

MODI DURING EMERGENCY

How PM Modi fought for democracy during Emergency

Democracy was strangled and fundamental rights of the people were curtailed. It is the darkest chapter in the history of seven decades of independent India.

However, during this period Narendra Modi, a young RSS Pracharak in his 20s, marked by his exceptional organizational skills, played an extraordinary role in the fight against the draconian rule.

With most of the seniors jailed, the responsibility of coordinating the anti-Emergency movement fell upon young Modi's shoulders, that too without getting caught. He was appointed the General Secretary for Gujarat of the Lok Sangharsh Samiti, led by Jayaprakash Narayan at national level.

He was entrusted with key responsibilities including publishing, printing and distribution of anti-Emergency literature, organizing Satyagraha, logistics of national leaders travelling through Gujarat, ensuring well-being of families of jailed workers and more importantly, maintaining the momentum of the resistance.


Vishnu Pandya, a senior journalist from Junagadh, Gujarat remembers says: "In a meeting, myself, Narendra Modi, senior RSS Karyakartas Keshavrao Deshmukh, Laxmanrao Inamdar, Shankar Singh Vaghela, Nathalal Jhagda etc, were present. In that meeting, all of us were assigned responsibilities related to literature, organization, and the resistance. But, unfortunately, we all were arrested, except Narendrabhai and Jhagda. Responsibilities like coordinating publications, organizing protests, and keeping the organization afloat, fell on the shoulders of Modi. During the two years of the Emergency, Narendra Modi's organizational skills shone bright, despite of him being just 25 years old!"

Sardarji to Bhatukbhai - Disguises to evade arrest

Narendra Modi was given the direction by his seniors to continue active work, but while avoiding arrest, as a large number of Sangh workers were already being detained.

Kanti Bhai Vyas, an RSS worker from Navsari, Gujarat recalls: "During the Emergency, warrants were issued against almost every RSS Pracharak. Most of them including Narendra Modi went underground. But, most of the senior Karyakartas like Keshavrao Deshmukh, Laxman Rao Inamdar etc, got arrested. Narendrabhai managed to evade arrest and roam around Gujarat, by adapting difas a Pathan."

Narendra Modi adeptly dodged the police many times, due to his presence of mind. Rohit Agrawal, whose father was a senior leader of the Jan Sangh in



ferent guises including that of Sardarji."

Many times he used to roam around in the guise of a Sadhu. Old associates of Modi recalls that it was difficult even for them to recognize him let alone the police.

Vishnu Pandya remembers that once Narendra Modi went the extra mile of visiting his colleagues in the jail.

"Myself, along with around 200 Karyakartas were imprisoned in Bhavnagar jail. On a fine day in September 1976, he entered the jail dressed as a Sadhu and spent almost one hour with some senior Karyakartas, having discussions about the struggle against emergency. No one could suspect that the perAhmedabad, recalls an incident. During the anti-Emergency activities, Narendra Modi visited Ahmedabad and stayed at Agrawal's home.

On a particular day, just as Modi, dressed as a Sikh youth, was about to leave the house, a police team arrived, based on some information they had received.

"Narendra Modi ji was stepping out for somewhere, when the police team intercepted him and asked 'Do you know if someone named Narendra Modi is residing here?' Modiji remained calm and replied that he was unaware, suggesting that the police should search other houses in the area. The police continued

son was Narendra Modi!"

Hiranbhai Murjibhai Khadni, from Kutch, shares, "During the Emergency, Narendra Modi used to visit us posing as an incense stick salesman, even dressed their futile search and Narendra Modiji, confidently maintaining his disguise, calmly walked away from the situation, escaping a narrow arrest," says Agrawal.

Harish Raval, a senior RSS Pracharak

in Gujarat, has in his memory an occasion when Narendra Modi was travelling in a rickshaw with anti-Emergency literature. A police team stopped the rickshaw, but a vigilant Narendra Modi immediately told the police officers that he worked at the local university and was on his way to deliver exam papers.

Modi advised the police to open the bundle and check, but since the question papers were confidential, they would need to go to the university and inform the university officials about this and clarify the reasons. The police did not touch the bundle and Modi had an easy escape.

Narendra Modi evaded arrest throughout the Emergency because of his alertness and smartness.

"During those days, the police was very vigilant. When Narendra Modi had to give someone a phone number, he did it covertly. Those days, phone numbers were only five digits long. Modi always instructed us to swap the last two digits when passing on a number," recalls Devang Lakhia, an RSS associate from Ahmedabad.

In order to evade arrest, Narendra Modi always maintained a different identity for himself and adopted different names. 'Batukbhai' was one.

Publication and distribution of anti-Emergency literature

Nationwide awareness against the Emergency relied mainly on anti-Emergency literature, as public meetings were impossible and the press was censored.

In such a situation, Narendra Modi coordinated the printing of anti-Emergency literature in Gujarat. He translated pamphlets published in English and Hindi to Gujarati. He go them secretly printed and ensured it reached villages across the state. BJP leader from Rajasathan, Kirori Lal Meena recalls he met Narendra Modi for the first time, when he went to Gujarat to collect such literature for distribution in Rajasthan.

Prakash Mehta, who worked closely with Modi during then says: "Narendra Modi was well aware of the fact that Ahmedabad was well-connected through the railway network to places outside Gujarat like Bihar, Kolkata, Madras, Uttar Pradesh etc. So he made use of railways to send booklets and pamphlets printed in Gujarat to other states." *IANS*

Canadian MP criticizes parliament's tribute to Nijjar amid extremism concerns

VANCOUVER: A Liberal member of Parliament has criticized the recent decision for MPs to stand in the House of Commons for a moment of silence marking the anniversary of the killing of Sikh separatist and India-

Arya, known for advocating stronger ties with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government and opposing Khalistan separatist movements, expressed concern over Nijjar's background. He cited findings that Nijjar had

designated terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijjar, reports The Globe and Mail.

Chandra Arya, MP for Nepean, voiced discontent with his own government's stance. He referenced a Globe and Mail investigation revealing Canadian authorities' concerns about Nijjar's alleged ties to extremism.

In an interview with the newspaper on Monday, Arya remarked on the exclusivity of parliamentary honors, stating, "When Parliament decides to hold a moment of silence, it is very exclusive and limited to a few great Ca-

nadians who have immensely served Canadians for most of their lives. Nijjar is not one of these people." He criticized the elevation of Nijjar's status despite "credible allegations" linking his killing to a foreign government.

On June 18, MPs from all parties observed a moment of silence for Nijjar, who was fatally shot outside his gurdwara in Surrey, BC, a year earlier, an incident Prime Minister Justin Trudeau linked to "credible allegations" involving the Indian government, leading to strained diplomatic relations.

Ambassador of India to France Jawed Ashraf inaugurates exhibition on '100 years of India at Olympics'

PARIS: Ambassador of India to France Jawed Ashraf inaugurated an exhibition on "100 years of India at Olympics" along with France's Minister of Culture Rachida Dati and International Olympic Committee President Thomas Bach.

Ashraf took to his official X account and said that the exhibition was sponsored by JSW Sports

The Ambassador added that during the exhibition he talked about Prime Minister Narendra Modi's emphasis on the development of sports in India.

"Inaugurated the exhibition on "100 years of India at Olympics" sponsored by @jswsports India with Minister of Culture @datirachida and IOC President Thomas Bach. Spoke about PM @narendramodi's emphasis on devt of sports in national transformation & India's case to host Olympics," Ashraf wrote on X.

Speaking at the occasion, Parth Jindal, Founder of the Inspire Institute of Sport said, "It is our mission at JSW Sports to further the Olympic movement, not just in India, but in the world."

In another post on X. Jindal also said that the institute was honored to be associated with the exhibition ANI

entered Canada using a fake passport, promoted violence and, was associated with

Sikh militants advocating for Khalistan in Punjab. The investigation also revealed Niiiar's presence on Canada's no-fly list and multiple instances of police questioning.

The MP highlighted worries that elements within the Khalistan movement were propagating conspiracy theories about the 1985 Air India bombing, which claimed 329 lives, mostly Canadians. Canadian inquiries attributed the bombing to

Sikh extremists, including Talwinder Singh Parmar, identified as its mastermind.

Following the bombing, Parmar, based in British Columbia, fled and was later killed by Indian police in 1992. Two men initially charged were acquitted of first-degree murder. The RCMP maintains an open investigation into the case. ANI

"Disheartening that Congress has nominated its candidate": NDA leaders on Speaker election

NEW DELHI: After the INDIA bloc nominated its candidate for the Lok Sabha Speaker post, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju said on Tuesday that the Speaker is not for a party; it is for the functioning of the House, and it is disheartening that Congress has nominated one.

"We had a conversation with all the floor leaders of the opposition regarding the post of speaker. The Speaker is not for a party, it is for the functioning of the House. The Speaker is elected unanimously. It is disheartening that Congress has nominated its candidate for Speaker. No election has ever taken place for the post of Speaker. Congress put this condition in place: if they get the post of Deputy Speaker, they will support our candidate for the Speaker's post. This give and take of posts of the Speaker and Deputy Speaker is not right," Rijiju said.

Union Minister Pralhad Joshi told ANI that the opposition is going to contest against them, although they have the numbers but this is against parliamentary traditions.

"Today, we had to move the proposal for the post of Speaker. Rajnath Singh and Amit Shah had a conversation with the leaders of the opposition, but they had a pre-condition to support our candidate for Speaker." Joshi said. ANI

India and UAE hail growing momentum in bilateral cooperation

NEW DELHI: External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar and his UAE counterpart Sheikh Abdullah bin Zayed Al Nahyan explored the two countries' efforts to strengthen joint cooperation in all sectors, including economic, trade, investment, education, culture, health, food security, renewable energy, and climate change during their working dinner meeting in Abu Dhabi last weekend.

As both ministers reviewed the multifaceted India-UAE Comprehensive Strategic Partnership, Sheikh Abdullah stressed that the UAE and India share a strong bond, marked by growing momentum in bilateral cooperation.

This collaboration, he was quoted as saying by the UAE Foreign Ministry on 24 June, is aimed at achieving comprehensive development and ensuring sustainable economic prosperity for both nations and their citizens.

"In 2017, the relationship between the two countries was elevated to a Comprehensive Strategic Partnership. This significant development further deepened and strengthened the already strong ties based on a solid foundation of mutual understanding, trust, respect, and shared interests," Sheikh Abdullah noted.

areas with untapped potential, enhancing collaboration within international organizations besides exchanging views on current regional and international developments, including the situation in the Middle East.

"Productive and deep conversations on our ever growing Comprehensive Strategic Partnership. Appreciated the discussion and his insights on regional and global issues," EAM Jaishankar stated.

After Colombo last week, this was Jaishankar's second official visit during the third term of the Modi government.

The assailant approached him at the counter last week Saturday afternoon and fired at him with a gun, causing severe injuries. Despite being rushed to the hospital, Gopikrishna succumbed to his injuries on Sunday while undergoing treatment.

He had been residing in the United States for the past 11 months and was employed at a supermarket in Arkansas.

'Electric car sales in India to reach 1.3-1.5 lakh in FY25'

MUMBAI: With an improving adoption rate, electric car sales in India are likely to reach 1.3-1.5 lakh in the current fiscal year (FY25), according to a CareEdge Rating report.

After a record growth of 90 percent with volumes at 90,432 units in FY24, the electric car penetration is consistently increasing in the country, driven by the government's efforts towards a more sustainable, environmentally friendly, and efficient transportation sector.

The shift to electric mobility extends beyond cars and trucks and e-rickshaws and e-karts are also gaining popularity across the country.

As per the report, the overall passenger vehicles (PV) industry is expected to exhibit moderate volume growth of around 3-5 percent in FY25, on account of a high-base effect of FY24, shrinking order book and expectation of persistently subdued demand for entry-level variants in FY25.



"Strong demand for new model launches and SUVs coupled with the expectation of interest rate cuts in the second half of FY25 is expected to keep the sales momentum rolling," said Arti Roy, Associate Director at CareEdge Ratings.

For the past decade, the utility vehicle (UV) segment has consistently outperformed the PV industry growth rate.

In FY24, for the first time, UV sales volume stood higher than passenger cars and vans.

"While the market for premium vehicles is predicted to thrive, driven by a surge in demand for luxury and high-end models, entry-level variants are likely to see continued diminished demand due to a downturn in both rural and urban markets," said Hardik Shah, Director at CareEdge Ratings. IANS



Weddings now \$130 bn industry in India, a family spending over Rs 12 lakh on average

NEW DELHI: Indian weddings have always been a grand affair and now, an Indian family is spending, on average, more than Rs 12 lakh (nearly \$14,500) on ceremonies, which is five times the GDP per capita (\$2,900), and more than three times the average annual household income of Rs 4 lakh, a new report has revealed.

Touted as the largest wedding destination worldwide, at least 80 lakh to 1 crore weddings are happening in the country every year, according to global brokerage Jefferies.

In fiscal 2023-2024, the Indian wedding market reached a whopping \$130 billion (around Rs 10 lakh crore), second only

The Planning Department has now begun the process of appointing a project management consultant (PMC) for the first Unity Mall that will come up at Awadh Shilpgram in Lucknow.

The Unity Mall project is a Union government scheme under which all states will have to set up at least one shopping space in the capital city or tourist city, following a common design specified by the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade.

Each such space will have to allocate stalls to each state and signify India's "unity and grandeur". In Uttar Pradesh, these



malls are being constructed in Lucknow, Agra and Varanasi.

The PMC, which is being appointed by the Planning Department, will carry out regular monitoring and submit periodical reports to the department to ensure proper assessment of the construction work, said a government spokesperson.

"The tender process has commenced through Request for Proposal (RFP), and implementation is expected in the first week of July. After acceptance, the consultancy must submit architectural designs within 75 days and after its approval, will have to complete all construction work within 18 months. A Defect Liability Period (DLP) of 36 months will also be applicable during this period," the official said.

The development of the Unity Mall project will include the construction of creative indoor spaces, proper space planning, and fulfilment of diverse functional requirements. Complying with environmental standards, the project will incorporate green buildings, excellent ventilation, climate-friendly architecture, wastewater recycling, water conservation and rainwater harvesting along with water and solid waste management, the spokesman added.

The Mall will include 200 non-AC and 34 air-conditioned shops, which will be allocated on a lease of 30 years.

The Unity Mall will also feature an exhibition hall, multipurpose hall, food court, air-conditioned atrium etc.

The Lucknow project is expected to cost more than Rs 60 crore. *IANS*

Mumbai, NCR and Bangalore account for 80 pc of debt financing for real estate in last five years

NEW DELHI: India's real estate sector has debt financing opportunity of around Rs 14 lakh crore in the next three years, highlights a report by real estate company JLL and Propstack. The report also highlighted that during the year 2018-23 the total debt sanctions of the real estate sector was at Rs 9.63 lakh crore.

The report pointed out that there is a good potential for lenders in the real estate market. It said that there is opportunity in two primary market segments, the construction finance or long-term debt, and Lease Rental Discounting, both are slated for good growth during the 2024-2026 period.

The debt demand in the residential market will reach to nearly Rs 4.3 lac crore till 2026. Furthermore, the report stated that India's real estate construction market, comprising other asset classes like Grade A commercial office, highquality malls, warehousing parks, and the market. However, there is still a significant gap between the total residential construction debt requirement and the debt that has been sanctioned, indicating the underserved potential of the market.

NEW DELHI: Union Home Minister Amit Shah will inaugurate the 'Fast Track Immigration Trusted Traveller Programme' at Indira Gandhi International (IGI) Airport here in the national capital later on Friday to revolutionize travel experience, making it faster, easier, and more secure.

Shah will inaugurate the Fast Track Immigration - Trusted Traveller Programme (FTI-TTP) soon after his arrival from Gujarat, where he stayed on Friday and e-inaugurated 30 smart schools.

The FTI-TTP is a visionary initiative by the Central government thoughtfully designed for Indian nationals and Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) cardholders. FTI-TTP aims to revolutionize your travel experience, making it faster, easier, and more secure. This initiative showcases the government's commitment to enhancing travel convenience and efficiency for everyone.

Eligible individuals will need to apply online and submit their biometrics (fingerprint and facial image) along with other required information as specified in the application form. Registration under FTI will be completed after the necessary verifications and confirmation of eligibility. Applicable FTI-TTP processing charges must be paid when submitting the application.

The application shall be submitted only after the non-refundable processing fee has been successfully paid. Applicants will be registered after their identity has been successfully authenticated through mobile OTP and email verification.

Centre designates Kerala's Kollam port as authorized Immigration Check Post

NEW DELHI: The Ministry of Home Affairs designated the Kollam port in Kerala as an authorized Immigration Check Post (ICP) for entry and exit from India with valid travel documents for all classes of passengers recently.

"In pursuance of sub-rule (b) of rule 3 of the Passport (Entry into India) Rules, 1950, the Central Government hereby designates Kollam Seaport of Kerala State as an authorized Immigration Check Post (ICP) for entry into/exit from India with valid travel documents for all classes of passengers," the order read.

The central government, in a separate order, also appointed the Foreigners Regional Registration Officer in Trivandrum as the civil authority for the ICP at Kollam. *ANI* Incorrect or false information or concealing any material facts in the application form shall make the application liable for rejection. Those applicants will not be registered for FTI-TTP whose biometrics, for any technical reason, cannot be captured.

The FTI registration will be valid for a maximum of five years or until the validity of the passport, whichever comes first.

Approved applications would receive a message to schedule an appointment to provide their biometric details. completion of the application processing. The applicant may ensure a minimum passport validity of at least six months while applying for FTI-TTP. Membership of the program will be co-terminus with passport validity.

Applicant needs to provide current residential address to avoid the rejection of application.

The FTI-TTP processing fee (nonrefundable) to be charged is as follows: Indian Nationals Rs 2000, Indian Nationals (Minor) Rs 1000, and

Taiwan mulls visa-on-arrival for Indian travellers

TAIPEI: In a promising development for Indian travellers, Taiwan is actively considering the implementation of visa-onarrival (VoA) for Indian citizens. Deputy Foreign Minister of Taiwan, Tien Chungkwang expressed this intention, highlighting India's significant outbound travel and the potential benefits of easing visa procedures.

Speaking to reporters in Taipei last week, he acknowledged the proposal and emphasized the necessity of internal discussions with Taiwan's Immigration Department before any formal decision can be made. Trump floats idea of giving foreign students graduating in US green cards automatically

WASHINGTON DC: Former US President Donald Trump, who is known for his strong anti-immigration stance, suggested recently that foreign students who graduate from college in the United States should receive a green card automatically so they can stay in the country. He stressed the need to retain the brightest minds in the world, who want to stay in the US and have a plan, which can benefit the country.

"You graduate from a college, I think you should get automatically as part of your diploma a green card to be able to stay in this country, and that includes junior colleges too," Trump said in an episode on the All-In podcast, which is hosted by several venture capitalists. He floated the idea after being asked by the host if he would promise to "give us ability to import the best and brightest around the world to America."

Notably, the former president has used harsh rhetoric about illegal immigration, throughout his campaign. Recently, he criticized President Joe Biden for not being able to decrease the number of migrants crossing the border illegally. Trump is known for his hardline stance on immigration. He has promised that if he's re-elected he'll carry out mass deportations, end birthright citizenship, and reinstitute his prohibition on people entering the US from certain Muslim-majority nations, according to Politico. ?During his tenure as President, Trump consistently promised to build a border wall along the US-Mexico border, although only 452 miles of the wall was built by the time he left office.

However, it is unclear if Trump's suggestion also applies to those who came to the country illegally. *ANI*

Biocon Biologics gets EMA nod to manufacture cancer drug in India

BENGALURU: Biocon Biologics, a subsidiary of Biocon, got approval from the European Medicines Agency (EMA) to manufacture bio-similar Bevacizumab in India.

Further, the facility also received Good Manufacturing Practice (GMP) Certificates of Compliance by the EMA, Biocon said.

The GMP certificates, issued by the Health Products Regulatory Authority (HPRA), Ireland, on behalf of EMA, were also provided to its insulin facility in Malaysia.

The GMP certifications in India and Malaysia "reflect Biocon Biologics' continued compliance with the highest standards of quality and our unwavering commitment to addressing patient needs globally", a company spokesperson said, in the statement. *IANS*

LOS ANGELES: The ongoing bird flu outbreak at US dairy farms has heightened concerns among public health experts as more dairy herds have tested positive for the vi-

The influenza A (H5N1) virus, commonly known as bird flu, is widespread in wild birds worldwide and has been circulating in US poultry since 2022, reports Xinhua news agency.

However, the situation escalated in late 2023 when the virus is believed to have jumped from birds to dairy cows at a Texas farm.

This was followed by a human infection in April linked to exposure to infected cattle. To date, three human cases of infection have been reported, bringing the

6. Keep on a low flame for another 2-3 minutes with a lid.

7. Turn off the flame and allow it to cool.

8. Once cool, grease your hands with some ghee and make balls of the mixture.

9. Your ragi balls or ragi Mudde are ready to eat with sambhar/rasam (soup-like delicacies with lentils).

Diaspora protests release of 'Maharaj' - the film

n June 20, followers of the Pushtimarg (a Vaishnava sect of Hinduism) together with members of the Hindu community held a demonstration outside the Netflix office in Los Gatos, CA to protest the release of Maharaj, a new movie produced by Yash Raj Films. The protestors were accompanied by one of the current leaders of the sect, Shri Dwarkeshlalji Maharajshri, who delivered a signed protest letter to Netflix opposing the release of the movie on the grounds that it hurts the sentiments of followers of the Pushtimarg sect and the Hindu community at large.

Based loosely on a real-life historic court case, the movie depicts a journalist (Karsandas Mulji) questioning the character of Jadunathji Maharaj, the then leader of the Pushtimarg sect. The movie is based on a Gujarati novel of the same name, which is itself a fictionalized and sensationalized account of the Maharaja Libel Case of 1862. The movie suffers from several shortcomings. Primary among them is that it assassinates the character of Jadunathji Maharaj and



grossly distorts the true teachings of the Pushtimarg.

There has been widespread opposition to the release of the movie by the Vaishnavas (followers of the sect) both in India and abroad. Several protest marches and demonstrations have been held in major cities in Gujarat and other states. Vaishnavas have been fighting a legal battle to portray the sect in the correct manner. The movie was originally scheduled to be released on June 14, but a stay order was issued by the Gujarat High Court to delay the release due to a petition filed by Vaishnavas in Ahmedabad, India. After several days of deliberation, the stay order was lifted on June 21 and the movie made available for streaming soon afterwards. Vaishnavas are expected to fight the release in the Supreme Court of India.


non-profit organizations, helping with creating and advising on programs for the community, fundraising, speaking engagements on preventative healthcare.

The warning signs and symptoms of a weak heart are chest pain, shortness of breath, coughing or wheezing, swelling in the legs, ankles, or feet, poor blood supply to extremities, fatigue, fast or uneven heartbeat (Palpitations).

What causes heart to pump harder?

Strong emotional responses, such as stress, anxiety or panic attacks, depression, strenuous exercise, stimulants including caffeine, nicotine, cocaine, amphetamines, and cold and cough medications that contain pseudoephedrine can cause damage to your heart and make it lose its pumping capacity.

You can treat a weak heart pump through your lifestyle changes - including eating a healthy diet, exercising regularly and stopping smoking. Taking a range of



moving and increase your heart rate. Start by setting a modest goal and work your way up to meet that goal. Begin by walking 10-15 minutes three times a week, then, increase walk time by 15 minutes, or increase distance or change pace. Biking, swimming, and dancing are also great activities for beginners.

When it comes to cardiovascular health, exercise is crucial. Get active by performing aerobic exercises that increase your overall aerobic fitness, as measured by a treadmill test, for example, and it helps your cardiac output to assess how well your heart pumps.

diovascular health, so choose foods with healthier fats. Examples include nuts, flaxseed, olives and avocados. Make sure to have a balanced diet and lots of fresh fruit and vegetables.

3) Get your cholesterol checked: Monitor your cholesterol and triglycerides regularly to maintain a good health of your cardiovascular system. You should ask your doctor to perform a test called a fasting lipoprotein profile. This test, usually performed every four to six years, looks at your levels of both good and bad cholesterol (HDL and LDL, respectively). If your LDL cholesterol is high

Aerobic exercise also reduces the risk of type 2 diabetes and, if you already live with diabetes, helps you control your blood glucose. A half-hour walk or other moderate activities for five days per week will make you fitter, stronger, and healthier overall.

2) Improve your diet: A healthy diet should include plenty of tasty, and natural foods that will support your heart health

or your HDL cholesterol is low, you may be at risk of developing problems with your heart and circulatory system.

4) Monitor your blood pressure: Blood pressure that is too high or too low is associated with heart and circulatory issues. Most of the time you probably will not experience any symptoms of high blood pressure. This is why it is essential to have your blood pressure checked



5) Do not overeat: Eating a lot of food at once leads to: 1) Blood shifting from the heart to the digestive system, 2) Faster and irregular heart rhythms, which can lead to heart attack or heart failure. Although this advice primarily applies during the holidays, when deaths from heart attacks spike however, it's valid year round.

6) Give up smoking: If you are a smoker, the single best thing you can do for your cardiovascular health is to stop as soon as you can. Giving up smoking is not easy, but try to quit it. Tobacco has multiple damaging effects on your heart and circulatory system, including increased blood pressure and damage to your blood vessels. The good news is that your body will begin healing itself as soon as you quit smoking. Your blood pressure returns to normal level and lung function recovers in around three months, and after a year, your heart may well be as healthy as a non-smoker's.

7) Stress management: Stress management approaches include learning skills such as problem solving, focusing on important tasks first, and managing your time. Improving your emotional awareness and reactions ability to cope with difficult events in life.

That is the paradox: it is unmistakably present. It has the same undeniable and ethereal character as conscious presence. We know this experience in the same way we know that we are conscious.



Climate crisis is on us: World has little to lose on climate finance agreement **RAJENDRA SHENDE**

new terminology called 'huddlenegotiations' is becoming popular on the conference circuit of the United Nations confabulations on climate change. The latest huddling of negotiators was at the Bonn Climate Conference that concluded on the midnight of 13 June 2024

The Bonn climate conference was the precursor to the main 29th Conference of Parties (COP29) of UNFCCC to be held in Baku, Azerbaijan in November 2024. Negotiators in Bonn, irrespective of their national affiliation, just 'huddled' together informally post conference to find the way out of the impasse, mainly on the issue of climate finance committed by the developed countries for mitigation of GHG (greenhouse gas) emission in developing countries to keep the global average temperature rise below 1.5 deg C or max of 2 deg C as stipulated in Paris Climate agreement.

Negotiations in COP28 in Dubai were, however, managed by President Dr Sultan bin Ahmed Al-Jabar in a more deft manner. Huddling was not needed to arrive at a consensus. COP28 was indeed a unique conference on three accounts

accounts. One, it was the first Conference of Parties where the president of the conference was himself head of the world's 12th largest oil producing company. And still, it was the first COP that agreed to 'transition away from fossil fuel' including oil.

Second, it was the first COP where the global stock-take (GST) took place to assess the global progress towards achieving the goals of the Paris Climate agreement, particularly those related to mitigation, adaptation, loss and damage and finance. Third, it was also the first COP that agreed on transiting towards the goals of the Paris Climate Agreement in a 'just' manner. The word 'just' meant that transition to a carbon neutral and fossil-fuel free economic system, needed for achieving the climate goals, should be as 'fair and inclusive' as possible to all the stakeholders including workers and communities in creating

decent work opportunities and leaving no one behind.

Climatic disasters happening Strangely,

There are variant strategies and tactics deployed in international negotiations during UN conferences. When negotiations in full plenary get stuck, as happens invariably in climate change conferences, smaller groups are formed informally by the president of the conference with the hope of a breakthrough.

In team sports like cricket or football, one sees players of a team huddle together to strategize the game's moves. Well, the huddle groups in the Bonn climate meeting were of a similar kind, except there were divisions within the huddle groups themselves. One group wanted to temper the financial commitments while the other group sought to engage in stumping others by distraction.

Wildfires in the thick forests in Chile, Himalayan India, Nepal, Mexico and Greece were brushed aside by the huddlers. Putin, Kim rekindle close Russian-N Korean links dating back to the Stalin era

Rearly a quarter century after his first visit as the newly-minted Russian President, Vladimir Putin was back last week in North Korea, where he met its leader Kim Jong-un - son of Kim Jong-II who he had met in 2000 - for talks on economic, security and global issues, and signed a Treaty on Comprehensive Strategic Partnership.

This unprecedented pact was cited as "the groundwork" for future bilateral relations in all spheres, including cultural and tourist ties, trade, economic relations, and security. Tellingly, it also includes a pledge by both to assist each other in case of "foreign aggression", amid what both termed efforts by the US and its allies "to destabilize the situation in Southeast Asia".

How should the development, which created frisson in the region, especially among neighbors South Korea and Japan and concern in the US, especially when Putin warned his country could arm North Korea on the same pattern as Western nations were supplying weapons to Ukraine, be seen?

First, it was not the first meeting between the two leaders. The North Korean leader, in his first visit out of his country after the Covid outbreak - had visited Russia's Far East in September last year and was hosted by President Putin, who travelled eastward.

While it is tempting to pass it off as a case of two isolated but scarcely to be ignored - and heavily sanctioned countries reaching out to each other for mutual support, history and geopolitics indicate the two are far from chance partners thrown together by the vicissitudes of diplomatic realignments and their statecraft choices.

Like Russia, which has plenty of friends across the world, North Korea is not entirely alone either. Both Russia and China are old allies, and despite agreeing to sanction it over its nuclear weapons program or disinclined to back it in any reckless adventure, they acknowledge its use in keeping the US, South Korea, and Japan on edge.

And then Russia's predecessor, the Soviet Union not only helped create - and then safeguarded - North Korea, but for good measure, also selected its first leader - and his family is still in power.

Kim Jong-un's grandfather Kim II-Sung was handpicked by Stalin to become North Korea's leader after the Japanese were North Korean accounts credit Kim Il-Sung with leading the liberation, it was only in September 1945 that he and 60 members of his band landed in Wonsan port on a Soviet ship, still dressed in their Red Army uniforms.

As it was decided Korea would be divided at the 38th Parallel for occupation purposes, Stalin needed a local face to run the Soviet part. Kim II-Sung was chosen for two reasons - he spoke good Russian and then having lived almost all his life outside his homeland, had no contact with the "nationalistic" Korean communists, whom

driven out at the end of the Second World War. His son and successor Kim Jong-II - whom Putin met in 2000 - was born Yuri Irsenovich Kim in Soviet Russia in 1941 or 1942.

Kim II-Sung, whose family fled Korea for Manchuria after Japan occupied and colonized the peninsula from 1910 onwards, had studied in China, where he also joined the Chinese Communist Party and fought against the Japanese who had invaded Manchuria in the 1930s. However as the tide turned against them, he and his remaining guerrillas crossed the Amur into Soviet Russia in 1940 and became part of the Red Army for the entire World War II.

On August 8, 1945, the Soviets declared war on Japan and by the time it surrendered, had arrived in Pyongyang. While Stalin disliked and distrusted.

However, on the flip side, since Kim II Sung had studied in China and trained in Soviet Russia, his Korean was rusty and before he could address his people in October 1945, the Soviets had to help him brush up his mother tongue!

In September 1948, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea came into existence with Kim II-Sung its leader - he would go on to outlive the Soviet Union himself.

Soviet-North Korean relationships were not always smooth. The invasion of South Korea was Kim II-Sung's idea and the Soviets only agreed after they got an atom bomb of their own and China's Mao Zedong agreed to support the attack. *IANS*

INDIA EXAM WOES

The Wonder-World of corruption in India has been exposed yet again. This time with the premier NEET-UG entrance test system. Investigators piecing together the conspiracy behind the NEET-UG paper-leak, have a handle on how 'handlers' operate in the shady realms of the nationwide exam racket, whose roots have been traced to Bihar and Jharkhand.

The nine handlers arrested in the NEET-UG case, so far, six in Jharkhand and three in Bihar, are tech-savvy individuals who played crucial role in orchestrating the leak of question papers, training the examinees, who paid for the services, to prepare the answers and even escort them to their respective centers," a senior police officer said. To expand their client base, these handlers would look for opportunities to connect with coaching centers, schools and colleges on some pretexts. They would seek out individuals associated with the exam process and bribe them into getting useful information. According to Bihar Police's raid on a safe house, based on a tip-off on the morning of the May 5 NEET-UG exam, threw up evidence of these handlers. "The examinees were there through the night to memorize answers to the leaked question papers. The handlers then transported them to their exam centers in private vehicles, taking all necessary precautions to ensure their safety," the officer said

The older system had loopholes that fraudsters and corrupt officials would easily exploit. "Before the introduction of online forms, examination-conducting agencies, would assign roll numbers based on when they received the application envelopes. Criminals exploited this system by sending multiple application forms in a single envelope, using codes like 'bogie' and 'engine' to refer to candidates and their proxies, respectively," said an IPS officer of the Bihar cadre.

India's centralized exam system is losing credibility by the day. Fixing accountability and rescheduling exams may be all very well, but what about the impact of such decisions on young minds? In any case, should a three-hour test be a deciding factor that defines the lives of millions of youth of India

The rise of Kota, Sikar, Hyderabad and Patna coaching centers, and hubs, should have raised doubts long ago that something is not right. The trauma that student aspirants are made to go through can be nearly compared to mini concentration camps designed to cramp-up three years of work into one exam.

The need-of-the-hour for a country like India is to adopt a program that is demand based. Students must be allowed to choose from more than one national testing agency and, like in US and other developed countries, open-book exams could also be looked at as an option.

Indian students are amongst the best brains in the world and the past rot in the system needs to be replaced with modern, open-thinking and, robust testing systems that match a new society, where they will have the opportunity to compete with AI and beyond.

Located in the Western Ghats at a height of 4411 feet above the sea level amidst Karnataka's Mookambika Wildlife Sanctuary, they also prove to be one of the good trekking trails, beginning at the South Kanara Forest.

Jog Falls: The second-highest plunge waterfall in India, Jog Falls is a major tourist attraction in Karnataka and is the highest waterfall in the state. Second, to the Nohkalikai Falls of Meghalaya, Jog falls drops about a huge 253 m (850 ft.) in a single fall. However, due to the construction of Linganamakki Dam, which is a hydroelectricity plant close by, the flow in the falls is hugely restricted before monsoons. So, it is best to go during the Monsoon season to see the falls in its full form. Honnemaradu: Honnemaradu is a small cozy village, by the Honnemaradu Reservoir. The site is set in the middle of a valley and a weekend getaway to this place is nothing less than an adventure camp. The little village has very few people, and the only attraction is the water sports at the Honnemaradu Lake. Camping, canoeing or even just relaxing by the lake, Honnemaradu is perfect for a quick getaway. There are other attractions there as well like the Dabbe Falls and the famous Jog Falls are close by.

Keladi: Keladi is a village in the Shimoga District known for its rich past and culture. Once served as the first capital of the Keladi Nayaka Kingdom, today this prime location is adorned with two popular attractions i.e. Keladi Rameshwara Temple and Keladi Museum.

Tavarekoppa Tiger and Lion Safari:

Located 10 km from Shimoga, a thick cover of forest is situated there inhabiting tigers and lions moving freely in its deep parts. A lion and tiger safari began there in 1988, across a huge area of 200 hectares.

Sakrebayalu Elephant Camp:

Sakrebayalu Elephant Camp is a place where one can see herds of Elephants being trained. Situated at a distance of nearly 14 km from the town of Shimoga, it is a quite popular spot among tourists. This eco-tourism center has elephants trained by skilled mahouts. The wild elephants are seen in their natural habitats as they go and bathe in the backwaters and interact with their young ones. It is located on River Tunga and is a beautiful sanctuary. When at the sanctuary, avoid using flash photography as it may anger the elephants. Best time to visit Agumbe: Monsoon is the best period, i.e. June to October, to visit Agumbe for river rafting as the Sita Nadi swells up and the rapids become challenging.

How to reach Agumbe: Mangalore is the nearest Air head at 106 km while Bangalore is 378 km from Agumbe. *www.holidify.com*




