China extends 'warm welcome' as direct flight from Kolkata lands in Guangzhou

BEIJING/NEW DELHI: China extended a warm welcome to the passengers of an IndiGo Airlines flight that landed in Guangzhou on Monday (27 Oct), making it the first direct flight between both countries after a gap of over five years.

"On the morning of October 27, IndiGo Airlines flight 6E1703 arrived at

Guangzhou, China safe and sound. Warm welcome to China," Yu Jing, spokesperson for the Chinese Embassy in India, wrote on X.

Direct flights between Kolkata and China's Guangzhou city resumed as the first flight took off from Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose International (NSCBI) Airport late on 26 October.

"Direct flights between China and India are now a reality. Kolkata-Guangzhou launches today. Shanghai-New Delhi starts Nov 9, flying three times a week," the spokesperson posted on X.

The decision to resume direct flights

between the two countries was made earlier this year when Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping met on the sidelines of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) summit, paving the way for a broader reset in flight operations.

Following the recent diplomatic initia-



tives, private carrier IndiGo announced that it will resume daily, non-stop flights connecting Kolkata to Guangzhou starting October 26. The low-cost airline had also announced new daily direct flights

between New Delhi and China's Guangzhou from November 10. The airline said that the route will be operated using Airbus A320 aircraft.

Meanwhile, China Eastern Airlines has announced the resumption of flights on its India route with direct flights between Shanghai and Delhi starting from

November 9, giving a fresh momentum for people-to-people exchanges and economic and trade collaboration between New Delhi and Beijing. The service will operate three times weekly - on Wednesdays, Saturdays, and Sundays.

Earlier on October 24, Chinese Foreign Ministry Spokesperson Guo Jiakun said that the

resumption of direct flights between India and China is the latest progress in implementing the consensus reached between PM Modi and Xi Jinping during their meeting in Tianjin. *IANS*

Pak Defense Minister dares Taliban to test Islamabad's resolve at 'own peril and doom'

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's Defense Minister Khawaja Asif recently issued a stern warning to Afghan Taliban, stating that they can test the resolve of Islamabad at their "own peril and doom", local media reported.

He added that Pakistan does not even need to use "a fraction" of its full arsenal to "completely obliterate" the Taliban and push them back to the caves for hiding, Pakistan-based Geo News reported.

In a statement shared on X, Pakistan's Defense Minister stated, "We have borne your treachery and mockery for too long, but no more. Any terrorist attack or any suicide bombing inside Pakistan shall give you the bitter taste of such misadventures. Be assured and test our resolve and capabilities, if you wish so, at your own peril and doom." *IANS*

'Father, killer, tough as hell': Trump calls PM Modi "nicest-looking guy", hints at early trade deal

GYEONGJU: US President Donald Trump lavished praise on Prime Minister Narendra Modi as the "nicest-looking guy" while describing him as a "father" but also calling him "a killer" and "tough as hell", while hinting at an imminent trade deal between the two countries.

While delivering his keynote remarks at the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) CEOs Luncheon in Gyeongju, South Korea, the US President also reiterated his disputed claim of personally avert-



ing a nuclear war between India and Pakistan in May.

Trump asserted that his intervention helped de-escalate tensions between the two nuclear-armed nations, claiming that seven planes were shot down during the conflict.

He said he personally contacted both PM Modi and Pakistan's leadership to halt the hostilities, linking the resolution to trade negotiations.

"I'm doing a trade deal with India, and I have great respect and love for Prime Minister Modi. We have a great relationship. Likewise, the Prime Minister of Pakistan is a great guy. They have a Field Marshal. You know why he's a Field Marshal? He's a great fighter. And I know them all. I'm reading that seven planes were shot down. These are two nuclear nations. And they're really going at it," Trump said.

"And I called Prime Minister Modi and said, 'We can't make a trade deal with killer. He's tough as hell. 'No, we will fight,' [PM Modi said]. I said, 'Whoa, this is the same man that I know," he added.

The US President also compared his own handling of the situation to that of former US President Joe Biden, questioning if Biden could have achieved similar

KUALA LUMPUR: India's External Affairs Minister (EAM) S. Jaishankar, recently, met the US Secretary of State Marco Rubio in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, and appreciated the discussion on bilateral ties as well as regional and global issues.

The meeting comes amid the ongoing trade talks between the two countries.

In a post on his official X account, EAM Jaishankar wrote: "Glad to meet @SecRubio this morning in Kuala Lumpur. Appreciated the discussion on our bilateral ties as well as regional and global issues."

"We are in dialogue with the United States of America. Our teams are engaged. We recently had the commerce secretary visit the US, and he met with his counterparts. We continue to engage with them, and talks are progressing. We hope to work towards a fair and equitable agreement in the near future," Union Minister Piyush Goyal said last week.

Earlier, Rubio dismissed growing concerns that Washington's growing strategic ties with Pakistan are meant to sideline India. He noted that the relationship with Islamabad would not undermine the US' "deep, historic, and important" partnership with New Delhi.

"Our commitment to furthering maritime cooperation remains strong, in line with the ASEAN Outlook on the Indo-Pacific and our shared commitment to the 1982 UNCLOS. 2026 will be observed as the ASEAN-India year of maritime cooperation. Notably, more nations have joined the Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative," he added. IANS

India, China stress "peace and tranquility" in border areas during 23rd Corps Commander-level meeting

NEW DELHI: India and China reaffirmed their commitment to maintaining peace and tranquility along the border, noting significant progress since last year's disengagement agreements, during the 23rd round of the Corps Commander Level Meeting held at the Chushul-Moldo border point, the Ministry of External Affairs said in a statement.

The talks, which took place last week, marked the first meeting of the General Level Mechanism in the Western Sector since the 24th round of Special Representatives Talks held in August this year.

According to the MEA, the discussions were conducted in a "friendly and cordial atmosphere".

"The 23rd round of India-China Corps Commander Level Meeting was held at Chushul-Moldo border meeting point on 25th October 2025. This was the first meeting of the General Level Mechanism in the Western Sector since

the 24th round of Special Representatives Talks held on 19 August 2025. The talks were held in a friendly and cordial atmosphere," the statement read.

Both sides also reviewed progress since the 22nd round of Corps Commander-level talks in October 2024.

Indian-origin businessman killed in Canada's Abbotsford, Lawrence Bishnoi Gang claims responsibility

ABBOTSFORD: A, 68-year-old Indian-origin businessman named Darshan Singh Sahsi was killed in Canada's Abbotsford on Monday (27 October), reported the Vancouver Sun.

In a news release by the Abbotsford Police, the patrol officers discovered the victim's body while he was suffering from life-threatening injuries. The victim was taken to the hospital, where he succumbed to death due to his wounds. The investigation into the matter is in the early stages, reported the Vancouver Sun.

"Despite life-saving medical efforts of first responders, the man succumbed to his injuries. No arrests have been made at this time. The investigation is still in its early stages, and additional resources have been deployed to support efforts in uncovering the full circumstances surrounding this incident," Sergeant Paul Walker said as per the Vancouver Sun.

The Police further said that the shooting of Sahsi doesn't appear to be linked to the continuing incidents of extortion-related violence targeting members of the South Asian business community. Nepali security forces rescue over 1,500 tourists from Himalayas post heavy snowfall

KATHMANDU: Nepali security forces have rescued over 1,500 stranded tourists from the high-altitude areas of Manang following heavy snowfall and adverse weather.

As per the Nepal Army's announcement, hundreds of tourists trekking towards Tilicho Lake (4,919 meters) have turned back from the base camp after heavy snowfall blocked trails and made conditions unsafe.



"Due to heavy snowfall in various areas of Manang district, a rescue team deployed from the New Bhairavidal Gulm has assisted approximately 1500 people, including more than 200 foreign tourists who were stranded, in reaching a safe place with the cooperation of the local administration, elected representatives, Armed Police

Force, Nepal, Nepal Police, and locals," the Nepal Army stated in a post on X.

According to local officials, approximately 800 to 900 tourists have returned from Tilicho Base Camp in the past two days.

"After the heavy snowfall in the high areas, nearly one thousand tourists have descended to the Khangsar- the

last settlement before the Tilicho lake. Many others are descending following the heavy snowfall and adverse weather," Chyolpa Gurung, ward chair of Ngisyang Rural Municipality-9," told ANI over the phone.

The District Administration Office of Manang has also stated that attempts are being made to clear the snow along the trails, while an announcement has been made to trekkers to cancel their visit.

"Attempts are being made to clear the ways, but the snowfall is intense. We have requested trekkers and tourists who are still in low-lying areas to cancel their plans to visit until the end of this week," Naba Raj Poudyal, chief district officer

(CDO) of Manang, confirmed ANI.

A district-level security task force has been deployed for road clearance and rescue operations.

Security personnel equipped with shovels and excavators are working to clear the blocked sections of the road, and motorcycles have begun moving in some areas. *ANI*

"Nothing is going to jeopardize" Gaza ceasefire deal: Trump after Israel's "powerful" strikes

TOKYO: US President Donald Trump has asserted that nothing would undermine the fragile Gaza ceasefire he brokered a few weeks ago, even after Israel launched deadly airstrikes in the enclave on 28 October, killing over 30 in response to the alleged killing of an Israeli soldier.

Speaking to reporters during a gaggle aboard Air Force One, Trump justified Israel's retaliation, stating that Israel should "hit back".

"They killed an Israeli soldier. So, the Israelis hit back, and they should hit back. When that happens they should hit," the US President said during the gaggle en route to South Korea.

Pressed on whether the Israeli action risked undermining the ceasefire, Trump replied flatly, noting that "Nothing is going to jeopardize that."

He sought to minimize Hamas's role in any broader peace process, calling the group "a very small part of peace in the Middle East" and warning that its members would face severe consequences if they failed to comply with ceasefire terms.

"You have to understand, Hamas is a very small part of peace in the Middle East and they have to behave. They're on the rough side, but they said they would be good, and if they're good, they're going to be happy. And if they're not good, they're going to be terminated. Their lives will be terminated. And they understand that. And we have many countries that are willing to do that," he stated. *ANI*

Why do families migrate? Children's education is the "Currency of Love"

merican Community Media (ACoM) held an online briefing on Oct 24th with Harvard School of Education professor Gabrielle Oliveira. She discussed the emotional and moral aspects behind immigrant families, pointing out that for most immigrants, education is not only a way out of poverty, but also a concrete manifestation of parental love and sacrifice.

In her new book "Now We Are Here", Oliveira uses a large number of interviews and surveys to reveal how parents regard their children's education as an investment of love. She said that traditional immigration narratives often focus on economic motivations, but in fact, "education becomes a stabilizing force and spiritual sustenance, making parents feel that all separation and sacrifices have meaning."

Oliveira pointed out that the current anti-immigration climate has left many families in fear. "Parents are worried

that their identities will be checked when driving their children to school. As a result, many students miss school and have to take the bus or take time off at home." She described that this era of high surveillance not only weakens the learning effect, but also puts children under great psychological pressure.

In response to the recent case of a

If teachers can understand students' cultural background and family stories and build trusting relationships, they can open the door to learning. She

Ignoring the education of immigrants' children will not only harm humanity, but will also weaken the country's economic future. She called on policymakers to stop viewing immigrants as a cost and see them as contributors and givers to society.

Indian student who lost US visa status charged with stabbing 2 teens

NEW YORK: An Indian student who lost his visa status allegedly went berserk on a flight to Germany and has been charged with stabbing two teenagers and slapping a woman, according to federal prosecutor Leah Foley in Boston.

After meal service on the Chicago-Frankfurt flight, Praneeth Kumar Usiripalli (28) stabbed a 17-year-old boy on the shoulder and another 17-year-old in the back of the head with a metal fork, her office said on Monday. He also slapped a woman and tried to slap a flight crew, it

The flight was diverted to Boston, where Usiripalli was arrested.

"When flight crew members attempted to subdue Usiripalli, he allegedly raised his hand, formed a gun with his fingers, put it in his mouth and pulled an imaginary trigger," according to the prosecutor's office.

It did not give a motive for the attack, but said that Usiripalli, who came to the US on a student visa, "presently does not have lawful status."

Without identifying the institution, it said he was enrolled in a master's program in biblical studies

A person with the same name has a LinkedIn profile where he says he is a student at Moody Bible Institute in Chicago.

On LinkedIn, the institute says it "exists to proclaim the gospel through equipping people to be biblically grounded. practically trained, and to engage the world through gospel-centered living."

On its website, it said that it "reflects our belief that the Bible is the inspired, inerrant, infallible Word of God essential to every area of life."

The prosecutor's office said that if Usiripalli is convicted on the charge of assault on an aircraft with a dangerous weapon with intent to do bodily harm, he could face a maximum sentence of ten years in prison and a fine of up to \$250,000. IANS

Kashmiris have called their ties with Pakistan strained and mentioned that their cultural and ethnic identity do not align with Islamic ideology of Islamabad, which has resulted in some of them thinking to form a government-in-exile that represents Kashmiris from PoK, a report has stated.

Recently, British Kashmiris held a hunger strike outside the Pakistan High Commission in London to highlight the sufferings of Kashmiris, after their protests for basic rights were violently suppressed by Pakistani security forces in PoK, Sakariya Kareem wrote in a report in UK-based newspaper for British Asians, Asian Lite.

London-based journalist Abdul Rehman Khan revealed how Pakistani diaspora from PoK held protests, stopped the car of Pakistani diplomats, and shouted slogans in the UK, as they were frustrated over internet censorship and brutal crackdown. As per the report, Khan in a Facebook post wrote, "Kashmiris! You are not alone; this atrocity must be taken into account. A large number of Kashmiris participated in Sheffield, UK, in favor of the Public Action Committee. The hall became crowded, and there was a large number outside too."

Jamil Maqsood, President of the Foreign Affairs Committee of the United Kashmir People's National Party (UKPNP), said that Kashmiris living in PoK hate living there as they are deprived of health, education, development, and job opportunities. *IANS*

'Chhath Puja festival witnesses trade worth over Rs 50,000 crore'

NEW DELHI: The grand festival of Chhath Puja generated trade worth more than Rs 50,000 crore nationwide, according to the Confederation of All India Traders (CAIT).

CAIT's assessment, conducted after the festival, revealed that over 10 crore people across India participated in Chhath celebrations.

Bihar alone witnessed business activity worth about Rs 15,000 crore, followed by Delhi with Rs 8,000 crore and Jharkhand with Rs 5,000 crore.

The findings are part of CAIT's ongoing research on India's "Sanatan Economy," which studies the spending patterns during major festivals and wedding seasons.



CAIT Secretary General and Member of Parliament Praveen Khandelwal said that Bihar, Jharkhand, and eastern Uttar Pradesh, particularly the Purvanchal region, remained the main canters of Chhath celebrations, where large congregations gathered along rivers and ponds.

However, Delhi and the NCR region also saw a major business boom due to the large Purvanchali population.

The Delhi government constructed around 1,500 ghats and spent significantly on infrastructure, sanitation, and security arrangements.

Khandelwal said that other states, including West Bengal, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, and Rajasthan, also reported strong economic activity.

In metros and non-traditional states like Odisha, Karnataka, and Telangana, local markets saw brisk sales due to the presence of migrant communities who celebrated Chhath with great enthusiasm. *IANS*

Elon Musk's Starlink to run technical, security demos in Mumbai from Oct 30

NEW DELHI: Tesla CEO Elon Musk-led Starlink is scheduled to conduct demonstration runs in Mumbai on October 30 and 31 to demonstrate compliance with India's security and technical requirements for satellite broadband services, according to people familiar with the developments.

The demos to be done before law enforcement agencies will be based on the provisional spectrum assigned to Starlink, which would mark a significant step ahead of its planned entry into the Indian satellite broadband market, they said.

This step is necessary for the company to obtain clearances to commence commercial operations in the country.

The government had informed in August that the data, traffic and other details accumulated by Elon Musk's Starlink will be stored in India, and the domestic user traffic is not to be mirrored to any system/server located abroad. *IANS*

India's industrial production clocks 4 percent growth in September

NEW DELHI: India's industrial production recorded a 4 percent growth in September this year compared to the same month last year, driven by a strong performance in the manufacturing sector, according to data released by the Ministry of Statistics recently.

The industrial growth rate, based on the Index of Industrial Production (IIP), had accelerated to 4 percent in August from a four-month high of 3.5 percent in July, which, in turn, had surged from 1.5 percent in June. The 4 percent growth rate has been maintained in Sep-

tember as well.

The data showed that the manufacturing sector, which provides quality jobs for the young graduates passing out of the country's universities and engineering institutes, registered a

sponding figure of 3.8 percent registered in August.

UPI transactions in India jump 35 pc in H1 2025, touch Rs 143 lakh crore: Report

NEW DELHI: India's Unified Payments Interface (UPI) continues to dominate the country's digital payments landscape, with transactions surging 35 percent year-on-year (YoY) to reach 106.36 billion in the first half of 2025, data of 29 October showed.

The total value of these transactions stood at a massive Rs 143.34 lakh crore -- highlighting how deeply digi-

tal payments have become a part of everyday life in India, according to Worldline's India Digital Payments Report (1H 2025).

According to the report, the average UPI transaction size fell from Rs 1,478 in the first half of 2024 to Rs 1,348 in the same period of 2025.

This decline indicates that people are using UPI more frequently for small, daily purchases -- from tea stalls and grocery stores to online shopping.

Notably, person-to-merchant (P2M) transactions grew 37 percent to 67.01 billion, driven by what Worldline calls the "Kirana Effect." where small and micro businesses

have become the backbone of India's digital economy.

India's QR-based payment network also saw tremendous growth, more than doubling to 678 million by June 2025 -- a 111 percent rise from January 2024.

The number of Point-of-Sale (PoS) terminals grew 29 percent to 11.2 million, while Bharat QR touched 6.72 million.

With this, India now operates the world's largest mer-

chant network, powered by small-business adoption and government-led inclusion programs.

Meanwhile, the report shows that credit cards are evolving into premium spending tools.

The number of active credit cards grew 23 percent between January 2024 and June 2025, while monthly spending crossed Rs 2.2 trillion.

Although the average transaction size fell by 6 percent, it shows that credit cards are increasingly being used for everyday purchases. In contrast, debit card usage at PoS fell nearly 8 percent as smaller payments shifted to UPI. *IANS*

The launch comes at a time when Tata Motors is undergoing a corporate restructuring. Its commercial vehicle arm, TML Commercial Vehicles Limited, will soon be renamed Tata Motors Limited after receiving regulatory approvals. *IANS*

India's IT sector expected to reach \$400 billion by 2030 amidst AI-related disruptions

NEW DELHI: India's information technology (IT) sector is projected to reach \$400 billion by 2030, led by firms delivering domain-specific automation that outperforms traditional service models on speed, quality, and cost, a recent report said.

The country's strong talent pool, global client trust, and cost efficiency will enable it to leverage the increased global demand for Al-driven solutions, a report by venture firm Bessemer Venture Partners indicated.

Al is automating tasks previously performed by humans and disrupting the billable-hour model that supports traditional Indian IT services, which makes deep strategic pivots crucial to stay competitive, the report noted.

The venture firm mentioned that agile, Al-native challengers are adapting more quickly to such changes than incumbent companies.

Three types of fast-moving AI-first challengers that will disrupt existing models are AI-enabled services, services built for AI, and pure software-led platforms, the report said.

The venture firm forecast that India's IT services industry will grow with margins intact despite challenges from Al-related disruptions.

It noted that three years after the launch of ChatGPT, India's IT revenues continue to climb, and margins remain surprisingly resilient because uptake of general-purpose large language models is concentrated in only two sectors- technology and media or advertising.

Incumbent IT firms continue to play a crucial role in solving complex business problems that are nuanced rather than providing one-size-fits-all SaaS deployments.

The strong balance sheets of these companies further strengthen client confidence, Bessemer Venture Partners said.

Fortune 500 companies still trust that IT services vendors can manage multi-year projects, absorb macro shocks, and deliver consistent execution, the report said.

The market capitalization of India's top ten IT firms has more than doubled from \$166 billion to \$354 billion in the past decade, driven by annual revenue growth exceeding 7 percent. *IANS*

ICE raids arrest 9 illegal immigrants in New York

NEW YORK: The US Department of Homeland Security said its agents arrested nine men accused of living in the United States illegally, The New York Times reported.

The men, mostly from West Africa and some with prior arrests, were targeted in an operation "focused on criminal activity relating to selling counterfeit goods," the department said. The agents also arrested four protesters.

People across New York City appeared on edge after the raid, seemingly bracing for the activation of US President Donald Trump's threat to deploy military personnel and Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents to New York City, which he often casts as lawless and dangerous. Trump has already moved to send troops to other Democraticled cities -- Chicago, Washington, Memphis, Los Angeles and Portland, Ore.

Last week Wednesday evening, the depth of the anger over the raid was evident as several hundred demonstrators rallied at 26 Federal Plaza, the New York City headquarters of ICE. Lifting placards and their voices, the demonstrators chanted, "Vendor power!"

The demonstrators marched north from Foley Square to Canal Street, filling about five blocks as they walked, before turning onto Broadway. One woman climbed on a police car in front of the Manhattan Criminal Courthouse. *ANI*

US deports 54 Haryana men, police probe 'Donkey Route' trail

NEW DELHI: The US has deported 54 youths from Haryana, India, for allegedly entering the country via the Donkey Route, an illegal pathway. They arrived 26 October at Delhi's Indira Gandhi International Airport, Terminal-3, on Flight OAE-4767, police said.

According to information received so far, 16 of these young people are from Karnal, 15 from Kaithal, 5 from Ambala, 4 from Yamuna Nagar, 4 from Kurukshetra, 3 from Jind, 2 from Sonipat and 1 each from Panchkula, Panipat, Rohtak and Fatehabad.

As per the data available, most of the deported youths are between 25 and 40 years of age. Karnal police handed them over to families; no agent complaints were received. The individuals were brought back to Delhi's IGI Airport and handed over to their families. The Trump administration's strict stance on illegal immigration has led to increased deportations.

Karnal DSP Sandeep Kumar said that these deported individuals entered the US via the illegal donkey route.



"Today, more Indians were deported from the United States, including 50 from Haryana, with approximately 16 from Karnal district. These individuals, from various villages and towns, had entered the US illegally via the 'donkey route' but were deported

deported. Karnal police brought them back and handed them over to their families. They stated that no complaint has been received regarding any agent. They also advised against anyone attempting to go abroad illegally, emphasizing

today. Karnal police informed the media that about 16 people who had gone to America through the "donkey route" were that it is the wrong method that leads to significant problems later on. The police further stated that an investigation is underway, and if anyone has a criminal record, it will come to light during the investigation," he said.

Earlier this year, hundreds of people were deported to India by US authorities. The US government regularly deports individuals who violate immigration laws or have no valid basis to remain in the country. After Donald Trump assumed office as the US President in January this year, the country's law enforcement agencies have launched a crackdown against illegal immigrants.

Meanwhile, in a major breakthrough in its sustained campaign against organized crime, the Special Task Force (STF) of Haryana has arrested a close associate of gangster Lawrence Bishnoi.

The accused has been identified as Lakhwinder Singh, alias Lakha, a resident of Titram village in Kaithal district and a close aide of gangster Lawrence Bishnoi, who has been deported from the United States of America and arrested by the STF Ambala Unit after completion of all legal formalities. ANI

Illegal Indian immigrant truck driver slams into traffic in California, kills 3

CALIFORNIA: A 21-year-old Indian man, identified as Jashanpreet Singh, has been arrested in the United States for allegedly causing a fiery semitruck crash that killed three people in San Bernardino County, California, Fox News reported.

Police said Singh was driving a big rig on the I-10 Freeway when he rammed into slowmoving traffic without braking.

The impact caused a massive fire that left three people dead and several others injured, including Singh himself.

Investigators said toxicology tests confirmed that Singh was under the influence of drugs at the time of the crash. He has been charged with gross vehicular manslaughter while intoxicated.

Earlier, US Attorney for Central California Bill Essayli told Fox

News that Singh was under the influence of some kind of "stimu-

lant" and he did not apply his brakes at all, before crashing into the moving traffic.

"He was travelling at a fast rate of speed, and he did not apply his brakes at all. They do suspect he was under the influence of some type of stimulant. I do suspect he will be charged with vehicular homicide."

"We are also looking at charges. We are opening an investigation to understand how he

obtained a commercial driver's license from the state of California as an illegal immigrant. We want to understand if anyone in the DMV is complicit in issuing that driver's license to him."

According to US federal officials quoted by Fox News, Singh had crossed the southern US border illegally in 2022. He was first stopped by Border Patrol agents in California's El Centro Sector in March 2022. ANI

JAIPUR: In a major breakthrough against organized crime, the Rajasthan Police Anti-Gangster Task Force (ANTF) has traced and detained Jagdeep Singh a.k.a. Jagga, an active member of the Lawrence Bishnoi gang currently associated with the Rohit Godara gang, in the US, an official said.

Jagdeep Singh, a resident of Dhurkot village in Moga district of Punjab, had been running criminal activities in India while living abroad for several

years.
Under the direction of Additional Direc-

tor General of Police (Anti-Gangster Task Force/ATS/ANTF) Dinesh M.N., the ANTF had been closely monitoring the movements of the notorious gangster.

Jagga was actively involved in extortion and firing incidents for the Bishnoi gang in both Punjab and Rajasthan. Three years ago, he fled to Dubai on his passport and later illegally entered the US.

He had also jumped bail in multiple cases registered in Rajasthan, leading to the issuance of warrants against him. Jagdeep Singh has over a dozen criminal cases registered against him in Punjab and has been declared a proclaimed offender by the court. In Rajasthan, he faces cases in Pratap Nagar and Sardarpura police stations of Jodhpur.

He was accused in the March 2017 firing and death threat case against Dr. Sunil Chandak in Pratap Nagar.

Later, in September 2017, he was jailed along with Lawrence Bishnoi and Anmol Bishnoi in connection with the murder of Vasudev Israni in Sardarpura. The operation was executed under the supervision of former Deputy Inspector General of Police Yogesh Yadav and current DIG Deepak Bhargava.

The AGTF conducted multiple raids at Jagga's hideouts in India and gathered intelligence on his foreign net-

work. With the help of international law enforcement coordination, US Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) detained Jagga near the Canada-US border.

Jagdeep Singh is currently in the custody of US authorities.

An official said that legal proceedings for his extradition to India have begun. Once extradited, the AGTF expects to obtain crucial information regarding other members and financial operations of the Bishnoi-Godara network.

Additional cases will be filed under relevant provisions, including Section 111 of the Indian Penal Code, and strict action will be taken against those aiding organized crime.

The operation was carried out by Additional Superintendent of Police Siddhant Sharma, along with officers Narottam Verma, Ravindra Pratap, Sunil Jangid, Manish Sharma, Kamal Puri, Head Constable Ramesh Kumar, and Constables Subhash Chand and Surendra Kumar. *IANS*

"Criminal illegal aliens being issued commercial vehicle licenses": White House on California crash that killed 3

WASHINGTON, DC: White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt recently highlighted a disturbing pattern of criminal illegal aliens being issued commercial vehicle licenses.

She accused California of giving a Commercial Driver's License (CDL) to an illegal alien who killed three people in a major crash, while intoxicated and driving under the influence, prompting an investigation by the Department of Transportation.

"I can confirm that California gave this individual a license, and it is something that the Department of Transportation has already looked into. I know Secretary Duffy, who is doing a phenomenal job, has spoken on this many times in the crackdown that the Department of Transportation is taking on these licenses that are being wrongfully issued to people who clearly do not deserve to uphold these positions," Leavitt said during the White House Press briefing.

A devastating crash in California resulted in the loss of three lives, allegedly caused by an undocumented immigrant driving under the influence, identified by authorities as 21-year-old Jashanpreet Singh. The individual, who entered the US in 2022 through the southern border, was released into the country by the previous administration.

She, however, did not confirm whether the illegal immigrant was an Indian or not, as was reported by certain news outlets earlier.

Highlighting concerns over licenses issued to undocumented immigrants, Leavitt said that Jashanpreet Singh entered the country in 2022 through the southern border and was "released" by the previous Biden administration. Leavitt said that this incident shows a "disturbing pattern" of "criminal illegal aliens" being issued commercial licenses.

"As for this case in California, on October 22, ICE lodged an immigration detainer for this individual following his arrest by local authorities in California on charges of manslaughter while intoxicated and driving under the influence. He killed three people. And he first entered the United States in 2022 through the southern border. And he was released into our country by the previous administration. ICE has lodged a separate detainer for this individual. And these tragedies are following a disturbing pattern of these criminal illegal aliens being issued commercial vehicle licenses. The Department of Transportation is absolutely cracking down on that...," she said.

The Department of Transportation is taking action, with Secretary Sean Duffy criticizing states like California for failing to enforce federal English-language requirements for commercial truck drivers. California risks losing over \$40 million in highway safety funding due to noncompliance.

"California's reckless disregard is frankly disgusting and an affront to the millions of Americans who expect us to keep them safe," Duffy stated in the September press release. *ANI*

Tibetan man sentenced to over two years in US prison for asylum fraud scheme: USCIS report

WASHINGTON, DC: A Tibetan man has received a prison sentence of over two years for his involvement in a scheme to submit false asylum applications for financial gain, according to a report released by US Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS), as reported by Phayul.

Tenzin Norbu, 56, was sentenced to 27 months in prison and mandated to pay \$170,000 in forfeiture for be-

ing part of a conspiracy to commit immigration fraud and for making false statements on asylum applications submitted to USCIS.

The sentence was handed down on October 15 by Judge Kimba M. Wood of the US District Court for the Southern District of New York, as highlighted by Phayul.

This conviction resulted from a collaborative investigation conducted by

USCIS, Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) under US Immigration and Customs Enforcement, and the US Attorney's Office for the Southern District of New York. These agencies worked together for over three years to expose the scheme.

Court documents state that between 2007 and 2018, Norbu and others prepared and submitted numerous asylum applications that contained fabricated stories claiming the applicants were Tibetan and would face persecution if returned to Tibet, which is under Chinese control.

Investigators noted that Norbu charged approximately \$5,000 for these services and guided clients on how to respond to questions about the fabricated stories during interviews, as emphasized in the Phayul report.

As law enforcement began looking into the scheme, Norbu fled the US for Canada. After nearly five years of

avoiding extradition, he was ultimately sent back to the US.

A federal grand jury indicted him in March 2024, and he entered a guilty plea in May 2025 to one charge of conspiracy to commit asylum fraud and make false statements, violating 18 United States Code, section 371, as cited by the Phayul report.

The US government estimated that Norbu profited around \$170,000 from

the fraudulent activities, which were forfeited as part of his sentence.

Officials indicated that the case impacted nearly 100 individuals, leaving some in a state of uncertain immigration status. Some applicants reportedly had legitimate asylum claims even without the fabricated narratives, while others may have received asylum based on the fraudulent applications. *ANI*

Institutional investments in Indian Real Estate hit USD 1.76 billion in Q3 CY2025; Highest in four years: Report



NEW DELHI: The Indian real estate sector recorded institutional investments of USD 1.76 billion in the third quarter (Q3) of calendar year 2025, the highest quarterly inflow of funds compared to any Q3 in the past four years, according to a report by Vestian.

While investments saw a marginal dip of two percent from the previous quarter, they rose sharply by 83 percent over the same period a year earlier.

The report pointed out that the commercial segment continued to lead, accounting for 79 percent of total institutional inflows. This was higher than its share of 61 percent in the previous quarter

and 71 percent in Q3 2024. In value terms, commercial investments reached nearly USD 1.4 billion, showing a strong annual growth of 104 percent.

In terms of geography, multicity investments accounted for 39 percent, followed by Mumbai (18 percent) and Chennai (16 percent), as per the report. ANI

India's office leasing touches a record high, outperforms Asian peers

NEW DELHI: India's office market outperformed the Asia-Pacific region in Q3 2025, with 8.8 million square feet of leasing activity, defying broader slowdown trends, a recent report said.

Full-year leasing volumes of Bengaluru, NCR and Mumbai together are expected to touch 50 million sq ft, surpassing the previous record of 41 million sq ft set in 2024, the report from real estate services firm Knight Frank said

This increase in leasing has driven prime rents higher, increasing 4.3 percent YoY across major cities, despite the arrival of new supply, it noted.

"Despite a supply influx of nearly 9 mn square feet during the quarter, prime office rents across India's three largest office markets - Bengaluru, NCR, and Mumbai - rose an average of 4.3 percent YoY, highlighting the market's enduring strength," the report said.



Across the APAC region, prime office rents fell 1.4 percent YoY, with rental growth flat lining at 0.0 percent QoQ, down from 0.2 percent in Q2 2025.

The surge in leasing volumes in India was also driven by commitments from global capability centers and a revival in third-party IT services.

Bengaluru led in performance, with prime rents increasing 8.8 percent year-over-year and 2 percent quarter-over-quarter, driven by demand in areas like Outer Ring Road and Whitefield. Delhi-NCR and Mumbai posted 2 percent QoQ growth, with YoY increases of 3 percent and 3.9 percent, respectively.

In comparison, several Asia-Pacific markets saw muted rental growth as landlords prioritized occupancy amid elevated vacancies. India's strong performance reflects a resilient occupier base, a diversified tenant profile, and a stable economic outlook, the report noted. IANS

'India's first free cancer vaccination program for girls aged 1-14 in TN soon'

CHENNAI: Tamil Nadu is poised to script a national milestone by becoming the first state in India to roll out a free cancer vaccination program for girls aged between one and 14 years, state Health and Family Welfare Minister Ma. Subramanian announced.

Speaking at the 16th annual breast cancer awareness walkathon, titled 'Oru Nadai Oru Nambikkai' (One Step, One Hope), held at Island Grounds in Chennai, the Minister said the State government has allocated Rs 38 crore for the landmark preventive healthcare initiative.

"The tender process has been completed. Once launched, Tamil Nadu will be the first state in the country to provide the cancer-preventive vaccine entirely free of cost to girls aged one to fourteen," the Minister said, adding that the initiative would set a precedent for similar projects across India.

He also emphasized the growing importance of lifestyle and physical fitness in preventing cancer.

"Scientific studies have proven that those who walk or run daily face a significantly lower risk of developing cancer. Regular exercise is one of the most effective preventive measures," he said.

India's gender pay gap narrows sharply, now among lowest worldwide: Report

NEW DELHI: India's gender pay gap has narrowed sharply, now ranking among the lowest worldwide, a recent report said.

According to a report from global payroll and compliance platform Deel, the median salaries for men and women in India are nearly equal, ranging from \$13,000 to \$23,000, reflecting "growing pay equity and the adoption of data-driven compensation models."

Deel analyzed internal platform data from over 1 million contracts and more than 35,000 customers in 150 countries to get insights into global pay trends, the report said.

The report also highlighted a 40 percent year-on-year (YoY) drop in median compensation for engineering and data professionals in India, decreasing from \$36,000 in 2024 to \$22,000 in 2025.

"India continues to show a hybrid workforce model, with 60

percent-70 percent full-time employees and 30 percent to 40 percent contract workers, underscoring steady reliance on flexible work arrangements," the report noted

"It's encouraging to see India

emerge as one of the few countries where the gender pay gap has narrowed significantly. This progress reflects a broader shift toward fairness, transparency, and data-driven compensation models that reward merit over

bias," says Mark Samlal, General Manager APAC at Deel.

The US, UK and Canada continue to offer the highest median compensation globally across job categories. Specialized roles in AI, cybersecurity, and digital marketing command 20 percent to 25 percent pay premiums due to skill scarcity and lack of established pay benchmarks.

Median equity grants for tech talent have grown consistently from 2021 to 2025 in emerging markets like Brazil and India, marking a global shift toward equity-heavy compensation models. The US leads in equity package size, followed by Canada and France, the report noted.

Globally gender pay gaps remain starker in tech and product roles compared to sales positions, with the largest gaps observed in Canada, France, and the United States, according to the report. *IANS*

Study shows eye scans may provide clues to ageing, heart disease risk

NEW DELHI: Canadian researchers have found that scanning the tiny blood vessels in the eyes may help predict a person's risk of developing heart disease and how fast they're biologically ageing.

The study, published in the journal Science Advances, suggests that retinal scans could one day serve as a noninvasive window into the body's overall vascular health and biological ageing status, offering new opportunities for early detection and intervention.

"By connecting retinal scans, genetics, and blood biomarkers, we have uncovered molecular pathways that help explain how aging affects the vascular system," said Marie Pigeyre, Associate Professor at McMaster University's Department of Medicine in Canada.

"The eye provides a unique,

noninvasive view into the body's circulatory system. Changes in the retinal blood vessels often mirror changes occurring throughout the body's small vessels," added Pigeyre.

To conduct the study, the team combined retinal scans, genetic data, and blood sample analyses from over 74,000 participants.

People with simpler, less branched blood vessels were

found to be at increased risk of cardiovascular diseases and showed signs of biological ageing, such as higher inflammation and shorter lifespan.

Currently, assessing age-related diseases like heart disease, stroke, and dementia requires multiple tests. The hope is that retinal scans alone could eventually be used as a quick, accessible way to assess ageing and cardiovascular risk. However, more research is needed.

The team also reviewed blood biomarkers and genetic data and identified potential biological causes behind changes in the eye's blood vessels. *IANS*



Surging elderly population to boost silver economy in India: Govt

This rapid demographic transition offers tremendous growth potential for health and wellness-focused enterprises.

It includes support that prioritizes family and community-led initiatives while ensuring financial security, digital literacy training, long-term care insurance,



digital healthcare access, assistive technologies, and engagement platforms are crucial for effectively integrating older adults into the silver economy.

"India's silver economy is valued at approximately Rs 73,000 crore in 2024,

with projections indicating substantial multi-fold growth in the years ahead. Research identifies senior citizens, along with professionals in the 45 to 64 age bracket, as the 'wealthiest age cohort' globally," the statement said.

"This burgeoning silver economy creates substantial opportunities for businesses and organizations dedicated to addressing the needs and preferences of the elderly demographic. The market is poised for rapid expansion both domestically and internationally, presenting considerable scope for innovation and development within this sector," it added.

Tiny metal particles show potential in targeting cancer cells: Study


NEW DELHI: Researchers have developed microscopic metal particles that can kill cancer cells while sparing healthy tissue, offering a potential new direction for more targeted and less toxic cancer treatments.

The study by the team from the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology (RMIT) in Australia remains at the cell-culture stage and has not been tested in animals or humans, Xinhua news agency reported.

However, it suggests a new strategy for designing cancer treatments that exploits cancer's own weaknesses.

The international team led by RMIT researchers created tiny particles, known as nanodots, from molybdenum oxide -a compound based on a rare metal called molybdenum. It is often used in electronics and alloys.

By tweaking their chemical composition, the scientists enabled the particles



to release reactive oxygen molecules -unstable forms of oxygen that damage cancer cells and trigger their self-destruction.

In tests, the particles killed three times more cervical cancer cells than healthy cells within 24 hours, without the need for light, unusual for technologies that rely on oxidative stress, according to the study published in the journal Advanced Sci-

"Cancer cells already live under higher stress than healthy ones. Our particles push that stress a little further, enough to trigger self-destruction in cancer cells, while healthy cells cope just fine," said Zhang Baoyue, first author from the RMIT School of Engineering.

"The result was particles that generate oxidative stress selectively in cancer cells under lab conditions," Zhang said.

Most cancer treatments affect both cancerous and healthy tissue, but technologies that selectively stress cancer cells could enable gentler, more targeted therapies, researchers said.

They added that these particles are made from common metal oxide instead of costly or toxic noble metals like gold or silver, making them likely cheaper and safer to develop. IANS

Bangladesh: Six more die of dengue, fatalities rise to 269 in 2025

DHAKA: As many as six people died due to dengue in Bangladesh in the 24 hours leading up to Monday morning (27 Oct), raising the total number of fatalities from the mosquito-borne disease in the country to 269 in 2025.

During the same period, 983 people were admitted to hospitals with viral fever, increasing the total number of cases in Bangladesh to 66,423 in 2025. Four new fatalities were reported in Dhaka North City Corporation (DNCC), and one each in Dhaka South City Corporation and

Barishal Division, the United News of Bangladesh (UNB) reported.

Presently, 993 patients are undergoing treatment in Dhaka while 2,740 patients are receiving treatment at various hospitals in Bangladesh. Among this year's patients, 61.8 percent were male while 38.2 percent were female, according to the report. Among the total number of deaths reported due to dengue, 53.2 percent were men while 46.8 percent were women.

On October 9, Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) Director General Abu Jafor noted that the number of dengue cases in 2025 is higher than last year; however, the death rate is lower.

Speaking at a press briefing held over the 'Typhoid Vaccination Campaign-2025'

at the Health Ministry, Abu Jafor said: "This year, the number of dengue infections is higher than last year, but the death rate in proportion to infections is lower," United News of Bangladesh reported.

He called breeding of mosquitoes and the destruction of their larvae important for preventing dengue. "People must use mosquito nets and take protective measures. These are mostly individual responsibilities. If we neglect these, it will be very difficult to eliminate dengue," he said.

Jafor said, "Our data shows that over 50 percent of dengue deaths in hospitals are occurring on the very first day of admission. This suggests that patients are seeking care too. We are doing our best to ensure proper management in hospitals."

Prevention and control of dengue depend on vector control. There is no specific treatment for dengue; however, early detection and access to proper medical care lower fatality rates of severe dengue. The framework of amended rules enjoins on the companies offering AI generation tools to embed permanent visible watermarks or metadata identifiers on all synthetic content prescribing coverage of at least 10 percent of the display area of images and videos. Likewise, audio content must carry identifiers during the first 10 percent of playback duration. The amendments formally set out to define -for the first time- a 'synthetically generated information' as content ' artificially or algorithmically created, generated, modified or altered using a computer resource in a manner that makes it appear as authentic or true'.

Significant social media intermediarieslarge platforms designated under the IT Rules- will be prohibited from enabling users to suppress or remove the identifiers

making it harder to disguise the origin of Al generated material. The platform is obligated to ask the users to declare whether uploaded content is synthetically generated before publication and deploy

automated detection systems to verify such declarations. The rules, of course, apply only to publically available content and not to private or unpublished material.

In a further move the government has brought all digital services that use mobile numbers-from WhatsApp and payment apps to food delivery platforms-under telecom cybersecurity regulations and empowered the concerned authorities to order suspension of user accounts across multiple services. The Telecommunications (Telecom Cyber Security) Amendment Rules notified on October 22, establish a government-run mobile number verification (MNV) system and mandate database checks before buying or selling used phones



Pakistan's Economic Revival: From Crisis Management to IMF-Supported Structural Consolidation

SARA NAZIR

n the last three years, Pakistan's economy has seen a significant metamorphosis, transitioning from near collapse in mid-2023 to a state of macroeconomic stability and incremental development by 2025. Supported by a \$7 billion International Monetary Fund (IMF) bailout and a series of audacious internal reforms, the nation's leadership has effectively averted default, mitigated rampant inflation, and established the foundation for permanent recovery.

This resurgence occurs while some countries in South Asia contend with rising inflation, debt vulnerabilities, and disruptions to the global supply chain. The relative economic stability of Pakistan is hence of greater importance for regional financial stability and trust among investors in emerging economies.

In June 2023, Pakistan encountered one of Asia's most se-

growth, the government facilitated inflation reduction, fiscal consolidation, and ultimately, investor confidence, establishing the foundation for a true economic recovery.

As of early 2025, the IMF observed that "Pakistan has achieved considerable advancement in reinstating macroeconomic stability and restoring confidence despite a difficult global context." Due to judicious monetary and fiscal policies, inflation consistently decreased, reaching 1.5 percent in February 2025 and plummeting to 0.3 percent in April 2025, down from 17.3 percent in April 2024. The Ministry of Finance anticipates inflation to stabilize between 1 and 1.5 percent in March 2025, representing the lowest rate in nearly a decade.

The alleviation of inflation has begun to alleviate the stress on households and small enter-

vere economic catastrophes. Inflation exceeded 30 percent, foreign reserves fell significantly, and the government's debt load consumed a substantial portion of its earnings. The economy was perilously near default, with inflation reaching almost 40 percent in May 2023.

IMF Bailout And Macroeconomic Stability

The tide begun to shift during the IMF's stabilization initiative. Economists see Pakistan's situation as a quintessential example of the "stabilization versus growth dilemma," wherein immediate austerity and stringent monetary policy are essential to reestablish equilibrium prior to achieving sustainable growth. By emphasizing macroeconomic stability rather than short-term

prises, while genuine wage growth and employment generation continue to be inconsistent. The government's emphasis on targeted subsidies and digital cash transfers is crucial in safeguarding vulnerable communities.

Foreign exchange reserves, after being exhausted, recovered to \$11 billion, offering 2.5 months of import coverage. The economy, currently valued at over \$350 billion, has not only steadied but actually commenced growth once more.

The Pakistan Economic Survey 2024-2025 indicated that Pakistan's economy exhibited significant stabilization and recovery, with Real GDP increasing by 2.68 percent in FY2025 and inflation declining markedly to 0.3 percent in April 2025 from

17.3 percent the previous year. Fiscal indicators significantly improved as the nation achieved its inaugural quarterly surplus in 24 years, with the primary balance attaining a historic 3.0 percent of GDP, driven by a 36.7 percent increase in revenues and enhanced spending control. The industrial and business sectors propelled development, with the IT and telecom industries serving as significant contributors; ICT exports increased by 23.7 percent, and freelancers generated US\$ 400 million in foreign money. The Survey observed enhancements in investment and savings ratios, increased provincial surpluses, and advancements in digital entrepreneurship, highlighting that Pakistan's fundamentals of the economy are fortifying, inflationary pressures are diminishing, and fiscal discipline is facilitating sustained recovery.

The Pakistan Economic Survey 2024-2025 states, "Pakistan's economy has entered a recovery phase supported by fiscal consolidation, disinflation, and enhanced investor sentiment."

Consolidating Achievements: Financial Robustness and External Resilience

In addition to headline statistics, the durability of Pakistan's recovery may be comprehensively assessed by its external and fiscal measures, which demonstrate a consistent rectification of enduring imbalances. The most notable transformation transpired in the external sector, as Pakistan achieved an annual current account surplus of around US\$ 2.1 billion (0.5 percent of GDP) in FY2024-25, overturning years of continuous deficits.

ast week a friend from JPL (NASA), located in Pasadena, California, called to say he and several other colleagues were laid-off due to cuts in federal funding. After serving for many years, sacrificing their youth, family and country of origin, suddenly they became victims of the recent policy to downsize R&D in several sectors across United States. Their search for deep learning in science led them to become part of America's superiority in technology and research. Most of these graduates were initially from institutions like IIT and other major engineering colleges across India. The main reason to leave the country was non-availability of work culture and growth. The era was known as the great brain drain of India, during 20th and 21st century. Many in India agreed that 'brain drain is better than brain in the drain'.

Today, the scenario has changed overnight. Their American dreams crushed, like a tornado has just struck.

Western Europe during the rise of colonial empires became the fertile ground for the intellect to pursue and migrate and later United States became the center for attracting the best talent from across continents after WW-II. Hard-working, creative and ambitious individuals left Europe for US followed by Indians and Chinese in the 70s. America's greatest achievements in science and industrial growth happened during these times.

This current scenario couldn't be better for India to dive in and take advantage of. India should accelerate with all major corporations to contribute in R&D to attract the talent pool that is available. China is already ahead in and continues to advance in R&D. In manufacturing they are already ahead of US and rest of the world. India could be the only other country, with a young population that can forge ahead besides China. With this golden opportunity and advent of AI, India can solve major employment problems and can setup the eco-system to woo the trained intellect pool available. By investing in high-tech industry will not only benefit the highly educated workforce but the effect can reach the entire employment eco-system.

None of this implies that India should ignore low-value manufacturing, especially given the underlying geopolitical risks. Modi government's, 'Viksit Bharat' will remain a hollow slogan unless the country shifts from 'Make in India' to 'Innovate in India.' Beyond job creation, innovation can advance India's strategic goal of atmanirbharta by reducing dependence on others for critical technologies.

Top-end innovation depends on attracting the very best human capital, which will now be available from the best of talent willing to move to India. Building more IITs or modestly raising PhD stipends, while worthwhile, will not move the needle. What will is massive investment in R&D. The government must provide equal or better incentives, intellectual freedom, and world-class civic amenities. Incentives could entail inviting global universities to launch and operate freely in India without regulatory and taxation-related challenges, and providing civic amenities like townships with clean air, water, quality schools, and open spaces. Gurgaon, Hyderabad and Bangalore are simply not enough, to woo the best.



Shot in Chandigarh, Ikk Kudi was first scheduled to hit the screens on September 19 and was later pushed for an October 31 release.



ampi, the city of ruins, is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Situated in the shadowed depth of hills and valleys in the state of Karnataka, this place is a historical delight for travellers. Surrounded by 500 ancient monuments, beautiful temples, bustling street markets, bastions, treasury building and captivating remains of Vijayanagar Empire, Hampi is a backpacker's delight. Hampi is an open museum with 100+ locations to explore and a favorite way to see the city from the perspective of its history.

Hampi was the capital of the Vijayanagar Empire around 1500 AD, and by some accounts, the second largest city in the world at that time. Over the next centuries it fell out of importance, and now you can explore the ruins of a lot of temples and other structures spread out over a vast area. The terrain around Hampi is as mysterious as the ruins itself - the city is surrounded by boulders of different sizes, and you can climb to the top of them with a little effort to get a stunning view of the entire city and the geography. It is located on the banks of the Tungabhadra River. Famous for its massive, beautifully carved temples, especially the Virupaksha Temple, dedicated to the patron deity of the empire. You can also find remains of the old aqueducts, canals and military barracks and stables here. Hampi was declared a UNESCO World Heritage site in 1986 and many efforts have been taken to restore the lost glory of the place - very limited (if any) modern establishments are allowed in the main area, which gives an authentic feel to the ruins.

PLACES TO VISIT IN HAMPI

Virupaksha Temple: The Virupaksha temple (or

century, the beautiful architecture and history of the temple have made it a UNESCO World Heritage site. The temple is abode to one of the forms of Lord Shiva called Lord Virupaksha. While it is located at present-day Hampi, it was once a smaller shrine in the middle of the ancient and majestic Vijayanagara Empire. You will find beautiful stone inscriptions dating back to the 7th century on the walls of the temple as proof of its rich heritage. Architecture-lovers and history-buffs, do visit the temple when you are in Hampi Vithala Temple: Lotus Palace: The Lotus Palace

> in Hampi is one of the most iconic landmarks in the town. Named so for the way the structure looks like a lotus in bloom, this

palace was the designated area for the royal women of the Vijayanagara Empire and is found within the Zenana Enclosure. Known widely as one of the few edifices in Hampi that was not lost either to the Mughal raids of the town or to the ravages of time, the Lotus Mahal stands tall in its courtyard.

Yantrodharaka Hanuman Temple: On top of the Anjaneya Hill, at a distance of 2 kilometers from the Virupaksha Temple, the beautiful Yantradharaka Hanuman Temple also known as the Monkey Temple is present inside a cave. The temple being 500 years old is dedicated the Vijayanagara Kingdom and a Dwaita philosopher, was the one to install the idol of Lord Hanuman in the temple

Being one of the most famous attractions of the Anjeyanadri Hill, the Monkey Temple is considered as a sacred spot for Hindus.

Hippie Island: While most tourists stay to the south of Tungabhadra where most of the ruins are located, some prefer the north banks which have a vibrant hippie culture. Virapapur Gadde or Hippie Island is a small island situated across the Tungabhadra river. It takes 5 minutes to travel to the island via coracle or boat. The last boat for the island leaves at 5.30 pm. The backpacker's delight.

Hampi Bazaar: Also known as the Virupaksha Bazaar, the Hampi Bazaar is the place to go to pick up knickknacks, souvenirs, cheap clothes and trinkets to remember your trip to Hampi by. Situated right in front of Virupaksha temple, hence its alternate name, this bazaar that stretches for over a kilometer long is one of the main


> landmarks of Hampi. From embroidered shawls, fiber handicrafts, to stone carvings, this is the place to pick up anything Hampi-related.


Queen's Bath: A part of the Royal Enclosure,

this aquatic enclosure was the Royal bath during the times of the Vijayanagara Empire. It was built in such a way that no outsiders could enter the bath. Over 500 years old, the Royal Bath continues to draw tourists to it and is famous for its intricately designed balconies and other features. A notable design feature of the Royal Bath is that it has no ceiling and it

is open to the elements.
