

Ankara conference to focus on India-Turkiye ties

NEW DELHI: Experts from leading think tanks of India and Turkiye are set to exchange perspectives to enhance mutual understanding and knowledge at a two-day conference that begins in Ankara on Feb-

The Foundation for Political, Economic and Social Research (SETA) based in Ankara, and the International Dialogue and Diplomacy Foundation (IDDF) in New Delhi are jointly organizing the event.

Prominent think tanks, experts and scholars of strategic affairs will gather for the two days' conference to hold a comprehensive discussion on India-Turkiye relations in the changing global and regional order, the International Diplomacy and Dialogue Foundation announced.

This is the first-ever dialogue in several years when many Indian and Turkish scholars, diplomats, experts from think tanks, and renowned academics are coming together to exchange their views and perspectives on global and regional issues and reshape bilateral ties, the IDDF observed

It is expected that the Indian delegation will be received by several prominent Turkish institutions, diplomats, and ministers.

Given the history of the Cold War, the two countries' relations have evolved in a more complex context in which they shared deep historical and cultural bonds restricted by the Cold War fault lines.

Under the leadership of Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan and Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the countries have managed to advance bilateral trade from USD 6 billion in 2014 to USD 14 billion in 2023, setting aside political differences.

This shows the scope of opportunities for cooperation and partnership that needs a broader consultation among all stakeholders, from diplomacy to think tanks to the trade and technology players. Turkish and Indian companies have been welcomed to invest and undertake joint ventures in all sectors.

As per the IDDF, the conference aims to open a forum for sustained dialogue between Indian and Turkish experts, institutions, and sector representatives to explore shared interests and perspectives in their regional and global relations and explore common views on international security and governance, including in the areas of cyber security, technology, artificial intelligence, UNSC reforms, and climate change. ANI

YK Sailas Thangal appointed as Indian envoy to Kazakhstan

NEW DELHI: YK Sailas Thangal, a 1996 batch Indian Foreign Service (IFS) officer, has been appointed as the next Ambassador of India to Kazakhstan, according to a statement from the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA).

Thangal, who is currently serving as an Additional Secretary in the Ministry, is expected to take up his new assignment

shortly, the statement added.

Relations between India and Kazakhstan are ancient and historical, going back more than 2,000 years. There has been a constant and regular exchange of goods and, more importantly, an exchange of ideas and cultural influences. The journey of Buddhism from India to Central Asia and Sufi ideas from Central

Asia to India are two such examples, as per MEA.

There are approximately 10,500 Indians residing in Kazakhstan, with about 9,500 of them being students, while the rest work in various professional fields.

Several special evacuation flights oper-

ated by Air India under the VBM and charter flights evacuated 3,745 Indian nationals from Kazakhstan to India. The evacuated Indian nationals included medical students, tourists, professionals and work-





Bangladesh wants good working relations with India: Foreign Affairs Adviser Touhid Hossain

DHAKA: Bangladesh is seeking to strengthen its ties with India, emphasizing the importance of mutual respect and reciprocal interest.

Foreign Affairs Adviser Md Touhid Hossain said in response to External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar's recent comments that "there are anti-India remarks from Bangladesh."

"We have a clear decision that we want good working relations with India on the

"It is absolutely up to India whether India will grant a visa or not. But if visa is not granted we will choose alternative", he said.

Recently, Jaishankar met with Hossain on the sidelines of the Indian Ocean Conference in Oman, where they discussed bilateral relations and the Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC).

Following the meeting, Jaishankar said that the talks were focused on the bilateral relationship between two countries and Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC).

Crime rate in Bangladesh surges under Yunus-led interim government

DHAKA: The crime rate in Bangladesh is increasing at an alarming rate, according to the police data, which shows that in January, cases of murder, abduction, robbery, burglary, and theft have all seen a spike across the country and have been the worst compared to the last six years.

The data sharply contrasts the interim government's Home Affairs Advisor Jahangir Alam Chowdhury's claim that the law and order situation is "satisfactory" in Bangladesh, according to local media.

Police Headquarters data shows at least 294 murder cases were filed with different police stations in January this year. An analysis of monthly crime data over the past six years revealed that the highest number of mugging and robbery incidents in a single month occurred in January 2025, with 242 reported incidents, reports the country's leading newspaper, The

The police data further reveals that incidents of mugging, robbery, and abduction also saw an increase in December and November last year compared to the corresponding months of the last five years.

Criticizing the government's claim that law and order were normal, a criminology Professor in Bangladesh questioned, "Are these crimes, which are instilling fear among the public, truly a sign of satisfaction?"

People in Bangladesh are living in constant fear of becoming victims of murder, theft, mugging, or burglary, and the government appears uninterested and has no idea how to deal with the prevailing situation, The Daily Star reported, quoting the professor.

In a separate development, several violent crimes were reported in different parts of Dhaka last Sunday night within a few hours.

Many took to social media to express their outrage over the failure of law enforcement, as videos of miscreants attacking residents with guns and cleavers went viral. IANS

India abstains on resolutions on Ukraine amendments; US breaks with allies

UNITED NATIONS: India abstained on a series of resolutions on Ukraine and amendments at the General Assembly that saw the US break ranks with its Western allies and side with Russia on some of them showing the ruptures and realignments under President Donald Trump.

Challenging Trump on the third anniversary of Russia's invasion, the Western nations managed to pass two resolutions naming Moscow as the aggressor in Ukraine.

In a strange spectacle, the US joined Russia to vote against a resolution put forward by Ukraine and Western

nations condemning Russia's invasion, while China abstained.

The resolution was adopted with 93 votes for it, and 18 against it, with 65 abstentions.

In the environment of

confrontation, the votes were significantly lower than the 141 votes a similar resolution received in 2023. (India had abstained on that vote).

A Washington-sponsored resolution that did not name Russia as the invader was cleverly amended at the initiative of Western nations to call out Moscow as the aggressor in Ukraine. A peeved US abstained on the resolution it had proposed after the amendments presented by France's Permanent Representative Nicolas De Riviere

while President Emmanuel Macron was in Washington to meet Trump were adopted.

The US, which is directly discussing with Russia a peace deal for Ukraine, views the condemnation of Moscow as interfering with its initiative. Trump spoke with Russia's President Vladimir Putin and his representatives met with Moscow in Riyadh to explore a way to end the war that began on February 24, 2022, and has devastated Ukraine and taken a toll on Russia also.

Justifying not assigning blame, Secretary of State Marco Rubio called it "a simple, historic resolution" to

Repeating that at the Assembly, acting US Permanent Representative Dorothy Shea said the previous resolutions that condemned Russia resolutions "have failed to stop the war".

The US resolution "looks forward, not backwards", she said, "This is a moment of truth -- a historic moment". "This has never been about Ukraine" and the resolution will address the global impact of war", she said. *IANS*

"India defends the territorial integrity of any country": Ukraine's ambassador Oleksandr Polishchuk

NEW DELHI: Ambassador of Ukraine to India, Oleksandr Polishchuk, spoke about India's stance on the ongoing Russia-Ukraine conflict, emphasizing that India firmly supports Ukraine's sovereignty and territorial integrity. He further stated, that "India absolutely supports Ukrainian independence."

Speaking to the media, Polishchuk particularly referenced Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Ukraine, calling it a "very historic visit."

The Ambassador recalled a tragic event during Modi's Moscow visit when Russia launched a missile strike on a children's hospital in Ukraine, an attack that highlighted the grave situation.

"It was a very historical visit of the Prime Minister of India to Ukraine. It was just after the Prime Minister's visit to Moscow. During PM Modi's visit, Russia made a terrible missile strike on the kids' hospital," he said.

"So this visit demonstrates that India absolutely supports Ukrainian independence, and we very much appreciate that it's always been highlighted by the Indian government, led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, that India defends the territorial integrity and the sovereignty of any country," he added. *ANI*

India reaffirms commitment to Women Peacekeepers at Global South Conference

NEW DELHI: In a powerful speech at the inaugural session of the Conference for Women Peacekeepers from the Global South, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar emphasized the nation's enduring commitment to the United Nations' peacekeeping efforts and its continuous support for women in peace and security

Marking the 25th anniversary of the adoption of UN Security Council Resolution 1325 on Women, Peace, and Security, Jaishankar highlighted how this resolution has advanced the role of women in peacekeeping.

"India is proud of its contributions and association with UN peacekeeping, a commitment that spans decades. Since the 1950s, India has contributed over 290,000 peacekeepers across more than 50 missions. In fact, India remains the largest Troop Contributing Country to this day. Currently, more than 5,000 Indian peacekeepers are deployed in nine of the eleven active missions, often in challenging and hostile environments, with a singular focus: the advancement of global peace and security," he said.

"In this pursuit, India has unfortunately lost nearly 180 peacekeepers, whose supreme sacrifices are etched in the history

of our collective endeavors forever. One such individual, Captain Gurbachan Singh Salaria, posthumously honored with the Param Vir Chakra for his courage during the UN Mission in Congo, remains a beacon of inspiration. His is the singular case of this highest honor being awarded for operations conducted abroad," he added.

Highlighting the country's role in empowering women in peacekeeping, Jaishankar affirmed that India has been at the forefront of deploying women in peacekeeping roles, both military and police.

The first chapter of this journey began in the 1960s, when Indian women, as medical officers, were deployed in Congo. In 2007, India was the first to deploy an allwomen-formed Police Unit in Liberia -- a pioneering initiative that had an indelible impact on both the host community and the broader UN framework.

"Today, India proudly continues this

legacy, with over 150 women peacekeepers deployed across six critical missions. including those in the Democratic Republic of Congo, South Sudan, Lebanon, Golan Heights, Western Sahara, and Abyei," he added.

Sharing the examples of "exemplary women peacekeepers", who have inspired others globally, like Kiran Bedi, who served as the first woman UN Police Advisor; Major Suman Gawani and Major Radhika Sen, recipients of the UN Military Gender Advocate Award in 2019 and 2023, respectively; and Seema Dhundia, who led the first all-women Formed Police Unit in

Jaishankar also highlighted the importance of upcoming international events, such as the Peacekeeping Ministerial in Berlin and the Peacebuilding Architecture Review in New York, where the discussions at this conference could help shape key decisions.

"The participation of women in peace operations makes it more diverse and inclusive. It is essential that we continue to increase the representation of women in peacekeeping. This is not only a matter of quantity but equally of quality. Women peacekeepers often have unique access to local communities, acting as role models for women in conflict zones. Training courses tailored to include modules sensitizing peacekeepers to issues related to women will enhance the effectiveness of peace operations." he said.

"India remains committed to supporting Global South nations in building their peacekeeping capacities. Through initiatives led by the Centre for UN Peacekeeping, India will continue to offer training and capacity-building programs, including courses specifically designed for women peacekeepers, as we did with ASEAN countries in 2023," he added.

Guided by the philosophy of "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam," or "the world is one family," India reaffirms its dedication to global peacekeeping efforts, recognizing the invaluable contributions of women peacekeepers as pillars of peace, leadership, and inspiration for future generations.

"At the heart of our foreign policy lies a commitment to peacekeeping--rooted in dialogue, diplomacy, and cooperation. Guided by the philosophy of "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam," the belief that the world is one family, India will continue to contribute meaningfully to the cause of UN peacekeeping," he said. ANI

Govt committee to review US reciprocal tariffs, submit report by March 15

NEW DELHI: As the US plans to impose reciprocal tariffs across trading countries by April 2, the Indian government has formed a high-level committee which is tasked to review tariff relief on imports from the US.

The panel, formed under the Union Commerce Ministry, is likely to submit its report by March 15. The report would be submitted to both the Ministry of Commerce and the Ministry of Finance.

According to people close to the matter, the government review is looking at tariffs that currently range between 15-20 percent, 50-70 percent, and 70-80 percent, and whether rate adjustment could be made in "8-digit code identifying a specific product for custom purposes".

The committee is assessing the scope of possible tariff reductions and is tasked to recommend the best course of action.

The mandate is to closely examine imported goods and propose tariff adjustments.

Once the recommendations are submitted, the final decision on the tariff relief will need to be vetted by the Prime Minister's Office before being implemented, according to reports. India has already been "extremely responsive" in addressing the perception that it imposes high tariffs on foreign goods.

The review panel's work will be crucial

The panel, formed under the Union Commerce Ministry, is likely to submit its report by March 15. The report would be submitted to both the Ministry of Commerce and the Ministry of Finance

in determining India's response to the US's proposed tariffs.

In the Union Budget 2025-26, India cut duties on bourbon whisky from 150 percent to 100 percent and reduced tariffs on imports like fish hydrolysate, scrap materials, satellite equipment, ethernet switches, and high-end motorcycles.

Meanwhile, India is unlikely to experience any major short-term consequences due to the US tariff on semiconductors, as it is not a major exporter of chips to the nation.

Domestic automotive manufacturers are also not likely to face any major impact due to US reciprocal tariffs as these companies sell their products largely in the fast-growing Indian market.

Also, the US tariffs on the steel sector are unlikely to impact India because only 2 percent of the country's total finished steel exports in the first nine months of this fiscal were to the US, according to a Crisil Intelligence report. IANS


Italy PM slams Left's double standards, says when Trump, Meloni, Modi talk, they are called threat to democracy

WASHINGTON: Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni has accused left-wing politicians of being "nervous" over former US President Donald Trump's victory, claiming that conservatives are unfairly labeled as a "threat to democracy" while leftist leaders are celebrated for similar global

Speaking at the Conservative Political Action Conference (CPAC) 2025 in Washington recently, Meloni praised Trump and US Vice President JD Vance while taking aim at "elites" and left-wing leaders.

"The Left is nervous, and with Trump's victory, their irritation has turned into hysteria -- not only because conservatives are winning but because conservatives are collaborating globally," she said.

She highlighted what she called a double standard, recalling how former US President Bill Clinton and former UK Prime Minister Tony Blair were praised for creating a global liberal network in the 1990s, while leaders like Trump, herself, Argentine President Javier Milei, and Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi are accused

of endangering democracy.

"When Bill Clinton and Tony Blair created the global leftist liberal network in the 90s, they were called statesmen. Today,

when Trump, Meloni, Milei or maybe Modi talk, they are called a threat to democracy. This is the Left's double standard," she

She added that despite media and political attacks, conservative leaders continue to win elections because "people no longer believe their lies."

"People are not naive as The Left considers them. They vote for us because we defend freedom, we love our nations, we want secure borders, we preserve businesses and citizens from green leftist insanity. We defend family and life, we fight against wokeism, we protect our sacred right to our faith and our free speech, and we stand for common sense," she added.

Backing Trump as a strong leader, Meloni dismissed concerns that his presidency could create divisions within the conservative movement.

"Our adversaries hope that President Trump will move away from us, but knowing him as a strong and effective leader, I bet that those who hope for divisions will be proven wrong," she said.

Meloni's speech received a warm reception from the conservative crowd, reinforcing the growing cooperation between right-wing leaders across the globe. IANS

'45 pc young Indians choosing stocks as their primary investment option'

Maruti Suzuki aims to create a manufacturing capacity of producing 4 million cars annually to reclaim a 50 percent market share in India and use the country as a global export hub as well.

In its new mid-term plan for 2025-30, the company has identified India as its "most important market"

The auto major plans to expand its EV lineup starting with

the e-Vitara, and is aiming to launch four new EV models by FY30 in a segment where its rivals like Tata Motors and Mahindra & Mahindra already have a varied EV portfolio in India.

Maruti Suzuki is currently exporting three lakh vehicles from India annually. By the end of this decade, it is targeting the export of 7.5-8 lakh units per year. *IANS*



India, UK agree to resume free trade talks

NEW DELHI: Union Minister of Commerce and Industry, Piyush Goyal, said India and the UK, have decided to restart negotiations for a Free Trade Agreement (FTA), after a meeting here with his UK counterpart Jonathan Reynolds.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his UK counterpart Keir Starmer met on the sidelines of the G-20 Summit in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil in November last year to underline the importance of resuming trade negotiations at an early date.

The latest announcement is an outcome of the discussions held at the level of Prime Ministers of the two countries.

"All options are on the table. We are in active negotiations on three different aspects - the FTA, the Bilateral Investment Treaty, and a Double Contribution Convention Agreement. And all three are in parallel and conjoined with each other," Goyal

Reynolds said India is a vital partner for the UK in an increasingly volatile and multipolar world.

"We have kickstarted negotiations for UK and India FTA again. Through these

talks we want to secure a mutually beneficial agreement," added Reynolds, the UK Business and Trade Secretary, who is in India on a three-day visit.

Goyal made it clear that India would not rush into a trade agreement in haste. "We will have speed but not haste," he guipped when asked whether a deadline had been fixed to sign the deal.

Reynolds said, "There is really an urgency and this is a top priority for the UK government and has strong support from the UK Prime Minister and key cabinet colleagues "

However, for the UK it is also about the quality of the trade agreements rather than the speed of delivering them, he added.

The UK and India have been negotiating

an FTA since January 2022 under the previous Conservative-led government. The current Labour Party government too has expressed desire to continue these talks.

There are 26 chapters in the agreement, which include goods, services, investments, and intellectual property rights. While the UK is seeking a lowering of tariffs on goods such as electric vehicles and Scotch whisky, India wants easier visa rules for its professionals in the services sector to enter the UK.

India and the United Kingdom have a close partnership, built through collaboration on security and defense, new and emerging technologies, climate, health, education, research and innovation, green finance and people-to-people contacts. At the center of this relationship is the collective aspiration to deliver economic growth and sustainable development.

Both sides have agreed to resume negotiations towards a balanced, mutually beneficial and a forward-looking deal that delivers mutual growth and builds on the strengths of the two complementary economies. IANS

Global refurbished smartphone sales grow 5 pc, Apple strengthens leadership

NEW DELHI: Global refurbished smartphone sales grew 5 percent (yearon-year) in 2024, as Apple strengthened its leadership, capturing 56 percent of the sales compared to 51 percent in 2023, according to a new report.

In comparison, the market for new smartphones rebounded from a difficult 2023 to grow 3 percent YoY.

However, following two to three years of consistent growth across regions, 2024 saw the refurbished market reaching maturity, and even stagnation, in some regions, said Counterpoint Research's 'Secondary Smartphone Market Report'.

Apple almost singlehandedly drove growth in the secondary market in 2024. It was one of only a few OEMs to increase sales in 2024, resulting in its share increasing to 56 percent.

More and more consumers turned to the secondary market to get their hands on affordable iPhones.

"Apple's growth this time was mostly made up of older models like the iPhone 11 and 12 series. Even with the iPhone 13 and 14 series being in the market for some time, many consumers held on to these devices for longer, creating a supply crunch," said senior research analyst Glen Cardoza.


The supply of newer iPhone models was affected to such an extent that the global refurbished ASP dropped by 11 percent YoY in 2024 to reach \$394 from \$445 in

> contrast, Samsung's ASP rose due to an increased preference for its flagship Galaxy S series, even though the brand's overall share reduced globally.

> "More durable devices have resulted in betterquality trade-ins, reducing the need for refurbishment. Also, rising costs of spare parts, labor and equipment mean many

players are simply selling used smartphones 'as is' to maintain margins," said Cardoza.

Ukraine resumes e-Visa issuance for foreign nationals, including Indians

KYIV: The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine has resumed the issuance of electronic visas (e-Visas) for foreign nationals from 45 countries, including India, Bhutan, Maldives, and Nepal.

The Department General for Consular Service will process applications starting February 19, 2025, allowing eligible travellers to apply for e-Visas for various purposes, such as tourism, business, education, cultural and scientific activities, journalism, sports, and medical treatment.

According to the Ukrainian embassy, the e-Visa system will offer two categories: a single-entry visa priced at USD 20 and a double-entry visa for USD 30. For applicants opting for the urgent procedure, the processing fee will be doubled. The standard processing time for an e-Visa is three working days, while urgent applications will be processed within a single day.

The decision to reinstate the e-Visa service aligns with Ukraine's broader diplomatic and economic objectives, reinforcing its engagement with key partner nations, including India. Over the years, India-Ukraine relations have expanded in areas such as trade, commerce, agriculture, pharmaceuticals, defense, education, science, and culture.

The two nations have maintained a strong diplomatic partnership since India recognized Ukraine's independence in December 1991, followed by the establishment of an embassy in Kyiv in May 1992. *ANI*

CHHATRAPATI SAMBHAJI-NAGAR: Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar has voiced serious concerns over illegal migration in India, stating that millions of undocumented individuals are residing in the country without legal rights.

Dhankhar cautioned against conversions through allurement and temptation, saying, "Every individual has the right to follow any religion; every person has the right to adopt a religion of their

choice. However, when a conversion happens through enticement, greed, allurement, and temptation, its objective is 'we will get supremacy by changing the demography of the Nation'. His-

Minister is ridiculed. My position is ridiculed. Our Institutions are tainted. Be it the Election Commission or the Judiciary. These are activities which are being undertaken by those at their heart,

tory bears witness, there are examples from some countries in the world. You are more knowledgeable than me, more informed, you can find out."

"The very character of those nations was erased; the majority community that existed there disappeared. We cannot allow this demographic invasion; organic demographic growth is acceptable, but if this is disruptive with a sinister design to control, we must be on high alert. This is a matter for our deep contemplation and reflection. This poses a challenge to our philosophy that is centuries old." he emphasized, while affirming every individual's right to follow their chosen religion.

VP Dhankhar also raised concerns about systematic attempts to undermine national institutions, and called for thorough investigations into recent revelations about attempts to manipulate electoral processes.

"In a systemic manner, the President is ridiculed. The Prime

national interest is not there. Recently, it has been revealed authoritatively that our elections were sought to be doctored, manipulated," he said.







How Indian students could benefit from U.S. immigration changes

BENGALURU: Amid growing speculation about potential U.S. immigration reforms, MPOWER Financing, a leading provider of no-cosigner education loans for international students, reassures Indian students and graduates that meritdriven policy changes could create new opportunities for high-achieving talent.

Indian students consistently enjoyed high F-1 visa approval rates. Despite inflammatory rhetoric, the administration even saw the U.S. Department of Justice successfully defend the OPT program against lawsuits filed by anti-immigration groups. This historical context suggests that while political rhetoric may be harsh, the policies on the ground have continued to support highly skilled international students.

What's changing

1. OPT, CPT, and school transfers:

The proposed changes to the "duration of status" policy aim to replace the current flexible system with fixed admission periods. This could complicate transfers - particularly to institutions offering "Day 1 CPT," which many students have used to secure early work authorization. However, bona fide students focused on academic excellence and career advancement rather than exploiting loopholes are unlikely to be adversely affected. These measures might discourage programs that seek to circumvent the spirit of the rules, thereby preserving opportunities for legitimate students.

2. H-1B program reforms:

Revisions to the H-1B visa system are already on the table. For example, proposals to increase wage requirements could price out employers relying on lowertion for students who meet the high standards of these programs.

Support from within the administration A key difference between the first and second Trump administrations is the presence of influential voices advocating

for a modernized, skill-based immigration * Marco Rubio, Secretary of State, has

emphasized that America's immigration system should welcome highly skilled immigrants who contribute significantly to the economy and society.

* Elon Musk, from the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE), has stressed the importance of making it easy

skilled labor - a change that, while challenging for some companies, would favor highly qualified graduates who can command competitive salaries. Furthermore, a shift from the current lottery system toward a merit-based system that prioritizes advanced degrees and specialized skills would directly benefit top-tier Indian graduates.

That said, there is concern over proposals to narrow the definition of "specialty occupations," which could reduce flexibility for students wishing to explore roles outside their precise degree specialization. However, given the emphasis on high-skill talent, such modifications may enhance the overall value of a U.S. educafor talented individuals to immigrate.

* Vivek Ramaswamy, a former DOGE member, has supported replacing the H-1B lottery with a meritocratic system - another change that would benefit Indian graduates from top U.S. institutions.

Even President Trump has floated the idea of automatically granting green cards to graduates of American colleges, an initiative that, while still in the discussion phase, underscores the administration's interest in retaining high-caliber talent. After all, putting "America First" requires drastically increasing the number of international students the country welcomes.

A balanced outlook for the future

For legitimate, hardworking students from India and around the world, these changes are more likely to level the playing field and elevate the status of highly skilled individuals in the U.S. immigration system. Data from institutions like the Institute of International Education show that, historically, U.S. enrollment has been buoyed by students who add significant value to the academic and professional landscape - an outcome that's likely to continue if reforms favor merit and high skill.

While no policy shift is without its challenges, the current proposals seem designed to reward excellence. For Indian students dedicated to their academic and professional pursuits, there has arguably never been a better time to pursue an education in the United States.

LA Launches a National Model for Park Equity

n the past few years, LA has plunged in a national ranking of park systems in the country's largest cities 88 out of 100. In a city already grappling with huge issues of inequality, lack of equitable access to green spaces and parks lies at the heart of the problem. Especially in low-income and minority communities, there has long been insufficient investment in park resources, and many residents have no parks near their homes. At the EMS meeting on the Feb 21st, experts collectively spoke out and proposed a plan to revitalize the Los Angeles park system, aiming to give residents of every community equal access to green spaces.

Jon Christensen, Adjunct Assistant Professor, UCLA Institute of the Environment and Sustainability pointed out that although Los Angeles has more than 16,000 acres of parks and 92 miles of trails, many small community parks have aging infrastructure and poor maintenance; especially in areas where green space is scarce, the health and well-being of residents are seriously threatened. We ur-

ing a project called "Park Needs Assessment" (PNA), which aims to formulate a park development blueprint for the next 25 years and improve the equity and sustainability of the overall park system.





Scented candles can release potential toxic particles in indoor air: Study

NEW DELHI: Aroma compounds released from the scented wax melts can react with ozone in indoor air to form potentially toxic particles, researchers have warned.

The study challenges the perception that scented wax melts are a safer alternative to combustion-based candles.

Previous research has shown that scented wax melts emit more airborne scent compounds than traditional candles.

The direct heating of the wax maximizes its surface area, thereby releasing more fragrance - such as volatile organic compounds (VOCs) made of hydrocarbons - into the air, according to the study published in the ACS' Environmental Science & Technology Letters.

Researchers know that these chemicals can react with other compounds in the air to form nanometer-wide particles, which have been linked to negative health effects when inhaled.

However, the potential for nanoparticle formation during wax-melt use was unknown.

So, Nusrat Jung, Brandon Boor and colleagues from Purdue University in the US set out to investigate this process using wax melts in a full-scale house model that mimicked a typical residential house. *IANS*

Stay optimistic and remain healthy in diverse situations, say researchers

NEW DELHI: Developing optimism and learning how to flexibly cope can help maintain and improve mental health in diverse situations, according to a new study.

With social isolation, health concerns and economic uncertainty, fear and anxiety have become a daily reality for many, said the study published in the Journal of Research in Personality.

A team of researchers from Syracuse University and Michigan State University recently explored the personal characteristics that help people handle prolonged stressors, such as the pandemic.

Led by Jeewon Oh, assistant professor of psychology in Syracuse University's College of Arts and Sciences, the group delved into optimism and pessimism and how those mindsets influence well-being.

The group utilized data from the Health and Retirement Study,

a large-scale panel study that gathers a nationally representative sample of Americans aged 50 and older.

The team used this data to explore how people's mindsets affected their psychological and

mism is linked to safer health behaviors.

"The pandemic introduced many changes, and we wanted to know more about personality traits that can help people cope with enduring and uncontrollable things are uncontrollable.


Both optimism and pessimism had independent associations with psychological well-being. So, people who are more optimistic and less pessimistic worried less, were less stressed and lonely and were more resilient

This was partly because these people engaged in more physical activity and perceived more social support and less strain from their relationships, Oh added.

In general, regular optimism/ pessimism isn't about thinking they wouldn't get sick, or they will be more likely to get sick (compared to others), but about knowing the reality and still thinking that things will eventually work out.

This positive mindset helps people to problem-solve and cope.

"Our study found that optimists fared better even during new difficulties," the researchers noted. *IANS*

Only 1 hour of daily screen use can up nearsightedness risk: Researchers

NEW DELHI: Here comes another warning for those who love to spend hours on digital screens. According to a new study, spending as little as one hour per day on tablets or smartphones could significantly increase the risk of myopia or nearsightedness.

In the systematic review and dose-response meta-analysis, a daily 1-hour increment in digital screen time was associated with 21 percent higher odds of myopia (nearsightedness), according to the study published in JAMA Network Open.

The dose-response pattern

exhibited a sigmoidal shape, indicating a potential safety threshold of less than 1 hour per day of exposure, with an increase in odds up to 4 hours.

"These findings can offer guidance to clinicians and researchers regarding myopia risk," said researchers.

There has been a surge in nearsightedness cases largely driven by an increased use of digital screens.

The team reviewed data from 45 investigations that looked at the association between screen time and nearsightedness in more than 335,000 participants

from toddlers to young adults.

The researchers said the risk increased significantly from 1-4 hours of screen time and then went up more gradually.

However, no association was found with exposure less than 1

hour, suggesting a potential safety threshold. The authors say these findings can offer guidance to clinicians addressing the "myopia pandemic."

Breathing can be linked with vision: Study

WASHINGTON DC: Researchers have discovered a fundamental mechanism that affects pupil size - breathing. The study shows that the pupil is smallest during inhalation and largest during exhalation, which could affect vision.

Researchers at Karolinska Institutet in Sweden have discovered a fundamental mechanism. The study was published in The Journal of Physiology.

Like the aperture in a camera, the pupil controls how much light reaches the eye. Therefore, it is fundamental to vision and how we perceive our surroundings.

Over a century ago, three mechanisms that can change the size of the pupil were known: the amount of light, focus distance, and cognitive factors such as emotion or mental effort.

Now, scientists have discovered a fourth - breathing. The pupil is smallest around inhalation onset and largest during exhalation


"This mechanism is unique in that it is cyclical, ever-present and requires no external stimulus," explains Artin Arshamian, associate professor at the Department of Clinical Neuroscience, Karolinska Institutet, who led the research.

"Since breathing affects brain activity and cognitive functions, the discovery may contribute to a better understanding of how our vision and attention are regulated."

The researchers conducted five experiments with over 200 participants, examining how breathing affects pupil size under different conditions. The results showed that the effect persisted whether participants breathed quickly or slowly, through their nose or mouth, if lighting conditions

breathing also affect vision. Previous research shows that smaller pupils make it easier to see details, while larger pupils help us find hard-to-see objects.

"Our results suggest that our vision may switch between optimizing for distinguishing small details when we inhale and detecting faint objects when



or fixation distance varied if they were resting or performing visual tasks.

The difference in pupil size between inhalation and exhalation was large enough to theoretically affect vision.

The researchers are now investigating whether changes in pupil size during

we exhale, all within a single breathing cycle," says Martin Schaefer, a postdoctoral researcher at the same department at Karolinska Institutet and the study's first author.

There may also be clinical applications, according to the researchers. ANI

Elderly, middle-aged at high risk of developing and dying from cancer: ICMR study

NEW DELHI: Older adults and middle-aged adults are more at risk of developing cancer, and dying from the deadly disease in India, according to a study led by the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR).

The study published in 'The Lancet Regional Health Southeast Asia journal showed that the elderly (aged 70 years and above) had the highest risk of developing cancer -- more than 10 percent --, and dying from it -- 7.7 percent.

The risk of middle-aged (15-49 years) developing cancer is 8.3 percent, while their odds of dying from the disease is 5.5 percent.

The researchers emphasized the need to increase targeted interventions and strategies "to tackle the escalating cancer burden in India, with about 70 percent of cases and deaths occurring in the middle- and older-age groups", the team said.

The risk of middle-aged (15-49 years) developing cancer is 8.3 percent, while their odds of dying from the disease is 5.5 percent

The ICMR researchers also projected that in the coming two decades, India will face a formidable challenge in managing deaths related to cancer incidence, with a yearly increase of two percent in cases as the population ages.

Using the Global Cancer Observatory (GLOBOCAN) 2022 and Global Health Observatory (GHO) databases, the team examined trends in 36 types of cancer across age groups and genders in India over the past 20 years.

Notably, it showed that three in every five people in India are likely to succumb to cancer following diagnosis.

The findings also revealed that the five most common cancers affecting both genders collectively account for 44 percent of the cancer burden in India.

However, women in India were found to bear a "disproportionate burden", as breast cancer continues to be the most prevalent cancer. Breast cancer contributes to 13.8 percent of new cases from both genders followed by cervical cancer (9.2 percent). *IANS*



To whom does this land belong? Waves of migrations have shaped India

he BJP-led government has formed a committee to document the 12,000-year-old history of India. Given that DNA and genetic studies clearly show that we are a mixed population, why form such a committee? The apparent aim is to establish that Hindus (Aryans) are the original inhabitants of this land.

Tamil Nadu and origins of iron

Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin, citing new research on pre-modern history, stated that archaeologists have concluded the Iron Age began in Tamil Nadu. Evidence suggests that iron melting was introduced in the region 5,300 years ago, with precise dating pinpointing its introduction to 3,345 BC. Stalin emphasized the significance of this discovery for understanding the historical timeline of the Indian subcontinent. Proudly, he declared, "I'm constantly saying that the history of India will be written from Tamil Nadu," underscoring the research's potential to reshape historical narratives. But how relevant is this to the

vaded by any foreign race," and thus the land came to be known as Hindustan, the land of Hindus (Golwalkar, 1939, p. 6).

This view contrasts with that of Lokmanya Bal Gangadhar Tilak, who suggested in Arctic Home in the Vedas that Aryans came from the Arctic region. Golwalkar sidestepped this contradiction by claiming that the Arctic region itself was once located in the Orissa-Bihar area before shifting northward. He argued that Aryans had always been here, and it was the Arctic zone that moved away. This mental gymnastics was necessary to prove Aryan nativity and support the anti-Muslim narrative of Hindu nationalism.

Several theories about the Aryans' origins have emerged. Many European scholars, including Indophile Max Mueller, proposed the "Aryan Invasion Theory," which suggested Aryans invaded India. However, this theory is largely discredited since the pastoral society of that era was characterized by migrations, not invasions. The more plausible theory, supported by linguis-

tic and geological evidence, suggests Aryans arrived through waves of migration.

The biggest obstacle to the Aryan nativity claim is the existence of the

Indus Valley Civilization which predates the Aryans' arrival. The urbanized Indus Valley Civilization was distinctly different from Aryan settlements. Attempts were made to manipulate evidence, such as creating a computer-distorted image of a unicorn bull





EU's 'new strategic agenda' with India:

Crisis in US ties compels Brussels to seek closer partnership with New Delhi

mid rapidly shifting global dynamics, European Commission
President Ursula von der Leyen
will be visiting New Delhi on 2728 February accompanied by as
many as 26 EU Commissioners
to confer with Prime Minister
Narendra Modi and senior Indian
government leaders and officials.

"The unprecedented visit highlights the strong momentum in EU-India relations. It follows President von der Leyen's announcement of a new strategic agenda with India to be presented this year at the EU-India Summit. The visit emphasizes the importance of strengthening ties in key areas vital to the prosperity and security of both Europe and India," noted a Euro-

body to New Delhi follows tumultuous days in EU-US relations that has left Europe in daze. US President Donald Trump's recent phone call with Russian President Vladimir Putin, followed by a meeting of their foreign ministers in Riyadh, and Vice President J D Vance's diatribe against Europe, which clearly indicated a sea change in US attitude on the Ukraine war and the virtual sidelining of Europe, has alarmed the EU. Trump condemned Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy as "dictator without elections," and accused him and Europe of starting the war. He also vowed to end the Ukraine war as soon as possible with or without any European involvement.

The transatlantic alliance,

On her part, Ursula von der Leyen, said: "In this era of intense geostrategic competition, Europe stands for openness, partnership, and outreach.

We seek to deepen ties with one of our most trusted friends and allies."

"Europe and India are likeminded partners, bound by the shared conviction that democracy best serves the people. That's why one of the first visits of the new Commission is to India. We are committed to strengthening our strategic partnership to advance trade, economic security, and resilient supply chains, along with a common tech agenda and reinforced security and defense cooperation, "she underlined.

Divergence in shared values

The visit of the EU's executive

considered to be a pillar of geopolitical stability, now faces an uncertain future and the realism that Europe can no longer depend on its security on the US has begun to creep in the minds of policymakers in Brussels.

The European Parliament's powerful Foreign Affair Committee in a statement said, "the latest political developments clearly show that the EU and its member states can unfortunately no longer fully rely on the United States' Government to defend our shared values and interests, but must take their defense and security into their own hands."

Von der Leyen thundered that "with or without the support of our partners, we cannot let Russia win. And the cost of insecurity - the cost of a Russian

victory - is far greater than any saving we could make now. And this is why it is time for Europe to step up."

To demonstrate the EU's unwavering support to Ukraine, Von der Leyen led a visit of the EU College of Commissioners to Kiev on Monday 24 February to mark three years of the Russian invasion of Ukraine.

Strategic convergence with India

On their part, European media and analysts are positive about the future of EU-India ties and cooperation. "With Donald Trump steering the White House away from Europe, and with the Brussels-Beijing relations in cold water, the EU understands it must act sooner rather than later, and forge closer cooperation with what it considers "like-minded partners", said the Brussels-based publication Euractiv.

"Reducing reliance on China and Russia and promoting a multipolar world are aims shared by the EU and India. While Europe seeks to collaborate with like-minded partners, India looks for strategic autonomy and diversified partnerships," it noted.

Another Brussels-based publication Politico said the upcoming Delhi gathering is expected to release a seven-page joint statement which notes that "the deepening of bilateral relations and the growing strategic convergence between the EU and India respond to the shifting dynamics of the global geopolitical landscape and a common interest in promoting global stability, economic security, and sustainable and inclusive growth."

ome to the largest population of the one-horned rhino on earth, Kaziranga National Park is one of India's national treasures in terms of flora and fauna. Located in the state of Assam in North-Eastern India, its total area is shared by the districts of Nagaon, Golaghat and Karbi Anglong placing it roughly at the center of the state. Approximately around five hours by road from Guwahati, Kaziranga National Park stands tall as the epitome of successful wildlife conservation in India. In 1985, it was awarded the status of a World Heritage Site by UNESCO.

Lying on the floodplains of the mighty river Brahmaputra, rich vegetation covers almost the entirety of Kaziranga National Park. Receiving massive amounts of rainfall each year, at times even crossing dangerous levels, this national park is characterized by tall elephant grass, marshlands and tall tropical broadleaf forests. Here, a wide variety of fauna thrives including the onehorned rhino, Asiatic elephants, wild water buffalo, leopards and Royal Bengal Tigers. A popular migratory location for birds who fly down from the north, one can spot various birds such as the black-nested stork, the lesser white-fronted goose, ferruginous duck and Baer's pochard duck to name a few. Other notable bird families which can be seen here include the great Indian hornbill and wreathed hornbill among many others.

Safaris can be undertaken both during the day and night during the open tourist season. Elephant rides are also very popular among tourists and wildlife journalists and enthusiasts. Hiking is one such activity which is prohibited here to avoid casualties.

In addition to its wildlife and cultural significance, Kaziranga plays a crucial role in conservation efforts, serving as a sanctuary for endangered species and contributing to the preservation of Assam's natural heritage. The park's successful conservation programs and initiatives make it an important landmark in the global fight against biodiversity loss and habitat destruction.

THINGS TO DO IN KAZIRANGA NATIONAL PARK

Birdwatching: Kaziranga is a haven for bird enthusiasts, offering sightings of exotic species like the great hornbill, pelicans, and bar-headed geese. The wetlands and forests provide the perfect setting for both resident and migratory birds.

Jeep Safari: Traverse the park's designated zones on a thrilling jeep safari, spotting iconic wildlife such as onehorned rhinoceroses, tigers, elephants, swamp deer, and various other species amidst the tall grasslands.



KNOW YOUR RIGHTS!

YOU DO NOT HAVE TO OPEN THE DOOR


 You do not have to open the door or let the officers into your home unless they have a valid search warrant signed by a judge.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO SPEAK TO A LAWYER

- · You have the right to seek an attorney and receive a phone call from them if detained.
- Request a copy of the Detainee Handbook to learn the Detention Center's rules.
- If you don't have a lawyer, ask to speak to one.
- If you have a lawyer, give the signed Form G-28 to an officer.
- If no lawyer, ask for a list of pro bono lawyers from an immigration officer.
- · You have the right to contact your consulate for assistance in finding a lawyer.
- · You can refuse to sign paperwork until speaking with a lawyer.
- If you sign something without a lawyer, fully understand the document first.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO REMAIN SILENT

- You do not need to speak to immigration officers or answer any questions.
- If asked where you were born or how you entered, you may refuse to answer or remain silent.
- · If remaining silent, say, "I choose to remain silent."
- You can show a know-your-rights card (English/Spanish) explaining you'll remain silent and want to speak to a lawyer.
- You may refuse to show identity documents stating your country of origin.







For your knowledge, here is some information regarding ICE agents' access to public and private areas of your business: ICE can enter public areas like dining areas, parking lots, and lobbies without permission, but they cannot stop, question, or arrest anyone just for being there. To enter private areas, ICE agents need a judicial warrant signed by a judge. Without it, they must have your permission. During a raid, remain calm and do not help ICE agents identify individuals by immigration status or nationality. If agents have an administrative warrant, they cannot enter private areas. Record or observe their actions to ensure they comply with the warrant and protect workers' rights.
