



tol in a separate car as did Kamala Harris and her successor J.D. Vance.



US President Trump issues executive order to withdraw from WHO

WASHINGTON DC: US President Donald Trump. in a major shocker, cut US ties with the global health agency, World Health Organization (WHO), as he issued an executive order of withdrawing from the orga-

According to the order, the withdrawal was due to the organization mishandling the COVID-19 pandemic and other global health crises.

Trump, who had long been critical of the WHO, had earlier also formally withdrawn the US from the WHO back in July 2020 as the COVID-19 continued to spread.

"The United States noticed its withdrawal from the World Health Organization (WHO) in 2020 due to the organization's mishandling of the COVID-19 pandemic that arose out of Wuhan, China, and other global health crises, its failure to adopt urgently needed reforms, and its inability to demonstrate independence from the inappropriate political influence of WHO member states," the order read.

Additionally, Trump stated that the WHO continues to demand payments from the US that are disproportionate to those required from other countries, criticizing the financial demands, stating that the payments required of the US are significantly higher than those of other nations. ANI

Trump slams China as he pulls US out of Paris climate accord

WASHINGTON: President Donald Trump slammed China as the reason for his withdrawal of the US from the Paris Climate Accord in a significant departure from his announcement in his first term in 2017 when he also blamed India.

"I'm immediately withdrawing from the unfair, onesided Paris Climate Accord rip off the United States will not sabotage our own industries while China pollutes with impunity," Trump told supporters at a sporting arena like you have a wall. Trump administration sued on day 1 over order aiming to end birthright citizenship

WASHINGTON: Hours after President Donald Trump signed an executive order aimed at ending birthright citizenship in the United States, a coalition of civil rights and immigration groups filed a lawsuit challenging the move, setting the stage for a major legal battle.

The executive order signed, directs federal agencies to deny recognition of US citizenship for children born on American soil to parents who are in the country illegally or, on temporary visas, unless one parent is a US citizen or lawful permanent resident.

It states that children born under these circumstances will not be eligible for US citizenship, including passports, starting 30 days from its signing.

The order, which contradicts a long-standing legal consensus that the 14th Amendment of the Constitution guarantees birthright citizenship, has drawn immediate backlash

The American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), several of its state chapters, and other organizations have filed a 17-page lawsuit in federal court in New Hampshire on behalf of immigration rights groups, arguing the order is unconstitutional and illegal.

"For plaintiffs -- organizations with members impacted by the order -- and for families across the country, this order seeks to strip from their children the 'priceless treasure' of citizenship, threatening them with a lifetime of exclusion and fear of deportation from the only country they have ever known," the lawsuit states. *IANS*

"Watching announcements very carefully..." Union Minister Hardeep Puri on Trump's remarks on energy

NEW DELHI: Union Minister for Petroleum and Natural Gas, Hardeep Singh Puri, said, they are watching the announcements made by US President Donald Trump "very carefully" and stressed that more and more energy is coming on the market. He stated that there is no shortage of oil in the world.

Speaking to reporters, Hardeep Singh Puri recalled that one of the former US Presidents had earlier said that they will put more energy on the market, irrespective of the results of the outcome. He noted that there is more oil coming from Guyana, Suriname and Canada.

On being asked about Trump's remarks on energy, he said, "First of all, the announcements made so far, we are watching them very carefully. "I've shared with you that my assessment at that point of time was that America already produces 13 million barrels a day. They'll put at least another 1.4-1.5 million barrels additional on the market, okay. When I went to Brazil, to which one of my colleagues on the panel, they are producing three million barrels a day. They are putting another 140,000 barrels a day on the market additional. There's more oil coming from Guyana, Suriname, Canada. I'm talking about Western hemisphere. So, there is no shortage of oil. What that means is how much oil is available in the marketplace. I have been on record with you many times. I see oil prices reacting to that availability. So, this is one. Secondly, the inauguration has just taken place, some decisions have been taken. Let them come in. You should come and meet me more often for our weekly meetings and then we will discuss," he added. ANI

Ramaswamy planning to run for Ohio governor: Reports

NEW YORK: Vivek Ramaswamy, who was appointed by US President-elect Donald Trump as the co-head of a body to improve government efficiency, is planning to run for governor of Ohio, according to media reports.

USA Today reported recently that according to a source close to him, Ramaswamy will announce his run for governor "shortly".

If elected, he would become the third Indian-American elected governor, after Bobby Jindal in Louisiana and Nikki Haley in South Carolina, all Republicans. The three made unsuccessful bids for the party's presidential nomination.

An avowed anti-Left crusader, Ramaswamy, 39, ran against Trump for the Republican Party's presidential nomination but dropped out to become one of his most vociferous supporters.

Trump appointed him to be the co-head of the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) with Elon Musk after having hinted during the campaign that he may even be considered for Secretary of State.

"He's really smart, and I hope he's going to be involved in our administration," Trump said.

"We can put him in charge of one of these big monsters (in government) and he'll do a better job than anybody you can think of."

At the DOGE, only an advisory body outside the government, Ramaswamy, who has a strong personality and is a multi-millionaire, was overshadowed by Elon, who has a stronger personality, is a multi-billionaire and closer to Trump.

While DOGE's role has to be firmed up, Ramaswamy's

position is even vaguer, and a run for governor gives him

Last week there were reports that Trump recommended that Ramaswamy take the Senate seat vacated by Vice President-elect JD Vance if it was offered to him.

But Ohio Governor Mike DeWine, who appoints an interim Senator, chose Lieutenant Governor Jon Husted who was considered his possible successor.

norship.

Trump won it with a lead of over 11 percent, and Republicans have a commanding majority in both Chambers of the legislature.

Ramaswamy, whose net worth Forbes puts at \$960 million, has a financial advantage in the race as he can himself finance the campaign, unlike his rivals.

He made his fortune first as a biotech entrepreneur and

Ohio's Attorney General Dave Yost and Treasurer Robert Sprague were reported to be preparing to run for the nomination.

The state is overwhelmingly Republican, giving whoever is the party's candidate a smooth path to the governow runs a hedge fund that he co-founded.

In August, Ramaswamy had shown interest in running for both Senator and governor.

In an interview with the Outback website, Ramaswamy said, "Governor is something that people are pushing me for a lot in Ohio. And how could I not consider it?" IANS



Usha Vance is the daughter of Telugu immigrants from India, Radhakrishna "Krish" Chilukuri, an aerospace engineer, and Lakshmi Chilukuri, the provost at the University of California, San Diego.

J.D. Vance and Usha met while they were studying law at Yale University.

J.D. Vance, who came from a broken family with his mother a drug addict, and suffered poverty, credited Usha in his memoir with being his "spirit guide" who helped him navigate the lvy League university and professional life.

Raised by his grandmother, Vance

joined the military to escape the dysfunction of life in Middleton, Ohio, and got his break with admission to Yale, where he said he felt out of place.

He wrote: "In a place that always seemed a little foreign, Usha's presence made me feel at home."

They married in 2014.

After briefly practicing law, J.D. Vance turned to business as a venture capitalist.

Entering politics, he was elected to the Senate in 2022.

Usha Vance is a corporate litigator who left a prestigious law firm after he was named the Vice President candidate.

She worked previously as a clerk for Supreme Court Chief Justice John Roberts and Kavanaugh while he was an appeals court judge.

J.D. Vance also influenced her.

Exploring How Minority Communities Experience Hate and Can Get Support in Rural California

MS briefing on Jan 17 shared per spectives from the California Civil ■ Rights Department, activists, and community leaders on how different ethnic minorities may experience hate in these rural areas, and how the state's antihate initiatives can offer direct support to vulnerable populations. In some parts of predominantly white rural California, ethnic minorities experience racism as an everyday fact of life - from hate speech and school yard bullying to facing discrimination in the workplace, housing, and more. Many report feeling too isolated from and distrustful of the local government to report it. Launched in May 2023, the state's anti-hate hotline and resource network -CA vs Hate - is a new initiative providing a direct response to these concerns and the rise in recent years of reported hate crimes in California, which state data shows have nearly doubled since 2019.

Kevin Kish, Director of the CA Civil Rights Department emphasized the unique role of the hotline. "For the first time

in California's history, we are launching a statewide tool to connect individuals experiencing hate with culturally competent resources". He said the hotline provides legal assistance, counseling, financial support and access to communities across California. Kish said "CA vs Hate" was cre-

counties. "Our mission is to create a California where everyone feels safe, respected and can thrive."



CHICAGO: The American Association of Physicians of Indian Origin (AAPI) organized its first-ever Indo-US Scientific Convention on January 18, 2025, at the Asian Institute of Gastroenterology (AIG) in Hyderabad, India.

The event focused on critical topics such as sudden cardiac death, advancements in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), and the growing Indo-US collaboration in CPR techniques.

Attended by nearly 350 Physician delegates from the United States and India, the Indo-US Scientific Convention, with participation from leading medical professionals, thought leaders, heads of several health industry sectors, and policy-makers, the convention assumes importance, especially in the context of reports of how cardiovascular diseases impact the lives of people of Indian origin.

According to Satheesh Kathula, President, AAPI, "Heart disease is the number one Global Public Health problem. South Asians are at a four-times

greater risk of heart disease than their Western counterparts and have a greater chance of having a heart attack before 50 years of age. Heart attacks strike South Asian Men and Women at younger ages, and as a result, both morbidity and mortality are higher among them compared to any other ethnic group. They tend to develop heart disease ten years earlier than other groups."

Pointing to studies, Dr. Kathula said that almost one in three in this group may die from heart disease before 65 years of age. In India, heart disease remains the number one cause of death.

Common risk factors are smoking and a diet high in sugar, salt, refined grains, and fat. A large number of South Asians appear to have "insulin resistance", a condition in which the body does not utilize insulin efficiently, resulting in Diabetes, which leads to a significant number of heart-related problems. Lack of adequate exercise, stress, and genetic predisposition are also contributing factors.

"The essence of AAPI is education," said Dr. Kathula. "That translates into numerous Medical Education initiatives programs by world academicians from the United States, offering unique opportunities for local medical staff and healthcare professionals to advance leanings and provide the best possible care for the people of India.

"We at AAPI, in keeping with our efforts and initiatives to educate, create awareness, and provide support on disease prevention, are happy to be part of the Cardiovascular Awareness Program. It was truly an enriching experience to be present in person and meeting with the young women and be part of this life-saving mission."

AAPI is hopeful that the scientific convention will serve as a critical means to creating awareness and educating healthcare professionals, First Responders, and community leaders in helping save lives from the deadly cardiovascular disease, especially among the people of Indian origin. Efforts to

raise awareness of heart disease and promote "Healthy Heart" lifestyles are essential.

The speakers at the convention were world-renowned experts, and the sessions were both highly relevant and engaging. Following the lectures, interactive workshops on adult and pediatric cardiac resuscitation took place, allowing for hands-on learning.

Best vegetables for type 2 diabetes

he National Diabetes Statistics Report of 2021 stated that 29.7 mil lion people of all age or 8.9% of the U.S. population had diagnosed diabetes. About 352,000 children and adolescents younger than age 20 years or 35 per 10,000 U.S. youths had diagnosed diabetes. This includes 304,000 with type 1 diabetes. About 1.7 million adults aged 20 years or older-or 5.7% of all U.S. adults with diagnosed diabetes-reported both having type-1 diabetes and using insulin. Around 3.6 million adults aged 20 years or older or 12.3% of all U.S. adults with diagnosed diabetes started using insulin within a year of their diagnosis. In fact, of the 37 million Americans who have diabetes, the vast majority nearly 95% have type 2,

lifestyle. Consuming a diet that contains a range of vegetables and some antioxidants can benefit anyone's health especially for people with type 2 diabetes.

1) Special benefit foods:

Green leafy vegetables, such as kale and spinach contain Alpha-Lipoic acid (ALA) that helps slow down metabolic syndrome, oxidative stress and diabetic neuropathy.

Allium vegetables, such as onion and garlic have N-Acetyl Cysteine (NAC) antioxidants that prevent side effects of drug reactions, toxic chemicals, breaks down excess mucus and even help reduce the risk of diabetic complications.

2) Nitrate-rich vegetables:

Leafy Greens-Arugula, Lettuce, Spinach

Eating foods naturally rich in nitrates may help reduce blood pressure and improve overall circulatory health.

3) Protein-rich vegetables:

Cruciferous-Broccoli, Cauliflower, Brussels Sprouts, Bok Choy, Watercress

Leafy Greens-Spinach, Mustard Greens, Collard Greens

Perennial/Fibrous-Asparagus Herbs-Alfalfa Sprouts

Protein-rich foods help people feel fuller for longer periods, reducing the urge to overeat or snack between meals. Protein also stimulates the release of insulin from the pancreas. In this way, it can help lower blood sugar levels after a meal or snack that combines a protein

etetics recommends 25 grams (g) of fiber per day for females and 38 g for males and this recommendation varies depending on body size, overall health, and other factors.

Why Choose Vegetables?

Eating a range of vegetables can provide the vitamins, minerals, and antioxidants to stay healthy.

The carbohydrates in vegetables provide energy but are less likely to cause a blood sugar spike than those from baked goods and sweet snacks.

Vegetables with a low to moderate GI ranking can help manage blood glucose levels.

Nitrate-rich foods can help lower the risk of cardiovascular disease.

When buying canned foods, choose those without added sugar or salt or drain the liquid before use.

Flavor vegetables with herbs, spices, or low-salt seasonings, drizzle with lemon juice or try a vinegar pepper sauce.

Boil, bake, or grill vegetables or roast them in a little vegetable oil rather than frying them. This will reduce calories and fat intake.

Leave the peel on vegetables when possible to boost the fiber content. When adding high-fiber foods to the diet, introduce them gradually to prevent abdominal discomfort.

Where appropriate, opt for raw vegetables as they contain more nutrients.

Ayurvedic diet chart for diabetics

iabetes is the world's fastest growing chronic condition, according to the World Health Organization (WHO). A metabolic disease occurs when your body either does not make enough insulin or cannot effectively use the insulin it produces. Insulin is a hormone that regulates blood sugar to be stored or used for energy. An estimated 77 million people are living with diabetes in India. Diabetes is not just a disease; it is an epidemic, affecting over 38 million Americans with devastating consequences. Around 1.2 Mil-

eating and weight gain, which can exacerbate diabetes, and consistent physical activity to keep one's metabolism up.

What is a typical diet chart for diabetics?

Early morning

Begin your day with a cup of herbal infusion that is metabolism-boosting herbal drink to kick start your body's metabolism.

How to make the herbal infusion?

Mix a tsp of crushed mulethi (licorice), a bark of cinnamon/ cinnamon powder, three pods of crushed cardamom, a tsp of

the digestion and absorption of the food. There is an old saying: "Eat breakfast like a king; lunch like a prince; and dinner like a pauper." For a diabetic person, 40-60gms of dry cereal mix flour would be sufficient to make breakfast the biggest meal of the day. Syamaka ((Barnyard millet), Kodrava and Uddalaka variety of rice, Godhuma (wheat), Canaka (Hemp), Adhaki (Pigeon pea) and Kulattha (Horse gram) pulse beans are good options for diabetics.

Avoid eating breakfast items that are made using refined flour,

coconut water. This will provide your body with essential proteins for the day.

Lunch

A diabetes diet chart for lunch thali consists of steamed red rice or Saamai rice, a bowl of horse gram dal or dal/lentil soup, or one bowl of steamed legumes and one bowl of steamed veggie, and a glass of buttermilk or spiced tea. Avoid drinking coffee or soda. This is enough to provide the needed calories as well as satiate the diabetic appetite. The ideal portion size is:

Make sure to avoid eating


broken wheat porridge with buttermilk and a medium-sized bowl of steamed veggies with lentil soup or salad. Alternatively, you can have roti with sumptuous veg curries.

What are the dos and don'ts to keep in mind?

Eat mostly vegetarian/vegan foods. If you currently eat a meat-based diet, aim to reduce the quantity of meat you consume.

Avoid eating leftovers and cold foods. Always choose to eat freshly prepared meals and warm foods.

lion Americans are diagnosed each year and 11.6% of Americans had diabetes in 2023. The number is expected to grow by over 100% by 2030. In Ayurveda, poor digestion is considered the primary cause of diabetes, which is referred to as 'Madhumey.'

Eating a healthy diet will help you keep your blood sugar levels under control, help to reduce the chances of weight gain, manage your diabetes and improve overall health. People with diabetes are recommended to follow a diet rich in nutrients and low in fat and calories. Ayurveda also suggests limiting or avoiding the intake of sweets and simple carbohydrates and including more green and leafy vegetables. The meal plan focuses on incorporating low-glycemic-index foods, highfiber vegetables, whole grains, lean proteins, as well as healthy fats that have a minimal impact on blood glucose levels. The diabetes diet plan also emphasizes portion control to prevent overcrushed coriander seeds in a glass. Pour a sufficient quantity of very hot boiling water in to the glass and boil the spices until they are infused in the water. Add a teaspoon of honey and drink this mixture on empty stomach to boost your metabolism. The recommended dosage of this herbal

Alternatively, you can start the day with an Amla drink - all you need to do is mix Amla powder or add freshly crushed Amla paste to the water and consume the drink. Adhere to this key step and reap its long-term benefits.

infusion is 150 300ml.

Breakfast

Foods rich in insoluble fiber like whole cereals (Bajra, Ragi, or Maize/Corn) are ideal breakfast items for a diabetic. You can have pancakes, steamed Idlis, Paddu, or Dosas or various versions of rotis made from cereals/grains. Adding spices like mint, coriander, tomato, herbal chutneys, Amla, or Lemon and Ginger pickles can further improve

refined sugar and white rice.

Mid-morning snack

While you do not need to consume a mid-morning snack, it is best you opt for something healthy if you start to feel hungry around this time. An ideal mid-morning snack could be a bowl (60gms) of whole protein like steamed and spiced sprouts of Canaka, Adhaki, Kulattha, Moong, Mataki, Chickpea beans sprinkled with lemon juice and salt or green and red chutney or cut fruits, or vegetable salad without fatty dressings or tender

white rice; in its place, you can eat red rice, brown rice or broken wheat.

Evening

Drink a glass [100ml] of warm spiced light mulethi (licorice root) milk tea in the evening. This will help digest the previous meal while supporting the transition of digestive metabolism from day to evening. If you are hungry, eat a bowl of soup or nuts.

Dinner

Wind up your day with a light meal. The ideal dinner menu includes a bowl of oats porridge/ Avoid consuming processed foods.

Make sure every meal includes all six tastes, including sour, sweet, bitter, salty, pungent and astringent.

Eat until you are satisfied; do not make the mistake of overstuffing yourself.

Semicon India scheme to create 85,000 jobs: Center

NEW DELHI: In the run-up to the Union Budget 2025-26 to be presented on February 1, the Union Finance Ministry highlighted the achievements of the government's policies in pushing up investments and employment through the semiconductor program and the PLI scheme for electronic goods manufacturing.

The ministry stated, "The Scheme for 'Program for development of Semiconductors and Display Manufacturing Ecosystem' aims to provide attractive incentive support to semiconductor packaging and semiconductor designing companies."

The Semicon India Program, approved on December 15, 2021, has made significant strides in strengthening India's position in the global semiconductor industry. Under the program, the government has approved five semiconductor projects and supported 16 semiconductor design companies. These initiatives are expected to attract a cumulative investment of Rs 1.52 lakh crore

The projects are expected to generate around 25,000 advanced technology direct jobs and an additional 60,000 indirect jobs marking a significant milestone in boosting India's technological workforce.

The program is designed to provide attractive incentives to companies involved in semiconductor packaging and designing, aiming to establish India as a global hub for semiconductors and display manufacturing. *IANS*

India, Belgium to deepen trade and investment ties: Piyush Goyal

NEW DELHI: Union Minister for Commerce and Industry Piyush Goyal and Bernard Quintin, Belgian Minister of Foreign Affairs, European Affairs and Foreign Trade, held bilateral talks in Brussels to boost trade and investment ties across the spectrum, it was recently announced.

The meeting reinforced the longstanding relationship between India and Belgium, built on shared values of democracy, rule of law and independent judiciary, according to a statement by Ministry of Commerce and Industry.

The two leaders discussed ways to expand economic cooperation, and explored new avenues to advance this partnership.

"We had fruitful discussions on the upcoming Belgian Economic Mission to India and explored avenues to deepen mutual trade and investment ties, with a focus on sustainable technologies, semiconductors, gems and jewelry, healthcare, and agricultural products," Goyal posted on X social media platform.

Both the leaders acknowledged Belgium's significant reliance on foreign trade and India's dynamic, growing economy as key factors for leveraging mutual opportunities

"Recognizing the potential of trade as a cornerstone of their partnership, they emphasized the importance of diversifying trade relations and deepening economic diplomacy to achieve sustainable growth," according to the ministry.

The leaders also discussed the progress of the EU-India Free Trade Agreement (FTA) negotiations and emphasized the importance of prioritizing trade issues to streamline negotiations and strengthen economic relations.

The India-Belgium trade is estimated at over \$15.07 billion in 2023-2024 while foreign direct investments



(FDIs) from Belgium into India was estimated at over \$3.94 billion.

Emerging sectors such as renewable energy, life sciences, infrastructure, digital technologies, and food products were highlighted as key areas of collaboration.

Belgium recognized the importance of engaging with India as a strategic partner to diversify its trade relationships. Regulatory barriers, particularly in the approval processes for pharmaceuticals and agro-products, were also discussed, with both sides agreeing to tackle these challenges through continuous dialogue.

The meeting concluded with a commitment to establish stronger mechanisms for resolving trade issues. Both leaders affirmed their dedication to fostering a robust and

mutually beneficial trade partnership.

"This high-level engagement marks a significant step in advancing India-Belgium trade relations, strengthening their shared vision for economic growth and sustainable development," the ministry noted. *IANS*

Trump threatens 25% tariffs on Mexico and Canada to raise prices for Americans

WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump said in an Oval Office signing ceremony on Monday that his administration will impose 25 percent tariffs on Mexico and Canada on February 1, an extraordinary change in North American trade policy that could raise prices for American consumers.

Trump still outlined his broader trade policy for his second term in an executive action. But that action - described by sources as a "placeholder" -- doesn't institute the new global tariffs that Trump promised on Day One.

As a candidate, Trump proposed sweeping and across-the-board tariffs: up to 20 percent on imports from all countries, with a 25 percent tax on goods from Mexico and Canada, plus a punishing 60 percent levy on goods from China. He also pledged to use tariffs as a negotiating tool on other countries, including, for example, Denmark - putting pressure on the European nation to give control of Greenland to the United States.

Asked on Monday at an Oval Office signing ceremony about tariffs on China, Trump noted extensive tariffs he imposed during his first administration were still in effect after former President Joe Biden largely left them in place.

And on universal tariffs, Trump punted, saying, "We may, but we're not ready for that just yet." *IANS*


"It would have never happened on my

Marco Rubio confirmed as Secretary of State, first Trump Cabinet official to be approved

WASHINGTON: The Senate voted on Monday to confirm Marco Rubio as President Donald Trump's Secretary of State, the first high-level Cabinet official for the new administration to be approved by the Chamber, media reported.

The confirmation vote took place just hours after Trump was sworn in as President, CNN reported.

Rubio has served as a Republican Senator from Florida since 2011, and his nomination drew strong support from several Senate Democrats, who called their colleague highly qualified for the role.

Rubio went from Trump's adversary to ally in recent years in a remarkable political turnaround. Now, he will play a key role as a high-ranking official in Trump's new administration, CNN reported.

After his failed GOP presidential primary bid in 2016, Rubio sharpened his foreign policy credentials as the leading Republican on the Senate Intelligence Committee, while building relationships in his party and across the aisle.

Florida Republican Governor Ron DeSantis has named state Attorney General Ashley Moody to fill the seat set to be vacated by Rubio.

Rubio's nomination received a warm

reception from many Senate Democrats. During his confirmation hearing, New Hampshire Senator Jeanne Shaheen, the top Democrat on the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, called Rubio "wellqualified to serve as Secretary of State".

During questions from Senators, Rubio voiced his support for NATO -- as well as a bipartisan law he co-sponsored that states that the US cannot withdraw from the alliance without Senate approval or an act of Congress.

Rubio also talked about the need for the US to take a strong stance with respect to China during his confirmation hearing, calling the Chinese Communist Party a "potent" and "dangerous" adversary.

"They're a technological adversary and competitor, an industrial competitor, an economic competitor, geopolitical competitor, a scientific competitor now, in every realm, it's an extraordinary challenge and one that I believe will define the 21st century," Rubio said.

"We've allowed them to get away with things, and frankly the Chinese did what any country in the world would do given these opportunities, they took advantage of it, so now we're dealing with the ramifications of it," he said.

"Much of what we need to do to confront China is here at home. It's not just abroad, it's also here at home," he said.

"We have to rebuild our domestic industrial capacity, and we have to make sure the United States is not reliant on any single other nation for any of our critical supply chains." IANS

Challenges to Xi Jinping, grow from Party, people and PLA

HONG KONG: Chairman Xi Jinping once looked supreme, unimpeachable and irreproachable. He was perched high upon a pedestal he and the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) erected after he became supremo in 2012.

At first, he could do no wrong, as China's economy and military might inexorably grow. However, a lot has happened since then, and the gloss of his aura has rubbed off and is now tarnished.

Much of the reason for that has been Xi's poor handling of the COVID-19 pandemic, increasingly restrictive surveillance and control over the minutest aspect of Chinese society, unstinting support for tsar Vladimir Putin and his war machine, and his failed economic policies.

Consider too that Xi and a militant CCP have done nothing to endear themselves to other nations - as China grabbed territory in India and the South China Sea, tightened the screws against Taiwan, trampled on human rights in Xinjiang, and subjugated Hong Kong. He has rubbed neighbors up the wrong way and alarmed Europe and the US.

The People's Liberation Army (PLA) has been complicit in all manner of sabre-rattling activities and in bullying others smaller than themselves. Yet the PLA is in a degree of disarray, wracked by scandal, corruption and political interference. Commander-in-chief Xi is not filled with confidence in his armed forces.

Furthermore, the PLA seems to be reacting somewhat to Xi's constant remonstrations and "meddling" with the CCP's armed wing. As an example, the PLA Daily recently championed the virtues of collective leadership in an article published on December 9, 2024.

Such a plea was a direct insult to Xi, who unceremoniously scrapped recent CCP practice by elevating himself far above anyone else in the hierarchy and rolling back all the advantages that collective leadership provided in re-

cent decades.

When Xi came to power, he insisted that all decisions should "rely on a single voice of authority," something the PLA seems now to be agitating against. Amidst such unfavorable conditions

at home and abroad, opposition forces are slowly stirring, although, of course, the country's Orwellian security apparatus prevents anything from breaking out into the open, at least for now.

Willy Wo-Lap Lam, a Hong Kong scholar who writes for The Jamestown Foundation think-tank in the USA, believes Xi is in trouble. Indeed, Lam has identified four key opposition groups against Xi: retired Politburo Standing Committee members; fellow princelings; some military top brass;

and some in China's middle class.

Lam noted: "As a result, his ability to shape policy in the financial, foreign affairs and other arenas has been truncated. It might be far-fetched to speculate that Xi, the so-called 'eternal core of the party', might be driven out of office this year, but it is crucial to understand who

his enemies are and how they challenge the commander-in-chief."

'Welcome home', Biden tells Trump during White House visit

WASHINGTON: Outgoing President Joe Biden welcomed President-elect Donald Trump to the White House for a traditional tea ceremony with two words: "Welcome home", according to media reports.

Biden and first lady Jill Biden received President-elect

Trump and Melania Trump for a brief ceremony after which they would leave together for the US Capitol where the incoming President will be administered the oath of office by Chief Justice John Roberts.

Guests for the swearing-in had begun arriving at the Capitol Rotunda where the ceremony will take place; indoors instead of the traditional

venue outside. This will only be the second instance of the swearing-in taking place indoors; the last time was in 1985 when President Ronald Reagan took the oath for his

Trump's return to the White House is also only the second time for an American President to serve two non-consecutive terms. The first was Grover Cleveland at the end of the 19th century.

The swearing-in will be attended by Trump's nominees to the cabinet, such as Marco Rubio for secretary of state, who is expected to be the first to be confirmed.

President-elect Trump the inauguration proceedings by attending a private service at St John's Church with the incoming first lady Melania Trump, Vice-President-elect JD Vance and wife Usha Vance and some members of

the cabinet.

No TV cameras were allowed inside but the Trump inauguration team released pictures from inside that showed other attendees including Trump's sons Barron Trump, Don Trump Jr, Eric Trump and his wife Lara Trump, Ivanka Trump and her husband Jared Kushner.

Also among Trump's guests were Meta CEO Mark Zuckerberg, Amazon's Jeff Bezos, Apple's Tim Cook, Tesla and Space X's Elon Musk, and Google's Sundar Pichai. They would go on to also attend the swearing-in ceremony in the Capitol Rotunda.

Former President Bill Clinton and his wife Hillary Clinton, former President George W Bush and his wife Laura Bush, and former President Barack Obama minus his wife Michelle Obama will attend the oath-taking ceremony as is the tradition, which was broken by President Trump who skipped Biden's inauguration in 2021. WHO regrets US announcement to withdraw, hopes for reconsideration

WHO plays a crucial role in protecting the health and security of the world's people, including Americans, by addressing the root causes of disease, building stronger health systems, and detecting, preventing and responding to health emergencies, including disease outbreaks, often in dangerous places where others cannot go." Cardiovascular risk underestimated for people in HIV, finds global study

NEW YORK: A team of US researchers has found that for people with HIV, current risk models underestimated cardiovascular events in both women and black men in high-income countries

Cardiovascular disease is the leading cause of morbidity and mortality globally, posing a particularly significant threat to people with HIV (PWH), according to new study published in the journal Lancet HIV.

Previous studies have called into question whether these commonly used prediction models perform well among people with HIV, and there remains a gap in understanding of what these scores mean for PWH in lowand middle-income countries (LMICs).

Researchers from Massachusetts General Hospital, a founding member of the Mass General Brigham healthcare system, in collaboration with an international team of investigators, conducted a study to evaluate how well existing atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease (ASCVD) risk estimates could be used to predict cardiovascular outcomes in global populations with HIV. Study shows fatty muscles raise heart disease risk regardless of BMI

NEW DELHI: People with pockets of fat hidden inside their muscles are at a higher risk of dying or being hospitalized from a heart attack or heart failure, regardless of their body mass index, according to recent report.

The new study, published in the European Heart Journal, adds evidence that existing measures, such as body mass index (BMI) or waist circumference, are not adequate to evaluate the risk of heart disease accurately for all people.

The study showed that people with higher amounts of fat stored in their muscles were more likely to have damage to the tiny blood vessels that serve the heart (coronary microvascular dysfunction or CMD). They were also more likely to die or be hospitalized for heart disease.

People who had high levels of

intermuscular fat and evidence of CMD were at an especially high risk of death, heart attack, and heart failure. "Knowing that intermuscular fat raises the risk of heart disease gives us another of fat and muscle-modifying incretin-based therapies, including the new class of glucagon-like peptide-1 receptor agonists," said Professor Viviany Taqueti, Director of the Cardiac Stress

These findings could be particularly important for understanding the heart health effects

Laboratory at Brigham and Women's Hospital, US.

The study analyzed muscle and different types of fat in 669 people to understand how body composition can influence the small blood vessels or 'microcirculation' of the heart, as well as the future risk of heart failure, heart attack, and death.

These were followed up for around six years. Besides checking how well their hearts were functioning, the team also used CT scans to analyze each patient's body composition, measuring the amounts and location of fat and muscle in a section of their torso.

Further, the team calculated the ratio of intermuscular fat to total muscle plus fat -- a measurement they called the fatty muscle fraction. For every 1 percent increase in fatty muscle fraction, there was a 2 percent increase in the risk of CMD and a 7 percent increased risk of future serious heart disease, regardless of other known risk factors and body mass index.

On the other hand, people with higher amounts of lean muscle had a lower risk. Fat stored under the skin (subcutaneous fat) did not increase the risk.

"Compared to subcutaneous fat, fat stored in muscles may be contributing to inflammation and altered glucose metabolism, leading to insulin resistance and metabolic syndrome.

In turn, these chronic insults can cause damage to blood vessels, including those that supply the heart, and the heart muscle itself," Professor Taqueti said.

The team is assessing the impact of treatment strategies including exercise, nutrition, weight-loss drugs, or surgery, on body composition and metabolic heart disease, to help lower the risk for people with fatty muscles. *IANS*



Authorities seal water spring in J&K's Rajouri after 17th villager dies

JAMMU: Authorities said they have sealed a water spring in Budhal village of Jammu and Kashmir's Rajouri district after the 17th victim succumbed to the mysterious disease.

Yasmeen Kousar, the 6th child of Mohammad Aslam of Budhal village, died last week Sunday in the SMGS hospital in Jammu city.

Earlier, Yasmeen's five siblings were killed by the mysterious disease about which the doctors and the administration seem to be clueless even after more than a month.

On December 8 last year, this mysterious disease claimed its first victim in Budhal village. All 17 victims of this disease in Budhal village of Kotranka sub-division in Rajouri belong to just three families.

Samples tested at premier laboratories inside and outside the union territory have returned negative results for any viral or bacterial infection although the

presence of some toxins has been confirmed in the analyzed samples.

Officials said that authorities have sealed a



spring in the affected area after its water tested positive for some pesticides and insecticides.

Additional Deputy Commissioner (Kotranka subdivision) ordered the spring to be sealed and a round-the-clock deployment of two to three security personnel at the water source in Budhal village to ensure that nobody uses water from this source.

"Whereas, the samples of water taken from the spring ('bawli') of village Badhaal have been tested positive for some pesticides or insecticides. The said 'bawli' has been blocked by PHE (public health engineering department), Jal Shakti division, Rajouri, and sealed by the magistrate concerned," the Additional Deputy Commissioner said in the order.

"There is an apprehension that the tribal population of the village may collect the flowing water of this spring stealthily. Therefore, tehsildar, Khawas, shall ensure that no villager must use the water from this spring in any case," the order said.

The SHO Kandi has been directed to depute two to three security personnel round-the-clock at the 'Bawli' spring to prevent the use of its water. "The matter is most urgent in the interest of public health and safety," he said.

Seventeen people from three families related to each other have died under mysterious circumstances in the village since December 7. The dead include 13 children aged between three and 15.

An inter-ministerial team constituted on the orders of Union Home Minister Amit Shah reached Budhal to investigate the cause of the disaster while police have filed an SIT to probe any criminal angle. *IANS*

Study decodes how grey matter in mothers' brains undergoes changes during pregnancy

NEW DELHI: A new research shows that 94 percent of the grey matter in the brains of mothers undergoes changes during pregnancy.

The team from Universitat Autonoma de Barcelona (UAB) found that there is a reduction and partial recovery of almost 5 percent of grey matter in 94 percent of the total grey matter volume of the brain, especially in regions linked to social cognition.

The study analyzed the brains of women during pregnancy for the first time using neuro-imaging techniques.

The study, published in the journal Nature Communications, included non-pregnant mothers, whose partners were pregnant, to distinguish biological effects from those caused by the experience of being a mother.

Researchers from UAB, the Gregorio Maranon Health Research Institute and the Hospital del Mar Research Institute together, with other prestigious international institutions, were part of the study.

The findings reveal a dynamic trajectory in the brain during pregnancy and postpar-

tum, significantly linked to the steroid hormone fluctuations inherent to pregnancy, and to the psychological well-being of the mothers.

The findings revealed that, during the first pregnancy, gray matter volume in the brain is reduced by up to 4.9 percent, with a partial recovery during the postpartum period.

"These changes are observed in 94 percent of the brain, being particularly prominent in regions linked to social cognition," said the study.

The study also demonstrated, for the first time, that the evolution of these morphological changes in the brain is associated with fluctuations in two estrogens hormones that increase exponentially during pregnancy and return to basal levels after delivery.

The researchers observed that a greater increase and subsequent decrease in estrogen levels is associated with a greater decrease and subsequent recovery of brain grey matter volume. *IANS*

Foreign entities lead real estate institutional investments in India with 54 pc share

NEW DELHI: Foreign investors dominated institutional investments in the real estate sector in India with 54 percent share in 2024, accounting for \$3.7 billion, according to recent

Despite a reduction in share, investments increased by 36 percent in value terms, according to a Vestian Research re-

Domestic investors followed the same trend as their share reduced to 30 percent in 2024 from 35 percent in the previous year, despite an increase of 36 percent in value terms during the same period, the report states.

Interestingly, co-investments gained traction in 2024 as foreign investors relied on the local expertise of domestic investors amid prevailing macroeconomic uncertainty.

Co-investment accounted for 16 percent of the total investments received in 2024, registerthe report pointed out.

Institutional investments reached \$6.8 billion in 2024, registering an annual increase of 61 percent.

Despite significant investments in the industrial and warehousing sector, commercial assets continued to dominate with 35 percent share.

"As demand for GCCs is growing in India, office spaces are expected to witness renewed demand," the report mentioned.

On the other hand, the residential sector reported investments worth \$2 billion, accounting for 30 percent of the total investments received in 2024.

year. Similarly, the industrial and warehousing sector witnessed an annual increase of 203 percent with a rise in share from 15 percent in 2023 to 28 percent in 2024.



Bangladeshi angle in Saif Ali Khan stabbing case raises political din

NEW DELHI: The political landscape has intensified following the arrest of the accused in the stabbing case of Bollywood actor Saif Ali Khan. The Mumbai Police detained Mohammad Shariful Islam Shehzad last week Sunday morning in Thane, Maharashtra, and suspect he may be a Bangladeshi national, igniting allegations and counteraccusations between political parties.

Dikshit Gedam, DCP, Crime Branch Mumbai, confirmed the arrest of Shehzad, who reportedly attacked Saif Ali Khan at his Bandra residence last week.

"There is primary evidence to suggest the accused is a Bangladeshi. He lacks valid Indian documentation, and some seizures indicate he may not be an Indian citizen," said Gedam during a press conference.

According to the police, Shehzad, aged 30, entered Saif Ali Khan's home with the intent to rob. The actor sustained six stab wounds during a struggle with the intruder and underwent multiple surgeries at Mumbai's Lilavati Hospital. He is now recovering and out of danger.

The arrest has triggered sharp political exchanges. BJP National General Secretary Tarun Chugh lauded the swift action of the Mumbai Police and accused opposition parties of supporting illegal immigration. *IANS*

'Dictator for a day': Immigration, petroleum exploration to top Trump's agenda

NEW YORK: Campaigning for the US President, Donald Trump brandished several promises and threats for his Day one in office when he said he would be a "dictator" for a day.

He and his aides have prepared a slew of executive orders, and he is expected to sign them at two ceremonies, one at the Capitol after his Monday swearing-in, and another later at the Oval Office.

Media reports have suggested that there could be as many as 100 orders.

Immigration and opening up petroleum and gas extraction would be at the top of his Day One agenda, taking care of two issues that were the voters' concerns.

On the international front, one of his demands, ceasefire and hostage release in Gaza, went into effect just before his threat that there will be "all hell to pay" if it is not sorted out before his inauguration.

Ending the Ukraine War was another priority, and he had boasted that it would end within 24 hours of taking office or before that





What Trump 2.0 means for Asia: Need to balance national priorities with collaborative efforts **M A HOSSAIN**

he inauguration of Donald Trump as the 47th president of the United States on January 20, 2025, signals a pivotal moment for global geopolitics. With a renewed "America First" agenda, Trump's administration is poised to reshape U.S. foreign and economic policies, particularly in Asia. The implications for the Indo-Pacific and South Asia are profound. spanning trade, security, and regional partnerships.

Central to Trump's Asia policy is his determination to counter China's growing influence. His administration's hawkish appointments, such as Marco Rubio as Secretary of State and Mike Waltz as National Security Advisor, reflect this focus. Both are staunch critics of Beijing and emphasize the need for stronger U.S. alliances in Asia.

Rubio's legislative efforts to sanction China for human rights abuses and security threats align with Trump's vision of curbing Beijing's dominance. Waltz advocates redirecting U.S. resources to counter China's assertiveness, reinforcing military modernization and strategic cooperation with allies.

For South Asia, these policies present both challenges and opportunities. Bangladesh, for example, risks significant losses in its ready-made garment (RMG) sector, which relies heavily on exports to the U.S. A 5% tariff increase on Bangladeshi goods could translate into nearly half a billion dollars in annual losses. India, while benefiting from its strategic role in the Indo-Pacific, also faces hurdles as tighter U.S. immigration policies impact remittance flows and student exchanges.

Trump's approach could reshape global supply chains, encouraging manufacturers to relocate from China to alternative destinations like Vietnam, India, and Thailand. However, competition for foreign direct investment (FDI) remains fierce, with countries like Vietnam outperforming Bangladesh in infrastructure and regulatory efficiency.

Defense and alliance management

Military modernization and alliance cohesion are critical components of Trump's Asia strategy. By addressing inefficiencies in defense acquisition, the administration

However, achieving these objectives reguires balancing economic and security priorities. For instance, nations like Japan and South Korea face pressure to increase defense spending and adopt policies aligned with Trump's strategic goals. Similarly, Southeast Asian nations such as Vietnam and the Philippines remain cautious, weighing the benefits of U.S. support against the risks of antagonizing China.

Economic nationalism and Its ripple

Trump's second term will likely intensify his protectionist economic policies. His focus on tariffs, renegotiated trade agreements, and domestic manufacturing aligns with his broader vision of economic nationalism. The administration's proposed 60% tariffs on Chinese imports and reciprocal trade levies highlight a confrontational seeks to enhance U.S. military readiness and deter regional threats.

South Korea's domestic political instability, exemplified by the impeachment of President Yoon Suk

Yeol, poses a challenge for Washington. Balancing demands for increased defense contributions with support for South Korea's democratic stability will require diplomatic finesse. Similarly, Japan faces pressure to align its defense policies with Trump's vision, despite internal political hurdles.

In addition to bilateral ties, Trump's emphasis on reforming multilateral institutions like the United Nations underscores his goal of strengthening U.S. influence. Proposals to grant permanent Security Council representation to allies such as Japan and Germany aim to dilute the power of adversaries like China and Russia while bolstering democratic alliances.

what is it to cease breathing, but to free the breath from its restless tides, that it may rise and expand and seek God unencumbered?



An Alliance of IITs to tackle the global climate crisis?

he wildfires raging in Southern California are far from simple wake-up calls. They are deafening sirens of scores of ambulances rushing, carrying the parts of our planet with severe burns. Indeed, this part of the planet is known for the extreme riches of Silicon Valley and Hollywood. But now it is more known for its chronic wildfire infernos. During the 2020 wildfire season alone, over 8,100 fires contributed to the burning of nearly 4.5 million acres of land. And the new year of 2025 has been greeted with the most cruel, deadly and horrific wildfires that razed not only forests but also palatial homes of Hollywood celebrities.

Reducing global emissions

The only way out as recommended by the UN's Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) is to reduce the human-induced global emissions of greenhouse gases by 43 percent by 2030 as compared to the emissions of 2019 and 100 percent (net zero) by 2050. This has been agreed and adopted as a decision in UNFCCC's Paris Climate Agreement of 2015. It may sound very parochial, but know-

The wildfires around Los Angeles are living example of an apocalyptic scenario where humans are all in the same boat that is sinking.

Around 150,000 IIT alumni reside in this part of the world. Many of them are techno-firebrands known to bring breakthroughs in transformative digital technologies for the last more than half a century. They are the trendsetters in cutting-edge technologies. Can they not catalyze their responses, technologies and solutions to find a solution to the climate crisis?

Climate Crisis is now increasingly recognized as an existential threat followed by the sixth extinction of life on the planet. The most disturbing scenario that the world is already experiencing is that no one, whether the super rich of Hollywood or

ing the DNA of the cream of India's tech-oriented youth, it is but natural for me to think if IIT alumni around the world and particularly students in all 23 IITs across India can provide a way out?

Just before the start of wildfires in Southern California, students, faculty and alumni of 6 IITs came together in IIT Bombay in December 2024 to explore the future of the planet amidst the climate crisis. They discussed technologies as well as policies needed for a Net Zero India. I immediately recalled the interesting conference held earlier in October 2024 in Southern California organized by the IIT alumni association. Its theme was "AI & Us: Today, Tomorrow and Beyond".

In the context of the rampaging wildfires scorching southern California, I strongly felt that Al

in the context of climate change is not Artificial Intelligence but it connotes Alliance of IITs! Ideation, development and speeding up of transformative technologies are in the DNA of individual IITs. Transition away from fossil fuel in just manner' can be achieved by deploying each of IIT's potential and gelling it into a collaborative strategy to enhance the scale and speed of climate mitigation and climate resilience. Such an alliance is needed to realize doubling the energy efficiency and tripling the renewable energy from the present base as agreed in COP28 in Dubai. Further, recognizing how AI might go rogue like the current wildfires around the planet including in sub-Himalayan states of India, an Alliance of IITs is not just an idea but also the need of the time.

This is precisely what IITs have started moving and focusing towards through the innovative process of making their campuses net zero. Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi has declared that "India is moving forward on the subject of climate with great courage and unprecedented ambition that by the year 2070, India will achieve the target of Net Zero carbon emission".

Net-zero campuses

It is now clear that the social and economic benefits of carbon-neutral net zero are beyond imagination. Cost of solar-generated electricity has come down by more than 90 percent over the last 10 years. In fact it is now cheaper than electricity generated by thermal power plants.

No president in US history has generated so much controversy and anxiety than Donald Trump. He has generated a lot of discussion globally, both in anticipation and with trepidation. Not only has he been elected with a clear majority, his confidence to achieve what he has been promising all along, may bring major changes across the world. With the deep state actively working overtime, Trump will have his hands full in the next several months tackling domestic challenges. But he seems determined not to be bogged down by them. Besides his Make America Great Again (MAGA) agenda, Trump is actively cultivating a world leadership that shares his conservative vision and, is willing to challenge deep state assets in their respective countries.

The US State Department's records of the last 150 years show no instance of any foreign leader ever attending the oath ceremony of a US president. Trump has broken that convention and invited several world leaders. The ceremony committee's choice of leaders, invited for the January 20 ceremony, speaks volumes about the disruption that Trump would cause in Europe and elsewhere.

World leaders invited include surprising choices like President Xi Jinping of China, who has deputed his Vice President Han Zheng to attend. While leaders of important European countries like Germany, France and the UK were ignored, the Prime Minister of Italy, Georgia Meloni and Prime Minister of Hungary, Viktor Orban received invitations. Trump's choice of inviting Nigel Farage, a UK conservative politician and Eric Zemmour, a French conservative leader, besides Meloni and Orban, indicates his intention to end the liberal dominance of European politics and promote conservative leadership. The foreign ministers of India and Japan too received invitations, which suggest Trump will continue to work along with Quad country partners.

Trump's major agendas will definitely be to put in place the deportation of illegal immigrants first, and then deal with China, India and Europe on tariff issues. He will have to deliver what he has been promising all along. In the meantime one can only wait and watch.







