Two decades later, he says, India has indeed "leapt, and is soaring."

Aitken lauded India's progress in sectors such as digital connectivity, semiconductors, artificial intelligence, and broadcasting, saying the country has become a "leader, especially for the Global South."

"India is not simply participating in the global economy. India is reshaping it," he said, citing examples like UPI-enabled financial inclusion, indigenous 4G/5G technology, and the Chandrayaan-3 lunar mission.

The US media executive emphasized that India's most significant resource lies in its people.

"India's greatest resource is not buried underground or locked in vaults. It walks its campuses, staffs its labs, works in factories and codes its platforms," he said.

He credited India's education system and diaspora for shaping world-class talent that leads major global institutions.

Aitken also praised India's policy direction under Prime Minister Narendra Modi, noting that programs such as Digital India, Make in India, and Startup India are not "slogans" but "strategies, and they are working."

Reflecting on his continued engagement with India over the past eight years, Aitken said his work on Direct-to-Mobile (D2M) technologies represents more than just innovation it symbolizes human connection.

"Bringing people together is what builds

nations. I believe that D2M is an integral part of bringing people together. And that, my friends, is far bigger than India," he said.

Aitken added, "Back in 1998, I said that if India could channel its human capital

with national focus, it wouldn't just be part of the future, it would define it. That future is now unfolding. India is not just taking the stage, it is shaping the script. This is India's moment." ANI

Trump praises 'good friend' Modi as Sharif rolls out carpet of eulogies

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi - despite not being able to attend the Gaza Peace Summit in Sharm El-Sheikh due to prescheduled commitments - was paid warm tributes by co-host US President Donald Trump, much to the discomfort of Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif.

Trump, beaming at the cameras. Intermittently turning towards Sharif, who was standing behind the US President during the latter's concluding address at the Summit, Trump urged India and Pakistan would "live very nicely together".

The slight laughter from world leaders


The Summit at the resort-town was also co-hosted by Egypt's President Abdel Fattah El-Sisi.

present was audible during a televised address. Incidentally, the US President paused his speech to invite Sharif to say a few words in what appeared to be an impromptu gesture.

Clearly taken unawares, Sharif limited his address in hailing Trump's contribu-

tions to the peace process. Calling the day as one of the greatest in contemporary history, the Pakistan PM spoke about how peace has been achieved "after untiring efforts led by President Trump". Sharif also thanked Trump, crediting him with averting a nuclear escalation between India and



Pakistan. According to him, without the US President's intervention, the conflict between the two countries with nuclear power could have spiraled into unimaginable devastation.

He also announced nominating Trump for the Nobel Peace Prize again. Despite

drawing worldwide praise for his efforts at a truce in Gaza and evolving a 20-point program towards that end, the President appeared somewhat embarrassed when he reacted to Sharif's eulogies with an exclamation, sharing that he had not expected such remarks.

Yet, Trump has earlier himself been talking about his pivotal role in the peace process and hostage exchange, taking credit for preventing a war between India and Pakistan for the umpteenth time. He cited the Gaza truce as one of the eight conflicts he had resolved in the eight years of his second term. The US President, while referring to the Pakistan Prime Minister, also mentioned General Asim Munir by name, though he was not present among the heads of state.

The reference indicates an apparent wave of the power the Pakistan Army wields over an elected government. "Asim Munir," he stated, "is my favorite field marshal." *IANS*

PM Modi hails efforts to impart 'new momentum' in bilateral ties during meeting with Canadian FM

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi has conveyed to Canadian Foreign Minister Anita Anand that her India visit would contribute to ongoing efforts to impart new momentum to the India-Canada bilateral partnership.

Prime Minister conveyed his warm wishes to Prime Minister Mark Carney and said that he looked forward to their upcoming engagements," read a statement issued by the Prime Minister's Office (PMO).

"I met with Prime Minister Narendra

Welcoming Anand on her first visit to India as Canada's Foreign Minister, EAM Jaishankar said, "India-Canada bilateral relations have been steadily progressing in the last few months. We are working to restore and reinvigorate the mechanisms necessary to advance our partnership."

"As Prime Minister Modi noted during his meeting with Prime Minister Carney in Kananaskis, India's approach is to move forward with a positive mindset. This morning, you met the Prime Minister. You have heard from him personally about our vision of cooperation and how best to realize it," he added.

He also recalled the "productive" meeting between National Security Advisor (NSA) Ajit Doval and Canadian NSA Nathalie G. Drouin, calling it "an important first step towards enhancing our security cooperation." IANS





India to send sacred relics of Buddha's disciples to Mongolia next year: PM Modi

NEW DELHI: Highlighting that that the ties between India and Mongolia are not only diplomatic but the two nations also share a bond of warmth and spirituality, Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced that India will send the holy relics of Lord Buddha's two disciples to Mongolia next year.

President Khurelsukh Ukhnaa following their talks at the Hyderabad House in New Delhi, PM Modi said, "The relationship between India and Mongolia is not merely diplomatic - it is a bond of warmth and spirituality. The true depth and breadth of our relationship is reflected in our people-to-people ties. For centuries, both countries have been bound by the thread of Buddhism, which has led to us being called spiritual siblings. Today, to further strengthen this tradition and give new strength to our his-

torical ties, we have taken several important decisions.

"I am pleased to announce that next year, the holy relics of two great disciples of Lord Buddha - Sariputra and Maudgalyayana - will be sent from India to Mongolia. We will also send a Sanskrit teacher to Gandan Monastery to study the Buddhist texts there in depth and carry forward the ancient tradition of knowledge," he stated.

PM Modi mentioned that the Nalanda University has played a vital role in the development of Buddhism in Mongolia and announced that the two nations have decided to link Nalanda and Gandan Monastery. He said that Khurelsukh Ukhnaa, before the meeting, planted a sapling as part of 'Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam' initiative.

He said, "Our meeting today began with a tree plantation as part of Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam. The banyan tree sapling planted by President Khurelsukh in the name of his late mother will remain a symbol of our deep friendship and our shared commitment to the environment for generations to come."

While extending a warm welcome to President Khurelsukh Ukhnaa, PM Modi said, "I am delighted to welcome President Hurrelsukh and his delegation to India. The visit of the President of Mongolia to India after six years is a very special occasion and this visit is taking place when

India and Mongolia are celebrating 70 years of diplomatic relations and 10 years of Strategic Partnership. On this occasion, we have issued a joint postal stamp which symbolizes our shared heritage."

During a joint press statement with Mongolian President Khurelsukh Ukhnaa in the national capital, Prime Minister Modi said the newly signed MoU between the Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council and Mongolia's Arkhangai Province would give "a fresh boost" to cultural ties between the two nations.

He also announced an annual sponsored visit for young Mongolian cultural ambassadors to India.

"The MoU signed today between the Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council and Mongolia's Arkhangai Province will give a fresh boost to our cultural ties... Even though we do not share a border, India has always considered Mongolia a close neighbor. We will continue to strengthen people-to-people ties. We have decided to provide free e-visas to Mongolian citizens. And we will spon-

sor the annual visit of young cultural ambassadors from Mongolia to India," PM Modi said.

The MoU, signed during President Ukhnaa's official visit, aims to deepen historical and civilizational linkages, particularly through shared Buddhist heritage and cultural exchanges between Ladakh and Arkhangai.

Highlighting India's role as a reliable partner in Mongolia's development, the Prime Minister emphasized the ongoing Oil Refinery Project, supported by India's USD 1.7 billion line of credit.

"India has been a strong and reliable partner in Mongolia's development. The Oil Refinery Project, supported by India's USD 1.7 billion line of credit, will strengthen Mongolia's energy security. It is India's largest development partnership project globally, with over 2,500 Indian professionals working alongside their Mongolian counterparts to make it a reality," the PM said.

The refinery, being constructed in Sainshand, Dornogovi Province, is expected to meet approximately 70 percent of Mongolia's domestic fuel demand, thereby reducing the country's reliance on imports. *ANI*

Assam CM Sarma claims Muslim population in State has risen to 39.5%, backs Centre's 'Detect, Delete, Deport' demography mission

GUWAHATI: Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma has highlighted the Union Home Minister's speech on the increase in India's Muslim population, attributing it to both internal growth and immigration. He noted the Union government's plan for a demography mission to "detect, delete, and deport."

Sarma emphasized Assam's significant demographic changes, stating the Muslim population had reached

graphic changes. In 2021, the Muslim population in Assam crossed 38 percent. When the census comes, then it will be 1 or 1.5 percent more, plus 38 percent. Now, the Muslim population in Assam is 39.5 percent. Even in Majuli, the Muslim population has increased by 100 percent. However, the Assamese Muslim population growth is not of that type; it is similar to ours. If the Muslim population growth is 100 percent in Majuli, then you can imagine the

issue, and we are all worried about it. The Prime Minister Narendra Modi said this on August 15, and Union Home Minister Amit Shah said this on October 10. We will have to know more about this. I will try to know more about this when I meet the Union Home Minister next time," he said.

In the 'Narendra Mohan Smriti Lecture' organized by Dainik Jagran, Home Minister Shah cited demographic data from multiple censuses to highlight how infiltration has altered the population balance over decades.

"Today, infiltration, demographic change, and democracy; I want to say without hesitation that until every Indian understands these three issues, we cannot ensure our country, our culture, our languages, and our independence. These three topics are interconnected..." Shah said

"Censuses were conducted in 1951, 1971, 1991, and 2011... In the 1951 census, Hindus constituted 84 percent, while Muslims constituted 9.8 percent. In 1971, Hindus constituted 82 percent, and the Muslim population was 11 percent. By 1991, the Hindu population had increased to 81 percent, while the Muslim community accounted for 12.12 percent. In contrast, in 2001, Hindus accounted for 89 percent, and Muslims accounted for 14.2 percent. I'm talking about the populations of only two religions because I want to talk about infiltration...," he explained. *ANI*

This increase in population has not happened only inside the country; people coming from foreign countries have also contributed to it. For that, the Union government wants to conduct a demographic mission, which aims to detect, delete, and deport. For the first time, the Union government has said this clearly. Assam is a big victim of demo-

depth of the problem," he said.

The Assam Chief Minister expressed concern over the state's demographic changes, citing projections from the 2011 census that indicate a 40% Muslim population, 6-7% Christian population, and a Hindu population not exceeding 40%. He said he plans to discuss this issue further with Union Minister Amit Shah.

WASHINGTON: As India and Canada agree to create a new roadmap for the relationship, a leading expert in Canadian foreign policy believes that a "reset" is underway in the bilateral ties, and the visit of Canada's Foreign Minister Anita Anand to India was a "significant step."

While speaking to IANS from Vancouver in Canada, Vina Nadjibulla, the Vice-President of Research & Strat-

egy at the Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada, termed the engagements "a big development."

"This is a big development in Canada-India relations, which have come a long way since the low in the relationship a year ago. Exactly a year ago, Canada and India were expelling diplomats, and the relationship was in a deep freeze," she added.

The Canadian Foreign Minister met
Prime Minister Narendra Modi and External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar recently in New Delhi, vowing to strengthen the ties.

"Both of our governments agree on the importance of elevating the relationship going further", she said while meeting EAM Jaishankar.

After the talks, both sides issued a joint statement,

promising to "take calibrated measures to restore stability in the relationship and to pursue a constructive and balanced partnership."

They also agreed to re-establish bilateral mechanisms on trade, investment, and science and technology cooperation. In the backdrop of the latest Chinese export controls on rare earths, both sides plan to hold the first Criti-

cal Minerals Annual Dialogue early next year and promote dialogue among "government, industry, and think tanks to identify how Canada's mining expertise can provide India with critical minerals needed for energy security."

Nadjibulla, who is also an Adjunct Professor at the University of British Columbia, called it an "ambitious roadmap" and highlighted the potential of collaboration in the critical minerals sector.

"That was also already signaled by the two prime ministers in June. In fact, Prime Minister Modi joined the discussions on energy security and critical minerals. So, I think already it was going to be an important element, but the fact that now this joint statement explicitly names this area of cooperation... there's quite a bit of momentum," she noted. IANS exclusive

Nvidia to keep sponsoring H-1B visas despite crackdown: Report

WASHINGTON: Nvidia CEO Jensen Huang has reportedly assured his staff that his company will continue to sponsor H-1B visas and cover all the costs associated with the applications.

A report by Business Insider cited Huang, who wrote in a note to employees, "As one of many immigrants at Nvidia, I know that the opportunities we've found in America have profoundly shaped our lives," adding that "the miracle of Nvidia - built by all of you, and by brilliant colleagues around the world - would not be possible without immigration."

The article quotes Huang as saying that "legal immigration remains essential to ensuring the US continues to lead in technology and ideas," and that the Trump administration's "recent changes reaffirm this.

"At NVIDIA, we built our company with extraordinary people from around the world, and we will continue to sponsor H-1B applicants and cover all associated fees. If you have any questions about H-1B visas, please reach out to NVIDIA-Immigration."

On September 19, US President Donald Trump signed a proclamation to significantly curtail the H-1B visa program and imposed a hefty \$100,000 application fee

While signing the proclamation, Trump had said the "incentive is to hire American workers."

Commerce Secretary Howard Lutnick had also defended the move, saying the policy would discourage companies from hiring foreign workers. *IANS*

Despite price pressure, urbanization & income growth driving housing demand in India: Report



NEW DELHI: Urbanization and rising household incomes continue to sustain housing demand in India, even amid increasing property prices in key cities such as Bengaluru and the National Capital Region (NCR), according to a report by PL Capital.

The report highlighted that higher disposable incomes, coupled with potential interest rate cuts, are expected to maintain activity in the housing market over the long term.

While affordable and mid-income housing continues to form the backbone of demand, luxury housing is also witnessing strong momentum in wealthier markets, driven by high-net-worth individuals and foreign investors.

Following a strong surge in residential and commercial real estate in 2024, with notable price gains in select cities and pre-

come growth sustains housing demand despite affordability pressures. Rising household incomes and potential interest rate cuts should sustain market activity over the long term".

While affordable and mid-income housing continues to form the backbone of demand, luxury housing is also witnessing strong momentum in wealthier markets, driven by high-net-worth individuals and foreign investors

mium segments, residential prices are anticipated to stabilize in 2025 while continuing to record steady gains.

It stated, "Urbanization, in-

The report also mentioned that the 2025 real estate demand is being shaped by a combination of global and local factors, with residential properties remaining

dominant. Sustainability and green building practices are increasingly influencing buyer preferences, with environmentally friendly and energy-efficient properties commanding premiums.

"By FY26, the market is likely to reach a balanced state, favoring credible developers, prime projects, and healthy absorption, with robust sales, barring major global disruptions," the report noted.

Housing demand is expected to strengthen in key locations, supported by record new launches and rising supply.

Despite low rental yields, ownership demand surged, aided by structural reforms and improved transparency.

The sector's increasing emphasis on sustainability, professional practices, and investor participation signals a marked shift from its historically fragmented past.

As urbanization continues and household incomes rise, the report suggested that India's real estate sector is set for sustained growth, offering opportunities for developers and buyers alike, while also encouraging responsible and sustainable development practices. *ANI*

India's real estate equity inflows jump 48 pc in Q3 2025: Report

NEW DELHI: Equity investments in India's real estate sector jumped 48 percent year-on-year to \$3.8 billion in the July-September period (Q3), a new report said.

This growth in inflow was primarily fuelled by capital deployment into land or development sites and built-up office and retail assets, according to the report by real estate consulting firm CBRE South Asia.

In the first nine months of 2025, the equity investments in-

creased by 14 percent on-year to \$10.2 billion -- from \$8.9 billion in the same period last year.

The report highlighted that land or development sites

and built-up office and retail assets accounted for more than 90

percent of the total capital inflows during Q3 2025.

On the category of investors, developers remained the primary drivers of capital deployment, contributing 45 percent of the total equity inflows, followed by Institu-

tional investors with a 33 percent

CBRE reported that Mumbai attracted the highest investments at 32 percent, followed by Pune at around 18 percent and Bengaluru at nearly 16 percent.

Anshuman Magazine, Chair-

man and CEO - India, South-East Asia, Middle East and Africa, CBRE, said that the healthy inflow of domestic capital demonstrates the sector's resilience and depth. IANS

Construction sector revival powers strong growth in UP and Bihar, outpaces national average: Report

NEW DELHI: The revival in India's construction sector has driven robust growth in Uttar Pradesh and Bihar, with both states witnessing a sharp rise in the sector's contribution to their Gross Value Added (GVA) in FY24, according to a report by HDFC Bank

The report noted that UP and Bihar have seen rapid growth in construction post the pandemic, propelled by the government's support for infrastructure development.

It stated, "The revival in the construction sector has powered recent growth in Uttar Pradesh and Bihar, together accounting for 13.4 percent and 11.2 percent of the state's GVA respectively, outpacing the All India average of 8.9 percent".

The report also noted that both states are among the top 3 beneficiaries of the central government's interest-free loan for capital investment projects.

The report also shared that Uttar Pradesh has emerged as the leading contributor to India's construction GVA, commanding a 12.5 percent share in FY24, followed by Tamil Nadu (11.8 percent) and Maharashtra (10 percent)

Other major contributors include Gujarat (6.9 percent), Karnataka (5.7 percent), Kerala (5.6 percent), and West Bengal (5.4 percent).

The surge in Uttar Pradesh's construction sector marks a strong turnaround from previous years.

The state's construction share in total GVA rose sharply from around 12 percent in FY12 to 13.4 percent in FY24, indicating an expansion in infrastructure spending and housing development.

Bihar also displayed a steady recovery, with its construction share climbing to 11.2 percent in FY24 after years of subdued growth.

The revival of increased public investment in infrastructure, particularly under government-led programs focused on housing, roads, and urban development.

The data highlights how construction activity has become a key growth driver for regional economies, particularly in northern India, helping to offset weaknesses in agriculture and manufacturing. *ANI*

As shutdown drags on, Is a compromise over Health Care costs possible?

t the heart of the federal government shutdown, which began Oc tober 1, are the spiraling costs of healthcare. Millions of Americans this month are set for sticker shock as they see their monthly Affordable Care Act premiums nearly double, once enhanced premium tax credits expire at the end of the year. ACom news briefing on Oct 10, highlighted this imperative issue.

4 million people will immediately lose coverage. 7 out of 10 Americans surveyed in a new poll say they will not be able to afford higher-cost health care, without seriously impacting their household budget. And very low-income people stand to lose their \$0 monthly premium. The cuts come in amid new rules and restrictions for Medicaid recipients. In total, as many as 12 million Americans stand to lose health care coverage.

US Congress should 'stand together' to defend ties with India, says Congressman Bera

WASHINGTON: Congressman Ami Bera, a Democratic House member from California, has argued that it's time for the US Congress to "stand together" to defend the "hugely important" India-US relationship.

In an exclusive interview with IANS recently, Bera, who currently serves as the Ranking Member of the Subcommittee on East Asia and the Pacific, spoke about his attempt to create a bipartisan consensus on India-US ties, his recent Congressional visit to India, the H-1B visa crackdown, and the future of the bilateral relationship.

Below are the excerpts from the interview

IANS: You recently led a congressional delegation to India and met with officials and industry leaders. What was the sense you got from them amid the current administration's actions?

Bera: I think there were some concerns amongst Indian government officials, certainly inviting Pakistani General to the Oval Office created some concerns. President Trump is taking credit for bringing the five tense days in May to a conclusion. I think that really was the Indians and Pakistan negotiating again.

And then, the \$100,000 H-1B visa fee. India does use about 70 percent of the H-1Bs, a lot of that benefits US companies, tech workers, and doctors that we need here in the United States. In the conversations, from the Congressional perspective, Congress is very strong in favor of the US-India relationship.

We see it as a pillar of not just the Indo-Pacific strategy, but also of global economics. India is the fastest-growing economy in the world. We want to continue to do business with India. I hope we get to zero tariffs between the two countries and actually finally get a trade deal between the two countries.

IANS: What's your overall analysis of the Trump administration's India strategy in the last nine months?


Bera: I'm not sure what the India strategy is, because it seems to be all over the place right now. There doesn't seem to be a coherent strategy, because it seems to go back and forth. At the beginning of the Trump administration, you certainly saw Prime Minister Modi and President Trump embrace, and you thought that this would be a relationship that would move forward fairly quickly. In May, you saw President cozying up to Pakistan. I think that gave some pause and had the Indian government scratching their heads, especially

after the heinous terror attacks that took place in April.

And then, the 50 percent tariff again, we have some concerns about India buying Russian energy, but we were able to get past that in the Biden administration.

China buys more Russian oil than India does. So again, I think it's fair for the Indians to say - why are you singling us out on this? And then the H-1B issue, none of this coherently makes sense.

That said, on the defense-to-defense side, we had a chance to visit Western Naval Command. Things continue to go really well.



IANS: Would you say this reflects a Trump-specific policy rather than a broader US-India strategy, and likely an aberration rather than the norm?

we view the India-US relationship, and that's one thing that we'll be introducing a legislation and a sense of Congress to reaffirm that members of Congress see the relationship as a hugely important one in the 21st Century.

IANS: A letter urging President Trump to improve US-India ties was signed by 19 House Democrats on Wednesday, but no Republicans. How do you view their silence?

Bera: I think they're certainly afraid to take on President Trump directly. So, instead of making this about President Trump, let's make it about the US-India relationship.

Let's make it about what we think as members of Congress - Democrats and Republicans.

I also think it's a good time for the diaspora. Once we have a sense of Congress like this, they can actually go to their members of Congress and say - You've talked for a long time about how important this relationship is, here's an opportunity to sign on to it. So again, once this government shutdown is over, we will be introducing that legislation. And again, hopefully, we'll do this in a bipartisan way. Because I don't want the India-US relationship to be a Democratic thing or a Repub-

Bera: What I've learned watching President Trump in these first eight-nine months of his administration is what he says today could be different than what he says tomorrow could be different than what he does the following week. So, I think it bears watching.

But I do think this is a time for Congress, Democrats and Republicans in Congress, to stand together and say - no, here's how lican thing. It should be an American thing.

IANS: You mentioned in an interview

that a few individuals are shaping India policy in the White House. Who are they, and how strong is the current India expertise there?

Bera: I mean, that's of concern. So certainly, in Trump's first term, he had seasoned political folks around him in his cabinet. Secretary Rubio has been a

strong advocate of the US-India relationship, but I don't know what his influence is

Certainly, a guy like Peter Navarro, who does seem to have the president's ear, has not been a friend of India. You have Stephen Miller, who also seems to be setting immigration policy [who] could be the one driving the H-1B strategy here, because how they rolled this out, it was clear that they didn't even know the details of it. So you saw the Commerce Secretary Lutnick make some statements, and then have to walk it back almost immediately.

And for big policy like this, you don't roll it out that way. Nobody consulted Congress on it. Clearly industry had no idea this was coming either. So again, I'm not exactly sure how they're making policy right now.

IANS: What, in your view, drove the administration's decision to target the H-1B visa program despite its clear impact on key sectors like tech and healthcare?

Bera: I don't think this was a thoughtthrough policy. If you were thinking it through, you would consult Congress, you would talk to industry, get a sense of the impact. I think this was a handful of people inside the White House making a decision, and the President made the wrong decision.

I think this is going to hurt US industry. You are already seeing the medical community, and many hospitals are already struggling to find doctors, and many of our medical students are physicians that are here in the United States are here on H-1B visas as well. So, hopefully that's getting through to the President, and then there will be some rollback of this policy.

The one challenge could be, if I'm a company like Microsoft, maybe I can figure a way through this, or I might just move my business to Hyderabad and set it up there. Because it's a small world right now. If I'm a small start-up in the United States, I can't pay \$100,000 for H-1Bs, and if the workers are in India, I'll just go ahead and move my work to India.

IANS: Could you share your thoughts on Sergio Gor, the new US Ambassador to India? He was confirmed by the Senate two days ago and is a close aide to President Trump, though he doesn't have regional expertise

Bera: He said all the right things at his confirmation hearings. I think since then, he said all the right things about a strong US-India relationship. Hopefully, his proximity to President Trump, the fact that he'll be in Delhi soon, he gets a chance to meet with Indian officials. He gets to see the vibrancy of the Indian economy and the vibrancy of the people, the vibrancy of their democracy, and hopefully, he can take that message back to President Trump. So, that's the positive, he does seem to have the president's ear and the ability to speak directly to the President.

IANS: Some critics say Democrats, despite supporting India, weren't vocal enough when Trump officials were attacking New Delhi. Do you agree with that criticism?

Bera: I have been speaking out. I have certainly been going to the Indian media and making the case, and by putting together a resolution that affirms the strong US-India relationship.

But that is something that I think it's fair, and that's part of the reason why we're





Japan reports flu outbreak, over 4,000 people affected

NEW DELHI: Japan has reported a significant outbreak of flu, with more than 4,030 people being affected nationwide, according to local media reports.

The country is experiencing a flu season about a month earlier than last year. It is also the second earliest in 20 years, Japan Today reported, citing the health ministry.

"About 3,000 hospitals across the country reported a combined 4,030 flu patients", the report said. Okinawa Prefecture reported the most patients per hospital, followed by Tokyo and Kagoshima.

The caseload has crossed the epidemic threshold, with an average of 1.04 patients per institution, the country's health ministry stated.

More than 100 schools, kindergartens, and childcare centers have been closed due to outbreaks among children.

Flu season in Japan usually spans from December through March. The previous season started in early November and peaked in late December before it was deemed over in April.

In the wake of the rising cases, the ministry urged the general public to take precautions and follow measures, such as hand washing and wearing masks.

While the virus strain is not yet known, it recommended vaccination for vulnerable populations such as young children, the elderly, and anyone with underlying health conditions. *IANS*

Young women account for seven out of 10 autoimmune disease patients: Experts

NEW DELHI: Women, especially young, account for seven out of 10 patients with autoimmune diseases, said health experts, emphasizing the need for increasing awareness and early screening among females.

Autoimmune diseases are chronic conditions where the body's immune system mistakenly attacks healthy cells and tissues. Common conditions include rheumatoid arthritis, lupus, thyroiditis, psoriasis, and Sjögren's syndrome. These diseases can affect joints, skin, blood vessels, and even internal organs like the heart or lungs.

The condition is far more common among women, especially between the ages of 20 and 50, when hormonal and lifestyle factors are most active. Many times, with a lack of awareness and other burdens, women tend to ignore their symptoms, leading to worsening outcomes.

"In my outpatient clinic at AIIMS, almost seven out of every 10 patients with autoimmune diseases are women. We see a clear pattern -- women often come late because they overlook

persistent symptoms," said Dr. Uma Kumar, Head of Rheumatology at AIIMS, New Delhi.

"Genetic make-up, hormonal changes during reproductive age and after childbirth, combined

with stress, obesity, and nutritional deficiencies, can make them more vulnerable to autoimcondition gets worse in India, because women often ignore early warning signs like tiredness, joint stiffness, or swelling -- dismissing them as minor problems or results of stress or ageing.

Many delay visiting doctors due to family responsibilities, lack of awareness, or social reasons, which allows the disease to progress silently until it becomes more severe.

Kumar urged the need to recognize autoimmune disorders as a major women's health issue in India.

A recent study by Stanford University found that women's bodies produce a special molecule called Xist RNA, which helps control one of the two X chromosomes that they carry.

However, this molecule can sometimes confuse the immune system, making it attack the body's own healthy cells instead of protecting them -- one of the key reasons why autoimmune diseases are seen more often in women.

"In my practice, about 70 percent of autoimmune patients are women, and many have gone through years of wrong treatment before reaching a specialist. We must identify the early signs, especially in women, so they can be referred to rheumatologists sooner. Early diagnosis can prevent long-term disability," said Dr. Pulin Gupta, Professor and Rheumatologist at Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Hospital.

Dr. Bimlesh Dhar Pandey, from a leading city-based hospital, said that women tend to live with unexplained joint pain or swelling for years before getting diagnosed.

"Many are in their 30s or 40s, juggling family and work. By the time they reach us, the disease has already damaged their joints or organs," said Pandey, urging for more awareness. *IANS*

AMR outpacing advances in modern medicine, resistant infections rising in hospitals globally: WHO

NEW DELHI: Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) is rapidly outpacing advances in modern medicine, and resistant infections are rising in hospitals across the globe, said the World Health Organization (WHO) in a new report.

The report, based on data from 104 countries in 2023 and 110 countries between 2016 and 2023, showed that one in six laboratory-confirmed bac-

terial infections causing common infections in people worldwide in 2023 were resistant to antibiotic treatments.

Between 2018 and 2023, anti-

biotic resistance rose in over 40 percent of the pathogen-antibiotic combinations monitored, with an average annual increase of 5-15 percent.



"Antimicrobial resistance is outpacing advances in modern medicine, threatening the health of families worldwide," said Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, WHO Director-General.

"As countries strengthen their AMR surveillance systems, we must use antibiotics responsibly and make sure everyone has access to the right medicines, quality-assured diagnostics, and vaccines. *IANS*

Heart disease, stroke and diabetes leading death and disability worldwide: The Lancet

NEW DELHI: Noncommunicable diseases (NCDs) such as heart disease, stroke, and diabetes are the leading cause of mortality and disability worldwide, according to a new study published in the journal The Lancet.

The study, based on the latest analysis of Global Burden of Disease (GBD), and also presented at the World Health Summit in Berlin, showed that the causes of death are shifting from infectious to NCDs -- which now account for nearly two-thirds of the world's total mortality and morbidity.

Ischemic heart disease, stroke, and diabetes were identified as the leading causes of mortality and morbidity across the globe, including in India. This was followed by chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, lower respiratory infections, and neonatal disorders.

While diarrheal diseases were the leading cause of deaths in 1990, with an agestandardized mortality rate (ASMR) of 300.53 per lakh population, in 2023, ischemic heart disease caused the maximum deaths, with an ASMR rate of 127.82 per lakh population.

Covid-19, the leading cause of deaths in 2021, plunged to the 20th place in 2023, followed by chronic obstructive pulmonary

disease, lower respiratory infections, and neonatal disorders, the study showed.

Notably, nearly half of all deaths and disability could be prevented by modifying some of the leading risk factors, such as reducing high levels of blood sugar and rector of the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation (IHME) at the University of Washington School of Medicine.

"The evidence presented in the Global Burden of Disease study is a wake-up call, urging government and health care lead-



high body mass index (BMI), said the researchers.

"The rapid growth in the world's ageing population and evolving risk factors have ushered in a new era of global health challenges," said Dr. Christopher Murray, Di-

ers to respond swiftly and strategically to the disturbing trends that are reshaping public health needs," he added.

The study produced estimates for 375 diseases and injuries and 88 risk factors by age and sex globally, analyzing data

from 204 countries and territories and 660 subnational locations from 1990 to 2023.

The researchers found that despite population growth and ageing, the 2023 global age-standardized mortality rate has declined 67 percent since 1950, and all countries and territories marked declines.

Global life expectancy returned to prepandemic levels at 76.3 years for females and 71.5 years for males, which is more than 20 years higher than in 1950. The number of infant deaths also declined globally.

Despite the progress, the largest increase in deaths was registered among adolescents and young adults, mainly due to suicide, drug overdose, and high quantities of alcohol.

Lead exposure, air pollution, and heat continued to have a more significant impact on global health.

Alarmingly, mental health disorders rose steeply, with anxiety disorders increasing by 63 percent and depressive disorders by 26 percent, the study showed.

In addition, sexual abuse and intimate partner violence were identified as preventable contributors to depression, anxiety, and other health consequences. *IANS*

Nagaland varsity study explores tea blossoms' potential for wellness products, rural growth

KOHIMA: A Nagaland University-led multi-institute research has unveiled the hidden health potential of tea blossoms that are often discarded as agricultural byproducts, officials said.

According to a varsity official, the study shows that these delicate flowers are abundant in potent bioactive compounds, positioning them as a natural source for health seven premium cultivars, rather than the traditional focus on the leaves.

Nutraceutical companies could harness tea blossom extracts to create natural energy boosters, relaxation aids, and skin-health products.

Beyond consumer health, the research offers economic opportunities for smallholder tea farmers by opening new rev-

supplements and functional beverages.

While tea leaves dominate global research and consumption, blossoms remain largely overlooked, he said.

This study is the first systematic effort in Assam, one of the world's largest teaproducing regions, to analyze the biochemical richness of tea blossoms from enue streams through blossom collection and processing.

As per the study, this approach also advances environmental sustainability, as utilizing blossoms reduces agricultural waste and contributes to a circular bio-economy.

With global demand rising for plant-based, eco-friendly health products, India

has the chance to position itself as a leader in functional foods and supplements derived from tea blossoms, it said.

Dr Sagarika Das, researcher from the Centre for Biotechnology and Bioinformatics at Dibrugarh University, fronted this groundbreaking research, collaborating with renowned tea biochemist Monoranjan Goswami from Tocklai Tea Research Institute in Jorhat, Assam, and Prof Tanmoy Karak from the Department of Soil Science at the School of Agricultural Sciences, Nagaland University.

New seaweed-based tablet to transform menstrual cups into health tracking tools

NEW DELHI: In a breakthrough, Canadian researchers have enhanced the existing menstrual cup into a safer, easier, and more environmentally sustainable tool, using seaweed, to track women's health.

The new menstrual cup can be leveraged to detect infections, monitor reproductive health, and improve diag-

nostics for conditions, such as endometriosis and urinary tract infections, said researchers at McMaster University in Ontario.

The new component, described in a paper published in the journal ACS Applied Materials and Interfaces, is a flushable tablet made from highly absorbent seaweed-based material.

It's designed to hold menstrual blood and minimize spills during removal -- a common barrier to wider adoption of menstrual cups.

"This project opened my eyes to how urgently innovation is needed in menstrual care," said Zeinab

Hosseinidoust, Associate Professor of biomedical and chemical engineering from the varsity.

"There's been little movement in the conversation around menstrual care. Some of that is due to stigma and some is lack of interest, but cups have the potential to make a serious difference in the lives of women around the world," Hosseinidoust added.

Beyond convenience and safety, the technology has the potential to significantly reduce the environmental impact of disposable menstrual products and improve access to menstrual care in lower-income communities.

> Each cup is designed to last for several years, offering a cost-effective and sustainable solution for users who may not have reliable access to tampons or pads.

> Though menstrual cups have long been available, their uptake has been limited due to usability challenges. These new cups address those concerns while opening the door to future health-monitoring capabilities.

The team envisions future versions of the menstrual products equipped with sensors to detect early signs of infections and blood-borne illnesses -

- using menstrual blood as a rich source of biological information.

"This could be a new form of wearable technology that could be even more valuable than a smartwatch," said associate professor of mechanical and bioengineering Tohid Didar, who co-led the research. IANS

RRI scientists deploy coffee-stain effect to spot deadly dyes in food

NEW DELHI: Scientists at Raman Research Institute (RRI), an autonomous institute supported by the Department of Science and Technology (DST), have exploited the phenomenon that makes coffee stains to spot deadly dyes in food.

When a coffee drop evaporates on a tabletop, it creates a distinctive dark circle around the edge. This daily phenomenon, or the coffee-stain effect, is due to the fact that as the liquid dries, particles suspended in the liquid move outward and cluster along the edge.

Using the phenomenon, the team developed a method to detect Rhodamine B -- a fluorescent synthetic dye used in textiles and cosmetics -- in food.

The dye is toxic and causes damage to the skin, eyes, and even the respiratory system. It is also an important environmental contaminant reported to persist in water.

"Dye molecules such as Rhodamine B are banned in products such as food and cosmetics due to their toxicity, but regulators face challenges in monitoring their illegal use, including usage of small quantities in products and a lack of availability of detection equipment," said A. W. Zaibudeen, researcher at RRI. IANS



India's Global Capability Centers' hiring increases by 5-7 pc in Q2 FY26

NEW DELHI: India's Global Capability Centers (GCCs) have witnessed a steady 5-7 percent quarter-on-quarter (QoQ) rise in hiring activity in the second quarter of the current fiscal (Q2 FY26), a recent report said.

The quarter reflected a continued focus on building capability rather than expanding headcount, with most demand stemming from AI and data, platform engineering, cloud and financial operations (FinOps) and cybersecurity roles.

"Sectors like BFSI, Manufacturing, Automotive, Energy, Technology and Hardware have become the main pillars of GCC growth, led by AI-enabled credit and risk operations in BFSI, EV and smart-factory programs in manufacturing, semiconductor and embedded AI development in the technology segment," Quess Corp, a staffing and workforce solutions company, said in its report.

According to the report, hiring budgets are now focused on revenue-critical and resilience-focused functions, creating steady demand for platform engineering, data management, and FinOps roles that support these programs.

Bengaluru-led GCC hiring in the July-September period leads with a 26 percent share, followed by Hyderabad (22 percent), Pune (15 percent) and, Chennai (12 percent).

Bengaluru saw strong traction in advanced AI and FinOps roles, while Hyderabad gained momentum in multi-cloud integration and data reliability, the report highlighted.

"India's GCC evolution is entering its most strategic phase yet, one defined by precision, not proliferation. Q2 reflected a measured 5-7 percent QoQ hiring growth, highlighting a shift from scale to capability-led maturity, with AI, FinOps, and platform reliability emerging as core priorities, said Kapil Joshi, CEO-IT Staffing, Quess Corp. *IANS*

Confidence of Indian CEOs in their firms' growth increased to 83 pc in 2025: Report

NEW DELHI: Confidence among chief executive officers (CEOs) in India in their own companies' growth prospects has climbed to 83 percent, up from 68 percent in 2024 - a significant leap that outpaces CEOs globally from 76 percent in 2024 to 79 percent in 2025, as per recent report said.

Despite a decline in global economic confidence -- from 80 percent in 2024 to 63 percent in 2025 -- Indian CEOs remain focused on innovation, resilience, and long-term growth strategies. Rather than retreating, they are prioritizing strategic investments in technology and talent to drive transformation.

"CEOs in India are demonstrating renewed confidence in their organizations' growth prospects, reflecting strong resilience and strategic clarity," KPMG India said in its report.

Meanwhile, AI remains a top investment priority, with 57 percent of Indian CEOs planning to allocate 10-20 percent of their budgets to AI over the next 12 months. A majority (73 percent) expect returns on AI investments within one to three years.

As much as 86 percent be-

tainty, CEOs in India are demonstrating remarkable resilience and a future-focused mindset. By embracing emerging technologies like AI, prioritizing cybersecurity, and advancing

vation, and fostering continuous learning is helping organizations stay competitive and ready for what lies ahead, he added.

Integration of AI into organizational processes is cited as the most pressing challenge shaping short-term decision-making.

Large enterprises are driving most of the hiring momentum, while medium and small businesses are proceeding with a more cautious, return-first approach.

"As India's economy sus-

tains a strong growth trajectory, driven by 7.8 percent GDP growth in Q1 FY2025-26 and tive demand cycles," TeamLease Services, a leading staffing firm, said in its report.



GST reforms, employers are aligning their people strategies to real business outcomes, commissioning milestones, and fesSectors leading the employment surge include e-commerce and tech start-ups, logistics, and retail, with projected Net Employment Changes (NECs) of 11.3 percent, 10.8 percent, and 8.1 percent, respectively, revealed the report, based on a survey of 1,251 employers across 23 industries and 20 cities, conducted from June to August.

Gold ETFs record 6-fold jump in Sep inflows amid geopolitical tensions, price rise: Report

NEW DELHI: Gold ETFs saw a six fold rise in inflows in September due to geopolitical tensions, central bank purchases, and expectations of US interest rate cuts, as per report of 15 October.

Net inflows increase by 578.28 percent to Rs 8,363.13 crore in September 2025 ahead of Dhanteras, up from Rs 1,232.99 crore last year, the report from ICRAAnalytics said.

Net inflow has witnessed a CAGR growth of 69.53 percent over last 5 years from Rs. 597.26 crore in September 2020, the report noted.

Net assets under management for Gold ETFs surged to Rs 90,135.98 crore in September, nearly doubling from Rs 39,823.50 crore a year earlier, marking a 126.34 per-



cent increase. On a month-on-month basis, net AUM increased by 24.33 percent from Rs 72,495.60 crore in August this year, the report noted.

"Escalating geopolitical tensions, global uncertainties and overall dynamic outlook seem to be boosting the safe-haven appeal of the bullion," said Ashwini Kumar, SVP and Head Market Data, ICRAAnalytics.

Further, investors prefer gold ETFs for their liquidity, transparency, cost-effectiveness, and ease of trading

India, South Korea ties get stronger with tech-driven partnership in chips, green energy

NEW DELHI: In recent years, India-South Korea relations have evolved into a strategically significant partnership with technology-driven collaboration in semiconductors and sustainable energy.

The focus on semiconductors and energy represents a leap from traditional trade ties to deep technological collaboration, essential for securing the future in a competitive global landscape shaped by geopolitical tensions and supply chain realignments, according to an article in India Narrative. South Korea's New Southern Policy provides the diplomatic scaffolding to translate economic and technological cooperation into a broad, resilient strategic partnership, amplifying both countries' influence in the Indo-Pacific, the article states.

The semiconductor partnership aligns closely with India's national ambition to become a global semiconductor hub by 2030. Through the India Semiconductor Mission and a suite of policy incentives, India is building fabrication plants and developing a comprehensive supply chain encompassing chip design, manufacturing, assembly, testing, and packaging. *IANS*

over physical gold, he added.

The demand for physical gold has steepened generally across various countries, which shall continue further and keep the gold price firm in the festive season and beyond in the near to mid-term, Kumar added.

Kumar also noted that ETFs provide portfolio diversification, inflation protection, and tax efficiency. He recommended strategic entry after short-term corrections, such as post-Diwali, which could offer attractive opportunities for phased investments.

Currently, there are 22 gold ETFs, including four launched in 2025. As of September 30, 2025, gold ETFs reported average returns of 50.97 percent over one year, 30.36 percent over three years, and 16.93 percent over five years. The top five funds have a five-year CAGR ranging from 16.95 percent to 17.23 percent. *IANS*

India's merchandise exports rise 6.75 pc in Sep despite US tariff hikes

NEW DELHI: India's merchandise exports in September rose 6.75 percent to \$36.38 billion compared to the same month of the previous year, despite the punitive tariffs imposed by the US, according to data released by the Commerce Ministry on 15 October.

The exports in September were also higher on a month-on-month basis than the corresponding figure of \$35.1 billion for August.

"This has been a turbulent year for trade given developments across the world pertaining to supply chains and market access. But despite the turbulence during the first 6 months of FY26, total exports are higher than last year with \$18 billion more than last year. Non-petroleum exports reached \$189.49 billion during the first six months of FY26, highest ever for the period," Commerce Secretary Rajesh Agarwal said here.



However. country's imports surged faster than exports due to the surge in demand ahead of the festive sea-

"Import increase in September 2025 has been higher than exports. Gold, silver, fertilizer and electronics have led to the import surge.

Fertilizer imports have been higher this year so far due to better demand this year," Agarwal explained.

Total goods imports rose to \$68.53 billion in September from \$61.59 billion in the previous month, according to the data.

The government estimated services exports in September at \$30.82 billion and imports at \$15.29 billion, suggesting a total goods and services trade surplus at \$15.53 billion.

Meanwhile, Indian and the US are making headway in their negotiations to conclude the first tranche of the proposed Bilateral Trade Agreement (BTA) as a team of Indian officials is scheduled to leave for Washington this week for further talks on the issue, according to government officials. IANS

Pakistan's debt spiral deepens: Another bailout on the horizon

NEW DELHI: With multiple internal strife, a Taliban offensive at the Afghan border and maintaining harmony with the powerful Pakistan Army, are adding to Islamabad's woes, the miserable economic condition has made it slide into deep debt.

Debtors, including China, reports suggest its total external debt has reached about USD 135 billion in Q2 2025, where the country already owes Beijing an estimated cluster of around USD 30 billion, with China being identified as one of Pakistan's largest bilateral creditors.

Pakistan must meet over USD 23 billion in external debt repayments in the current fiscal year, and the central bank's estimates put total foreign debt repayments and interest at about USD 30.35 billion for the year, say media reports.

As per the Pakistan Economic Survey 2024-25, the country's total debt was Pakistani Rs. 76.01 trillion (approx. USD 267 billion) at the end of March this year, comprising domestic debt of Pakistani Rs. 51.52 trillion (approx. USD 180 billion) and an external debt of Pakistani Rs. 24, 49 trillion (about USD 86 billion). IANS

Should India be seen deferring to the Taliban?

he US handed back Afghanistan to the Taliban on a platter after 20 years on August 26, 2021 when the last US troops left Afghanistan, suffering 19 killed while exiting. In these 20 years, the US continued its practice of promoting terrorism by inducting ISIS cadres from Iraq-Syria into Afghanistan (via Pakistan), conducting joint ISIS-US Special Forces operations in Afghanistan (photographic evidence of which exists), and allowing Pakistan to raise the ISKP in Peshawar and push it west into Afghanistan. During the same period, Al Qaeda declared its full support to the Taliban, which continues to date.

Concurrent to the US troops' exit, Indian diplomats hurriedly packed their bags and ran back to India despite the Taliban asking them to stay put, assuring they have nothing to fear. S. Jaishankar was India's foreign minister at that time, who has continued in the same appointment since then,

Questions to Ponder

India has announced the opening of its full-fledged embassy in Kabul, which is an indirect recognition of the Taliban regime ruling the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan. Since 2021, Pakistan has had a Taliban ambassador. Also, Taliban has had a political office in Doha since 2013, where the US-EU also interacts with the Taliban. China and Russia have diplomatic missions in Kabul and Beijing has a Taliban ambassador since 2023. But no country has provided a public platform to a Taliban official as India has - a joint press conference with a visiting Taliban minister!

Taliban's human rights record, particularly its regressive misogynistic policies are well known. No doubt developing relations with Taliban is a geostrategic requirement. But why did India have to ban women reporters from attending the joint press conference by the two foreign ministers?

India lifts temporary suspension on postal services to US, to resume from October 15

NEW DELHI: India announced the resumption of all categories of international postal services to the United States, effective October 15, following a temporary suspension of the services.

In an official release, the Department of Posts of the Ministry of Communications said that the move follows the successful implementation of a new Delivery Duty Paid (DDP) mechanism to comply with updated regulations issued by US Customs and Border Protection (CBP).

Postal services to the US were earlier suspended on August 22, following Executive Order 14324 by the US Administration, which withdrew de minimis treatment for all postal shipments. The suspension was due to new US requirements for upfront duty collection and remittance on all incoming postal items.

"After extensive system development, coordination with CBP-approved Qualified Parties, and successful operational trials in the Delhi and Maharashtra Circles, India Post has now established a compliant DDP mechanism," the Ministry stated.

Under the new system, all customs du-



ties for postal shipments to the USA will be collected at the time of booking in India and remitted directly to US authorities, ensuring faster customs clearance and hasslefree delivery for recipients in the US.

According to CBP guidelines, postal shipments from India to the US will be subject to a flat customs duty of 50 on the

declared Free on Board (FOB) value, as outlined in the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA) tariff.

However, unlike courier or commercial shipments, no additional product-specific duties will be imposed, offering a cost advantage to exporters.

Significantly, India Post will not charge

customers any additional fee for facilitating the DDP process. International postal tariffs will remain unchanged, helping to keep export logistics affordable for MSMEs, artisans, e-commerce sellers, and small traders.

"Importantly, the Department of Posts will not levy any additional charges on customers for facilitating DDP and Qualified Party services. The postal tariffs will remain unchanged, ensuring that exporters continue to benefit from affordable international delivery rates while complying with the revised U.S. import requirements. This measure has been introduced to maintain affordability, support MSMEs, and boost India's exports through the postal channel," the release

All categories of international mail, including EMS, Air Parcels, Registered Letters or Packets, and Tracked Packets, can now be booked for the US from any Post Office, International Business Centre (IBC), Dak Ghar Niryat Kendra (DNK), or via the India Post self-service portal. *ANI*

EAM Jaishankar, Canadian counterpart Anand agree on 'new roadmap' for India-Canada ties

NEW DELHI: External Affairs Minister (EAM) S Jaishankar and his Canadian counterpart Anita Anand held discussions in New Delhi to "restore and reinvigorate" the mechanisms necessary to advance bilateral partnership. The two leaders agreed on an ambitious cooperation roadmap for India-Canada ties.

A joint statement released following their talks stated that, in keeping with the priorities that the Prime Ministers of India and Canada had set out for bringing momentum to the relationship, both sides, based on mutual respect for shared democratic values, the rule of law, and a commitment to upholding the principles of sovereignty and territorial integrity, reached consensus on a 'New Roadmap' for India-Canada relations.

The Ministers recognized that in the context of ongoing global economic uncertainty and rising geopolitical tensions, a strong and resilient India-Canada bilateral relationship is essential

"Reviving this partnership will not only create opportunities for enhanced economic cooperation but also help mitigate vulnerabilities arising from shifting global alliances, ensure more reliable supply chains, and reinforce strategic stability in an increasingly complex international environment," it 2024 and the expanding presence of Indian and Canadian enterprises in each other's markets, generating jobs with significant potential for future growth.

Canada seeks stronger partnership with India, with public safety, trade at forefront, says FM Anand

MUMBAI: Canadian Foreign Minister Anita Anand has reiterated Canada's commitment to elevating its partnership with India, highlighting public safety at home and bolstering economic relations as top priorities.

She emphasized that while domestic public security remains a key focus for the Canadian government, it is also actively working to expand economic engagement with India across a wide range of sectors, including artificial intelligence (AI), energy, agriculture, and climate sustainability.

"I am so happy to be here in India... The main message that Canada is bringing to India is that we are here to elevate the relationship with India," Anand said.

"We have a focus on domestic public security in Canada and at the same time, we are working to strengthen the economic relationship with India across various sectors, which include AI, energy, agriculture and agro-food, climate and environmental sustainability, as well as peopleto-people and business-to-business ties," she added.

The Canadian Foreign Minister is currently on a three-day official visit to India, during which she will have engagements with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Exter-

nal Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, and Minister of Commerce and Industry Piyush Goyal. She is now in Mumbai to participate in an event, as per a release by the Ministry of External Affairs.

Anand also noted that the two areaspublic safety and economic cooperationform the core of Canada's approach to its evolving relationship with India. her Indian counterpart, Jaishankar, to unveil a "New Roadmap for India-Canada Relations".

The roadmap, rooted in mutual respect for democratic values, the rule of law, and sovereignty, aims to strengthen ties.

According to the joint statement, the meeting between the two leaders builds on guidance provided by the two Prime Ministers during their meeting on the sidelines of the G7 Summit in Canada, where they committed to taking calibrated measures to restore stability and pursue a constructive partnership.

Under the newly agreed Roadmap, India and Canada commit to revitalizing trade and investment ties. Among the first steps will be ministerial-level discussions and the resumption of the Canada-India CEO Forum, with a focus on sectors such as clean technology, infrastructure, agrifood, and digital innovation.

The two countries will be collaborating on renewable energy, decarburization of heavy industries, plastic pollution reduction, chemicals management, and sustainable consumption, with India and Canada also intending to relaunch the Canada-India Ministerial Energy Dialogue (CIMED) and promote two-way trade and investment in cleaner fuels, grid modernization, and clean technologies, including green hydrogen and carbon capture.

Recognizing that institutional capacity is key, Indian and Canadian High Commissions and consulates will be strengthened with expertise in economic, political, defense, and technological domains to help implement this ambitious agenda. Beyond bilateral initiatives, the Ministers affirmed their shared resolve to engage more actively in addressing global challenges and supporting inclusive, reformed multilateral institutions. *ANI*

Cherished friend of India: PM Modi condoles death of Kenya's ex-PM Raila Odinga

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed grief over the demise of former Kenyan Prime Minister Raila Odinga, who passed away earlier in the day at the age of 80, in Koothattukulam, Kerala, after suffering a heart attack during his morning walk.

Referred to Odinga as a "cherished friend of India", PM Modi recalled their meeting during his tenure as Chief Minister of Gujarat.

Odinga, who was in the state for Ayurvedic treatment,

collapsed suddenly and was rushed to Sreedhareeyam Ayurvedic Eye Hospital and Research Centre, but could not be revived. His body has been kept at Deva Matha Hospital, Koothattukulam.

In a post on X, PM Modi said, "Deeply saddened by the passing of my dear friend and former Prime Minister of Kenya, Mr Raila

Odinga. He was a towering statesman and a cherished friend of India. I had the privilege of knowing him closely since my days as Chief Minister of Gujarat, and our association continued over the years."

"He had a special affection for India, our culture, values and ancient wisdom. This was reflected in his efforts to strengthen India-Kenya ties. He particularly admired Ayurveda and the traditional medicine systems of India, having witnessed their positive impact on his daughter's health. I extend my deepest condolences to his family,

friends and to the people of Kenya in this hour of grief," he added


Odinga had arrived in Koothattukulam six days ago, accompanied by his daughter and close family members.

He had been following a routine of morning walks and treatment sessions at the hospital.

Local authorities said the heart attack occurred around 6.30 a.m. during his walk, and he was brought to the hospital in critical condition.

A towering figure in Kenyan politics for over four decades, Odinga served as the country's Prime Minister from 2008 to 2013, during a crucial period of national reconciliation and constitutional reform.


Known for his fiery speeches and grassroots connections, he was a central figure in shaping modern Kenyan democracy

India elected to UN Human Rights Council for 2026-28 term

NEW YORK: India has been elected for the seventh time to the United Nations' Human Rights Council for the term 2026-28, India's Permanent Representative to the UN, Parvathaneni Harish shared recently.

In a post on X he thanked all the delegations for their

support and underscored how the election is reflective of India's unwavering commitment to human rights and fundamental freedoms.

"India was elected to the Human Rights Council for the term 2026-28 @UN for the seventh time today. Thank all delegations for their overwhelming support. This elec-

tion reflects India's unwavering commitment to human rights and fundamental freedoms. We look forward to serve this objective during our tenure", he said.

The Human Rights Council is the main intergovern-

mental body within the United Nations responsible for human rights. Established in 2006 by the General Assembly, it is responsible for strengthening the promotion and protection of human rights around the globe.

The Council, composed of 47 Member States, provides

a multilateral forum to address human rights violations and country situations. It responds to human rights emergencies and makes recommendations on how to better implement human rights on the ground.

In a previous statement, the Permanent Mission of India to the UN noted how India's deepening engagement with

the United Nations is based on its steadfast commitment to multilateralism and dialogue as the key for achieving shared goals and addressing common challenges faced by the global community. *ANI*

China firmly opposes US restrictive measures targeting maritime, logistics, and shipbuilding sectors

BEIJING: China has expressed strong dissatisfaction with and resolute opposition to the restrictive measures imposed by the United States, which are based on the so-called results of the Section 301 investigation into China's maritime, logistics and shipbuilding sectors, the country's Ministry of Commerce said recently.

A ministry spokesperson, responding to a media query, said the US actions reflect typical unilateralism and protectionism, seriously violate World Trade Organization rules, undermine the principle of equality and mutual benefit in the China-US maritime transport agreement, and inflict severe damage on China's relevant industries.

China announced on October 10 that it will impose special port fees on ships that are US-flagged or US-built, or that are owned, partly owned, or operated by US enterprises,

organizations, or individuals, according to the ministry.

The US measures will not only disrupt global supply chains and significantly increase international trade

The US measures will not only disrupt global supply chains and significantly increase international trade costs, but will also drive up domestic inflation in the United States

costs, but will also drive up domestic inflation in the United States, undermine the competitiveness and employment of US ports, and jeopardize the security and resilience of its own supply chains, the spokesperson said, Xinhua news agency reported.

There is also significant opposition from US industry circles, clearly showing that the US approach harms others without benefiting itself, the spokesperson added.

The spokesperson noted that, in accordance with relevant domestic laws and regulations, China has placed certain companies that assisted or supported US investigative actions on its countermeasures list, and has launched investigations into US actions and those of other entities that threaten the security and development interests of China's shipping, shipbuilding and related industries.

Throughout the investigation, China will carry out law enforcement and inquiries in accordance with the principles of openness, fairness and justice, ensuring the full protection of the rights of all parties involved, according to the spokesperson.

China's position is clear and consistent, the spokesperson said. "We will fight, if fight we must. Our doors remain open, should the US wish to engage in dialogue."

China urges the United States to correct its wrongdoings, meet China halfway, and resolve issues of mutual concern through dialogue and consultation on an equal footing, the spokesperson added. *IANS*



US passport slips from top 10 powerful passports list for first time

NEW DELHI: The US passport has fallen out of the top 10 most powerful passports in the world for the first time since the Henley Passport Index was introduced twenty years ago. With visa-free travel to 180 of 227 countries, the US, which was the world leader in 2014, is now tied with Malaysia for 12th place.

With visa-free access to 193 destinations, Singapore remains in the top place, followed by South Korea with 190, and Japan with 189, according to the most recent Henley Passport Index, which is based on data from the International Air Transport Association (IATA).

Recent changes in access by a number of nations are the cause of the US ranking's decline. The decline has been attributed to a number of factors, including the removal of visa-free entry to Brazil earlier this year, exclu-

According to the India-Canada joint statement, EAM Jaishankar and Anand agreed to collaborate, exchange information and expertise and support respective climate ambitions in various areas, including renewable energy capacity, decarbonizing heavy industries, reducing plastic pollution, supporting the sound management of chemicals, and ensuring sustainable consumption. Both sides agreed to deepen collaboration to unlock new frontiers in S&T including AI, and digital infrastructure.

The joint statement said, "Noting with satisfaction that people-to-people linkages are central to fostering mutual understanding and building long-term collaboration, both sides agreed to strengthen cooperation in education, tourism, cultural exchange, and professional mobility. Early initiatives in this regard will include: Refreshed collaboration in higher education and research to reflect the increasingly deep talent pools and cutting-edge research in each country. Emphasis on research partnerships in emerging technologies (such as AI, cybersecurity, and fintech), and to expanded Canadian academic presence in India through overseas campuses. Revitalized Joint Working Group on Higher Education as a means to further expand Canada-India academic networks and institutional ties."

The two leaders pledged to expand collaboration on global issues, including working to ensure more effective and inclusive multilateral institutions. Following their talks in New Delhi, Jaishankar said that he and Anita Anand discussed global developments and their responses to shared challenges.

"Delighted to welcome FM Anita Anand of Canada to-day in New Delhi. Had constructive discussions to restore and reinvigorate the mechanisms necessary to advance our partnership. Also exchanged views on global developments and our responses to shared challenges. We also agreed on an ambitious cooperation roadmap. And to shepherd the process of rebuilding our cooperation so that it delivers on the expectation of our leaders and the interests of our people," Jaishankar posted on X after the meeting. *IANS*

sion from China's growing list of countries that do not require a visa, and new entry restrictions imposed by Myanmar and Papua New Guinea.

More recently, the US passport's reputation was further damaged by Vietnam's decision to exclude the US from its new visa-free program and Somalia's implementation of an eVisa system.

The UK has also suffered, dropping from sixth to eighth place since July, the lowest since it topped the index in 2015.

Only 46 nationalities are permitted entry into Washington without a visa, whereas US citizens are granted visa-

free travel to 180 locations. According to the Henley Openness Index, which rates nations according to how hospitable they are to foreign tourists, this disparity puts the US

in 77th place.

The US lags Australia and only marginally surpasses Canada, New Zealand, and Japan in the disparity between

its own openness and its international travel privileges.


On the other hand, China has made significant strides in the last ten years. It has added 37 more destinations to its list of visa-free travel destinations, moving up from 94th in 2015 to 64th in 2025.


After allowing visa-free travel to 76 nations, 30 more than the US, China is now ranked 65th on the Henley Openness Index. Beijing's increasing focus on global mobility and open-

ness is demonstrated by recent visa-free agreements with Russia, the Gulf States, several South American nations, and European partners. *IANS*







A Reset in the Making? Modi, Trump Reboot India-US Trade Ties

hen Prime Minister Narendra Modi tweeted about his "good progress achieved in trade negotiations" after a call with President Donald Trump, it was more than diplomatic choreography. It marked a visible thaw in one of the most strained phases of India-US commercial relations in recent memory-a pragmatic reset after months of tariff battles, oil-related sanctions, and stalled dialogue.

For Washington and New Delhi alike, the revival of talks signals both an economic and geopolitical recalibration, one that could reshape India's global posture as it navigates between competing great-power rivalry.

Since early 2025, India has been locked in a bruising trade confrontation with Washington. Punitive tariffs, some reaching could jeopardize any future alliance of democracies.

Behind the scenes, however, negotiators never stopped talking. Indian Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal's repeated visits to Washington and quiet working-level consultations gradually built a bridge back to dialogue.

By late September, with US midterm politics stabilizing and Washington seeking to rebuild Asian alliances, both sides found reason to de-escalate. The Trump-Modi call capped weeks of intensive diplomacy-an effort to fast-track a long-stalled bilateral trade agreement targeted for signature by November 2025.

Modi, Trump and Optics of Alignment

The optics of the leaders' exchange was deliberate. Modi's public reference to "good

50 percent, hit Indian exports ranging from textiles to auto components, a direct consequence of New Delhi's refusal to curb discounted Russian oil imports.

For India, the US measures were seen as excessive and politically tone-deaf, undermining the very strategic trust both nations had cultivated under the Indo-Pacific partnership.

Behind The Scenes Action

For Trump, the issue had turned into another round of embarrassing confrontation with Democrat Senators and Congressmen and leaders from the liberal or progressive Republican faction, who criticized his sudden harsh actions against India, a pivot in US strategies for the Indo-Pacific, as a move which

progress" and Trump's reciprocal praise, calling Modi a "great friend", were designed to project harmony and direction. The gestures also marked a reversal from earlier months, when Modi had conspicuously avoided direct engagement amid frustration over the U.S. tariff barrage.

What emerges now is a carefully managed "reset." The call restored leader-level communication and signaled that political capital is being invested to ensure the trade deal's conclusion.

It is also a personal recalibration: both leaders see the optics of economic cooperation as strategically valuable in an election-heavy year when global trade realignments are redefining alliances.

It also allows both leaders who

are extremely conscious of their public postures and positions to disengage from an ugly confrontation without losing "face". While Trump can claim victory by pointing out his measures helped bring peace in the Middle East with Indians as major cheerleaders, Modi can claim he has not given up buying Russian oil even as the amount imported is quietly recalibrated.

India's negotiators have tabled an array of targeted concessions to break the impasse. These include phased tariff reductions on select US industrial goods-premium dairy, automobiles, and alcoholic beverages-and conditional market access for American digital services and medical devices.

More significantly, India has offered to fast-track defense and nuclear purchases from US firms, using big-ticket strategic buys as leverage to secure tariff relief on exports. Talks for a defense pact as well for co-production went into the freezer after the public spat between the two leaders over trade and Russian oil.

Once the reset on trade proceeds, it could transform far more consequential realignment in security and technology, with both nations preparing to formalize a planned new 10-year Framework for Major Defense Partnership.

The proposed framework aims to institutionalize joint military planning, streamline defense trade regulations, and expand logistics-sharing, making the transfer of advanced US technologies to India faster and more predictable. It marks the most ambitious structural upgrade in defense ties since the signing of the foundational logistics and communications agreements nearly a decade ago.

US DUMPS INDIA UK PICKS-UP

As Trump dumps India especially on trade, PM Narendra Modi and UK counterpart Keir Starmer solidified trade and strategic ties in Mumbai, signing agreements to deepen economic links, expand education, and boost defense cooperation recently. The leaders highlighted the new Free Trade Agreement as a significant step, with Starmer emphasizing India's remarkable growth and its path to becoming a developed nation by 2047.

PM Modi described India and UK as 'natural partners' and characterized the deepening partnership as "an example of stability in an uncertain world." Education received a particular boost, with Modi confirming, "Nine UK universities to establish campuses in India," adding "GIFT city will host campuses of three UK universities."?The meeting, which included leaders from industry, academia, and culture, aims to leverage the FTA to unlock new trade opportunities, investment, and joint ventures across sectors ranging from technology and finance to defense and education.

The agreements signed last week are expected to accelerate bilateral trade growth, support the establishment of UK university campuses across India, and reinforce cooperation in maritime security and defense technology. In technology and innovation, to establish the India-UK Connectivity and, to create an innovation Centre for AI. Launch of Phase II of the UK-India Critical Minerals Supply Chain Observatory and establishment of a new satellite campus at IIT-ISM Dhanbad.

Establishment of the Critical Minerals Industry Guild to secure resilient supply chains and promote green technologies. On education front to hand over the Letter of Intent for opening of the Campus of Lancaster University in Bengaluru and Campus of University of Surrey in GIFT City. While in the trade co-operation, resetting the India-UK Joint Economic Trade Committee (JETCO), which will support implementation of the CETA and drive economic growth and job creation in both countries. The defense co-operation includes providing flight training instructors to R.A.F. and acquiring multirole missile systems from UK.

The deal envisages cuts in tariffs on goods from textiles to whisky and cars, and allow more market access for businesses in the world's fifth- and sixth-largest economies, aiming to boost trade by a further 25.5 billion pounds (\$34 billion) by 2040.

"This relationship matters more than ever," Starmer told reporters at a press conference before he flew home. "We're opening up new opportunities in India for British businesses, opportunities that other countries simply do not have. It has given us a unique edge."

Modi told a business forum he was confident the two countries would double their trade from the current \$56 billion ahead of their 2030 target. Ever since President Trump raised and singled out India on tariff issues, India's Prime Minister Modi has been busy looking for new partners to offset the losses, which may impact India.

In hindsight it may also be a blessing in disguise for India. India has been in slumber for many decades and this will definitely broaden India's trade with rest of the world. Modi and his team have been busy organizing new trade partners and create new trade-blocks to counter the shocks created by Trump. Politically India has chosen a neutral position on most issues including Gaza and Ukraine conflicts.
