Delhi. We continue to closely monitor the situation. Our sincere condolences to the families who lost their loved ones. Praying for the speedy recovery of those injured." *IANS*

"Terror may strike our cities, but it will never shake our souls": Israeli PM over Delhi blast

TEL AVIV: Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu expressed his condolences to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the people of India over the tragic blast near Delhi's iconic Red Fort on Monday evening.

their investigation into the car blast that occurred near the Red Fort, revealing crucial details from CCTV footage that tracked the suspect vehicle's movements hours before the

According to Delhi Police sources, CCTV footage shows that the white i20 car was parked near the Red Fort parking area at around 3:19 p.m., remaining there for nearly three hours before it exited the parking at approximately 6:48 p.m.

The car was seen leaving the parking area at a time when there was heavy crowd movement in the vicinity, police officials said.

Investigators are also tracing the vehicle's full route, from where it originated, how it reached the Red Fort parking, and how it later proceeded toward the traffic signal located directly in front of the monument.

Police officials confirmed that over 100 CCTV clips are being analyzed, including footage from nearby roads and parking toll plazas, to map the vehicle's journey and identify the suspect.

A case has been registered under UAPA Sections 16 and 18, along with provisions of the Explosives Act and several sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). IANS

Slammed for 'irresponsible' behavior', Pak PM says regional peace depends on Taliban's actions

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said that regional peace and stability relies on Taliban taking concrete action against "terrorist groups operating from Afghanistan", including the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP), the Afghan media reported.

In his remarks at the International Conference of Speakers in Islamabad, Sharif expressed Pakistan's willingness to cooperate with the Taliban if they take "decisive and verifiable steps" against groups threatening cross-border security, Afghanistan's leading news agency Khaama Press reported. "Our doors for dialogue and cooperation remain open," he said.

Sharif stated that repeated militant attacks have stalled economic growth of Pakistan and stopped investment, particularly in border regions where violence continues to impact development. He stated that diplomatic efforts for peace and stability would continue "through every possible channel."

His remarks came after failure of

three rounds of negotiations between Pakistan and Taliban, with both sides accusing each other of not agreeing on a mechanism to monitor and combat cross-border terrorism. Tensions between two nations have escalated in recent months with major clashes erupting between forces of Afghanistan and Pakistan in October.

A ceasefire was agreed between the two sides on October 15, which had been extended during the two rounds of talks held on October 19 in Doha and October 25 in Istanbul.

Meanwhile, the Taliban Deputy Foreign Minister Mohammad Naeem blamed Pakistan's "unrealistic demands" and lack of coordination for the failure of talks between the two nations, local media re-

Naeem stated that there was no outcome from the negotiations due to Pakistani side's "irresponsible and uncooperative behavior" despite what he termed Taliban's goodwill and the efforts of mediators, Khaama Press reported. IANS

Nepal border under tight watch as Delhi blast accused plan escape route

NEW DELHI: The security agencies that have launched a nationwide hunt to track down those involved in the Delhi blasts are keeping a close watch on the Nepal border. The Intelligence agencies have stated that the accused persons may attempt to flee India through this porous

The agencies say that the accused could be planning on exiting India through the Nepal border and then entering Pakistan. This was the route that was frequently used by the Indian Mujahideen operatives when the terror group was active.

Officials say that it is unclear at this time how many persons were involved in the blasts. The persons arrested during the Faridabad module bust are being questioned for more information. So far, they have not revealed anything major, but the agencies are confident that eventually they will.

Those living along the Nepal border have been told to immediately report any suspicious activity. IANS

India won't sign any trade deal at cost of farmers: Piyush Goyal

NEW DELHI: Union Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said that India would not compromise on the interests of farmers, the dairy sector, and workers, in trade deals that it signs with other countries.

He also said India is looking for new markets like Russia for the country's fisheries sector as an alternative to the US market following the sharp hike in tariffs by the Trump administration.

Last week, Goyal said that discussions between India and the US are progressing steadily, though several sensitive and complex issues remain unresolved, IANS



than \$25 billion in transactions annually. The Trump Administration's pivot towards Pakistan is thus far more than a matter of diplomatic expediency or regional power balance, the article points out.

policymakers and other strategists have voiced concerns that Trump's approach to relying on cryptocurrencies as tools of statecraft poses governance and security risks. Reports from the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) rate Pakistan as a "jurisdiction under increased monitoring," with crypto flows complicating oversight and enforcement mechanisms. Nonetheless, the Trump Administration remains steadfast. By embracing digital assets and alternative payment systems, particularly through platforms like World Liberty Financial, the US can restore economic primacy without resorting to military interventions or deep treaty entanglements. In a 2025 White House briefing, President Trump described Pakistan as a "key partnership incubator for new digital freedoms."

The economic results of this policy pivot are already discernible. Bilateral trade between the United States and Pakistan has increased by 11 percent in the first half of 2025, with mobile payments and crypto-linked remittances accounting for over \$1.2 billion in value transfer, three times higher than in 2023, according to internal Commerce Department estimates. Pakistani fintech firms, several backed by American venture capital, have expanded operations into the Gulf and Southeast Asia, benefiting from reduced transaction costs and expanded interoperability, the article points out. *IANS*

strengthen India's scientific and industrial base. He highlighted how the Department of Science and Technology played a central role in the birth of the National Hydrogen Mission, which later merged with other renewable initiatives in a bid to work "out of silos in a more integrated fashion."

Singh explained that the focus now is on reducing oil dependence and addressing pollution through scientific innovation. "In terms of hydrogen, addressing pollution remains a critical part of our roadmap. While the concept of clean energy sounds idealistic, we must approach it scientifically and strategically," he said. He pointed out that oil-exporting nations themselves are now shifting their economies away from petroleum, reflecting a major shift in global energy dynamics.

The minister further said that India's progress in renewable and emerging technologies, such as electric vehicles, biotechnology, and nuclear energy, has set the stage for what he described as the country's "next industrial revolution." He noted that the government's decision to open the nuclear sector to private players was a bold move, reflecting a willingness to encourage innovation and investment.

Referring to the financial structure of the National Hydrogen Mission, Singh shared that the project has drawn strong support from non-government entities. "Of the total Rs 485.32 crore, Rs 315.43 crore will come from non-government sources, while the government's contribution will be around Rs 170 crore," he said. He added that this model mirrors other research-led initiatives such as the National Research Foundation, where a large share of funding also comes from private and institutional partners. *ANI*



Court order on Annual Asylum Fee notices

n Oct. 30, 2025, the United States District Court for the District of Maryland issued an order in Asylum Seeker Advocacy Project v. United States Citizenship and Immigration Services, et al., SAG-25-03299 (D. Md.), temporarily staying the Annual Asylum Fee (AAF) implementation provisions by USCIS as provided in the notice titled "USCIS Immigration Fees Required by HR-1 Reconciliation Bill" and published in the Federal Register (90 FR 34511 (FRN)) on July 22, 2025. USCIS strongly disagrees with the Court's order but will follow its terms pending possible further judicial review.

The FRN provided information about how DHS would effectuate the mandatory AAF for fiscal year 2025 and subsequent years. It specified that any alien who had a Form I-589, Application for Asy-



lum and for Withholding of Removal, pending during the entire fiscal year 2025 would be subject to the fiscal year 2025 fee.

Additionally, aliens with asylum applications filed after Oct. 1, 2024 that remain pending with USCIS for 365 days must pay the AAF as of the one-year anniversary of his or her filing date and each calendar year thereafter that the application remains pending.

The FRN also provided that USCIS will directly notify aliens that an AAF is due, when it is due, and how it is paid. The fiscal year 2025 fee is not due until a notice has been sent.

It further stated that USCIS will provide guidance for future years' AAF payments in subsequent issuances. As provided in the FRN, on or around Oct. 1, 2025, USCIS began issuing personal notices to aliens that their AAF was due. USCIS

BANGKOK: The Indian Embassy in Thailand said 197 Indian nationals have been repatriated to India from Mae Sot by two special flights operated by the Indian Air Force (IAF). The Embassy stated that Thailand Prime Minister Anutin Charnvirakul visited Mae Sot to oversee the operation. During his meeting with India's Ambassador to Thailand Nagesh Singh, conveyed Charnvirakul Thailand's appreciation for Indian Government's efforts in prompt repatriation of detainees from Mae Sot and assured of continued cooperation from Thai authorities in facilitating repatriation of Indian nationals released from scam-centers in Myanmar.

"Today 197 Indian nationals have been repatriated to India from Mae Sot, Thailand by two special flights operated by the Indian Air Force (IAF). HE Mr. Anutin Charnvirakul, Prime Minister of Thailand, visited Mae Sot

On November 7, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal stated that 270 Indians were repatriated from Thailand's Mae Sot city to India by two special IAF flights and urged Indian nationals to stay away from job scam centers in Myanmar.

Addressing a weekly media briefing in New Delhi on November 7, Jaiswal said that the individuals had entered Thailand illegally after a crackdown on the centers in Myanmar. He added that, once the necessary procedures in Thailand were completed and their documents verified by the Indian authorities, they were flown back to India. *IANS*

Germany deports Uyghur woman to China's brutal regime sparks global outcry from World Uyghur Congress

WASHINGTON, DC: The World Uyghur Congress (WUC) has sharply criticized the deportation of Rizwangul Bekri, a Uyghur woman, from Germany to China, despite the widely acknowledged risk of persecution faced by Uyghurs under China's rule. The organization described the deportation as a serious violation of international law and a betrayal of Germany's human rights obligations.

According to Bekri's daughter, Muyesser, local officials from Selsingen's Rathaus informed her that her mother had been sent to China by German immigration authorities after her asylum request was denied. In a video statement shared with the World Uyghur Congress, Muyesser expressed deep distress, noting that her mother suffers from chronic hypertension and requires regular medication.

Fortunately, Bekri was diverted to

Turkiye after passing through Beijing airport, avoiding what could have been a life-threatening situation.

WUC President Turgunjan Alawdun denounced the deportation, stating it violates the principle of non-refoulement, which prohibits returning individuals to countries where they face persecution. "Sending a Uyghur back to China, where an ongoing genocide targets their

community, is indefensible," Alawdun said. "Germany must explain how this occurred and ensure it never happens again."

The World Uyghur Congress highlighted that this is not the first such incident. In 2018, a 22-year-old Uyghur man deported from Germany due to an administrative oversight disappeared after arrival in China, prompting a tem-

porary moratorium on deportations of Uyghur asylum seekers. The WUC warned that Bekri's case represents a troubling reversal of that policy and raises questions about Germany's continued commitment to protecting vulnerable minorities.

Calling for urgent action, the WUC urged the German government to investigate the deportation, secure Bekri's safety, and reinstate the moratorium on Uyghur deportations. The group also

appealed to the European Union and other democratic nations to strengthen legal safeguards preventing similar cases.

The World Uyghur Congress concluded that deporting a Uyghur to China, a regime accused of genocide and mass internment, is a threat to their tranquility and lives. *ANI*

Housing prices rise 7-19% across Indian metros in July-September 2025: Report

NEW DELHI: Property prices across metros in India continued their unabated upward march in the July-September quarter of 2025, supported by strong end-user demand in the premium segment, elevated input costs, and a limited supply of quality, ready-to-move-in inventory, according to digital real estate transaction and advisory platform PropTiger.com by Aurum Proptech.

The weighted average property price across the top Indian cities registered healthy year-on-year growth.

Delhi NCR led the pack with a 19 percent year-on-year and 9.8 percent quarter-on-quarter appreciation, driven by

strong demand for luxury properties and infrastructure upgrades, PropTiger's latest report has asserted.

The weighted average price of homes in Delhi-NCR rose from Rs 7479 per sq. ft. in Q3 2024 to Rs 8900 per sq. ft. in Q3 2025.

Bengaluru recorded strong doubledigit price growth of 15 percent year-onyear and 12.6 percent quarter-on-quarter, while Hyderabad recorded 13 percent year-on-year and 4.6 percent quarter-on-quarter growth.

The price in Bengaluru rose to Rs 8870 per sq. ft in Q3 2025 from Rs 7713 per sq. ft in the same period last year, while prices in Hyderabad rose to Rs 7750 per sq. ft in Q3 2025 from Rs 6858 per sq. ft in Q3 2024.

Karishmah Singh, President of Sales, Marketing and CRM, Sattva Group, said the growth they were seeing in Bengaluru and Hyderabad reflects a larger transformation in India's urban economy, driven by technology, talent, and aspiration.

"As the IT and GCC sectors expand, they are shaping

According to the report, other major markets, including Greater Mumbai, Pune, Chennai, and Kolkata, saw robust single-digit price growth, reflecting broad-based developer confidence and buyers' willingness to invest in appreciating assets.

The PropTiger report also highlighted that home sales across India's 8 prime residential markets stabilized in the July-September quarter, with a marginal 1 percent year-on-year dip in volume to 95,547 units sold.

On a quarter-on-quarter basis, it registered a 2.2 percent decline. In sharp contrast, the total value of properties sold during the quarter surged by 14 percent annually to reach Rs 1.52 lakh crore, which the report asserted is a "clear indication of a market shift towards premiumisation."

The report also highlighted that new supply across the top eight cities saw a marginal annual decline, with 91,807 units launched.

However, new launches registered a 9.1 percent growth over the previous

quarter, signaling cautious optimism among developers.

"This trend suggests that developers are strategically launching higher-value projects to align with the current buyer demand, which is heavily skewed towards the premium and luxury segments," it said.

"Geographically, new supply was concentrated in the western and southern markets. The Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR) was the largest contributor, accounting for 26.9 percent of all new launches, followed by Pune with 18.7 percent and Hyderabad with 13.6 percent. These

India makes significant strides to address mental health issues

NEW DELHI: Mental health remains a pressing global challenge and while India has made significant strides through initiatives like Tele MANAS and the National Mental Health Program, building a mentally healthier society requires strengthening awareness, expanding workforce training and investing in digital solutions, according to government data.

About 10.6 percent of Indian adults -- roughly 11 out of every 100 adults -- were living with a diagnosable mental health disorder, according to a 2015-16 National Mental Health Survey (NMHS) conducted by the National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (NIMHANS).

According to a NIMHANS study from 2019, mental health disorders are more prevalent among women (20 percent) than men (10 percent). Women in India are found to be particularly more prone to conditions like depression, anxiety, and somatic complaints compared to their male counterparts.

Suicide rates in India are on the rise. According to the 2023 National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) report 'Accidental Deaths & Suicides in India', 171,418 suicides were reported in the country in 2023. IANS

Australia leads first human trial of one-time gene editing therapy to halve bad cholesterol

MELBOURNE: Researchers in Australia have led a first-in-human trial for a breakthrough gene-editing therapy that halves bad cholesterol and triglycerides in people with difficult-to-treat lipid disorders.

The trial tested CTX310, a one-time CRISPR-Cas9 geneediting therapy that uses fat-based particles to carry CRISPR editing tools into the liver, switching off the ANGPTL3 gene. Turning off this gene lowers LDL (bad) cholesterol and triglycerides, two blood fats linked to heart disease, according to a statement released by Australia's Monash University.

The Victorian Heart Hospital, operated by Monash Health in partnership with Monash University, treated three of 15 patients aged 18-75 years with difficult-to-treat lipid disorders in phase 1 of the global trial conducted across Australia, New Zealand, and Brit-

ain, the statement said, Xinhua news agency reported.

At the highest dose, a singlecourse treatment with CTX310 resulted in a mean reduction of LDL cholesterol by 50 percent and triglycerides by 55 percent, remaining low for at least 60 days after two weeks of treatment, it said, adding LDL cholesterol and triglycerides were reduced by nearly 60 percent among all participants with various doses, with only mild, short-term side effects

reported.

Importantly, CTX310 is the first therapy to achieve large reductions in both LDL cholesterol and triglycerides at the same time, marking a potential breakthrough for people with mixed lipid disorders who have elevations in both, according to the trial published in the New England Journal of Medicine.

"The possibility of a singlecourse treatment with lasting effects could be a major step in how we prevent heart disease," said Stephen Nicholls, Director of the Victorian Heart Hospital, and study lead investigator.

"It makes treatment easier, reduces ongoing costs, relieves pressure on the health system, all while improving a person's quality of life," Nicholls said, emphasizing plans to focus on larger and more diverse patient populations in future trials of CTX310. IANS

Study finds pregnancy hypertension raises women's cardiovascular risk

UTAH: Women who experience hypertensive disorders of pregnancy (HDP) face significantly higher risks of cardiovascular complications, including heart attack, stroke, heart failure, and death, within five years of giving birth, according to a new study by Intermountain Health researchers.

The study found that women who experienced HDP during pregnancy were significantly more likely to develop serious cardiovascular-related issues compared to those without HDP. These findings underscore the growing body of evidence over the past two decades linking pregnancy-related hypertension to long-term maternal health risks.

"Any form of hypertension during pregnancy significantly increases cardiovascular risk and the risk of death," said Kismet Rasmusson, NP, principal investigator of the study and an advanced practice clinician with Intermountain Health's Advanced Heart Failure Program. "This risk is present in women with chronic hypertension prior to pregnancy, and it's even more

pronounced when compounded by severe forms of HDP, such as eclampsia."

The findings were presented at the American Heart Association Scientific analyzed 218,141 live births involving 157,606 patients across 22 Intermountain Health hospitals between 2017 and 2024. They reviewed electronic medical

In this retrospective study, researchers

records for diagnoses of chronic hypertension and hypertensive disorders of pregnancy, including gestational hypertension, preeclampsia, and eclampsia. Patients were then monitored for cardiovascular disease for an average of five years following delivery.

19.7 per cent of patients had an HDP diagnosis, with most cases occurring during the first live birth. Patients with HDP had significantly more cardiovascular risk factors, including obesity, smoking, diabetes, hyperlipidemia, depression, and lower socioeconomic status. HDP was most strongly associated with increased risk of heart failure (3 to 13 greater risk), but also for stroke (2-17 greater risk), heart attack (3 to 7 greater risk), coronary artery disease (2 to 7 greater risk), and death (1.4 to 4 greater risk).

The severity of HDP correlated with higher cardiovascular risk. Women with chronic hypertension and eclampsia had the greatest risk of future cardiovascular events compared to those without HDP.

Despite these alarming statistics, many pregnant women remain unaware of the long-term cardiovascular risks associated with HDP. ANI

India's bio-economy likely to reach \$300 billion in coming years: Dr Jitendra Singh

NEW DELHI: India's bio-economy, which rose from \$10 billion to over \$130 billion in about 10 years, is projected to reach \$300 billion in the coming years, Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh said.

Speaking at an event here, Dr Singh observed that India is already initiated into next industrial revolution driven by biotechnology.

The minister noted that India is one of the few countries to have an exclusive dedicated Biotechnology policy 'BiOE3'. He commended the Department of Biotechnology (DBT) for emerging as one of the most dynamic and integrated scientific ecosystems in the Government of India

Additionally, the minister also launched BRIC-BIRAC Entrepreneur-in-Residence (EIR) Programme.

The Union Minister recalled that under the visionary leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the decision to merge 14 autonomous biotechnology institutions

under a single umbrella - BRIC -- was a transformative reform that strengthened coordination, innovation, and impact across India's biotechnology sector.

The minister said that the integration of institutions under BRIC reflects the spirit of "synergized working" in Indian

science. "The age of silos is over. We have moved towards collaboration across biotechnology, medical research, agriculture, and data-driven science. BRIC now partners not only with other science departments but also with IITs, medical institutions, and private industry

to accelerate innovation," he added.

Dr. Singh noted that biotechnology has become the key driver of India's growth in the Fourth Industrial Revolution.

Referring to the recently launched BioE3 Policy, he said India has positioned itself among the global frontruppers in bio-innovation.

The minister stated that when the next phase of global economic growth will be biotechnology-driven, India will not be a follower; it will be a leader.

Dr. Rajesh S Gokhale, Secretary, DBT and DG, BRIC, highlighted the achievements of BRIC institutions over the past three years - 3,190 publications, 107 patents, 13 technologies commercialized, 2,578 PhD scholars, and 678 post-doctoral fellows currently contributing to the research network.

He also noted that BRIC ranks number one in biological sciences in India, as per Nature's Pringles Index. *IANS*

Nagaland University researchers unlock medicinal secrets of rare Meghalaya plant

KOHIMA: A research team from Nagaland University, the only Central University in the state, has partnered with an Assam-based private varsity to carry out the first comprehensive scientific study on Goniothalamussimonsii, an endangered and endemic medicinal plant found in the forests of Meghalaya.

Long used by indigenous communities to treat gastrointestinal complications, throat irritation, typhoid fever, and malaria,

this plant had never before been studied for its scientific or pharmacological potential.

Nagaland University officials said that the study provides scientific validation for the plant's traditional use and reveals that G. simonsii is a rich

source of bioactive phytochemicals with potent antioxidant, antimicrobial, and anticancer activities.

Using advanced analytical tools and computational modeling, the team demonstrated how natural compounds from this species interact with cancer-related proteins, offering valuable leads for the devel-

opment of new, nature-based therapeutic drugs.

The Research was led by Dr Mayur Mausoom Phukan, faculty, Nagaland University, with his student Samson Rosly Sangma.

The findings were published in October 2025 in a reputable journal. The paper was co-authored by Sangma, research scholar; Dr Phukan, Assistant Professor, Department of Forestry; Dr Pranay Punj

Pankaj, Associate Professor, Department of Zoology, Vahshi Chongloi, Research Scholar of the Nagaland University and Dr Dhrubajyoti Gogoi, Assistant Professor of the Assambased private varsity

this research, Prof. Jagadish K Patnaik, Vice Chancellor, Nagaland University, said, "Nagaland University, in collaboration with Assam's private University, have undertaken the first comprehensive scientific study on Goniothalamussimonsii, an endangered and endemic medicinal plant native to the forests of Meghalaya." *IANS*

Scientists find brain cells that can stop Alzheimer's: Study

WASHINGTON DC: Researchers have identified special immune cells in the brain that help slow Alzheimer's disease. This microglia, work to reduce inflammation and block the spread of harmful proteins. They appear to protect memory and brain health, offering a promising new direction for therapy.

In a study published November 5 in Nature, the team found that microglia with

lower levels of a transcription factor called PU.1 and higher expression of a receptor known as CD28 help reduce brain inflammation.

These specialized microglia also slow the buildup of amyloid plaques and the spread of toxic tau proteins,

which are both major hallmarks of Alzheimer's.

PU.1 is a protein that binds to specific DNA regions, helping control which genes are activated or silenced. CD28 found on the surface of T cells, acts as a signaling receptor that supports immune cell activation and communication.

How Protective Microglia Work

Using mouse models of Alzheimer's, as well as human brain cells and tissue samples, the researchers showed that reducing PU.1 levels encourages microglia to express immune-regulating receptors typically found in lymphoid cells.

Although these protective microglia make up only a small portion of total microglia, their effect is widespread: they suppress inflammation throughout the

> brain and help preserve memory and survival in mice.

> When the scientists removed CD28 from this specific microglial subset, inflammation worsened and plaque growth increased, confirming that CD28 plays an essential role in keeping these brain-

protective cells active.

"Microglia are not simply destructive responders in Alzheimer's disease -- they can become the brain's protectors," said Anne Schaefer, MD, PhD, Professor in the Nash Family Department of Neuroscience at the Icahn School of Medicine, Co-Director of the Center for Glial Biology at The Friedman Brain Institute. *ANI*

To grow spiritually, you must take an interest in consciousness, which means setting out to find your source.



Wrestling with Giants: India's Strategic Maneuvers In A Tri-Polar World

ndia's position in the current US-Russia-China tri-polar geopolitical contest, imagined as a virtual wrestling arena, is that of a flexible, fiercely autonomous contender using a multi-alignment strategy to maximize influence while reducing vulnerability to any single great power. In this new era of transactional diplomacy and shifting alliances, India's choices and challenges have a significant impact on the global power balance.

World A Wrestling Ring

Imagine the world stage as a massive wrestling ring, with three heavyweights - the United States, China, and Russia, each battling for top dominance. India, once seen as an outsider or a secondary contender, now steps onto the mat as a strong, smart "swing power." In 2025, unlike during the Cold War, India's eco-

foreign policy, enabling it to interact with all powers without relying on any one of them. This principle is rooted in India's history of non-alignment. Still, its modern variant, multi-alignment, involves the country's participation in rival blocs, such as the QUAD (with the US and Japan), BRICS (with China and Russia), the SCO, and others.

With the US, India is a vital player in the Indo-Pacific strategy, sought by Washington as a bulwark against China. High-tech and defense collaboration has grown, and India is the USA's natural partner in defense, technology, counterterrorism, and economic rivalry with Beijing.

With Russia, despite Western pressure, India maintains strong arms and energy ties with Moscow, using Russian support at the UN and hedging against

nomic strength, demographic advantage, and strategic insight put it nearly on equal footing with the established giants.

This arena is not just a test of brute force. Here, agility, adaptability, and the ability to exploit shifting alignments are as necessary as strength or historic alliances. India's role is not just that of a contender, but a "strategic balancer", a key pivot point that determines future outcomes. India's position is not that of a camp follower, but a crucial player that keeps the balance of power in constant flux.

Multi-Alignment: India's Winning Strategy

India's doctrine of "strategic autonomy" forms the basis of its

over-reliance on the West. Recent defense deals and energy arrangements are a deliberate hedge against global volatility.

The relationship between China and the West is characterized by both rivalry and interdependence. Trade volumes are high, but border disputes and China's encirclement strategy pose a challenge to New Delhi's security. India's participation in forums with China is calculated diplomacy, not deference.

India's success lies in maintaining flexibility. In the face of changing alliances and shifting power dynamics, India has successfully engaged, hedged, and extracted concessions from all sides. This adaptability, coupled

with its leadership in the Global South and its advocacy for multipolarity, has projected India as a resilient and influential player in the global arena.

Navigating Hostility and Opportunity

This "wrestling match" is not without risk. China's assertive posturing, whether in South Asia, the Indian Ocean, or against Indian allies, means India faces constant jabs and probing holds by a neighbor determined to expand its influence. The border skirmishes, economic competition, and strategic encirclement by the Belt and Road Initiative have prompted India to strengthen its ties with the US and diversify its defense relationships beyond Russia.

Economic opportunities are plentiful, but so are vulnerabilities. The US's protectionist stance, tariff threats, and inconsistent signals can expose India to risks. Russian weaknesses are pushing Moscow closer to Beijing, limiting India's options in Eurasia and the energy sector. In this environment, India must constantly navigate, respond, and adapt, protecting its role as a "third pole" and preventing the conflict from becoming a solely Sino-US or Sino-Russian struggle.

Much like a wrestler studies every move of his opponents, India monitors, anticipates, and uses the actions of the big three.

• Economic Diversification. India expands trade and technology cooperation with the EU, Japan, the Middle East, Africa, ASEAN, and Latin America. It aims to become the world's factory, supply chain hub, and services leader, while balancing dependence on any single market.

INDIA GLOBAL HUB FOR RECYCLING

India has potential to become a global hub for recycling due to its strong existing recycling infrastructure, lower operational costs, and growing demand for recycled materials in sectors like textiles, e-waste and batteries. By investing in advanced technologies, improving enforcement against illegal practices, and strategic import of waste for processing, India can expand its current capabilities to become a significant player in global recycling.

India already has a culture of recycling, particularly with a world-leading PET bottle collection rate of 95%. Lower operational costs compared to developed countries make India an economically attractive option for processing waste. Strong growth in sectors like steel, driven by infrastructure and manufacturing initiatives, creates a high demand for recycled raw materials. There is significant growth potential in areas like e-waste, tire recycling, plastics recovery, and lithium-ion battery recycling. Foreign companies are showing interest in establishing plants in India, indicating confidence in its potential for a major recycling hub.

India has a large workforce, including skilled women who specialize in sorting, and there exists necessary talent of metallurgy and chemical engineering, required for complex recycling processes. To move beyond basic recycling and meet the demand for higher-quality materials, investment in advanced recycling technologies is needed.

Strict enforcement of existing rules and a crackdown on illegal practices, such as the misclassification and export of e-waste and batteries, is crucial for legitimate growth. A focus on high-value materials like lithium-ion batteries could solidify India's position in the global market of importing spent batteries for processing and creating a closed-loop system.


India's textile recycling efforts are already gaining momentum, particularly in states of Gujarat, Maharashtra, and Tamil Nadu. These regions have become key hubs for textile recycling, where cutting-edge technologies turn textile waste into valuable, reusable fabrics. These regions are focused on technologies that break down waste textiles into raw materials, which are reused to produce new fabrics and garments.

Austria is said to be world's leading country for recycling in a new study by Reloop and Eunomia Research and Consulting. Wales leads the way in the UK, coming in at number 2. Northern Ireland was ranked 9th England at 11th and Scotland at 15th among the 48 countries included in the comparison.

The diverse recycling market size in India is projected to grow significantly across different segments, with the waste recycling services market valued at USD 3.11 billion in 2024 and projected to USD 6.99 billion by 2033. The plastics recycling market was worth approximately USD 4.09 billion in 2024 and expected to grow to USD 6.93 billion by 2033. The e-waste recycling market forecast is USD 3.35 billion by 2031.

The "biggest" recycling company in India, varies by material recycled, with CMR Green Technologies Ltd. being the largest in metal recycling; Pashupati Group a major in plastics recycling and sustainability, is one of India's largest integrated recyclers with comprehensive services for various waste types. Attero Recycling is a leading e-waste recycler; and Ganesha Ecosph Ltd. is a major company in plastics recycling for the textile and packaging sectors.

Hope India can take advantage and become the leader in recycling for rare materials needed for advancement of I.T. Sector.


