India expels 6 Canadian diplomats hours after withdrawing its envoy to Canada

NEW DELHI: Hours after deciding to withdraw its High Commissioner and other "targeted diplomats" and officials from Canada, India expelled six Canadian diplomats.

The reason cited behind withdrawing High Commissioner and other officials by India from Canada was Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's continued "hostility" towards the country.

In a statement, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said "the Government of India has decided to expel the following 6 Canadian Diplomats".

The statement mentioned that the diplomats "have been asked to leave India by or before 11.59 p.m. on Saturday (October 19).

The decision to withdraw the High Commissioner and other officials was conveyed to Canadian Charge d'Affaires Stewart Wheeler who was summoned to the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) Secretary (East) in New Delhi and informed that the "baseless targeting" of the Indian High Commissioner and other diplomats and officials in Canada was completely unacceptable.

The decision to withdraw the High Commissioner and other officials was conveyed to Canadian Charge d'Affaires Stewart Wheeler who was summoned to the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) Secretary (East) in New Delhi and informed that the "baseless targeting" of the Indian High Commissioner and other diplomats and officials in Canada was completely unacceptable.

"It was underlined that in an atmosphere of extremism and violence, the Trudeau Government's actions endan-

gered their safety. We have no faith in the current Canadian Government's commitment to ensure their security. Therefore, the Government of India has decided to withdraw the High Commissioner and other targeted diplomats and officials," a statement read.

"It was also conveyed that India reserves the right to take further steps in response to the Trudeau Government's support for extremism, violence and separatism against India," it added.

Earlier in the day, India had issued a strongly worded statement, calling the diplomatic communication received from Canada on Sunday (13 Oct.) - suggesting that the Indian High Commissioner and other diplomats are 'persons of interest' in a matter related to an investigation in that country - as "preposterous imputations"

New Delhi asserted once again that the Trudeau government has "consciously provided" space to violent extremists and terrorists to harass, threaten and intimidate Indian diplomats and community leaders in Canada. *IANS*

LONDON: United Kingdom has said it is in contact with the Canadian government about serious developments outlined in the probe conducted in Canada into Khalistani terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijjar case. The spokesperson called India's cooperation with Canada's legal

process the "right next step."

Spokesperson for the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office of UK said, "We are in contact with our Canadian partners about the serious developments outlined in the independent investigations in Canada. The UK has full confidence in Canada's judicial sys-

tem. Respect for sovereignty and the rule of law is essential."

"The Government of India's cooperation with Canada's legal process is the right next step," the spokesperson said.

The diplomatic fallout between India and Canada came after Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) Commissioner Mike Duheme claimed they had informa-

tion on certain criminal activity carried out by agents of the Indian government.

"Over the past few years and more recently, law enforcement agencies in Canada have successfully investigated and charged a significant number of individuals for their direct involvement in ho-

micides, extortions and other criminal acts of violence. In addition, there have been well over a dozen credible imminent threats to life which have led to the conduct of duty to warn, by law enforcement with members of South Asian community and specifically, members of the pro-Khalistan movement," Duheme said.

The RCMP Commissioner further claimed that investigations have revealed that Indian diplomats and consular officials based in Canada leveraged their official positions to engage in clandestine activities, such as collecting information for the Government of India, either directly or through their proxies; and other individuals who acted voluntarily or through coercion. *ANI*

India's deteriorating relationship with Canada "reminiscent of relations with Pakistan"

WASHINGTON: Michael Kugelman, a US-based foreign policy expert and the Director of the South Asia Institute at the Wilson Center, has drawn a bleak comparison between India's deteriorating ties with Canada and its long-standing strained relations with Pakistan.

As tensions between India and Canada continue to escalate, Kugelman said, "One could not have imagined that things in this relationship could get worse, but they have."

Kugelman highlighted the seriousness of the situation, noting that the diplomatic fallout between the two countries bears striking simi-

larities to the Indo-Pakistan relationship.

"This is a relationship that's now hit rock bottom and indeed, looking at recent developments, certainly is reminiscent of India's relations with Pakistan in terms of these extremely serious allegations being made, in terms of senior diplomats being expelled, as well as the use of blistering language in government statements, it's all there and of

course, the core allegation that we're hearing from India that Canada is sheltering and sponsoring anti-India terrorists. This is what we're used to hearing India say about Pakistan," he pointed out.

Kugelman also spoke the internal political dynamics in Canada that have con-

tributed to the diplomatic rift, saying, "There are a lot of factors at play here. Certainly, one could acknowledge the relevance of the domestic political realities in Canada."

He further noted that Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's comments on India's internal matters, particularly his support for the

farmers' protests against agricultural laws, had sparked tensions.

"It is notable that PM Justin Trudeau has made some comments on internal developments in India that one would not expect a Canadian PM to make, such as commenting and expressing support for farmers protesting against Indian agricultural laws," Kugelman added. *ANI*

Indian enquiry team in Pannun assassination plot heads to United States

WASHINGTON DC: Amid the diplomatic row between India and Canada, the US State Department has announced that an Indian investigation team would travel to Washington DC on October 15 to investigate a plot to kill a US citizen in New York.

An Indian enquiry committee is set to visit the United States to investigate the involvement of an Indian government official in a foiled plot to assassinate a US national, the US Department of State said.

According to the State Department statement, an Indian enquiry committee "is

actively investigating the individual" and that India had informed the US it was looking in to "other linkages of the former government employee."

Notably, Indian national Nikhil Gupta is accused of being involved in the alleged failed murder plot of India-designated pro-Khalistani terrorist Gurpatwant Singh Pannun.

Earlier in June, Gupta was extradited from the Czech Republic to the US to stand trial, where he pleaded "not guilty." The US Justice Department alleged that

Gupta (52) is an associate of the Indian government and that together they and others helped plot the assassination of Pannun in New York City.

ONTARIO: Members of the Indian Diaspora in Canada raised concerns over the souring of ties between India and Canada. They made calls for a peaceful resolution of the matter. This comes amid a diplomatic standoff on Monday which saw India expelling six Canadian diplomats and recalling the Indian envoy to Canada.

Speaking exclusively to ANI, leading Canadian businessman, politician and social activist Baljit Singh Bawa called it a "disheartening news" and said the turn of events happened due to "politically

"sorrowful news" that India and Canada's relationship is going downhill. Emphasizing that Canada is home to a significant number of Indo-Canadians, he noted that the standoff would impact the citizens and even the trade relations of the two countries.

Maharaja suggested the intervention of a "third friendly country" between India and Canada to help in the resolution of the matters between the two nations.

With nearly 1.8 million diaspora and another 1 million Non-Resident Indians, Canada hosts one of the largest Indian

gating the individual who was identified last year in the Department of Justice's indictment as an Indian government employee who directed a foiled plot to assassinate a US citizen in New York City," the US Department of State said in a press release.

"The Enquiry Committee will be travelling to Washington, DC on October 15th, as part of their ongoing investigations to discuss the case, including information they have obtained, and to receive an update from US authorities regarding the US case that is proceeding," the State Department said.

"Additionally, India has informed the United States they are continuing their efforts to investigate other linkages of the involvement in a foiled plot to assassinate a US-based leader of the Sikh Separatist Movement and a citizen in New York.

India in November last year formed a high-level inquiry committee to address the security concerns highlighted by the US government. The Ministry of External Affairs said that India takes such inputs seriously since they impinge on national security interests as well, and relevant departments were already examining the issue.

India withdrew the High Commissioner to Ottawa earlier, along with other "targeted diplomats and officials" that Canada named as "persons of interest" in its investigation. India later also expelled six Canadian diplomats. *ANI*

Indian climber rescued from Russia's Mount Elbrus

MOSCOW: The Russian Emergencies Ministry said it has successfully rescued a climber from India, who fell ill while attempting a solo ascent of Mount Elbrus.

The climber, a 32-year-old man, encountered difficulties at a challenging altitude of 5200 meters and had not registered his route before the climb, the ministry revealed.

The rescue operation, coordinated by the Elbrus High-Mountain Search and Rescue Team of the Russian Emergencies Ministry, involved five skilled personnel who were swiftly dispatched to the site after receiving a distress call.

The team worked under difficult conditions, carefully evacuating the climber to safety. He was transported to a mountaineering camp, where he is now receiving medical attention and recovering.

The Ministry has reiterated the importance of proper route registration and climbing in groups, especially in such high-altitude environments.

Mount Elbrus, the highest peak in Europe, is a popular destination for climbers worldwide, but its severe weather conditions and challenging terrain demand careful planning and professional support.

The incident, said the Russian ministry, underscores the crucial role it plays in safeguarding lives, particularly in remote and hazardous regions like the Caucasus Mountains.

"The swift and efficient response of the Russian Emergencies Ministry highlights their expertise and commitment to protecting both locals and international visitors in the country's most extreme environments," the ministry said in a statement. *IANS*

"If activities across border characterized by terrorism....": Jaishankar's veiled jibe on Pakistan at SCO meeting

ISLAMABAD: External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar termed cross-border terrorism, extremism and separatism as the "three evils" that hinder trade and travel as well as people to people relations between

Addressing the 23rd Meeting of the Shanghai Cooperation (Organization) Council of Heads of Government, Jaishankar took a veiled jibe at Pakistan to state that if activities across borders are characterized by terrorism, extremism and separatism, they are "hardly likely to encourage trade, energy flows, connectivity and people-to-people exchanges in par-

Further in an indication towards China's Belt and Road Initiative, Jaishankar, called out the "unilateral" connectivity moves in the region while stressing that "cooperation must be based on mutual respect and sovereign equality."

Jaishankar noted that globalization and rebalancing are realities that cannot be

"We all realize that the world is moving towards multi-polarity. Globalization and rebalancing are realities that cannot be denied. Cumulatively, they have created many new opportunities in terms of trade, investment, connectivity, energy flows and other forms of collaboration. There is no question that our region would benefit immensely if we take this forward. Not just that, others too would draw their own inspiration and lessons from such efforts,"

he said in his address.

"However, to do that, cooperation must be based on mutual respect and sovereign equality. It should recognize territorial integrity and sovereignty. It must be built on genuine partnerships, not unilateral agendas. It cannot progress if we cherry-pick global practices, especially of trade and transit," the External Affairs minister said.

The SCO Meeting is being chaired by Pakistan's Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif as the current chair of the Council.

Calling for firm commitment to the SCO Charter, Jaishankar said, "But most of all, our endeavors will progress only when our commitment to the Charter remains firm. It is axiomatic that development and growth requires peace and stability. And as the Charter spelt out, this means being

firm and uncompromising in countering the 'three evils'. If activities across borders are characterized by terrorism, extremism and separatism, they are hardly likely to encourage trade, energy flows, connectivity and people-to-people exchanges in parallel.'

He further said, "Let us contemplate how much we all stand to gain if it was to be otherwise. Our very agenda today in Islamabad gives us a glimpse of those possibilities. Industrial cooperation can enhance competitiveness and expand labor markets. MSME collaboration has positive implications for employment. Our collective endeavors can expand resources and encourage investment flows. Business communities will profit through larger networks. Collaborative connectivity can create new efficiencies." ANI


He mentioned the inclusion of digital public infrastructure (DPI) and digital inclusion as an aspect of the SCO cooperation framework.

Industrial and warehousing demand surges 17 pc in top 5 Indian cities

NEW DELHI: Industrial and warehousing demand witnessed 20.2 million square feet of leasing in top five cities in the January-September period, registering a 17 percent annual growth, according to a recent report.

The quarterly average space uptake has steadily increased from 5.7 MN sq ft in 2021 to 6.7 MN sq ft in 2024, indicating steady and sturdy growth in industrial and warehousing demand, according to the report by Colliers India.

Third-party logistics (3PL) players accounted for 35 percent of Grade A space uptake, followed by engineering and FMCG segments.

At about 22 MN sq ft-supply rose 29 percent YoY in the first three quarters of 2024. During the first three quarters of the year, Delhi-NCR and Chennai cumulatively accounted for 53 percent share in the overall leasing.

At a micro-market level, Bhiwandi in Mumbai has witnessed 3.7 MN sq ft of leasing activity in 2024, followed by Oragadam in Chennai and Chakan-Talegaon in Pune. Both saw more than 2.0 MN sq ft of demand and continue to drive warehousing demand in respective cities.

"On a quarterly basis, Q3 saw about 7.3 MN sq ft of industrial and warehousing demand across the top five cities, an 18 percent rise YoY," said Vijay Ganesh, Managing Director, Industrial and Logistics Services, Colliers India. *IANS*

India's semiconductor market projected to surpass \$100 billion in revenues by 2030

NEW DELHI: India's semiconductor market is set to cross \$100 billion in revenues by 2030, driven by government initiatives like production-linked incentive (PLI) scheme amid robust demand to build digital infrastructure across industries, according to a report.


Mobile handset, IT and telecom segments are leading the semiconductor industry, contributing more than 75 percent of its revenues, according to a report by the India Electronics and Semiconductor Association (IESA) and Counterpoint Research.

The government's \$9.1 billion 'Semicon India' program aims to boost semiconductor manufacturing and workforce development, driving innovation and growth in India's tech ecosystem.

"India has created one of the largest smart populations in the world, powered by semiconduc-

tors operating in the background. Semiconductors have a profound commercial, strategic and social impact," said Ved Prakash Mall, Director, IESA. Semiconductors play a crucial role in sectors such as electronics manufacturing, digital transformation, defense, aerospace, renewable energy, IoT, healthcare, automotive and research.

India's semiconductor market was valued at \$45 billion in 2023 and is projected



to rapidly grow at a CAGR of 13 percent to surpass \$100 billion by 2030.

Tarun Pathak, Research Director at Counterpoint Research, said that the

handset sector is the leading force in India's semiconductor industry, playing a crucial role in the country's digital transformation as more consumers transition from feature phones to smartphones.

"This growth is driven by the increased use of social media, OTT platforms, af-

fordable prices, accessible data, and the expansion of the 5G network. At the same time, India's IT sector is thriving, supported by pandemic-driven digitalization and government initiatives like 'Digital India' and 'Make in India'," he mentioned.

Union Minister for Electronics and IT, Ashwini Vaishnaw, said this month that India is moving towards becoming the next semiconductor hub for the world as big investment is happening in this sector in the country.

More than Rs 1.52 lakh crore (nearly \$18 billion) worth of in-

vestments have come in India's semiconductor manufacturing space in a short span of time and several projects are already in the pipeline. *IANS*

Satellite broadband spectrum not be auctioned but allocated administratively: Center

NEW DELHI: The government has said that spectrum for satellite broadband will not be auctioned but allocated administratively, after SpaceX CEO Elon Musk termed the auction route being sought in the country by top industrialists as "unprecedented".

During a press briefing at the 'India Mobile Congress 2024', Telecom Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia said the spectrum for satellite services will be allocated administratively.

"There is a paper that has already been circulated by TRAI and that regulatory authority of telecom has been empowered by the constitution to decide what administrative prices are going to be," the minister said.

"I am very confident that they will come up with the best prices that should be adopted, provided they are under administrative demand," the minister added.

Minister Scindia assured that the allocation process is in line with global standards. *IANS*

Indonesia sends off humanitarian aid in Yemen, Sudan

JAKARTA: Indonesia here sent off \$3 million of humanitarian aid to refugees in Yemen, Palestine and Sudan.

During a press conference at an airport in Jakarta, the head of the National Disaster Mitigation Agency Suharyanto said the aid was respectively for around 270,000 disaster victims in Yemen, around 3,000 people infected with cholera and around 490,000 people affected by floods, and around 1.9 million Palestinian refugees who are aggravated by polio disease.

"All the aid is given officially, and of course, under accountability, including aid to Palestine, Sudan, and Yemen, which will start being delivered today," he said at Halim Perdanakusuma airport, accompanied by Coordinating Minister for Human Development and Culture Muhadjir Effendy and Minister for Foreign Affairs Retno Marsudi.

Suharyanto also mentioned that Palestine, Sudan and Yemen are the 12th, 13th and 14th countries to receive aid from Indonesia in the last two years, Xinhua news agency reported.

The aid, transported by a plane from the country's flag carrier, Garuda Indonesia, included dozens of refugee tents, mattresses, blankets, lighting, women's and children's clothing, ready-to-eat food, medicines, and medical equipment.

All aid from Jakarta departed 14 October and is expected to arrive in Yemen on October 15, before being distributed to the other two countries.

Suharyanto expressed hopes that this assistance would help alleviate the suffering of disaster and humanitarian crisis victims in the three countries, while also enhancing Indonesia's role on the international stage in promoting peace and upholding humanitarian values. IANS

Trump reiterates he wants legal immigrants, promises strong action against illegal migrants

NEW YORK: Republican Presidential Candidate Donald Trump has reiterated that he wants immigrants as long as they come legally, but will take strong action against illegal migrants.

"We want to have people come into our country, but they have to come in legally", he said at the campaign rally in Aurora, Colorado.

As for illegal immigrants, he said, "All across our nation I make this pledge and vow to you. November, 5, 2024, will be Liberation Day in America, (there) will be liberation" from what he said was "the occupation" of the country.



According to the Customs and Border Protection agency, till August as many as 82,610 Indian citizens were recorded crossing the borders illegally and 96,917 last year.

His opposition accuses him of being "anti-immigrant" a refrain taken up by most of the mainstream media -- but Trump makes a distinction between illegal and legal immigrants while most Democrats lump those who waited for years and went through rigorous scrutiny to legally immigrate with those sneaking in.

He has promised Green Cards - legal immigrant status - for foreigners graduating from US colleges, going far beyond any Democrat proposals, which focus on legalizing illegal immigrants.

"What I want to do and what I will do is, you graduate from a college, I think you should get automatically as part of your diploma, a green card to be able to stay in this country", he said in June.

That policy would be dif-

ficult to implement, but in theory it sounds as good news for the nearly 269,000 Indian students enrolled in US colleges and universities, according to statistics from the International Institute of Education covering 2022-23.

Colorado, where Trump campaigned last week, is a blue state that Hillary Clinton carried in 2016 and by President Joe Biden in 2020, and a poll taken last month by Keating Research gave Harris a lead of 11 percent.

Trying to go against the odds, he made crimes by ille-

gal immigrants the centerpiece of the speech in Aurora where reports that an armed Venezuelan criminal gang had taken over local apartment complexes have sparked

Trump interrupted his speech to show a video stringing news clips of crimes by illegal immigrants, ranging from rape and murder to shooting at police.

Standing against a black backdrop scrawled with "End Migrant Crime", and "Deport Illegals Now", he accused his Democrat rival Vice President Kamala Harris of bringing in criminal illegal immigrants through "open border" policies, asserting that she was the "Border Czar".

> He cited an old quote of Harris that "we don't want to treat people who cross the border illegally as criminals."

> While vowing mass deportations and stern action against criminal gangs, he said, "I'm hereby calling for the death penalty for any migrant that kills an American citizen or law enforcement officer."

> Trump said that crime in countries like Venezuela had gone down drastically because they have emptied their prisons and mental hospitals and sent the inmates to plague the US.

> He said he would invoke an 18th-century law, Alien Enemies Act, "to target and dismantle every migrant criminal network". But this law applies only to those from a foreign enemy country - and applying it across the board to all countries would be a challenge as would a mass

deportation campaign.

Till August this year, 2.75 million illegal immigrants from around the world were caught entering illegally and 3.2 million last year.

Aurora Mayor Mike Coffman, a Republican said that while there a few incidents, it was an exaggeration to say the city was a "war zone" run by Venezuelan criminal gangs.

Trump called on stage a woman who publicized a video recording of the Venezuelan gang armed with a highpower rifle overrunning an apartment building.

Although Trump called Harris the "Border Czar", her campaign has said that she was not put in charge of the border by Biden, but was only asked to work with other

countries on stemming illegal immigration to the US.

After Aurora, Trump went to Reno in Nevada, a swing state that could determine the winner where his lead is a sliver of 0.2 percent.

He repeated most of the elements of his speeches -that Harris was a "Marxist", was incompetent, that the US was on a downhill trajectory, and that he would stop World War III, bring back jobs, cut taxes, reduce prices, and make the nation safe. IANS

Record 2.25 lakh housing units sold in India in Jan-Sep

NEW DELHI: The Indian housing market saw over 225,000 units being sold during the first nine months of the year, demonstrating strong performance in absolute terms, according to a new report.

The sustained positive sentiment in the housing market has encouraged developers to launch new projects and additional phases, resulting in approximately 215,000 new units entering the market in the first nine months of 2024, according to a report by real estate consultant CBRE.

"Given the strong performance in H1 2024 and the sector's tendency to peak during the festive season, we forecast both sales and new launches of



residential units to remain elevated," the report mentioned.

In addition, the report expected the high-end/premium categories (Rs 1 to 2 crore and Rs 2 to 4 crore, respectively) to witness strong demand.

Notably, the traditional midend segment-dominated markets such as Noida, Bengaluru, Pune, and Chennai are expected to continue gravitating increasingly towards high-end developments.

Meanwhile, equity investments in the Indian real estate sector surged 46 percent to \$8.9 billion during the January-September period.

According to Anshuman Magazine, Chairman and CEO-India, South-East Asia, Middle East and Africa at CBRE, sustained capital inflows are expected in both traditional and emerging sectors in the upcoming quarters, while institutional and collective vehicle investors, along with developers, are expected to drive the overall capital flows. *IANS*

India sees all-time high deal numbers in real estate sector in July-Sep

NEW DELHI: India saw 25 deals worth \$1.3 billion in the real estate sector in the July-September period (Q3), maintaining strong deal volumes and marking an all-time high in deal numbers and second-highest values since Q2 2023, a recent report showed.

Deal values were primarily driven by the qualified institutional placement (QIP) activity, private equity funding in residential and commercial segments, and real estate technology companies, according to the report by Grant Thornton Bharat.

Compared to Q2 2024, the third quarter saw a 71 percent decline in overall private equity (PE) and mergers and acquisitions (M&A) deal value but a 5 percent increase in deal volume.

"Year-over-year comparison shows a 54 percent increase in deal volumes and a 41 percent decline in values compared to Q3 2023," said the report.



Q3 2024 saw three inbound deals in the property development space and two outbound deals in the student housing and online rental platform sectors.

PE activity in Q3 2024 saw 12 deals valued at \$401 million. Deal volumes remained consistent with Q2 2024, indicating sustained interest in the sector. The top two deals accounted for \$346 million, highlighting a concentration of value in fewer

transactions.

Despite decline in funding values over Q2 2024, deal values continued to outperform those in both Q1 2024 and Q3 2023, according to the report.

Q3 2024 saw one IPO raising \$49 million, maintaining consistency with previous quarters. The quarter witnessed a significant surge in QIPs, with four deals totaling \$940 million.

"This represents a nearly six-fold increase in QIP values compared to Q2 2024," the report mentioned.

The robust QIP activity demonstrates growing confidence in real estate firms' ability to access public markets.

Renewed PE and M&A activity in the latter part of Q3 signals potential for increased momentum in Q4 2024, the report noted.

Listed Indian real estate players trim debt by 54 pc, bookings at record high

MUMBAI: Top eight listed real estate developers in India have reduced their net debt by over 54 per cent in the first quarter of current fiscal (FY25) from the previous peak in FY19, a report showed on Thursday.

The net debt of these companies collectively reduced to about Rs 20,808 crore in Q1 FY25, from over Rs 44,817 crore in Q4 FY2019 when the overall debt of these listed players was at its peak, according to data by Anarock Group.

With residential sales creat-

ing a new peak across the top seven cities in the last one year, buyer demand is heavily in favor of branded developers. In Q1 FY25 alone, the booking value of these eight listed developers stands at Rs 26,832 crore.

According to their investor presentations, FY19 saw these top eight listed players with a collective booking value of Rs 27,144 crore.

In FY24, it increased to about Rs 90,573 crore, thereby rising by a whopping 234 per cent in this period.

Notably, the first quarter of this financial year alone saw their collective booking value at Rs 26,832 crore - nearly 99 per cent of the total value clocked in entire FY19, and 30 per cent of the total value in the whole of FY24.

"This is significant, considering that there are three more quarters left in the ongoing financial year," said the report.

Dr Prashant Thakur, Regional Director and Head-Research, Anarock Group said that data shows a significant rise in their sales revenue.

"Some players even saw their net debt rise in this period. However, these developers also saw a high jump in their booking values over the year," said Thakur.

The rise in debt is mainly due to their aggressive expansion across the geographies and many have been on a land buying spree across cities.

The net debt decline of the other players is due to the significant jump seen in the booking values over the last few quarters, said the report. *IANS*



SC dismisses PIL over Covid-19 vaccine side effects

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court dismissed a public interest litigation (PIL) seeking a direction to the government to establish fast-track courts and vaccine courts to provide swift justice to the Covid-19 vaccine injured and their families.

A bench, headed by CJI D.Y. Chandrachud, said that the petitioners may choose to institute a class action suit instead of filing a PIL before the apex court.

After noting that the petitioners did not suffer any adverse effects personally, the Bench, also comprising Justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra, proceeded to dismiss the PIL.

The plea said that there are "persisting risks" of long-term health consequences of Covid-19 vaccination and controversies over vaccine side-effects refuse to die

"While vaccination was the cornerstone to control the pandemic and disease spread, concerns regarding safety and adverse health impacts (SAHIs) have been raised lately. There are health concerns about safety and adverse health impacts (SAHIs) of Covid-19 vaccines among common citizens," it said. *IANS*

Climate change to have severe impact on health emergency services globally: Study

COPENHAGEN: Climate change is likely to have a severe impact on health emergency services around the world, international experts in emergency medicine warned on Sunday.

Despite this, few countries have assessed the scale of the impact or have a plan to deal with it, said researchers at a special session at the European Emergency Medicine Congress.

Luis Garcia Castrillo, a professor in emergency medicine at the Hospital Marques de Valdecilla, Santander, Spain, described how he and colleagues had asked 42 focus groups in 36 countries to complete a survey on climate change awareness and preparedness.

"On a scale of zero to 9, they rated the severity of the impact of climate change on health systems and specifically on emergency care, both now and in the future, at an average of 7," Castrillo said. "This is a high figure, especially as some regions, such as northern Europe, consider it to be less of a problem than on global health systems.

However, only 21 percent of the focus group members reported that assessments of the effect of climate change on published in the European Journal of Emergency Medicine.

Out of all the focus group respondents, 62 percent said their governments or policy makers



than do other countries, such as Australia.

The focus groups considered that the impact of climate change on emergency medical services would be similar or even higher emergency medical services had been carried out, and only 38 percent reported any measures had been taken to prepare for the impact of climate change," the team noted in the research to be had made no assessment of the impact of climate change on emergency services, 9 percent said they didn't know, 55 percent said nothing had been done to prepare for the impact of climate change, and 10 percent didn't know

"It is surprising how awareness is lacking in so many countries, as well as among emergency medicine societies. Some countries do not seem to be concerned at all. Yet this is going to affect rich and poor countries alike," said Castrillo.

Dr Roberta Petrino, director of the Emergency Department at Ente Ospedaliero Cantonale, Lugano, Switzerland, said that one interesting finding is that the need to implement actions to mitigate climate change is considered important everywhere.

"In particular, our survey showed the need to strengthen emergency medicine services and education programs for medical students and emergency medicine doctors, as well as research," she mentioned. *IANS*

Indian healthcare, pharma sector sees highest quarterly deal volumes in 3 years

NEW DELHI: The healthcare and pharma sector saw an overall 64 deals, valued at \$2.8 billion in Q3 of 2024, marking the sector's highest quarterly volumes in three years, according to a recent report.

The report by Grant Thornton Bharat showed that mergers and acquisitions, and private equity deal volumes increased significantly, with 59 deals worth \$2.2 billion, the highest since Q4 2021.

However, Q3 2024 saw a 47 percent decline in deal values compared to Q2 2024.

The decline was mainly due to fewer high-value deals, with only two deals worth \$1.8 billion.

In contrast, Q2 2024 had 11 high-value deals (over \$100 million) totaling \$3.4 billion.

Healthtech, Pharma, and biotech and wellness segments led the deal volumes collectively with a 66 percent share, while Pharma and biotech led the deal values with a 79 percent share.

"Overall, the pharma and healthcare sector witnessed increasing investor interest, driven by strong consumer demand focused on healthy living, innovation, and a focus on high-growth areas like biologics and specialty care," Bhanu Prakash Kalmath S J, Partner

and Healthcare Services Industry Leader, Grant Thornton Bharat.

"We anticipate the deal momentum to continue as companies position for growth both domestically and globally," he added.

The report said that Q3 2024 saw 26 merger and acquisition deals valued at \$1.9 billion, achieving record-high quarterly deal volumes.

Deal volumes also increased 44 percent from Q2 2024, and deal values rose by 39 percent to \$1.9 billion.

Further, Q3 2024 saw 33 private equity/venture capital deals valued at \$246 million. Deal values declined 91 percent from Q2 2024 due to the absence of big-ticket transactions. *IANS*



New Lancet study shows how countries can reduce premature death by half

The Quality care you need

ACCEPTING NEW PATIENTS

NEW DELHI: Childhood immunizations and low-cost prevention and treatments combined with new health technologies may help reduce premature deaths by 50 percent, according to a new study published by The Lancet Commission.

The report laid out a roadmap for every nation that chooses to do so to cut the chance of premature death for its citizens in half by 2050.

"The goal of "50 by 50," is achievable", argues the report. If every country achieves the goal, then, a person born in 2050 would have only a 15 percent chance of dying before age 70, down from 31 percent for someone born in 2019.

It suggested measures such as "expanding childhood immunizations and low-cost prevention and

treatments for common causes of preventable death, combined with scaling up financing to develop new health technologies".

Since 1970, about 37 countries have cut the probability of their citizens dying before they reach age 70 in half -- a milestone that signals the remarkable progress many countries have made in preventing and treating disease.

"Today, the case is better than ever for mortality reduction," said Gavin Yamey, director of the Duke University Center for Policy Impact in Global Health (CPIGH), who led the writing of the commission report.

"It's a prize within reach. It will have extraordinary health, welfare, and economic benefits. Reaching '50 by 50' would reduce mortality and morbidity, help grow

economies, and alleviate poverty," Yamey added.

The report urged countries to prioritize the 15 health conditions that cause most premature deaths -- including tuberculosis and respiratory infections, diabetes and cardiovascular disease, and other issues such as accidents and suicide.

The researchers said that significant gains can be made in public health by

"subsidizing the costs of essential medicines, diagnostics, vaccines, and that address these 15 conditions.

The report also called for increased taxation on tobacco products, unhealthy foods and drinks, and fossil fuels, which the researchers said would both reduce illness and death attributable to those products and raise revenue that can be reinvested in health systems. *IANS*

Second round of polio vaccination campaign starts in Gaza: UN

UNITED NATIONS: The second round of the polio vaccination campaign began in the middle area of the Gaza Strip, UN humanitarians said.

The UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) said, in less than two weeks UNRWA-- the UN relief agency for Palestinians, the World Health Organization, and the UN Children's Fund aim to vaccinate around 590,000 children under 10 years of age with a second dose of the novel oral polio vaccination, reports Xinhua news agency.

"But to vaccinate as many children as possible, all parties must respect local humanitarian pauses," OCHA said.

This follows a first round, which was implemented from September 1 to 12, reaching more than 559,000 children. As with the first round, the second round will have three phases, each involving three campaign days and one catch-up day.

Responding to recent Israeli strike on tents sheltering displaced people near Al Aqsa Hospital in Gaza, UN Acting Under-Secretary-General Joyce Msuya said that the horrors Palestinians are forced to endure "seem to have no end."

In a statement, Msuya said there really is no safe place in Gaza for people to go, calling for the atrocities to end and for civilians and civilian infrastructure to be protected. *IANS*



he United States has long been a global leader in innovation, setting the pace for technological advancements that drive the international economy. Careers in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics are among the highest-paying jobs in the US. Workers in these fields earn over \$100,000 a year, in comparison to the national wage average of \$46,000. The US is the world's leader in research and development, but faces a critical shortage in its home-

Getting Students to Embrace STEM

grown workforce. Roughly 43% of STEM workers in the US are from abroad. The gaps are critical for students of color and girls as well as low income children. For the United States, this means fostering a diverse and highly skilled workforce capable of driving the next wave of breakthroughs. Speakers at the EMS briefing discussed novel initiatives to engage kids in STEM occupations, as well as some of the barriers in classrooms

Growth in STEM jobs over the next decade is projected to significantly outpace the growth of non-STEM jobs. In fact, employment in STEM occupations is expected to increase by almost 11 percent, compared to a projected 2.3 percent change in non-STEM occupations. To meet that demand, U.S. policymakers should significantly strengthen the county's STEM talent pipelines over the next decade

Dr. Louis Freedberg, interim

CEO of EdSource pointed out that the growth rate of STEM occupations in the next ten years is expected to be twice that of other jobs, so how to ensure that all students in the current public school system have access to these careers is critical. Freedberg believes that an important reason why African-American, Hispanic, indigenous and low-income students are underrepresented in STEM industries is that their families cannot provide relevant support

and environment, such as participating in summer programs focused on science. And early identification of an interest in math and science is a key indicator of students pursuing STEM careers. In addition, it is also necessary for students to understand STEM courses and the connection between learning content and careers, not just abstract things.

A Wedding Golu that fills you with joy!

nother Golu season is just con cluding. A tradition that started in 14th century South India has blossomed and grown in the Bay Area as the South Indian diaspora has embraced Golu with intensity and passion.

The Venkatraman family is one such example.

Led by the enthusiastic and driven Radhika Venkatraman, the family has celebrated Golu for a few decades now.

Over the last decade or so, the Venkatraman family has constructed their Golu each year around a "theme" that tries to tell a larger story.

The theme for Golu 2024 was "Weddings".

When you think about it, a wedding is the most seminal event in anyone's life.

Every society has created special ceremonies to conduct and celebrate marriages in memorable and delightful ways.

The Venkatraman Golu 2024 captures the gestalt of weddings by deploying 3 distinct sets of exhibits.

So, let's take a tour of the Golu.



First Stop - Celestial Weddings

To get you in the wedding mood, as soon as you enter, 6 beautiful dolls dressed in pavadai dhavani (half sarees) welcome you.

The ambience exudes joy and fun and the wedding is in the air.

As you approach the main Golu Padi of 9 steps, you see the topmost step (#1) has Krishna, Lord Venkateswara and Panduranga with their consorts. The next step features all the Navarathri Devis.

As you go down the steps, the stories of celestial weddings begin to come alive.

There is Lord Srinivasa on Step #3 marrying Padmavati to keep the promise He made as Rama. Note the presence of Hanuman from the Ramayana.

You see Meenakshi, the daughter of Pandyan King Malayadhwaja who fell in love with Lord Shiva. Lord Shiva goes to Madurai as the handsome Sundareshwar



and marries her (Step #4). Lord Vishnu gives away Meenakshi as her brother.

On Step #5, Andal marries Ranganatha idol in Srirangam in the presence of Shiva and Brahma and their consorts.

Then there is a depiction of Rama marrying Sita on Step #6 after breaking Shiva's bow at Sita's Swayamvaram.

The last 3 steps round up the Heavenly wedding stories with Lord Krishna-Rukmini, Lord Murugan with Valli and Deviyani, and Lord Ganesha with Riddhi & Siddhi.

On each step, you find marapachis or dolls related to the story about those Gods and Goddesses.

If you had any doubt that weddings are significant events, note the prominent presence of the Hindu Gods at these weddings!

Next Stop - South Indian Wedding Ceremony

This sequence of exhibits captures the mystique and mechanics of a South Indian wedding by showcasing the head spinning preparation and activities around the events and ceremonies.

The Golu starts with the traditional version of "Boy meets Girl" (Poona Pattal) where the two families meet in a private setting where the boy and girl see each other for the first time.

After the boy and girl approve the match, we have the Janvasam. Here the groom is shepherded back to the wedding mandapam in a convertible at very slow speed from the temple, for the Nichayathartham (engagement) ceremony.

This is followed by Mehndi, depicted by an absolutely endearing exhibit with the bride's palm and feet being decorated by the henna artists.

Next, for "Malai Mattal" there is a cute set of dolls where the bride and groom are carried by their mamas (mother's brothers) while the bride and groom try to garland each other thrice.

The bride and groom are dressed tastefully with garlands and seated on a flowery "Oonjal" (Swing) that can rock back and forth. Aunt dolls are waiting to sing and ward off evil spirits by throwing rice balls in all directions.

For the Kalyanam (Wedding)

scene, the bride arrives in a palanquin. The priest leads the Vedic ceremony with music accompaniment from the Kerala Chenda Melam. On the floor in front of the bride and groom, is a wedding seer bakshanam consisting of different kinds of sweets and

On the left side, you can see the caterer serving Kalyanam Sapad (traditional wedding meal) on banana leaves and the guests are enjoying the experience.

The wedding ceremony concludes with

a "Reception", where the bride and groom appear as a married couple for the very first time in public.

Brides & Grooms of India

The final stop on this tour takes you to 28 Indian states.

Standing on a Map of India, is a stunning collection of dolls representing married couples from the 28 Indian states adorned in their region's traditional wedding attire.

It is a beautiful encapsulation of that area's culture, customs, language and historical influences.

The attire is bright, elegant and colorful. The women wear sparkling accessories including necklaces, ear and nose rings, and even chains around the head. The men's outfits are sharp, some with necklaces and head gear with precious stones, footwear with adornments, and even a sheathed sword in one case.

Brinjal/Eggplant Pakoda

Pakoda are made primarily with gram flour, spices, and a variety of vegetables like potato, spinach, onion, capsicum, spring onions, cauliflower, fenugreek leaves, etc.

These Brinjal/eggplant Pakoda have a lovely soft, mildly sweet taste from the inside and the outside texture is crisp. Use small to medium-sized variety of Brinjal. If you use larger sized Brinjal then chop them into bite-sized slices.

Make Pakodas when you have sudden unseasonal rains or dull cold weather. Not to forget the masala chai that is served with the Pakoda.

How to make Brinjal Pakoda Batter:

1. In a mixing bowl, take the dry ingredients - 1 cup Besan (gram flour), ¼ tsp

turmeric powder, ¼ tsp red chili powder, ½ tsp coriander powder, ½ tsp cumin powder, a generous pinch of Asafoetida (Hing) and salt as required. Also, add 1 pinch of baking soda.

2. Add? cup water or as required.



3. Whisk to a smooth batter without lumps. Add water as required to make a medium consistency batter.

Slicing and batter coating

4. Rinse and slice the Brinjals (Baingan) into thin slices if it is large in size. You can also use medium-sized eggplants

5. Dip the Brinjal slices in the batter

6. In a Kadai or pan heat oil. When the oil becomes medium hot then gently place them in medium hot oil for frying.

- 7. Turn over when one side is cooked partly.
- 8. After a minute or so, flip again and fry them until crisp and evenly golden.
- 9. With a slotted spoon remove the Brinjal Pakoda/Bhajji and drain as much oil as possible.
- 10. Place them on a paper kitchen towel to remove excess oil. Fry the Brinjal Pakoda in batches.
- 11. Serve the Brinjal Pakoda hot or warm with any chutney of your liking.

Serving Suggestions

Serve the Brinjal Pakoda hot or warm with mint and coriander chutney or tamarind chutney or tomato ketchup.

You can also have them with roti or bread. You can also wrap them in a roti, add some green chutney and Guacamole, and make a Pakoda wrap. It taste equally delicious. You can even stuff them in bread slices to make sandwiches or as stuffing for burgers.



Drop, Cover, & Hold On, California! Register for our earthquake preparedness briefing

thnic Media Services and California Black Media, in partnership with Listos California presented a statewide ethnic media briefing to raise awareness around earthquake preparedness. In recognition of the 35th anniversary of the 1989 Loma Prieta earthquake, Listos California aims to reach communities across the state with vital knowledge and resources to ensure safety before. during, and after an earthquake. The briefing covered key elements, including participation in the Great ShakeOut on October 17, insights on earthquake science, and an overview of California's first-in-the nation Earthquake Early Warning System, including the MyShake App.

The Loma Prieta earthquake occurred on October 17, 1989 and caused severe damage. Infrastructure and buildings in the San Francisco Bay Area were hit hard, highways collapsed, and many people lost their lives. Experts participating in the meeting expressed their hope that by disseminating key knowledge on earthquake preparedness, they hope to help every community in California have the necessary resources and information before disaster strikes to ensure people's life safety. As earthquake warning technology advances, it is now more important than ever that people understand the steps to take when an earthquake strikes.

Sonya Harris, Senior Advisor, Listos California has a long-standing focus on emergency response efforts and emphasized at the meeting the need for communities to use tools and resources to better protect themselves. "In order for every community to be prepared before a disaster, they need to start today by taking advantage of the tools and information they already have."

Amy Palmer, Deputy Director of Crisis

Communications and Public Affairs, California Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) talked about the operation of California's earthquake early warning system and related preparedness measures. She pointed out that California is currently using a statewide network of sensors to detect early shaking from earthquakes and send early warning signals to the public seconds in advance through mobile applications and other communication methods. A few precious seconds can buy people valuable time to take action quickly.

Jose Lara, Seismic Hazards Branch Chief, Cal OES introduced California's large earthquake drill plan. He said that starting at 10:17 a.m. on October 17, California will hold a statewide earthquake emergency drill. During the exercise, earthquake simulators will be used to provide the public with a realistic earthquake experience. This simulator can

simulate the intensity of earthquake shaking and help the public experience coping skills when experiencing strong shaking. He emphasized the importance of children and families in earthquake preparedness: "By making children aware of the dangers of earthquakes and teaching them the correct steps to respond, you are not only looking out for their safety, but also making the rest of the family better off. "Be prepared." He called on the public to actively participate in the drill on the 17th and spread earthquake emergency knowledge to more people.

The public must respond quickly and take "Drop, Cover, & Hold On" actions, in order to minimize the risk. This strategy has proven to be the most effective method of self-protection, especially with modern building codes, where many buildings have been designed to "life safety" standards to maintain structural stability during a major earthquake.





Dr. Yasemin Copur-Gencturk, Associate Professor of Teacher Education, University of Southern California pointed out that stereotypes based on gender and race are deeply rooted in society, leading people to believe that certain gender and racial groups have higher math proficiency than others. awareness of invisible bias is the first step in combating it. Second, teachers and educators need to give struggling students a chance. Finally, targeted interventions need to be developed to help teachers overcome implicit bias in mathematics classrooms, with general bias training insufficient to address specific issues in subjects such as mathematics.

Cultural significance of Garba and Dandiya dance during Navaratri

arba is a religious and social event that highlights the village traditions. All sociocultural events that happen in the Sanatanis community always have a ritualistic or religious significance. Navaratri (Nava' means 'Nine' and 'Ratri' means nights in Sanskrit) is very dear to all Sanatanis because they worship the Goddess Durga. The nine forms of Devi /Shakti (meaning Strength

What is Garba Dance?

Garba is a joyful style of dance, based on a circular pattern and characterized by a sweeping action from side to side. Garba performances often include singing and a musical accompaniment by Dhol (doubleheaded smaller drum), hand clapping and assorted metallic idiophones, such as cymbals.

Garba dances celebrate fertility, honour

formers of Garba. The basic dance formation is that of a circle that moves counterclockwise; if space is small and there are many participants, then, dancers form concentric circles that move in opposite directions. In due course, the performers circle around an image of a mother goddess, Durga, or around a symbolic representation of her creative energy that is often an illuminated clay pot or a water-filled

some times when they are short on Dandiya they will use just one in right hand. Generally, in a four beat rhythm, opposite sides hit the sticks at the same time, creating a nice sound. One circle goes clockwise and another counter clockwise. In the west, people do not form full circles, but instead often form rows.

Garba dancing also takes place during the nineday Navratri festival, held annually during the Sanatana month of Ashvina (September-October). Women are the typical per-



vessel, Kalash. Dancing begins slowly and gradually increases in speed. Garba performance has spread beyond Gujarat to many other parts of India, also among other Sanatani communities worldwide.

What is Dandiya or Dandiya Raas?

Raas or Dandiya Raas is the traditional folk dance form of Vrindavan, India, where it is performed depicting scenes of Holi, and Leela of Krishna and Radha. Along with Garba, it is the featured dance of Navratri evenings in Western India. During Navratri festival, in most of the cities of Gujarat and Mumbai people gather and perform Garba dance.

The word "Raas" comes from the Sanskrit word "Rasa". The origins of Raas can be traced to ancient times. Lord Krishna performed Rasa Leela" (Leela means Lord Krishna's playful dance. There are several forms of Raas, but "Dandiya Raas", performed during Navaratri in Gujarat is the most popular form. Other forms of Raas include Dang Lila from Rajasthan where only one large stick is used, and "Rasa Lila" from North India. Raas Lila and Dandiva Raas are similar. Some even consider "Garba" as a form of Raas, namely "Raas Garba".

In Dandiya Raas men and women dance in two circles, with sticks in their hands. In the old times, Raas did not involve much singing; just the beat of Dhol was enough. "Dandiya" or sticks are about 18? long. Each dancer holds two, although



The women wear traditional dresses such as colorful embroidered Choli, Ghagra and Bandhani dupattas, which is the traditional attire, dazzling with mirror work and wear heavy jewelries. The men wear special turbans and Kedias, but can differ from area to area. The dancers whirl and move their feet and arms in a choreographed manner to the tune of the music with drum beats. The Dhol/Dholak, The dance gets extremely complicated and energetic. Both of these dances are associated with the time of harvest.

What is the difference between Dandiya and Garba?

The main difference between Garba and Raas is that Raas is played with Dandiyas (pair of colorfully decorated sticks), while Garba consists of various hand and feet movements. Most of the Dandiya steps require even number of people while in Garba there is no such requirement on number of people.

For Dandiya, sometimes instead of sticks, people also use "Swords". The circular movements of Dandiya Raas are much more complex than that of Garba. As people play with sticks, it is important to be careful while playing Dandiya.

Another difference between Garba and Dandiya is Garba is performed before Aarti (worshipping ritual), while Dandiya is performed after the Aarti, as a part of the merriment. Men and women join in for both Raas Dandiya and Garba.

All passions have a time when they are nothing but fatal, when they drag their victim down with the heaviness of their stupidity-and a later, much later time when they marry the spirit, they "spiritualize" themselves.

It used to be that on account of the stupidity in passion, one made war against passion itself: one conspired to destroy it-all the old moral monsters are of one mind on this point, "the passions must be killed". The best-known formula for this is in the New Testament, in that Sermon on the Mount in which, by the way, things are not contemplated from a height at all.

For instance, there it is said with reference to sexuality, "if your eye offends you, pluck it out." Fortunately, no Christian acts according to this prescription. To destroy the passions and desires, merely in order to protect oneself against their stupidity and the disagreeable consequences

mity, enmity to the death against sensuality, is always a symptom that repays reflection: it justifies one's suspicions about the general condition of one who goes to this kind of extreme.


By the way, this enmity, this hatred reaches its peak only when such natures no longer have enough stamina even for the radical therapy, for the repudiation of their "devil." Survey the whole history of priests and philosophers, and artists too: the most poisonous words against the senses have not come from the impotent, not even from the ascetics. They have come from the impossible ascetics, from those who were in need of being ascetics

The spiritualization of sensuality is known as love: it is a great triumph over Christianity. Another triumph is our spiritualization of enmity. It consists in a deep grasp of the value of having enemies: in short, it is a way of acting and drawing conclusions that is the reverse of what people used to do.

of their stupidity, seems to us today to be itself an acute form of stupidity.

We no longer admire dentists who pull out teeth so that they won't hurt anymore ... But on the other hand, it's only fair to concede that on the soil from which Christianity grew, the concept of "spiritualizing the passions" was simply inconceivable. After all, the early Church fought, against the "intellectuals," on behalf of those who were "poor in spirit".

How could one expect the Church to wage an intelligent war against passion?The Church fights passion by cutting it out; its practice, its "therapy" is castration. It never asks, "How does one spiritualize, beautify, deify a desire?"-its discipline has always emphasized eradication (eradication of sensuality, pride, the ambition to rule, covetousness, vengefulness).

But ripping out the passions by the root means ripping out life by the root; the practice of the Church is an enemy to life


Radical means are indispensable only for degenerates; having a weak will, or more precisely, being incapable of not reacting to a stimulus, is itself just another form of degeneration. Radical enenemies to be destroyed; we immoralists and anti-Christians, see our own advantage in the Church's continued existence.

In the political sphere, too, enmity has now become more spiritual-much more clever, much more reflective, much more considerate. Almost every party grasps that its own interest, its own self-preservation, depends on the opposing party's not losing its strength; the same applies to politics on the grand scale.

Diversity and democracy: Why India remains politically stable in a volatile South Asian neighborhood

he recent crisis in Bangladesh is a stark reminder of how precarious the political realities of South Asia are and, how easily India's neighborhood can fall apart. Considering the range of political crises faced by every country in South Asia - India stands as one of the largest democracies in the world; Pakistan oscillates between civilian governments and military dictatorships; Bangladesh has once again plunged into political turmoil; Sri Lanka grapples with civil conflict and economic instability; Nepal became a secular republic in 2008 ending the world's last Hindu monarchy; and Afghanistan continues to be ruled by the oppressive Taliban regime - it is remarkable that these varied political experiments have survived and continue to thrive.

However, despite predictions of col-

political commentators. Their fundamental argument was based upon the diversity of independent India, it was considered very difficult for a country and democracy to survive if its population was diverse. Although of an exploitative nature, British co-Ionialism could bequeath a strong institutional legacy for laying down the ground for democracy in India. The parliamentary system was indeed a boon to India, being endowed with a bicameral legislature and having an executive responsible to the elected representatives by the central government. Mob justice: A growing threat to Bangladesh's stability

August Bangladesh under went a significant political upheaval as the government was overthrown in a revolution. On the same day, former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina resigned and left the country. Protesters' demands led to the establishment of an interim government, with Dr. Muhammad Yunus serving as Chief Advisor. The public, filled with anticipation for a new era, widely hoped that this new administration would eradicate vandalism, discrimination, looting, corruption, and violence while restoring the rule of law. However, a disturbing wave of mob justice has shaken the country instead of bringing stability, leaving the public deeply disillusioned.

Does mob justice establish justice or the rule of law in society? The answer is no; it does the opposite. When mob justice becomes the norm, the stability and integrity of the entire country are jeopardized. Such law-lessness threatens to plunge the nation into civil unrest, pushing it closer to the brink of a failed state.

The rule of law is a cornerstone of governance, establishing state legitimacy through accountability, transparency, and protecting citizens' human rights. Without implementation, these rights would remain mere rhetoric. However, the rise of mob justice, where individuals bypass legal processes to exact swift punishment on suspected offenders, directly threatens this principle.

Mob justice not alien to Bangladesh

Undoubtedly, mob justice in Bangladesh is a significant threat to the rule of law and human rights as it violates the fundamental rights to life, liberty, and security that the Constitution of 1972 and international conventions guarantee. Al-

though Article 31 of the Constitution 1972 guarantees the right to legal protection, and Article 35 guarantees the right to a fair trial, pervasive mob violence persists unabated. This directly opposes Bangladesh's obligations under the Universal Declaration of Human Rights 1948 and the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights 1966, guaranteeing the right to a fair trial and the presumption of innocence. Mob justice violates national laws, too, such as the Penal Code 1860, Code of Criminal Procedure 1898, Special Powers Act 1974, Metropolitan Ordinances, and Cyber Security Act 2023.

Is mob justice an alien concept in Bangladesh? The answer is no. In the past, alleged thieves and robbers were subjected to violent mob beatings.

country. As these incidents continue to unfold, they highlight a growing crisis in which not even the sanctity of the dead is respected, posing urgent questions about the state of collective morality and justice in Bangladesh.

Mob justice can be understood through Tylerian procedural justice theory and liberal democratic theory. Tylerian theory suggests that people resort to mob justice when they experience procedural injustice, as fair treatment by authorities fosters respect and compliance. Liberal democratic theory posits that citizens follow laws when the government is accountable and upholds legal principles, which lends legitimacy to the legal system. When this trust is absent, people may bypass the judicial system, perceiving it as

But this time, there have been incidents of forcibly making teachers of educational institutions, university vice-chancellors, and heads or officials of various institutions resign, driving them away through beatings, attacks on defendants in court premises, vandalism of places of worship of people with opposing views, destruction of mausoleums, and even killings by beating and stabbing on university campuses. The alarming trend has brought the term "mob justice" into sharp focus. An enraged mob desecrated and destroyed a grave in a particularly shocking incident. Such acts raise serious concerns about the state of social order and the extent of lawlessness in the

unfair or inconsistent, and take justice into their own hands.

Conflicting messages from government

Following the recent revolution, Bangladesh established an interim government that appears to align with the aspirations of the revolutionaries. Yet, a troubling rise in mob justice overshadows the transition. Dr. Muhammad Yunus, the head of the interim government, has urged citizens to refrain from taking the law into their own hands.

ADIEU TO INDIA'S RATAN

Ratan Tata is no more. He was unquestionably India's most respected businessman, even though by standards of India's wealthiest billionaires he was relatively poor. By virtue of his position as chairperson of the Sir Dorab Tata Trust and the Sir Ratan Tata Trust, which own 66 percent of Tata Sons, the holding company for India's largest and most prestigious business house, he was more powerful than any other Indian businessman.

The reclusive bachelor was very much a loner and hard to fathom. His former executive assistant R Venkataraman, when asked about his proximity to his former boss in an unguarded moment, remarked that those closest to Ratan were not people but his pet dogs and all strays.

He had just embraced the mantle of leadership when the diversified group's growth story had some parallels with India's economic growth story as well. As India took its leap towards liberalization in 1991, Tata also worked towards revamping the Group, taking business decisions during his tenure that looked like failure to his critics, but helped turn around the fortunes of many group companies, both in domestic operations and the group's global footprint. From Tata Tea's acquisition of Tetley in 2000 to acquiring the UK-based Corus Group in 2007 and reviving the once-struggling British luxury car manufacturer, Jaguar Land Rover (JLR), post acquisition in 2008, Tata set the ball rolling with the Group's presence overseas, charting out a path for other companies to follow.

About 15 years ago, Ratan Tata promised something that would shake up the Indian vehicle market - Tata Nano, a car that would cost just Rs 1-lakh and fulfill the middle-class dream of owning a four-wheeler. It became commonly known as the Lakhtakia car, the Indian equivalent of a Rs 1-lakh car.

The proposal though, faced significant roadblocks. His proposed car factory at Singur in Bengal, this was when Buddhadeb Bhattacharya CPI (M)'s Bengal Chief Minister was trying to attract investment to the state and change the direction of his party, got caught in a land acquisition row, and Mamata Banerjee, keen to replace the CPI (M), launched a movement against the plan.

Tata did not wait long for the Singur crisis to resolve. Deft at doing business with politicians while maintaining enough distance, he bagged a deal from Narendra Modi, then CM of Gujarat, who was trying to build an industry-friendly image, to set up the car factory at Sanand in Gujarat instead.

The Ambassador car, although assembled in India, was essentially an Indian-assembled version of the British Morris Oxford. While the Suzuki suffix meant the Maruti was never truly an Indian car. India did not have a truly indigenous car until Tata launched Indica

JRD Tata had dreamt of launching a fully indigenous family car during his time but prevailing government policies did not allow him to proceed. The idea of Indica came when JRD stepped down and named Ratan as Tata Sons chairman, and India's economy underwent structural reforms. Under his leadership Tata Group's revenues soared from USD 4-billion to over USD 100-billion.

Beside his success in business, he will be remembered mostly for his simplicity and significant contributions to corporate social responsibility and philanthropy.

INTERNATIONAL FILM FESTIVAL OF SRINAGAR ALL SET TO BEGIN FROM NOVEMBER 20


SRINAGAR: The International Film Festival of Srinagar is all set to begin from November 20 to November 23 in Jammu and Kashmir.


