In his remarks from onboard the Dragon spacecraft, Shukla said, "Namaskar, my dear countrymen, what a ride. We are back in the space once again after 41 years. It's an amazing ride. ideshare services like Uber and Lyft have fundamentally changed the way we commute. However, when accidents occur, the legal landscape can be anything but straightforward. If you're injured as a passenger-or struck by-a rideshare vehicle, one of the most pressing questions is: who bears responsibility?

WHO CAN BE HELD LIABLE?

In any auto accident, liability depends on who was at fault. Rideshare crashes introduce additional complexity due to the unique business structure of companies like Uber and Lyft, and the multiple insurance policies that may come into play.

THE RIDESHARE DRIVER

If the Uber or Lyft driver is to blame, they bear primary responsibility. However, because drivers are classified as indepen-

dent contractors rather than employees, rideshare companies often attempt to distance themselves from direct liability.

THE RIDESHARE COMPANY (UBER/LYFT)

The good news is that Uber and Lyft both maintain \$1 million in liability coverage for accidents that occur while a driver is either transporting a passenger or en route to pick one up. However, this policy is active only during those phases. If the app is off or the driver is awaiting a request, the company's coverage drops significantly-or disappears entirely.

ANOTHER DRIVER

If a third party caused the crash, their personal auto insurance is typically the first source of compensation. That said, if the at-fault driver is underinsured or uninsured, Uber or Lyft's uninsured/underinsured motorist (UM/UIM) coverage may help make up the shortfall.

WHAT IF YOU'RE A PEDESTRIAN OR CYCLIST HIT BY A RIDESHARE VEHICLE?

Rideshare drivers are subject to the same rules of the road as everyone else. If they strike a pedestrian or cyclist while off-duty, their personal auto policy is on the hook. But if they're actively on the app and accepting rides, Uber or Lyft's commercial coverage can significantly bolster compensation.


WHY RIDESHARE CLAIMS ARE SO COM-

The most difficult aspect of these cases is establishing the status of the driver at the time of the incident. Was the app on or off? Was the driver waiting for a fare, heading to pick one up, or already transporting a passenger? Insurance companies often attempt to exploit this ambiguity to minimize or deny claims. The Axiom Mission 4 of Ax-4, launched aboard a SpaceX Dragon spacecraft from Launch Complex 39A at NASA's Kennedy Space Centre in Florida at 2:31 am Eastern Time (12 Noon IST).

In his remarks from onboard the Dragon spacecraft, Shukla said, "Namaskar, my dear countrymen, what a ride. We are back in the space once again after 41 years. It's an amazing ride. We are revolving around the Earth at a speed of 7.5 kilometers per second. The Tiranga embossed on my shoulders tells me that I am with all of you. This journey of mine is not a beginning to the International Space Station (ISS) but to India's Human Space Program. I want all of you to be part of this journey. Your chest, too, should swell with pride. You all also show excitement. Together, let's initiate India's Human Space Program. Jai Hind! Jai Bharat!"

For Group Captain Shukla, this will be an opportunity to emulate fellow Indian Air Force Officer Wing Commander Rakesh Sharma, who flew aboard Soyuz T-11 on 3 April 1984 as part of the Soviet Interkosmos program. Sharma spent seven days in space on board the Salyut 7 space station.

This is the fourth private astronaut mission to the International Space Station. The

crew is travelling to the orbiting laboratory on a new SpaceX Dragon spacecraft. The targeted docking time is approximately 7 am Eastern Time on Thursday, June 26.

Once docked, the astronauts plan to spend up to 14 days aboard the orbiting laboratory, conducting a mission comprised of science, outreach, and commercial activities. Peggy Whitson, former NASA astronaut and director of human spaceflight at Axiom Space, is in command of the mission, while Indian Space Research Organisation Astronaut Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla serves as pilot.

The two mission specialists are European Space Agency project astronaut Slawosz Uznanski-Wisniewski of Poland and Tibor Kapu of Hungary. The astronauts are using the new Axiom Extravehicular Mobility Unit (AxEMU) spacesuit which provides them with advanced capa-

bilities for space exploration while providing NASA with commercially developed human systems needed to access, live and work on and around the Moon.

The advanced spacesuits ensure astronauts are equipped with high-performing, robust equipment and are designed to accommodate a wide range of crew members. The Ax-4 mission is going to conduct major research. The research complement includes around 60 scientific studies and activities representing 31 countries, including the U.S., India, Poland, Hungary, Saudi Arabia, Brazil, Nigeria, UAE, and nations across Europe.

This will be the most research and science-related activities conducted on an Axiom Space mission aboard the International Space Station to dateNASA and ISRO (Indian Space Research Organisation) are collaborating to launch several scientific investigations.

These studies include examining muscle regeneration, growth of sprouts and edible microalgae, survival of tiny aquatic organisms, and human interaction with electronic displays in microgravity. The first private astronaut mission to the station, Axiom Mission 1, lifted off in April 2022 for a 17-day mission aboard the orbiting laboratory.

The second private astronaut mission to the station, Axiom Mission 2, was also commanded by Whitson and launched in May 2023 with four private astronauts who spent eight days in orbit. The most recent private astronaut mission, Axiom Mission 3, launched in January 2024; the crew spent 18 days docked to the space station. *ANI*

"Ceasefire in effect, don't violate it," says US President Trump even as both sides report continued attacks

WASHINGTON, DC: US President Donald Trump has once again reiterated that the West Asia ceasefire is in effect and should not be violated.

In a post on Truth Social, the US President wrote, "The ceasefire is now in effect. Please do not violate it! Donald J. Trump, President of the United States."

Earlier, Trump announced that Israel and Iran had agreed to a "complete and total ceasefire," in what would bring about an end to the conflict just hours after Tehran targeted American Air bases in the Middle East. In a Truth Social post, Trump said Israel and Iran would likely exchange final blows over the next six hours before the deal would come into place.

"Iran will start the ceasefire and, upon the 12th Hour, Israel will start the ceasefire and, upon the 24th Hour, an official end to the 12-Day War," he said.

Qatar's Prime Minister Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al Thani secured Iran's approval for a US-proposed ceasefire in the conflict with Israel, Reuters reported, quoting an official briefed on the negotiations.

PMAI Thani obtained Tehran's agreement during a phone call with Iranian officials, Reuters reported. The conversation followed US President Donald Trump's communication with Qatar's Emir, in which Trump informed him that Israel had accepted the ceasefire proposal and requested Doha's assistance in convincing Tehran to agree to the deal, as reported by Reuters.

In an official statement released by the Prime Minister's Office, Netanyahu declared that Israel had met all strategic goals of its military campaign, dubbed Operation Rising Lion, and even exceeded expectations.

"Israel had achieved all the objectives of Operation Rising Lion, and even far beyond that. Israel has removed a dual immediate existential threat - both in the nuclear domain and in the ballistic missile domain," the statement read.

According to the statement, the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) had "achieved complete air superiority over Tehran's skies, struck a severe blow to the military leadership, and destroyed dozens of central regime targets in Iran." IANS

She called on Iran to seriously engage in the diplomatic process and stated that the negotiating table remains the "only viable path forward "

"Europe welcomes the announcement of a ceasefire by President Trump. It's an important step towards restoring stability in a region in tension. This must be our collective priority"

In a post on X, Ursula von der Leyen stated, "Europe welcomes the announcement of a ceasefire by President Trump. It's an important step towards restoring stability in a region in tension. This must be our collective priority. We call on Iran to engage seriously in a credible diplomatic process. Because the negotiating table remains the only viable path forward."

Earlier today, Trump said the ceasefire in West Asia is in effect and should not be violated. In a post on Truth Social, the US

President wrote, "The ceasefire is now in effect. Please do not violate it! Donald J. Trump, President of the United States."

Trump made the statement hours after announcing that Israel and Iran had agreed to a "complete and total ceasefire," in what

would bring about an end to the conflict just hours after Tehran targeted American Air bases in the Middle East.

In a post shared on Truth Social, Trump said Israel and Iran would likely exchange final blows over the next six hours before the deal would come into place.

"Iran will start the ceasefire and, upon the 12th Hour, Israel will start the ceasefire and, upon the 24th Hour, an official end to the 12-Day War," he stated.

Israel has confirmed that it has agreed to Trump's proposal

for a bilateral ceasefire with Iran and vowed to "respond forcefully" in case there is any violation of the truce. Israel thanked President Trump and the US for "their defensive support and for their participation in removing the Iranian nuclear threat."

Israel & Iran came to me: Trump reaffirms ceasefire claim amid renewed missile attack

WASHINGTON: After Iran launched six more missiles at Israel, US President Donald Trump reiterated his claim that both Tehran and Tel Aviv had approached him simultaneously asking for "peace," which prompted his declaration of a ceasefire.

Posting on his platform, Truth Social, Trump wrote, "Israel & Iran came to me, almost simultaneously, and said, 'peace'! I knew the time was NOW. The World, and the Middle Fast, are the real winners!"

"Both Nations will see tremendous love, peace and prosperity in their futures. They have so much to gain, and yet, so much to lose if they stray from the road of righteousness & truth. The future for Israel & Iran is unlimited, & filled with great promise. God bless you both!" he added.

Trump's renewed remarks came even as Israel's Home Front Command urged residents to take cover following missile launches from Iran. The Israel Defense Forces (IDF) confirmed that defensive systems were activated in response to the fresh attack and that a ballistic missile struck a building in Beersheba.

Emergency responders from Magen David Adom were dispatched and although no immediate injuries were reported, assessments were ongoing.

The latest round of strikes came shortly after Iran declared a unilateral halt to military operations against Israel, effective 4 a.m. local time. However, Iranian authorities stressed that this ceasefire was conditional -- hinging entirely on Israel halting its own offensive actions.

The contradiction became evident when Trump claimed that both sides had agreed to a ceasefire, a claim Tehran quickly denied.

Iran's Foreign Ministry clarified that Tehran had not received any formal ceasefire proposal from the United States and asserted that it was Israel that began the hostilities.

Iran stated it had temporarily paused military action, pending reciprocal restraint from Israel. As of now, Israel has not officially responded to Trump's ceasefire declaration.

According to estimates, nearly 400 people have been killed in Iran and around 24 in Israel. IANS

NSA Ajit Doval meets Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi, stresses need to counter terrorism

"NSA also emphasized the need to counter terrorism in all its forms and manifestations to maintain overall peace and stability in the region," the MFA said.

The ministry said that views were also exchanged on other bilateral, regional and global issues of mutual inter-

"NSA noted that he looked forward to meeting with Wang Yi in India at a mutually convenient date for the 24th round of the Special Representative (SR) Talks," the MEA said.

The SCO is a permanent intergovernmental international organization established on June 15, 2001, in Shanghai. The member states of SCO include India, Iran, Kazakhstan, China, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Russia, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan and Belarus. IANS

India to outpace G7 economies: Report

NEW DELHI: Global capital can no longer overlook India's structural economic advantages, as the nation is poised to significantly outpace G7 economies in growth, according to a recent report released by wealth management firm Equirus.

The report identifies strong macro fundamentals, policy-led capital expenditure, resurgence in rural consumption, and structural manufacturing shifts as key longterm drivers of India's growth in an uncertain global environment.

"India is no longer the world's fastest-growing economy just on paper -- it is structurally better positioned than most G7 nations. That's a seismic shift," said Mitesh Shah, CEO, Equirus Credence Family Office.

"The global macro regime is shifting. US growth has been revised down sharply, and while India is projected to contribute over 15 percent to global GDP growth (2025-2030), traditional 60/40 portfolios are breaking down. In this new regime, strategic asset allocation across geographies and growth cycles isn't optional -- it's the alpha generator," he added.

India is benefiting from structural trends: rural FMCG demand outpacing urban (6 percent vs 2.8 percent), policy-led capex rising 17.4 percent, and Rs 2.5 lakh crore liquidity infusion underway, the report states. IANS

Middle East air travel hit hard as airlines avoid region after US strikes on Iran

NEW DELHI: Air travel across the Middle East continues to face major disruptions after the United States launched airstrikes on Iranian nuclear facilities.

Airlines are now avoiding large parts of the region's airspace due to growing security concerns, causing delays, longer flight times, and increased costs.

According to flight tracking service FlightRadar24, commercial planes are being rerouted to avoid flying over countries like Iran, Iraq, Syria, and Israel.

Instead, they are taking longer paths over safer areas such as the Caspian Sea, Egypt, or Saudi Arabia.

This change is leading to higher fuel consumption and more expensive flight operations.

"Following the U.S. strikes, commercial flights continue to avoid high-risk zones, adhering to airspace restrictions introduced last week," FlightRadar24 shared on social media platform X.

The situation in the region remains tense with increased missile and drone attacks. Safe Airspace, an aviation risk monitoring group, warned that the US strikes could lead to higher risks for American airlines flying near the Middle Fast

While there are no direct

threats to civilian planes yet, the group said Iran might respond by targeting US military bases or using its allies, like Hezbollah.

Saudi Arabia, and the United Arab Emirates, could face increased

The group advised airlines to remain extremely cautious. In Israel, the country's main airlines -- El Al, Arkia, and Israir -- have stopped running rescue flights meant to bring Israeli citizens back home.

El Al also announced that its regular commercial flights will stay suspended until at least June 27.

Israeli airspace remains closed, although land borders with Jordan and Egypt are still

The conflict has stranded thousands of people. Nearly 40,000 foreign tourists in Israel are trying to leave, with many seeking to cross into Jordan by land or reach Cyprus by sea.

Israel's Tourism Ministry is helping to organize their evacuation. Several countries have already begun pulling out their citizens. IANS



India's export sector stands strong amid rising geopolitical tensions: FIEO

NEW DELHI: While geopolitical tensions in the Middle East, including the ongoing Iran-Israel conflict, pose certain challenges to global trade dynamics, India's export sector remains resilient and adaptive. the Federation of Indian Export Organisations (FIEO) said.

The country's trade with both Iran and Israel, while important, constitutes a small share of the overall export-import basket.

"The government and industry are jointly monitoring developments to ensure minimal disruption," FIEO President S.C. Ralhan said.

"We do anticipate some short-term impact on demand and logistics, particularly in the

insurance premiums may add pressure, especially in pricesensitive sectors," he said in a



Gulf region, which serves as a crucial hub for Indian exports. Increased shipping costs, longer transit times, and rising marine

A wider Middle East conflict is expected to have an impact on oil supplies from Saudi Arabia, Iraq, Kuwait and the UAE, which would lead to a sharp spike in oil prices. Shipping could also get hit as Yemen's Houthi rebels have already warned that they would resume their attacks on ships if the US attacked Iran.

India imports around 85 percent of its crude oil requirement.

However, Indian exporters have time and again demonstrated agility in re-routing shipments, diversifying markets, and managing financial exposures, the FIEO said.

The robust MSMEs and largescale exporters, coupled with strong government support mechanisms, will help cushion any near-term shocks.

Crude oil price volatility is being closely watched, as it can influence both inflation and logistics costs. But India's diversified energy procurement strategy and the Reserve Bank's proactive stance help maintain liquidity and macroeconomic stability.

"Overall, while there are temporary headwinds, we see this as an opportunity for Indian exporters to explore alternate routes, strengthen regional partnerships, and consolidate India's role as a reliable trade partner in uncertain times," Ralhan said. IANS

India's coffee exports more than doubles in last 11 years

NEW DELHI: India's coffee exports have more than doubled to \$1.8 billion in the last 11 years, with the country becoming the 5th largest exporter, according to the government data.

India's coffee exports stood at \$800 million in 2014-15 and have been rising steadily since then.

The top export markets for Indian coffee are Italy, Germany, Russia, Belgium, the United Arab Emirates (UAE) and the US.

India is the seventh largest producer and the fifth largest exporter of coffee in the world. Prices of coffee are ruling at record levels following an adverse weather-induced supply crunch in the largest producing countries of Brazil and Vietnam. India exports over two-thirds of the over 3.5 lakh tons produced in the country.

The country's coffee exports have grown significantly due to the increasing global demand for its rich and unique flavors. Approximately three-fourths of India's coffee production consists of Arabica and

Robusta beans. These are primarily exported as unroasted beans. However, there is a growing demand for valueadded products like roasted and instant

Ghats, areas famous for their biodiversity. Karnataka leads in production, contributing 248,020 MT in 2022-23, followed by Kerala and Tamil Nadu.



coffee, further fuelling the export boom.

India's coffee is primarily grown in the ecologically rich Western and Eastern

These areas are home to shaded plantations that not only support the coffee industry but also play a vital role in preserv-

ing the natural environment, helping to maintain the ecological balance of these biodiversity hotspots.

Meanwhile, due to the rise of the cafe culture, higher disposable incomes and a growing preference for coffee over tea, coffee consumption in India is also steadily increasing. This trend has been observed particularly in both urban and rural areas. Domestic consumption has increased from 84,000 tons in 2012 to 91,000 tons in 2023.

To enhance coffee production and meet growing domestic and international demand, the Coffee Board of India has launched several important initiatives. Through the Integrated Coffee Development Project (ICDP), the focus is on improving yields, expanding cultivation in non-traditional regions and ensuring the sustainability of coffee farming. These measures are part of a comprehensive strategy to strengthen India's coffee industry, increase productivity and improve its global competitiveness. *IANS*

India's exports of pharmaceuticals, textiles, jewelry to US likely to go up after bilateral trade pact

NEW DELHI: Although the US is India's largest export partner, there is scope to increase exports further in areas such as smartphones, certain pharma products and labor-intensive exports such as textiles and gems and jewelry under the bilateral trade agreement (BTA) between the two countries that is expected to be signed by the fall (September-October) of this year, according to a Crisil report released recently.



To begin with, India should be prepared to see more imports from the US under the BTA. This is because India's tariffs are much higher than those of the US, and bringing these down would be advantageous to exporters in the US, the report points out.

It highlights that the imminent bilateral trade agreement will likely lead to a reduction in India's goods trade surplus with the US.

India would be able to import more en-

ergy products, defense equipment and certain agricultural products, among others, from the US after the agreement is signed.

The report further states that India accounts for only a small part of the USA's imports. India's exports, however, are unlikely to see a major spike because the focus of the Donald Trump administration is to reduce its trade deficit with India, and most of India's top exports to the US are

already duty-free (i.e. before the application of baseline 10 per cent, which is applicable since April 10).

Besides, the export potential would also depend eventually on the amount of tariff India faces when compared with other competing nations, it added

According to the report, there is some potential to improve.

The US is not only the world's largest economy, but also the world's largest importer. In 2024, its goods imports stood at \$3.36 trillion (in contrast, China and Germany, the second- and third-largest importing nations, recorded \$2.59 trillion and \$1.43 trillion worth of goods imports, respectively), according to ITC Trade Map.

But India's share in the US's global imports was just 2.7 per cent. Thus, there is some scope for India to increase its ex-

ports to the US.

The report said "to understand the areas where India can potentially increase exports to the US, we assess the following two matrices".

"Among the top 25 items India exports to the US, products such as diamonds, marine products and bed linen already have a high penetration there. The penetration remains low for others, such as smartphones and certain pharma products.



Also, only two of India's top 25 export items faced the most favored nation (MFN) tariff in 2024; others were duty-free. Clearly, this means Indian goods will have to become more competitive to gain further market share.

Though a vast majority of India's exports to the US are duty-free, several products attract MFN tariffs. For instance, out of the US's goods imports of \$91.2 billion from India in 2024, \$32.9 billion worth of goods (36 per cent) attracted tariffs. *IANS*

Govt seals Rs 1,982 crore deals for defense hardware to beef up Army's counter-terror capability

NEW DELHI: In a significant move to strengthen the Indian Army's operational readiness in counter-terrorism operations, the Ministry of Defense has concluded 13 contracts worth Rs 1,981.9 crore under the Emergency Procurement mechanism, according to an official statement issued recently.

The key equipment being procured includes Integrated Drone Detection and Interdiction Systems, Low Level Lightweight Radars, Very Short Range Air Defense Systems and Remotely Piloted Aerial Vehicles.

Loitering Munitions, including Vertical Take-Off and Landing systems, various categories of drones, Quick Reaction Fighting Vehicles, Night Sights for Rifles, Bullet Proof Jackets and Ballistic Helmets also form part of the list.

These contracts, amounting to Rs 1,981.90 crore, have been finalized against an overall sanctioned outlay of Rs 2,000 crore for the Indian Army.

Executed through fast-track procedures under the EP mandate, the procurement aims to enhance situational awareness, lethality, mobility, and protection for troops deployed in CT environments. *IANS*

Real estate institutional capital flows in India reach \$3.1 billion in 2025

MUMBAI: Institutional investments in the Indian real estate market reached \$3,068 million (\$3.1 billion) across 30 deals in the first half of 2025, according to a recent report.

Investment transactions are experiencing extended timelines due to the challenging international economic conditions. Despite this moderation, the real estate market demonstrates fundamental resilience, said the report by JLL.

This slowdown follows an exceptional 2024, which saw investments reach a historic peak, marginally surpassing the previous record of \$8.4 billion set in 2007.

Institutional investors continue to participate through public market channels including REITs, QIPs, and investments in listed entities. The standout transaction of 2025 has been Blackstone's significant entry into India's residential real estate sector with approximately \$214 million invested to acquire up to 66 percent of Kolte-Patil Developers.

"India's real estate sector remains a compelling investment destination, buoyed by both domestic and international confidence despite global economic uncertainties having presented short-term challenges in the first half of 2025," said Lata Pillai. *IANS*

NEW DELHI: LIC Housing Fi-

nance has reduced its rate of interest on new home loans by 50 basis points, in line with the similar degree of reporate cut by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).

With this revision, interest rates on new home loan sanctions will now start from 7.50 percent, effective June 19, 2025, coinciding with the company's 36th Foundation Day, it said in a recent statement. *ANI*

Global super-prime property sales rise 6 pc in Q1 2025: Report

NEW DELHI: The global market for super-prime residential properties recorded a 6 percent rise in transactions during the first quarter (Q1) of 2025, as per report of 20 June.

In total, 527 super-prime deals worth \$9.43 billion were recorded across 12 global cities in Q1 2025, up from 498 deals in the previous quarter, according to data compiled by real estate consultancy Knight Frank.

The average sale price for these luxury homes stood at \$17.9 million.

Dubai led the global rankings once again, recording the highest number of transactions (111 deals) as well as the largest transaction volume.

Palm Beach and Miami also posted strong performances. Palm Beach saw a notable rise to 74 deals in Q1 2025, continuing its recovery from just 21 deals in Q4 2023.

Miami registered a 35 percent



year-on-year increase in deal count, with transaction volume nearly doubling from the same period last year.

New York recorded 75 transactions, while London and Hong Kong experienced a cooling off after strong closings in late 2023.

Hong Kong's deal count dropped to 42, a 16 percent de-

cline from the previous year, wit volumes falling to \$690 million.

London saw a sharper slow-down, with 34 deals in Q1 2025, down 37 percent year-on-year, and total value dropping to \$590 million.

Knight Frank noted that the super-prime market continues to be active despite rising global uncertainties.

However, it cautioned that buyers and developers will need to be mindful of factors like changing interest rates, currency fluctuations, and local policy shifts as they plan their investments.

The report includes both quarterly and annualized data on residential sales above \$10 million across key global cities. *IANS*

India offers huge scope in office spaces managed by real estate investment trusts

MUMBAI: Real estate investment trusts (REITs) in top seven Indian cities currently have only 23 percent of total REIT-worthy office stock (worth 520 million square feet) listed in their portfolios, showcasing tremendous scope in the future, according to a report released last week.

In terms of appreciation, India's office REITs have shown strong one-year performance (as of June 16, 2025), driven by robust leasing activity and steady rental escalations.

India was a late entrant into the REIT sector. However, since REITs launched in 2019, their market capitalization has surpassed that of some major economies with matured REIT markets, according to latest Anarock Research data.

The three listed Indian REITs - Embassy Office Parks,
Mindspace Business Parks and
Brookfield India -- have a com-

bined portfolio of just 117.2 million sq ft, which is just 23 percent

of the overall REIT-able Indian office space market, said Anuj



Puri, Chairman, Anarock Group.

This indicates significant headroom for future REIT listings and office market consolidation across the top 7 cities, he mentioned.

With about 313 million sq. ft., Bengaluru, Hyderabad and Chennai currently host the maximum available REIT-worthy office stock. However, just 18 percent of this stock is listed in REIT portfolios. *IANS*

But investing from abroad isn't without its share of complexities. From choosing the right kind of property to managing taxes and repatriation, here's how to invest in Indian properties as an NRI without getting lost in the fine print.

Who can invest and what you are allowed to buy

Under FEMA (Foreign Exchange Management Act), an NRI is defined as an Indian citizen who resides outside the country for more than 182 days in a financial year. This also includes Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs) and Overseas Citizens of India (OCIs).

As an NRI, you're permitted to invest in residential or commercial properties in India. However, the purchase of agricultural land, farmhouses, or plantations is prohibited without special RBI approval. This is a key distinction and one that often surprises first-time NRI investors.

Picking the right property

The Indian property market is incredibly diverse, but before narrowing down your options, you need to define your objective. Are you buying for rental income, capital

appreciation, personal use, or as a future retirement home?

Your end goal should guide your choices. For instance, if rental income is your priority, cities like Bengaluru, Hyderabad, and Pune, known for their tech-driven workforce and steady rental demand, are strong contenders. Mumbai and Delhi, though more expensive, offer better long-term value in terms of appreciation and connectivity

Those with emotional ties or future relocation plans may lean towards hometowns or cities like Kochi or Chennai that offer comfort, familiarity, and lifestyle balance

Financing the purchase: Loans, accounts, and funds flow

One of the biggest advantages NRIs have today is access to home loans from Indian banks, provided certain criteria are met. Lenders usually require the loan to be serviced through NRE, NRO, or FCNR accounts. Having a local co-applicant or issuing a Power of Attorney can also streamline the process, especially when you're not

physically present in India.

Funding your purchase involves a choice between two key bank accounts:

An NRE (Non-Resident External) account is ideal for inward remittances. It's fully repatriable, and both principal and interest are tax-free in India. An NRO (Non-Resident Ordinary) account, on the other hand, is better suited for managing income within India, such as rent or dividends. It does involve taxes and comes with a repatriation limit of \$1 million per financial year.

Making the right choice here is crucial if you plan to send money back overseas or use the rental income locally.

Documentation

Here's a checklist of documents you'll need:

Passport and visa

PAN card

Overseas address proof

Power of Attorney (if you're authorizing someone else) NRE/NRO bank account details

It's equally important to check the property's legal status. Ensure clear titles, up-to-date land records, and that the property is RERA registered. Due diligence isn't op-

Taxes, income, and rules

tional-it's your safety net.

Understanding taxes on your investment is just as critical as buying the property. Rental income earned in India is taxable. You may also face TDS (Tax Deducted at Source) when selling property, typically around 20%, depending on the holding period and total gains. However, if your country of residence has a Double Taxation Avoidance Agreement (DTAA) with India, you can avoid paying tax twice.

If you sell the property and wish to move the money abroad, you can do so through your NRO account, up to \$1 million per financial year. Repatriation is easier if the property was originally purchased using funds from an NRE or FCNR account, so keep your funding channels documented and clean.

While property in India offers excellent potential, NRIs must be vigilant about legal risks, particularly around illegal property grabbing. Absentee owners are often targets for encroachment or fraudulent transactions. Ensure that the property is well-documented, has clear titles, and conduct regular checks through your representative or property manager.

Maintain records of purchase agreements, tax filings, and sale deeds, as banks and the RBI may request them during repatriation procedures. www.housing.com

'Housing sales in top cities fall below 1 lakh unit'

NEW DELHI: Housing sales in India's top cities in Q2 2025 (April-June) fell below one lakh unit mark for the first time since Q3-2021 while supply remained below this threshold for the fourth consecutive quarter as per a report.

Sales fell by 19 percent on year-on-year basis to 94,864 units while supply fell by 30 percent on year-on-year to 82,027 units in the April-June period of 2025, according to a report by NSE-listed real estate data analytics firm PropEquity.

Housing sales stood at 116,432 units and supply

stood at 117,208 units in April-June period of 2024.

According to the report, housing sales fell year-on-year in 7 out of the 9 cities with Mumbai and Thane witnessing the sharpest fall at 34 percent each while Delhi-NCR at 16 percent and Chennai at 9 percent were the only two cities that saw a rise in sales in April-June of 2025.

Similarly, housing supply fell in six out of the nine cities with Mumbai recording the sharpest fall at 61 percent while three cities saw rise in supply, namely Delhi NCR at 37 percent, Hyderabad at 19 percent and Chennai at 6

percent in April-June of 2025.

Samir Jasuja, Founder and CEO, PropEquity said, "This is for the first time since Q3 2021 (July-September) that housing sales have fallen below 1 lakh unit mark. Supply, too, has stayed below 1 lakh unit mark for the fourth consecutive quarter. There has been a decline in both sales and supply on Q-o-Q basis in Mumbai, Bengaluru and Navi Mumbai as these cities recorded their high in 2023 and 2024, and are now stabilizing to their normal pace." *ANI*

How ICMR's blood donor registry is saving lives

NEW DELHI: The Indian Council of Medical Research has initiated a Rare Donor Registry of India (RDRI) that is crucial in saving the lives of rare disease patients, including those with thalassemia and hemophilia, in the country.

According to the ICMR, the RDRI will also benefit patients with hemoglobinopathies like sickle cell disease; other bleeding disorders; and Primary Immunodeficiency Diseases, including those with T and B cell deficiency.

"Some people have rare blood types -- less than 1 in 1,000. This can make life-saving transfusions extremely hard to find, especially in emergencies," the ICMR said.

To develop RDRI, scientists at ICMR-National Institute of Immunohematology (NIIH), along with KEM Hospital (Mumbai), PGI (Chandigarh), NRS Medical College (Kolkata), and JIPMER (Puducherry) created a database of over 4,000 carefully screened donors, tested for over 300 rare blood markers from across the country.

They "identified more than 1,000 rare individuals negative for common antigens and 128 very rare blood group donors," the ICMR informed. *IANS*

Bangladesh faces COVID-19 vaccine shortage amid new variant surge

DHAKA: Bangladesh is facing a vaccine crisis to fight against the newly detected sub-variants of the Omicron strain of COVID-19. The Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) of the country stressed that only 3.2 million doses of older vaccines are available, which are due to expire in a few months, local media reported.

According to a report by Bangladeshi media outlet UNB, COVID-19 infection rates have surged nationwide over the past month. According to the data from the Institute of Epidemiology, Disease Control and Research (IEDCR) in Dhaka, 134 cases tested positive out of 1,409 samples in May, a sharp rise in the infection rate at 9.51 percent, the highest recorded in Bangladesh from January to May 2023.

"In total, there are around 3.2 million doses of vaccines. No

new vaccines for the sub-variants have arrived so far. However, the process of procurement is ongoing. A vaccine committee will be formed soon to make a prompt decision," said Halimur

Rashid, Line Director of the Communicable Disease Control (CDC) unit at the DGHS.

Meanwhile, amid the rise in Covid cases reportedly there is a lack of interest among the public said Rashid.

According to the DGHS, a total of 28 new COVID-19 cases were reported in Bangladesh till Thursday (19 June) morning, as the total number of confirmed


Mechanism behind life-threatening cancer drug side-effect revealed

NICE: New research has found immune changes in cancer patients that could help identify which patients are most at risk of dangerous heart complications from cancer drugs, known as immune checkpoint inhibitors.

The study was led by Assistant Professor Pilar Martin, Head of the Regulatory Molecules of Inflammation Lab at

"We put patients into two groups based on their levels of a protective biomarker called CD69, and saw these groups had very different response to the cancer treatments. Those who had lower levels of CD69 before starting treatment had a more negative immune response which puts them at much greater risk of heart damage,"

Professor Martin said.



Researchers analyzed blood samples from 215 cancer patients from the Spanish Immunotherapy Registry of Cardiovascular Toxicity (SIR-CVT)2 before treatment and at 24

weeks, 1012 weeks, 6 months, and 1 year after treatment with immune checkpoint inhibitors. The patients had a range of different cancers, including lung, breast and skin cancer, and were treated with different types of immune check point inhibitor treatments, including anti PD1, PDL1 and CTLA4.

Patients were put into two groups dependent the amount of biomarker for a specific protective T-cell (CD69) in their blood and changes in levels of their immune cell populations were monitored over time.

While both patient groups experienced some decline in levels of a specific type of a protective immune cell (CD69 positive regulatory T cells) in response to treatment, those patients with low starting levels of the protective biomarker had a much larger decrease. These pa-

the Spanish National Centre for Cardiovascular Research (CNIC) and group leader at CIBER-CV.

She explained, "Immune checkpoint inhibitors have revolutionized cancer treatment, but they can also damage the hearts of some patients. In this study, we monitored how levels of immune cells, which are known to be involved in the development of heart diseases, change after treatment.

"We were surprised to see an early and rapid loss of protective immune cells, called regulatory T cells, after cancer patients started treatment. This suggests a window of vulnerability early in treatment." Assistant Professor Martin continued.

The new research is being presented at European Cardio-Oncology 2025, a scientific congress of the European Society of Cardiology.

Immune checkpoint inhibitors are drugs that work by harnessing the patient's own immune response to attack cancer cells. Unfortunately, they can also have side effects, including causing heart damage or cardiotoxicity, in some patients. Approximately 1 in

100 patients treated with these drugs develop myocarditis, a life-threatening heart complication.

Researchers found that patients with lower levels of a blood biomarker, called CD69 and found in protective immune cells, experienced a greater decrease in protective immune cells and a resulting increase in destructive proinflammatory immune cells. Such a decline in protective immune cells has previously been associated with a greater risk of developing cardiovascular complications such as myocarditis.

tients also had an increase in immune cells with a role to kill other cells and others that have a role in inflammation.

Regulatory T cells are found in the blood and are important to maintain immune balance and stop the immune system damaging healthy tissues, including the heart and blood vessels. Previous research has shown how the wrong levels of these cells can result in damage to blood vessels and the heart, and this study suggests they could be key in mediating the heart damaging effects of immune checkpoint inhibitor cancer drugs. *ANI*

USFDA Okays Lenacapavir: Affordable, generic India-made drug key to boost global HIV prevention

NEW DELHI: While Gilead Sciences' HIV prevention drug Lenacapavir got approved by the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA), its made-in-India generic versions may be a more affordable alternative that can boost the prevention of the deadly condition globally.

In a major breakthrough, the US FDA this week approved Lenacapavir -- a long-acting injectable drug that offers near-complete protection against HIV with just two doses a year.

Marketed under the brand name Yeztugo, the world's first twice-yearly HIV prevention shot can potentially, transform pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) options. The drug may be particularly crucial for those who struggle with daily medication adherence due to stigma, access issues, or lifestyle factors.

However, the high cost -- at \$28,218 per person per year -- is likely to act as a deterrent to global HIV prevention goals.

Although USFDA approval is a big thing, the "real breakthrough would be when Lenacapavir becomes

drop the price of Lenacapavir HIV prevention shot.

"If this game-changing medicine remains unaffordable, it will change nothing. I urge Gilead to do the right thing. Drop the price, expand production, and ensure the world has a shot at ending AIDS," said Winnie Byanyima, Executive Director of UNAIDS and United Nations Undersecretary-General.

Even as Gilead granted voluntary licenses to six generic manufacturers earlier, including four Indian: Dr Reddy's Laboratories, Emcure, Hetero Healthcare, and Viatris, Gilada urged Indian generic manufacturing companies to develop 'made in India' generic versions.

"The voluntary licenses give hope that the medicine may cost less than \$100 -- that is 0.3 percent of the innovator's cost," said Gilada, who is also the President Emeritus of the AIDS Society of India (ASI).

According to the National AIDS Control Organization (NACO), an estimated 2.4 million people were living with HIV in India in 2021. That year, 41,970 AIDS-related deaths were recorded, underscoring the ongoing public health challenge.

"India needs to lead from the front for Lenacapavir's equitable and timely distribution at the required scale to prevent HIV transmission and help end AIDS," said Dr Gilada. IANS

Depression: Therapy, and potentially prescribed medication, may be in order. Timely screening for depression is important.


Neurosyphilis: A blood test or spinal fluid check is required to test for this infection, which can then be treated with antibiotics. The symptoms closely mimic dementia.

Frontal lobe tumor: An MRI will detect the presence of such a tumor, which can cause subtle behavioral changes.

People over the age of 50 should have their thyroid checked.

Normal pressure hydrocephalus: This is diagnosed with a CT of the head and spinal tap. Symptoms include gait instability, urinary incontinence, and memory loss, which can suggest dementia.

Chemotherapy can cause temporary memory loss.

Lyme disease can cause permanent nerve damage that mimics memory loss.

Diabetes: Low blood sugar levels can

be very dangerous - even more dangerous than high blood sugar because of the possibility of brain damage if not detected.

Sleep apnea: This interruption of sleep can cause memory loss and needs to be detected and properly treated.

Alcohol abuse: If there is memory loss, chronic alcohol use can make it worse.

Mini strokes: Also called 'silent strokes,' these can cause brain damage that causes memory loss. The damage may not be repairable, but the underlying cause of the strokes must be explored and treated.

These health conditions and others such as AIDS, enclosed head injury can be overlooked and symptoms misdiagnosed particularly in cases where the memory loss is sudden. Communication with a primary care physician, or neurologist is an essential step in determining the real cause.

In most cases, the warning signs of a health problem are present. Don't ignore them

India's herbal and Ayurveda OTC market set to outpace global growth: Report

NEW DELHI: India's herbal and Ayurveda OTC (over the counter) market is expected to grow at a CAGR of 6.5 percent, from \$69 million in 2025 to \$118 million by the end of 2033, outpacing global trends, a recent report showed.

However, challenges persist as 40 percent of new launches in 2024 faced regulatory hurdles, only 20 percent of products have clinical validation, and quality concerns affect up to 30 percent of offerings, limiting their credibility and adoption for clinical illness, the report mentioned.

The herbal and Ayurveda OTC industry is reported to be growing at an unprecedented rate. According to latest research, it has made a robust entry in more than 70 percent of Indian households.

This insight comes from the latest industry analysis by MedIQ, the Healthcare

Intelligence research wing of 1Lattice, which highlights a fundamental shift in consumer behavior, with a strong shift in preference for natural, chemical-free wellness products across all age groups.

The study reveals that the driving factor behind the rapid growth is due to the widespread consumption of popular categories, such as Chyawanprash, Ashwagandha supplements, Ayurvedic



personal care, functional food, and youth-targeted products -- like gummies and effervescent tablets.

The study also reveals that over 40 percent of the new adopters are millennials and Gen Z, signaling a generational shift for traditional wellness, but in modern formats.





Speakers share personal experiences

During Pride Month in June, parades and activities are held in various places to support the LGBTQ community in expressing their identities and demands. American Community Media held a media discussion on June 20th, inviting three speakers to share their personal experiences and discuss the challenges and situations faced by the community. All three speakers emphasized that the key to promoting LGBTQ understanding among immigrant communities

lies in the power of human connections and authentic stories.

Helen Zia, an Asian journalist and social activist and founder of the Vincent Chin Institute, said that she grew up in New Jersey, where the Asian population was sparse and LGBTQ identity was considered a social taboo at the time. "If you are considered gay, you may lose your job, your children, or even your life." She recalled that when she was young, in the social movement circle, she was questioned in public by groups because she was suspected of being a lesbian. "After

that, I closed myself off and withdrew from many women's movements that I had been actively involved in. In 2010, she registered her marriage with her partner in San Francisco, and her mother attended. Pride is not the past tense; it means that I can fully exist in the community and society.

Aruna Rao, founder and CEO of Desi Rainbow Parents & Allies, said that her son came out as transgender 10 years ago. At that time, as an Indian immigrant and a cisgender woman, she had no knowledge of LGBTQ issues. She once joined parent organizations such as PFLAG, but found it difficult to get support due to cultural barriers and language barriers. "I was often the only brown face, and no one understood my fears and struggles as an immigrant mother." She founded Desi Rainbow to provide resources for South Asian parents and LGBTQ children. Transformed into an online community after the epidemic, it has now expanded to the United States and overseas, becoming a place for many young people who need support due to family rejection. "We not only help parents understand, but also help children find selective

Tyrone Ross, CEO & Co-founder of Turngev Labs and Principal at 401 Financial Cantrell Dumas. Director of Derivatives Policy, Better Markets used his own experience to illustrate

the potential of virtual currencies. He grew up in a family without a bank account. As an adult, he worked on Wall Street and experienced firsthand the exclusivity and injustice of the traditional financial system. He believes that the birth of Bitcoin and blockchain technology is a positive challenge to the current financial system. Even if you don't have a bank account, you can use your mobile phone to remit money and transfer money across countries. Cryptocurrency is like digital cash, allowing poor people to obtain financial services at very low cost.

Ross pointed out that there are about 5 million people in the United States who are "unbanked" and 12 million people live in bank deserts typically meaning more than 10 miles away from banks. The monthly fees and fines of traditional banks often form a heavy burden on lowincome households. He emphasized that virtual currency technology can break geographical and institutional barriers and provide fair financial access.

Cantrell Dumas, Director of derivatives financial policy at Better Markets warned that cryptocurrencies are still highly

> speculative assets and their volatility is particularly dangerous for households with limited financial buffers. Fraud cases have also increased rapidly. According to FBI statistics, cryptocurrency-related fraud caused more than \$5.6 billion in losses in 2023, which surged to \$9.3 billion in 2024, a 66% increase. Fraudulent techniques include Ponzi schemes, fake investment platforms, phishing text messages and impersonation extortion, especially targeting the elderly and

those with insufficient financial literacy.

Elizabeth Kwok, Managing Director, FTI Consulting added that many cryptocurrency scams are actually "new wine in old bottles", taking advantage of investors' fear of "missing out on the opportunity to get rich in Bitcoin. She reminded the public to be wary of common scams such as sudden investment invitations, only accepting payments in cryptocurrency, requests for quick remittances, or using technical jargon to confuse people.

Indian families rush to secure US Green Cards before \$5 Million hike kicks in

MUMBAI: With the cost of a U.S. Green Card investment visa set to rise dramatically under proposed policy changes, Indian investors are moving quickly to file under the current EB5 program, according to Deepesh Deshmukh, Director of DSquare Global Pvt. Ltd. and an expert in U.S. immigration solutions.

The EB5 visa program, which currently allows foreign nationals to gain U.S. permanent residency by investing \$800,000 (approximately INR 7 crore) and creating ten American jobs, may soon become significantly more expensive. U.S. President Donald Trump is proposing to raise the investment threshold to \$5 million, a change that would price out thousands of hopeful applicants, especially from India, where interest in U.S. migration remains high.

"We are already seeing a surge in demand," said Deepesh during a recent podcast interview on Finance with Sharan - The One Percent Show. "Indian families who were earlier on the fence are now accelerating their applica-

tions. Many of them understand this could be their last affordable chance at securing a U.S. Green Card."

A key point of discussion during the interview was the availabout long-term security, education, and opportunities."

The U.S. caps EB5 visas at 10,000 per year globally, with only 700 allocated per country. That restriction, combined with

driver. "It's not about abandoning India. It's about what the U.S. offers -- clean air, working infrastructure, and a transparent system. You pay taxes, and you see the results."


He also clarified a common misconception: applying for a U.S. Green Card does not require Indians to give up their citizenship. "You retain your Indian passport until you decide to apply for U.S. citizenship, usually after five years," he said.

One of the podcast's most notable revelations was that middle-income families are also using the EB5 program, thanks to flexible financial arrangements. Deepesh mentioned cases where even families with partial funds have managed to secure the investment by using loan assistance from Banks, friends, and family.

The EB5 visa grants permanent residency, unlike temporary options such as student visas or H1B work permits, which are limited by quotas and job status. "With a Green Card, your stay in the U.S. doesn't depend on a job offer or employer sponsorship," Deepesh said. "It's called permanent residency for a reason. It gives families the peace of mind they're looking for."

Deepesh advised prospective applicants not to delay. "Even if you're not ready with the full amount, begin the legal process now. The rules could change anytime, and once the new threshold is in place, it's unlikely to be reversed."

ability of collateral-free loans of up to \$300,000, sourced from within the U.S. itself, to help applicants based in the U.S. meet the EB5 investment requirement. These loans come with a typical annual interest rate of 5.95 percent.

Deepesh explained that many Indians, including those without the full investment amount, are taking this route to give their children a chance at a better future. "I've seen families with less than 1 crore in total savings take out loans to apply," he said. "For them, it's not just about moving to the U.S. It's

high demand from Indian applicants, could mean long wait times if investors miss the current window.

"There's already a long waiting period just to get a U.S. tourist visa," said Deepesh. "Imagine the queue once people realize this \$800,000 route may disappear. We are advising serious applicants to begin paperwork within the next three months if they want to qualify under the existing rules."

When asked why affluent Indians are increasingly choosing the EB5 route, Deepesh pointed to quality of life as a primary

UNHCR urges de-escalation as displacement reported in Iran, Israel

GENEVA: The United Nations Refugee Agency (UNHCR) urged de-escalation of the ongoing hostilities between Israel and Iran, saying that displacement has already been observed in both countries due to the intensifying conflict.

In a statement, UNHCR said of last Saturday that movements have been reported from Tehran and other parts of Iran, with some individuals crossing into neighboring countries. Meanwhile, shelling in Israel has forced people to seek shelter in other parts of the coun-

try or, in some cases, abroad, Xinhua news agency reported.

"This region has already endured more than its share of war, loss, and displacement - we cannot allow another refugee crisis to take root," said Filippo Grandi, the UN high commissioner for refugees. "The time to de-escalate is right now. Once people are forced to flee, there's no quick way back - and all too often, the consequences last for generations," he added.

According to the agency's Global Trends 2024 Report released last week, Iran hosts some 3.5 million refugees, mainly from Afghanistan - making it the largest refugee-hosting country in the world. Prolonged conflict, the agency warned, would compound existing vulnerabilities among refugee populations.

Meanwhile, Israeli attacks on Iran over the past nine

days have killed over 400 Iranians and left 3,056 others wounded, Hossein Kermanpour, head of the Iranian Health Ministry's public relations, said.

"Among the injured, 2,220 have been treated and discharged from Min-

istry of Health hospitals, while 232 received outpatient care at the scene of the attacks," Kermanpour said in a post on social media platform X.

According to the health official, the majority of the casualties have been civilians, with 54 women and children among those killed in the Israeli strikes. IANS

12 illegal Bangladeshi nationals apprehended in Delhi's Anand Vihar area; to be deported

NEW DELHI: In a significant development, the Delhi Police on Thursday apprehended 12 Bangladeshi nationals living illegally in East Delhi's Anand Vihar area.

A team of Delhi Police raided the area and detained 12 Bangladeshi nationals, including six minors.

The detainees had forged documents to conceal their identity and were residing illegally in the densely-populated area of the national Capital.

The detection and detention of Bangladeshi nationals comes as part of Delhi Police's special drive against illegal immigrants residing in the national Capital and also its pledge to deport them.

All these individuals are reported to have illegally entered the country via unauthorized riverine routes along the Indo-Bangladesh border and were living without valid documents. All these illegal immigrants are natives of Kalirhat village in Kurigram district of Bangladesh and are mostly in the age group of late 20s and mid-30s apart from some dependent minors.

A special East Delhi police team raided the area on Wednesday, after getting specific Intelligence inputs and launched a targeted verification drive to isolate and identify the illegal immigrants.

During the operation, the team employed both human Intelligence and technical surveillance.

None of the apprehended individuals could produce any valid documents proving Indian citizenship. However, digital evidence, including photographs and documents linked to Bangladeshi citizenship, was recovered from their mobile phones. IANS

Afghan national arrested at **Bhubaneswar Airport for** illegally residing in India

NEW DELHI: An Afghan national, Mohammad Yousaf alias Yaha Khan, was arrested at Biju Patnaik International Airport, Bhubaneswar, for entering India on a forged Indian passport and living in Cuttack under a false identity since 2018.

According to the First Information Report (FIR) registered under the Airport Police Station, the arrest was made after the immigration department grew suspicious of the documents presented by Yousaf.

He had submitted an Indian passport issued in the name of "Yaha Khan, S/o Moti Khan, Cuttack." However, system checks revealed a Look-Out Circular issued by Kolkata Airport and confirmed his real identity as Mohammad Yousaf, an Afghan citizen holding an original

Investigations have revealed that Yousaf had illegally entered India in 2018 and settled in the Petinmati area under Puri Ghat police limits in Cuttack. Using forged details, he fraudulently obtained various Indian identity documents, including Aadhaar, PAN card, voter ID, driving license, and even a gas connection.

These documents allowed him to live and operate under a fake Indian identity, enabling travel within India and potentially abroad.

Following his arrest, joint searches by the Bhubaneswar-Cuttack Police Commissionerate and the National Investigation Agency (NIA) led to the seizure of numerous forged identity documents, cash, foreign currency, gold earrings, mobile phones, and other valuables. IANS

US resumes student visas with mandatory social media screening

WASHINGTON: The US Department of State has announced that it will resume processing of the visa applications for foreign students with a condition that requires applicants to make their social media accounts public for government review.

"Under new guidance, we will conduct a comprehensive and thorough vetting, including online presence, of all student and exchange visitor applicants in the F, M, and J nonimmigrant classifications. To facilitate this vetting, all applicants for F, M, and J nonimmigrant visas will be instructed to adjust the privacy settings on all of their social media profiles to 'public,'" read the statement issued recently by the US Department of State.

According to the State Department, it is committed to protecting America and its citizens by upholding the highest standards of national security and public safety through the visa process, adding that a US visa is a "privilege, not a right".

"We use all available information in our visa screening and vetting to identify visa applicants who are inadmissible

to the United States, including those who pose a threat to US national security," it stated

The US State Department asserted that every visa adjudication is a national security decision.

vigilant during the visa-issuance process to ensure that those applying for admission into the United States do not intend to harm Americans and our national interests and that all applicants credibly establish their eligibility for the visa sought, including that they intend to engage in activities consistent with the terms for their admission," the statement added.

Last month, the US indicated that the pause on student visa interviews would end "sooner than later" and encouraged applicants to continue the application process while frequently checking for the resumption of regular services.

Earlier, US Secretary of State Marco Rubio ordered US missions around the world to pause student visa interviews to incorporate expanded scrutiny of the social media footprints of applicants.

The Trump administration has expanded scrutiny of foreign students in US colleges and universities in the wake of political unrest that swept through campuses against the Israel-Gaza conflict.

The administration has targeted college authorities for not doing enough to prevent and protect Jewish students and foreign students from participating in them. IANS

It is our attachments to the pleasures

of the senses. It could be many attachments. The most powerful of these are our relationships with people. We are caught in relationships which make us believe that without a certain person or persons, our life is meaningless. We become overdependent on people, and to that extent less on God.

If we feel that a person or an object can meet our need, then it is logical that we would not feel strongly the need for God in our life. Only by giving up attachment to the worldly objects can a sincere desire for the Divine arise in our heart.

When we have made all the effort to gain knowledge of the Self and we are

The conclusion is quite clear - the removal of the impurity, i.e. purification of the mind is the most important Sadhana to prepare oneself for spiritual life.

Sometimes the past Karma of a seeker is so strong that he has a strong desire for God in spite of having some glaring impurities in his mind. This can be due to favourable Karma from previ-

ous births. The favourable Karma overrides the unfavourable effect of impurities in the mind. This can be to such an extent that it enables Sravana (listening) to take place successfully. One is able to understand clearly what the Guru is teaching.

A person who has accumulated great merit through selfless actions in his previous births could be blessed with a desire for God and with knowledge of God without having all his impurities cleaned away. However, even in this case the final goal of firm abidance in God cannot be attained until the mind gets purified.

We need 'Special Grace' to turn mind to God

We become over-dependent on relationships, and thus less on God

still not progressing, it is then we realize that real grace of God lies in increasing our Vairagya or dispassion. 'Ordinary Grace' is when we get what we want. This is what most people pray for. But we need the 'Special Grace' that turns our mind away from the world.

That is when real spiritual life begins. Longing for liberation cannot arise in a mind that is still dense with impurities. It is a case of desire for God versus desire for pleasure - which is stronger? To wait for the impurity to go away on its own without making any effort is just wishful thinking. It will never happen. We have to do the Sadhana to make it happen.

Some saints recommend that just being (i.e. Self abidance) is sufficient to get rid of the impurity in the mind. That is more of an exception. It requires great will power to succeed in doing that. In practice, it is more common to observe that the impurity in the mind prevents us from abiding in the Self.


The impurity even prevents us from having a desire for abiding in the Self.

There is no escaping the Sadhana to purify one's mind. It has to be done by one desiring to know the Truth. This emphatic need for purification is the main point, not the fact that an exception exists. There is no exception to having a pure mind in order to realize God.

Israel and the 'Clash of Civilizations': The Case for a Muslim Nuclear Security Framework

ong before Samuel Huntington gave it academic legitimacy, Israel began promoting the notion of a "clash of civilizations" as a strategic tool in the post-Cold War era. The purpose was clear: to position Israel as the vanguard of "Judeo-Christian civilization" under siege, thereby justifying its continued exploitation of U.S. power and resources. This ideological framing, packaged later by Huntington as a cultural theory, was in fact a geopolitical instrument aimed at sustaining American military and diplomatic support for Israel's regional ambitions.

This framework is no longer theoretical. Israel has actively applied the "clash of civilizations" logic in its wars against Hamas in Gaza and, more recently, in its attacks on Iran. These conflicts have been deliberately cast as religious battles-between "the children of light and the children of darkness", a binary drawn from biblical scripture and deployed to resonate with American religious and political narratives. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's references to the Old Testament, Reinhold Niebuhr's

senal, combined with its repeated threats and recent attacks, has forced Iran to reassess its strategic posture. In this context, Iran's appreciation of Pakistan's nuclear deterrent has grown. Despite complex regional dynamics, Tehran increasingly views Islamabad's nuclear stance as a stabilizing force that signals to Israel and its backers that unchecked aggression carries real risks.

Time for collective narrative

In the face of a collapsing international order, paralyzed by UN Security Council gridlock and Western double standards, it is time for Muslim-majority nations to consider a collective alternative. For many small and medium-sized states in the Islamic world, conventional deterrence is insufficient. Drawing from realist theory, particularly Kenneth Waltz's structural realism, a nuclear deterrence framework led by Pakistan emerges as not only a rational option but a necessary one.

A Pakistan-led Muslim nuclear security initiative would not be aimed at prolifera-

Children of Light and Children of Darkness, and civilizational rhetoric are calculated efforts to mobilize U.S. public opinion, political elites, and media in defense of Israel's militarized policies.

The civilizational narrative

This civilizational narrative has been aggressively promoted across American policymaking circles, social media ecosystems, and religious institutions. It has shaped the way Israel's actions in Gaza and toward Iran are framed, not as violations of international law or human rights, but as righteous wars of defense for Western civilization. In doing so, Israel has effectively turned American support into a religious and cultural allegiance rather than a strategic alliance, hollowing out the international legal system in the process.

Nowhere is the danger of this more evident than in Israel's ongoing hostility toward Iran. Israel's undeclared nuclear ar-

tion or escalation. Rather, it could serve as a stabilizing force, supporting the existing international order through multilateral cooperation. With Pakistan's technical capacity and strategic positioning, this framework could


provide a nuclear umbrella for countries under direct threat, such as Iran, Turkey, Egypt, Jordan, Gulf States, and Southeast Asian nations like Malaysia and Indonesia.

Such an initiative, guided by neoliberal institutionalism, would include shared protocols, joint inspections, and cooperation with international bodies like the IAEA. Drawing from constructivist theory, it could also foster a shared sense of purpose and identity among Muslim nations, one rooted not in confrontation, but in mutual assurance, stability, and a commitment to regional peace.

une 25-26 hardly creates a ripple in Indian polity anymore, save for a couple of newspaper articles by a dying breed of journalists and politicians who lived through those tumultuous times. Many among the younger generation got to know about this dark chapter in India's democratic evolution through the eponymous Bollywood film starring Kangana Ranaut, panned for its "selective storytelling".

Yet two generations of Indians have grown into adulthood since Indira Gandhi, in a midnight crackdown on June 25, 1975, curtailed fundamental rights, jailed political and other opponents, and imposed press censorship in the enforcement of a declaration of internal

rumors of midnight arrests of opposition leaders, and then the first call from a leading opposition figure of his impending arrest.

Acting on a tip-off, a colleague, Arul Louis, who is now a journalist in New York, and I in the absence of any senior reporters at that hour - rushed to the nearby Parliament Street police station to get the latest information (in an era where there no mobiles and landlines worked fitfully). It was past 2.30 a.m. and the city was asleep, blissfully unaware of the retributory machinations of a democratically elected prime minister, who was subverting democracy to stay in power in the face of a judicial verdict removing her from parliament after finding her guilty of electoral malpractices.

Yet two generations of Indians have grown into adulthood since Indira Gandhi, in a midnight crackdown on June 25, 1975, curtailed fundamental rights, jailed political and other opponents, and imposed press censorship in the enforcement of a declaration of internal emergency

emergency. Democratic India had not seen anything like this since British colonial rule and the next 21 months marked a watershed in the country's checkered history.

For a rookie sub-editor working on late-night duty in the newsroom of the United News of India (UNI) news agency the period marked a loss of political innocence. The events are still too vivid in memory: the first startling reports of the closure of newspaper printing presses, switching off of power and seizure of newspapers from places as far apart as Jalandhar and Indore; sightings of unusual security movement at many places, including Connaught Place in the capital;

Midnight swoops

Outside the sprawling whitecolonnaded police station there was unusual activity and riot police were driving out in trucks. The air was taut with tension. The two of us were asked to leave, but we hung on in the shadows. The defiant wait proved journalistically rewarding as very soon a white Ambassador car drove up in a flurry of escort vehicles. Wedged in between two plain clothed police officials was the familiar sight of Jayaprakash Narayan, hailed as "Lok Nayak", or 'people's leader', who the day before had given a call to the military and police at a massive public rally in Delhi to act on their conscience and disregard unconstitutional and immoral orders.

He reiterated his call for a program of social transformation which he termed "Sampoorna Kraanti" (total revolution).

As the tough-looking cops tried to shield the frail, gangling man, Narayan gave his terse reaction with words that were to make history: "Vinash kale vipreet buddhi" (reason takes flight as doom nears). We rushed back to our office to file the breaking news.

From then on the few of us who were privileged to be on the nocturnal beat worked feverishly to a climactic dawn. With the printed phone directory on our laps, every senior opposition leader was rung up and the tracking efforts proved rewarding. UNI's General Manager GG Mirchandani, though a former government official, encouraged us to keep the truth flowing and the public informed. Government censors arrived in the morning and took charge of the editorial operations as censorship set in.

Aides of Moraraji Desai, who was to later become the prime minister in 1977 heading a short-lived government, said he had been woken up by police and was being taken to jail. Similar stories were heard from the homes of Atal Bihari Vajpayee, Chandra Shekhar, Charan Singh, all of whom were to become prime ministers of India.

Sikander Bakht, who later became a cabinet minister in the Desai government and was one of the stalwarts of the Jana Sangh/BJP, said he had hidden in his bathroom when the police came calling and appealed to us to save him from arrest.

Last week, Khamenei rejected Trump's calls for surrender in his first televised message since Israel began its attacks on Iran. "Any US military intervention will undoubtedly be accompanied by irreparable damage," Khamenei said. It seems Iran has moved to uranium enrichment of 60 percent at its nuclear facilities, close to the 90 percent enrichment needed to make nuclear weapons, as per experts. However, like US intelligence reports, the United Nations nuclear watchdog also said it has found no evidence of Iranian nuclear weapons production. "We did not have any proof of a systematic effort to move into a nuclear weapon," said Rafael Grossi, director general of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) recently.

Trump's wavering stance on Iran has sparked serious concerns for many in his MAGA base, named after his campaign slogan, Make America Great Again. Those concerned supporters believe US involvement in a fresh war goes against Trump's campaign promise of putting America First and of staying out of conflicts involving others. "I may do it. I may not do it. I mean, nobody knows what I'm going to do," he told reporters outside the White House. Later, Trump said Iranian officials wanted to visit Washington for talks. He said it is "a little late" for such talks but "we may do that."

"The IC [intelligence community] continues to assess that Iran is not building a nuclear weapon and Supreme Leader Khamenei has not authorized the nuclear weapons program he suspended in 2003," Gabbard said, referring to a collection of US spy agencies that collaborate to make such assessments. On March 25th, Trump's director of national intelligence, Tulsi Gabbard, unambiguously told members of the US Congress that Iran was not moving towards building nuclear weapons. Since then, everything has changed within a week.

Trump unitarily used the Presidential power, and dropped the most powerful bombs on most of the key nuclear facilities in Iran.

Last week, Russia warned that Israel's attacks have brought the world "millimeters" from nuclear calamity, and Putin urged Trump against attacking Iran. Meanwhile, General Munir's recent visit to US, with his proposal of Nobel for Trump, crypto pact, and closed-door diplomacy regarding providing support for US forces in case of US involvement in Iran; might have trapped Trump like most of his predecessors as in Iraq, Afghanistan or Ukraine-Russia conflicts. The world knows how Pakistan shielded Bin Laden and squeezed US funds meant to fight Taliban, which were used to support terror base organizations.

It seems Trump, who promised Americans he will work hard to end any major war around the world and also limit further US involvement in future conflicts is now trapped in the quagmire of domestic politics and now global uncertainty. He may very well receive the Nobel or, may go down in history as the worst President, US ever had. The world leaders are watching how he has been used by rogue states like Pakistan, China and Russia, not to say the least, by the warmonger Netanyahu.

General Asim Munir has strategically engaged with Donald Trump, securing a White House meeting recently, while India has dismissed Trump's repeated claims of mediating between the two countries.

She said, "I found my soul through Yoga. It taught me how to breathe, how to listen to myself, and how to let go of things







PLACES TO VISIT IN MATHERAN



AR Rahman at IGF London 2025

LONDON: In a deeply personal and expansive conversation at the final day of India Global Forum London 2025 at Taj St. James' Court, Academy Award-winning composer AR Rahman urged artists, institutions, and governments alike to nurture creative freedom and cultural innovation.

* Oscar-winning composer on scent cinema, AI, and the reinvention of Indian music culture

"In cinema for over 40 years now, I was bored with the same rectangle form." Rahman confessed. "It's just seeing and hearing--what else can we do?" That question

sparked Le Musk, Rahman's pioneering immersive project that brings scent, touch, and narrative together. "The idea came from my ex-wife who loved perfumes. I thought, why not create a theatre experience with perfume and haptics?"

Now coming to London for a year, Le Musk is more than a film--it's an artistic manifesto, showcasing Rahman's contin-

ued defiance of convention.

The fireside chat turned from personal to philosophical, as Rahman explored the urgent need to preserve traditional Indian music, asking: "Where is the next shehnai player? Where is the next Bismillah Khan Sahib? Unless

we find them, recognize them,

and let the world see them--

they'll vanish. That's where the inspiration for JHAALA came in." JHAALA, Rahman's initiative to platform and preserve Indian classical arts, seeks to make the invisible visible--through technology, talent discovery, and global exposure.

On artificial intelligence, Rahman struck a balanced note of caution and curiosity: "Al is like Frankenstein--it just steals from human experiences, human knowledge, human art, and then puts together multiple thoughts. It's copied from us. And now it gets faster, because we feel with emotion--and it just runs on data."


