

NEW DELHI: US Director of National Intelligence Tulsi Gabbard expressed her deep admiration for India, describing it as a place where she "always feels at home."

During her visit, she spoke about her fondness for Indian culture, cuisine, and spirituality, highlighting the influence of the Bhagavad Gita in her life.

In an interview with ANI early this week, Gabbard said, "Let me just say, I love so much about India. I always feel at home when I'm here."

She added, "The people are so welcoming and kind, and the food is always

delicious. Dal Makhani and anything with fresh paneer are my favorites."

Gabbard, known for her distinguished service in the US Army Reserve, has had a career spanning over two decades.

She also shared how Krishna's teachings to Arjuna give her strength, peace, and comfort in her daily life.

"My personal spiritual practice and relationship with God are at the center of my life. Every day, I do my best to live in a way that is pleasing to God and to be of service to all of God's children," Gabbard said.

Reflecting on the Bhagavad Gita, she

added, "At different times in my life, whether serving in war zones or facing challenges today, I turn to Krishna's teachings to Arjuna. These teachings provide me with strength, peace, and great comfort through all my days."

Gabbard arrived in India as part of her multi-nation visit, marking her first trip to the country since assuming office as the US Director of National Intelligence. The Asia leg of her trip will conclude with her address at the Raisina Dialogue on March 18.

Her visit follows Prime Minister Narendra Modi's trip to the US in February, where he met Gabbard and praised her as a "strong votary" of India-US friendship. Gabbard called it an "honor" to welcome PM Modi and expressed her commitment to strengthening bilateral ties.

According to the official website of the Raisina Dialogue, Gabbard will participate in a keynote conversation with Samir Saran, President of ORF.

The 10th edition of the Raisina Dialogue, co-hosted by the Ministry of External Affairs in collaboration with the Observer Research Foundation (ORF), begins today *ANI*

'Trump clear about commitment to defeating Islamist terrorism threat," says Tulsi Gabbard

NEW DELHI: US Director of National Intelligence Tulsi Gabbard reiterated US President Donald Trump's commitment to defeating the threat of Islamist terrorism that she said continues to pose a direct threat to American people. She noted that Prime Minister Narendra Modi also takes this threat seriously and added that the two leaders will work together to try to identify and defeat that threat.

In an interview with ANI, Gabbard said that terrorism has been affecting people in India, Bangladesh, Syria, Israel and different parts of the Middle East.

When asked how Trump administration sees the repeated terror attacks on India from Pakistan, Gabbard responded, "President Trump, through his first administration in the presidency, and it continues now, has been very clear about his commitment to defeating this threat of Islamist terrorism that has unfortunately plagued us, and continues to pose a direct threat to the American people."

"But, we see how it's been impacting people here in India, in Bangladesh, currently ongoing in Syria, Israel and different countries in the Middle East. So this is a threat that I know Prime Minister Modi also takes seriously and one where the leaders of our two countries will work together to try to identify and defeat that threat," she added.

On dismantling of deep-state assets and whether they were involved in regime change matters in India, Tulsi Gabbard said that US intelligence professions were using intelligence-based chat network to conduct a "highly unprofessional and sexually explicit conversation" for an extended period of time. She stated that

the action violates the basic professionalism expected from US government employees and the trust that the people of the US need to have in intelligence professionals.

"I can tell you to my knowledge, the answer is no. what you are referring to unfortunately was an incident that came to my attention where for an extended period of time we had intelligence professionals who were using an intelligence-based chat network to conduct a highly unprofessional and sexually explicit conversation." ANI

'PM Modi played role in persuading Putin against using Nuclear weapons'

NEW DELHI: Poland's Deputy Foreign Minister and Secretary of State, Wladyslaw Teofil Bartoszewski, said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi played a role in persuading Russian President Vladimir Putin not to use nuclear weapons against Ukraine.

Speaking to ANI, Bartoszewski stated that Putin had "threatened" to use tactical nuclear weapons on Ukrainian territory, but calls from India and China influenced his decision to reconsider.

"President Putin was threatening to use tactical nuclear weapons on the territory of Ukraine. The Americans sent lots of messages for him to not think about it... That didn't necessarily persuade him at first. He received two phone calls- one from the President of China, Xi Jinping, and one from PM Modi, telling him that neither China nor India independently ap-

prove of the war. When two major nations, which Russia considers to be friendly, said don't do it. He decided that it is not a good idea so PM Narendra Modi played a role in it." Bartoszewski said.

Bartoszewski, along with several world leaders, is attending the Raisina Dialogue in New Delhi.

Additionally, Ukrainian MP Sviatoslav Yurash highlighted India's global influence and noted that PM Modi's recent podcast with American research scientist Lex Fridman aligned with Ukraine's perspective that war should not be permissible.

"India decides the fate of the 21st century. Therefore, the podcast was just about Ukraine, from what I under-

> stand. The podcast was about many other matters that would be key for this century and the future of humanity. That is why, as far as the perspective on the fact that war is impermissible, Ukrainians would very much agree and desire nothing more," Yurash said.

> During his conversation with Lex Fridman, PM Modi outlined India's approach to peace efforts between Russia and Ukraine.

> "We seek neither to wage war against nature nor to foster strife among nations. We stand for peace and wherever we can act as peacemakers, we have gladly

embraced that responsibility", PM Modi said."

"Ukraine may hold countless discussions with their allies, but it will bear no fruit. Discussions must include both parties instead," PM Modi added.

Reiterating his stance, PM Modi stated, "As for me, I have always maintained that I stand with peace. I am not neutral. I have a stance, and that is peace, and peace is what I strive for." ANI

Rubio follows through Trump's 'vision' on minority rights in Bangladesh: Spokesperson

NEW YORK: US Secretary of State Marco Rubio follows through with President Donald Trump's "vision", State Department Spokesperson Tammy Bruce remarked when asked about Trump's pre-election statement about the plight of Hindus in Bangladesh.

She said recently at her briefing in Washington, "Secretary Rubio, of course, follows through with his (Trump's) vision and the nature of the choices that are made in that regard".

Meanwhile, at the United Nations in New York, Secretary-General Antonio Guterres's Deputy Spokesperson Farhan Haq was asked if Guterres had raised human rights abuses of Hindus in Bangladesh during his visit to that country.

Haq said, "In his talks overall with officials, he made sure to address any concerns we have regarding human rights".

Shortly before the November election, Trump posted on X, "I strongly condemn the barbaric violence against Hindus, Christians, and other minorities who are getting attacked and looted by mobs in Bangladesh, which remains in a total state of chaos."

Referencing it, Bruce was asked about Rubio's "assessment about the situation of Hindus in Bangladesh. and what steps he is taking to address" the concern of Trump. IANS

Trump, Putin 'agree' on immediate ceasefire in energy and infrastructure amid Russia-Ukraine conflict

WASHINGTON DC: US President Donald Trump described his Tuesday's telephonic conversation with Russian President Vladimir Putin as "productive," stating that both leaders agreed to an immediate ceasefire on all energy and infrastructure.

Trump, in a post on his social media platform Truth Social, said they discussed elements of a peace agreement and that the ceasefire process is now in motion.

"My phone conversation today with President Putin of Russia was a very good and productive one. We agreed to an immediate Ceasefire on all Energy and Infrastructure, with an understanding that we will be working guickly to have a Complete Ceasefire and, ultimately, an END to this very horrible War between Russia and Ukraine. This War would have never started if I were President! Many elements of a Contract for Peace were discussed, including the fact that thousands of soldiers are being killed, and both President Putin and President Zelenskyy would like to see it end. That process is now in full force and effect, and we will, hopefully, for the sake of Humanity, get the job done!" his post read.

The phone call between Trump and Putin focused on the ongoing Russia-Ukraine conflict, during which the two leaders agreed on the necessity of lasting peace. They also discussed a proposed ceasefire in the Black Sea and broader regional stability in the Middle East. ANI

Sunita Williams, NASA's Crew-9 astronauts breathe Earthly air after 9 months, disembark from SpaceX's Dragon

CALIFORNIA: NASA Crew-9 astronauts Sunita Williams, Nick Hague, Butch Wilmore, and Russian cosmonaut Aleksandr Gorbunov breathed earthly air for the first time in over nine months on Wednesday after the successful splashdown of SpaceX's Dragon capsule.

The astronauts disembarked the capsule on stretchers, as is customary, CNN reported. This precaution is taken by SpaceX for all astronauts returning from long-duration space missions.

Earlier, a worker rinsed the Crew Dragon spacecraft with fresh water to remove as much salt water as possible.

"Saltwater is corrosive, and we want to try and rinse out as much of the salt water as possible to reduce that corrosion on the metallic structures," SpaceX's Kate Tice said.

The side hatch of the Crew Dragon remains closed throughout its time in orbit. After docking with the ISS, astronauts enter and exit through a different hatch on top of the vehicle, CNN reported.

SpaceX's recovery ship, Megan, used a large rig to lift the capsule carrying the four astronauts out of the

crew members closely monitored the spacecraft to ensure there were no fuel leaks.

As the capsule splashed down off the coast of Tallahassee, Florida, several dolphins were seen swimming around it, welcoming the astronauts home. At least

five dolphins were captured on video circling the capsule as it bobbed in the water, CNN reported. Boats in the area assisted in stabilizing the capsule and ensuring the astronauts' safety.

NASA astronauts Nick Hague and Russian cosmonaut Aleksandr Gorbunov have been in space since September 2024. However, Butch Wilmore and Sunita Williams had been away much longer--their journey began last June. Initially expected to last just a week, their mission was extended to more than nine months due to issues with their Boeing Starliner capsule, which delayed their return.

White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt earlier stated that US President Donald Trump had fulfilled his promise to bring home the "forgotten" astronauts. "President Trump promised to look out for the forgotten man and woman. At 5:57 PM ET tonight -promise made, promise kept!" she said in a post on X. ANI

Proud of what Indian community does for our country: New Zealand PM

NEW DELHI: New Zealand Prime Minister Christopher Luxon praised the Indian community in his country for its significant role in shaping the island nation's progress.

Luxon arrived in Delhi last Sunday and was warmly received by Union Minister of State S.P. Singh Baghel. Members of the Indian diaspora in New Zealand also accompanied him during his arrival.

Expressing his admiration for the community, he posted on X, "The Indian community is the third-largest ethnic group in New Zealand. India is our largest source of skilled migrants and our second-largest

source of international students."

He further acknowledged their contributions, stating, "Indian-Kiwis make a massive contribution to New Zealand, and I'm proud of what this community does for our country."

Highlighting the importance of this visit, Luxon mentioned that he has brought along a high-level delegation comprising community and business leaders, calling it the larg-

est-ever group to accompany a New Zealand Prime Minister on a foreign trip.

Among the prominent figures accompanying him are former Governor-General Sir Anand Satyanand, former National Party MP Kanwaljit Singh Bakshi, business leader Rajna Patel, Sudima Hotels CEO Sudesh Jhunjhunwala, India New Zealand Business Council (INZBC) chair

Bharat Chawla, Waitakere Indian Association president Sunil Kaushal, and Wellington Indian Association president Manisha Morar.

The participation of these community

leaders highlights the importance of connections between individuals, promoting more profound cultural interaction and enhancing the partnership between the two countries

note address along with Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Following this, he will travel to Mumbai on March 19-20 for discussions with Indian business leaders and representatives from various industries. His visit will conclude on March 20, when he departs for Wellington.

The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) described the visit as a reaffirmation of the longstanding and enduring ties between India and New Zealand.

The statement stressed the commitment of both nations to strengthening bilateral relations across diverse sectors and further deepening people-to-people connections. *IANS*

In another post, PM Modi thanked US President Donald Trump after he shared his podcast link with Lex Fridman on his Truth Social platform.

"Thank you, my friend, President Trump. I've covered a wide range of topics, including my life journey, India's civilizational outlook, global issues and more," Modi wrote on Truth Social.

Earlier in the day, PM Modi, along with New Zealand PM Christopher Luxon, attended the Raisina Dialogue2025 in Delhi.

During his keynote address, Luxon highlighted the long-standing relationship between Indians and New Zealanders, emphasizing over two centuries of shared history at the Raisina Dialogue 2025 in New Delhi.

Bay Area Health officials urge measles vaccination and awareness as cases rise nationally

Risk of exposure to measles in the Bay Area is currently low. However, with rising cases in the United States, getting the safe and highly effective vaccine is strongly encouraged for those not fully vaccinated

SANTA CLARA COUNTY, Calif.: With the recent rise of measles cases nationally, the County of Santa Clara Public Health Department joins Bay Area health officials in urging everyone to get the measles vaccination if they are not sure if they got it or if they did not have measles as a child, and to be aware of the signs and symptoms of measles after travel or

Measles is a highly contagious virus that can cause serious illness and death, and the safe and highly effective measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccine offers the best protection against the virus. Protect yourself by making sure each member of your family who is 12 months to 3 years old is vaccinated with one dose of MMR vaccine, and each person who is age 4 or older has gotten two doses of MMR vaccine.

Over 300 measles cases have been reported in the United States as of March 14, 2025. This includes a large outbreak among primarily unvaccinated children in Texas and nearby states. At this time, there have been two deaths. These were the first measles deaths in the United States since 2015.

There are five reported measles cases in California as of March 11, 2025. All five cases were separately reported after international travel, and there is no evidence they are connected to the outbreak in Texas.

"Vaccination against measles is the single most effective way to prevent getting sick with the disease," said Dr. Monika Roy, Communicable Disease Controller and Assistant Health Officer at the County of Santa Clara Public Health Department. "If you are not already vaccinated, are unsure of your vaccination status, or will be traveling internationally, talk with your doctor about getting the MMR vaccine."

How Measles Spreads and Symptoms Measles spreads easily through the air when an infected person breathes, talks, coughs, or sneezes. If an infected person coughs or sneezes, the virus can linger in indoor air for several hours. Symptoms include fever, cough, runny nose, and conjunctivitis (pink eye), followed 2-4 days later by a rash.

About one in five unvaccinated people in the United States who get measles are

two doses are 97 percent effective. Individuals born between 1957 and 1969 are likely to have received only one dose and should consider getting a second dose. The MMR vaccine protects you for life and is widely available at provider offices, clinics, health systems and pharmacies.

Measles and Travel

hospitalized, and nearly one to three of every 1,000 children who become infected with measles will die from respiratory and neurologic complications, according to CDC. Measles presents the greatest risk to children less than five years of age, adults over 20 years of age, those who are pregnant, and people with compromised immune systems.

MMR Vaccine

The safe and highly effective MMR vaccine is recommended for children aged 12-15 months, with a second dose administered between ages 4 and 6 years. Children can receive the second dose of MMR vaccine earlier than 4 through 6 years, as long as it is at least 28 days after the first dose. Infants 6-12 months of age can start vaccination early prior to international travel or travel to an outbreak area. Teenagers and adults with no evidence of immunity should be vaccinated right away. Your medical provider can order a simple blood test to check whether or not you are immune.

One dose of the MMR vaccine is 93 percent effective against measles, and

Area is a hub for international travel and tourism, increasing the potential for exposure to this highly contagious virus. For individuals or families that plan to travel, anyone who is not vaccinated

against measles is at increased risk of getting infected.

Plan early before international travel and check your destination and the CDC Global Measles Travel Health Notice for more travel health advice, including where measles outbreaks have been reported. Parents should consult with their child's health care provider prior to travel. The CDC offers accelerated vaccination guidelines for children and adults who plan to travel internationally.

For questions about the MMR vaccine and immunization records, check with your health care provider and access your digital vaccine record.

Health Officers from the Counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Monterey, Napa, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, San Benito, San Francisco, San Mateo, Solano, Sonoma, and the City of Berkeley encourage the public to take the above easy steps to protect themselves and others.

County of Santa Clara and HCA Healthcare Reach Agreement for County to Acquire Regional Medical Center

Regional Medical Center is expected to join Santa Clara Valley Healthcare system in early April

SAN JOSE, Calif.: The County of Santa Clara and HCA Healthcare have reached a definitive agreement in which the County will purchase Regional Medical Center (RMC) for \$150 million. The two parties have signed an Asset Purchase Agreement, whereby RMC is planned to be integrated into the Santa Clara Valley Healthcare (SCVH) system. The transaction, which is subject to customary closing conditions and regulatory approvals, is expected to close on April 1, at which point the County expects to assume operations of the hospital.

RMC serves as the leading emergency healthcare provider for East San José, treating a wide range of critical and lifethreatening conditions. In August 2024, HCA Healthcare downgraded the level of trauma, comprehensive stroke, and certain cardiac services (STEMI) at RMC. The County plans to restore Level II trauma care immediately once it assumes hospital operations, and the County will add STEMI and comprehensive stroke services shortly thereafter. Labor and Delivery services are also expected to be re-

stored at a later date; these services were closed at RMC in 2020.

RMC, a 258-bed hospital, has provided care to East San José for 60 years. HCA Healthcare has made significant investments in the hospital during the last decade to improve access and address the diverse medical needs of the commu-

Supreme Court Reviews Louisiana Redistricting Case

ouisiana, like Alabama, only had one Black majority Congressional district until a federal court ruled the maps proposed by the state legislature following the 2020 census were racial gerrymanders. Following the Supreme Court's decision in Allen v. Milligan, the Louisiana legislature eventually adopted a new map with two Black majority districts. On March 24 the Supreme Court will hear a Louisiana redistricting case which is pivotal to the fight for fair representation. The Louisiana case now presents the next major

test in this ongoing legal battle.

In 2022, the District Court for the Middle District of Louisiana ruled during a preliminary hearing that the map may have violated the VRA and ordered the state Legislature to redraw the districts. However, the

state Legislature failed to amend the map as required, causing the case to go to appeals, while Alabama's Milligan case went to the U.S. Supreme Court. In 2023, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that Alabama must redraw districts to increase repre-

LOS ANGELES: The Los Angeles County Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) and City of Los Angeles recently announced the first round of grants for the LA Region Small Business and Worker Relief Funds that will provide direct cash assistance to impacted workers, small businesses, and non-profits. A total of \$2.7 million was disbursed to 82 businesses and 324 workers in this initial phase, including those businesses and nonprofits that had physical brick-and-mortar locations destroyed in the fires.

Victoria Wenger, Counsel at NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund, Inc. (LDF) explained the impact of this case on national and local elections. She said: "This is federal law and involves constitutional rights." In the case of Louisiana redistricting, it is about congressional seats and involves the interests of tens of thousands of people. People are watching the Supreme Court's decision in the case, which could affect gerrymandering in any state, county, city or school district in the United States. Wenger said that this case will not only affect other pending district delineation disputes, but also affect local elections across the United States, meaning whether minorities have a better chance of electing elected officials who represent their interests. In 2020, according to a census, the state's African-American population was growing and accounted for about one-third of the total population. The state has six congressional seats. In the 2022 constituency planning, only one of the six constituencies has a majority African-American minority population. A federal district court ruled that the district planning violated Section 2 of the Voting Rights Act, which prohibits electoral procedures that deny or dilute the right to vote because of race.

Alanah Odoms, Executive Director, American Civil Liberties Union-Louisiana (ACLU-LA) said, "Only by fighting can we have the possibility of winning." The right to vote needs to be fought for generation after generation. We have a responsibility and we are ready.

Bangladeshi national nabbed in Delhi, deportation process initiated

NEW DELHI: Delhi Police said they have arrested Bangladeshi national residing illegally in the national capital in a recent operation and have begun the process of deporting him.

In a recent operation, the RK Puram police arrested Afazuddin Gazi alias Gazi, a 40-year-old Bangladeshi national who hailed from the village Saigura in Dhaka and was residing illegally in the national capital. He was apprehended based on intelligence inputs.

The Foreigners Regional Registration Office (FRRO) has initiated the deportation process.

As per a release, during early morning patrols on March 13, the team received specific information that the suspect was found roaming inside the village Mohammadpur in RK Puram, to purchase scrap in the market.

Based on this input, team swiftly responded and apprehended the suspect. Upon initial interrogation, he falsely claimed to be a resident of Malda, West Bengal. However, after sustained interrogation and verification, his true identity was revealed as Afazuddin Gazi alias Gazi.

According to the release, during further interrogation, Afazuddin Gazi alias Gazi had in 2022, entered India illegally via Benapole -Petrapole border. He then took a train from Kolkata and reached Delhi.

In Delhi, he worked at various locations, primarily in Old Delhi and was recently working as a ragpicker. ANI

Indian student 'self-deports' from US after visa revoked over Palestine protests

NEW YORK: An Indian student who participated in pro-Palestine protests in the US has "self-deported" herself after her student visa was revoked, Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem has announced.

The Department said last week that Ranjani Srinivasan "was involved in activities supporting Hammas, a terrorist

organization" and left the US on March 11 after her student visa was revoked by the State Department

A citizen of India, she was a doctoral student in urban planning at Columbia University, the Ground Zero of student protests in support of Palestine and against Israel over Gaza that swept the US last year.

The university saw the violent takeover of a campus building, and scores of students were arrested when the university called in the police to quell the protests.

Noem said that it was "a privilege" to study in the US, but "when

you advocate for violence and terrorism that privilege should be revoked, and you should not be in this country".

Homeland Security Department said that it obtained a video of Srinivasan using an app of the Customs and Border Protection (CPB) agency to "self-deport".

"I am glad to see one of the Columbia University terrorist sympathizers use the CBP Home app to self-de-

search, "Gold & Cyanide: Family, Caste, and the Post-extractive Landscape at Kolar Gold Fields".

She had also worked for an environmental advocacy nonprofit in Washington on "frontier communities at risk from climate change" and as a researcher for the West Philadelphia Landscape Project (WPLP) at the Massa-

chusetts Institute of Technology.

President Trump's administration has trained its sights on the lvy League university, accusing it of failing to stem the protests that it said veered into anti-Semitism and threatened Jewish students and faculty

It has cut off \$400 million in federal funds to the university.

Last week, a former Columbia student of Palestinian descent who was involved in protests there last year and in the affiliated Barnard College last week was arrested by immigration officials and is in custody, pending deportation.

Mahmoud Khalil, however, has

a green card, which Secretary of State Marco Rubio said has been revoked.

His deportation has been temporarily put on hold by a federal judge.

Noem said that a Palestinian student at Columbia was arrested by an immigration official for overstaying her student visa



port," Noem said.

She posted a video of Srinivasan at an airport.

It was not clear if Srinivasan had been arrested in the protests or if she had expressed sympathy for Hamas because many of the protesters were only against Israel's attack on Gaza in retribution for the Hamas terrorist attack on it

Self-deporting - or leaving voluntarily before authorities take action - avoids the risk of her being put on a US military aircraft and sent home like the three planeloads of deportees who arrived in India.

Srinivasan was doing research at Columbia's Graduate School of Architecture, Planning and Preservation.

According to the school, she has a bachelor's degree from CEPT University in Ahmedabad and got her master's degree from Harvard with Fulbright Nehru and Inlaks Scholarships.

On the school website, she is shown with the gender-neutral "they" pronoun rather than she.

The site said that she had received support from the Lakshmi Mittal South Asia Institute at Harvard for her re-

US imposes visa restrictions on officials involved in 'forced return' of Uyghurs to China

WASHINGTON, DC: The United States has announced a new visa restriction policy targeting foreign government officials involved in the forced return of Uyghurs and other vulnerable ethnic or religious groups to China.

Secretary of State Marco Rubio stated in a statement, announced that the policy would apply to both current and former officials responsible for, or complicit in, such actions, emphasizing the US commitment to countering China's ongoing efforts to pressure governments into deporting individuals who face persecution upon return.

The visa restrictions will be implemented 'immediately', with initial measures targeting officials from the Thai government involved in the forced return of 40 Uyghurs to China on February 27.

Secretary Rubio highlighted in the press release that those sent back are at risk of enforced disappearances and torture, a longstanding concern regarding China's treatment of Uyghurs and other minority groups.

The US government has repeatedly condemned such actions, citing well-documented human rights violations, including what it has classified as genocide and crimes against humanity.

Secretary Rubio reiterated that China has engaged in systematic persecution of Uyghurs, and the United States is urging governments worldwide to refrain from forcibly returning individuals to China under any circumstances.

"I am immediately implementing this policy by taking steps to impose visa restrictions on current and former officials from the Government of Thailand responsible for, or complicit in, the forced return of 40 Uyghurs from Thailand on February 27," Rubio said in the statement.

"In light of China's longstanding acts of genocide and crimes against humanity committed against Uyghurs, we call on governments around the world not to forcibly return Uyghurs and other groups to China," he added. The policy expands the US government's ability to restrict visas for foreign officials deemed responsible for these deportations, reinforcing a broader effort to protect at-risk groups from mistreatment upon their return. ANI

'Important to engage' with Arakan Army to fully respect Rohingya rights: Guterres

UNITED NATIONS: Secretary-General Antonio Guterres has said that it was "important to engage" with the Arakan Rohingya Salvation Army (ARSA) to fully respect the rights of Rohingyas while finding a solution to the refugee crisis.

"The Arakan army is an entity with which, I believe, a necessary dialogue must take place", he said at a joint news conference with Bangladesh interim leader Muhammad Yunus in Dhaka last week.

ARSA carried out a massacre of Hindus in Rakhine State in Myanmar in August 2017 and abducted others -- incidents documented by Amnesty International.

"We know that in the past, the relations between the Rakhine and the Rohingya communities were not easy, and so, I think it's important to engage the Arakan army for the full respect of the rights of the Rohingya population in Rakhine", Guterres said according to the UN transcript of the media encounter.

ARSA is led by Ataullah Abu Ammar Jununi, a Pakistan-born ethnic Rohingya.

Amnesty International has documented the massacre of about 100 Hindus by ARSA at Ah Nauk Kha Maung Seik in Rakhine State in August 2017. *IANS*

Ultra-processed vegan meat, soy milk may help lose weight: Study

NEW DELHI: Trying to lose weight? A new study claims replacing animal products with plant-based foods like soy milk and vegan meat that are ultraprocessed, can lead to significant weight loss.

The research by the Physicians Committee for Responsible Medicine looked at the role of plant-based processed foods in weight loss.

High-processed foods -- rich in sugar, salt, and fat -- are known to be unhealthy and contribute to weight gain, obesity, and a host of diseases.

"Our research shows that choosing a bagel instead of bacon for breakfast or a veggie burger instead of a hamburger for dinner is the best option if you are looking to lose weight," said Hana Kahleova, director of clinical research for the Physicians Committee for Responsible Medicine.

"Filling your plate with plantbased foods -- even if they are considered ultra-processed like soy milk and vegan meat and yogurt alternatives -- instead of animal products can have a positive impact on your weight and overall health." Kahleova added. *IANS*

Western diet may raise risk of lung cancer: Study



NEW DELHI: Western diet, often high in salt, sugar and fat, has the potential to raise the risk of cancer in the lungs, finds a study.

Previous research has shown the link between poor diet and cancers of organs like the liver and pancreas; thus the long-term impact of diet has been well studied.

"Lung cancer has not traditionally been thought of as a dietary-related disease," said Ramon Sun, Associate Professor and director of the University of Florida's Center for Advanced Spatial Biomolecule Research.



pancreatic cancer or liver cancer, yes. However, when it comes to lung cancer, the idea that diet could play a role is rarely discussed," Sun added.

For the study, published in the journal Nature Metabolism, the team focused on glycogen accumulation -- a storage molecule, made up of glucose, or a simple sugar.

It has been found to accumulate at high levels across a variety of cancers and other diseases.

Through lab models and computer-guided models of glycogen stores in the lung, the researchers showed that in lung cancer, glycogen acts as an oncogenic metabolite, akin to a "giant lollipop for cancer's sweet tooth."

The more glycogen in the cancer cells, the bigger and worse the tumor growth.

When scientists fed mice a high-fat, high-fructose Western diet that supported more glycogen in the blood, lung tumors grew. When glycogen levels de-

creased, tumor growth did, too.

In short, the typical Western diet increases glycogen levels and glycogen feeds lung cancer tumors by providing their building blocks for growth, said the researchers.

Glycogen is an "exceptionally good predictor" of tumor growth and death in lung cancer patients, Sun said. IANS

Al could predict true biological age from 5 drops of blood

NEW DELHI: Scientists at Osaka University in Japan have devised a new AI model to estimate a person's biological age - a measure of how well their body has aged, rather than just counting the years since birth.

Using just five drops of blood, this new method analyses 22 key steroids and their interactions to provide a more precise health assessment.

The team's breakthrough study, published in Science Advances, offers a potential step forward in personalised health management, allowing for earlier detection of agerelated health risks and tailored interventions.

"Our bodies rely on hormones to maintain homeostasis, so we thought, why not use these as key indicators of aging?" said Dr Qiuyi Wang, co-first author of the study.

To test this idea, the research team focused on steroid hormones, which play a crucial role in metabolism, immune function, and stress response.

The team developed a deep neural network (DNN) model that incorporates steroid metabolism pathways, making it the first AI model to explicitly account for the interactions between different steroid molecules.

One of the study's most striking findings involves cortisol, a steroid hormone commonly associated with stress. The researchers found that when cortisol levels doubled, biological age increased by approximately 1.5 times. *IANS*



Extreme heat set to double heart disease burden in Australia by 2050

CANBERRA: Extreme heat is a major contributor to heart disease in Australia, responsible for 7.3 per cent of the total cardiovascular disease burden, a new study said on Monday.

Between 2003 and 2018, hot weather accounted for nearly 50,000 years of healthy life lost annually, with South Australia experiencing the highest impact and the North-

ern Territory the lowest. according to the study funded by the Adelaide University China Fee Scholarships and the Australian Research Council Discovery Program.

Under future climate scenarios, the burden of cardiovascular disease is expected to rise steadily. By the 2050s, under a high-emissions scenario, it is projected to more than double compared to the baseline, with the Northern Territory experienc-

ing the most significant increase, said the study published in the European Heart Journal.

"When the weather is hot, our hearts have to work harder to help us cool down. This added pressure can be dangerous, especially for people with cardiovascular disease," said Bi Peng, the research lead from the University of Adelaide Public Health and Environmental Medicine.

"Many of us have experienced how a warming climate can make us feel unwell, particularly during longer periods of extreme heat," Bi said, adding the exact number of people living with severe heart disease or dying prematurely due to rising temperatures remains uncertain. It is

> crucial to understand how this burden will grow in the future.

> Using disability-adjusted life years to measure lost healthy years due to illness or death, the study underscores the urgent need for adaptation and mitigation strategies, including urban cooling initiatives, public health campaigns, and emergency response measures in hot days, Xinhua news agency reported.

> While the study focusses on Australia,

researchers note that the link between heat and heart disease is a global concern, Bi said, adding investing in climate mitigation and adaptation strategies could significantly reduce the future impact of heat-related cardiovascular disease worldwide. IANS

NEW YORK: The '13th Gut Microbiota for Health World Summit' in Washington, DC, over the weekend revealed how cutting-edge research on gut microbiome science is being applied to clinical practice.

The summit showcased the latest microbiome research on coronavirus, plant and dairy-Researchers found a

A novel study found that the gut microbiome in children is altered post-COVID-19 infection, much like it is in adults.

based protein, as well as probiotics.

Researchers found a significant decrease in beneficial bacteria. like Lacticaseibacillus and Bifidobacterium. in children who had COVID-19 compared to those who didn't.

These bacteria help reduce inflammation and support gut health. Children with

lingering symptoms also showed different types of bacteria, in addition to elevated markers of inflammation and decreased barrier function in the gut. Future research will examine immune responses and potential microbiome-targeted therapies for persistent post-COVID-19 symptoms.

In another study, researchers analyzed 35 plant-based and 23 dairy-based foods and found that nearly 50% of tested plants and milk and dairy products contain S100B, a helpful protein that binds calcium.

The study suggested that S100B may interact with gut bacteria to promote a healthy microbiome, potentially influencing inflammatory bowel disease (IBD). The findings

> open the door for future dietary applications, such as using S100B in supplements and nutraceuticals.

> A meta-analysis of 10 studies, including 2,345 patients, showed that probiotics significantly reduced abdominal pain, bloating, and vomiting after a colonoscopy.

> While there was no significant reduction in nausea, constipation, gas, or diarrhoea, these findings suggest probiotics could improve patient recov-

ery and encourage more individuals to undergo the crucial procedure.

The event - organised by the American Gastroenterological Association (AGA) and the European Society of Neurogastroenterology and Motility (ESNM) brought together clinicians, researchers, nutritionists, and dieticians from around the world. IANS

HKU1 not a new virus, less likely to cause any widespread infection: Experts

NEW DELHI: Even as the news of a woman in Kolkata being infected with Human Coronavirus HKU1 has raised fresh concerns, health experts on Monday said that the virus has been known for at least two decades and is less likely to cause any widespread

HKU1 was named after Hong Kong University where it was originally described in 2004. HKU1 is also known as Betacoronavirus hongkonense. It is a species of coronavirus that affects humans and ani-

Dr Rajeev Jayadevan, Chairman, Scientific Committee, IMA Cochin told IANS that HKU1 is different from Covid-19, caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus.

"HKU1 is one of several common cold-causing viruses that belong to the coronavirus group. It is not the same as Covid-19 and is not a new virus," Javadevan said.

"As per current understanding, HKU1 is a coronavirus subtype. It is less likely to cause any widespread infection," Dr. Harshal R Salve, Additional professor at, the Centre for Community Medicine at AIIMS, New Delhi, told IANS.

What is HKU1 and what are its symptoms?

HKU1 is one of the four common cold-causing coronaviruses -- NL63, OC43, 229E. On the other hand, three coronaviruses cause severe disease --Covid virus, the MERS virus, and the SARS virus.

Jayadevan stated that HKU1 is not typically associated with severe disease. Most cases are mild with a runny nose, sore throat, cough, and fever. "But in vulnerable individuals, it is known to cause severe disease such as pneumonia," he said.

Global studies show that most children had at least one infection from HKU1 by 3-4 years of age.

"Most children get exposed to these viruses while growing up. But immunity against coronaviruses is not long-lasting, which means repeated infections are the norm," Jayadevan said.

As per a 2021 study, published in the Indian Journal of Medical Microbiology, by Sir Ganga Ram Hospital, HKU1 along with NL63, OC43, 229E accounted for 4.3 per cent of infection in a group of 250 children.

HKU1 in India

A 45-year-old woman from Garia, Kolkata, has been recently diagnosed with HKU1. She had been suffering from a fever, cough, and cold for the past 15 days, but doctors say her condition is stable.

Since the virus is "not commonly tested for, it is meaningless to say it wasn't found in India," Jayadevan said.

How to prevent

HKU1 spreads mainly by contact, and also through the air by standing close to someone who is cough-

"Viruses tend to stick to commonly touched surfaces and therefore washing hands with soap and water after returning from public places is a good habit," the expert noted.

You must lie flat on your back and relax all the muscles and all the nerves - it is an easy thing to learn - to be like what I call a rag on a bed: nothing else remains.


And if you can do that with the mind also, you get rid of all those stupid dreams that make you more tired when you get

Balochistan train attack has grave implications for Pakistan's internal security, external ties

he hijacking of the Jaffar Express which was travelling from Quetta to Peshawar on 11 March 2025 resulted in the killing of 21 civilians, 4 soldiers and 33 militants. The Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA) claimed responsibility for the attack. The Pakistan Army declared an end to the standoff on March 12, 2025 after storming the train and claimed to have rescued the majority of hostages.

Balochistan, which accounts for over 43% of Pakistan's land, has often complained of step-motherly treatment by Islamabad. The reason for a sense of alienation among residents of Balochistan is both economic and political. While in economic terms, people of the province have complained of their natural resources and minerals being exploited on the political front there has been intense resentment against human rights violations, including the mysterious disappearance of scores of Baloch youth, allegedly with the involvement of Pakistani security forces.

Among the nine markets in the APAC region, India, South Korea, Taiwan and Australia saw significant investment growth, each recording more than 30 per cent year-on-year increases during the period, according to a Colliers report. *IANS*

NEW DELHI: A total of 6.54 crore people comprising 1.39 crore households are living in slums across the country and 90.60 lakh houses have been completed/delivered to beneficiaries from slums under PMAY-U till March 3, 2025, the Parliament was informed.

Minister of State for Housing and Urban Affairs, Tokhan Sahu, told Rajya Sabha in a reply that the figure on slum households was based on the last Census conducted in 2011.

Under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Urban (PMAY-U), a total of 118.64 lakh houses have been sanctioned by the Ministry, of which 112.46 lakh have seen start of work on the ground for construction and 90.60 lakh have been completed/delivered to the beneficiaries as on March 3, 2025, he said.

Capital appreciation outpaces rental income in India's top housing markets: Anarock report

MUMBAI: The answer to the 'rent or buy' question keeps changing as the Indian housing market evolves.

According to the latest ANAROCK data, capital values in the top 7 cities increased by a significant 128 percent between 2021 and 2024, while rental values in many micro markets appreciated less than the overall capital value growth.

An analysis of the key micro markets in the top 7 cities by Anarock showed that in major cities like Bengaluru, greater Mumbai, Delhi NCR, and Hyderabad, average capital values rose higher than rental values between 2021-end and 2024end,

Anuj Puri, Chairman of ANAROCK Group, said, "On the other hand, localities in Pune, Kolkata, and Chennai saw the reverse trend--rental values appreciated more than capital values."

Anarock also shared insights from top markets where capital value growth outpaced rental value growth - 2021-end to 2024-end:

NCR's Sohna Road saw capital values go up by 59 percent while rental values rose by 47 percent. Sector-150 in Noida saw capital values appreciate by a whopping 128 percent while rental values rose by just 66 percent in the period.

In Mumbai's Chembur, capital value growth was 48 percent, while rental appreciation was lower at 42 percent. In Mulund, rental values rose by just 29 percent, while capital prices went up 43 percent.

Hyderabad's HITECH City and Gachibowli also saw similar dynamics—in HITECH City, rental value growth was 54 percent, and capital appreciation was 62 percent; in Gachibowli, rental values rose 62 percent, and capital val-

ues rose 78 percent.

While Bengaluru's Thanisandra Main Road saw capital values appreciate more (67 percent) than average rental values (62 percent) in the period, Sarjapur Road saw average monthly rental values increase more (76 percent) than capital values (63 percent).

On the other hand, key micro markets in Pune, Kolkata and Chennai saw higher rental values growth than the capital value appreciation between 2021-end

Pune's Hinjewadi saw rental values appreciate by 57 percent, while capital values rose by just 37 percent. In Wagholi, rental value growth was 65 percent while capital values rose by just 37 percent.

In Kolkata's EM Bypass, rental value appreciation was 51 percent, while capital values rose by just

19 percent in this period. In Rajarhat,

rental values grew by 37 percent while capital appreciation was 32 percent.

Chennai's Pallavaram recorded a 44 percent growth in rental values, while capital values rose by 21 percent. In Perambur, rental values grew by 36 percent, while capital values rose 23 percent.

The clear divergence between capital appreciation and rental growth in these areas indicates that homeownership is becoming more lucrative in key markets where property values are rising faster than rental yields. The real estate consultant said this suggests strong long-term returns for investors in cities like Noida, Hyderabad, and MMR, where capital appreciation outpaces rental growth. *ANI*

Luxury real estate demand to remain strong, fueled by HNIs, capital market returns and startup ecosystem: Report

NEW DELHI: Demand for luxury real estate will be sustained, driven by rising High-Net-Worth Individual (HNI) population, strong capital market returns, and a growing startup ecosystem, according to a report by

Elara Capital.

Since the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic, the real estate sector has witnessed a major increase in the share of luxury real estate (properties priced over Rs 30 million) in Tier 1 cities, rising by 10 percentage points from FY20-24.

This trend has led to higher average pricing, with a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 8 percent in absorbed volume, while construction costs have remained largely stable, as per the report.

This is positive for overall industry profitability, the report added.

Additionally, key indicators of wealth creation, such as the rising HNI population, strong capital market returns, and a growing startup ecosystem, suggest a strong demand for upgrades in the luxury real estate market, the report added.

The report mentions the Knight Frank data, which revealed that India's UHNWI population, those with a net



worth exceeding USD 30 million, is expected to grow by 50 percent between Calendar Year 2023-28, outpacing growth in Asia (38 percent) and the US (26 cent).

This growth is supported by double-digit returns in capital markets, strong earnings from alternative investments like crypto currencies, and increased funding in startups and the sports & entertainment sectors. *ANI*

PM Modi's model of DOGE stopped Rs 5 lakh crore wastage in India

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi recently pointed out in his interview with popular American podcaster Lex Fridman, that he has already implemented measures for government efficiency by preventing the wastage of social welfare funds in India much like the goal that is envisaged in President Donald Trump's DOGE program just introduced in the US.

PM Modi highlighted that when he came to power, he introduced the Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) system for social welfare which eliminated fake, non-existent beneficiaries of various schemes that were resulting in massive amounts of funds being siphoned out of the system by corrupt middlemen.



"After I took office in 2014, I observed that back then, we weren't part of many global discussions, not like how President Trump and DOGE are being talked about today. But let me give you an example so you can see the kind of work that was done. I noticed that the benefits of certain government schemes, especially welfare programs, were being exploited by so many people who never even existed in real life," PM Modi told Fridman.

According to senior officials, by March 2023, the Modi government's model of allocating social welfare funds through DBT had saved around Rs 3.48 lakh crore.

As nearly Rs 64,000 crore are being saved each year now with the plugging of leakages due to fake withdrawals by corrupt elements, the total savings now add up to around Rs 5 lakh crore, a senior official said.

Incidentally, this is what the DOGE program led by Elon Musk has found in the US where social security benefits were being made to people who were not alive any more. IANS

India among 6 countries with indigenous Cryogenic tech, ISRO's CE20 engine now human-rated: ISRO

NEW DELHI: India is among six countries -- the US, France, Russia, China, and Japan -- that have indigenously developed Cryogenic technology, said Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) Chairman Dr. V. Narayanan.


Speaking at the launch of a research center at the Indian Institute of Technology

(IIT) Madras, Narayanan said that ISRO's CE20 engine has achieved a human rating for the Gaganyaan mission.

"The Cryogenic Engine technology was denied to India but today, we have three different such engines with the third one being human-rated. Only six countries in the world have this technology," Narayanan said, noting the world records made


with the advanced technology.

"We have made three world records in this technology -- we got it right in our third attempt; from the engine test to flight, we got it done in 28 months, while other countries took between 42 months and 18 years. We also conducted the test in 34 days which no other country had done as they took around 5 to 6 months," the ISRO chief said.

Middle East remains the cause of serious global concerns

he conflict-ridden Middle East is affecting geopoli tics, particularly because developments there suggest a convergence between political alignments and religious divides and a dangerous drift of the world towards faith-based confrontations.

Perhaps the biggest evidence of this is the fact of a fundamentalist Iran taking the radicalized Hamas in its embrace because they both were driven by their political opposition to the US.

Shia fundamentalism is ideologically against the US, for it rejects Capitalism and even glorifies poverty, while Sunni radicals carried the historical memory of the 19th century Wahhabi Jehad

not carry a denominational stamp and would provide equality of political rights to all 'communities'.

An 'Islamic Republic' may subscribe to the view that the 'Quran is the best Constitution' -- this was propounded by the Islamic thinker Hasan Al Banna, who founded the Muslim Brotherhood in Syria and Egypt in 1928 to oppose the nationalist pro-Soviet Arab leaders there, but it is the grant of equal political rights to the religious minorities that marked the essence of 'democracy' even where there was no express declaration of commitment of the state to 'secularism'.

Banna made a political state-

launched by the leading Ulema of the time, against the Western encroachment on 'Muslim lands'. Jehad is described as a fundamental duty of faithful Muslims to make the supreme sacrifice for the defense of Islam if it was 'in danger'.

The continually disturbed Middle East is at the edge of catastrophe because the leading players there -- Saudi Arabia, Yemen, Iraq and even Israel -- seem to be keeping their respective faiths above the state policy. This evidently came at the cost of 'liberalism' and prevented a move of the region towards democracy.

Democratization was the key to a return to normalization in the Middle East. Democracy mandates that the state would ment that an "Islamic State could live in competition, not conflict with the West" which kept the Muslim Brotherhood on the right side of the US. As late as 2011, when the Muslim Brotherhood led the Arab Spring movement in Egypt, it was quietly appreciated by the US.

Currently, Abdel Fattah el Sisi of army background elected as President after an interim period, is ruling Egypt and the US is tolerating him. There is no denying the fact that the Middle East must make stable progress towards adopting the spirit of 'democracy' if a larger geopolitical disruption is to be averted.

No significant diplomatic efforts to bring peace to the Middle East have apparently been made, possibly because the region was torn into conflicting alignments caused by the reappearance of a new Cold War between the US-led West, on one hand, and the Russia-China combine, on the other.

Iran is now firmly with Russia and China in a strategic alliance, Saudis remain in the US camp, and Israel continues to have unflinching support of President Donald Trump against Hamas to a point where the new US President wants Israel to 'clean up' Gaza in quick time.


Trump seemed to have a friendly disposition towards President Vladimir Putin but the relations of the US with China were already facing added tension and these would keep up the Cold War kind of divide between the two powers. While the UAE and Saudi Arabia were inclined to have the Abrahamic Accord with Israel under the influence of the US, the military conflict between Iran and its proxies with Israel had reached a new level of escalation.

The Shia-Sunni discord always impacted Iran-Saudi relations, but the Iran-Hamas alliance could be interpreted as a mark of antipathy between Islam and Zionism at the level of faith. This happened in the wake of the October 7 terrorist attack of Hamas on Israel in 2023 and the subsequent move of Iran to bring the radicalized Hamas into its fold against the US-Israel combine.

Hamas, it may be mentioned, had originally represented the Palestine branch of the Muslim Brotherhood -- a militant organization known to be in the good books of the US during the Cold War and had turned radical in the course of the US-led 'war on terror' in reaction to the perceived high- handedness of Israel in Gaza and West Bank.

INDIA'S SPACE MISSIONS

ndia's SPADEX satellites successfully docked on January 16, 2025. ISRO has now accomplished the pivotal operation of undocking of SPADEX satellites, in the very first attempt on 13 March 2025 at ~09:20 Hrs. The undocking of the satellites took place in 460 km circular orbit with 45-degree inclination. The satellites are now orbiting independently and their health is normal. With this, ISRO has successfully demonstrated all capabilities required for rendezvous, docking and undocking operations in a circular orbit. The entire operations were monitored through ground stations located at Bengaluru, Lucknow and Mauritius.

Having accomplished this major milestone of undocking, further experiments with satellites are planned in the coming days. Exhaustive ground simulations and analysis was the cornerstone of achieving the undocking in the first attempt. Various tests replicating on-orbit conditions were meticulously planned and carried out, in preparation for the earliest opportunity for undocking operations. It is a cost-effective experiment through which, India has achieved space rendezvous, docking and post docking control technologies.

The other main achievement by ISRO was Chandrayan-3, with a joint collaboration with the European Space Tracking network (ESTRACK), operated by the European Space Agency (ESA), and Deep Space Network operated by Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) of NASA which supported the mission. Under a new cross-support arrangement, ESA tracking support could be provided for upcoming ISRO missions such as those of India's first human spaceflight programme, Gaganyaan, and the Aditya-L1 solar research mission.

Data from Chanrayan-3 has indicated that the presence of water on the Moon could be more widespread than known so far. The research team from Physical Research Laboratory in Ahmedabad which analysed the data from the ChaSTE instrument onboard the Vikram Lander, has come to the conclusion that there were strong possibilities of water ice-sheets being present in the areas outside the polar regions as well. It was one of the major breakthroughs for the Indian space communities.

It was a big achievement since Chandrayaan-2 which crashed after the lander lost contact with mission control, deviated from its intended trajectory while attempting to land near the lunar South Pole in 2019. The lunar South Pole region holds particular interest for scientific exploration. Studies show large amounts of ice there. The ice could contain solid-state compounds that would normally melt under warmer conditions elsewhere on the Moon, compounds that could provide insight into lunar, Earth and Solar System history. For future crewed missions and outposts, the ice could also be a source of oxygen, of drinking water, as well as of fuel due to its hydrogen content.

It was result of a strong support and collaboration by the government and international agencies which paid rich dividends. It seems India is performing much better in space exploration and satellite technologies than other areas. This was due to greater autonomy given to these departments and to the scientific community. Other reasons also contribute, including young scientists returning to India from overseas and working alongside local agencies. There is also large group of Indian scientists in NASA, who are of Indian origin, working for space and nuclear research.


