



Geo News reported that without mentioning any country, Tammy Bruce, spokesman for the US Department of State, has also issued a statement in this regard.

"Consistent with President Trump's Executive Order on Reevaluating and Realigning United States Foreign Aid, Secretary Rubio has paused all US foreign assistance funded by or through the State Department and US Agency for International Development (USAID) for review," Bruce said, as reported by Geo News.

The move has instantly stopped several USAID projects in Pakistan, including the Ambassadors Fund for Cultural Preservation (AFCP), which is the flagship program to promote cultural heritage preservation and protection.

Additionally, five projects related to the energy sector have also come to a halt as a result of this decision. As per Geo News, these include the Power Sector Improvement Activity, Pakistan Private Sector En-

ergy Activity, Energy Sector Advisory Services Project, Clean Energy Loan Portfolio Guarantee Program and Pakistan Climate Financing Activity.

Notably, economic growth-related four

Among them, Social Protection Activity was the only program supposed to end in 2025.

Others include Investment Promotion Activity, Pakistan Private Investment Initiative and Economic Recovery and Development Activity. Geo News noted that the USD 24.8 million FATA Economic Revitalization Program, implemented by the United Nations Development Program has already been completed.

In the agriculture sector, the Gomal Zam Command Area Development Project was completed in 2024. However, two of the five programs were expected to end in 2025.

They include Water Management for Enhanced Productivity and Pakistan Agriculture Programs II. Yet, Livelihood and Food Security Activity for Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and the Flood Affected Districts of Pakistan, Climate Smart Agriculture and Recharge Pakistan are also affected, Geo News said.

Projects Democracy, Human Rights and Governance funds are also hit by Trump's order.

As per Geo News, four of these 11 projects were expected to be completed in 2025. However, a USD 19.1 million project to strengthen Electoral and Legislative Processes was just completed in 2024. ANI

### Tulsi Gabbard, Trump's pick for Director National Intelligence to appear before Senate Intelligence Committee for confirmation hearing

WASHINGTON, DC: US President Donald Trump's pick for Director of National Intelligence, Tulsi Gabbard, will

face what could be the toughest confirmation hearing of any of his top nominees as Democrats and some Republicans have been preparing to question Gabbard about her visit to Syria in 2017, her statements in support of Russia and her concerns regarding domestic surveillance powers, The Washington Post reported.

According to two congressional officials, who spoke on the condition of anonymity to discuss Trump's nominee, said her approval by the Senate Intelligence Committee to be director of national intelligence is far from assured.

A Senate aide said, "She definitely doesn't have the votes right now" to advance out of the intelligence committee."

## Tahawwur Rana not yet on plane to India, US 'evaluating' options

WASHINGTON: The United States' State Department is "evaluating next steps" in regard to Tahawwur Rana's extradition to India that was upheld last week by the country's Supreme Court, clearing the way for him to finally face justice for his alleged role in the 2008 Mumbai terrorist attacks.

Rana is of Pakistani descent like David Coleman Headley, who is serving a long prison sentence in an US jail after pleading guilty for his complicity in the 2008 ter-

rorist attacks in a deal with American authorities that protects him from extradition.

"In view of the recent Supreme Court decision, and consistent with applicable US law, the Department of State is currently evaluating next steps in this case," a spokesperson for the agency said in response to an IANS request for information on the next steps following the court order and when is he likely to be dispatched to India.

"We have long supported India's efforts to ensure the perpetrators of the Mumbai terrorist

attacks face justice," the spokesperson added.

The US has indeed been supportive of Indian efforts to bring the perpetrators of the attacks that left 167 people

dead, including six Americans, and hundred wounded.

It has pushed Pakistan, where the terrorists of the

Lashkar-e-Toiba were based and where they had been trained by the country's Intelligence service, to punish the perpetrators.

The US also helped India's case before the UN Security Council for designating Masood Azhar, the founder of the Lashkar-e-Taiba, an international terrorist, leading a group of permanent members to stymie Chinese attempts to block the effort.

For now, however, it seems unclear how soon Rana

will be on a plane to India.

Rana was arrested by the US police in October 2009, just two weeks after Headley's arrest, on three counts: Conspiracy to provide material support to terrorism in India, conspiracy to provide material support to terrorism in Denmark, and providing material support to a foreign terrorist organization, according to a US court document.

Rana was convicted in June 9, 2011 by a jury of the terrorism conspiracycharge related to Denmark and provid-

ing material support to Lashkar, but he was acquitted of the terrorism conspiracy related to the Mumbai attacks.

He was sentenced by the district court in 2013 to 14 years in prison. But after serving half of the sentence he applied for and was granted compassionate release in 2020 during the COVID-19 pandemic. *IANS*


Yelena from Moscow, Russia told ANI that she enjoyed attending the Maha Kumbh Mela with her friends and described Prayagraj as a "beautiful place."

### Trump freezes USD 50 million for 'condoms in Gaza'

WASHINGTON DC: In her first press briefing recently US Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt said that the US Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) and Office of Management and Budget (OMB) found that about USD 50 million was used to fund 'condoms in Gaza'.

In a post on X, he said, "My guess is that a lot of that money ended up in the pockets Hamas, not actually condoms," adding, "Yes, even in the unlikely event that the money was actually spent on condoms, we should NOT be sending US taxpayer money to buy condoms for foreigners." *ANI* 


### Putin greets Prez Murmu, PM Modi on occasion of India's 76th R-Day

security," PM Modi wrote on X.

There was no word yet from the White House, which, as is the practice, will release readout of the conversation shortly.

This was the second phone conversation between the two leaders after President Trump's re-election; the first took place just after Trump won the election in November.

The two leaders have shared a close personal relationship going back to President Trump's first term from 2017 to 2021.

The U.S. President jointly addressed a rally hosted for Prime Minister Modi in Houston in 2019 called the "Howdy Modi" rally and then he travelled to India in February 2020 for a "Namaste Trump" in PM Modi's home state Gujarat.

The two leaders will meet personally sometime this year. According to a report

"Welcome to the revolution of love, to the rebellion, to our refusal as

## India likely to launch its own safe, affordable Al model within 6 months: IT Minister

NEW DELHI: India is likely to launch its own safe and secure indigenous artificial intelligence (AI) model within six months at an affordable cost, Union Minister for Railways and Electronics and IT, Ashwini Vaishnaw, said recently.

The Indian AI model is a timely step as India is a trusted

nation and, therefore, it will help the country emerge as a more reliable technological powerhouse of ethical AI solutions in the days to come, the minister told media here.

Backed by a high-end common computing facility, the IndiaAI mission is now closer to customizing indigenous AI solutions for the domestic context using Indian languages.

Scientists, researchers, developers and coders are

working on multiple foundational models in this regard and with the given pace, the Union Minister expressed hope that the Indian AI model is likely to be ready within six months.

The AI model is beginning with the computation facility of roughly 10,000 GPUs. Soon, the remaining 8693 GPUs will be added. It will largely benefit researchers, students and developers in the beginning.

Government has decided to give it to the users for less

than Rs 100 per GPU after subsidizing the 40 per cent of the cost.

Compared to global models costing \$2.5 to \$3 per hour usage, India's AI Model will cost less than less than Rs 100 rupees per hour after 40 per cent government subsidy.

#### National Critical Minerals Mission to cut dependence on imports, support Net Zero goal: PM Modi

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi recently said the National Critical Minerals Mission, approved by the Cabinet, aims to reduce import dependence, strengthen domestic value chains and support India's 'Net Zero by 2070' goal.

Responding to an article written by Union Minister G

Kishan Reddy on National Critical Mineral Mission (NCMM), PM Modi posted on X: "Union Minister Shri @kishanreddybjp elaborates on how the National Critical Minerals Mission aims to reduce import dependence, strengthen domestic value chains and support India's 'Net Zero by 2070' goal."

National Critical Mineral Mission (NCCM) is being launched with an outlay of Rs 16,300 crore and expected investment of Rs 18,000 crore by public sector undertakings (PSUs).

It will encompass all stages of the value chain, including mineral exploration, mining, beneficiation, processing, and recovery from end-of-life products.

The mission will intensify the exploration of critical minerals within the country and in its offshore areas. It also aims to create a fast-track regulatory approval process for critical mineral mining projects, according to an official statement.

Additionally, the mission will offer financial incentives for critical mineral exploration and promote the recovery of these minerals from overburden and tailings.

Critical minerals such as lithium, chromium, nickel, graphite, cobalt, titanium and rare earth elements are essential raw materials for sectors like electronics, electric

vehicles, renewable energy, defense and high-tech telecommunications.

Currently the extraction of these minerals is dominated by a few countries such as China which makes the supply chain vulnerable to geopolitical uncertainties.

India is viewed as part of the alternative supply chain that needs to be developed to break China's dominance in this crucial segment. India at present relies mainly on imports to meet its demand. It is also exploring opportunities for min-



The country has entered into collaboration with Australia, the world's top producer of Lithium accounting for as much as 47 percent of the mineral. A government-to-government agreement has been signed between the Ministry of Mines and DSIR, under which five projects of Lithium and cobalt have been selected where project feasibility is being carried out. *IANS* 

#### iPhones gain 7 pc India smartphone market share in 2024, grow 23 pc YoY

NEW DELHI: Apple iPhones registered 7 percent India smartphone market share in 2024, rising on robust local production and growing premiumisation trend in smaller cities, a recent report showed.

On year-on-year basis, iPhones registered 23 percent growth and iPads an impressive 44 percent growth in the country, according to data shared by CyberMedia Research (CMR) to IANS.

"Apple's strong growth momentum in CY2024, fuelled by double-digit expansion in both iPhones and iPads, was driven by favorable tailwinds from smartphone premiumisation, alongside a robust push by Apple in domestic manufacturing and retail expansion," said Prabhu Ram, VP-Industry Research Group, CyberMedia Research (CMR).



India's aspirational middle class is increasingly investing in premium devices, not only as lifestyle statements but also for their advanced technological capabilities.

"The enduring aspirational appeal of iPhones and iPads continues to be a key driver of market growth for Apple, with sufficient headroom to grow in CY2025 and beyond. It is still early days for Apple in India," he

In the October-December quarter (Q4) of 2024, Apple, with its aspirational image and rising footprint, entered the top 5 smartphone players in India for the first time, garnering nearly 10 percent market share by volume.

Last year, the tech giant made new exports as well as domestic sale records, driven by the government's production-linked incentive (PLI) scheme and aggressive retail expansion.

The company's strategic approach in India over the past year has resulted in significant achievements and increased market importance.

Apple's India shipments were set to cross 11 million marks in 2024.

Apple's growth in India is expected to continue with significant momentum in the coming year, driven by aggressive retail expansion, targeted marketing strategies, and a deeper penetration into the aspirational Indian market, said Ram.

This growth is fuelled by the strong demand for both the latest and previous generation iPhones, he noted. IANS

#### **New Zealand** relaxes visitor visa rules to allow tourists' 'workcation'

WELLINGTON: The New Zealand government is relaxing visitor visa rules to allow tourists to work remotely for their foreign employers while visiting New Zealand in the latest effort to boost tourism and economic growth.

The government is making the country more attractive to "digital nomads," people who work remotely, while travelling, such as IT specialists, which will boost New Zealand's attractiveness as a destination, Economic Growth Minister Nicola Willis said recently, as reported by Xinhua news agency.

Tourism is New Zealand's second-largest export earner, generating revenue of almost 11 billion NZ dollars (6.26 billion US dollars) and creating nearly 200,000 jobs, Willis said.

"The change will enable many visitors to extend their stays, which will lead to more money being spent in the country," said Immigration Minister Erica Stanford

Visitor visas will allow people to work remotely for a foreign employer while they are holidaying in New Zealand, she said, adding that anyone who intends to work remotely for more than 90 days should look at possible tax implications.

Tourism Minister Louise Upston said many countries offer digital nomad visas, and New Zealand aims to be an attractive destination for people who want to "workcation" abroad, as ways of working become increasingly more digitized and flexible. IANS

#### US intensifies crackdown on immigration; Vice President Vance, Trump's Border Czar defends raids on schools, churches

WASHINGTON DC: The Donald Trump administration's crackdown against illegal immigration continues to intensify, as the US Justice Department said it had begun making arrests in Chicago as part of a multiagency enforcement operation, the New York Times reported.

US Vice President JD Vance, has also endorsed immigration raids on schools, and said that he hoped they would have a "chilling effect on illegal immigrants coming to our country."

Vance said immigration raids in religious buildings and schools should not be ruled out. "If you have a person who is convicted of a violent crime, whether they are an illegal immigrant or not, you have to go and get that person to protect the public safety," he said. "That's not unique to immigration."

Trump's Border Czar Tom Homan has said that immigration officials will need at least 1,00,000 beds to support Trump's sweeping deportation efforts. He called on the US Congress to "come to the table quick and give us the money we need."

On being asked whether immigration enforcement agents would search for people in churches or schools, Homan replied that ICE would act on a "case-by-case basis." But he seemed to suggest that highschool-aged children could be

Regarding deportation funding, Tom Homan said he would "leave it up to Congress," The Hill reported. Homan was speaking

affiliated with gangs and represented legitimate targets.

Homan said that deportations would "steadily increase" as the administration moved to "open up the aperture" to target anyone in the country illegally -- not just those with a criminal record.

"The Congress, I think the president has a mandate. This is the number one issue that people voted on," Homan said. "And I think Congress has a mandate to give us money."

In another major development last week, US officials also shut down an app that allowed asylum-seekers to schedule appointments for admission at a port of entry.

Homan apparently dismissed the app, which had been set up by the Biden administration, as an 'illegitimate method' for migrants to use.

"Go to the embassy, go to the port of entry, do it the legal way," Homan said as quoted by the New York Times. "You shouldn't come to this country and ask to get asylum, and the first thing you do is break our laws by entering illegally." ANI

#### Mexico blocks US deportation flight amid tensions over Trump's immigration policies

WASHINGTON, DC: Mexico refused to permit a deportation flight from the United States to land, marking an obstacle in US President Donald Trump's intensified immigration enforcement measures, the New York Post reported.

The denial followed Trump's renewed efforts to strengthen border security, conduct mass deportations, and execute raids since returning to the White House.

The blocked flight came after two US Air Force C-17 flights successfully transported approximately 160 deportees to Guatemala earlier that day.

However, Mexico's refusal to accept the plane raised questions, with no immediate clarification provided.

The White House attributed the issue to an administrative mix-up. A White House official understanding was related to the Department of Defense flight manifest.

"Per the official, Mexico was full steam ahead to accept the deportations - and would have if there hadn't been a misunderstanding

#### Colombia buckles: Trump shows how tariff threats will work if nations shun illegal migrants' deportation

NEW YORK: As the US has intensified its campaign of rounding up illegal migrants and deporting them on military planes, it overcame opposition from Colombia with threats of tariffs in a preview of how President Donald Trump will enforce his campaign promise.

After Colombia refused to let two aircraft carrying its nationals apprehended in the US as illegal migrants land, Trump announced on Truth Social a 25 percent tariff on imports from that country, which, he threatened, would double in a week.

However, by Sunday night, Colombia's resistance crumbled, and the White House said it had agreed to "unrestricted acceptance of all illegal aliens from Colombia" including those coming on military planes.

Secretary of State Marco Rubio said, "It is the responsibility of each nation to take back their citizens who are illegally present in the United States in a serious and expeditious manner".

After a meeting between Rubio and External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, the US said that they had discussed "irregular migration" and the minister said that India was open to taking back illegal migrants.

Reports said that about 20,000 Indians would be taken

In a show of force, federal agents fanned out across the US rounding up criminal illegal migrants.

Trump had promised mass deportations in his Day 1 agenda, but the logistical impossibility of rounding up millions of people has made his administration moderate it by prioritizing those who had committed crimes, reinvigorating enforcement of laws that were followed tepidly.

Brazil, meanwhile, protested the handcuffing of deportees who arrived there on US planes calling it "degrading treatment".

Mexico temporarily refused to let US military planes carrying deportees land last week, but quickly rescinded the orders and let them back in.

#### Sikh community leaders deny reports of immigration raids at **New York's Gurdwaras**

NEW YORK: Sikh community leaders have said that there have been no raids on Gurdwaras contradicting reports in some Indian media.

Sukhjinder Singh Nijjar, who was at New York's Richmond Hill Gurdwara, a major Sikh center, said the prayer services were conducted reverently and there was no interference by anyone.

There were no raids or any law enforcement actions at other Gurdwaras in New York and New Jersey either, said Nijjar who is with the Sikh Cultural Society representing the Coastal Northeast and was the chairman of its public and media committee.

He attributed the misreporting to "some sort of misunderstanding and miscommunication" and "just basically word of mouth type of thing that" gets spread with no ba-

Rajwant Singh, the chairman of the Sikh Council on Religion and Education, discounted the reports of the raids or visits to the temples by immigration or other agen-

The Sikh community in New York and New Jersey has good relations at "all levels of government representatives, including the Justice Department and the White House", he said. IANS

back. While that meshes with Trump's goal of ridding the country of illegal migrants, it also deals with India's concern over Indian criminal gangs and extremists operating from the US.

There are an estimated 11 million illegal migrants in the US and, according to the Pew Research Centre about 725,000 of them are Indians.

The rounding up of illegal immigrants, particularly those with criminal histories, has been ongoing, even under former President Joe Biden, but has been reinvigorated with a dash of publicity after President Trump declared a national emergency over illegal migration last Monday after he was sworn in.

Acting Deputy Attorney General Emil Bove said that several federal agencies were being deployed to help the Department of Homeland Security in rounding up illegal migrants in order to "secure the border, stop this invasion".

He and Border Czar Tom Homan were in Chicago, where the enhanced operations have been launched.

The Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), the prime agency for the deportations announced "enhanced targeted operations" in Chicago to keep "potentially dangerous criminal aliens".

Chicago is one of the places that have declared themselves sanctuary cities that claim to be protective of illegal migrants and forbidding their police and other agencies to cooperate with the immigration authorities.

Operations were also afoot in other places, including Colorado where about 50 people were arrested in a raid at a nightclub, according to the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA).

DEA said in post X that many were members of Tren de Aragua, a dreaded Venezuelan criminal gang declared a terrorist organization by President Trump.

The agency said it was participating in raids in Los Angeles, Savannah in Georgia, Omaha in Nebraska, and

On Friday, raids were carried out in Newark, New Jersey. Homan has threatened legal action against those impeding immigration operations.

Despite Chicago's claim to be a sanctuary city, Illinois Governor JB Pritzker said in an interview to CNN that the state would cooperate in deporting criminal illegal migrants or those under deportation orders, while ruling out participation in raids. IANS

#### Kristi Noem voted as US Homeland Security Secretary, will be crucial for Trump's crackdown on immigration

WASHINGTON DC: The US Senate voted to confirm Kristi Noem as the Homeland Security Secretary in the new Trump administration.

The installation of a longtime Trump ally at the helm of an agency is poised to play a central role in the president's promised immigration crackdown, according to CNN.

The vote cast last Saturday, was bipartisan, 59-34, confirming Noem's appointment.

Noem, who has been serving as Governor of South Dakota since 2019, is a former state legislator and fourterm congresswoman. She will now be tasked with leading Homeland Security, a sprawling department that oversees agencies such as US Customs and Border Protection, Immigration and Customs Enforcement, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, and the US Secret Service.

The White House in a post on X said that Noem's confirmation as Secretary of Homeland Security underscored Trump's commitment to strengthening their security.

"Kristi Noem's confirmation as Secretary of Homeland Security underscores President Trump's commitment to strengthening our nation's security."

Following Saturday's vote, Noem in a statement, said she will prioritize securing the southern border and fixing "our broken immigration system," as reported by CNN.

"I will work every day to keep all Americans safe and secure. One of my top priorities is achieving President Trump's mandate from the American people to secure our southern border and fix our broken immigration system," she stated.

"The Trump Administration will once-again empower our brave men and women in law enforcement to do their jobs and remove criminal aliens and illegal gangs from our country," Noem added.

In addition to immigration, Noem addressed a range of other issues during her confirmation hearing.

In response to questions from Democrats, she said that under her leadership "there will be no political bias" when it comes to disaster relief and there must be a focus on domestic terrorism, saying that "homegrown terrorism is on the rise," as she called the deadly New Year's truck attack in New Orleans "a horrific event", CNN reported. ANI

## Study shows new drug can be a game changer for restoring vision

NEW DELHI: US researchers have found a promising drug candidate that could potentially help repair vision in people with multiple sclerosis (MS) and other neurological conditions.

Researchers at the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus showed that the drug, LL-341070, can boost the brain's ability to repair damaged myelin - the protective sheath around nerve fibers.

Damage to myelin is a hallmark of diseases like MS. Ageing also causes damage to myelin -- resulting in vision loss, loss of motor skills, and cognitive decline.

The study, published in the journal Nature Communications, showed that LL-341070 can boost the repair process of the brain. Mice studies showed it also improves brain function related to vision, even after severe damage.

"This research brings us closer to a world where the brain has the capacity to heal itself," said Ethan Hughes, Associate Professor in the Department of Cell and Developmental Biology at the CU School of Medicine. *IANS*

Currently, there are more than 1000 people, which include 436 disabled people, 250 leprosy patients, 80 mentally ill (suffering from schizophrenia) and 26 HIV+ patients. Not just Gujarat, people from Maharashtra, Rajasthan, and Bengal are also living here.

Suresh Soni may have turned octogenarian today but his resolve towards social service remains as strong as it was earlier.

Years ago, while being a professor in Vadodara, Suresh Soni chose a life partner for himself who accepted all his conditions. He wrote a 17-page letter to his wife before marriage, in which he preferred her not to wear gold jewelry, live a village life and do something for society.

His wife Indiraben supported him in every endeavor. He and his wife themselves served leprosy patients in their early days. Today, Indiraben plays an active role in all works of the trust started by her. The Trust is also home to some people who failed to clear competitive examinations like IAS but turned victims of mental stress due to failure, leading to severe cognitive diseases. *IANS* 

## Asia-pacific healthcare market to hit \$5 T by 2030, Indian CDMOs to shine globally: Report

NEW DELHI: The Asia-Pacific healthcare market is on track to hit \$5 trillion by 2030, driving 40 percent of global sector growth, according to a recent report.

The report by Boston Consulting Group (BCG) noted that the unprecedented expansion is fuelled by rapid demographic shifts, investment influxes, and groundbreaking tech-

nology applications.

The expansion also includes advancements in new therapies and modalities by Indian contract development and manufacturing organizations (CDMOs).

"Innovation is emerging as a key driver of growth in Asia's healthcare landscape. Indian CDMOs are scaling globally, leveraging their cost efficiencies but also starting to make early strides into complex and cutting-edge modalities such as ADCs and

oligonucleotides, enhancing their global competitiveness," said Smruthi Suryaprakash, Partner, BCG.

"At the same time, decades of investment in biotech across the

region are starting to pay off, with advancements in India and Singapore driving localized breakthroughs in new therapies and modalities. These complementary trends, as highlighted in our report, showcase Asia's potential to lead both global and regional healthcare innovation," Suryaprakash added.

Further, the report comprehensively explores the Asian healthcare market from multiple perspectives and identifies key factors driving transformation.

It noted that Asia accounts for only 22 percent of global healthcare spending, despite being home to 60 percent of the global population.

With chronic conditions such as diabetes and cancer affecting Asia disproportionately, the report suggested finding its own healthcare models to manage the disease

burden. Of the top five prevalent cancers in Asia, liver and stomach cancer have a lower prevalence in the West, which means that Asia will need to invent its own solutions. *IANS* 



## This weight loss app can track fiber, protein content in meals

NEW YORK: Researchers have developed a weight management program that helps individuals plan meals with the assistance of a web application and support from a registered dietitian, including tracking fiber and protein content in meals.

Many people struggle to maintain a healthy weight, and choosing the optimal meals for weight loss can be challenging. Most dieting apps available are usually macronutrient calculators, according to the study published in the journal JMIR Formative Research.

"But we want people to focus on finding foods that have a high protein and fiber density to get them to their meal goals. It's less about counting calories and more about finding the foods that will satisfy us and provide the protein we need to maintain muscle mass as we lose weight," said Ashleigh Oliveira, a doctoral student at University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign in the US.

"Foods that are high in fiber also have

all the micronutrients we need, so we're not missing out on vitamins and minerals as we're eating less food," Oliveira added.

The program's first iteration, the Individualized Dietary Improvement Program (iDip), was an in-person program where



EMPOWER has three components: Educational materials about nutrition; an online app where participants can design meals for weight loss and monitor their progress; and personalized support from registered dieticians, who are available for online chats.

The research team developed MealPlot, an interactive feature that charts protein and fiber content in food.

People enter the food they want to eat into a chart that plots fiber and protein content. The goal is to ensure each day's overall food intake falls within a specific protein/fiber target range.

The MealPlot app is freely available and anyone can register for an account, but to get the full benefit you should work with a dietitian, the researchers said. The researchers are now fine-tuning the application and plan to launch the full program by spring 2026. IANS

## Rise of Ayush increasingly making India a health tourism hub

NEW DELHI: With the rise of the AYUSH system (Ayurveda, Yoga and Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha, and Homeopathy) India has emerged as a premier destination for medical tourism over the years.

The Ministry of Ayush has been instrumental in promoting traditional medicines. As a result in 2024, Ayurveda, Yoga, Unani, Siddha, and Homeopathy were integrated into mainstream health systems worldwide.

In 2023, the government implemented medical visa provisions to facilitate the entry of international tourists seeking health and wellness treatments in the country.

It has led to significant growth in medical tourism resulting in about 123 regular Ayush visas and 221 e-Ayush visas issued to foreigners seeking treatment in India, between July 2023 and December 2024, according to the Ministry

During the same period, 17 e-Ayush attendant visas have also been issued.

Ayush Visa is available under four sub-categories namely: Ayush visa; Ayush attendant visa; e-Ayush visa and e-Ayush attendant visa. An Ayush Visa is granted to a foreigner whose sole purpose is to seek treatment

through Ayush systems.

India currently has more than 755,780 registered Ayush practitioners, 886 undergraduate and 251 postgraduate colleges with an annual intake of 59,643 UG students and 7,450 PG students.

About 3,844 Ayush hospitals and 36,848 dispensaries have also been set up, while over 43,000 studies are hosted on the Ayush Research Portal, emphasizing evidence-based healthcare.

Ayush has also seen digital transformation through initiatives like Ayush Grid, e-Sanjeevani telemedicine, and Al integration. Further, Ayush Telemedicine has brought quality healthcare to remote regions.

Outside India, Ayush Information Cells are currently operational in 39 locations across 35 countries. These serve as vital hubs for disseminating knowledge and building global awareness.

The Ministry has also collaborated with over 103 countries to promote Ayush systems. It established the WHO Global Traditional Medicine Centre in Jamnagar and led to the recognition of traditional medicine in WHO Disease Classification Series ICD-11 in 2024. *IANS* 

#### Indian scientists develop nano-formulation to bring safer treatment for Parkinson's

NEW DELHI: Scientists from the Institute of Nano Science and Technology (INST) Mohali, an autonomous institute of the Department of Science and Technology, recently announced a targeted nano-formulation that will enable safer treatment method for people suffering from Parkinson's disease.

The new nano-formulation helps in the sustained release of a hormone called 17beta-oestradiol which is crucial for managing Parkinson's. Many neurodegenerative and psychiatric malignancies like Parkinson's disease originate from an imbalance of 17 beta-oestradiol (E2) in the human brain.

However, the peripheral side effects of the usage of E2 for Parkinson's therapy and less understanding of the molecular mechanism hinder establishing its neurotherapeutic potential, said the team. In the study, published in the journal Carbohydrate Polymers, the team noted using Dopamine Receptor D3 (DRD3)

conjugated to 17beta-oestradiol-loaded chitosan nanoparticles that led to sustained release of 17beta-oestradiol (E2) to the brain.

"The targeted nano-formulation inhibited the mito-chondrial translocation of calpain, thereby protecting neurons from rotenone-induced mitochondrial damage," the researchers said.

The new nano-formulation helps in the sustained release of a hormone called 17beta-oestradiol which is crucial for managing Parkinson's. Many neurodegenerative and psychiatric malignancies like Parkinson's disease originate from an imbalance of 17 betaoestradiol (E2) in the human brain

Furthermore,

in a rodent model, the targeted nano-delivery system alleviated behavioral impairments. In addition, the study reveals for the first time that BMI1, a member of the PRC1 complex that regulates mitochondrial homeostasis, is a substrate of calpain.

The targeted nano-formulation restored BMI1 expression by inhibiting its degradation through calpain. Calpain is a protein that breaks down proteins in cells in response to calcium.

The study "has helped in understanding the role of hormone (E2) in regulating oxidative stress in Parkinson's patients. With the continued exploration of long-term safety profiles and better-targeted delivery, this can establish itself as a safer drug to improve the lives of Parkinson's patients," the researchers said.

Earlier, INST researchers showed that nano-formulation of melatonin -- the hormone produced by the brain in response to darkness -- could provide a therapeutic solution for Parkinson's. *IANS*

- 1. Bring water to a boil in a small saucepan. Stir in quinoa. Reduce heat to low, cover, and simmer until all the liquid is absorbed, about 15 minutes. Use a fork to fluff and separate the grains; let it cool for 5 minutes.
- 2. Meanwhile, sprinkle salt over garlic on a cutting board. Mash the garlic with the side of a spoon until a paste forms. Scrape and add it into a medium bowl. Whisk in lemon juice, oil, and pepper. Transfer 3

Tbsp. of the dressing to a small bowl and set aside.

- **3.** Add chickpeas, carrot, and avocado to the bowl with the remaining dressing; gently toss to combine. Allow 5 minutes for flavors to blend. Add the quinoa and gently toss to coat.
- **4.** Place greens in a large bowl and toss with the reserved 3 Tbsp. dressing. Divide the greens between 2 plates and top with the quinoa mixture.

## Could rebuilding LA upend plans to deport millions of Immigrants?

mmigrants are the backbone of the American economy and are key to many sectors, including construction and other services relevant to the reconstruction after a disaster. Experts and advocates discussed on Jan 24 whether this effort will go anywhere and what steps are being taken to confront the issue and ensure workers' rights.

In post-apocalyptic fires in LA, as has happened in every disaster in the United States, immigrants are already hard at work doing the cleanup as the area emerges from its worst disaster ever. Many of these workers are undocumented. An effective recovery will be key not just for the people who lost their homes but also for the insurance indus-

try and the economy at large.

Pablo Alvarado, Co-Executive Director of NDLON, the National Day Laborers Organizing Network explained the contribution of immigrant gig workers in this wildfire. There is a community work center in Pasadena near the wildfire. There are many immigrant workers here to help clean up debris. The working environment of these odd jobs is

harsh and they lack effective protective tools. Pablo Alvarado said, "Los Angeles cannot be rebuilt without these immigrant workers." Now that Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) is arresting undocumented immigrants in large numbers, many parents in Southern California are afraid to send their children to school.

sor, Department of Urban Planning and Policy University of Illinois Chicago said reconstruction requires a lot of manpower and often has to hire third-party contractors. These workers generally face a harsh situation of low wages and insufficient protective tools. The government's deportation order for undocumented tourists will make the manpower shortage even more severe.

Jennie Murray, President and Chief Executive Officer at National Immigration introduced a poll of Democrats and Republicans conducted in December last year. The results showed that 76% supported deportation of criminals rather than immigrant labor. Jennie Murray said that even among Republicans, many people support that it should be criminals who are deported.





#### **Union Budget:** PMAY holds key to affordable housing for millions

NEW DELHI: The Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY-Urban) has made steady progress since it was announced in mid-2015 in providing affordable housing and going forward, adaptable, sustainable and lowcost construction technologies can be used to rapidly develop large mass housing projects, according to a recent report.

Data by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs indicates 118.64 lakh homes have been sanctioned as of January 20, 2025.

Nearly 90.22 lakh units have been completed, and nearly 112.50 lakh have been 'grounded'. In terms of the financials, nearly Rs 200,000 crore of central assistance has already been committed.

"PMAY must be made accessible to more people, and awareness about it also needs a big shot in the arm," said Anuj Puri, Chairman, Anarock Group.

An important aspect of PMAY is interest subsidy on home loans, and direct subsidy for individual house construction or enhancement.

"Any announcements that Union Budget 2025-26 will make in context with affordable housing will doubtlessly involve PMAY. Creative solutions and strong political will can bring this vitally important program back to center stage, which is where it belongs," Puri added.

Nationally, rising prices have led to a gradual tapering down of luxury housing, and this may trigger an inflection point where the cycle can once again turn positive for the affordable segment (units priced under Rs 40 lakh).

Any substantial announcement for the affordable housing segment in the upcoming Union Budget can strengthen the trend and give affordable housing a seriously needed leg-up, according to the report.

"Even if such measures don't initiate a full-blown revival, they can at least improve this segment's overall prospects. Finally, a healthy housing market caters to a broad range of buyers and doesn't favor just one segment," said Puri. IANS

## Mumbai, Delhi among top cities in Asia Pacific for FDI in real estate: CBRE report





NEW DELHI: Mumbai and New Delhi rank among the top 10 most preferred markets for cross-border real estate investment in the Asia Pacific region, as per recent report.

While Mumbai ranked fifth after Tokyo, Sydney, Singapore and Ho Chi Minh City, New Delhi was tied for the eighth spot along with Seoul, Osaka and Hanoi, according to the report by property consulting firm CBRE.

In India, the total net buying intentions reached 3 percent, with developer, owner, operator, real estate fund, and institutional investors displaying the strongest buying intentions.

The report further pointed out, investor sentiment in India is driven by asset classes, including office, residential, industrial and data centers, the report states.

India recorded robust foreign equity investment inflows in 2024 calendar year, with countries like Singapore, the United States, and Canada dominating the foreign equity investments. These three countries cumulatively contrib-

#### 62 pc HNIs and UHNIs plan to buy luxury properties in India in next 12-24 months

NEW DELHI: Confidence in India's economic growth remains strong and 62 percent of high-net-worth individuals (HNIs) and ultra high-net-worth individuals (UHNIs) have expressed desire to buy luxury properties in the country in the next 12-24 months, according to recent report.

Affluent buyers believe that India will continue to be the fastest-growing major economy, with GDP growth projected to hover between 6 percent and 6.5 percent, said the annual 'Luxury Residential Outlook Survey 2025' conducted by India Sotheby's International Realty (ISIR).

The steady confidence underscores real estate's enduring appeal as a wealth-building asset. The number of ultra high-net-worth individuals in India has reached 13,600 in 2024, with projections of a 50 percent increase by 2028.

HNIs and UHNIs remain primarily motivated by capital appreciation, with 55 percent citing it as their main reason for investing in luxury residential real estate in 2025, up from 44 percent in 2024.

Nearly half of respondents expect real estate investments to deliver returns between 12 percent and 18 percent, while 38 percent anticipate returns below 12 percent. *IANS*  uted more than 25 percent of the total equity investments in the country's real estate in 2024, the report said.

Singapore accounted for nearly 36 percent share of the total foreign equity investments, followed by the United States (29 percent) and Canada (22 percent).

Investments from the UAE also witnessed a significant uptick throughout 2024 compared to 2023. Total equity investment in Indian real estate recorded an all-time high of \$11.4 billion in 2024, increasing by 54 percent year-on-year, according to the report.

Anshuman Magazine, Chairman & CEO - India, South-East Asia, Middle East and Africa, CBRE, said, "Investment in India's real estate market reached a record high in CY2024. While the landscape was primarily dominated by domestic investors, foreign equity investments and a significant resurgence of capital deployment across asset classes

by overseas investors stand as a testament to India's growing prominence as a global real estate destination.

"This trend is anticipated to continue with consistent capital flowing into both established and new sectors of the real estate market," he added.

Investors who are investing in Delhi and Mumbai are more inclined to look at value-added and opportunistic strategies which involve a higher risk/return profile than core and core-plus strategies.

Those chasing value-add strategies in India will potentially explore core office products in tier-1 cities such as Mumbai and Delhi, while those looking at more development plays across these markets, with some examples including the acquisition of land sites for either residential (build-to-sell) development or data center development, the report added. *IANS*



## Hidden hand behind opposition to Adani wind power project in Sri Lanka?

mid the much-hyped joint state ment 'Fostering Partnership for a Shared Future' of Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Sri Lankan President Anura Kumara Disanayaka, the JVP-led National People's Power government has decided to appoint a committee to review the Adani Group's energy projects in Sri Lanka which was approved by the previous Ranil Wicramesinge-led government. The joint statement also underscored the importance of timely implementation of ongoing energy cooperation projects between India and Sri Lanka.

Adani's investment in Sri Lanka is the first major foreign investment since the country declared bankruptcy following the historic economic crisis. India was playing a pivotal role in rescuing the nation during the crisis. Under the ambitious goal of generating 70 percent of Sri Lanka's total energy from renewable sources and a vision for a

project in northern Sri Lanka cannot be avoided, as a similar Indian project in the strategically important Trincomalee faced the same interference.

#### Opposition to Indian projects

Indian projects facing setbacks are nothing new in Sri Lanka-in fact, one could even refer to this as the country's model of blocking Indian investments. It is common for the government to grant approval and then withdraw it citing local opposition. The Gotabaya Rajapaksa government, which signed a tripartite agreement with India to jointly develop the strategic Colombo Port's Eastern Container Terminal, arbitrarily cancelled the agreement citing opposition from labor unions.

In retrospect, India's coal-fired power project also faced the same obstacle under the name of environmental concern. Amid the war-torn situation in Sri Lanka, in 2006, the Sri Lankan government and India's National Thermal Power Corporation

(NTPC), signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to build a 500-megawatt (MW) coal power plant at Trincomalee, Eastern Province. However, 10 years later,

low-carbon future, the Board of Investment approved a \$422 million project in Mannar and Pooneryn in Sri Lanka's Northern Province in January 2023. The proposed project is one of the largest green energy projects in Sri Lanka; it is expected to generate a total of 484 megawatts of electricity.

However, as the 250 MW Mannar project was planned to be implemented, the Bishop of the Diocese of Mannar, Rev. Emmanuel Fernando, and three environmentalists filed a fundamental rights petition in the Supreme Court of Sri Lanka. The petitioners have questioned the credibility of the environmental assessment report and have stated that the project will cause financial losses to the country.

But according to the Colombo-based Sunday Times, Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA), including Birds and Bat Studies, it was carried out by the Sri Lanka Sustainable Energy Authority (SLSEA), led by Devak Weerakoon, a senior professor at the Department of Zoology and Environment Sciences, University of Colombo. Based on this, doubts about environmental interference in Adani's major investment

with all the initial arrangements completed, the project was cancelled.

A similar intervention is happening now with Adani's project in northern Sri Lanka. The Environmental Foundation Limited (EFL) filed a fundamental rights case against the Sampur project. Just as the Bishop of the Diocese of Mannar and some other locals in Mannar opposed Adani's project, the people living in villages near the area chosen for the coal power station in Sampur were also encouraged to oppose it. However, China successfully implemented the 900 MW coal power project in Norochcholai. No environmental organization in Sri Lanka has tried to sue it. Based on this, doubts about environmental interference in Adani's major investment project in northern Sri Lanka cannot be avoided, as a similar Indian project in the strategically important Trincomalee faced the same interference.



## India in a challenging neighborhood: Need to reach non-confrontational equilibrium with China

ew US President Trump took office on 20 January 2025 and immediately issued executive orders, in pursuance of his central policy to "Make America Great Again". These orders - with more to follow - are widely viewed as "disruptive". Their implementation will have immediate and long-term effects within and between nations, affecting economic and political (including military) processes and events, worldwide.

India is currently the world's fifth largest economy. India needs to do much, both domestically and with other nations, near and distant, to rise to number three by 2030 as envisaged. The policies and executive actions of the U.S administration.

Coco Islands); in the north Indian Ocean (Sri Lanka's Hambantota) and Maldives; and Pakistan's Gwadar in the north Arabian Sea, also makes China our most powerful ocean neighbor. This has been dubbed as China's "string of pearls". This is without mentioning China's economic influence in these countries, and in other Indian Ocean littoral states.

What India does militarily, diplomatically, economically and politically affects China and vice versa. This could be in terms of policy, diplomacy, trade-business-commerce, military deployment and capability, status and operation of the domestic economy, social integrity, etc., both in India and in China.

What affects India's other less powerful neighbors due to their

will impact India's challenging South Asia neighborhood, including the spectrum of India-China relations. [Ref.1]

This article attempts to appraise the situation in South Asia, as India and its neighbors increasingly engage in military diplomacy and military engagement in furtherance of their respective strategic interests.

#### India and its neighbors

India has several immediate neighbors. We have land borders with Pakistan and, going clockwise, China, Nepal, Bhutan, Myanmar, and Bangladesh. Separated by varying distances of ocean, we have Bangladesh, Myanmar, Sri Lanka, Maldives, and Pakistan.

China's naval, economic and commercial power projected into the Bay of Bengal (Myanmar's own internal or external events also affects both India and China, although perhaps less directly. The effects of China's interactions with its land and ocean neighbors apart from India, also reflects on India's actions, reactions and expectations and diplomacy, on the world stage.

Thus, it behooves us to place China at the center of the "picture", certainly inasmuch as territorial-economic-political sovereignty and security, are concerned. But first, it is best to take a look at India as an emerging political-diplomatic-military-economic power in South Asia and in the international community.

### India - an emerging global power

India has made tremendous technological strides across diverse fields, by building on the sound scientific-technological infrastructure of yesteryears, and the availability of hardware and software in the recent past. We have especially excelled in the aerospace industry, launching successful missions to Moon, Mars, and Sun, with more under planning, and becoming the fourth nation to achieve unmanned docking of spacecraft. Apart from an assured share in the \$400-billion global space market, this capability leverages India's military capability and political heft.

Even with comparative shortfall in defensive and offensive cyber capability, India's military has become more technologically advanced, although with dependence for semiconductor chips and processors, and for cyber security software on international vendors. Very recently, the government announced the starting of India's first commercial semiconductor fab unit as a joint venture between Tata Electronics and Taiwan's Powerchip Semiconductor Manufacturing Corp, to produce 50,000 wafers/ month using (albeit not indigenous) 65, 40 and 28-nanometer technology, in 3-4 years. It is not yet clear in what manner and to what extent, this capability may enhance India's cybermilitary capability.

Building upon the legacy policy of indigenization, Indian Navy has advanced in increasing its blue-water capability. Indian Air Force remains dogged by depletion of its fighter aircraft with inadequate fresh inductions. How India's drone capability may compensate for this remains to be seen.

## 75 YEARS OF BEING REPUBLIC

As India celebrates its 75 years of being a republic and the world largest democracy, it is now ready to take on the challenges no other country can comprehend. However, India has to steer very carefully with the changing world scenario, especially after the new US administration headed by President Donald Trump. India has continually supported legal immigration to US and to other nations across the world. Regardless of change to US administration, India has collaborated with all administrations. The current problem is not the illegal Indians who may be deported but skilled professionals who came to US legally, sacrificing well paying jobs in India to immigrate to US for better and more challenging opportunities.

Trump's return to the White House after a four-year gap threatens to upend international political, economic and strategic landscape, to a much larger degree than what happened during the first term of Donald Trump as President. In an interdependent world, what the sole superpower does, affects all regions of the world in varying degrees. Seen in a broader geopolitical perspective, Trump1.0 administration's policies towards South Asia and the Indo-Pacific region were, by and large in keeping with the national interests of India. Can India expect the same scenario during Trump2.0 administration?

Soon after the Presidential Inauguration signaled that President Trump will continue to give priority to developments in the Indo-Pacific region to ensure no single country takes unilateral measures, to alter the geopolitical status quo in the region, to the detriment of the interests of other countries and, play a proactive role in ensuring freedom of navigation and uninterrupted trade and commerce in the region. The joint statement reiterated the shared commitments of the Quad member countries to uphold the "rule of law, democratic values, sovereignty and territorial integrity" in the Indo-Pacific and cautioned against changing the status quo by coercive means.

Seeing the large contingent of Indian business tycoons attending the inauguration ceremony surely reflects good and harmonious relations may be on cards with the new administration. Companies of corruption announced their shutdown days before Trump's inauguration. Around the same time, Breon Peace, the US Attorney for the Eastern District of New York, who had led the indictment against Gautam Adani, also announced his resignation. These events indicate that industrial cooperation between India and the US may witness better days ahead.

However, no one should take Trump for granted, as he may change his stand anytime, and surprise everybody. India on the other hand should be ready to deal with patience and tread carefully, without making harsh comments or take negative steps that may jeopardize our good relations built over the past two decades.
