



India, US closer than any time in history, says Biden after meeting PM Modi

WASHINGTON: US President Joe Biden said after his recent meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi that ties with India are "stronger, closer and more dynamic than any time in history".

The two leaders met at Biden's home in Greenville, Delaware ahead of the fourth inperson summit of the Quad later in the day.

"The United States' partnership with India is stronger, closer, and more dynamic than any time in history." President Biden said on X after hosting Prime Minister Modi at his residence. "Prime Minister Modi, each time we sit down, I'm struck by our ability to find new areas of cooperation. Today was no different."

Their meeting started at 1 p.m. US eastern time and lasted over an hour as the Prime Minister's delegation, comprising External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar, Indian Ambassador to the US Vinay Kwatra and Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri, was seen leaving at about 2:30 p.m. Prime Minister Modi and President Biden were not open to the press but there will be a readout later in the day.

They will meet for the Quad summit

later, joined by Fumio Kishida and Anthony Albanese, their counterparts from Japan and Australia.

Earlier upon arrival, Biden received PM Modi at his residence with a handshake and the two leaders embraced, which has become a signature greeting for the Indian Prime Minister. The Prime Minister's office posted pictures of the two leaders taking in the view from the president's house.

At the meeting with PM Modi, the US President was accompanied by Secretary of State Antony Blinken, National Security Adviser Jake Sullivan and US Ambassador to India Eric Garcetti.

"Today's program will be focused on the Quad Summit and the bilateral meeting with @POTUS, @JoeBiden," the Prime Minister wrote on X shortly after landing in Philadelphia, from where he travelled to Wilmington, Biden's hometown in the adjoining state of Delaware. "I am sure the discussions throughout the day will contribute to making our planet better and addressing key global challenges."

Prime Minister Modi is expected to leave for New York later in the night. IANS



Indian national handed over to BSF week after abduction in Bangladesh

AGARTALA: Nearly a week after an Indian national was reportedly abducted while he was visiting in Bangladesh with a valid passport and documents, the Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) handed him over to the Border Security Force (BSF), in presence of immigration and police officials of the two countries.

A BSF spokesman said that during a company commander-level flag meeting in southern Tripura last week, BGB informed BSF that the Indian national would be handed over to the Indian authorities soon.

The BGB officials told the BSF officials that the Indian national Challa Fur Mog was under the custody of Bangladesh Police at Chattogram.

The BSF spokesman said, on Thursday (Sept 19) one Swapna Mog informed BSF officials that her husband (Challa Fur Mog), a resident of Mogpara in South Tripura district was abducted by miscreants in Bangladesh.

Quoting the lady, BSF said that the 42-year-old Indian citizen went to Bangladesh on September 13 with a valid passport and visa to visit his relatives and while he was returning he was allegedly abducted by a group of Bangladeshi miscreants who demanded Rs one lakh as ransom for release.

BSF officials immediately approached the BGB and then the flag meeting was held between BOP Belonia and BGB BOP Majumdarhat. *IANS*

Turkey introduces tech visa to attract foreign entrepreneurs

ANKARA: Turkey has launched a new tech visa program to attract foreign entrepreneurs, aiming to boost its economy and innovation sector.

Industry and Technology Minister Mehmet Fatih Kacir announced the initiative earlier this week, offering expedited work permits for up to three years for foreign nationals starting businesses in the country. The program includes tax benefits, mentoring, healthcare coverage and access to innovation centers, Xinhua news agency reported.

Government officials say the goal is to enhance local workforce capabilities and diversify the innovation ecosystem. The move comes as part of a broader strategy to address brain drain concerns, with thousands of highly educated Turks, particularly doctors and engineers, leaving for opportunities in Europe in recent years due to the country's economic woes.

Accepted entrepreneurs will receive six months of consultancy on legal, financial, and technical aspects of their businesses. Kacir said the pro-

gram aims to transform Turkey into an epicenter of global attraction

research and development in Türkiye lag behind advanced countries, adding that he has observed that people from Eastern

serving international clients.

Ankara-based entrepreneur Tekin Kahraman highlighted Türkiye's strengths in sectors including defense, aviation, space and fintech.

The government aims to foster 100,000 tech-driven startups by 2030, with at least 100 reaching a valuation of \$1 billion or more. Currently, six startups in Turkey meet that criterion.

Financial crunch adds to Pak passport printing woes

LAHORE: In Pakistan, a delay in government funding for a new advanced passport printing machine has created a severe problem, with approximately

8,00,000 people waiting for their passports, according to Daily Pakistan.

Despite placing an order and finalizing a tender, the Finance Division has not yet released the PKR 2.9 billion needed, resulting in a substantial backlog, Daily Pakistan reported.

Although the backlog once exceeded 1.5 million, it has since been reduced. However, the Passport and Immigration Department, which generates between PKR 50 and 51 billion annually, is struggling to meet demand due to the lack of a new machine, according to Daily Pakistan.



Department officials have expressed frustration, highlighting that despite their significant revenue contributions, they have not

received the necessary funds to address the rising demand for passports.

"We receive between 72,000 and 75,000 applications each day

but can only process 22,000, leaving many applicants in limbo," a senior official told Daily Pakistan on the condition of anonymity.

The situation is further complicated by import restrictions that hinder the acquisition of crucial equipment. Although the legal processes are com-

plete and an order has been placed, bureaucratic delays are obstructing the purchase of the new machine. *ANI*

"Granting 35% fewer international student permits this year": Canada tightens immigration rules

OTTAWA: In a significant move, Canada said that it is taking steps to manage its temporary resident population by reducing the number of study permits issued to international students and tightening eligibility for work permits.

Notably, the government plans to reduce the number of study permits from 4,85,000 in 2024 to 4,37,000 in 2025, a 10 percent decrease.

Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau announced the decision of reducing the number of study permits granted to foreign students and said that when "bad actors" abuse the immigration system, "we crack down."

Sharing a post on X, Trudeau wrote,

"We're granting 35% fewer international student permits this year. And next year, that number's going down by another 10%."

In a news release, the Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Department of the Government of Canada said, "We are announcing a reduction in the intake cap on international student study permits for 2025 based on a 10 percent reduction from the 2024 target of 4,85,000 new study permits issued, and then stabilizing the intake cap for 2026 such that the number of study permits issued remains the same as 2025. For 2025, this means reducing study permits issued to 4,37,000."

The 2025-2026 study-permit intake cap will include masters and doctoral students who will now have to submit a provincial or territorial attestation letter. "We will be reserving approximately 12% of allocation spaces for these students in recognition of the benefits they bring to the Canadian labor market," the news release said.

Meanwhile, Miller in a statement said that the action is being taken to strengthen temporary residence programs and emphasized preserving the integrity of the Canadian immigration system.

"The reality is that not everyone who wants to come to Canada will be able to-just like not everyone who wants to stay in Canada will be able to. We are taking action to strengthen our temporary residence programs and roll out a more comprehensive immigration plan to meet the demands of today's changing landscape. Our immigration system must preserve its integrity, and be well managed and sustainable. And as we look forward, we will do everything it takes to achieve that goal and set newcomers up for success," Miller said. *ANI*

'India has the potential to become \$10 trillion economy by 2032'

NEW DELHI: Driven by strong GDP growth and robust manufacturing and emphasis on building infrastructure, India is on its way to becoming the third largest economy soon and has the potential to add \$1 trillion to its GDP every 1.5 years to reach the \$10 trillion economy mark by 2032, a new report showed.

The country is expected to become a \$4 trillion economy in 2024-2025, which would make it the world's fourth-largest economy.

According to a report by IDBI Capital, the country is on track to become a \$10 trillion economy by 2032, positioning itself as the world's third-largest economy by 2030.

"By adding USD 1tn every 1.5 years going forward, India is forecasted to emerge as the third-largest global economy over the next six years," the report noted.

Ten years ago, India was the 10th largest economy in the world, with a GDP of \$1.9 trillion at current market prices.

US mulls ban on Chinese software in connected vehicles from 2027

WASHINGTON: The US Department of Commerce has proposed a rule to prohibit the import or sale of connected vehicles integrating certain software and hardware with a "nexus" to China or Russia, citing national security concerns.

The department's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) published a notice of the proposed rule amid concerns that those cars with cameras, sensors, software and other components -- manufactured in China -- could be used to glean sensitive data about drivers and passengers, as well as U.S. infrastructure.

The rule is expected to lead South Korean automakers to readjust their supply chains if they have used prohibited software and components from China. But the measure would make it difficult for their potential Chinese competitors to enter the U.S. market, observers said, reports Yonhap news agency.

The prohibitions on software would take effect for the 2027 model year, and those on hardware would go into force for the

2030 model year, or January 1, 2029, for units without a model year, the department said.

The rule focuses on hardware and software integrated into the Vehicle Connectivity System (VCS) and software integrated into the Automated Driving System (ADS).

The VCS refers to the set of

The department called the proposed rule a "proactive" measure designed to protect national security, saying it has found that certain technologies originating from China or Russia present an "undue" risk to U.S. critical infra-

IPEF members are not required to join all pillars, and each agreement can be implemented with the participation of at least five countries, Yonhap news agency reported.

Trade Minister Cheong In-kyo discussed the progress of the IPEF with participating nations, officials said.

Seoul's trade ministry said the

implementation of these additional pillars will help create new business opportunities, generate jobs and expand investment cooperation, particularly in the clean energy sector.

The fair economy agreement is expected to enhance taxation and administrative transparency within the bloc, fostering a more equitable business environment among member nations, the

 $ministry\ added.$

Meanwhile, India signed key agreements focused on a clean economy, fair economy and the IPEF Overarching arrangement during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's meeting with the leaders at the Quad Summit in the US.

The IPEF 'Clean Economy Agreement' aims to promote technical cooperation, workforce development, capacity building, and research collaborations; and collaborate to facilitate development, access, and deployment of clean energy and climate-friendly technologies.

It aims to collectively accelerate efforts of IPEF partners towards energy security and transition, climate resilience and adaptation and GHG emissions mitigation, said the ministry. IANS

As part of the official visit, the Finance Minister is expected to call on HE Shavkat Mirziyoyev, President of Uzbekistan. She will sign a bilateral investment treaty (BIT) between India and Uzbekistan, according to the ministry.

The treaty aims to promote more extensive economic cooperation for the mutual benefit of both countries on a long-term basis.

FM Sitharaman is also set to also participate in the India-Uzbekistan business forum discussions, jointly organized as well as represented by industry captains from

both the countries.

chain with about 1,500 facilities across the US and Canada from the investment company Blackstone in a \$525 million cash deal, the US firm said.

With the acquisition of G6 Hospitality, parent company of the two budget lodging chains, Oyo will become a major player in the US and Canadian hospitality industry, which is already dominated by Indian Americans. Blackstone said that Motel 6's franchise network produces gross room revenues of \$1.7 billion.

Motel 6 is ubiquitous across the US and Canada known for its relatively cheap rooms that, however, conform to the corporate standards in maintenance and hospitality.

Stay 6 is an extended stay network for guests who want to rent rooms with more facilities for longer periods. Oyo International CEO Gautam Swaroop said that the group will continue to operate as a separate entity.

"This acquisition is a significant milestone for a startup company like us to strengthen our international presence", he said. *IANS*

India becomes 3rd global cross-border capital destination for land, development sites

MUMBAI: India rose to third place in the list of global cross-border capital destinations for land and development sites in the first half of 2024, a report showed, adding that investments in Indian real estate sector will remain steady.

With \$3.5 billion of inflows in the January-June period, institutional investor interest in Indian real estate has remained firm.

While 70 percent of investments during H1 2024 were focused on ready assets, India's fast-paced growth and infrastructure development will continue to offer numerous opportunities in developmental assets over the coming years, according to the report by Colliers.

Foreign investment in India's industrial and warehousing sector has been gaining significant traction in recent times.

In H1 2024, nearly 70 percent

of the total foreign inflows in India's real estate sector were directed towards industrial and warehousing assets.

"Investor affinity is being driven by rising demand from third-party logistics (3PL) and etal Markets and Investment Services at Colliers India.

The growing appeal of India as a key destination for industrial investments reinforces long-term confidence in the sector, he added.



commerce players and strengthening of manufacturing capabilities across key industrial corridors of the country," said Piyush Gupta, Managing Director, CapiThe Asia Pacific region was home to four of the top 10 global cross-border capital sources in the first half of 2024 - Singapore, Hong Kong, Japan and China. In India, investments in industrial and warehousing and office assets remained strong in the first half of the year. Investments in Industrial assets especially were 5 times, compared to same period last year.

Amid rising demand for superior quality Grade A assets and evolving supply-chain models, global investor confidence in the sector is improving significantly, the report mentioned.

Backed by robust domestic demand, healthy GDP growth and likely easing of monetary policy in the next few quarters, investments in Indian real estate sector will remain steady.

"Evident from a 73 percent share during H1 2024, foreign inflows will continue to dominate institutional investments in the near-term," said Vimal Nadar, Senior Director and Head of Research, Colliers India. *IANS*

India's office real estate to surge amid robust fundamentals: HSBC Global Research

NEW DELHI: The office market of India's real estate is poised for a promising future in the coming months, highlighted a report by HSBC Global Research.

The report noted that although India's office Real Estate Investment Trusts (REITs) have underperformed the broader market for the past five years, they have started to rerate positively over the last year, indicating potential for growth.

"Despite the strong economy, India office REITs have significantly underperformed the broader market over for five years," said the report.

As per the report, the analysts believe there is more upside to come, as the market has yet to fully reflect the robust fundamentals that underpin it.

It added that since 2011, office rentals in India have shown consistent growth, yet the stock prices of office REITs have not matched this upward trend. This discrepancy suggests that current valuations are attractive, providing a compelling opportunity for investors.

"We see more upside. Despite consistent growth in office

rentals since 2011, stocks have yet to fully price in the strong fundamentals and valuation is dian market is particularly bullish as it is believed to be in a structural upcycle. Grade A office



attractive" the report added.

The report added that the In-

rents have steadily increased since 2001, and the pace of

growth is strong and healthy, positioning India as a resilient player in the global office market.

Remarkably, the Indian office market emerged largely unscathed from the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. Rental rates remained stable even during lockdowns, highlighting the market's resilience.





Steep increase in imposter scam losses: What people are reporting and how to fight back

he Federal Trade Commission (FTC) received 2.6 million con sumer complaints about online, over-the-phone, and in-person scams. Many people think scams mostly affect older adults, however, anyone can be scammed. Reports suggest that many scams are harming younger people more than older adults. 1 in 4 Americans reported losing money to some form of scam in 2023. According to the FTC, the median loss to FTC impersonators has increased from \$3,000 in 2019 to \$7,000 in 2024. Scammers gain the trust of vic-

tims by posing as government officials, Social Security Administration employees, or representatives of well-known companies such as Amazon and Microsoft, and quickly ask victims to provide sensitive information or transfer funds. At Ethnic Media Services briefing on Sep 20, experts from the FTC Bureau of Consumer Protection shared tips on how to avoid some of the most devious scams and what to do if you or someone you care about becomes ensnared.

Emma Fletcher, a consumer rights expert at the FTC, said, "these scammers use panic and a sense of urgency to force victims to take quick action, even going

against the norm to transfer money or provide personal information. She added, "Especially in cases where the name of a well-known company is used, the victim often thinks that he is communicating with a legitimate company or government department, and ends up falling into a trap." She pointed out that scammers are constantly evolving their methods, and scam messages are often disguised as legitimate-looking email or text message notifi-

FTC also specifically pointed out that fraud reporting data only reflects the tip of the iceberg, and many victims do not take the initiative to report out of shame or self-blame.

To help the public respond to this growing threat, the FTC has proposed precautionary measures that begin with identity verification and that any requests for sensitive information or funds transfers should be verified through official

cations, such as false shipment delays, account security issues or unpaid fines. A growing number of cases show victims being asked to pay via unusual methods, such as cryptocurrency transfers or gift cards.

Kati Daffan, Assistant Director, Division of Marketing Practices, Federal Trade Commission, Washington, District of Columbia said that the new regulations clearly stipulate that more severe penalties will be adopted for those who impersonate governments and businesses to commit fraud and provide more legal assistance to victims. The

channels. Secondly, avoid hasty decisions. Never share the verification codes sent to you by your bank - especially not to someone claiming to be from your bank. No caller will ever ask for the verification code, especially not someone from your bank's fraud department.

Scammers often try to create a sense of urgency and force victims to make quick financial decisions. If you encounter any possible fraud, you should immediately report it to the FTC or local law enforcement agency. 

Urad Vade for Pitru Paksha

rad Vade is a dish typically prepared during Pitru Paksha, a 16-day lunar period when families pay homage to their ancestors and offer food to the departed souls, with each region having its own customs and rituals.

Ingredients

- 4 Servings (1 serving = 7-8 pieces)
- 1 1/2 cup Urad dal
- 1cup water to soak them
- 1tsp Cumin seeds
- Salt to taste
- Oil to deep fry

How to make Urad Vade

- 1. In a bowl, take 1.5 cups of Urad dal. Wash and soak them in 1-cup water for 30 minutes.
- 2. Blend Urad dal into fine paste without adding extra water. The water used for soaking is enough for dal to grind them.
- 3. Batter should be fine and smooth. Pour the batter in a big bowl.





- 4. Add cumin seeds and pinch of salt. Mix well and whisk using your fingers until it turns fluffy.
- 5. Check the consistency by adding a small drop of batter in a bowl of water. If it floats that means, the batter is ready to fry as Vade.
- 6. While whisking the batter, heat oil. Fry the Vade by choosing the size as per your choice. Smaller size takes around 4 5 min to make crispy Vades.
- 7. Now, Vades are ready to be offered as homage to our ancestors. Of course, you can make these Vades for teatime.

Tips & Tricks

- 1. Batter should be nice and fluffy otherwise it will absorb more oil and Vades turn soggy.
- 2. You can add grated ginger, chopped green chilies and coconuts, and mustard and coriander seeds tadka to enhance flavor.
- 3. You can also use coconut and roasted Chana dal chutney as a dip to make them tastier.

Shraddha rituals are performed not only as homage to departed souls but also believed that performing Shraddha rites and offering prayers can bring blessings and peace to the departed souls and helps them to attain liberation or moksha.

During Pitru Paksha, people remember their ancestors and perform Shraddha karma as per their ancestor's Shraddha Tithi by offering Pind Daan for them. Special attention is given to the preparation of foods of their ancestors' liking; perform good deeds, and charities while performing rituals during this period. It is consid-

such as engagements, marriages, starting a new business ventures or a job or other celebrations should not be held during Pitru Paksha. It is also believed that cutting your hair or nails during this time is unlucky and disrespectful to the celebration of Shraddha.

Whom we should worship during Pitru Paksha?

Pitru Paksha, a special period for Sanatanis to pay homage to their deceased ancestors. Therefore, it is advised to focus on honoring ancestors and performing Shraddha rituals, special offerings should feed Brahmins especially on the day of Amavasya (New Moon Day).

How to offer water to Pitru?

Tarpan must be done by facing the East or South directions. Copper vessels should be used; if not available, you can also use silver vessels. Take black sesame seeds in right hand. While chanting PITRU-MANTRA, pour water over sesame seeds into plate. Water has to flow between thumb & index finger AND NOT from front of palm.

The oldest or the youngest son usually does the Tarpan rite. In their absence,

Pitru Paksha Tarpan ritual is the offering of water mixed with gingelly to the manes (dead ancestors). Though we have several ancestors, this offering is addressed to three however, other members including women of the household are permitted to conduct Tarpan for their ancestors.

Study shows antidepressants may improve brain function

NEW DELHI: A class of drugs that are commonly prescribed to treat depression, and anxiety may also help improve brain function and memory, claimed a study.

The study, published in the journal Biological Psychiatry, showed that SSRI (Selective Serotonin Reuptake Inhibitors) antidepressants have the potential to improve certain cognitive functions, such as verbal memory.

Verbal memory is the ability to remember words, sentences. stories, and other information presented through language.

Serotonin is often described as a 'feel good' chemical, and higher levels of serotonin circulating in the brain contribute to a sense of well-being, and can ease clinical depression in most sufferers.



Researchers from the Copenhagen University Hospital in the Netherlands measured brain function in 90 patients before and after taking the SSRI escitalopram daily for eight weeks.

The team scanned the participant's brain to measure the quantity of the serotonin receptor, the 5HT4 receptor. The patients were also given a series of tests to measure mood and cognitive

About 40 patients were rescanned to measure the quantity of 5HT4 receptor in the brain.

The results showed that the levels of 5HT4 receptor had dropped by around 9 percent in the brain and the mood of the patients also improved.

Further cognitive tests showed improvements, so that the less the 5HT4 receptor had changed the better the cognitive outcome. This phenomenon was particularly prominent for the ability to recall words, the researchers said. IANS

'One Earth, One Health': India to contribute \$7.5 mn under 'Quad Cancer Moonshot' initiative, says PM Modi

WASHINGTON: Affirming India's vision of 'One Earth, One Health', Prime Minister Narendra Modi has announced a contribution of \$7.5 million for sampling kits, detection kits and vaccines under the 'Quad Cancer Moonshot' initiative.

The groundbreaking initiative was announced during the sixth Quad Leaders' Summit in Wilmington, Delaware recently and aims to save lives in the Indo-Pacific region by combating cervical cancer.

Speaking during the Cancer Moonshot event in Wilmington, Prime Minister Modi said that he is glad that in Quad, "we have decided to jointly face the challenge of cervical cancer".

"I heartily congratulate President Biden for organizing this important event. It reflects our shared determination for afford-



able, accessible and quality healthcare," the Prime Minister

"In cancer care, collaboration is essential for cure. An integrated approach of prevention, screening, diagnosis and treat-

ment is necessary to reduce the burden of cancer," he asserted.

Prime Minister Modi noted that India is running a "very costeffective" cervical cancerscreening program on a mass scale. "Also, India is running the

world's largest health insurance scheme. And, special centers have also been created to make medicines available to everyone at affordable cost. India has also developed its own vaccine for cervical cancer. And, new treatment protocols are also being introduced with the help of AI," he said, adding that India is ready to share its experience and ex-

"I am happy that India will contribute 40 million vaccine doses for the Indo-Pacific countries under the GAVI and QUAD initiatives. These 40 million vaccine doses will bring rays of hope to the lives of crores of people. As you can see, when the QUAD acts, it is not just for nations - it is for the people. This is the true essence of our human-centric approach," he concluded. IANS

Depression during pregnancy linked to specific brain activity: Study

NEW DELHI: Scientists have linked symptoms of depression during pregnancy to a specific brain activity, and hope to develop test for "baby blues" risk.

Around 80 percent of women suffer from "baby blues" after the birth of their child.

Normally, this is a brief period of feeling down which disappears in a few days. But around one woman in seven develops postpartum depression, a more serious depression which can affect how mothers bond with their baby and can have long-term consequences.

These women seem unable to regulate the negative emotions which can follow giving birth.

A group of European research-

ers have found that in healthy pregnant women, activity in a specific area deep in the brain is linked to regulation of negative emotions and the tendency towards symptoms of depression.

The researchers hope that testing for this activity, along with how

emotions are regulated, will indicate which women are at risk for postpartum depression.

"This is among the first trials to compare brain activity in pregnant and non-pregnant women. The ability to regulate emotions is


> essential for mental health, and this interplay was our starting point," said Franziska Weinmar, University of Tubingen, Germany.

For the study, the researchers took 15 healthy pregnant women with very high estrogen levels (due to the pregnancy).

Each woman was put in an MRI scanner and shown upsetting/disturbing pictures. The team found that in the MRI scans, pregnant women who showed more activity

in the amygdala while regulating their emotions were less successful in controlling emotions.

In addition, pregnant women with this greater activity in the amygdala reported more symptoms of depression. IANS



Investors prefer regular hefty returns, tax benefits post Covid: Report

NEW DELHI: Degree of returns, regularity of returns, and tax benefits are the significant factors influencing post-Covid investment decisions, according to a recent report.

The report, jointly made by the PHD Research Bureau, PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry, and Jagan In-

stitute of Management Studies (JIIMS), Rohini, aims to analyze the factors influencing individual investments across various financial instruments and to compare the investor behaviors towards selected financial instruments in pre and post-Covid years.

"India's capital market has witnessed a robust performance during the post-Covid years supported by the strong regulatory environment, high growth of the economy, and investors' confidence in India's growth story," said Sanjeev Agrawal, President, PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

"Going ahead, our capital market is seen with outstanding performance in the coming years, as India is going to be the third largest economy soon and have a size of \$7 trillion by 2030," Agrawal added.

The period considered for the analysis includes two years of pre-pandemic (FY 2018-2020) and two years of

post-pandemic (FY 2021-23)

A total of 6 financial instruments were considered to assess the changing investor preferences in pre- Covid and post-Covid pandemic years including mutual funds, bonds, stocks, derivatives, gold, and real estate.

The participants were also given a multiple-choice

questionnaire based on five factors including the degree of risk, tax benefits, liquidity, degree of returns, and regularity of returns (from the Investment option).

The analysis showed that in pre-Covid times, the degree of returns and the regularity of returns guided the decision to diversify the portfolio.

Conversely, in the post-Covid pandemic years, tax benefits along with the degree of returns and regularity of returns influenced the investing decisions

Investment in mutual funds was largely influenced by the degree of returns, regularity of returns, and degree of risk in the pre-Covid period.

But, the post-Covid period saw more influence of liquidity rather than the degree of risk involved along with the degree of returns and regularity of returns in the mutual fund investments, the report said. *IANS*

Canada announces new support for global polio eradication

OTTAWA: The Canadian federal government announced new funding for the eradication of polio worldwide. According to a news release issued by Global Affairs Canada, \$111 million was earmarked to support the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI), bringing Canada's historical contribution to over \$737 million since 2000.

GPEI and partners like UNICEF and the World Health Organization will deliver and expand quality, accessible polio immunization and health services around the world including conflict-affected regions where there is little or no access to essential health services, it said.

Efforts will focus on stopping the transmission of all forms of poliovirus by vaccinating more than 370 million children annually against polio, preventing 600,000 children annually from suffering from paralysis and death, Xinhua news agency reported quoting Global Affairs Canada.

Polio is a highly infectious viral disease that affects children under five and can result in severe paralysis and death. Since the launch of the GPEI in 1988, more than 2.5 billion children have been immunized against polio. Although polio cases have decreased by 99 percent worldwide, the disease has not yet been eradicated. *IANS*

Quad will stand up for a free, open Indo-Pacific region

NEW DELHI: The Quad will stand up for a free and open Indo-Pacific region in all eventualities, White House officials have said, adding that there is no dilution in terms of its focus.

Josh Rubin, National Security Council Director for Indo-Pacific Affairs at the White House, said this while replying to a question from IANS.

The comprehensive question asked was: There is a section that believes the Quad hasn't become as muscular as it would like, with softer issues occupying its agenda over real challenges in the South China Sea. Any comments on this? And has the focus on the Indo-Pacific diluted due to Russia's war with Ukraine and the dominance of European continental security because of it?

Also, doesn't it benefit China, allowing a free pass for fresh aggression in the South China Sea or Taiwan Strait?

Rubin replied that the Quad is working to deliver in the areas the partners identify as priorities for them. Maritime security is a priority for many partners across the

Indo-Pacific region.

"That is why the Quad is stepping up to ensure that countries across the region have a better ability and capacity to see what is happening in their exclusive economic zones. So we will continue to do that in partnership with countries across

the region because it is at their request and in partnership with them on issues across the region that are, obviously, of concern, including in the South China Sea, East China Sea and elsewhere," said the National Security Council Director.

He said that this year's Quad joint lead-

ers statement included the strongest ever language they have used on issues in the South China Sea, in particular, as well as, issues related to the increasing provocations from North Korea.

"So I think you can continue to expect, that when and that the Quad will stand up for a free and open Indo-Pacific region," he said.

He emphasized, "When actions are taken that undermine a free and open Indo-Pacific region, the Quad will continue, to speak out on those."

Nancy Izzo Jackson, Deputy Assistant Secretary for South and Central Asian Affairs, while replying to IANS question said, "The war in Ukraine does not dilute our focus on the Indo-Pacific. I think it's clear by just the sheer number of meetings that we have at the foreign minister and the leaders level, we demonstrate our continued commitment to this region."

Jackson further said that there was no dilution in terms of the focus in trying to "really promote an open and safe and prosperous Indo-Pacific". IANS

Tech, biosciences CEOs meet with PM Modi, express 'immense optimism'

NEW YORK: Prime Minister Narendra Modi met with the top technology and biosciences leaders after outlining his vision of making India a technology powerhouse at a rally of the diaspora.

After the meeting with 15 CEOs from chip design and manufacture, IT, and biosciences fields, he posted on X that he was "glad to see immense optimism towards India".

His administration was "committed to making India a global hub of semiconductor manufacturing" and a biotech powerhouse, PM Modi told them, according to the Ministry of External Affairs press re-

He said India's policy is "to promote AI for All, underpinned by its ethical and responsible use".

PM Modi's X post called the roundtable "fruitful" and that they discussed technology and innovation while he "highlighted the strides made by India in this field".

He met separately with Kris Singh, the CEO of Holtec International, a company that makes small nuclear reactors.

"They discussed Holtec's plan to expand manufacturing in India and the potential for boosting cooperation in the field of civil nuclear energy," said an X post from MEA Spokesperson Randhir Jaisal.

The MEA release said the roundtable with the CEOs of tech and bioscience focused on artificial intelligence and quantum computing; biotechnology and life sciences; computing, IT and communication, and semiconductor technologies.

The release said they had a "deep dive" on the evolving technology landscape at a global level and "how these cutting-edge

technologies are contributing to the wellbeing of people around the world, including in India".

PM Modi assured the CEOs about India's "deep commitment" to protecting intellectual property, the MEA said.

During his third term, "India will make every effort to become the third largest economy in the world", he said, asking them "to take advantage of India's growth story for collaboration and innovation".

"They can co-develop, co-design, and co-produce in India for the world, harnessing the opportunities from India's economic and technological growth," the release said.

While on previous visits to the US, he has met with many tech leaders, this time there were more from the chip, semiconductor, and biosciences fields.

The leaders from the chip field were CEOs Jensen Huang of Nvidia, Lisa Su of AMD, Tim Archer of Lam Research, Thomas Caulfield of Global Foundries, and Arvind Krishna of IBM.

CEOs Shantanu Narayen of Adobe, Sundar Pichai of Google, Enrique Lores of HP, and Hans Vestberg of Verizon from the IT sector were at the roundtable.

From life sciences and biotech came, CEOs Chris Viehbacher of Biogen, Chris Boerner of Briston Squibb Myers, David Ricks of Eli Lilly, and Noubar Afeyan, the chairman of Moderna.

The MEA release said they expressed their strong interest in investing and collaborating with India seeing its "growing prominence as a global technology hub, driven by its innovation-friendly policies and flourishing market opportunities". IANS

The right kind of leadership, the delegation of 'knowledge-based' decision-making and the existence of an absolutely fair system of credit-sharing in the organisation, pretty much summarises the prerequisites of the much-needed management reform.

More than anywhere else, security management requires a leader who commands the complete faith of those reporting to him. Such a leader is strict in tasking but was 'nurtural' towards the subordinates - he clearly understood that the success of security was always a collective affair and a systemic outcome.

Forces handling internal security realised that action lay closer to the ground

where people lived and that the local officer sometimes was the first to have information about what was there which required an immediate response. A healthy practice of delegation of power to take

a decision and act on it was therefore required to be adopted and evolved with experience.

Finally, while confidentiality was built into the management of security it was crucial to establish a system that guaranteed the award of credits where due- a senior usurping the credits of a junior is not something unknown in the profession of Police and security but such a thing would always be injurious for the force and would weaken the organisation. The success of the premium Intelligence agency of the Centre-Intelligence Bureau- was attributable to many factors the most important of which was that the system did not allow any 'stealing' of the credit- the organisation was quite transparent internally within the 'need to know' conditions even as it rightly appeared to be opaque from the outside.



As world abandons Afghanistan, Taliban, IS and ISK-P feed on each other to export terror

he Islamic State of Iraq and Sham (ISIS), also known as Daesh, officially declared the establishment of its offshoot, the Islamic State of Khorasan Province (ISK-P), in the South Asia region in 2015. Since ISK-P began its activities in Afghanistan, the Taliban have declared their opposition to the Islamic State and instructed their fighters to combat Islamic State and kill their leaders and fighters. Historically, the differences between the Taliban and ISIS did not start with the establishment of ISK-P. In fact, the difference between the Taliban and the Islamic State predates ISK-P's presence in Afghanistan, dating back to when the Islamic State controlled large parts of Iraq and Syria. At that time, the first caliph of ISIS, Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi, referred to the late Emir of the Taliban, Mullah Mohammad Omar, as a warlord, illiterate, and an insignificant figure. He also criticized him as someone lacking spirituality and political vision.

The Taliban and the Islamic State share similar ideologies and strategies, such as being influenced by Wahhabism and Salafism, establishment of a caliphate-style government, jihad against non-Muslims, and the imposition of Sharia law. Despite their similar ideology and strategy they dislike each other. Indeed their rivalry stems not from differences in their interpretation of Islam or types of government but rather from competition over resources, validation, and leadership supremacy. The Taliban believe their leader is the only rightful Emir-ul-Momineen (Commander of the Faithful) with the legitimacy to lead the Muslim Ummah (Nation). Therefore, they consider it mandatory for other Islamist groups to pledge allegiance to the Emir of the Taliban. Daesh holds the same belief, claiming that their caliph is the rightful leader who should be accepted as the caliph of the entire Muslim Ummah.

These issues have made the

Taliban and ISK-P sworn enemies. Another notable claim by the Taliban is their rejection of Salafi ideology, asserting that they follow Hanafi Islam and have no connection to the radical Salafi movement. However, in contrast to their claims, the Taliban's methods of governance and interpretation of Sharia are closely aligned with Wahhabism and Salafism. The Hanafi school of Islam is traditionally known for its more moderate and anti-radical interpretation of Islamic teachings.

Internecine battles in Afghanistan

In light of this, when the Taliban seized power in August 2021, observers in Afghanistan viewed ISK-P as the main challenger to Taliban rule. Since then, ISK-P has carried out multiple

former members of the Afghanistan security forces, executed under the pretense of being ISK-P affiliates. Additionally, the Taliban have conducted operations in other parts of the country, including Herat, Kandahar, Parwan, Kabul, and Balkh provinces. It is believed that in these operations, the Taliban targeted members of the National Resistance Forces (NRF), the primary anti-Taliban group, under the pretext of fighting ISK-P. Overall, there is a widespread belief that the Taliban are using ISK-P as a pretext to suppress former members of the Afghanistan security forces and the NRF.

After conducting such operations, the Taliban claimed they had eliminated Daesh in Afghanistan. In contrast to their claim,

suicide attacks in Kabul. Kandahar. Herat. and Badakhshan provinces, and has targeted Taliban leaders, such as Daud Muzamil, the Taliban governor of Balkh Province. In response, the Taliban launched search operations against ISK-P members in eastern provinces like Nangarhar and Kunar. During these operations, the Taliban killed several individuals suspected of having ties to ISK-P. However, there are claims that many of those killed were not ISK-P members, but rather

ISK-P has expanded its area of activity across Afghanistan and improved its operational capabilities compared to the pre-Taliban period. According to international security agencies, ISK-P's operational capacity has increased. The latest UN Security Council report confirms this.

A WEEK OF PAIN & HOPE

Weaponizing ordinary communication devices represents a new development in warfare. The recent events targeting thousands of Lebanese people using pagers, two-way radios and electronic equipment, is a violation of international human rights law, the United Nations human rights chief said last week. Volker Türk told an emergency meeting of the U.N. Security Council there must be an independent and transparent investigation of these devices that exploded, reportedly killing 37 people and injuring more than 3,400 others. "Those who ordered and carried out these attacks must be held to account," he said.

Lebanon blames Israel for the attacks, which appeared to target Hezbollah militants but also caused civilian casualties, including children.

Hezbollah has fought many conflicts with Israel, including a war in 2006, and it has conducted near-daily strikes against Israel to support Hamas militants who attacked Israel on Oct. 7. Whether we like it or not, new and advanced technologies are going to be the next generation weapons, like the pagers and handheld devices used last week in the attack on Lebanese citizens. In very near future besides drones, humariods or robots will soon replace conventional soldiers.

In the meantime Russia-Ukraine war seems to have escalated further, with both sides exercising long-range weapons of destruction. One can hope Prime Minister Narendra Modi, during three-day visit to US, for Quad Summit (India, United States, Australia and Japan) can bring some positive outcome to contain China's growing influence in the Indo-Pacific.

President Biden shared with Prime Minister Modi that United States supports initiatives to reform global institutions to reflect India's important voice, including permanent membership for India in a reformed UN Security Council.


Modi also announced 7.5 million US dollars worth of support of sampling and detection kits, and vaccines, to fight cervical cancer as part of India's vision of "One Earth One Health". PM Modi, during Quad summit's Cancer Moonshot event in Delaware, mentioned New Delhi's initiative to fight cervical cancer and said that India was ready to share its expertise.

"Four years since elevating the Quad to a leader-level format, the Quad is more strategically aligned than ever before and is a force for good that delivers real, positive, and enduring impact for the Indo-Pacific," said the Wilmington Declaration issued after the fourth in-person Quad Summit.

"We are not against anyone. Our collective support is for a rules-based international order, respect for sovereignty, territorial integrity, and the peaceful resolution of disputes," PM Modi remarked, without directly naming any country.

China, which is involved in territorial disputes in both South China Sea and East China Sea, claims sovereignty over nearly the entire South China Sea, while nations such as Vietnam, Malaysia, the Philippines, Brunei and Taiwan assert counterclaims.

The joint statement signed by all Quad leaders further emphasized to reform the UN Security Council, recognizing the urgent need to make it more representative, inclusive, transparent, efficient, effective, democratic and accountable, through expansion in permanent and non-permanent categories of membership of the UN Security Council. That the expansion of permanent seats should include representation for Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Caribbean in a reformed Security Council.



NEW DELHI: Often called the 'Picasso of India', M.F. Husain's unique artistic vision not only celebrated the peculiarity and complexity of Indian culture but also ensured that he was celebrated internationally.

Husain's artistic journey might have begun in the 1940s, and by the 1950s, but it has not ended even after years of him passing on (2011). Interestingly, he was

one of the few artists recognized by even those who had no interest in the arts; his work had become synonymous with Indian modernism. His vibrant color palettes, and depictions of human figures, animals, and mythological themes stunned everyone. While his work may be termed as deeply personal, it never 'isolated' him and had resonance the world over.

Born in 1915 in Pandharpur in a Suleymani Bohra family, he got fascinated with art through studying calligraphy while he stayed at a Madrasa.

One of the founding members of the Bombay Progressive Artists' Group, his modern technique, was inspired by the 'new' India post the Partition of the country. His themes -- sometimes treated in series -- include topics as diverse as Mahatma Gandhi, the British Raj, the Ramayana, Mother Teresa or Mahabhartha using Indian motifs. Early in his life. Husain painted cinema posters in Mumbai and also worked for a toy company to earn additional income.

IANS speaks to several major contemporary artists and tries to decipher what keeps Husain 'alive' even now. The auction house Asta Guru organized a major manifest auction to celebrate his birth anniversary on 19 September.

Major artist and co-founder of the Kochi Biennale, Riyas Komu feels Husain was a gypsy who celebrated 'Independent India' through his remarkable engagement with socialism, modernity, myth, traditions, history, children's art, design, craft, cinema in a much more enlightening Nehruvian way of Nation Building through bold, confident strokes. "His art remains as a liberal and secular engagement with the nation. In context, I remember the cover he painted in 1964 for the book by Lohia titled 'The Caste System'."

Stressing that Husain lived like a Sufi, never had a studio space of his own and painted wherever he went; Romu feels it is important to talk more about the ongoing Hussain Project titled 'Rooted Nomad' by KNMA at Venice here. "I think it is a big statement the curator Rubeena Karode is making about the secular credentials of Indian modernists by presenting M.F. Husain on a global stage like Venice. It is the best memorial symbolizing the return of an artist's spirit in the form of a protest," he adds. IANS



rchha is a historical town located on the banks of river Betwa in Madhya Pradesh, known for its grand palaces, and intricately carved temples. Famously known as the city of palaces, it is world-renowned for the classic mural paintings, frescos and Chhatris (cenotaphs) that were constructed to commemorate the Bundela rulers. Orchha's old-world charm casts a spell on tourists from all around the world.

Founded in 1501 by Bundela Rajput Chief, Orchha literally means 'a hidden place'. It was the capital of one of the most powerful dynasties to ever rule in India- the Bundelas. The major attractions in Orchha include Ram Raja Temple (the only place where Lord Ram is worshipped both as a God and a king), Laxmi Narayan Temple (known for its unique architecture which is a melange of a fort and a temple), and the Jahangir Mahal (built in hour of Mughal emperor Jahangir). The medieval architecture of Orchha's palaces and temples is a



visual delight for photographers.

Places to visit in Orchha

Jehangir Mahal: Built as be a garrison and citadel for the Mughals to allow greater control over the Bundela region, this palace was completed in 1598 by Bharath Bhushan after he defeated Vir Deo Singh of Bundela.

Ram Raja Temple: This beautiful Ram temple has an intriguing history behind it. The Idols which were supposed to be installed in the magnificent Chaturbhuj Temple were kept on the ground where this temple now stands.

Raja Mahal: Built during the 17th century, the Raja Mahal has withstood the test of time without losing its charm that transports you back to one of the golden eras of history.

The palace is constructed beautifully with impeccable architecture and breath-taking grandeur. Resided by the erstwhile kings of Orchha, the palace has kept the soul of the India's most eminent royalty intact through all these years.

Rafting and Boating in River Betwa:

Rafting in the river Betwa is also possible and the rafting starts from the boat club. Tickets are arranged through MP tourism and are available at the Betwa retreat or at the Hotel Sheesh Mahal. It could cost you around Rs. 1000 per hour or more per raft and a single raft would take 1-6 persons.

Chattris (Cenotaphs): Situated on the banks of Betwa river, Chattris is a set of magnificent royal tombs of the Maharajas, placed on a platform and supported by the pillars.

The charm of Chattris is best experienced when it is viewed from a narrow bridge on the opposite side of the river, from where the entire reflection of the tombs can be seen. The domes are

adorned with exquisite paintings, which add to the alluring appeal of Chattris which has attracted tourists since years.

Chaturbhuj Temple: Built in 875 AD during the reign of Gurjara Pratihara dynasty, this famous temple is dedicated to

Lord Vishnu. The name literally means the one with four arms, and Lord Vishnu has been referred as Chaturbhuj in various Hindu texts. www.holidify.com
