NEW DELHI: The Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal, stated recently that the global community has shown a clear understanding of India's plight and recognized that the Pahalgam terrorist attack targeted Indian tourists and that the epicenter of terrorism lies across the border in Pakistan.

He said that numerous foreign leaders have acknowledged India's right to defend itself and protect its citizens, emphasizing that the epicenter of terrorism is in Pakistan.

While addressing a question of India and Pakistan 'hyphenation,' Jaiswal, while addressing the MEA briefing, said, "There is widespread understanding in the world

that Indian tourists were the victims of terrorism at Pahalgam and that the epicenter of terrorism is across the border in Pakistan. A number of foreign leaders, in their conversations with Indian counterparts, recognized India's right to defend itself and protect its people."

He added, "I also draw your attention to the UN Security Council press statement of 25th April, which states that - 'there is a need to uphold perpetrators, organizers, financiers and sponsors of this reprehensible act of terrorism accountable and bring them to justice.' He added, "I also draw your attention to the UN Security Council press statement of 25th April, which states that - 'there is a need to uphold perpetrators, organizers, financiers and sponsors of this reprehensible act of terrorism accountable and bring them to justice.' They further stressed that those responsible for these killings should be held accountable."

Jaiswal also spoke about the abeyance of the Indus Water Treaty (IWT) and highlighted

that while the treaty was originally founded on the principles of goodwill and friendship, "Pakistan held these principles in abeyance by its promotion of cross-border terrorism."

"After the CCS (Cabinet Committee on Security) decision, the Indus Water Treaty has been put in abeyance. I would also like to take you back a little. The IWT was concluded in the spirit of goodwill and friendship as specified in the preamble of the treaty. However, Pakistan has held these principles in abeyance by its promotion of cross-border terrorism for several decades now. Now, as per the CCS decision, India will keep the treaty in abeyance until Pakistan credibly and irrevocably abjures its support for cross-border terrorism. Please note that climate change, demographic shifts and technological changes have created new realities on the

Jaiswal, during the press briefing, also stated that Pakistan's attempt to escape the consequences of its actions is futile, given its long history of supporting terrorism. He highlighted that the terrorist infrastructure sites destroyed by India were responsible for the deaths of not only Indians but also many other innocents around the world.

"We have seen the statement made by the Pakistani side. That a nation which has nurtured terrorism on an industrial scale should think that it can escape the consequences is fooling itself. The terrorist infrastructure sites that India destroyed were responsible not only for the deaths of Indians but also of many other innocents around the world. There is now a new normal. The sooner Pakistan gets used to it, the better," he said.

Jaiswal's remarks came after Pakistan's Foreign Minister, Ishaq Dar, in his first interview since India and Pakistan's cessation of hostilities, said that Islamabad "had no choice" but to launch strikes in "self-defense" following India's May 7 cross-border attacks.

Dar referred to India's strikes as a "war" and a "wishful attempt to establish its hegemony" and claimed that "We were very sure that our conventional capacity and capabilities are strong enough that we will beat them both in the air and on the ground." ANI

Breaking down Pak's fake narrative factory: How it colluded with 'allies' to launch 'info war' against India

NEW DELHI: India's Operation Sindoor gave a deadly blow to Pakistan, demolished its terror infrastructure and also left its political leadership humiliated and exposed before the world.

The Indian military decimated its safe havens for terrorists as well as Pakistani air bases in response to its escalation; however, the rogue nation stuck to its character and kept upping the ante against Indian action.

Defeated on the battlefield, it opened a new front against India and desperately attempted to sell false narratives about India's 'defeat', the fall of its fighter jets, to project itself as a 'winner' in the digital space. A couple of its friendly nations, allegedly Turkiye and China, also helped it in peddling this fabricated narrative by tacit or direct means.

An X user has documented a chain of events as to how Pakistan engaged in a blitz of 'information warfare' and peddled full-blown propaganda to paint India in a poor light and get itself an upper hand.

As India struck its popular airstrip and airbases, Pakistan started leveraging its access to Western media to push anti-India propaganda. Pakistan journalists at CNN, Reuters, Bloomberg, and NYT began publishing anti-India narratives with baseless claims and without any evi-

dence, claimed the X user.

Instances of data fudging, doctored videos for the anti-India narrative

On May 8, DG ISPR peddled its first official lie as it claimed that the Pakistan Army didn't attack civilian areas in Amritsar and accused India of 'false flag'. The very next day, they went on chest-thumping, celebrating Pakistan's attack in Amritsar.

DG ISPR, addressing the media, played a doctored clip of Wing Commander Vyomika Singh 'admitting' to Pakistan's attack, however, the fact was that the Pakistani Army's spokesperson conveniently cut out a part from the video,

where the officer was explaining how Pakistan targeted civilian areas.

On May 1, 2025, Pakistan's ISPR ran a disinformation campaign by circulating 'classified RAW documents' to target India.

On May 11, DGISPR used a 2-yearold image from 2023 to falsely show their Navy's preparedness against India

DGISPR also manipulated a news clip from a reputed Indian news channel and claimed that an Indian airfield was destroyed, however, the original footage was about Pakistan's airfield being hit by Indian forces. *IANS*



Baloch forum blames Pakistan army for civilian assault

BALOCHISTAN: As Pakistan continues to rain atrocities on Baloch residents, the Baloch Women Forum (BWF) strongly criticized the recent rocket launcher attack on the residence of Jangiyan Baloch, a civilian in the Balicha area of Tump Tehsil, district Kech.

Taking to the social media platform X, BWF alleged that the assault was carried out by "death squads," the locally operating armed groups with the purported backing of law enforcement agencies of Balochistan.

The forum stated, "We, the Baloch Women Forum (BWF), denounce the ugly attack of rocket launchers on

According to X handle, the incident left three members of Jangiyan Baloch's family injured -- his son Nawaz Jangiyan, daughter-in-law Ayesha Mulla Raza, and wife Modho Naik Bakht.

The BWF highlighted that the armed factions in the re-

gion freely perpetrate violence, destabilizing society while remaining shielded from justice. And, with the tacit support of the state, these groups act as instruments of chaos, immune to law and accountability.

"These groups have been given a free hand to destabilize the social order," the BWF stated. "They function with impunity and are unaccountable due to the backing they receive from state institutions."

The Forum also expressed deep concern over the deteriorating security conditions in Tump, describing it as one of the most gravely impacted regions in Balochistan.

> It accused armed groups in the area of orchestrating targeted killings, enforced disappearances, and assaults on civilians, all of which are fueling an escalating climate of lawlessness and fear.

> The Baloch Women Forum in the resort to combat

the rising human right abuses demanded several actions which included measures like an immediate end to what it described as "illegal privileges" granted to armed militias, a permanent halt to human rights violations in Trump and the wider Balochistan region, and a transparent and impartial inquiry into the rocket attack on Jangiyan Baloch's home, with legal action against the perpetrators. Furthermore, it also called for medical and financial assistance for the injured and their family. ANI

BSF jawan Purnam Kumar Shaw returns home after 21 days in Pakistani custody, family celebrates

KOLKATA: BSF constable Purnam Kumar Shaw was repatriated to India on Wednesday (14 May), after spending 21 days in Pakistani custody.

Shaw had inadvertently crossed into Pakistan territory

while on operational duty in the Ferozepur sector on April 23, 2025, and was detained by Pakistan Rangers.

Family members of BSF Jawan Purnam Kumar Shaw celebrated the news of his repatriation to India by distributing sweets.

Following the cessation of hostilities, diplomatic efforts between India and Pakistan facilitated the repatriation process. Shaw was handed over to Indian authorities at the Joint Check Post Attari in Punjab at 10:30

in accordance with established protocols.

Shaw's family, who had been anxiously waiting for his return, celebrated the news of his repatriation with great government to ensure her husband's safe return.

West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee expressed her happiness and relief after Border Security Force Constable Purnam Kumar Shaw was repatriated

from Pakistan to India.

Taking to the social media platform X, Banerjee shared that she had been in close contact with Shaw's family throughout the ordeal, offering her best wishes to the jawan, his wife Rajni Shaw, and their entire family.

"I am happy to receive the information that our Purnam Kumar Shaw, the BSF jawan, has been released. I had all along been in touch with his family and spoke thrice with his wife here at Rishra, Hugli. Today, I also called her. All the

very best wishes for my brother-like jawan, his entire family including his wife Rajni Shaw," Banerjee stated in her

Balochistan is not Pakistan: Baloch leader declares independence from Pakistan, seeks support from India and global community

BALOCHISTAN: Baloch representative Mir Yar Baloch on Wednesday 14 May, declared independence from Pakistan, citing decades of violence, enforced disappearances, and human rights violations

In a post on X, he said the people of Balochistan have given their "national verdict" and that the world must no longer stay silent.

"Tum Maroge Hum Neklengy, Hum Nasal Bachany Nekly Hain, Aao Hamara Sath Do. Baloch people across Pakistan Occupied Balochistan are up on streets and this is their national verdict that Balochistan Is Not Pakistan and world can't be a silent spectator any more," he said.

He also urged Indian citizens, especially media, YouTubers, and intellectuals, to avoid calling Balochs "Pakistan's own people.'

"Baloch Narrative!! Dear Indians patriot media, the YouTube comrades, the intellectuals fighting to defend Bharat are suggested not to refer to Balochs as 'Pakistan's Own People.' We are not Pakistani, we are Balochistani. Pakistan's own people are the Punjabi who never faced air bombings, enforced disappearances and genocide," the Baloch leader said,

Mir Yar Baloch also expressed full support for India's stand on Pakistan-occupied Jammu Kashmir (PoJK). He urged the international community to pressure Pakistan to vacate the region.

Mir Yar said, "14 May 2025- Balochistan fully supports the India decision of asking Pakistan to vacate PoK. The international community must urge Pakistan to immediately leave PoK to avoid another humiliation of surrender on its 93,000 army personnel in Dhaka. India is capable of defeating Pakistan army and if Pakistan didn't pay any heed then the only Pakistani greedy army generals must be held responsible for bloodshed because Islamabad is using PoK people as human shields."

He also called for recognition and support from India and the global community for Balochistan's in-

According to Mir Yar Baloch, the world must not accept Pakistan's narrative on Balochistan, which, he said, was forcibly annexed with the involvement of foreign powers.

Balochistan has long witnessed serious human rights violations. These include enforced disappearances, extrajudicial killings, and silencing of dissent. Both Pakistani security forces and armed groups have been accused of abuses.

Civilians often suffer in the ongoing conflict, with little media access or legal accountability. While international concern has grown, meaningful intervention remains lacking. ANI

Devotees throng Hanoi to offer prayers to holy Buddha relics sent from India

HANOI: Vietnam's Hanoi came to a standstill as a large crowd thronged the capital city from across the country gathered outside the Buddhist temple Quan Su Pagoda on Wednesday 14 May, to pay their obeisance to the Holy Buddhist Relics sent from India.

"The mood of festivity and the excitement in the air is something people of Hanoi have not seen in a long time, as the crowd chanted -- 'the Buddha has arrived'," said the International Buddhist Confederation

Around 5 lakh people had gathered on the streets to welcome the sacred relics as it entered the Vietnamese capital on Tuesday. People were high on emotions, with many weeping and praying while others chanted aloud.

The sacred relics of Lord Buddha from India were enshrined in the Buddhist temple Quan Su Pagoda in Hanoi the same day, with ceremonial ritual and prayers conducted by monks from India and Vietnam. The relics will be displayed in the Buddhist temple till May 16.

"Holy Buddha Relics from Sarnath, India, arrived in Hanoi today and enshrined at Quan Su Pagoda till May 16, 2025, with due ceremonies and prayers by monks from India and Vietnam," the Embassy of India in Hanoi posted on X.

Earlier, External Affairs Minister (EAM) S. Jaishankar



extended wishes on the Vesak Day, also known as Buddha Purnima, highlighting shared cultural ties with Vietnam, where over one million people prayed at the sacred Buddha relics sent from India.

"On this Vesak Day, also deeply moved to see over one million people in Vietnam pay respects to and pray at the Buddhist Holy Relics, which travelled from India. Indeed, a clear reflection of our age-old connect, shared culture and special ties," said EAM Jaishankar.

India's sending of the holy relics to Vietnam has been appreciated by Vietnamese President Luong Cuong as a gesture that has further strengthened the strong spiritual and cultural ties between both countries.

The holy relics were brought from India on May 2 by a Union Minister of Parliamentary and Minority Affairs, Kiren Rijiju-led Indian delegation, which also included Andhra Pradesh Minister Kandula Durgesh and senior monks and officials.

The holy relics will remain in Vietnam until May 21 as part of the UN Day of Vesak celebrations. The relics were earlier displayed at Thanh Tam Pagoda in Ho Chi Minh City, and then in Ba Den Mountain in Tay Ninh province and are currently in Hanoi.

Recently, the Consulate General of India in Ho Chi Minh City attended the enshrining ceremony of the Holy Relic of Lord Buddha held at Ba Den Mountain in Tay Ninh province on May 8.

EAM Jaishankar congratulates Anita Anand on appointment as Canada's Foreign Minister

NEW DELHI: External Affairs Minister (EAM) S Jaishankar has congratulated Anita Anand on her appointment as the Foreign Minister of Canada in the newly elected Carney government.

In a post on X, the EAM said, "Congratulate @AnitaAnandMP on your appointment as Canada's Minister of Foreign Affairs."

Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney unveiled a 38-member cabinet, comprising 28 ministers and 10 Secretaries of State.

The Cabinet is supported by 10 Secretaries of State who will provide dedicated leadership on key issues and priorities within their minister's portfolio.

One of the key faces of the newly unveiled cabinet includes Indian-origin Anita Anand, who has been appointed as the Minister of Foreign Affairs.

Following the unveiling of the new Cabinet, Carney outlined the government's top priorities -- creating new economic and security relationships with the United States, tackling the cost of living, and strengthening Canada's economy.

Sharing a post on X, Carney wrote, "Canada, meet your new Cabinet. This is a team that is empowered and expected to lead. Together, we will create a new economic and security relationship with the United States and build a stronger economy -- the strongest economy in the G7."

In another post, he wrote, "Canadians elected this new

government with a strong mandate: to define a new economic and security relationship with the United States, bring down the cost of living, and build a stronger economy. This new cabinet is focused, ready, and built for this moment."

On April 29, Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratu-

lated Mark J. Carney on his election as the Prime Minister of Canada, extending warm wishes to the Liberal Party for their electoral victory.

Posting on X, PM Modi wrote, "Congratulations Mark J Carney on your election as the Prime Minister of Canada and to the Liberal Party on their victory. India and Canada are bound by shared democratic values, a steadfast commitment to the rule of law, and vibrant people-to-people ties. I look forward to working with you to strengthen our partnership and unlock greater opportunities for

our people."

Carney had taken over the leadership from Justin Trudeau, who resigned towards the end of his term after losing the confidence of his party.

Unlike his predecessor, Trudeau, whose tenure saw strained relations with India following his allegations regarding the killing of NIA-designated terrorist Hardeep Nijjar, Carney has publicly advocated for improving ties with India. He notably extended condolences following the Pahalgam terror attack, signaling a commitment to strengthening India-Canada relations. *ANI*

India slams China's preposterous renaming attempts of places in Arunachal Pradesh

NEW DELHI: India has categorically rejected China's vain and preposterous attempts to rename places in the Indian state of Arunachal Pradesh and emphasized that such maneuvers would not change the reality that Arunachal Pradesh was, is, and will always remain an integral and inalienable part of India.

Spokesperson of the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), Randhir Jaiswal, made the remarks while responding to the media queries on the renaming of places in Arunachal Pradesh by China.

Jaiswal said, "We have noticed that China has persisted with its vain and preposterous attempts to name places in the Indian state of Arunachal Pradesh. Consistent with our principled position, we reject such attempts categorically."

He added that such "creative naming" will not alter the undeniable reality that Arunachal Pradesh is an integral part of India.

"Creative naming will not alter the undeniable reality that Arunachal Pradesh was, is, and will always remain an integral and inalienable part of India", he said.

In the past, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar had said, "If today I change the name of your house, will it become mine? Arunachal Pradesh was, is and will always be a state of India. Changing names does not have an effect."

"I think we rightly called it senseless. By doing it repeatedly, it is still senseless. So I want to be very clear. Arunachal Pradesh was, is, and will always be India," he had said. The EAM had also emphasized, "I hope I am saying it so clearly that not only in the country but beyond the country also, people get that message very, very clearly," Jaishankar emphasized. ANI

Gaurav Jaisingh, a student of Bentley University, Massachusetts, was on an annual senior class trip. Reports suggested that Jaisingh, a native of Shrewsbury, Massachusetts, was a member of the Delta Sigma Pi fraternity and the South Asian Students Association of the University.

Bentley University took to social media, grieving the tragic loss of the student.

"It's been a difficult few days, and our community is feeling the emotional toll of the tragic loss of Gaurav Jaisingh '25. Our hearts go out to Gaurav's family and friends. We plan to honor Gaurav at the undergraduate commencement ceremony," the university said in a post on X.

The Royal Bahamas Police Force earlier confirmed the incident, stating that Jaisingh fell from an upper-level balcony while inside his hotel room with other roommates. *IANS*

nline video conference on May 9 was hosted by American Community Media (ACOM), and several panelists explored the question of whether the United States is drifting toward authoritarianism. A new ABC News/Washington Post/Ipsos poll finds that 49% of respondents believe the new administration is expanding its authority, violating the rule of law and moving the nation away from its

founding principles.

Lucan Ahmad Way, a professor at the Department of Political Science at the University of Toronto, pointed out that the current situation in the United States is different from the rise of autocracies in other countries. He believes that the actions of the administration show a more rapid and drastic change, which is different from the slow and authoritarian path of most countries in the past that relied on legal reforms He emphasized

that when government leaders challenge the rule of law, it not only damages the independence of the judiciary, but may also endanger the overall democratic system.

Gloria J. Browne-Marshall, a law professor at the City University of New York (CUNY), pointed out that there have been many constitutional crises in the past when the United States dealt with the rights of African Americans and other marginalized groups. She emphasized that the new administration's policies, especially on the rights of immigrants, refugees and other minority groups, show clear authoritarian tendencies. She warned that when governments violate basic human rights of certain groups, this behavior can expand and ultimately threaten the rights and freedoms of all members of society.





Terror in Pahalgam: The World Cannot Ignore Pakistan's role in Destabilizing Kashmir

n April 22, 2025, the tranquil valley of Pahalgam in Kashmir (India) was devastated by a brutal act of terrorism. Twenty-six Hindu tourists were murdered in what survivors describe as a coordinated, targeted assault-an act meant to intimidate, divide, and disrupt.

According to eyewitness accounts, the assailants separated Hindu men from their families, identifying their religion through names, forced recitations, and even invasive physical checks. This chilling pattern of violence echoes the threats issued to Kashmiri Pandits in 1990-"Raliv, Galiv, ya Chaliv" ("Convert, Leave, or Die")-which led to the forced displacement of over 150,000 Kashmiri Pundits.

The Indian government stated the attack was orchestrated by Pakistan-based terrorist groups, including Lashkar-e-Taiba and its proxy, The Resistance Front. This would add to a long and painful history of cross-border terrorism enabled by Pakistan's military and intelligence establishments.

A Threat to Peace and Progress

The Pahalgam massacre is not an isolated incident. It is a deliberate attempt to reverse the progress seen in Jammu and Kashmir in recent years. Since the abrogation of Article 370, the region has witnessed a remarkable revival. In 2024 alone, 2.36 crore tourists visited Kashmir- up from just 34.7 lakh in 2000. Young Kashmiris are increasingly turning away from violence and embracing opportunity.

For extremist groups and their state sponsors, Kashmir's return to normalcy is threatening. So is the global support India continues to receive. Just days ago, U.S. Vice President J.D. Vance visited India to strengthen diplomatic and trade ties. This attack, likely timed for maximum disruption, sought to reframe the Kashmir issue through bloodshed, not diplomacy.

The Global Dimension

Pakistan's recent hosting of a Kashmir-focused conference in PoK was attended by Hamas spokesperson Khalid al-Khoudousi underscores growing ideological ties between South Asian and Middle Eastern jihadist movements. The tactical similarity between the Pahalgam attack and Hamas's October 7 atrocities in Israel is deeply troubling.

This is no longer a regional matter. It is a global threat that demands a global response. The Punjab Unity Alliance calls on the international community to:

- Re-list Pakistan on the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) grey list until all terror infrastructure is dismantled.
- Pressure Pakistan's military and intelligence agencies to end support for extremist proxies.
- Hold accountable those who perpetrate or enable cross-border to a serious.

We also urge Indian authorities to ensure the safety of all citizens and visitors, and to hold accountable any individuals or institutions responsible for security lapses in Pahalgam.

A Call for Unity and Accountability

Silence in the face of targeted religious violence only emboldens its perpetrators. We urge elected officials of Indian origin around the world-and all defenders of justice-to condemn this act in the strongest possible terms.

This is a defining moment. The world must choose between appearsement and accountability, between allowing terrorism to fester or, standing firmly against it.

The Pahalgam massacre must not be allowed to fade from memory. It must become a rallying cry-for justice, for security, and for peace.

Indian American Cancer Scientists Honored with Prestigious Awards for Groundbreaking Discoveries

Trojan-horse approaches, and phagocytosis evasion strategies. The laboratory also anchors a Center for Physical Energy Therapeutics that evaluates new strategies of combining localized physical energy therapeutics (ionizing and non-ionizing radiation of all flavors, thermal therapies, ultrasound) with targeted therapeutics (custom nanoparticles, antibody-drug conjugates, targeted protein degraders, immune-therapeutics) in a one-two punch synthetical lethality approach. Dr. Krishnan's laboratory research has been continuously funded by peer-reviewed extramural grants for over 15-years, the majority of these being from the National Institutes of Health.

Dr. Krishnan has authored and coauthored over 300 peer-reviewed manuscripts, co-edited three textbooks, coauthored 20 book chapters, been awarded five patents (with six pending), and served as editor of multiple scientific journals including as editor-in-chief of Cancer Nanotechnology. His publications have been cited over 28,000 times; his h-index is above 95, and more than 95 of his papers have been cited over 100 times (I100 index of 95) highlighting the impact of his research work within the scientific community. He enjoys working with students at all stages of their academic career, leading an outstanding research team of clinicians and scientists, and collaborating with colleagues across departments and institutions. In particular, this manifests as interactions at the intersection of the physical and biological sciences, where there is much to be learned from otherwise nonintersecting disciplines.

Dr. Krishnan's dedication to advancing cancer research and improving patient outcomes via novel therapeutics has been recognized with numerous awards and honors. He is an elected fellow of the American College of Physicians, the American Society for Radiation Oncology, and the American Institute for Medical and Biological Engineers, the Royal Society of Chemistry, the Institute of Physics, rounding out a trifecta of physics, chemistry, and biology recognitions. He has served as cochair of the GI Translational Research Committee of the Radiation Therapy Oncology Group/NRG Oncology, chair of the gastrointestinal scientific program committee and education committee of the American Society for Radiation Oncology, and a consultant for liver cancers and advisor for rectal cancers at the International Atomic Energy Agency.

Dr. Chandan Guha serves as Professor, Vice Chairman, and founding Director of the Einstein Institute for Onco-Physics at Montefiore Medical Center and Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York. He also holds the prestigious Harry Eagle Chair in Cancer Research, National Women's Division, and is a Professor of Pathology and Urology. Originally trained in medicine at the University of Calcutta and later earning his PhD in immunology from the Medical University of South Carolina, Dr. Guha was among the first scientists in the 1990s to explore how radiation therapy could stimulate the immune system - a concept that laid the groundwork for modern in situ tumor vaccines.

Over the past three decades, Dr. Guha's groundbreaking research has produced major innovations, including the development of Radiation-enhanced Autologous in situ Tumor Vaccines and LOTUS (Low Intensity Therapeutic Ultrasound-activated Immune Response) against cancer therapy. His work spans critical contributions in pancreatic cancer

Dr. Guha's entrepreneurial spirit is matched by his scientific rigor - his translational research efforts have led to clinical trials across the U.S., India, and China, including at the Shanghai Proton and Heavy Ion Center where he served as the first Director of Translational Oncology.

Dr. Guha's career stands as a testament to the power of visionary science, bold innovation, and a deep commitment to improving human health. His work continues to drive transformative change across oncology, regenerative medicine, and radiobiology - inspiring the next generation of scientific leaders.

Dr. Prasad Adusumilli is a Professor and Vice Chair of Translational Research in the Department of Surgery at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, New York. Dr. Adusumilli serves as Deputy Chief of Thoracic Surgery and performs complex and minimally invasive cancer resections for lung cancer, mesothelioma, thymoma, and other cancers of the chest. He carries an international reputation for treating mesothelioma, an ag-

therapy with Carbon Ion Radiation (funded by the NIH), radiation biodosimetry, and the development of regenerative cell therapies to repair radiation injuries. He is the inventor of multiple patents and, a cofounder of BioConvergent Health, a biotechnology platform merging drug, device, and cell therapies to revolutionize cancer and regenerative medicine treatments.

In addition to his pioneering work in cancer immunotherapy, Dr. Guha has led major advances in mitigating radiation-induced injuries, particularly gastrointestinal, liver, and hematopoietic syndromes. His research team has developed and validated a range of innovative growth factor and cell-based therapies for radiation injury, supported through competitive funding from the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID) Radiation Countermeasure Program. His contributions are critical for advancing emergency preparedness in radiation exposure scenarios and improving survivorship after radiological events.

gressive cancer of the lining of the lung resulting from asbestos exposure. Dr. Adusumilli is also an expert in robotic bronchoscopy, an advanced endoscopic outpatient procedure wherein multiple lung nodules and lymph nodes can be biopsied in patients by use of a computerized real-time image-guided robotic system.

Dr. Adusumilli research focuses on cancer immunology and the development and translation of immunotherapy. Supported by prestigious National Cancer Institute and Department of Defense awards, his laboratory has published papers that were among the first to highlight the prognostic importance of tumoral and stromal immune cell infiltration in thoracic cancers, which provided the foundation for investigating immune modulation. To date, his laboratory has analyzed tumors, peripheral blood, and body fluids from more than 12,000 patients to advance the understanding of cancer immunology and patient immune system responses to cancer cells. At present, his laboratory is

analyzing tumors from patients after immunotherapy to understand secondary resistance to immunotherapy and to develop agents to overcome this resistance.

Using the knowledge generated from analyzing tumors from patients, Dr. Adusumilli's laboratory established clinically relevant solid tumor models and investigated treatment with biological therapies, including oncolytic viruses and chimeric antigen receptor (CAR) T cells. CAR T cells are T cells harvested from the patient's peripheral blood, genetically engineered to recognize and target cancer cells, and given back to the patient as treatment. Multiple clinical trials initiated by the Adusumilli laboratory have shown the safety and anticancer effects of CAR T cells, prolonging survival of patients with advanced cancer. The resulting mechanistic data have been translated to clinical trials, including trials of combination immunotherapy to reactivate both CAR T-cell and endogenous immunity by use of cell-intrinsic and -extrinsic checkpoint blockade strategies.

The Adusumilli laboratory has identified new antigen targets and costimulatory domains for CAR T-cell therapy. Dr. Adusumilli's discoveries in lung adenocarcinoma pathobiology were included in the World Health Organization classification of lung tumors and resulted in changes in clinical practice. He has mentored more than 150 junior faculty, postdocs, and MDs, resulting in more than 320 publications-one-third in highimpact journals-and has been honored with more than 100 research awards. He is an elected member of the Fleischner Society, the American Society of Clinical Investigation, the American Surgical Association, and the American Association for Thoracic Surgery.

Resham Bhattacharya is a Professor in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology and a Co-Leader of the Cancer Biology Program at the NCI-designated Stephenson Cancer Center (SCC) at the University of Oklahoma. She is an elected fellow of the American Institute for Medical and Biological Engineering. Dr. Bhattacharya received her Ph. D. degree from the Bowling Green State University, Ohio in 2002. Dr. Bhattacharya received her post-doctoral training from Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center, Harvard Medical School, and the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, MN.

Study shows weightloss drugs can cut alcohol intake by almost two-thirds

NEW DELHI: Medications such as liraglutide or semaglutide taken for weight loss also have the potential to reduce alcohol consumption by almost two-thirds, according to new research.

Alcohol use disorder is a relapsing condition that accounts for 2.6 million deaths a year -- 4.7 percent of all deaths globally.

Treatments such as cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT), therapies that aim to strengthen motivation to stop or reduce drinking, and medication can be very successful in the short term, however, 70 percent of patients relapse within the first year.

The study showed that Glucagon-like peptide-1 (GLP-1) analogues -- drugs developed to treat obesity -- likely curb alcohol cravings in the brain.

Average alcohol intake decreased from 11.3 units/week to 4.3 units/week after four months of treatment with the GLP-1 analogues a reduction of almost two-thirds.

Among the regular alcohol drinkers, intake decreased from 23.2 units/week to 7.8 units/week in four months.

This reduction of 68 percent is comparable to that achieved by nalmefene -- a drug used to treat alcohol use disorder in Europe, said Professor Carel le Roux, of University College Dublin, Ireland.

"The exact mechanism of how GLP-1 analogues reduce alcohol intake is still being investigated, but it is thought to involve curbing cravings for alcohol that arise in subcortical areas of the brain that are not under conscious control. Thus, patients report the effects are 'effortless'," Roux said.

The study, published in the journal Diabetes, Obesity and Metabolism, was also presented at the European Congress on Obesity (ECO 2025).

GLP-1 analogues have reduced alcohol intake in animal studies, but research on their effect in humans is less.

To find out more, the team prospectively collected data on the alcohol intake of patients who were being treated for obesity at a clinic in Dublin. *IANS*

NEW DELHI: In a new executive order, US President Donald Trump has vowed to cut the price of prescription drugs and pharmaceuticals in the US by 30 to 80 percent.

Taking to his social media platform Truth Social, Trump promised to sign the order on May 11 morning and provide Americans relief from high medication costs "almost immediately".

He also cited years of frustration of US consumers in paying significantly higher prices for medications than people in other countries

"For many years the World has wondered why Prescription Drugs and Pharmaceuticals in the United States of America were so much higher in price than they were in any other nation," Trump said in the post.

"Sometimes being five to 10 times more expensive than the same drug, manufactured in the

any other country for the same drug. It would introduce a "most favored nation's policy", said Trump.

"Our Country will finally be



exact same laboratory or plant, by the same company"

The new policy is expected to tie the cost of drugs sold in the US to the lowest price paid by treated fairly, and our citizens' Healthcare Costs will be reduced by numbers never even thought of before," he added.

The US president also ac-

cused pharmaceutical companies of exploiting Americans by citing research and development costs to justify inflated prices. The move is expected to slash prices of cancer treatments and other injectable medications in the US

Notably, the new policy would also force prices to rise in other countries to match, calling it a matter of fairness, Trump said. "They will rise throughout the World in order to equalize and, for the first time in many years, bring fairness to America!" he said.

Trump first introduced a similar plan during his first term, but it was blocked in court and never took effect. Trump said this time it is different, and promised that the move would "save trillions of dollars." *IANS*

A simple oral swab test before IVF likely to boost success rate

NEW DELHI: Swedish researchers have developed a simple oral swab test, which can help boost the success rate of the in vitro fertilization (IVF) procedure.

IVF treatment involves stimulating the woman's ovaries to mature many eggs, which are then retrieved and fertilized with sperm in the laboratory before being returned to the uterus.

There are two different types of hormone treatments to choose from for egg maturation: biological or synthetic. Besides the risk of serious side effects, the therapies sometimes require women to go into intensive care -- and many attempts at IVF fail. Selecting which therapy is best for the



While mapping genes is costly and takes time, the new simple oral swab test within an hour shows which hormone therapy is most suitable.

"Our hope is that this will reduce the risk of suffering for women, increase the number of successful treatments, and cut costs for taxpayers. Our goal is for the test to be available by the start of 2026," said Yvonne Lundberg Giwercman, professor at Lund University.

A total of 1,466 women undergoing IVF treatment in Sweden were included in the study, and 475 were randomized to two different hormone treatments while the rest were controls.

Using gene sequencing, the team mapped the action of the gene follicle-stimulating hormone (FSH), which is known to play an important role in egg maturation

The study identified that women with a particular variant of the FSH receptor (FSHR) gene that mediates the action of the hormone re-

sponded best to the biological hormone treatment, while others benefited from receiving the synthetic type of hormone.

To decode the genetic profile, the team turned to the oral swab test, which proved to be significantly efficient. Within an hour, it produced results that can be seen with the naked eye as a pink or yellow color. *IANS*

8,500 tons of antibiotics from human use contaminating rivers worldwide: Study

NEW DELHI: About 8,500 tons of antibiotics -- nearly one-third of what people consume annually -- end up in river systems around the world each year, significantly promoting drug resistance and harming aquatic life, according to a study.

The study, led by researchers from McGill University in Canada is the first to estimate the scale of global river contamination from human antibiotics use.

"While the amounts of residues from individual antibiotics translate into only very small concentrations in most rivers, which makes them very difficult to detect, the chronic and cumulative environmental exposure to these substances can still pose a risk to human health and aquatic ecosystems," said lead author Heloisa Ehalt Macedo, a postdoctoral fellow in geography at McGill.

For the study, published in the journal PNAS Nexus, the research team used a global model validated by field data from nearly 900 river locations.

They found that amoxicillin -- the world's mostused antibiotic -- is the most likely to be present at risky levels. The risk was especially found in Southeast Asia, where rising use and limited wastewater treatment amplify the problem. While antibiotics are crucial for global health treatments, the "results indicate that there may be unintended effects on aquatic environments and antibiotic resistance", said Bernhard Lehner, Professor in global hydrology at McGill's Department of Geography. *IANS*

Indian researchers develop catalyst for sustainable oxygen electro-catalysis

NEW DELHI: Researchers from Bengaluru-based Centre for Nano and Soft Matter Sciences (CeNS) have created a groundbreaking new catalyst designed to make crucial oxygenrelated catalytic reactions faster, more affordable and efficient, it was announced.

Electro-catalysis involving oxygen underpins numerous clean energy technologies, such as splitting water to produce hydrogen, creating clean fuels, and manufacturing chemicals like hydrogen peroxide.

However, these technologies typically face challenges like slow reaction speeds, high energy demands, and high costs due to the limited availability and expense of the precious metals involved.

Traditionally, catalysts used in these processes rely on expensive precious metals like platinum or ruthenium making the processes costly, according to the Ministry of Science and Technology.

Targeting to reduce the costs, CeNS (under the Department of Science and Technology) has developed a new catalyst that uses nickel selenide enhanced by precisely adding a small amount of iron (Fe). This has the potential of not only reducing costs significantly, but also improves performance. *IANS*

Distancing from the geopolitical tensions, the post says, "The vast majority of the local population is unaware of the conflict taking place between India and

Pakistan, and it has no bearing on daily life or the tourism environment here."

However, the message appears to have done little to pacify Indian sentiment.

Shiv Sena (UBT) MP Priyanka Chaturvedi, in a strongly-worded post on X, responded: "No Turkiye, Indians won't come spending money on tourism in a country that uses the same to arm Pakistan. Look for your tourists elsewhere, our money ain't blood money."

BJP Kerala state president Rajeev Chandrashekhar, in a terse post, just said, "No, thank you," accompanied by hashtags #BoycottTurkey and #SayNoToTurkey.

Veteran journalist Vir Sanghvi also weighed in, writing on X: "Frankly we don't give a damn whether Turkey is safe or whether you welcome tourists. You must be mad if you think we want to visit a country whose naked military support for Pakistan and drones have spilled the blood of Indians. Invite Pakistani tourists instead."

Industrialist Harsh Goenka, Chairman of RPG Enterprises, highlighted the economic contribution of Indian tourism to the region. "Indians gave Rs 4,000 crore plus to Turkey & Azerbaijan last year through tourism. Created jobs. Boosted their economy, hotels, weddings, and flights. Today, both stand with Pakistan after the Pahalgam attack. Plenty of beautiful places in India & the world. Please skip these 2 places. Jai Hind," he wrote.

India's industry sector to open \$3 trillion opportunity by 2035, manufacturing to lead

NEW DELHI: India's industry sector is expected to outpace agriculture to take a larger share in the GDP (30-32 percent) by 2035 and opening a \$3 trillion opportunity, driven majorly by manufacturing, a recent report showed.

Manufacturing is expected to emerge as the growth leader taking two-third share of industrials and more than 20 percent share of the GDP by 2035.

Higher domestic consumption with increasing per capita income and a target of \$1 trillion merchandise exports are expected to drive this growth,

according to the report by Omniscience Capital.

The manufacturing sector is pivotal to India's economic growth, significantly contributing to the nation's GDP. Currently, it stands as one of India's key growth sectors, catering to both domestic and

international markets.

Government initiatives such as the Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme, 'Make in India' campaign, liberalized Foreign Direct

Investment (FDI) policy, public-private partnership (PPP) models for various public undertakings, and infrastructure development are fuelling this growth.

To achieve India's ambitious \$1 trillion merchandise export target by 2030, the merchandise exports should increase from the current \$450 billion to \$1 trillion, requiring a year-on-year growth rate of 12 percent, the report mentioned.

India's share in global merchandise exports has doubled from 0.9 percent share in 2005 to 1.8 percent in 2023. India's merchandise exports have grown at a 3-year CAGR of 18.8 percent from FY21 to FY24 and a 5-year CAGR of 9.4 percent from FY19 to FY24. *IANS*

India successfully tests hard-kill counter-swarm drone system 'Bhargavastra'

NEW DELHI: India achieved a significant milestone in its counter-drone capabilities with the successful test firing of its low-cost, hard-kill counter-swarm drone system, 'Bhargavastra', at the Seaward Firing Range in Gopalpur.

The system met all specified performance targets and is being hailed as a major advancement in the country's ability to neutralize the emerging threat of drone swarms.

Developed indigenously by Solar Defence and Aerospace Limited (SDAL), 'Bhargavastra' is a powerful addi-

tion to India's defense arsenal, particularly in its mission to secure airspace from unmanned aerial threats.

The micro rockets that form the heart of the system underwent rigorous testing in Gopalpur and successfully achieved all designated objectives, indicating a high level of operational readiness.

Three separate trials of the rocket system were carried out on May 13 in the presence of senior officials from the Army Air Defence (AAD).

Two of these tests involved the firing of individual rockets, while the third was conducted in salvo mode, launching two rockets within a span of just two seconds.

All four rockets met the required launch parameters, highlighting the system's robust technological foundation and its potential to combat large-scale drone incursions effectively.

According to SDAL, 'Bhargavastra' offers a unified and advanced solution to counter the growing threat from Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs), especially drone swarms.

The system has the capability to detect and neutralize small, fast-moving drones at distances of up to 2.5 km.

It utilizes unguided micro rockets as its primary defensive layer, designed to destroy multiple drones within a lethal radius of 20 meters.

For precision strikes, a guided micro-missile -- which has already undergone successful testing -- forms the second defensive tier, ensuring pinpoint accuracy.

The system is engineered to function efficiently across

varied terrains, including highaltitude areas exceeding 5,000 meters above sea level.

This design feature addresses the complex operational challenges faced by India's armed forces in difficult and strategic regions.

SDAL has highlighted the indigenous nature of the technology, emphasizing the in-house development of both the dedicated rockets and micro-missiles.

'Bhargavastra' is also designed with modularity in mind, allowing for the integration of a soft-kill layer that can include jamming and spoofing elements, thereby offering a comprehensive and multi-dimen-

sional shield against UAV threats.

A key feature of 'Bhargavastra' is its seamless compatibility with India's existing network-centric warfare systems

The counter-drone system includes a Command-and-Control Centre that integrates advanced C4I (Command, Control, Communications, Computers, and Intelligence) technologies. *IANS*

Trump cites 'genocide' of white farmers as 59 South Africans granted refugee status in US

WASHINGTON DC: Agroup of 59 White South Africans arrived in the United States (12 May), after being granted refugee status under the US President Donald Trump administration, marking the first such designation by the administration, according to a report by CNN.

The group, which included children, landed at Washington Dulles International Airport in Virginia, where they were welcomed by US Deputy Secretary of State Christopher Landau and Deputy Secretary of Homeland Security Troy Edgar.

The Trump administration has moved to not only admit but to expedite the processing of Afrikaners as refugees for alleged discrimination. At the same time, it has suspended all other refugee resettlement, including for people fleeing war and famine, as per CNN.

Defending his administration's decision to grant refugee status to a group of White South Africans, Trump described the situation in South Africa as "a genocide," citing the killing of white farmers and the confiscation of their land. Trump said the US had extended protection to those fleeing what he called a "terrible situation," and criticized the media for ignoring the issue.

During a press conference, Trump said, "They are being killed and we don't want to see black makes no difference to me, but white farmers are being brutally killed, and their land is being confiscated in South Africa, and the newspapers and the televi-

At least 60 days before a TPS designation expires, the Secretary, after consultation with appropriate U.S. government agencies, is required to review the conditions in a country designated for TPS to determine whether the conditions supporting the designation continue to be met, and if so, how long to extend the designation.

UK cuts post-study work visa duration for international graduates from 5 years to 18 months

LONDON: The UK government recently announced plans to reduce, the length of time, international graduates can remain in the UK after completing their stud-

Under the new rules, the length of time graduates can remain in the UK after their studies will be reduced from five years to 18 months.

"New requirements will be imposed for educational institutions recruiting international students to ensure compliance with the law; The length of time graduates can remain in the UK after their studies will be reduced from two years to 18 months," according to a document reported by Sky News.

Further, the government is also raising English language requirements across every main immigration

"New English language requirements for both applicants and dependents, with 'an assessment of improvements over time'; Doubling the qualifying period for gaining settled status from five to 10 years," the document read.



Sharing a post on X, UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer wrote, "If you want to live in the UK, you should speak English. That's common sense."

While announcing plans to reform the country's immigration system, Starmer said, "With our plan for change, we're restoring common sense and control to our borders."

"We will finally honor what taking back control meant and begin to choose who comes here. So that migration works for our national interest," he stated.

"We will create a migration system that is controlled, selective, and fair. A clean break with the past that links access to visas directly to investment in homegrown skills. So that if a business wants to bring people in from abroad, they must first invest in Britain," he added.

Under the new system, businesses seeking to bring in workers from abroad will be required to invest in Britain first. Starmer outlined the benefits of this approach, stating that it will result in "an immigration system that is fair, that works for our national interest, and that restores common sense and control to our borders.

The Prime Minister highlighted the key objectives of the new system, including lower net migration, higher skills backing, and support for British workers. "That is what this white paper will deliver: lower net migration, higher skills backing British workers." ANI

'Half of India's office spaces are fit for retrofitting and redevelopment'

NEW DELHI: Nearly 50 percent of India's office inventory in the top seven cities, including integrated technology parks and standalone properties, is over ten years old, indicating significant potential for retrofitting and value enhancement, according to a study by CBRE.

The release by CBRE further mentions that specifically, around 27 percent of the total office stock is over 15 years old, and 23 percent is between 10 to 15 years old, while only 28 percent is less than 5 years old.

It also highlights the problem that a major portion of the total office stock of approximately 882 million sq. ft. faces the risk of declining occupancy, stagnant rents, and functional obsolescence as occupiers increasingly prioritize modern, high-performance spaces.

The report further reveals that Bengaluru and Delhi-NCR hold nearly 45 percent of the of India's decade-old office stock, while Mumbai and Chennai together account for another 32 percent. These stats reaffirm the need for strategic upgrades and retrofitting to align with evolving workplace expectations and sustain asset competitiveness.

The office buildings covering approximately 434 million sq. ft. are suitable candidates for upgrades, representing an investment potential of roughly INR 304 to 520 billion. *ANI*

TOKYO: Japan's household spending in fiscal 2024 dropped a real 0.1 percent from a year earlier, falling for the second consecutive year, as consumers reduced food expenditure amid rising prices, government data showed recently.

Households of two or more people spent an average of 304,178 yen (\$2,100) per month in the fiscal year ended March, according to the data, a key indicator of private consumption that accounts for more than half of Japan's gross domestic product. *ANI/WAM*

Retail boom: India to add 16.6 million sq ft of new mall space by 2025-26

MUMBAI: India's retail sector is witnessing a major transformation, with over 16.6 million square feet of new Grade-A mall space expected to come up across top seven cities in 2025 and 2026, a new report said.

This surge is being driven by rising consumer demand and strong momentum in retail leasing, marking what experts call a golden era for the sector, according to data compiled by Anarock Research.

Hyderabad and Delhi-NCR will lead this supply boom, accounting for nearly 65 percent of the upcoming mall space.

This indicates a clear shift towards high-growth consumption centers in these cities.

The expansion is part of a broader retail real estate pipeline that could see more than 40 million square feet of new retail space added across India by 2029.

Anuj Kejriwal, CEO and MD of Anarock Retail, said that the push

for more mall development is also due to a shortage of quality supply in recent years.

"In 2022, top cities saw only 2.6 million sq. ft. of new supply, while leasing hit 3.2 million sq. ft. Similarly, in 2023, new supply was 5.3 million sq. ft., but leasing was even higher at 6.5 million sq. ft.," he said.

The supply shortfall became more pronounced in 2024, partly due to slower approval processes linked to general and state elections. *IANS*

The Los Angeles Times' Slanted Smear on India and Hindus

ndia's rising as a global heavyweight, flexing economic muscle and cultural pride, but the Los Angeles Times keeps serving up a tired, lopsided narrative that paints the nation and its Hindu majority as villains. The paper's obsession with slamming Hindu nationalism as a threat to India's democracy is not just selective-it's borderline deceptive. By cherry-picking stories, ignoring history, and sidelining Hindu voices, the LA Times churns out articles that feel like they're written to shame Hindus rather than inform readers. This isn't journalism; it's agenda-driven storytelling that demands a reality check.

Take their February 2022 hit piece, "Hindu nationalism threatens India's status as world's largest democracy." (1) It screams that India's secularism is crumbling under Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), toss-

shame Hindus rather than inform readers.

What's missing? The 2019 Supreme Court ruling that greenlit the temple based on evidence of a prior Hindu structure, or the site's 500-year role as a symbol of Hindu grit against invasions. By obsessing over political drama and ignoring Hindu joy, the LA Times spits on a community's sacred moment

Not every piece is a total miss. A March 2025 story, "Southern California Hindu temple vandalized with anti-India messages," (3) covered vandalism at a Hindu temple in Chino Hills, California, with graffiti like "F- Modi and Hindustan." It quoted a temple volunteer and the Hindu American Foundation, framing Hindus as hate-crime victims and tying the attack to Sikh separatists. This rare balanced take actually let Hindu voices breathe, unlike the paper's usual anti-Hindu-nationalism crusade. But don't get used to it-articles like this are the

exception, not the rule.

Contrast that with their September 2022 piece, "Hindu nationalism raises tensions among Indian immigrants,"(4)

which hyped protests against Modi's policies at an Indian Independence Day event in Anaheim. It zoomed in on caste discrimination and Muslim-targeted violence, painting Hindu nationalism as a wedge splitting Indian Americans. One person downplayed religious tensions, but the article leaned hard into critics bashing the BJP's "Hindutva." No mention of why diaspora Hindus cheer Modi's bold policies as a badge of Indian pride. That omission tilts the story, making Hindus look like the





India's Unprecedented Retribution Against A 'Roque State': The Battle Against Terror Should Not Go Unfinished

wenty-five Indian males and one Nepali male, touring with their families in Jammu & Kashmir's popular destination Pahalgam, were cold-bloodedly killed by five Pakistani terrorists on the afternoon of 22 April 2025. The terrorists confirmed the victims were Hindu by forcing them to drop their trousers. One Muslim pony ride operator, who bravely tried to wrestle a weapon from a terrorist to help the tourists escape, was also mercilessly killed. The incident sparked nationwide shock, anger, and an overwhelming demand for retribution.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed deep anguish and vowed strong action. After consultations with the Home and

At 0144 hours on 7 May 2025, nine terrorist camps belonging to Lashkar-e-Taiba and Jaish-e-Mohammad in Muridke and Bahawalpur, located in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Jammu & Kashmir, were destroyed within 25 minutes-without Indian forces crossing the border.

In retaliation, the Pakistan Army launched unprovoked artillery and small arms fire across the Line of Control (LoC), targeting Kupwara, Baramulla, Uri, and Akhnoor, Thirteen Indian civilians. including four children and one soldier, were killed.

In the 14-day gap between the massacre and Operation Sindoor, Pakistan evacuated many of its 42 terrorist camps and launching pads, anticipating retaliation. Defense Minister

At 0144 hours on 7 May 2025, nine terrorist camps belonging to Lashkar-e-Taiba and Jaish-e-Mohammad in Muridke and Bahawalpur, located in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Jammu & Kashmir, were destroyed within 25 minutes-without Indian forces crossing the border

Defense Ministers, the Chief of Defense Staff, service chiefs, and the National Security Advisor, a punitive operation was planned to target terrorist bases. The operation was codenamed Sindoor, referencing the vermillion powder worn by Hindu married women, which is removed permanently upon widowhood-symbolizing the gravity of the loss.

Shortly after the Pahalgam attack, Indian Navy's carrier battle groups, surface forces, submarines and aviation assets were deployed at sea with full combat readiness. While the Navy did not do any direct action at Karachi as misreported in Indian television media, its deployment was a reminder of 1971 December when it pulverized Pakistan Navy's assets in Karachi and blockaded Pakistan's sea front.

Precision Strikes Deep Inside

Rainath Singh later stated that over 100 terrorists were killed. including individuals linked to the 1999 IC-814 hijacking and the 2019 Pulwama attack. Had the operation occurred earlier, Indian forces may have eliminated thousands.

Devastation Key Airbases

The following Pakistani airbases were heavily damaged:

Mushaf (Sargodha) Air Base: Command HQ of the Pakistan Air Force, hosting F-16s, JF-16s, and Mirage 5As.

Rafiqui Air Base: Hosts Chinese JF-17 and Mirage fighter squadrons.

Murid Air Base: In Chakwal district, housing UAVs and drones used against Indian cities.

Nur Khan Air Base: Located in Rawalpindi, 10 km from Islamabad, suffered heavy strikes.

Rahim Yar Khan Base: Strategically near the Rajasthan border.

Sukkur Air Base: Commissioned in 2017 to bolster coastal defenses near Karachi.

Chunian Air Base: 70 km from Lahore, a key installation.

Additional bases at Skardu, Jacobabad, and Bholari were also hit hard.

Reportedly, the Kirana Hillsnear the fortified underground nuclear storage site at Mushaf-Sargodha-were struck by a BrahMos missile. According to idrw.org, the strike Rawalpindi's Noor Khan base sent shockwaves through the Pakistan Army leadership, especially its chief, General Asif Munir. The operation exposed critical vulnerabilities Pakistan's nuclear deterrence. On 10 May, during these strikes, Pakistan experienced two shallow earthquakes (magnitude 4.0 and 5.7).

According to Reddit's r/ IndianDefense Forum, the U.S. National Nuclear Security Administration's emergency response aircraft (B-350 AMS) were spotted flying over Pakistan-aircraft typically used for nuclear contamination detection. This coincided with the former U.S. President Donald Trump being mentioned in the "ceasefire" developments on the evening of 10 May 2025.

Chinese Equipment Failure

Reports indicate that Pakistan's Chinese-supplied air defense systems-including radar and interception platformsfailed during Operation Sindoor. Platforms like HQ-9 and LY-80, which were supposed to intercept missiles, reportedly failed to detect or engage any Indian threats. The JY-27A radar system, which claims stealth detection capabilities, was ineffective.

OPERATION SINDOOR

ultiple explosions were heard in two big cities of Indian-controlled Kashmir last Saturday, hours after India and Pakistan agreed to a ceasefire deal; following the US-led talks to end the military confrontation between the nuclear-armed rivals seen in decades. India and Pakistan are currently facing one of the most intense periods of border tensions in recent years, triggered by the launch of Operation Sindoor on May 7, 2025.

Earlier, several explosions reverberated through Jammu city, causing a total blackout just hours after India foiled Pakistan's attempt to target military installations along the border. Reports indicated the presence of loitering munitions in the skies. Similarly, the border town of Jaisalmer also experienced loud explosions during the nights, while blackouts were imposed across western Rajasthan's districts bordering Pakistan, plunging the area into darkness few days back.

Multiple districts of Punjab, Chandigarh, and parts of Haryana, including Panchkula, Ambala, and Sirsa also faced these blackouts. Measures were taken amid rising military tensions following Operation Sindoor and the increasing threat of airstrikes.

The tensions escalated after Operation Sindoor carried out in retaliation for the Pahalgam terror attack that killed 26 people including 25 Indian nationals and one Nepali tourist.

India's strike targeted nine key terrorist-infrastructures linked to Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM), and Hizbul Mujahideen (HM); spanning locations in both Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK).

India's military response was aimed at neutralising the operational bases of major terror outfits while consciously avoiding Pakistani military installations. This approach, military officials said, was to prevent an all-out escalation while still delivering a strong message.

Among the targets were JeM's headquarters in Bahawalpur and LeT's base in Muridke. Other sites hit included terrorist locations in Sialkot and Tehra Kalan in Pakistan and Muzaffarabad, and Kotli in PoK. The military described the strikes as "focused, measured, and non-escalatory," aimed solely at terrorist facilities.


Prime Minister Narendra Modi, praised the armed forces for their precision and bravery. He expressed pride in the success of the operation and urged continued vigilance against future threats.

Even after experiencing heavy losses and damage to its major defense installations, Pakistan failed to respect the ceasefire that came in to effect soon after U.S. President Donald Trump intervened.

According to Indian navy spokesman, the Indian armed forces will adhere to the understanding reached on the ceasefire, but they "remain fully prepared, ever vigilant and committed to defending the sovereignty and integrity of the motherland."

"Every misadventure by Pakistan has been met with strength. And every future escalation will invite a decisive response. We remain fully operationally ready to launch whatever operations may be required in defense of the nation,"

This clearly shows that India cannot trust Pakistan and must continue to pursue other means to stop the support base and funding channels of terrorism across the border. IMF should be strict in controlling its funding not to be diverted towards such activities. Of course the so called all weather friend of Pakistan, China will do whatever possible to destabilize India. Being heavily punished and cornered by U.S. on tariffs it is looking towards destabilizing neighbors in South East Asia.
