

Pakistan: Radical Islamists set ablaze two Ahmadiyya places of worship

ISLAMABAD: A leading minority group condemned the recent violence against religious minorities in Pakistan, highlighting the recent torching of two Ahmadiyya places of worship by a mob led by leaders of the radical Islamist party Tehreek-i-Labbaik Pakistan (TLP).

The Voice of Pakistan Minority (VOPM) mentioned that on the occasion of Pakistan's 78th Independence Day, extremists turned the country's streets into battlegrounds of hate. In Faisalabad district of Punjab province, two Ahmadiyya places of worship were set ablaze by the mob serving as an ugly reminder that in Pakistan, religious

freedom remains an illusion.

Citing police reports, the rights body revealed that more than 300 attackers, armed with rods and bricks, descended on Ahmadiyya worshippers under the cades before Pakistan criminalized Ahmadiyya worship in 1984. They tore down minarets, delivered fiery hate speeches, and torched the buildings while hurling stones at nearby Ahmadiyya homes.

Citing police reports, the rights body revealed that more than 300 attackers, armed with rods and bricks, descended on Ahmadiyya worshippers under the cover of Independence Day processions in the Dijkot area

The VOPM highlighted that their main target was the two mosques built de-

The rights body stressed that the violent incident left families, including women and children terrorized, while several sustained injuries.

According to the VOPM, the mob was reportedly led by TLP ticket-holder Hafiz Rafaqat, exposing once again how mainstream extremist groups openly incite violence under political and religious banners. It stated that TLP, notorious for its violent street power, enjoys immunity in Pakistan's political and judicial system while minorities pay the price.

"This was no spontaneous riot - it was organized terrorism, with cases now registered under the Anti-Terrorism Act, 1997 and multiple sections of the Pakistan Penal Code. Yet, history shows such cases rarely lead to real accountability. *IANS*

Zelenskyy confirms USD 90 bn US weapons plan, says trilateral meeting dates yet to be finalized

WASHINGTON DC: Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy confirmed plans for Ukraine to purchase USD 90 billion worth of American weapons through European funding as part of its security guarantees, while noting that the dates for a proposed trilateral meeting with Russian President Vladimir Putin and US President Donald

MOSCOW: Russian President Vladimir Putin and his American counterpart Donald Trump held a telephonic conversation reaffirming their commitment to continuing direct talks between Moscow and Kyiv delegations.

Confirming the development, Russian President's aide Yuri Ushakov said the conversation took place at the US President's initiative.

According to Ushakov, during the discussions, Trump briefed Putin about the dialogue he had with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy and leaders of several European countries in Washington.

During the call, Putin also expressed gratitude to Trump for the hospitality

and arrangements at the Alaska Summit, as well as for the progress they were able to achieve towards bringing about a peaceful resolution to the Ukraine conflict.

The Russian Presidential aide said that, among other things, both Trump and Putin discussed the prospect of exploring opportunities for drawing higher-ranking officials from both Ukraine and Russia into the direct talks.

"It is quite telling that Vladimir Putin and Donald Trump agreed to keep in touch with one another on the Ukrainian issue and other urgent international and bilateral matters. The President of Russia highlighted the importance of

Donald Trump's personal efforts and commitment to finding solutions for a lasting settlement in Ukraine. The conversation was quite frank and constructive," Ushakov stated.

Meanwhile, after meetings with the Ukrainian President and European leaders, Trump announced he is arranging a meeting between Zelenskyy and Putin in his effort to end the devastating war that has killed hundreds of thousands of civilians and military personnel.

Following the meeting, he called the Russian President and held discussions to hold a trilateral meeting -- Zelenskyy, Putin and Trump -- to discuss the peace talks.

"I called President Putin, and began the arrangements for a meeting, at a location to be determined, between President Putin and President Zelenskyy," Trump said in a post on his social media platform, Truth Social. *IANS*

US to work with India to face modern challenges: US Secretary of State

NEW YORK: The US looks forward to working with India to meet modern challenges and ensure "a brighter future", Secretary of State Marco Rubio said in a conciliatory Independence Day message amid rising tensions between the two nations.

"The historic relationship between the world's largest democracy and the world's oldest democracy is consequential and far-reaching," Rubio said.

"Working together, the United States and India will rise to the modern challenges of today and ensure a brighter future for both our countries," he said.

The message of cooperation and partnership came amidst a standoff between the two countries over tariffs and differences over US President Donald Trump's role in ending the Operation Sindoor conflict.

He focused on the Indo-Pacific, where India and the US share challenges from China.

"Our two countries are united by our shared vision for a more peaceful, prosperous, and secure Indo-Pacific region," he said.

Rubio also mentioned the areas of cooperation in technology and industry that are imperiled by Trump's tariff of 25 percent on imports from India and a threat to add 25 percent if India buys Russia's oil.

He said, "Our partnership spans industries, promotes innovation, pushes the boundaries of critical and emerging technologies, and extends into space".

Another divisive issue that has emerged in relations between the two countries that had been on an upswing is Trump's repeated insistence that he mediated the end to the May conflict between India and Pakistan.

India has insisted that it was resolved by the neighbors themselves, with a phone call from Islamabad's military. *IANS*

Putin shares insights with PM Modi on Trump meeting; India reiterates call for peaceful resolution

NEW DELHI: Russian President Vladimir Putin called Prime Minister Narendra Modi and shared his insights about the recent meeting in Alaska with US President Donald Trump over the Ukraine conflict.

PM Modi said India has consistently called for a peaceful resolution of the Ukraine conflict and supports all efforts in this regard.

He thanked the Russian President for the phone call and for sharing his perspective on the Alaska meeting.

"Thank my friend, President Putin, for his phone call and for sharing insights on his recent meeting with President Trump in Alaska. India has consistently called for a peaceful resolution of the Ukraine conflict and supports all efforts in this regard. I look forward to our continued exchanges in the days to come," PM Modi said in a post on X.

India had welcomed the US-Russia Summit meeting and appreciated the

progress made.

"India welcomes the Summit meeting in Alaska between US President Donald

Trump and President Vladimir Putin of Russia. Their leadership in the pursuit of peace is highly commendable," MEA spokesperson had said in a statement on July 16.

"India appreciates the progress made in the Summit. The way forward can only be through dialogue and diplomacy. The world wants to see an early end to the conflict in Ukraine," the statement added.

While the Summit meeting was anticipated to take about seven hours, it wrapped up in less than three. Trump and Putin addressed a gathering of journalists after the talks with relatively brief pre-prepared statements. Neither leader took any questions, according to Al Jazeera.

Putin said his country is committed to ending the war, but the conflict's "primary causes" must be eliminated for an agreement to be long-lasting.

Putin also warned Ukraine and the European Union against throwing a "wrench in the works" and cautioned against attempts to use "backroom dealings to conduct provocations to torpedo the nascent progress," as per Al Jazeera.

Trump praised the "extremely productive meeting", in which he said "many points were agreed to". He said there is a "very good chance of getting there" - referring to a ceasefire - but conceded that there remain sticking points with Moscow, including at least one "significant" one.

He cautioned that it's "ultimately up to them" - referring to Putin and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy. "There's no deal until there's a deal," he said. ANI

India-China relations showing positive trend toward returning to cooperation, says Wang Yi

NEW DELHI: During the visit of Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi to India, India and China agreed to maintain the momentum of bilateral ties as the countries mark 75 years of their diplomatic ties. The talks between him and EAM Dr S Jaishankar featured several themes such as the changing world situation, challenges to free trade and how New Delhi and Beijing can act as major powers, set an example for developing countries, as reported by Xinhua news.

As per Xinhua News, India and China have agreed to maintain momentum of bilateral ties. The consensus came from talks held between Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi, who is visiting India and EAM Dr S Jaishankar.

According to Xinhua, Wang Yi said that in today's world, the changing situation is evolving rapidly, unilateral bullying practices are rampant, and free trade and the international order face severe challenges. *ANI*

"There is no change in our position Taiwan. We stressed that, like the rest of the world. India has a relationship with Taiwan that focuses on economic, technology and cultural ties. We intend to continue it," a source in the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) stated less than 24 hours after Beijing claimed that the issue of Taiwan came up for

discussion during the meeting between External Affairs Minister (EAM) S Jaishankar and visiting Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi in New Delhi recently.

The Indian government also facilitates legal employment of Indian workers overseas based on mutual interest.


China claims Taiwan to be a part of its territory that must be reunified with the mainland by force, if necessary. In recent

years, Beijing has increased military exercises in the Taiwan Strait to intensify pressure on Taiwan.





A historic moment: Tiranga hoisted on Seattle's iconic space needle for the first time ever!



The Wide-Reaching Impacts of Trump's Tariffs Plan

n April 2, President Donald Trump announced "Liberation Day," signaling his intent to impose tariffs on at least 90 countries. Trump has said his sweeping tariffs plan will generate revenue, while also countering allegedly unfair trading practices. Speakers at the ACOM briefing on Aug 15 discussed whether the President can successfully negotiate his tariffs plan, especially in the key economies of China, India, Brazil, and Mexico. Speakers also discussed the impacts of tariffs for American consumers, the labor force, and small businesses.

Dr. Neale Mahoney, Director of the Stanford Institute for Economic Policy Research and Professor of Economics at Stanford University pointed out that the most direct effect of tariffs is to push up consumer product prices and business costs. Recent data shows that the pass-

through effect has already emerged, especially affecting small and medium-sized enterprises that rely on imported raw materials the most. He said that U.S. imports account for about 10% of overall consumption. If the average tariff is increased by 15 percentage points, it will push up overall

prices by about 1.5%. Although this does not seem to have a catastrophic impact, for daily necessities such as coffee, toys, clothing and furniture, the price increase

that China is currently facing 30% U.S. tariffs and may soar to 145% after November, which will cause a devastating blow to China's manufacturing industry. China's annual exports to the United States total about US\$450 billion, of which iPhones, computers and electronic components are important items. If mobile phone products lose their immunity and are subject to an additional tariff of more than 100%, it

will inevitably lead to large-scale layoffs in China's coastal OEMs. He stressed that China's economy has slowed down significantly in recent years, with youth unemployment rumored to be as high as 25%, and officials even suspended the release of relevant data. Against this background, suffering the impact of high tariffs will exacerbate economic difficulties.

Dilawar Syed, former Deputy Administrator, US Small Business Administration Marcus Bowers, Co-founder of She's Happy Hair emphasized that tariffs have particularly harmed U.S. small businesses. He said that 97% of importers in the United States are small businesses, and two-thirds of small businesses are involved in exports, but they lack the funds and manpower to respond to sudden policy changes. For example, he gave the example of a female owner of a Latin American grocery store who recently received an import tax bill of nearly \$20,000, which was far more than she could bear. She could only consider layoffs or closure of business. According to a survey by the National Small Business Association, 58% of small business owners said economic conditions are worse than last year, and the confidence index hit a 15-year low.

Nearly 43 pc Indian workers confident about adopting AI tools soon: Report

MUMBAI: Nearly 43 percent of Indian workers are confident in adopting generative and agentic AI into their work in the next two to five years, a recent report said.



In a survey of over 3,000 white and blue-collar workers in India, job site Indeed found that

mid-career professionals aged 35 to 54 show the highest confidence in navigating Al-integrated workplaces, with 49 percent reporting readiness outpacing their younger peers aged 18 to 24. *IANS*

Additional US tariffs to impact \$48 billion of India's exports, govt to safeguard trade: Minister

NEW DELHI: If America imposes additional 25 percent on India, around \$48.2 billion of India's merchandise export to the US is likely to be subject to those tariffs, the Parliament was informed.

Reciprocal tariff at the rate of 25 percent has been imposed on certain goods exported from India to the US, starting from August 7.

Further, additional rate of duty of 25 percent with effect from August 27 has been imposed on certain goods exported from India.

"The government has taken note of tariff imposition by the US. It is estimated that around \$48.2 billion of India's merchandise export (based on 2024 trade value) to the US will be subject to the above additional tariffs," Minister of State for Commerce and Industry Jitin Prasada said in a written reply to a question in Lok Sabha.

He further said that the government is committed to secure



and advance country's national interest and protect the welfare of our farmers, workers, entrepreneurs, exporters, MSMEs and all sections of industry and "take all necessary steps to help mitigate

impact on trade including through appropriate export promotion and trade diversification measures".

It is estimated that around 55 percent of the total value of India's

merchandise exports to the US is subject to the 25 percent first line of US reciprocal tariffs.

No additional tariffs have been imposed on Indian exports to the US in sectors like pharmaceuticals and electronics as yet.

According to the minister, a combination of different factors, such as product differentiation, demand, quality, and contractual arrangements, would determine the impact of reciprocal tariffs on India's exports, including in the textiles sector. *IANS*

Amazon India announces 1.5 lakh new jobs owing to festive demand

MUMBAI: Online marketplace Amazon India announced it has created over 1.5 lakh seasonal work opportunities in the country due to the increased demand in the festive season.

"These include direct and indirect work opportunities in 400+ cities, including Mumbai, Delhi, Pune, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Lucknow, Cochin, Coimbatore, Indore, Raipur, etc."

Job opportunities were created for thousands of women associates and over 2000 PWDs (differently abled people), and the company has

already onboarded many of these new associates, a release from Amazon India said.

The seasonal jobs are available in fulfillment centers (FCs), sort centers, and last-mile delivery stations.

"Many of these new associates continue their journey with Amazon beyond the festive period, with a significant number returning to work with us year after year," said Abhinav Singh, VP - Operations, India & Descriptions, Australia, Amazon.

"Throughout our operations, we prioritize the safety and well-being of all associates-whether they're working in our buildings or

delivering packages to customers," he said.

"We remain dedicated to fostering a safe, equitable, and empowering work environment that includes social security benefits and supports the financial wellbeing of all our team," Singh added

Amazon has increased the number of Ashray rest centers in India to 100 to support the well-being of its associates in the ecommerce network, the release said.

Further, it claimed to provide

free health check-ups to over 80,000 delivery associates across major cities, offering comprehensive services that include eye, dental, BMI, and physician consultations.

Additionally, an on-site first aid ('AMCARE') facility is available at the fulfillment centers to anyone who needs immediate first-aid attention or rest.

"The Early Access to Pay (EATP) program allows associates to withdraw up to 80 percent of their accrued basic salary within the first 20 days of each month, promoting financial flexibility and wellness," the company said. *IANS*



Apple clocks 63 pc growth in India exports at \$7.5 billion in April-July: Data

NEW DELHI: Apple saw its iPhone exports from India rise almost 63 percent to \$7.5 billion in the April-July period this year, from \$4.6 billion in the same period last fiscal (FY25), according to latest industry data.

Overall smartphone exports also surged to a new high of \$10 billion in the first four month this fiscal, up 52 percent from \$6.4 billion in the same period in FY25.

When it comes to Q1 FY26, India's smartphone export momentum hit a record high in the April-June period, with shipments reaching \$7.72 billion, up 58 percent from \$4.9 billion in the same period last year. During the quarter, Apple exported \$6 billion worth of iPhones through its contract manufacturers, representing an 82 percent increase from the previous year, as per industry estimates.

Meanwhile, Taiwanese electronics major Foxconn and Apple's key supplier has started production of iPhone 17 at its new Bengaluru factory. This marks a significant milestone for the facility, which is Foxconn's second-largest iPhone manufacturing unit outside China and



has been set up at an investment of around \$2.8 billion (about Rs 25,000 crore).

Apple is betting big on India as a manufacturing hub. The company is expected to scale up iPhone production to 60 million units this year, compared to 35-40 million units in 2024-25. In the year ended March 31, 2025, Apple manufactured 60 percent more iPhones in India, worth an estimated \$22 billion.

Apple CEO Tim Cook recently underlined India's growing importance in the company's global supply chain. After announcing financial results on July 31, he revealed that majority of iPhones sold in the US in June 2025 were made in India.

Moreover, in a major fillip to the 'Make in India' initiative, India's electronics production surged from \$31 billion to \$133 billion in a decade beginning 2014-15.

The electronics exports surged more than 47 percent in Q1 of 2025-26 over the same quarter in 2024-25. *IANS*

Bharat Connect emerges as global model for bill payments: Report

NEW DELHI: Bharat Connect processed nearly 8 million transactions daily, facilitating 715 million transactions worth Rs 3.14 trillion in FY25 Q3 alone -- a 217 percent year-on-year growth in value over Q3 FY24, a recent report said.

"India's Bharat Connect is a testament to the country's leadership in digital payment innovation. As a unified, centralized platform, it has not only enhanced trust and accessibility in bill payments but also set a global benchmark," said Dharmender Jhamb, Partner, Grant Thornton

"We believe such models offer a valuable roadmap for economies looking to modernize their financial infrastructure and drive inclusive digital growth," he added.

Globally, Bharat Connect has emerged as a benchmark.

The reports also compared Bharat Connect with systems like BPAY in Australia and SADAD in Saudi Arabia, highlighting its unique scalability, security, and replicability.

While many countries grapple with fragmented payment landscapes, India has shown what's possible when unification meets regulation, the report said.

At the heart of this transformation lies technology-led efficiency.

With just a single integration point for billers and service providers, the platform reduces costs, enhances transparency, and ensures compliance with regulatory standards,

the report stated.

The result is a seamless ecosystem where trust and innovation go hand in hand.

By 2026, it is projected to handle more than 3 billion annually - an achievement that would place it firmly among the world's most successful centralized bill payment systems, the report highlighted. *IANS*



NEW DELHI: India's exports of textile products to the USA, the EU, and the UK touched the \$20.7 billion mark for the financial year ended on March 31, 2025, the Parliament was informed recently.

The USA and the EU are important markets for Indian textile products.

During the year 2024-25, India's total textile and apparel exports, including handicrafts, to the US were valued at \$10.94 billion, whereas the export of these products to the EU and the UK were valued at \$7.6 billion and \$2.16 billion, respectively, Minister of State for Textiles Pabitra Margherita said in a written reply to a question in the Lok Sabha, adding that India has signed an FTA with the UK and is actively engaged in FTA negotiations with the EU.

India's exports of technical textiles stood at Rs 24,732.68 crore in FY 2024-25, which represented a 15.53 percent growth over the previous financial year, the minister said.

He also highlighted that India has signed 15 Free Trade Agreements (FTAs), including the recently signed CETA between India and the UK. These FTAs aim to reduce tariff and non-tariff barriers, simplify procedures, and address structural issues to make Indian exporters more competitive in partner markets.

The minister further stated that the government is implementing the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme for Textiles with an approved outlay of Rs 10,683 crore over a five-year period, to promote the production of MMF apparel, MMF fabrics, and products of technical textiles in the country to enable the textile sector to achieve size and scale and to become competitive. *IANS*

PM announces mission to tackle illegal immigration

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi, during his address from the ramparts of Red Fort, warned against illegal immigration, which is threatening the country.

He announced a demography mission to protect the country from the dangers posed by illegal immigrants.

PM Modi said he would like to alert the nation about the concern, which has now become a challenge. "Under a well-thoughtout conspiracy, the country's demography is being changed, and seeds of a new crisis are being sown," the PM said.

The Prime Minister said that the infiltrators are snatching the livelihood of the youth of the country.

"They are targeting our sisters and daughters. They are misleading the adivasis and grabbing their lands. This will not be tolerated," said PM Modi.

The Prime Minister flagged the challenges caused due to demographic changes, especially in the border areas.

He said that the demographic changes in border areas pose a threat to national security.

"It sows the seeds of conflict. No country can surrender before infiltrators. Then how can we?" he said.

PM Modi announced the national mission to tackle what he referred to as a looming danger. "Not to allow such activities is our duty to our ancestors who gifted us an Independent India. So I announce from the ramparts of Red Fort that we have decided to start a high-powered demography mission. This mission will tackle the danger that is looming over India," said PM Modi. IANS

OMAHA, Neb.: U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services provided valuable assistance to federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies during a coordinated operation targeting a human trafficking ring operating in Omaha-area hotels.

United States Attorney Lesley A. Woods announced that five people were charged by complaint for a range of federal violations that center around their alleged conspiracy to engage in labor trafficking, sex trafficking, and harboring of aliens at several hotel locations across the Omaha metro area and into central Nebraska. the investigation or prosecution of criminal activity.

The complaint further alleges one defendant engaged in conversations about the cost to bring someone from India to America and alleges that aliens were being transported by co-conspirators between Nebraska and Washington for the purpose of fraudulently obtaining Washington state driver's licenses for around \$1,000 per document.

U.S. Attorney Woods commended the unparalleled investigative coordination and accomplishment of this case achieved by the combined efforts of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Department of Homeland Security, the Sarpy County Sheriff's Office, the Omaha Police Department, the Nebraska State Patrol, the Internal Revenue Service Criminal Investigation Branch, the United States Marshals Service, and the Nebraska State Attorney General's Office. USCIS assistance included furnishing immigration status updates and verifying immigration documentation.

The redacted complaint affidavit contains a more complete summary of the allegations. Every defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.

At least 27 migrants, refugees dead in shipwreck off Italy's Lampedusa

LAMPEDUSA: At least 27 migrants and refugees drowned last week following a tragic shipwreck off the coast of the Italian island of Lampedusa, according to a statement by the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), Filippo

Grandi, marking yet another deadly incident in the perilous Central Mediterranean migration route.

In a post on X, Grandi stated that over 700 refugees and migrants have lost their lives in the Central Mediterranean so far in 2025, while emphasizing the ur-

gent need to enhance all aspects of the response to deal with such situations.

"At least 27 people have drowned in a tragic shipwreck near #Lampedusa. Over 700 refugees and migrants have now died in 2025 in the Central Mediterranean. All responses -- res-

cue at sea, safe pathways, helping transit countries and addressing root causes -- must be strengthened," Grandi stated in his post.

According to UNHCR Italy's Communication Officer, the agency is currently assisting survivors from the wreck. ANI

Pakistan steps up crackdown on undocumented Afghan migrants

ISLAMABAD: Pakistani police have intensified operations in Peshawar, detaining numerous undocumented Afghan migrants as part of a wider crackdown on those without valid legal documentation, Khaama Press reported.

Police in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa said they had detained a significant number of undocumented Afghan migrants and suspected armed individuals during coordinated security operations in the city. Authorities claimed weapons and narcotics were seized from those arrested and vowed to continue the campaign, according to Khaama Press.

The operations were conducted in the Kacha Garhi,

The operations were conducted in the Kacha Garhi, Nasir Bagh, and Regi areas. While the exact number of detainees was not disclosed, officials said the drive was part of broader action against undocumented Afghan nationals

Khaama Press reported that in recent months, Pakistan has intensified arrests and deportations of Afghan migrants lacking legal documentation, often carrying out house-to-house searches. The campaign has accelerated as visa renewals for Afghan nationals have been suspended for over a month, leaving many who previously

held legal status undocumented and vulnerable to expulsion

On August 13, the Pakistani government announced the formation of a special committee comprising police and intelligence officials to identify and repatriate Afghans holding Proof of Registration (PoR) cards. The committee will collect and share data from various agencies to locate Afghan migrants and coordinate enforcement actions, Khaama Press reported.

The UNHCR has expressed concern that Pakistan's recent measures have left thousands of Afghans homeless, with many reporting threats, coercion, and mistreat-

ment by police. Rights advocates warn that the continuation of such policies risks worsening an already severe humanitarian crisis, pushing vulnerable Afghan families into deeper insecurity, displacement, and loss of livelihood.

This comes amid reports that over 30,000 Afghan nationals illegally residing in Quetta division have been repatriated to Afghanistan in less than a month, official sources told Dawn.

The Pakistani government had set a July 31 deadline for all illegal Afghans to return to their home country. While many complied, a significant number remained, prompting authorities to launch legal action. Joint teams comprising police, Frontier Corps, FIA, and district administration were formed to carry out the crackdown. *ANI*

Tensions rising in Pakistan's Gilgit-Baltistan against Chinese dominance

NEW DELHI: Tensions are growing in Pakistan's Gilgit-Baltistan region between local communities and the increasingly dominant China-Pakistan trade apparatus, according to reports.

Social media footage widely circulated showed Chinese nationals blocking a key road in protest, and within hours, Pakistani traders responded by staging a sit-in that effectively brought cross-border movement at the Sost town at the Gilgit-Baltistan (GB) immigration point to a standstill on July 31.

According to a report in the online publication Zamin.uz, these developments are not isolated. They reflect a deepening discontent in Gilgit-Baltistan over what many local residents view as an exploitative trade relationship-one in which the economic benefits disproportionately favor Chinese interests while local traders are left to navigate a system they say is stacked against them.

Gilgit-Baltistan's traders have been voicing concerns for years, but recent developments underscore

just how acute those frustrations have become.

Many in the region argue that the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) -- a project long hailed by Islamabad as a game-changer --

has offered little by way of tangible benefit to the local economy

Instead, GB residents say they are witnessing their lands used as corridors for foreign economic gain, while their own businesses are suffocated by bureaucracy and an uneven playing field.

A recurring complaint involves the inspection of Pakistani goods and vehicles by customs officials, while Chinese shipments often pass with minimal scrutiny.

One Gilgit-Baltistan trader told a local media outlet that they were required to provide strict documentation and face exhaustive checks, while Chinese goods faced almost no scrutiny at all.

Adding to this imbalance are concerns about labor. Chinese workers employed in infrastructure projects under CPEC are often flown in rather than hired from the local population, leaving many GB residents sidelined despite promises of job creation.

According to the report, the Pak-China Traders Action Committee (PCTAC) has escalated its protest at the Sost Dry Port in Hunza since July 21, demanding an end to what it terms illegal taxation by federal agencies.

The committee, comprising traders, hoteliers, transporters, and local businesses, has blocked the Karakoram Highway in Hunza and Nagar districts, disrupting trade with China. *IANS*

Bollywood film unit hit by food poisoning in Leh

SRINAGAR: A Bollywood film unit shooting in Ladakh was hit by food poisoning, and over 100 members of the unit were admitted to a hospital in Leh, officials said.

"Over 100 workers of a Bollywood film crew were hospitalized in Leh after a suspected case of food poisoning late 11 August evening," officials confirmed.

The workers of the film unit were engaged in the shooting of an upcoming film when several of them suddenly developed severe abdominal pain, vomiting, and headache.

They were immediately rushed to the Sajal Narbu Memorial (SNM) Hospital in Leh, where doctors said it was a case of mass food poisoning.

An official said that nearly 600 people had meals at the location before the incident occurred.

"Food samples have been collected for detailed analysis to identify the cause," the official added. The hospital authorities said the situation was brought under control after an urgent mobilization of staff from all departments.

"We managed the patient rush effectively. The police also stepped in to regulate the overcrowded emergency ward and prevent panic," a senior doctor

Doctors confirmed that all patients are in stable condition, and most of them have been discharged after receiving necessary treatment. *IANS*

New ultrasound drug delivery safe, reduces side effects

NEW DELHI: US researchers are building a non-invasive system using ultrasound to deliver drugs anywhere in the body with precision, as well as with reduced side effects.

The new system, being developed by a team of Stanford University researchers, uses nanoparticles to encapsulate drugs along with ultrasound to unleash the drugs at their intended destinations.

In a study published in the journal Nature Nanotechnology, the team showed in rats that their system can deliver ketamine to specific regions of the brain and painkillers to specific nerves in limbs. Using a new sucrose formulation, they found that nanoparticles are safer, more stable, and easier to produce.

"Turns out just a little bit of sugar is all you need to make this work," said Raag Airan, Assistant Professor of radiology, Stanford Medicine.

The researchers found that a 5 percent sucrose solution inside the nanoparticles made them

relatively stable in the body, yet responsive to ultrasound stimulation

That means that even when the nanoparticles are delivered into the bloodstream and travel tial to make a wide range of drugs safer and more effective.

"We can maximize the therapeutic effect and minimize the off-target effects," Airan said.

Initially, the nanoparticles con-

Finally, they tried sugar. After testing different types and concentrations of sugars, the researchers found that 5 percent sucrose added to the liquid core achieved the best balance of ultrasound response and stability at body temperature.

The researchers then tested the drug delivery system in rats, comparing animals that were given an injection of free, unencapsulated ketamine with those given ketamine encapsulated in nanoparticles with 5 percent sucrose.

When the researchers applied ultrasound to a particular brain region, the nanoparticles delivered about three times as much drug to that region as to other parts of their brain -- demonstrating targeted drug release.

If the system works in humans, clinicians may be able to isolate the emotional effects of ketamine -- to treat depression, for example -- while blocking the dissociative effects of the drug, the researchers said. *IANS*

Highly sensitive people more likely to experience depression, anxiety: Study

NEW DELHI: People with sensitive personalities are more likely to experience mental health problems like depression and anxiety, according to a recent study.

The study, led by Queen Mary University of London, defined sensitivity as a personality trait that reflects people's capacity to perceive and process environmental stimuli such as bright lights, subtle changes in the environment, and other people's moods.

The research, based on a meta-analysis of 33 studies, revealed there was a significant, positive relationship between sensitivity and depression and anxiety. The findings, published in the journal Clinical Psychological Science, noted that highly sensitive people are more likely to experience depression and anxiety compared to those who are less sensitive.

"We found positive and moderate correlations between sensitivity and various mental health problems such as depression, anxiety, post-traumatic stress disor-



der, agoraphobia, and avoidant personality disorder," said Tom Falkenstein, a psychotherapist and a doctoral student at

Queen Mary University of London.

"Our findings suggest that sensitivity should be considered more in clinical

practice, which could be used to improve the diagnosis of conditions," he added.

Falkenstein said that around 31 percent of the general population are considered highly sensitive, and the findings show they are more likely to respond better to some psychological interventions than less sensitive individuals.

For example, people with more sensitive personality traits may be more likely to benefit from treatment plans that involve techniques such as applied relaxation and mindfulness, which can also prevent relapse.

"Therefore, sensitivity should be considered when thinking about treatment plans for mental health conditions. Our work shows it is crucial that the awareness of sensitivity is improved among mental health care professionals, so clinicians and practitioners can recognize the trait in their patients, and tailor treatment to their sensitivity," the researcher said. *IANS*

Covid can accelerate ageing in blood vessels by 5 years in women: Study

NEW DELHI: A Covid-19 infection can accelerate ageing in blood vessels around five years, particularly in women, according to research.

As blood vessels ages, it can make arteries stiffer -- raising the risk of cardiovascular disease, including stroke and heart attack, explained the researchers.

"We know that Covid can directly affect blood vessels. We believe that this may result in what we call early vascular ageing, meaning that your blood vessels are older than your chronological age and you are more susceptible to heart disease," said Professor Rosa Maria Bruno from Université Paris Cité, France.

"If that is happening, we need to identify who is at risk at an early stage to prevent heart attacks and strokes,"

Bruno said.

The study, published in the European Heart Journal, included 2,390 people from 16 different countries (Austria, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Cyprus, France, Greece, Italy, Mexico, Norway, Turkey, the UK, and the US) who were recruited between September 2020 and February 2022.

The results showed that all three groups of patients who had been infected with Covid, including those with mild Covid, had stiffer arteries compared to those who had not been infected.

The effect was greater in women than in men and in people who experienced the persistent symptoms of long Covid, such as shortness of breath and fatigue.

Notably, people who had been vaccinated against Covid generally had arteries that were less stiff than those of the unvaccinated. Over the longer term, the vascular ageing associated with Covid infection seemed to stabilize or improve slightly.

The Professor noted that one reason for the difference between women and men "could be differences in the function of the immune system". *IANS*

Study explains why loss of smell is associated with Alzheimer's disease

NEW DELHI: Brain's immune cells may explain why a fading sense of smell is an early signal for Alzheimer's disease even before cognitive impairments manifest, according to a study.

Researchers at DZNE and Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität München (LMU) in Germany revealed that the brain's im-

mune response seems to fatally attack neuronal fibers crucial for the perception of odors.

These olfactory dysfunctions arise because immune cells of the brain called "microglia" remove connections between two brain regions, namely the olfactory bulb and the locus coeruleus, they noted in the

paper published in the journal Nature Communications.

These findings, based on observations in mice and humans, including analysis of brain tissue and so-called PET scanning, may help to devise ways for early diagnosis and, consequently, early treatment.

"The locus coeruleus regulates a variety of physiological mechanisms. These include, for example, cerebral

blood flow, sleep-wake cycles, and sensory processing. The latter applies, in particular, also to the sense of smell," said Dr. Lars Paeger, a scientist at DZNE and LMU.

"Our study suggests that in early Alzheimer's disease, changes occur in the nerve fibers linking the locus coer-



uleus to the olfactory bulb. These alterations signal to the microglia that affected fibers are defective or superfluous. Consequently, the microglia break them down," Paeger added.

Specifically, the team found evidence of changes in the composition of the membranes of the affected nerve fibers: Phosphatidylserine, a fatty acid that usually occurs inside a neuron's membrane, had been moved to the outside. *IANS*

Godrej Properties' net debt jumps 42 pc in Q1 FY26

Pandey added that the firm has sufficient cash flow from operations and borrowing capacity to support its short-term requirements. *IANS*



Regarding returnable plots, the Chief Minister called for measures that would not inconvenience farmers. He stressed the need to address farmers' concerns without impacting the master plan.

Responding to this, Minister Narayana assured that the issue will be assessed and resolved within a week.

Contractors also informed the Chief Minister that materials such as iron and other supplies brought during the previous government were pilfered, and sand stockpiles meant for construction were removed by past administrators. *IANS*

Israeli Finance Minister to approve 3,000 E1 homes, vows to 'bury' Palestinian state idea

TEL AVIV: Israeli Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich announced plans to advance tenders for the construction of over 3,000 housing units in the contentious E1 settlement area, located between Jerusalem and Ma'ale Adumim in the West Bank, The Times of Israel reported.

Smotrich declared that the move would "bury the idea of a Palestinian state", adding that the plan has the backing of Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu.

The project has been frozen for decades amid fierce opposition from the international community, who fear the new settlement neighborhood would prevent the estab-



Smotrich said in a speech that Netanyahu supports his

move. "He backs me up in everything concerning Judea and Samaria, and is letting me create the revolution," Smotrich said at an event in Ma'ale Adumim organized by the Yesha Council, the umbrella organization representing local authorities in settlements.

Smotrich, who holds a junior ministerial position within the Defense Ministry that gives him significant influence over settlement construction, said the approvals for the long-frozen E1 settlement project are a response to a wave of Western countries that have an-

nounced or floated plans to recognize a Palestinian state at the United Nations next month.

"Today, anyone in the world who tries to recognize a Palestinian state will receive an answer from us on the ground," he declared. "Today, we are writing a historic chapter in the story of the redemption of the people of Israel in their land."

Smotrich boasted that "after 20 years of delays... the traffic jam has been broken [and] the E1 plan is underway," adding that the government is "fulfilling the promise and connecting Ma'ale Adumim with a strategic, security and demographic connection, which ensures our united capital for generations." *ANI*



lishment of a contiguous, viable Palestinian state, as per The Times of Israel.

"Approval of construction plans in E1 buries the idea of a Palestinian state and continues the many steps we are taking on the ground as part of the de facto sovereignty plan that we began implementing with the establishment of the government," Smotrich said in his recent statement.

"After decades of international pressure and freezes, we are breaking conventions and connecting Ma'ale Adumim to Jerusalem. This is Zionism at its best, building, settling, and strengthening our sovereignty in the Land of Israel," said Smotrich, who is also a minister in the Defense Ministry responsible for the West Bank civilian issues.

No future for 'Future City', says KTR on CM Revanth Reddy's dream project

HYDERABAD: Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) working president K.T. Rama Rao has said that there is no future for 'Future City' proposed by Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, as the lands acquired for Hyderabad Pharma City cannot be diverted.

"No Future for this so-called "Future City"! A classic example of what happens when a clueless leader runs the State. Revanth first scrapped Hyderabad Pharma City then floated an imaginary Future City on the same lands. As per the Land Acquisition Act 2013, land acquired for a particular public purpose cannot be diverted for real estate initiatives for the benefit of friends and family," Rama Rao said in a post on 'X' recently while reacting to media reports about legal hurdles for the Chief Minister's ambitious project.

The former minister said he had warned about this two years ago in the state Assembly. "After spending hundreds of crores on PR blitz, today even officials admit serious legal hurdles Public money wasted. Farmers betrayed.

Citizens fooled," he added.

CM Revanth Reddy has been aggressively pushing for Future City, proposed as the fourth city after Hyderabad, Secunderabad and Cyberabad.

"I will develop the city in a great manner that people will remember for 100 or 1000 years in future. Former CM Chandrababu Naidu developed Hi-tech City; YS Rajashekhar Reddy constructed the Outer Ring Road. Quli Qutub Shah laid strong foundation by constructing Charminar. Likewise, my name will also be etched in history forever," the Chief Minister said at the CREDAI property show on August 15.

He also dismissed the allegation of KTR that he floated the idea of Future City for his and his family's benefit.

"Some people are calling Future City a 'Four Brothers City'. You are all my brothers; I am designing it for your benefit. I don't care about others' comments," he told the real estate developers. *IANS*

Rapid redevelopment essential for a slum free Mumbai: CM Fadnavis

MUMBAI: Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis said the implementation of speedy redevelopment is necessary to make Mumbai slum-free.

To make Mumbai slum free, the projects should be completed in a time-bound manner, avoiding delays.

Speaking at an event recently, the Chief Minister said, "If we want to make Mumbai slum-free and carry out redevelopment quickly, we cannot have projects dragging on for decades. Once a project starts, the plot should be readied within a year to a year and a quarter, and the rehabilitation building should be constructed within the next year. Only then will the dream of a slum-free Mumbai come true."

He emphasized that this transformation can be achieved through new ideas, new technologies, and an innovative approach.

CM Fadnavis said that large-scale redevelopment is currently underway in Mumbai. The first phase of

the BDD Chawl redevelopment has been handed over to residents.

He further said that the latest technologies available worldwide should be brought to Mumbai. In the construction sector, such technology now allows an 80-storey building to be built in just 120 days. Major infrastructure projects are also underway in Mumbai.

"The Bandra-Versova Sea Link project is 60 percent complete and will be finished within the next two years. Work is also in progress to extend the sea link to Dahisar, and later to Bhayandar. The Western Expressway currently carries 60 percent of Mumbai's traffic; a parallel connection from the sea link to Bhayandar-Vasai-Virar is being developed and will later be extended to the port. All this will open up the entire northern belt for the real estate industry,"

CM Fadnavis said that when preparing Mumbai's new development plan, the city's diversity and its coastal location meant that many rules, military, naval, and forest regulations would have to be considered. *IANS*



It is svarupa-ananda and not vrtti-gata- ananda.







Chapramari Wildlife Sanctuary: Located at a distance of about 20 km from the Gorumara National Park,

Latpanchore: A small village at the top of a hill top on the Mahanada Wildlife Sanctuary, surrounded by forest and rich in the Cinchona plantation, a British bungalow in the middle of this, which now serves as a forest bungalow.

It is as much vintage as it is heaven like to stay be here. Trekkers trek from here up to Namthing Pokhri. Sunrise from the Aahal Pick is a delight to watch, so soothing and unreal.

BEST TIME TO VISIT DOOARS

Known for having pleasant weather throughout the year, Dooars is best when visited in the winter season, i.e. between September and May. Some visitors prefer visiting the town during the festive days in the winter season to witness the colors, the enthusiasm, excitement and unity in the city celebrated in their unique ways.

HOW TO REACH DOOARS

Bagdogra airport is the nearest to Dooars. It is a small domestic airport with flights running from the major cities of the country. Just 12kms from the town, taxies and buses are available from Bagdogra to Madarihat/ Dooars. www.holidify.com

US Positioning on Crypto Currency has implications for BRICS and South Asia

PARTHA PRATIM MITRA

n recent months policy discussions have focused on the United States' increasingly assertive trade policies and their impact on global supply chains and economic stability. A new dimension in this debate is the rise of US dollar-pegged stablecoins and the digital financial infrastructure that supports them. The Trump administration's promotion of crypto assets and US dollarpegged stablecoins, combined with regulatory moves in Singapore, South Korea and Hong Kong, have generated worldwide interest. Stablecoins are digital tokens pegged to another asset, often a sovereign currency. US dollar-pegged stablecoins are backed one-toone with dollars or liquid dollar assets and are redeemable at lar-pegged tokens without interacting with the US or any banking system. In times of stress, mass redemptions could trigger run on treasuries, destabilizing short-term funding markets, weakening the tools of monetary authorities and potentially spreading shocks across global financial markets. The stablecoin market presently is estimated to be around US\$250 billion, backed by roughly US\$180 billion in US Treasuries and other short-term liquid assets.

The recent legislation called "Guiding and Establishing National Innovation for US Stablecoins of 2025" or the GE-NIUS Act of 2025 marks the beginning of the United States' first major legislative step towards regulating stablecoins. With this

face value despite their occasional deviation from the currency peg. They are considered as near-cash equivalents - programmable, transferable and globally accessible. These tokens are widely used for settling crypto asset trades, facilitating international remittances, an important source of foreign earnings for South Asia and providing a dollar alternative in some developing economies. Their 24/7 transferability, near-instant settlement and low transaction costs also make them attractive for foreign exchange transac-

bill, the US joins a growing list of countries seeking to bring oversight and stability to the rapidly expanding digital asset ecosystem. This act aims to provide clear regulatory framework for the crypto industry.

The risk of the crypto industry comes from the business model which it follows. Such a business model essentially involves the capture of the spread between what the stablecoin issuers pay on their currencies (which is zero interest under the GENIUS Act) and what they can receive in returns when they invest their reserves, just like a bank. Major incentives for stablecoin issuers are prompted by their propensity to invest at least some of their reserves in riskier assets to get higher returns. Such investments could be a major source of vulnerability, particularly when issuers are licensed by state authorities. Critics have pointed out that from a systemic perspective, the GENIUS Act's main shortcoming is its failure to deal effectively with the inherent risk of stablecoin runs when there is a crisis of confidence in the crypto system, because it prevents regulators from prescribing strong capital, liquidity, and other safeguards.

Perceived Challenge from BRICS nations

The GENIUS Act 2025 must be seen in the context of not only establishing the legal legitimacy of the crypto industry but the global context of establishing the reserve status of the US dollar which has been increasingly challenged by certain countries. The BRICS group of nations got directly involved in the US trade war with imposition of high tariffs on imports from Brazil and India, countries that were accused of pursuing "anti-American" policies due to their growing trade relations with China and Russia.[iv] The status of the US dollar as a world reserve currency became an integral part of the trade war discourse with the US President Donald Trump accusing the BRICS nations as trying to replace the dollar with another reserve currency.

In November 2024, BRICS countries held their 16th summit in the Russian city of Kazan. The BRICS group currently consists of 10 member countries: the original five -Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa and five new members admitted in 2024-25 -Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, Saudi Arabia, and the United Arab Emirates, with Indonesia joining in early 2025.






